Café Kunsthuis is officially open!

A delightful experience can be found at the Oranjestad Kunsthuis, directly across from Fort Zoutman in Oranjestad. The art gallery, featuring the work of some of the island's finest artists has opened their cozy café with a European flair where Aruba's art community likes to gather and socialize.
