

The first annual "Aruba Way" Golf Tournament raises \$55,000. for the Washington Center for Children

On Saturday, September 2, the Tierra del Sol Golf Course and Country Club conducted the first "Aruba Way" golf tournament, a charity affair to raise substantial funds for the Centro Juvenil Washington. Twenty-two four-man teams made their way around the beautiful Robert Trent-Jones Jr. golf course, donating \$2,500 per team to enjoy a convivial afternoon of golf. Afterwards they relaxed with a delicious buffet awards dinner on the Tierra del Sol terrace. Tournament fees will all be donated to the center and the day of golf was donated by of Tierra del Sol, while Valero Refinery donated the trophies and dinner. The "Aruba Way" is a charitable program sponsored by Valero Refinery Aruba, which gets its main funds from donations made by Valero Refinery employees. They specify a percentage of their salaries to be deducted, and the refinery matches that amount, which will produce 500,000 Arubian florins to be donated to worthy causes on Aruba for the year 2005. This tournament will provide an additional substantial sum to the Washington Center, allowing some desperately needed repairs to their sports facility. The Washington Center is used by youth organization all over the island for the activities of various youth sport leagues, and, in addition, a venue for holiday and summer camps.

The First Place winners of the Aruba Way Tournament was a team that likes to keep in all in the family from GTC Petro Advance, a sub contractor of Valero, with the four man team of Feldman, Feldman, Feldman, and Feldman, which boasted a net score of 51.8. Second Place trophies went to Total Safety, and the Stork Wescar Aruba team was declared the third place winner. David Smith, Community and Government Affairs Director of Valero, and Oliver Riding, Head Golf Pro of Tierra del Sol awarded special prizes to Merrick Alpert for the longest drive, and Steve Wescott for Nearest to the Pin. David Smith, with a beaming countenance, was proud to hand over a check for 90,000 Arubian Florins to the Board of the Centro Juvenil Washington.

In one last gesture during his tenure in Aruba, before moving up the ladder in a position in San Antonio, Martin Parrish, former Vice-President and General Manager of Valero Refinery Aruba gave a brief thank you to the gathering for their generosity and participation. He then conducted a raffle for an all expense paid trip for two to the Valero Open Golf Tournament in San Antonio, Texas, which was claimed by a representative of Todeke, N.V.

The first annual Aruba Way Golf Tournament was a great success, raising a substantial sum of money, which Pro Oliver Riding described as a sum with which the Washington Center "could really accomplish something important."
