This past Saturday night the Don Elias Mansur Ballpark was filled with love as the 'Dynamic Duo" of Graham Russell and Russell Hitchcock, better known as Air Supply provided one of the most exciting concerts Arubans have ever witnessed.

Afterwards, the stars of the show spent some time at the back of the stadium giving a brief "meet and greet" with their fans, signing autographs and posing for pictures, something they revealed they always do after every show. The "after party" show, starring top island performer Claudius Phillips and Oreo was just that, one big party, as everyone began dancing in the aisles until well into the wee hours of the morning.

Aruba is known for its concerts featuring chart-topping groups from the past, and though billed as "A Night of Romance" the Air Supply concert put on by Edmond Croes and Top 95 FM was exhilarating and dynamic, enjoyed by all ages that attended, the songs and performances spanning generations. As Russell Hitchcock stated "the music is timeless," and the consummate showmanship of he and Graham Russell made it a concert and night to remember.
