

## Editorial

The Huge mass of people witnessing the final game between La Salle, and Aruba last Wednesday night rushed to the reserved grand stand following the game to see the trophy being handed over to Aruba and to cheer their sports representatives for the victorious accomplishment.

Great was the disappointment of the fans when they were deprived of that privilege. Instead the A.V.B. president announced that the presentation would take place at the Club Bolivariana during a farewell party for the teams.

On Tuesday, the requests to air the fans' objection to this treatment kept pouring in to our editorial staff. The fans, especially the Aruban fans, feel strongly that they had as much right to share in the honors as the team which represented them. Another sour note was the treatment which the large group of devoted fans, who followed the boys to Bolivariana, received there. They were very rudely thrown out.


THE LOCAL agrees with the fans. We do not know why this deviation was made from the normal and standard procedure of presenting trophies on the field.

#### Aruba Wins Interland Series

The Interland Football Series between Aruba, Surinam, B.G., and La Salle (Venezuela) came to a close last Wednesday night, with Aruba taking a 2—0 win from La Salle.

Thus the home boys won all of their 3 matches and the Series' championship.

The tournament was officially opened last Saturday night, February 7, at the Wilhelmina Stadium, with Acting Lt. Governor F. de P. Wever welcoming the teams and wishing them success. The opening ceremony also included: the hising of the Dutch, British and Venezuelan flags; taking the sportsman's oath by the captains of the teams; playing of the respective National Anthems; a defile by Aru-

ban football clubs; reading of congratula ory letters from British Guiana; and a "kick-off" by charming Madrina Beatriz Tovar of La Salle, during the opening match between Aruba and Surinam.

The match ended in a well-earned 2—1 victory for Aruba, although not an easy one.

The slight margin of 1 point gives a good picture of the team's strength and it was mainly Aruba's stamina and productive game which changed what looked like defeat into a thrilling victory. At half-time, the score was 1—0 for Surinam.

The game was played in a truly sportman-like manner, with very little work given to referee Snoek. There was not a single incident to mar this outstanding, fast ball game.

The huge crowd, the largest ever to witness a sports event in Aruba, left completely satisfied with the end result and the conduct of the teams. On Sunday afternoon a considerably smaller crowd, saw B.G. receiving a ball lesson from the profs of La Salle. The Venezuelans left the field, victorious by a 7—1 margin.

The game was far below the standard of the Aruba-Surinam encounter, with both sides starting off slightly nervous. La Salle was first to recover from the slump and in rapid fashion penetrated the B.G. domain 6 times before the referee called it half time.

On resumption B.G. played a slightly better game than before the rest and, during a short spell, took the offensive. During this period they succeeded in scoring their lone goal, but shortly thereafter La Salle again increased their lead.

The second half of the match saw some rough play and the "temper barometer" threatened to jump, but referee Tromp, who did a fine job, was able to cool down the boys before any damage was done. A word of praise is in order for B.G's relief goalie who stopped a wellplaced penalty kick by La Salle.

On Monday night, a meager crowd saw the Surinamers trash their neighbors, B.G., 9-0 to better Venezuela's 7-1 victory over the Britons.

For the first 20 minutes, the kick-and-run style of the Guianese created some confusion in the Surinam ranks, but once they found the range, the game became a onesided affair with Surinam scoring. almost at will. At half time the score was 4-0; in the second half Surinam added 5 more to the end the match 9-0.

Tuesday night's double header. which was witnessed by a very large crowd was disappointing in several respects.

In the first game, extremely poor refereeing killed the enthusiasm with which B.G. combatted their hosts. British Guiana was whipped 3—1 by Aruba, but even the lome team showed very clearly heir disgust for the referee's

B.G. played a surprisingly good me and scored a fine goal. Aru-'a's first goal was equally beautiful; their second came from a penalty kick (cause unknown) and the third has not yet landed in the net. How it was scored is a puzzle even

The Wilhelmina Stadium was filled to overflowing last Wednesday night and for the first time in it's history the sale of tickets had to be stopped as apparently all sports fans had come to see the final match of the inter-land series, and better the record gate of the Aruba-Surinam match. Before the game a cable, from the Governor of BG was read, in which H.E. expressed his appreciation for the swell time given the BG players in Aruba.

With two wins each to their credit, Aruba and La Salle were battling for the series' championship. The hosts whipped their guests 2—0.

The match was as thrilling as Aruba's against Surinam, and for the first 20 minutes it appeared that La Salle would not live up to its "foul" reputation. Then Aruba, through fine coordination between Jansen and Brokke, scored its first goal and the game started to get "forceful". With a 1—0 lead for Aruba referee Snoek blew for half-time.

While La Salle slightly dominated the first half, Aruba dominated the second, and their repeated, well coordinated attacks yielded

# FRENCH LANGLOIS DEFEATED ROCKY CASTELLANI

Pierre Langlois, French import, upset the 3 to 1 favored Rocky Castellani of Luzerne, Pa., to win a split 12-round decision Friday last in the first of a series of elimination bouts for the American version of the middleweight title vacated by Sugar Ray Robinson.

Many ring rules were ignored in the closing rounds.

Both fighters had to be warned

several times by Referee Goldstein for hitting on the break, holding and wrestling.

Langlois suffered a bad cut over his right eye in the 10th.

A right hand punch had knocked Castellani down just before the bell ended the 11th.

There was no count but Referee Goldenstein informed the judges that he had ruled it an official knock-down.

Referee Goldstein and judge Art Aidala scored it 5—5—2 but gave it to Langlois on points.

Goldstein's point margin was

9—8 and Aidala's 8—7. Judge Charley Shortell saw Castellani out front 7—4—1. The AP card gave it to Castellani 7—5 in rounds but only 7—6 in points.

Castellani weighed 159½. Langlois 160.

#### BASSETT STOPS FRENCH FAMECHON IN 3.

Percy Bassett of Philadelphia won the interim world feather-weight, boxing championship Monday last by stopping Ray Famechon of France in three rounds. Bassett weighed 1251/4. Famechon 1251/2.

Sandy Saddler, the world featherweight champion now a U.S. soldier stationed in Germany, was at the ringside.

His title was frozen for the duration of his military service but boxing commissions in the United States and abroad decided to keep the division active in the interim.

Bassett led the fight from the start, pouring punches at the back-pedalling Frenchman. Famechon boxed according to his schedule in the first two rounds, staying cautiously out of the American's reach.

#### GAVILAN RETAINS TITLE.

An estimated 20.000 fans saw Cuba's Kid Gavilan, welterweight world champion, successfully defend his title against U.S.' Chuck Davy last Wednesday night by stopping Davy. Chuck was unable to answer the bell for the 10th, after having been knocked down 4 times in the 9th and being saved by the bell the last time. Chuck's right eye was completely closed and his left eye was also in bad shape.

Ed. Note: There is some question about the number of times Davy was floored in the 9th. While the blow


