



It is probably only his hours of work as a shift worker that prevented him from becoming a Trinidad representative in the game he had chosen.

In 1945 he came to Aruba, and playing for the team Cambridge the following year established himself as one of the leading batsmen locally. The next year he was Vice Captain of the Aruba team against Curacao.

In 1950 he joined the Barbados C. C. here, and was instrumental in their winning the cup that year when in the final match against Statia he top-scored with a brilliant 59.

He had a "lean" season in '51, but came back in a blaze of glory last year to captain the Barbados team to victory in the competition. His captaincy and performance were superb, and he was later chosen to lead the Aruba team against the visiting Curacao players.

His leadership and demeanor in this engagement gained him further laurels. He won the opening match, himself top-scoring with 38, and only dropped catches in the closing stages of the Test game robbed him of victory over Curacao. But with George what mattered more than victory was 'playing the game' as it should be played - in a spirit of true sportsmanship - and in this he has been an outstanding example in local cricket circles.

He has again been chosen to lead the Barbados team in this year's competition. All eyes will be upon him to see if he can repeat last year's brilliant performance.

Local News LAGO HOSPITAL WING COMPLETED.

Modern, attractive new facilities at Lago Hospital - designed for from the outside and the inside,

March 26. Lago President J. J. Horigan officially presented to Dr. R. C. Carrell, medical director, Lago's latest contribution to the welfare of its employees and their families when he opened the new wing which replaces the former bedspace and allied facilities with improved quarters.

Visitors attending the opening were staff physicians, Island doctors and dentists, Government representatives, members of Management, and the press. The informal ceremony, which preceded the tour of the hospital, was held in the main lobby on the east side of the building.

Speakers were : H. H. the Lt. Governor L. C. Kwartsz, Lago Pre-sident J. J. Horigan, Mr. F. W. Switzer who briefed the audience on some construction details, and Dr. R. C. Carrell, Medical Director who thanked Lago and Government for the support and cooperation received at all times.

Highlighting the ceremonies was the announcement by the Lt. Governor that it had pleased H. M. Queen Juliana to decorate Dr. Carrell as officer in the Order of Oranje Nassau.

Visibly moved, Dr. Carrell required some time to regain his voice for an appropriate word of thanks.

The guests were then taken for an inspection of the luxurious wing with Doctor-guides as informants after which refreshments were served.

The new fire-resistant building is expected to be put into use about the middle of next month.

THE NEW WING.

The new unit is an attractive pleasant looking structure. Both the new unit's appearance is one that suggests maximum comfort and care for new and convalescing patients.

Built entirely by Lago personnel at an approximate cost of over 2 million guilders, it was designed by Robert Law Weed, Miami architect. The three story structure which faces the Caribbean Sea has 80 rooms plus toilets of which 42 rooms are for patients with space for 120 beds. All patients' rooms are located on the windward side of the building to take advantage of the natural breeze. All utility rooms, lavatories, doctors' offices and examining rooms, and serving kitchens are located on the leeward side of the new wing.

The three stories have each been assigned specific types of cases — another of the many long range plans by the Medical Department to establish maximum efficiency and patient comfort in the new quarters. The west side of the first floor will be used for surgical cases; the east for children. The second floor closed-off isolation ward. The third floor is entirely for obstetrics and gynocology and includes nurseries.

One of the many important factors of the new quarters is the preparation that has gone into the building in the event of any emergency. Considering fire first, the new building is completely fire resistant. Firealarms are conveniently and conspicuously located throughout. If the alarm is thrown, a red light blinks at the information desk alerting the clerk stationed there at all times. In addition to the red blinking light, a gong sounds at constant intervals that through specific codes locate in what section of the building the alarm was sounded. Hospital staff members know immediately where the trouble is through the code system and can act without loss of time. Also on the automatic system are two smoke doors located on each of the three floors. When the alarm is thrown, these smoke doors automatically close protecting the corridors and patients' from smoke. Exits are clearly marked by large red globes to eliminate possible confusion. Fire escapes are located at each end of the building. The west side fire escape is entirely enclosed while the escape on the east side

has an open front.

The new quarters will never be without electricity. The hospital is on a two-feeder system. In the event electricity is cut off on one feeder, the other automatically goes into operation. If both feeders cut off — which is almost impossible — an automatic electric system generated by a unit located in the hospital's boiler room immediately supplies necessary power. To further safeguard a continuing supply of electric power from the 75 KVA gasoline generator at the hospital, at the instant this auxiliary power cuts in a red light flashes at the information desk. The alerted clerk at the desk then calls Utilities and a man is dispatched to the hospital where he stands by at the generator electririty is supplied until through one of the main feeder lines again.

When the auxiliary power unit at the hospital is in use it supplies power to an emergency system throughout the hospital which governs call lights, clocks, outlets, the elevator on the west side of the new quarters, necessary lights, and other electrical fixtures needed to conduct normal hospital activity. All elements on the emergency system are identified by small red squares located on the various fixtures.

When entering the new quarters, the visitor finds himself entering a bright, modern lobby. The east and west sides of the lobby are enclosed by panels of plate glass. The information desk, where visitors must register before entering patients' rooms, is in the lobby as is the telephone switchboard. Just outside the lobby—on the west side— a sun desk for convalescing patients has been provided.

TWO MONTHS IMPRISONMENT DEMANDED AGAINST CHAND.

On Wednesday morning the case against Bipat K. Chand, chairman of the Lago Employee Council, wascalled and deferred for two months pending further information.

Mr. Chand faces charges of :

(1) Spreading untrue reports against an officer of police involving assault of said Chand; and

(2) Insult of said policeman through such rumors.

Witnesses claimed that the accused had called at the police station in San Nicolas on his way home from a party, where he had indulged, apparently in heavy drinking.

The police officer, witnesses said, had urged Mr. Chand to go home, but he refused. He was then searched and put in a cell nor-

mally used to allow heavy drinkers to recover.

The following morning Mr. Chand was allowed to leave. Evidently perturbed by the incident, said the witnesses, Mr. Chand had then set out to start a series of untrue stories of assault against the policeman and had cabled the United Nations that a British subject had been innocently jailed.

Mr. N. E. Henriquez Sr. Chand's lawyer, pointed out that the accused had offered his apologies and sent another cable to undo the first. The defense thought that this would be sufficient justification to drop the matter.

The prosecution felt, however, that in spite of the apologies, the harm was done and demanded a 2-months prison sentence.

LAGO EMPLOYEES STUDY PROPOSAL FOR NEW WORK-WEEK

Lago employees, currently on a regular work schedule of 48 hours per week, are facing a difficult decision as their representatives discuss a proposal for a shorter (45hour) work-week which would also involve a reduction in wages and salaries.

The proposal, said the representatives, was the result of a government established work-week of 45 hours maximum for all employees, with overtime compensation for time worked in excess of 45 hours. An exception was made in the case of operating personnel of oil refineries and medical employees, where a 48-hour regular work-week is permitted, with the stipulation, however, that such hours (48) can be worked only on a voluntary ba-The employees involved s'is. were therefore given the option of a 45 or 48-hour week.

While the 45-hour week is attractive, it also means that the employees involved would have to take a substantial reduction in earnings. On the other hand, it might mean employment for an additional number of men.

It can readily be seen, also, that it would be impossible to meet individual wishes. The entire group will go on 45 or 48-hour schedule and as such the majority vote will

VALDIVIA DEFEATED IN VENEZUELA.

Raul Valdivia who recently thrilled Aruba queu fans with a series of exhibition games and fancy strokes in carambole (French) billiards. ran into defeat in Venezuela this week when he met and lost to Termilo Moran in a carambole game over 3 cushions for 50 points. The game was completed in 66 turns with the final score 50-37 in favor of Moran.

Valdivia, Chilean, is the 4th ranking contender for the world title and holds the Chilean and South American championship. In the "fancy strokes" rating he ranks 3rd in the world.

The highest break in the match against Venezuelan champion Moran was scored by the Venezuelan for 5; the players tied for second place with 4. The match lasted 80 minutes.

In free caramboling here in Aruba, Raul played Aruba's champion Osorio 500 to 150 points and won conveniently in 50 minutes, 14 turns, for an average of 35.7 points. His highest break being 135.

— pediatric and surgery cases is directly off the main lobby on the north side. On the second and third floors, the main corri new quarters may be reached either by elevator or stairs.

Basically, the three floors are the same in location of rooms, porches, utility rooms, nurses' desks and lavatories. They differ only where hospital demands for a smoothly functioning plant make it necessary. An isolation ward has been placed on

dors lead from smaller lobbies. The main lobby and those on the next two floors are attractively furnished for the convenience of

the second floor, and the design of the third floor is necessarily different to accomodate obstetrical cases from the time the mother enters the hospital until she leaves with her baby.

All patients' rooms are equipped exactly the same. Each bed has a bedside table and an overbed table and individual lighting. A patient reading in bed may avail himself of either direct or indirect lighting simply


by flicking a switch located on the wall above the bed. Located at each bed is a signal to call the nurse. The signal lights a panel at the nurse's desk indicating the location of the call. All rooms have straight chairs, easy chairs and ottomans. Each room has ample built-in closet space and a private bathroom with shower, as well as toilet facilities. The rooms' floors are black and white composition tile. The walls are finished in a coolgreen-colored paints.

Being located on the windward side of the new quarters, all patients' rooms are comfortably cool and pleasantly bright. Glass windows let in the day's light — direct glaring rays of the sun will not disturb patients, however, thanks to the red awning strips the length of the building over the windows. Letting in the breeze are louvres above the glass, and window-box ventilators below the window. An air tunnel, constructed above the corridor, carries the breeze from the rooms on the windward side to the offices, utilities rooms, and the like on the leeward side.

An interesting side note is the manner in which the Medical Department has furnished the children's rooms in the pediatric section. The cribs are high to facilitate nurse care of the children. The children's bathrooms are all junior size to handle the wants of the younger set. Little bath tubs are located in those rooms with a built-in seat for the youthful bathers.

In addition to the various types of identical rooms on each floor, a small serving kitchen and enclosed porch also make up a section of each floor plan. The porches are for patients' relaxation. The present Section E of the old quarters will become the main kitchen for the entire hospital. Food for the new quarters will be prepared there and transported in electrically heated units to the various floors: Two dumbwaiters run up through the three stories to carry food and medical supplies.

The corridors on the three floors are the same in design, color, and





The corridor walls are location. grey; the flooring is red composition tile, and the ceilings are all soundproof. **Doors opening from** the corridor are four-feet wide for ease in moving beds and equipment. Also located off the corridors on each floor are toilet facilities for staff members and visitors.

Located on the west side of the second floor is the isolated ward. It is made up of three rooms and a utility room. The three isolation rooms for patients have large plate glass windows set in the doors allowing visitors in this section to see the patients.

For mothers-to-be, new mothers, and new arrivals, the obstetrical section on the third floor is complete from pins and diapers to large sterilizing and delivery equipment. Facing the ocean are two labor rooms and the delivery room. The Grand Day Dance The labor rooms and the delivery rooms are located side-by-side with connecting doors. This positioning enables expectant mothers to be taken directly into the delivery from the labor room without entering the corridor. The labor rooms and the delivery room are located on the sea-side of the wing.

It is complete in itself. The section is prepared to handle any possible emergency that may arrise during delivery. ' At no time will this section have to call on other facilities of the hospital. The delivery room is a large bright room. All electrical switches and outlets are the safety type to safeguard the room's occupants when anesthesia is used. Also located in the delivery section is a room for the obstetricians, who, anticipating a night delivery, may sleep there. The delivery section is closed to all but

the hospital staff.

On the leeward side of the west end of the third floor are the nurseries. For the convenience of proud fathers, large plate glas windows overlook the nurseries for "papa's first look." A small indicator room also has a plate glass window for viewing the little tots resting there. Connecting the two nurseries is a large workroom for the nurses' use in , caring for the new arrivals.

A now procedure has been established for visitors. Upon entering the hospital, visitors will be required to check in at the information desk in the main lobby. The information clerk will issue each visitors a card authorizing him to visit. Visitors will not be allowed in the patients' quarters with-out a guest card. Each patient is allowed two visitors at a time plus family members. Those coards are to be returned to the information desk when leaving the hospital.

The visiting hours of the new quarters will be the same as previously set up for the old quarters. Adults may be visited from 2 to 3 p.m. and 6 to 8 p.m. Children may be visited from 2 to 3 p.m. and 6 to 7 p.m.

LAGO FLYERS MISSING.

5 Lago employees, Messrs Edward R. De Freitas, Joseph I. Castilho, Henry F. Abraham, Eric J. Jardine, and Oscar E. Nascimento were reported missing at press time on their way back to Aruba from British Guiana in a sports plane of the Aruba Flying Club.

The boys had left Aruba a few wecks ago for a short vacation in British Guiana.

The last report received here was that they had landed safely at Barcelona and had taken off on the last lap of the trip early Monday morning. Since then there has been no further news.

The worst was feared Thursday since inquiries by their relatives, cable dispatches by the Consul and the Lago had yielded no success in getting word of their whereabouts back to Aruba.

Late Thursday afternoon, following a rumor, that a wing of a plane was found somewhere along the Venezuelan coast, Lago Officials sent the following cable to the Company in Venezuela :

ENGLAND

On Tuesday, the death of Oueen Mary, 85-year old Royal Grandmother, was announced. Queen Mary had been ill with gastric trouble for the past four weeks but was reported improving only a few days before her death.

INDIA.

India will shortly build a Uranium processing plant as the first step towards the production of atomic energy to provide cheap power for industrialisation .. report submitted to Parliament by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Scientific Research said important uranium deposits had been located in Bihar.

Uranium would also be extracted from Monazite, a radioactive sand found on the beaches of Travancore Cochnin.

GERMANY.

Admiral Gottfried Hanson, chairman of the German Veterans' League, demanded that the Allies release more German war criminals before Germany contributes soldiers to Western defence.

Hanson said he was asking Chancellor Adenauer to make the same plea te President Eisenhower when he visits Washington in April.

The veterans, meeting in a threeday convention cheered lustily when Vice-Chancellor Franz Bluecher and Interior Minister Robert Lehr said that West Germany soon hoped to raise soldiers for the proposed European army.


