A new crop of doctors receive their white coats from the Xavier University School of Medicine

Friday evening, December 8, the Xavier University School of Medicine (XUSOM) hosted a gala event at the Renaissance Convention Center to welcome and honor a new group of graduates completing their studies. The entire student body attended, many with their parents that had traveled to the island for the occasion, to see the ritual donning of a white coat that signifies the eighteen graduates have completed very difficult studies and earned the title of "Doctor."

It was a very proud moment for the parents of the graduates and the faculty of XUSOM, headed by Dr. Cecil Bennett, who traveled from their headquarters in Atlanta for the occasion. He welcomed the gathering and gave some words of sage advice to the new doctors, applauding them for their great achievement.

Hosting the event and acting as Master and Mistress of Ceremonies were students John Garcelon, and, of Aruba, Mila Ponson. Dr. Gil Apacible, Dean of Basic Sciences announced the graduates, who then chose the individual they would care to have assist them in donning their personally monogrammed doctor's coats, a gift from the school. Dr. Gil also announced those receiving special honors for academic achievement. Dr. Bennett revealed that the school, little more than one year after its inception is now host to a student body of 220 between both campuses, and expects that to grow to 500 by this time next year.
