kick leather balls as a 1st class player when he was only 14 years old. His team at that time was Young Curacao. Young Kemp was still going to school. He

continued playing for this team until he came to Aruba and joined "Las Estrellas" a Curacaoan Club on the island.

But Mundo's roaming days in the world of football had started and when he found himself listed among the players who won the island's championship for San Nicolas Juniors in 1940 he was also an ex-member of Unidos. From then until this writing his team has been Aruba Juniors, with time off from 1940 to 1945 to defend the "Savaneta Camp" ball honors with the men in uniform.

More significant than this change-over movement, however, was Mundo's performance on the field. Followers of the game and the authorities who make selections of all-star teams cannot visualize such a team without Mundo in the 'must' line-up.

This is not surprising. While many fans automatically think of a full back when Mundo's name is mentioned, there is no position on the field where he cannot perform equally good. Both as a defensive and an offensive player he stands out.

Aruba as well as Curacao have therefore found it very convenient to "take Mundo along" when tough going was anticipated. Trips between Aruba and Curacao are so numerous that no attempt will be made to list them. But a look at his trips to foreign lands include: Venezuela, with Jong Holland (Cur.) 1942; Surinam, with A.V.B. in 1944 and with Aruba Jrs. in 1950; Haiti, with RCA at their request in 1948; Guatemala with Antillean team in 1950; Helsinki (Olympic games) with Antillean team 1952 and Costa Rica with Antillean team 1953. Between trips abroad he defended Aruba's colors locally against Beta Fogo (Brasil),

Surinam, B.G., La Salle (Ven.), and Millonarios (Colombia).

He also took part in several inter-land series played in Curacao, and played as one of Lago's All-stars against CPIM this year.

Little wonder is it that Mundo has a selection of trophies and medals that would create the impression that he is a jeweler rather than a ball player. Also impressive is his picture album.

There is more that makes Raymond Kemp a popular "man about town", for Mundo has a voice that makes many a gal swoon. This became evident when he made his debut as singer for the Conjunto "Havana Boys", of which he later became the manager. Between offers from Speen Linscheer's orchestra and others, Mundo finally made his stand with "Happy Hit" as singer and manager.

During outings with his band, Mundo has been and is often tempted to take a try at the bottle but so far he has stuck to his resolution to reach the ripe old age of 100 by staying away from tobacco and alcohol.

### LAGO COMMITTEE PLAN HITS SPOTLIGHT AS LADY IS NOMINATED CANDIDATE.

Mrs. Adeline de Vries made history in Lago this week as she accepted nomination as candidate for the Lago Commissary Advisory Committee.

It is the first time in the history of the Lago Oil & Transport Company that a lady was nominated to serve on an employee representative Committee for locally-hired

employees. The nomination was made last Wednesday and accepted by the candidate.

Mrs. de Vries, who was born in Surinam, is the wife of Mr. Otto de Vries of the Lago's Accounting Department, and mother of 3 children — two girls, one boy. She is a resident of Lago Heights.

Off and on she has been in Lago's employ as a stenographer for approximately 7 years; first from 1942 to 1947 and again from 1951 to date. She is well known in local social and cultural circles and, like most all other housewife-mothers, is an authority on food and

prices.

The Nominating Committee certainly deserves praise for their insight in a really urgent need. The Commissary Committee definitely needs the benefit of a woman's experience and thinking where household matters are concerned and the general opinion is that Mrs. de Vries will receive every possible support from the voters. The election is scheduled for May 27, 28 & 29.

### OBSERVER'S REPORT INDICATES CRASHED CESSNA WAS OVERLOADED.

In a report submitted to the local Aeronautics Supervisory Committee, Mr. H. C. M. Hakkenberg van Gaasbeek, head of the Department of Aeronautics in the Netherlands Antilles, stated that it has been established that the Aruban plane, which recently crashed off Higerote with 5 British Guianese on board, was considerably overloaded (too much baggage) when it left Barcelona.

The Venezuelan Committee for the Supervision of Air Navigation conducted an investigation in which Mr. Hakkenberg van Gaasbeek, as member of the Antillean Commission T. L., participated as observer. Mr. W. J. Kelder, chief of Technical Division of the K.L.M. also acted as a member of the Committee. These two members of the Antilles were in Venezuela on March 29 & 30.

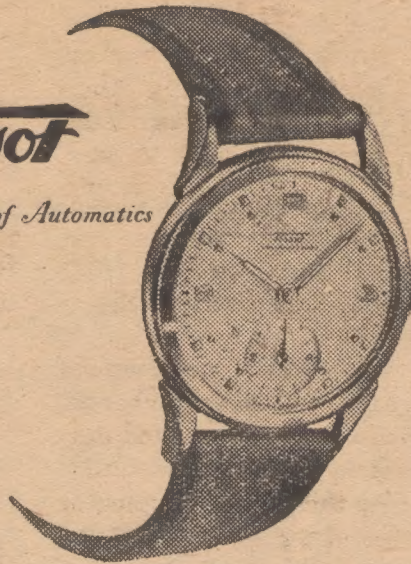

zuelan Committee was in compliance with the rules prescribed by the ICAO (International Civil Aeronautics organization). According to this ruling, the committee for supervision of aeronautics of the country where the plane accident takes place is obligated to institute an investigation and to submit a report thereon to all parties concerned. In this instance, the Venezuelan and N. A. governments, and the ICAO. Observers can be added to this committee from the country of origin of the plane.

Pending the receipt of the final report from Venezuela, Mr. Hakkenberg van Gaasbeek has prepared a report covering his own observations in which it was stated that the PJAAM was overloaded at the time of the crash. According to Mr. Hakkenberg van Gaasbeek, this should not necessarily have fatal results, but it is assumed that one of the motors failed and may even have been entirely out of commission when preparations were made for the start in Barcelona. The plane did return to the hangar because there was something wrong

with the magneto of one of the motors. After repairs were made, the plane took off and the suspicion that it flew with a not properly operating engine is not imaginary.

From the wreckage that washed ashore, it was determined that the plane fell vertically into the sea. The time that the plane fell into the sea may also be determined with some accuracy as the people living near the coast saw the wreckage wash ashore.

The accident should be ascribed, says the report, to lack of sense of responsibility on the part of the pilot who presumably had motor trouble with an overloaded plane.

The pilot of the plane was Mr. Edward de Freitas. Others on board at the time of the crash were Messrs: Oscar Nascimento, Eric Jardine, Joseph Castilho and Henry Abraham, all from British Guiana. They were on their way back to work following a short vacation in BG. All were Lago employees.

**SARMAAT RE-INSTATED**

Mr. O. Sarmaat, employee of the Lago, who was recently charged with immoral acts committed during working hours, received a letter from the Public Prosecutor in Oranjestad last Saturday, April 11, in which the accused was informed that he will not be exposed to persecution.

Such decisions normally are arrived at, if no or insufficient grounds are found present for legal action, and it may therefore be assumed that the charges against Mr. Sarmaat were either untrue or exaggerated.

The accused who had been originally discharged, was reinstated by the Lago and returned to his job last Monday, April 13, 1953. Mr. Mingus, vice-president of the Lago, said Mr. Sarmaat, had informed him that the "discharge" clause in his employment status will be reversed. The period of his inactivity will be recorded as a suspension from work.

## DR. ODUBER'S DUPLICATE TEAM-OF-SCORE DOMINOES SYSTEM SCORES HIT.

Dr. Oduber, his assistants and the Aruba Tivoli Club management certainly deserve every bit of credit for the invention and the splendid arrangements which, no doubt, will go a long way in elevating the game in Aruba.

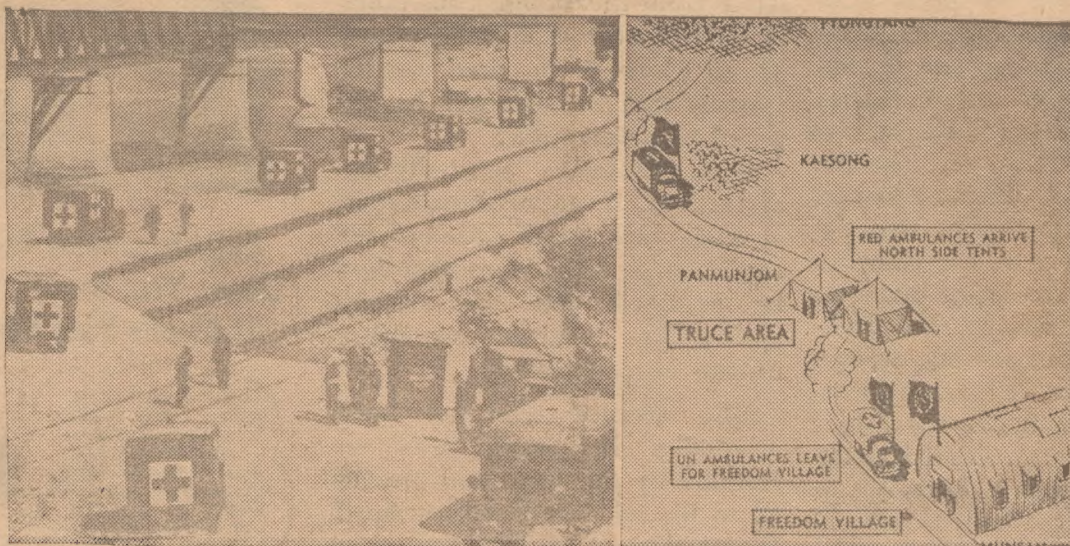

On Tuesday the trucks carrying the United Nations prisoners left the Communist camps near the Yalu River border of Manchuria and arrived at the Communist armistice camp at Kaesong on Friday. The actual exchange of prisoners will begin on Monday morning.

ENGLAND

On Monday British West Indian politicians and their advisers started talks to determine whether the British West Indies should federate.

The conference was presided over by Mr. Oliver Lyttelton, Secretary of State for the Colonies. Mr. Lyttelton, in welcoming the delegates, their advisers and observers from British Guiana and British Honduras, expressed the view that although federation might be slow to mature, the task facing them now was to look ahead and determine the policy in relation to the long term and enduring consideration of public interest.

He declared that the delegates must not be impressed by difficulties but must look to the economic advantages of federation. Every scheme of federation involves sacrifice by constituent states, but the West Indies can hardly expect to develop and merchant their resources to the best advantages in separate small units. The present age seems to be one calling for large units and if they decided to federate, they will be following the trend of today.

Mr. Renwick of Grenada in his opening speech declared that Federation is the only highway on which the West Indies can travel to economic and political independence.

**MISSING FLYER'S BROTHER GIVES STORY TO B.G. PRESS.**

Charles Jardine, employee of Lago and brother of Eric Jardine, one of the five Lago employees missing on a return flight from British Guiana to Aruba, gave the B.G. press last week a detailed account of his efforts to find traces of his brother and companions.

After the non-appearance of the local boys Jardine went to Venezuela, in company with Cletus Matthews, another Lagoite, and joined in the search of the Venezuelan coast and off-shore in the vicinity of the crash. The search was carried out by plane and boat.

They found the wing of the plane a tire and a back rest. They dragged a great stretch of sea fifteen miles by four for possible discovery of the body of the plane, but without success.

*Charles gave the opinion that the fliers might have landed in some obscure part of the Venezuelan coast, since the pilot would have stuck close to the coast on the flight from Barcelona to Higuero where the wreckage was found, and at any sign of trouble could have landed on the coast. This has raised hopes in British Guiana that the men may be found.*

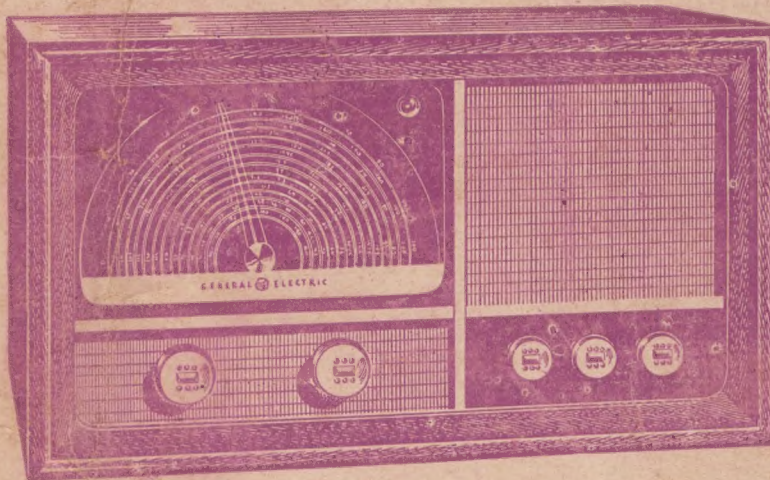
