

That same year Julio was among the AVB selection playing against Curacao, and since then he has been a "regular" in the island's All Star team.

Two years earlier, in 1948, while a member of Arsenal, Julio was one of the "re-inforcements" on the R.C.A. team which travelled to Haiti. He also played for R.C. This performance, which is still talked about was bettered in the recently completed Caribbean series. So outstanding was Julio's performance that he played in all of the Antilles' 6 matches. Of the total number of 17 goals scored by the Antilles, our sportin'ality scored 5 to make him runner-up for the record. Popo Godoy of Honduras beat him to it with 1 goal. Popo set the record with a total of 6.

Julio is very enthusiastic about the trip to Costa, Rica and the people's hospitality. The memories of "outings" which rate first place with him are the trips to Haiti and Costa Rica.

Asked what he found especially beautiful or charming in Costa Rica, Julio answered the "Ojo de agua" "swimming pool and the girls". "Ojo de agua" is a natural well, shaped like a human eye from where the water flows into a swimming pool. The ever present group of girls at the pool make out the other part of the attraction.

CONSUL LACLE COLLECTS.

The final chapter in the \$ 44,000 "Battle Of The Consuls" was written in the form of a check made out to the order of Mr. L. A. C. "Etty" Laclé, consul for Peru in Aruba.

The check was written, following verdict of a court in Panama, concerning ownership of the grand prize winning ticket in the Panamanian National Lottery drawing of November 9, 1952.

The dispute started here when Salvador Contreras, former Panamanian Consul in Aruba, sold the ticket to his colleague Laclé in good faith, with the understanding that Laclé, who had no money with him just then, would pay "later".

Before settlement took place, the drawing was held, and the ticket won the grand prize. Contreras demanded that Laclé return the





the prize ticket, which the latter refused to do. He then suggested a 50—50 split, but to no avail. On claims that the ticket was stolen from him, Contreras then cabled a "stop payment" order to Panama, although he had not reported the alleged "theft" to the local police.

In February a court in Panama ruled in favor of Laclé. Last week the new Panamanian Consul in Aruba, Mr. De La Tonga announced that the Director of the Panamanian National Lottery had handed over to Mr. Aleman, Laclé's Lawyer, a check which makes "Etty" Laclé, an Aruban, \$44,000 richer.

How fat a "slice" Lawyer Aleman will get, was not revealed. Consul Laclé, we understand, will not face legal difficulties here in Aruba for owning a "contraband" ticket, thanks to the flexibility in the text of the written law covering this matter.

PEP RECEIVES NEW RING LICENSE FROM NEW YORK.

Former World Featherweight champion Willy Pep was given a new license by the state Athletic Commission on Friday last, to fight in New York.

His license was taken from him after his foul-packed bout with Sandy Saddler on September 26th. 1951 in Madison Square Garden.

Besides his written application for reinstatement, Pep personally apologized to the commission for his conduct.

YOUNG OUTPOINTED DURANDO.

Paddy Young placed himself into an American middleweight title fight with Carl Olson Friday last by scoring a unanimous decision over rugged Ernie Durando in a bruising Madison Square Garden 12-rounder. Young weighed 160 to Durando's 1571/4.

Cut over both eyes by the fourth round and rocked twice within the same span, Young came on like a prairie fire to win impressively in this fifth meeting of the two sluggers.

The scoring, all in favour of Young was : Referee Ruby Goldstein, 6-5-1; Judge Bert Grant, 7-5, and Judge Harold Barnes, 7-4-1. The AP scorecard had Young in front 9-3.

was his third over the Bayonne, N. J., fighter and moved him into the final round of the NBA and New York commission's middleweight elimination tournament.

Young was rocked by Durando's power-packed right in the second round and stagered in the fourth by another solid right to the chin.

He stabbed Durando off ballance with stiff left jabs, smacked his ribs with jolting left hooks, and followed up with left and right combinations.

Young's hard-earned triumph TURPIN-HUMEZ CLASH FOR "KING" SOLOMONS' CROWN

> British Promoter Jack Solomons Monday announced the signing of England's Randy Turpin and France's Charles Humez for a "world" middleweight title fight in London, June 9, but he received no support from American boxing commissions.

> "European title yes, world title no," said Bob Christenberry, chairman of the New York State Athletic Commission who also heads a joint board made up of himself and two NBA officials, George Barton and Abe J. Greene. Both Barton and Greene made similar statements.

Solomons, as a matter of fact, hasn't yet received approval of the White City Stadium 15rounder as a "world" title bout from the British boxing board of control.

E.J. Waltham, secretary of the BBBC, said Solomons' appli-



cation for the fight had been received. He said the board would decide at a meeting soon whether it should be considered a "world" title fight.

In New York, Christenberry said "when Mr. J. Onslow Fane, chairman of the BBBC, was in New York recently, it was stated very plainly and definitely that a Humez-Turpin fight would not be given world title recognition. There was no misunderstanding.

"We expect that Paddy Young and Carl Olson will meet for the American championship." added Christenberry. "We would like the winner to fight the Humez-

DOCTORED WHISKEY IMPORTED IN VENEZUELA

According to an article in Venezuela's "La Esfera" last Saturday, authorities in the country had found a trail which suggests large scale gangster operations in Venezuela and other South American places.

Official sources, said La Es-

fera, revealed that an estimated 40.000 bottles of doctored whiskey have been imported into the country recently, with a total financial set-back to trade and population of over Bs. 1 million.

Investigation by authoritative sources, the publication said, have brought to light that several brands of whiskey have been doctored in Mexico City and shipped to Central and South America via Los Angels. Among these are "White Horse" and "Old Par". The horse on the label of the doctored White Horse bottle differes from the authentic one in that only two legs are visible; the "curve" shown in the tail is much higher; the eyes are invisible; the finsh of the engraving is much rougher; and the labels are printed in a different color. Similar falsifications are evident on the "Old Par" labels. In addition, the whiskey tastes unpleasant.

In order to determine whether these Scotch Whiskeys have been doctored, the Britsh Embassy in Caracas has forwarded samples to England with the request to have same analyzed.

La Esfera said that the Venezuelan authorities are of the opinion that this contraband trade is run by a powerful unit of international racketeers who market the products in South American ports. USA's Frank Costello, big-time gambler, writes the publicaton, is suspected of having a hand in the matter.



VICTIMS OF SADIST FOUND BY SCOTLAND YARD

Scotland Yard detectives Saturday found the bones of a fifth woman victim of a sex-mad sadist of Notting Hill buried beneath a forsythia bush in the back garden.

The discovery confronted officials with the possibility that still more bodies may be hidden around the apartment where five victims have been found since Tuesday.

Authorities began digging up the garden and ordered the entire apartment searched anew and ceilings pulled down.

Every available detective in Greater London was assigned to hunt for John Reginald Christie. 55, amateur photographer specializing in nudes, in whose twoand-one-half room apartment the bodies were found.

Those of his 45-year-old wife and three women in their 20s were discovered boarded up in the wall and floor.

Digging Saturday police found charred human bones. The remains included part of torso, a leg and arm joint. The head is missing. The first victim was believed' to have been strangled four months ago and three others a month apart thereafter. Christie occupied the apartment 15 years. A new tenant discovered the bodies.

Police said postmortem evidence indicated all the women were murdered by a sadist.

MOSCOW.

The government announced an amnesty decree under which all persons serving five years or less in prisons, corrective labor camps and other places of detention will be freed, provided such persons were not sentenced for counter-revolutionary crimes, large scale theft or embezzlement of public property, gangsterism or premeditated murder.

Persons serving more than five years will have their sentences reduced by half, and some prisoners will be freed regardless of the length of their sentences. Included in this group are women with children ten years old or less, pregnant women, minors under 18, men over 55 and women over 50 and those suffering from incurable illnesses."

On Tuesday, a conference was held at the Soviet Control Commission office at Karlshorst on Tuesday between British and Russian officials to study air safety in divided Germany.

GERMANY.

Chancellor Adenauer addressing the youth section of the Christian Democratic Party this week remarked that the new Kremlin rulers had. recently caused world-wide flutters with what sounded like tentative peace feelers.

The Chancellor said, "In my opinion, there is only one possible policy toward Russia, that is : first, that every genuine peace feeler must be investigated and grasped. Scond, we must remember that the temptation for Soviet policy to do

something else than seek peace that is, to embark on some adventure is so strong that the West must continue unswervingly its policy of building up its defences. That is the only way for us. "and the European Defence Community is part of this building-up.

It is an instrument to secure peace in every direction.

By joining Germany and France in an European army, we would also prevent any future war between our two countries a war which would destroy Europe for all time.'




