

A500P on its exclusive way for UK

Commodore tell John Butters what the Amiga's getting for Christmas

AT AN exclusive press briefing recently, Commodore told *Amiga Computing* that the A500 Professional will go on sale in the UK early next year and gave details of other plans for the Amiga family.

The A500P, which has been available in the States for several months, is based on the A500 but is fitted with the enhanced chip set, one megabyte of memory and runs the Workbench 2 operating system.

The enhanced chip set includes the Super Agnes and Super Denise chips which give the computer improved sound and graphics, and Workbench 2 is an improved version of the operating system with a more attractive appearance and added features.

While Commodore have not fixed a price or marketing plan for the machine, experts believe the price will stay at or close to the current £399.99.

The move casts doubt on whether A500 owners will have an option to upgrade their operating system to Workbench 2 but as Amiga Computing exclusively confirmed last month,

upgrades for other models in the family will be available by the end of the year. But even before A500Ps arrive, standard A500s are to have one megabyte of memory.

The computer has always had half a megabyte of ram, and for several months had a 512K upgrade included in the box. The extra power will make the A500 an attractive buy for most home applications, such as wordprocessing and accounts.

The new version, which could be available before Christmas, will have the additional memory already fitted to the motherboard and its price will remain at £399.99.

It will feature in the Cartoon Classics bundle, which will be at the centre of a £3.5 million television advertising campaign during Christmas.

The A500 is the firm's best selling version of the Amiga, with 675,000 units already in the UK and a forecast of growth of a further 180,000 by the end of this year.

With 1991 sales of 250,000, the Amiga remains the best selling home

computer in the country. The computer's success has led to the firm building a \$9.1 million assembly plant in the Philippines.

To be opened in February 1993, the factory will be used for overspill production from the company's existing

Hong Kong assembly line which turns out "hundreds of thousands" of machines each year.

Meanwhile, the firm's German plant in Braunsweig will continue to manufacture computers higher in the Amiga range.

First 040 for A3000

AS the A2000 sees new 68040 accelerators nearly each month, *Amiga* Computing has received details of the first 68040 board for the A3000.

Denver-based Progressive Peripherals and Software have just released the Progressive 040/3000 which plugs into the computer's processor slot beneath the floppy disk drive.

Using software supplied with the A3000, users can switch between the machine's original 68030 and the 040/3000. Under the increased power, a 16MHz A3000 will run at six times its normal speed and a 25MHz A3000 will be four times faster.

The chip's performance is rated at 19.2 MIPS and it has a built in maths

co-processor. The accelerator does not have additional memory and costs \$1,795.

Progressive are also to send Video Blender to the UK. A professional video switching system for all versions of the Amiga, it provides video switching, genlocking, local background screen colour generation in 16 million colours and a variety of video fades. A stereo sound mixer is also included.

Video Blender can mix and manipulate composite video, NTSC RGB and Amiga RGB video outputs, and an internal colour generator produces up to 16 million background colours. The unit is also PAL compatible.

Video Cameras and 24-bit frame-

buffers can be attached to the set up to give special video effects.

Multiple video inputs can be synchronised without time-base corrector hardware and stereo audio channels can be synchronised with video.

It has full linear keying over 256 levels, so superimposed graphics can be anti-aliased to just about any degree the user wishes.

Controlled through the Amiga's serial port, the compact unit enables 256 levels of red, green and blue colours to be mixed.

An unlimited number of wipes and other effects are available through MixMaster software. UK pricing for both on calling Marcam (081-941 6117).

Amiga makes French music

MUSIC program Audio Sculpture is the first Amiga package to come from French company Expose Software.

It is described as being a powerful music tool which enables users to create music from the beginning to the end. Tools include a high quality soundtracker, a sampler which includes a sample editing interface and sound synthesis which allows synthesiser type sounds to be generated.

A data disk is supplied which has modules and samples and the program is accompanied with an "easy to understand" manual. It will be distributed in the UK for £49.99 by the Software Management Group who can be contacted on 0274 566155.

Card avoids bottlenecks

USERS of graphics applications on A2000s are being targeted for a new 68040 accelerator card from California-based Computer System Associates (010 1 619 566 3911).

The card, which makes the computer run at three times the speed of the fastest 68030-based Amiga, enables several "performance bottlenecks" to be bypassed.

CSA describe the 40/4 Magnum as a single board computer, rather than just an accelerator, and it works by taking as much processing work as possible from the motherboard.

At 4.5in by 13.8in, the board plugs directly into the A2000's CPU slot and uses a Motorola 68040 running at 25MHz.

It is supplied with one megabyte of static ram and currently supports 4, 8, 12 or 16 megabytes of Dynamic ram. sixty-four megabytes of Dram is expected to be available by January, when a number of manufacturers will be releasing 16Mb, 32-bit SIMM modules.

"Installing an SBC like the 40/4 Magnum is like adding a second, more powerful 1992-model engine, transmission and cargo trailer to your favourite 1985-model car," said CSA's Steve Riker.

"Not only can you drive faster and haul more luggage, you can still put in the same kind of gas as before and still CDTV gets CES support

COMMODORE used the recent trade only Computer Entertainment Show to demonstrate several new CDTV software products but were quiet on anything new for the Amiga.

Falcon is a compact disc version of the Amiga shoot-'em-up flight simulator which has you completing several missions at the controls of an F-16 fighter. The most noticeable difference is the sound, with includes an impressive flight briefing with realistic speech.

Trivial Pursuit comes from Domark and the main advantages of the CDTV technology are seen in the questions, with each having a digitised picture relevant to the subject and sound.

The Guinness CD hold all records found in the book but by making the most of the increased storage capacity manages to add illustrations and sound to the software.

The company were expected to unveil their new CD-rom drive which will enable A500s to use the CDTV's compact discs but because EMAP chose to make the show trade only, had to re-think their strategy for the different audience.

Experts believe that the A690 will now be shown for the first time at the World of Commodore Show to be held in London on the 15-17 November 1991. Commodore's Andrew Ball claims that between 35 and 65 per cent of the existing A500 user base wants the drive for "wild and wacky"

DLG PROFESSIONAL is a communications program being aimed at high-end hobbyists and the professional bulletin board market that has just been released for the Amiga.

The program is made up of a group of interrelated modules and commands rather than a single large application to enable it to have a low memory overhead and full multi-user, multi-tasking of all functions and operations.

DLG Professional's features include multi-line capability, conferencing, compatibility with FidoNet electronic mail and echomail conferencing protocols and UseNet, a network used by researchers, software firms, universities and governments.

The software is based on AmigaDOS, which enables standard CLI-based programs to be incorporated into a DLG bulletin board set-up. Standard functions of messaging and file transfer are included such as message broadcasting, tagging, bundling and downloading, off-line reading and sysop-configurable file-transfer protocols.

A London-based sysop, Tony Miller, who has been testing the program told Amiga Computing: "With the introduction of DLG Pro as the host software, the user base of my BBS has nearly quadrupled in the year I have been running it and I have needed to add over 600 megs of hard disk to keep up with user demands."



ADPro gets JPEG compression

THE AMIGA has received its first software package to use Joint Photographic Expert Group (JPEG) image compression technology.

JPEG modules have now become a standard part of ASDG Incorporated's Art Department Professional and will enable such files to be loaded and saved. Using this compression technique a true colour or greyscale image can be cut to a fraction of its size without noticeable degradation.

The user specifies how much compression should take place and the firm claims that results of 80 to 1 or better are possible. People using the Amiga in video, print and other imaging related work will be able to keep more images online in a manageable fashion and transmit them more easily.

ADPro files meet the JFIF standard which enables images created on other computers such as IBM PCs and Apple Macintoshes to be exchanged with its own. The UK distributor is Silica Systems (081-309 1111).





THE 1991 North American Amiga Developer's Conference was held in Denver, Colorado - the Mile-High City -September 3 to 7. As I write this, I'm flying home from the conference, feeling awfully good about the future of the

Unfortunately, most of what was discussed at this year's DevCon is under strict non-disclosure. Developers can't talk about what's coming until after Commodore officially announce any

However, you can take heart in knowing that evidence abounded at DevCon that issues such as better graphics. sound, and new Amiga markets are high priorities in Commodore's future plans.

While the lay offs announced last month were a bit disconcerting, Commodore still have more employees in research and development than in most years previous, and they're hard at work developing neat stuff. One of the highlights of DevCon occurred when members of the CDTV and AmigaDOS release 2 development teams paraded

through the Developer's Showcase to the tune of Lemmings. Resplendent in green mop-hair, the large-as-life Lemmings bounced down the stairs, climbed over obstacles, and jumped off hotel furniture carrying umbrellas.

Finally, Bryce Nesbitt and Leo Schwab, blockers extraordinaire, exploded in a blast of confetti and the Lemmings escaped into an elevator, to the applause and laughter of most of the 265 developers in attendance.

You're not overburdened with minute details like many of the hex-based war games. The computer takes care of minutia such as unit strengths and movement limits. You simply move your units and tell them where to fire.

The game includes 14 scenarios ranging from the simple, speedy First Battle to the more complex Patton Kicks Butt. You have a variety of units at your command, ranging from infantry and tanks to engineers who can build mines and bridges. You can play against the computer, against another player on the same Amiga, or against

another Amiga or PC running Light Task being fired upon by Light Task the Perfect General using a modem.

The game is hard diskinstallable, and uses only word-lookup protection. There's a lot of gameplay here for \$59.95.

ProWrite Perfected

ONE of the first developers to announce a product that takes advantage of 2.04's CG font technology is New Horizons (010 1 512 328 6650), makers of the ProWrite wordprocessor. ProWrite 3.2, which should be available by the time you read this, will automatically use

larger sized fonts and scale them down to printer resolution when printing. If you're running Workbench 1.3 and have a larger bitmap of the current font in your FONTS: directory, you should see a decent improvement. Output from a 2.04 system, though, will be at your printer's highest resolution, resulting in true jaggy-free printing.

Other improvements include a new "3D look" user interface, even under Kickstart 1.3, key equivalents in requesters, direct insertion of text files into ProWrite documents, exporting of files in Professional Page text format, automatic timed saving of backup files, and a more flexible macro menu, which will allow you to give ARexx macros real names, instead of "Macro 1" and so on.

You no longer need the ProScript add-on to output to PostScript printers. All of ProWrite's features, including fonts, styles, colour, and columns are now supported in PostScript output. If you have a colour printer, you'll be delighted by ProWrite 3.2's improved colour support. Pictures now preserve their original colour palette – when they're displayed onscreen they automatically map to the closest approximate screen colour. Also, when you resize a

picture down and then up in size, the picture doesn't come out blocky any more - the original data is preserved.

Many ProWrite users love everything about the program except its Macintosh-like file requester. Now, Workbench 2.04 users can choose to use the system-standard ASL requester instead. ProWrite 3.2 also adds support for release 2.04's Public Screen feature, so you can now open the wordprocessor on another screen. For instance, you could use it to take notes as text scrolls by on your comms program's screen.

Registered ProWrite owners will be sent upgrade information through the mail. ProWrite 3.2 retails for \$175. Upgrades from ProWrite 3.0 or 3.1 are \$20; from 2.0 or 2.5, \$60; and from 1.0 or 1.1, \$75. Shipping and handling is \$5 in the US, \$10 for other countries.



Script

Artistic history

In order to find out a little more about the artistic background of The Chart Show, I spoke to Louise Hadley, the woman behind the show's graphic design and one of the leading lights in the field of computer generated graphics.

As it turned out, Louis revealed that many of the familiar animations and graphic effects employed by the show are, in TV terms, rather dated.

As a result, on December 1 the show will be undergoing a complete face-lift thanks to a whole range of new techniques and equipment, some of which may well be added thanks to the Amiga, which along with other systems is beginning to revolutionise TV graphics.

The Amiga's arrival in such lofty graphic circles is down to the recent explosion of 24-bit boards and paint packages which are about to turn the TV world upside down - they are already making their mark in everything from game shows to television advertising.

In the past much of The Chart Show's artwork has been provided thanks to Quantel's Paintbox which has long been the industry standard in 24-bit art. Now that's all changed thanks to the Amiga's 24-bit abilities. Nevertheless it's still worth looking back at how things used to be in the bad old days..

Apart from Paintbox, a three dimensional system entitled Dubner has been the mainstay of most of the show's graphic output. This is the hardware responsible for the famous plane and rocket sequences and indeed the majority of special animations such as the Exclusive Release animation and many more besides.

Other systems such as Cubicomp are at the controls of the flames which blaze from the rear of the rocket. When all of the elements are complete the entire package is brought together with the aid of Paintbox.

Having mentioned all of this high power and high price hardware, it's perhaps easy to forget that some of the most interesting graphic effects needn't cost the earth. The opening roller-coaster sequence is a prime example.

This particular piece of wizardry is the product of a cameraman throwing caution to the wind and braving the worst that Alton Towers could throw at him. After the live action was captured on film, the shots were edited back in the studio and then each frame was hand painted using the Paintbox and a production technique known

Apart from the new look provided by the next generation of hardware, there could be an added mystery name appearing all over the glossy graphics of the show.

An unnamed sponsor is about to lend its financial muscle to the enterprise but unfortunately, even after my best efforts as an investigative reporter, I couldn't glean any more than a "no comment" as to the identity of the mystery backer.

As a result I'm afraid we'll all have to wait to find out which of the corporate giants intend to make the best even better.

Designing a font should be within everyone's grasp thanks to the Workbench Extras disk which every Amiga owner should have hidden away in the back of a long-forgotten disk box. If you boot the disk you'll find a utility entitled FED which funnily enough stands for Font Editor. With the aid of this handy little utility you shouldn't have any problem creating your very own designer font.

If the prospect of creating a complete character set fills you with more apprehension than any amount of icons, don't despair - it's perfectly acceptable to load a standard Amiga font and modify it to your own design, but remember - the more original the design, the more likely it is to win.

An important point is to make sure you create a full character set, not just the letters - a complete range of numerical characters is required as well as all the essential quotation marks, commas, colons and so on.

The only restriction to your calligraphic exploits is the point size of the font itself, which must be between 12

and 19 point. You can design as many fonts within this range as you like. But remember your entry is not valid if the fonts are smaller than 12 point or bigger than 19 point.


Producing the goods

Designing your icons is simplicity itself and can be done either with one of the many icon creation utilities that lurk within the public domain or by employing Dpaint to produce suitable brushes which can then be transformed into icons for use with the appropriate information boxes.

The advantage of using icon creating utilities such as IconMaster and Icon Magic is the addition of the Pattern Fill option which effectively gives you four extra paint effects to add to the original four colours of the Workbench screen.

This is done by alternating colours in a fill function to give a fine mesh effect which can be applied to any filled area within an icon.

When these extra pattern effects are applied to the secondary image of a twin picture icon, its animated effect can be greatly enhanced thanks to the Amiga's familiar double clicking pro-



cess. If you're unfamiliar with icon creators, any good PD library will happily supply the necessary program complete with documents which will guide you through the finer points.

Regular readers will be glad to know that they could already have the necessary software among their coverdisk collection, the most recent example being Huge, the icon utility that was given away in the March issue of Amiga Computing.

Workstation owners also have a head start thanks to what has become the most popular of all icon creators, namely IconMaster, which is just one of the many utilities waiting within the disk.

If we assume that you're equipped with either a copy of Dpaint or a suitable utility, the next job is to create your icons. With an icon editor all that's required is an idea and vou're off.

For Dpaint fans things are a little more complex. First you must specify the correct resolution which has to be medium-res, and in order to save confusion later on the available colours should also be set, to eight.

When the design stage of



your project finally gets under way, remember to keep your icons to reasonable proportions in relation to the screen. If you're familiar with The Chart Show, as I'm sure you are, you'll have a good idea of what's required.

If you're one of our many European and American readers or even those further afield this translates to about the size of a postage stamp for each of the 12 icons.

This size restriction applies to both the first and second stage of the icon so don't let you imagination run too wild as far as size is concerned – after all, the viewers still want to get a look at the artists, not just the icons and – of course – the juicy details they reveal.

Competition essentials

- The first necessity for any entry are the 12 individual icons, all of which must have a double image like those used in our normal coverdisk, an example of which can be seen in the IconMaster example.
- Each icon must be named and a short description should be added as an Ascii file on the disk which contains your entry. If you prefer to enter written details, ensure that your text is marked with any entry details.
- Make sure your designer font is included on the disk and is labelled "Filename.font".
- Don't forget to label the disk itself with your name, address and phone number, if you have one. This also applies to any printed material included with you entry.

Behind the screens

........................

It's just gone quarter past twelve on a humid Friday afternoon as my taxi pulls up outside an anonymous, tall and otherwise uninteresting building in the heart of London's Soho.

I have arrived at what the broadcast industry has come to know as a "facilities house". This is basically a high-tech hotel where TV programme makers can rent rooms or "suites" packed full of video equipment. The sort of kit

needed to edit a programme to broadcast quality is awesomely accurate and toe-curlingly expensive. When you consider that some suites cost well over £500 an hour to rent you get some idea of the scale of

hardware investment we are talking about.

There are thousands of edit suites in London's West End where programmes are finished off by produ

ished off by production teams working to strict standards and tight deadlines.

After paying the taxi I am escorted to a small room hidden up several staircases separated by sharp corners and fire doors.

I am now in "Edit 2" of "Wiseman", where The Chart Show's producer Phil Davey is just putting the finishing touches to part one of tomorrow's show

Go with the flow

The Chart Show is enjoyed every week by over two and a half million viewers, so it's important that every cut and link is just right. If an editor has done his job properly, you won't be aware of the joins. A good programme should flow. This is especially true of The Chart Show, where there are no presenters to take up slack or fill in gaps. Every single video is linked by graphics sequences. Some wipe, some fade, some mix but they all bind the programme together.

It takes a complete working day to get one Chart Show down on tape. This might seem a long time for around 50 minutes of television, but by most recognised standards it is positively speedy. The programme uses a whole range of technologies and techniques to achieved its high-tech look and feel. Vision mixers, character generators, and a bank of video recorders all combine to produce that unmistakable look.

We are not here to admire the moni-

tors or flashing lights though. At the end of the control desk sits the computerised star of the show. A lone Amiga 2000 complete with external drive is responsible for the generation and display of The Chart Show's icons and information boxes.

The Chart Show uses a custom piece of software which allows an operator to input the information you seen in the dialogue boxes and then decide which icon will display it. The system is by no means as ornate as it could be. Ease of use has taken priority over features, but that's only sensible considering the fast moving environment within which it is being employed.

Compare the cost of the Amiga with the rest of Wiseman's kit in "Edit 2" and the humble 2000 is almost disposable. However the graphics input our trusty machine provides to The Chart Show has proven it invaluable.

Those Amiga icons have become The Chart Show's hallmark, just as the Amiga is starting to become the hallmark of quality video work with the onset of 24-bit paint systems and Amiga controlled editors. There's an exciting time ahead.





If you already own an earlier release of Prodata, skip these pages and dive straight into the program. The support material in these pages is strictly for those who've never used the program, and especially those who wouldn't know a database from a tin of sardines.

Right, first things first! Grasping the key firmly between thumb and forefinger, twist gently until the tin is open, being careful not to spill any of the vegetable oil, as this can make a real mess of your Amiga keyboard. See what I mean? How many of you were examining the disk for a key? None of you? Oh.

The program

Don't worry if you're a database beginner – at its most basic level, Prodata is an absolute doddle. Once you get your head round the jargon, you'll be creating your own databases with gay abandon.

To launch the program, double click on the coverdisk's icon. Double clicking on the Prodata program icon will load an information screen from which you can press any key to start Prodata. Alternatively, you can launch the program from the ShortCut menu at the top of your coverdisk Workbench screen. Don't at this stage press Return

for the list of files as the screen suggests. There aren't any on the disk, so our first job will be to create one. Be warned: There's not much free space on the disk, so to save a decent sized database you may need to copy Prodata or delete, say, the machine code drawer (always ensure you're using a backup!). Hold down the right mouse button and select Create New Database from the "File" menu on the extreme left of the menu bar.

You will now be asked to type in the name of the new database. Call it "coverdisks" and press Return. Two more questions on the general nature of the database will be put to you.

In answer to the first question, which asks if your database will allow duplicate entries in the index field, type Y. If you were to answer No to this question, the database wouldn't allow two records to have the same entry in the field it uses as the default index (field 1). Just press Return in answer to the second question. Fifteen characters is plenty for the labels we'll be giving to fields.

You should now be asked to type in the name of your first data field. The brackets to the left of the cursor indicate the field's parameters, but all you need know about them for the purposes of this tutorial is that the default field is a text string (hence the S) with a maximum length of fifty characters.

Our database will have four fields in each record, which you should name in the following order: "Program/File", "Disk No.", "Type of Program/File", and "Comments". As you type each one and press Return, you will be asked if you want your input checked to see if it is

the correct type for the field. Answer N to each question until you have the four fields named, press Return after the fourth, then Esc.

Data entry

Once the database form has been saved to disk, Prodata will ask if you want to password-protect the file. Answer in the negative for now, and press Return to go to data entry.

The demo version of Prodata will allow you to create databases with up to twenty records, so there's plenty of space to enter your favourite coverdisk programs of the past six months or so. At this stage, you should type in the relevant details for the programs you liked. As you fill each field, press Return






The American suppliers, INOVAtronics inadvertently shipped us a CanDo demo with a mistake in the archive that becomes the ExtrasDisk. If you still have the de-archived disks you can repair the fault by using the program you'll find in this month's coverdisk utilities drawer.

Make sure you have a backup of the de-archived ExtrasDisk (the second de-archived disk), then boot from the coverdisk, double click on the disk icon, then the Utilities icon, then on the FixCanDo icon. A script will be executed which will copy the missing files from the coverdisk to your ExtrasDisk, which you should then be able to make full use of.

UGA Fonts

The font included on your coverdisk is a sample from UGA's PowerFonts disk, containing ten fonts designed by Demo supremos such as Red Sector Inc. They are all presented in the form of DPaint IFFs, from which you cut each letter as a brush and paste it into your demo screen or message.

ated, press Return and Esc to exit Create mode. You will find you can now move back and forward through your database, one record at a time, using the cursor left-right arrow keys. To jump directly to the first record, press the control (Ctrl) key at the same time as the left arrow, and to skip to the end of your database, press Ctrl with the right cursor arrow key.

Once you're happy going back and forward through your database, it's time to carry out a Find operation. Go to the first record and select Find String from the Edit menu or type F. A cursor will appear in the strip at the bottom of the screen into which you should type the string you want to find.

Try the name of the program you entered in the second last record, and press Return. The disk will whizz as Prodata looks through your records, then the display should change to show the record containing the string you typed in. Prodata cannot search backwards, and will not continue on from the beginning of the database, so all searches should be started from record number one.

Layouts

The default Prodata layout is an uninspiring sight, designed to make it easy for the beginner to produce a straightforward list of records and get his or her database off the starting line. You can, however, make use of Prodata's flexible layout editor to radically alter the appearance of your records on screen and in print.

How to use the Disk

First of all, you must make a back-up copy of the coverdisk. To do this, boot up with your copy of Workbench, then double click on the Workbench disk icon, followed by the Shell or CLI icon. Now type:

DISKCOPY FROM DF0: TO DF0:

or, if you have an extra disk drive, put a blank, formatted disk in DF1: and type:

DISKCOPY FROM DF0: TO DF1:

Follow the onscreen prompts until the copying procedure has ended, then put your original disk away in a safe place. Now switch off the machine and wait for 30 seconds before rebooting with the copy. Wait until the CoverDisk17 icon appears, double click on it and away you go.

That's all you need do to make a straight copy of the entire disk. However, you may also want to to copy individual

programs from your copy of the coverdisk to a separate disk. In this case ensure that you fully understand which related files need to go with it.

For example, all of the document files on the disk require that the text editor PPmore is in the current disk's C: directory. Therefore, if you copy the docs to a new disk you will also have to copy PPmore to the new C: directory before you can read

Some of the smaller docs will not have been crunched, so for these you need only change the tool types on the icon's info screen to reflect whichever text editor you do have on the new disk.

As a general rule, you should carefully read the documentation for any program you copy from disk to disk.

This can save a great deal of messing about and can help you avoid all those infuriating error messages!



Hunter III

If you bought our April issue, you'll already have seen Hunter II, which was on that month's coverdisk. We decided to include the latest version because it has a couple of features which make it a much better all-round program - we think you'll

Hunter is a sample "ripper", which means it will chew out the bits of memory containing sound samples, then save them to disk for later use in your own programs or MED/Soundtracker tunes. For this to work, there must obviously be some samples available to rip, and there are several ways you can ensure this.

Because of the nature of memory chips, a warm reboot (holding down CTRL-Amiga-Amiga) will not flush their contents. This means that if you play a PD demo or a game, then carry out a warm reboot, the samples used in the game's or demo's music will usually be preserved in memory.

Hunter can take advantage of

the situation because it enables you to "playback" the contents of your computer's chip memory - where all samples are stored - until from among the hissing, crackling noises you hear a sample you'd like to keep. Once the sample has been found, you can isolate it using Hunter's Length and Start buttons until you have determined its exact location, then save it to disk.

The Start button determines where in memory the playback will begin, and the length button sets the amount of memory to be played through. By the judicious juggling of these two settings, it should be possible to home in on any sample present in your machine's memory, as these will stand out plain and clear from the background garbage that is the rest of your chip ram's contents.

If this process seems a little over complicated for your tastes, you can make use of Hunter's very fast search option. By clicking on one of the two buttons under the word Search, you can instruct Hunter to go through all chip memory in search either of an IFF sample or a Soundtracker-type module.

Neither is perfect, and both will often entirely miss a sample or module. They are both very fast, however, and it's a good idea to use them first, then resort to the longer and more tedious process of checking your memory piece by piece if they don't work.

The warm reboot method is the only way to rip samples from inaccessible software such as games or PD demos, but there are other ways of finding samples. Hunter III can load any sample, module, or tune into memory using its Load facility, then trawl through memory in the same way as before. Hunter III offers several improvements over Hunter II. The most useful from an Amos user's point of view is the facility to load Amos sample banks for examination, or to save samples as an Amos bank ready for use in Amos programs.

This facility makes Hunter the only choice of sample ripper for Amos fans and represents a major upgrade from v2.

The second major extra is Hunter III's ability to load PowerPacker data files, uncrunch them, and search them for samples. It seems these days as if everything has to be powerpacker compatible, so universal has it become as a cruncher, so Hunter's new PowerPacker-friendly version will ensure it isn't left out in the cold.

As an added extra, there is a palette control which you can bring up by clicking the right mouse button any time Hunter's window is active. This is designed to complement the Workbench 2 look of the main panel, an effect which can be unsuccessful if the screen colours are wrong.

> layouts, but for the moment you need only select Create New Layout, the last in the list. When asked, call the layout "flat", and press Return to go to the layout editor.

You must now define the layout's parameters. Most of these don't concern us as the flat layout will be a fairly

Type in the values shown in the box on this page to create a layout with records that appear as thin strips one above the other.

Since we allow 999 records per page, you can fit as many of your records on one screen as possible, making this sort of layout ideal for quickly glancing through the database.

When you've typed in all of the parameters, press Esc. The screen will change to a graphical representation of the layout, and field one will already be onscreen ready to be positioned. It needn't be moved as it's where we want it, so press F to call up a list of fields, and double click on field two.

The field will appear as a line of dashes on the editor screen, and will be highlighted to show that it is the currently selected field. We want to move it to the right of field one on the same line, so hold down the Shift key and use

the cursor keys to move the field across and up until it is in the correct position. Remember to leave a blank space between the two fields.

If you now press Esc, the layout will be saved to disk and your records will appear onscreen in their new form. Don't worry that only two fields are visible - the other two still exist. To swap layouts, choose "Select Layout" from the layout menu or press L. A list of the available layouts will appear and you can double click on the standard layout if you want to see all the data again.

Now that you've grasped the basic principles of layout creation, you can go on to create address labels, book record cards - the list is endless. To master the full power of Prodata, however, you'll need more advice than we can supply in these two pages, and for that the only source is the Prodata manual, available from Arnor when you buy the full version of the program!

PicSaver

PicSaver is a utility for saving screens or parts of screens as IFF files for later use in DPaint or any other Amiga art package. For example, all the Virus Checker windows grabbed for use in this month's disk pages were grabbed using PicSaver.

To run PicSaver, either click on its icon, or run it from CLI by typing

PicSaver <RETURN>

The program will automatically detach itself from the CLI to run in the background.

Three way split

In use, PicSaver offers three ways to save screens or parts of screens. All three involve holding down the left Alt-Shift-Ctrl keys at the same time. To save a full screen, hold down AltShift-Ctrl and the S key and the presently active screen will be saved once you've typed its name and save path into the file requester.

To save a window on its own, ensure that the desired window is active by clicking in it, then hold down Alt-Shift-Ctrl-W to bring up another save requester.

The third method involves holding down Alt-Shift-Ctrl with no other keys. A cross-hair will then appear on your mouse arrow, which you can use to cut out a portion of the screen in exactly the same way you'd cut out a brush in DPaint. Click with the left mouse button and drag the crosshairs until you've outlined the target area, then release the button and type your path and filename into the requester as normal.

To remove PicSaver, either run it again, or press Alt-Shift-Ctrl-Esc.

PPLoadSeq

PPLoadSeg is the answer to a disk compiler's dreams. Previously, using PowerPacker, it has been possible to crunch data files, such as documents, and executable program files so that we have been able to bring you much more than the standard 880K of programs on our coverdisks.

There is a group of files, however, which we've never been able to crunch. Workbench's libraries, fonts, device handlers, and so on have always had to go on the disk in their uncrunched states and have thus unavoidably used up a lot of space we could have used to bring you even more programs.

With the latest addition to the PowerPacker stable, you can crunch system files to your heart's content, then use them as normal as long as you include the PPLoadSeg command early on in your startup sequence. It then acts as a rom "patch"; replacing the Amiga's LoadSeg routine with its own, which recognises PowerPacked system files.

To use PPLoadSeg on any disk, simply copy it from our coverdisk to the C: directory of the target disk and alter its startup sequence to include the line PPLOADSEG. It is best if this line is one of the first in the startup sequence as PPLoadSeg should be activated before any system files are accessed.

Virus Checker

The recent outbreak of the Saddam file virus, a particularly nasty piece of work, prompted us to cast around for a good general purpose killer capable of dealing with the latest menaces. Virus Checker was the obvious choice.

Installation

You can run the program by clicking on its icon once Workbench has loaded, but by far the most efficient way to use it is to include it in the startup sequence of your hard drive or the disk from which you normally boot your system. If you continually reboot with different system disks, it's a good idea to put Virus Checker on its own disk and use it after each reboot.

To do this, take a blank, formatted disk, install a standard boot block using the command:

INSTALL DRIVE DFO: <RETURN>

then copy the program across to it from the coverdisk. You can do this by dragging the icons across on



It can learn any number of boot block viruses

Workbench, or by using the COPY command.

If you have two drives, boot from the coverdisk and place the blank disk in your external drive. Next, click in the CLI window left open at the bottom of the coverdisk main screen and type:

COPY UTILITIES/VIRUS_CHECKER TO DF1: ALL

The entire Virus Checker directory will be copied to the extra drive, and you should be able to run it at any time by

DF1: VIRUS_CHECKER <RETURN>

If you have a single drive, your best bet would be to load Virus Checker into ram at the start of the day. If using a wordprocessor, for example, you could then check each data disk before saving precious documents to it. To copy the program to another disk using a single

drive, activate the CLI window on the coverdisk's Workbench screen, and type:

COPY COPY TO RAM: <RETURN> COPY CD TO RAM: <RETURN> COPY UTILITIES/VIRUS_CHECKER TO RAM: ALL <RETURN> CD RAM: <RETURN>

Now insert the blank disk onto which Virus Checker is to be copied, and type:

COPY RAM:#? TO DEO: <RETURN>

If in future you need to use the program to check a number of disks, or would just like it close at hand, rename the disk as VIRUSCHECKER (no spaces), and type:

COPY VIRUSCHECKER: #? TO RAM: <RETURN>

You can now run Virus Checker by typ-

RAM: VIRUS_CHECKER <RETURN>

at any time.

Using Virus Checker

When activated, Virus Checker first checks memory for known viruses or suspicious vectors, and removes or disables those found.

The program next checks all floppy drives for known boot block viruses and alerts the user to their presence. At this stage, you have the option to display, ignore, or remove the virus.

Displaying the boot block will give



you a chance to gaze at a load of machine code which sometimes contains Ascii text from the coders of the virus. This can be of help of you're trying to decide whether a dodgy boot block is a virus or simply a custom

If the boot code displayed by Virus Checker includes a stupid message from the dork who wrote the virus, you can rest assured of its identity. Otherwise, the display function is just a


handy aid to nosy people like you and me. If the boot block is a new or unknown factor, a fourth option appears enabling a "learning" function. This adds the boot block to Virus Checker's "brain file", a sort of ID parade for boot blocks. Once a boot block is added to the brain file, Virus Checker will cease to alert you to its presence, saving loads of hassle if you have a lot of PD disks with messagestyle boot blocks.

Patriot missile system in the shape of his FixSaddam program. The program is designed to be used on disks already infected by Saddam and, when run, attempts to repair any damage inflicted by the virus.

There is no cure for disks which have been completely kippered by Saddam, but the virus will alter some blocks when it first infects a disk, and it is this damage that FixSaddam is intended to repair. To check a disk, put it in one of your drives, say DFO:, and type:

FixSaddam DFO: <RETURN>

The program will then cycle through all tracks on the disk, and will inform you when it finds Saddamised blocks.



There are several ways in which you can reduce the flicker on a television or standard monitor, such as the Philips CM8833 or the Commodore 1084. You can reduce the brightness level on the monitor, change the colours, buy an anti–glare screen filter or even wear sun-glasses. None of these methods will completely remove the flicker – they will just cut the levels down.


De-interlacers

If you have decided once and for all that the flicker must go no matter what the cost is, then you have only one option – buy a multisync monitor. Depending on what machine you are using you will probably need to buy a de-interlacer card as well. This converts the video output from the Amiga into a stable non-interlaced output that the multisync can display.

If you own an Amiga 500 there is only one de-interlacer currently available for you – the ICD Flicker Free Video board. This board plugs inside your Amiga 500 invalidating your warranty, and will probably not fit if you have accelerators or other internal hardware added. Once installed, a ribbon cable with a 9-pin monitor connector hangs out of the back of your machine. To this you can attach a multisync monitor.

If you want to play games, or work in low or medium resolution you will find that fast moving objects, like your mouse pointer, or anything that moves

in games, will blur to the point that a lot of games are totally unplayable. The only solution to this is to use a monitor connected to the standard Amiga output for these modes, either your original television or medium–resolution monitor, or your new multisync with an adaptor cable.

Video slot

The Amiga 1500 and 2000 provide a special video slot which allows easy installation of a de-interlacer card. There are two such cards available – the original Microway Flicker Fixer, a tried and tested design, and the Commodore A2320 card.

The Microway card has been around for a couple of years now and was, until they released their own card, strongly recommended by Commodore. It fits neatly into the

video slot with a 9-pin monitor output. Most modern multisyncs have 15-pin outputs rather than 9-pin, so you may need an adaptor to plug your monitor in.

Like the ICD board, it does not handle low or medium resolution very well, leaving you to either run two monitors or wire up a cable allowing you to switch between the Flicker Fixer and the standard 23-way output. The Microway card, unlike the ICD and Commodore card, is not compatible with the new ECS screen modes.

The Commodore A2320 card uses

the same de-interlace circuitry that is found in the Amiga 3000 which unlike the Microway and the ICD products, is intelligent. It will de-interlace all high resolution and interlace screens, but will double-scan low and medium resolutions screens.

This means that not only is the image free from blurring, but the thin black scanlines found on ordinary monitors have been removed. The result is a clean and sharp image, although it does make low resolution in particular seem rather blocky. It is certainly better than having to put up with two monitors or a switch box.

Switched off

If you don't like the blocky low res or for some bizarre reason you want to return to the flickery interlace, there is a disable switch on the card which will give you a standard Amiga image.

The Amiga 3000 does not need a de-interlacer, for it has an excellent de-interlacer built in to the machine. Any standard multisync monitor, including those listed below, will give a stable image in hi res.

There are a wide variety of multisync and similar monitors available which will work with the Amiga. Some of them will only work with the flicker-fixer installed and active, others will also work with the standard Amiga

output, or with the Commodore A2320 card in fall back mode. For PAL machines the monitor must be capable of 50Hz vertical frequency operation, which unfortunately rules out most cheap VGA monitors.

Monitors

When looking for a monitor there are a few things which you must take into consideration.

Firstly, it must be capable of a 50Hz verti-

cal sync frequency – as opposed to a 50Hz power supply frequency, which it must handle if sold in the UK. Otherwise your Amiga picture will continually roll around the screen with no way of stopping it.

Some monitors are capable of a 50Hz display despite it not being mentioned in the technical specifications. Also, if you want to use it with the standard Amiga output – either direct from the Amiga's 23-pin video port or by switching off the A2320 card – the monitor must be capable of a 15KHz horizontal sync frequency. Most larger monitors cannot handle this.

The second thing to check for is the screen quality. This is, of course, a complex thing to measure. Watch for the dot pitch – this is the distance between each group of red, green and blue dots



What is flicker?

Interlace flicker is unavoidable when using the Amiga with a television or a cheap colour monitor. This is because a single high-resolution screen cannot be fully displayed in a single video frame (1/50 second). To output the full display requires two passes. The first frame displays all the odd-numbered lines, 1.3.5.7.9. and so on, and the second frame draws in the even-numbered lines to fill the gaps. However, because of the time delay in drawing the second screen, the phosphorous screen has already started to fade, and it is this difference in brightness levels between the odd frame and the even frame that causes the flicker.

Taxon sell a wide range of monitors

Taxan sell a wide range of monitors that are compatible with the Amiga, from 14in models up to 20in monsters.

Options

The Taxan Multivision 770 Plus LR is probably the most popular of these. It works fine with both standard Amiga output and de-interlaced output. It is a 14in monitor with an excellent anti-glare tube. The dot pitch is 0.31mm, which is average for these monitors, but not excellent. This monitor has the distinction of being one of the first low-radiation colour monitors around which are so safe that even the Swedes use them. Apparently.

Less healthy, but with a bigger screen, is the Taxan Multivision 970 with its 20" display and 0.31mm dot pitch. This monitor has a medium-persistence display, which means that interlace is cut down considerably even without a de-interlacer, because the phosphor coating on the screen fades more slowly than normal screens.

If you want the best in quality screens, the Taxan Multivision 795 provides an amazing 0.26mm dot pitch on a 14" screen. Unlike the other two Taxan monitors mentioned here, it does not

What is a multisync?

Televisions and normal monitors operate on a fixed frequency. The frequency is described in two components: the vertical frequency, which is the number of frames displayed per second, and the horizontal frequency, which is the number of horizontal lines displayed per second.

Standard PAL televisions have a vertical frequency of 50Hz and a horizontal frequency of around 15.5KHz. The Amiga output is identical to this, to allow the Amiga to display all video modes on the same monitor – unlike the Atari ST. With these fixed values, the number of lines that can be displayed in one frame is limited to around 300.

A multisync monitor can accept a wide range of vertical and horizontal frequencies, typically 50Hz to 70Hz vertical and 15.5KHz to 35KHz horizontal.

A quick calculation reveals that by doubling the standard Amiga horizontal frequency, we can get all 512 lines of our hi-res display in one frame, resulting in no flicker. De-interlacer cards work by providing an output at these frequencies that the multisync can display.

CM-326. The CM-325 is a Super-VGA monitor rather than a multisync. The difference with Super-VGA monitors is that rather than working over a wide band of frequencies, they can automatically switch between a few preset frequencies.


These monitors are often consider-

ably cheaper than multisyncs, although not all Super-VGA displays will work with de-interlacers, and they will not work with the new ECS display modes or with the de-interlacer turned off.

The CM-326 is a true multisync and will handle all Amiga displays including the ECS chipset. Both monitors have a good 0.28mm dot pitch and a 14" tube. The CM-326 comes with both 9-pin and 15-pin plugs to fit easily into any of the three boards available, although you will need to use an adaptor cable if you want to run the monitor with the standard 23-pin output.

My personal favourite for price and features – although I can't afford one at the moment – is the Panasonic TX–1703MA. It has a Sony Trinitron 17" FST screen and a 0.28mm dot pitch. Although it cannot cope with standard de–interlaced signals, it can cope with the ECS productivity modes.

The screen display is simply excellent
– it is big enough to allow you to use a
large display with small fonts and still
read them, but not so big that you hurt
your neck constantly turning your head
to view both sides of it. It also has two
sets of inputs, which is useful if your
have two or more computers.

he Amiga is already the primary machine in the world of desktop video, with countless titlers and all manner of Amiga generated images finding their way in to both amateur and commercial productions.

However, up until now the Amiga's role has been merely that of a special effects engine, only called upon to add finishing touches such as animations, titles and of course glamour where live action is concerned.

Now fortunately for both the machine and it's videophile owners, that's all about to change and the once humble extension to the average video workstation may soon become its heart.

VideoPilot is one of three systems presently leading the field in Amiga controlled editing, and over the next few months we plan to explore all the available options and give the definitive guide to the Amiga in the movies.

Obvious advantages

Anyone who's tried video editing the old fashioned way won't waste any time extolling the virtues of computer controlled editing. The endless piles of scrap paper, worn out stopwatches and an expression that only being up till four in the morning can provide, are sure signs of the video editing old quard.

The basic principle of any editing system is to help keep track of hundreds of scenes spread throughout your library of unedited tapes, to arrange them as required, then to accurately assemble the desired shots in a user defined order, all with squeaky clean edits making seamless connections.

To achieve this, the various master tapes need to be either timecoded or controlled via their tape counters. The timecode option is by far the most precise of the two and boasts an accuracy of +/- one frame, which is as good as any system can offer.

The tape counter alternative isn't anything like as accurate but is still capable of between 5 and 10 frame precision over a period of around 15 minutes. If you're working with longer tapes, the software can divide the footage up in order to keep timing within tolerable limits.

What's in the box?

Like many dedicated Amiga applications, VideoPilot is a combination of both hardware and software – the hardware element of the equation being a multiple input timecode read/write unit that synchronises three source players which then write to a fourth mastering

The various machines can be a mixture of VCR's and camcorders, all of which are controlled by either infra red or hardwire remote control.

Along with the black box, you receive a pair of infra red rodents which

connect to the VideoPilot and issue commands to the players by taking over the role previously undertaken by their own remotes. Also included is the control software, connections and of course the ever-present manual.

The learning process

Perhaps VideoPilot's greatest strength is its versatility and willingness to learn how to control the ever-changing variety of available VCR's and camcorders.

It's the afore—mentioned infra red rodents which provide this power, due to their ability to be taught how to control unfamiliar machines. This is done by aiming the VCR's own infra red controllers at VideoPilot's surrogate units which then learn the required commands to operate the transport on the machine.

This process is done a matter of moments in one of VideoPilot's embarrassingly friendly option screens,

which in this case asks you to press a function key for the appropriate video control, at which point a bleep sounds prompting you to hit the corre-

sponding button on the VCR's own remote.

After all the commands are complete, the Amiga assumes full control of the VCR from the comfort of the function keys. Amazing...

Having explained this impressive talent it's perhaps unlikely that you'll need to try it for yourself – there are a multitude of pre-defined configurations already programmed into the software and even if you do need to define commands they can be stored on disk and loaded with the rest when necessary.

Second only to VideoPilot's flexibility is its easy of use, which for a program and hardware combination of such

complexity is a rare thing indeed. All the various screens lead you by the hand with large icons and wiring configurations all appearing onscreen.

This makes the correct connections in the real world as simple as possible.

The entire process of configuring and operating the system is done with the rodent, with the only exception being the operation of the video controls which, as mentioned earlier, is done with the function keys.

A prime example of this process in action is the configuration screen which displays the rear of the V310 or VideoPilot if you prefer, and four selection boxes for the various players and the recorder.


Configuring the system is simply a matter of clicking on the appropriate input on the V310, then on the player in question. If your selection is incorrect the software throws up a warning and suggest what could be the problem.

To select a player simply requires clicking in one of the four available boxes until the correct make, timecode and control method appears.

If your particular player isn't available you can add the necessary details followed by a trip to the programming screen to teach the infra red unit the correct controls.

When all's well with the system you can timecode the tape and begin to

construct your masterpiece, with the aid of the onscreen Edit table. This allows old and new scripts to be chopped and changed as required, with wordprocessor style cut and paste operations.

Effects can be added at various points, such as captions, still frames, crossfades and genlock effects which when necessary cause the software to emit a warning bleep, allowing you to operate the desired effect at the appropriate moment.


The inertia of the record machine can also be adjusted to ensure accurate edits and up to eight tapes can be used

in the various machines during assembly. Once again, a warning bleep is sounded when the necessary changes are required.

All the shot selections are done via the function keys, with fine-tuning being achieved via single frame advance or, if complete accuracy is required, through the Edit table.

Conclusion

In general, VideoPilot is excellent, and if you're a video nut it may even be worth the asking price. For the professional who wants to free valuable time for

Timecode trickery

Perhaps the biggest stumbling block in both the Amiga and video worlds is the seemingly endless supply of incompatible timecodes which are unsuccessfully vying for dominance.

In the professional market this problem has long been resolved thanks to SMPTE timecode which has been the industry standard in TV and film for years.

In music SMPTE also plays an occasional role along with MTC but unfortunately video is a minefield of formats and VideoPilot does its bit to add to the confusion by employing its own proprietary code entitled V3TC. This, of course, isn't compatible with either VITC or SMPTE systems but does work with RCTC or "artic" as it's known and pronounced.

This happy coincidence is both great news for VideoPilot and Sony who are employing this new format for use with 8mm camcorders. The big advantage of the new system is its ability to retain a full stereo sound-track without the need for any modifications to the VCR.

Because VideoPilot reads this new format frame accurately it can be edited direct, something which Sony's own RCTC editing system has not yet mastered. So for the moment if you're the proud owner of Sony's CCD-V800 camcorder, VideoPilot could be the perfect choice.

Like everything else, the addition of a timecode can be a case of swings and roundabouts, due to the sacrifice of one of the available audio tracks for timecode information.

If you're working with hi-fi VHS/S-VHS or 8mm units employing PCM sound, it will inevitably mean that you'll be left with a mono sound-track. You could always combine the sound from both tracks but of course the actual stereo effect would be sacrificed anyway.

On non-stereo VCR's and camcorders adding a timecode will completely obliterate any available sound, so dubbing to a hi-fi machine might well be worth the loss in quality.

Enhancements

E.M.R., the UK distributors of VideoPilot, offer a number of additional services to enhance the abilities of the system. The first of these is to supply a PCM encoder for 8mm source machines equipped with the optional PCM track. The PCM/AFM output is then split into separate mono hi–fi tracks for sound, and mono PCM for timecode.

Other machine formats can have their pre–amplifier circuitry and output sockets modified to keep the original hi–fi sound in stereo whilst still being able to output a separate timecode track to the VideoPilot.

All the necessary work is done by E.M.R. who operate a collection and delivery service using insured couriers to transport the love of your life back and forth in perfect safety.

more work and less editing it could soon pay for its place in your system.

After all, once the shot selection is complete and providing there are no tapes to be change, the system can be left to compile your creation all on its lonesome.

My only criticism concerns the limit of two infra reds which could cause problems on some systems, although of course four hardwire inputs are available for the remaining players. The only other disappointment is the inability to see your edits prior to mastering.

Having had my little moan, both factors are more molehills than mountains and don't do any real harm to what is an very impressive product.



ell, what will they think of next? First we had sequence dancing, followed by synchronised swimming and of course sequenced music. Now Gold Disks have gone the whole hog and produced the Amiga's first multimedia sequencing package which claims to control every aspect of the machine's vast array of talents – all from one user friendly interface.

If you're anything like me, at first you'll probably be a little confused as to what a multimedia video sequencer actually does, how it does it, and why you'd want it to do it in the first place. Well to clear the air I feel a short explanation is in order.

ShowMaker's primary mission is to draw together all the Amiga's talents and apply them in one smooth and perfectly sequenced production. To do this it employs the Timeline which is the window at the very heart of ShowMaker.

The Timeline is an event display window which shows all the elements within a production plus their duration, type and position within the creation. The unusual thing about what is in effect a fairly standard sequencer is its ability to control a whole range of events, whether they be external video sources, internal sound effects, musical backing tracks or, of course, animation.

Track talk

Before we delve into the various ins and outs of the system, a quick look a just

what ShowMaker is capable of might whet your appetite.

When you first enter the program, you are offered the default number of 12 tracks to play with, these being the primary Amiga based internal tracks which control the machine–generated side of the production.

Moving pictures

The first of the 12 is the graphics track which allows you to generate either still frames or animations. These appear as a background on to which titles or effects can be overlaid. The various backgrounds can be produced on any standard Amiga paint package, as either standard IFFs or ham images.


If for example you want a still image, it can be introduced with a variety of wipes and fades. It will then remain onscreen for as long as is specified by the Timeline, only being replaced by

ticular sequence requires 15 – the software will cycle the animation until the next section of the production.

The frame rate of animations can also be defined so that it will fit the pace of the production. And if you're after a really slick effect, graphics can be defined to keep time with the backing music – as indeed can the entire production – so not only will animations fit perfectly, but wipes and fades will occur on the beat to give a punchy, professional feel.

Tricky titling

The next track controls ShowMaker's internal titling software, and to be honest this is the only element which

doesn't score well. The problem here is that the designers have bitten off a little more than the Amiga can chew, by designing a titler which attempts to do things which even dedicated titling packages such as Scala and Broadcast Titler 2 don't attempt – namely scrolling over an animated background.

This would be a tricky enough proposition if the machine had nothing else to consider, but when the basic problems are compounded with the need to sequence genlocks, videos, Midi, ARexx and soon NewTek's video toaster, not to mention the remaining nine internal Amiga tracks, it's little wonder that the scrolling is less than silky smooth.

To be fair, for the average amateur the variety of wipes and fades might well make up for the rather stuttered scrolling, but for a professional, titling would have to be done by another method, such as being included within animation.

If you do decide to use the titler option there are numerous goodies thrown in, such as access to your entire font directory plus those present within the software itself, all of which can be presented in the usual array of bold, italic and underlined combinations. There's also a range of drop shadow effects and numerous outlines. In short, if you keep things simple, reasonable effects are possible, if perhaps a little less than spectacular.

Special FX

The next four tracks all control good old Paula, the Amiga's internal sound chip. Each of the four available channels have their own track, onto which any IFF sample can be assigned – complete with volume definition, optional loop and pitch control. Finally, you can decide whether the sound should have priority over the music track which may be taking up that particular channel at the moment of play–back.

The great thing about these SFX tracks is their flexibility. Because sounds are assigned to events rather than to tracks, the number of samples on a track is limited only by available memory. Literally hundreds of effects could be assigned to the four channels in a single production.

The next talent in the Timeline's repertoire is Midi control. This consists

If you are going to use this option, you must known the codes which are understood by the instrument in question. You can then add considerably more spectacular sound effects to you masterpiece via Midi, employing synthesisers and, of course, samplers.

trols to define the note information.

Pump up the volume

Overall volume is the next element of the production to be mastered. This is done via the Volume track, which defines the overall volume of the sounds within a production. For example, the backing music and sound effects could be gradually faded down prior to a voice-over and then faded up to continue with the presentation.

Because this works independently of the sound tracks themselves the level between the elements remains the same, so there's no need to adjust all the tracks within the production individually whenever you need some space in the audio section.

ARexx exploited

Like many power programs, ShowMaker eagerly embraces the potential of ARexx – the inter–program communication language which is exploding in the serious Amiga market. With the assistance of ARexx, ShowMaker can launch all manner of Amiga applications. You can control ARexx–compatible sequencers such as

Bars and Pipes Professional, or perhaps employ ARexx–friendly titlers to add real glamour to your graphics.

ARexx has a complete track available throughout the presentation and can issue commands in either macro or string formats. On top of its own ARexx command potential, ShowMaker also listens to instructions from ARexx itself and has a few simple designer commands of its own, with which ARexx can issue the orders.

Genlock option

Genlocking Amiga output is big business, and as you've probably guessed, ShowMaker isn't going to be left out when it comes to one of the cornerstones of multimedia. To do it, ShowMaker employs the SuperGen 2000S. Whether this can be substituted for any other genlock is doubtful, but it could be worth enquiring with Gold Disks before you buy.

Controlling the genlock is very simple, and can be done via a number of predefined dissolves or clean cuts which occur between the Amiga and the external video source. The usual overlay options are available and, as is the norm, they are all locked onto colour-0, or background. The four available sliders determine the amount of transition which will occur between the video

image and the Amiga during the time specified in the Timeline.

So with the aid of the genlock, smooth transitions between full Amiga and full video can happen either instantly or smoothly over a desired period, and titles can be faded up and down as required. All effects work both ways and do a great job of easing the sometimes painful transition between the Amiga and a live video source.

Toaster talents

The last of the standard tracks betrays the software's origins. As I'm sure you're aware, NewTek's Video Toaster is for the moment strictly an American play thing, but if industry rumours are

true we should be seeing this mystical beast of the multimedia world in about 18 months. If the transatlantic reports are to be believed, it should be well worth the wait.

I'd love to tell you how good the combination of ShowMaker and Toaster actually is, but unlike many UK Amiga mags we admit to never having used one – and if the truth were told so would the others. At present the Toaster works solely on NTSC Amigas, so we'll just have to wait until it crosses the Pond.

The next step

Well folks, that's about it for the 12 default internal tracks, but just when you thought all was safe, ShowMaker adds yet another twist to its already well endowed tail by employing numerous external tracks which are controlled via the serial port.

These extra tracks can command everything from videos to Laserdiscs,

and the number of tracks available is only limited by your system and of course the number of suitable drivers – several of which are supplied with the ShowMaker software. The Amiga's numeric keypad is employed to operate the transport on videos and the entire system is configured via a fairly standard comms requester.

Interface info

As you can imagine, making the most of ShowMaker's potential requires a very special interface and fortunately that's just what Gold Disks have provided with one of the best sequencer front ends I've ever had the pleasure to use.

It literally couldn't be simpler. Events are added to the timeline by simply clicking-in the appropriate track, then dragging and releasing when required. This process immediately produces the appropriate requester which then allows you to define wipes, volumes, loops and paths, plus a chance to view or hear the event prior to insertion in to the track.

This click, drag, release and requester approach is identical throughout the timeline and makes production a dream. Adjustments to the track can be done with ease, thanks to a variety of editing modes which can affect individual tracks or the entire production. As you might expect, full cut and paste editing is catered for.

Along with full Timeline editing, there are options to work in a variety of time formats. These can vary from one to sixty second increments, or alternatively as beats, or measures if you prefer musical notation.


The third triumph of the interface is its option to work with an internal sync, external MTC/SMPTE time code or via a Midi clock.

And finally...

As far as conclusions are concerned, ShowMaker is a little difficult, but I'll have a go. If you're one of the many on a limited budget ShowMaker would best be described as a good package which is occasionally prone to the odd stutter. If you're looking to combine your musical and artistic exploits into a complex and impressive presentation, it's ideal.

Having said that, the software's real strength is as a conductor rather than a performer. If you have access to vast mounds of external equipment, ShowMaker is sure to be a godsend, with the ability to unify all of their individual strengths in one stunning production. As such it comes highly recommended...



n recent months most of the conversation in the Amiga art world has been dominated by the release of Dpaint4. This isn't surprising as it's as far as most of us are likely to aspire for both ability and expenditure, but in comparison to TVpaint even the latest Dpaint is no more than a plaything.

On the serious side of Amiga art the pros have been praying for the release of a 24-bit paint package which will match up to the talents of the ever increasing array of 24-bit boards.

These miraculous bits of hardware give access to a palette of over 16,000,000 colours and when these boards are combined with ray tracers and powerful CAD packages, broadcast quality images pour from the Amiga equalling anything produced on

infinitely more expensive systems. Such Amiga imagery already appears on TV and in films, bringing gasps of amazement from Amigans who mistakenly assume that such work is far beyond the abilities of their lowly home micro. How wrong they are...

It's true that to produce such results on the Amiga does requires a good deal of investment, but in comparison with commercial alternatives it's a mere drop in the financial ocean.

Video work

As you're probably aware, the Amiga is the machine for video work. Literally every graphic artist working seriously in the field employs an Amiga in some aspect of his or her work.

Up until now this has mostly meant that the Amiga was used primarily as a rendering engine, producing either stills or animation on a 24-bit board which are then passed on to commercial hardware such as Quantel's Paintbox – the hardware which has long been the industry standard in TV and film. Because of Quantel's long established

dominance in the field and a price tag that would leave even the largest donkey gasping for breath, it has managed to attains the lofty position of artistic demigod in the electronic art world. But is its reputation deserved?

For the frightening asking price of Paintbox, you'd think the system would do everything but walk the dog. In fact it does little more than Dpaint but of course all in full 24-bit colour.

Even with its impressive commercial credentials it certainly won't animate and would never even consider trying its hand at ray tracing. Such pastimes are purely for the Amiga and programs such as Real3D, Imagine and Caligari to name but a few, all of which have built-in 24-bit output and animation options as standard.

With Quantel you pay for pure image quality and the ability to transform ideas direct from the artist into the 16,000,000 colours and incredible

resolution that only Quantel – and now TVpaint – can offer.

The great news for semi-professionals, professionals and enthusiasts, is that the prohibitively expensive Quantel dominance is about to end and TVpaint is the software to do it, by offering the full range of essential paint package skills – all of which are applied in the full glory of 24-bit colour.

With the average Quantel system costing around £40,000, TVpaint's paltry asking price of £800 plus VAT is

ridiculously cheap. Even when the extra hardware requirements are considered, it's still possible to produce 24-bit animation and art solely on the Amiga for under £5000, and that includes the price of an Amiga 2000 to house all the assorted goodies.

Essential hardware

To quote £800 for TVpaint is perhaps a little misleading as there are a few other odds and ends essential to get the system up and running. Perhaps most important of all is is TVpaint's inseparable partner, namely the Harlequin framebuffer.

Harlequin was the first, and is arguably still the best framebuffer on the market. Even today it is one of the few boards to boast any pixel and colour, something which many of the cheaper 24-bit boards simply cannot compete with.

Unfortunately the decision-making doesn't stop with just the purchasing of a Harlequin, as there's the agonising decision of just which Harlequin configuration you require. This decision is purely up to you and will be a matter of balancing your needs with your finances very carefully.

The system will work perfectly with the minimum configuration of one and a half megabytes, but it will mean you won't have a spare screen and perhaps







more importantly there will be no undo option. If you're as clumsy as me this can be a real problem, but if you think methodically and make regular saves, major disasters can be avoided.

To enable both the spare screen and the undo feature, a minimum of three megabytes is required. If you want to go the whole hog and utilise the Harlequin's Alpha channel you'll need the maximum of four megabytes. Who needs a holiday, a social life, a home...not me!

If you're the owner of an alternative board, I'm afraid you'll have to wait until compatible software is available as TVpaint is Harlequin only. It's a case of upgrade or wait a little longer.

Aside from the Harlequin, another essential add-on is a 68030 accelerator, preferably fitted with an FPU or maths co-processor. Between two and four megabytes of 32-bit memory wouldn't do any harm, but it isn't essential.

Obviously those lucky souls blessed with a 3000 can skip this bit and spend the money on surgery to make their smug smiles even more permanent than they already are.

Second mortgage

Right about now you'll probably be thinking about a second mortgage, a bank job, or perhaps what's on the next page, but remember we're taking about imagery that George Lucas, Steven Spielberg and the average advertising executive would kill for, so keep that in mind before you turn to the games section and the killer nutter ninja turtles.

Next on the shopping list comes a hard drive. This isn't strictly an essential but with even small files running to over 100K a floppy wouldn't be too

For example if you're working with a hi-res Harlequin output of 910x576, a standard Amiga monitor simply doesn't have the number of pixels available to display the entire page, so sooner or later a hi-res monitor would be required for any serious use.

Another optional element would be one or more of the many 24-bit compatible ray tracers and CAD packages, the likes of which where mentioned earlier and described in the *image info* boxes throughout the article.


Interface information

Once you've made the appropriate investment, the next task is to install the software. This is done automatically and all that's required is the partition name. The only other essential is the dongle which must be present in the parallel port before boot up. With an asking price of £800 plus VAT, it's not entirely surprising that the French authors Tecsoft take the odd precaution against piracy.

Once the software is installed and the dongle inserted, the program defaults to a opening screen which allows you to select one of the three available resolutions and whether or not you require the Undo or Function options.

The final choice is the whether you require the present screen on the frame buffer to be retained. This is a useful function if you want to touch up your latest ray tracing before committing it to digital posterity.

When your selection is complete, the Harlequin screen clears and redisplays complete with the TVpaint selection panel. Unlike Dpaint, all the available options are accessed through this single

requester which operates with a combination of right and left mouse clicks, in a similar manner to that of Dpaint's control panel.

One of the many examples of the double button system is the Density control which can be invoked by a single left mouse click or altered with the right. As soon as the right mouse is selected the density requester appears and can be redesigned with any of the many presets, or altered manually with the mouse.

Using the software is simplicity itself and will take the average Dpaint fan a matter of minutes to come to terms with. The only real difference between the two is TVpaint's lack of animation and, of course, the absence of any pull-downs.

Power features

One of the first points raised in the excellent accompanying manual is the design teams' approach to the software itself. Rather than being a technojunkies nirvana complete with all manner of scripts and programming protocols, the program is very simple. The technology trap is easy to fall into when designing power programs, but thankfully this particular pitfall has been avoided.

One of the first examples of this user friendly approach is the floating control panel which can be moved and placed anywhere onscreen, only changing position at your command. This also applies to all of the sub-menus, and as a result the flow of work isn't interrupted by annoying permanent requesters which need to be removed from the keyboard.

The Undo function, which is available with the larger Harlequin configurations, doesn't stop with a simple erase or replace but can be set up with parameters which can be activated from the opening format screen or the system requester on the main control panel.

The spare screen option has obvious advantages as any Dpaint fan will tell you but an added bonus is PVpaint's Transparency option which allows the spare screen to be mixed with the foreground of the present screen. Some

other Dpaint-like options are the separate button/separate colour option for the mouse and the usual variety of brush options which include lasso polygon and rectangular brush selection – all of which can be rotated and re-sized in the classic paint package manner.

As well as the invaluable Density control, which was mentioned earlier, the system also boasts a range mode which can be defined over either the entire palette or just a specified range. As you can probably see from the screenshots, when the range option is combined with the airbrush effect the true power of 24-bit starts to appear, as the entire spectrum scrolls through a single mouse stroke.

It is perhaps the airbrush that best shows the power of the Harlequin and TVpaint combination. On more than one occasion I found myself trying to remove dust from the monitor which in fact were merely faint traces of paint left by a wayward manoeuvre with the mouse. To be honest it took all my meagre mental powers to drag myself away and try out some of the other features.

Perhaps the most confusing part of using a 16,000,000 colour palette is how exactly it can be accessed without the use of a palette displaying every colour. As you can imagine, a requester showing all the colours would be about 50 feet long and almost impossible to apply.

To combat this a whole range of palettes can be cycled through and if a specific colour can't be found, individual colours can be edited by either their RGB or CMY colours. If that's still not enough, they can be selected direct from two spectrum disks at the bottom of the requester.

If that's still not enough, various colours can be blended in the mixer – an option which allows individual colours to be sprayed on top of each other and mixed manually.

The last of the colour controls is a Gamma option which allows you to adjust the Gamma curve on either the entire image or combinations or the RGB elements. This can be particularly useful if you want to lift the colour balance within an image, but saving out

beforehand is an essential as sometimes it can do a little more harm than good.

Apart from the power of the paint package itself, the other essential of any 24-bit package is its compatibility with the myriad of graphic file formats. Fortunately for TVpaint, all of the essentials are ready and waiting with full support for 24-bit IFF, TGA, Rendition and Deep modes, so no matter what output you and your ray tracer prefer, TVpaint should be more than happy to import your latest creation.

The final element of the TVpaint equation is its ability to multitask with perfection, allowing you to jump between the paint package and any other Amiga application which you may wish to employ.

When you've finally decided on the colour composition and loaded any relevant files, the real work can start. This is where the now almost mandatory

keyboard short cuts come into their own, making everything from selecting an airbrush to specifying magnification as simple as a single keystroke. As a result, commercial artists should be able to use their valuable time to the full and leap from one tool to the next with ease, pausing only to cash a cheque and send an invoice.

Artistic opinions

As you're no doubt aware I'm not exactly disappointed, as indeed I didn't expect to be for a package that retails at just under a £1,000 minus the essential hardware.

Having said that, and considering the alternatives which approach over 50 times the price for what is essentially the same system, TVpaint has to be good value.

My only real complaint is the soft-


ware's tendency to crash occasionally, which I must admit is infuriating, especially if you're in the final throes of your piece de la resistance.

To be fair to the software, it's a strong possibility that the fault lies with my rather elderly 2000 rather than the software itself.

To clarify the crashing problem I took some advice from Martin Lowe at ASC, who assured me that such problems are unheard of north of the border, and must be either the fault of my elderly companion or perhaps due to TVpaint's need for a rather a weighty amount of continuous memory on the parent machine.

On the whole the complete package comprising the Harlequin, a 68030 and TVpaint is quite simply incredible, and is sure to help in the production art that only Quantel's paintbox can compete with. And all for just a fraction of the price...





f you fancy yourself as something of a would-be Speilberg, then you may well be surprised to learn that you already own one of the most powerful video devices ever developed. With little more than your Amiga, a video recorder and a device called a genlock, you too could create video effects that would have left BBC video engineers dumbstruck little more than a few years ago.

The key to all this power is the genlock, a sophisticated little device that has revolutionised low cost video production on the Amiga. Genlocks are available for other machines, but the Amiga's obvious power has allowed developers to produce professional quality genlocks at a fraction of the cost.

Atari may have coined the phrase, but the Amiga is still the only machine that can truly claim to offer "power without the price" where video is concerned. You'll find the Amiga being used in conjunction with professional video decks, video processors, chro-

makeys and paintbox systems within many professional post-production houses. Even on the television you'll find the Amiga's talents at work – check out the ITV Chart Show, for example.

So what is a genlock? Well, put simply, it's a device which allows you to combine the video output from your Amiga with the output from a video recorder or camcorder.

Specialist circuitry within the genlock allows the background colour of the Amiga video signal to be replaced with the video output from your VCR. This process allows you to overlay titles onto your home videos and a lot more besides.

Choosing a genlock is a complicated process which must not be entered into lightly. If you do, you could well end up with a genlock that is quite unsuitable for your particular application – worse still, you could waste a lot of your hard earned money. So, before you write out that cheque, read our mega round up of the current state of the art in Amiga genlocks.

MIGGE VISUS

Genlock jargon explained

Everyone knows that a genlock overlays computer graphics onto an external video source, but how does it actually work? Well, believe it or not, the actual process of overlaying – or "keying" as it should be called – is actually a very minor function of the genlock.

Genlocks carry out three basic functions – they code, genlock and key video signals. Coding is a process whereby the RGB output from the Amiga is converted into either PAL composite or Super VHS format, depending on your individual requirements. If all you want to do is to record the output

from the Amiga onto videotape, then a coder is all that you will need. However for true desktop video, the genlock's second and third functions come into their own.

Contrary to what you may have been led to believe, genlocking itself is not the process which allows the Amiga's graphics to be superimposed onto video. Instead, genlocking is actually a process whereby two separate video signals are synchronised internally at sync pulse level, bringing them in time with each other. Without this all-important process, it would be impossible to

combine the two signals. The excitement doesn't really start until we get to keying. Keying is a process whereby the video image completely replaces certain parts of the computer image.

Contrary to what you may think, the genlock doesn't look for a certain colour when keying the signal – you could have two identical blacks in the signal with only one being keyed, for example. Instead, keying works at colour register level. Most genlocks allow only colour register zero to be used as the key colour, but more professional units allow you to change this.

At the bottom of the genlocking pile is MiniGen, a cheap and very cheerful genlock that has been around for a number of years now. Up until the release of Roctec's RG300, MiniGen was the choice for home video enthusiasts on a budget, but it is starting to show its age.

The MiniGen hardware consists of a pretty uninspiring little cream box, in much the same shape as Commodore's A500 TV Modulator. Connector wise, there's not a lot to talk about apart from the usual composite video-in and video-out connectors and a 23-pin connector to connect the thing to the Amiga. Surprisingly it doesn't have an RGB pass-through, which really is a silly omission. I really cannot understand how

hardware manufacturers could possibly be unaware of the importance of RGB pass-through.

The genlock has three modes of operation – Video only, Amiga only and Mix. Video only displays the incoming composite signal, Amiga only displays the Amiga image, and mix displays the two together. Like most budget genlocks, MiniGen doesn't allow you to control which colour register is used for keying, so you're

colour. This isn't too much of a problem really, as most home users will probably have no need to alter the keying colour.


MiniGen doesn't come with any software at all which is yet another big disappointment. Most genlocks at least give you a couple of test images – some even come with complete packages – but you're on your own here folks! As it is, a good video titling package should also be on your shopping list.

The overall image quality of MiniGen was thought to be pretty good a few years back, but it has aged terribly. Some screens suffer terribly from colour bleeding and the genlock occasionally seems to lose sync even when using a good clean

> source signal. That said, MiniGen isn't that bad – just ask the thousands of satisfied users across the country!

MiniGen was a revolutionary piece of kit when it was released a few years back, but it no longer cuts it. It will do the job, but this is about as far as things go. If you're after a budget genlock, then the Roctec unit is definitely a better bet.

During it's few months on the market, the RocGen has become the choice for video enthusiasts on a budget. It has a number of flaws, but its obvious talents more than make up for these.

The Roctec RG300C comes to you in a rather flat little box sporting more knobs and whistles than a fairground organ. It connects to the Amiga via a long cable with the video source itself

being fed in through a phono connec-

tor. Like MiniGen, RocGen the doesn't have an RGB pass-through either, which is such a shame for a genlock with such a high specification. Rumour has it that Roctec are planning to correct this, but nothing more has been heard from the company since the genlock's release.

The RocGen too can be operated in three modes – Amiga only, Video only and Mix – but it goes further than both the Rendale unit or MiniGen thanks to its powerful fade and dissolve controls which are built in to the genlock as standard. These two modes allow you to fade in and out the Amiga

graphics and fade between Amiga graphics only and video only. This feature alone makes the RocGen a very


The RocGen does come with its own software but – to be frank – it's not worth the disk that holds it. There's the usual selection of test images plus a very naff video titling

package that looks as if it was written in AmigaBasic. If you've got any sense, some decent video software should be bought immediately.

I must admit that despite its flaws, I like the RocGen. It's a shame that it doesn't have an RGB pass-through, but

then an upgraded RocGen should eventually be made available (don't hold your breath though!). For home video enthusiasts who don't need lots of fancy features, the Roctec RG300 is the genlock to be seen using.

Rendale A8802

Rendale's A8802 is one of the few real classic genlocks available for the Amiga. It too has been available for a number of years now, but it's still a very capable system which offers near broadcast quality output at a very reasonable price.

The Rendale hardware is pretty boring – a little box that connects to the Amiga RGB port. Unlike both MiniGen and RocGen, it does have an RGB pass-through, which is nice to see. The composite signal is fed to the genlock through a BNC-style connector, therefore allowing the cables to remain firmly

connected - there's nothing more annoying than ripping a cable out of its socket halfway through a genlocking session!

Unlike both MiniGen and the Roctec unit, the Rendale doesn't have mode switching built in to the genlock hardware. That's not to say that mode switching isn't supported though. The Rendale fully supports the usual three video modes, but before you

can take advantage of this you must get out your trusty soldering iron and actually make a mode switching cable yourself. It's a pretty simple bit of wiring, but it's annoying that Rendale didn't build the cable in to the A8802 in the first place. Most users don't like tinkering around with the internals of expensive equipment and I'm quite sure that Rendale could end up with a few dead genlocks as a result. What the Rendale has got going for it is image quality. The A8802 was originally designed for semi-professional use, so its genlocking hardware is of a very high standard. In fact, it's not far short of broadcast quality. If you then chuck the output from the Rendale through a PAL, the results that you will get will look very professional indeed.

One very nice feature of the A8802 is that it can be upgraded to Super-VHS for around £400. This may seem rather steep, but this price also includes the cost of that extra fade box that comes as standard with the Super-VHS A8802.

If you're after a high quality genlock along the lines of the G2 Video Centre but can't quite afford the extra cash, then the Rendale A8802 is a good bet. Not only does it produce very high quality results, but it can literally grow with you, assuring that your new toy doesn't become outdated.

The follow up to the classic A8802 is the Super-VHS A8802, a genlock that offers a lot more than just Super-VHS compatibility. Coming in at just under £600, it offers


Like most Super-VHS genlocks, the Rendale doesn't just support S-VHS. If you feel like taking the plunge straight away but haven't got access to S-VHS decks, then the unit can still be used with a composite video signal by simply flicking a switch on the back of the unit. Obviously you won't get the same image quality, but you still get all the extra features that the S-VHS A8802 has to offer

Probably the most striking difference between the normal A8802 and the S-VHS A8802 is the inclusion of a bulky but nicely presented effects control box that is about three times the size of the genlock itself. All connections are made through this box, with a simple lead connecting all this video wizardry to the actual genlock unit. This fader box must be brought around from the back of your Amiga to sit next to your Amiga keyboard, allowing easy access to its controls.

Thanks to that extra box, the A8802 fully supports the usual crossfading and fading to black that is common with genlocks of this price. However, it also supports a number of powerful wipes that will allow you to create some quite stunning effects within your video productions.

Using a combination of the controls available, it's possible to create left, right, up, down, top left, bottom right, middle of the screen wipes and a lot more besides. Clever use of these wipe effects can produce some very nice effects.

As you'd expect from a Rendale genlock, the quality of the genlocked signal is very good indeed. Once again, it's not quite up to broadcast quality spec, but it's more than good enough for semi-professional purposes. When you also consider its relatively low price, the Super-VHS Rendale is a very good bet indeed.



GST Gold

You may not have heard of GST, but they're a big name within the ST market. Indeed, they were one of the first companies to produce a workable genlock for the ST, a machine that was never really that good at video work. Now they've started producing their wares for the Amiga, but the competition is somewhat tougher.

Like all GST's products, the GST Gold lives inside a brilliant colour coordinated black box about the size of a good thick hardback book. It fully supports both Super-VHS and composite signals, so it's not let down in this department. On the front of the genlock are a couple of controller knobs which allow you to alter the contrast, luminance and colour of the incoming signal. Very few genlocks seem to offer these controls, so this is definitely one up for the GST Gold.

The documentation which comes with the GST Gold is pretty good... if you can read French, that is. Perhaps I'm just being picky, but it would have

been nice to have had an English manual. My French is pretty appalling, so getting to know the GST Gold was something of a struggle to say the least. So if you order a GST, make sure that you insist on an English manual.

One very nice feature of the GST is its built in RGB splitter, which is not actually that useful for desktop video, but is a real boon if you own a video digitiser. So, if you also own a digitiser like DigiView or Rombo's Vidi-Amiga, you can use the genlock to separate a composite or S-VHS signal into its component red, green and blue signals. It's really nothing more than a gimmick, but it's handy nonetheless.

The genlock itself seems pretty basic, although the image quality is very good indeed. Surprisingly, it doesn't offer any form of wipes or fades, which is definitely not going to help it, especially now that budget units like the RocGen offers these for considerably less money. In all, you're probably better off with the Rendale.

Genlocking top tips

If you want to get the best from your new acquisition, then follow these handy hints:

- 1. When overlaying graphics, always try to use the best possible quality composite video source. Try to avoid using second generation videotapes. If you do, you may find that the image will break up terribly.
- For more professional work, avoid using low resolution composite video decks. If you can afford it, go for Super-VHS or even Hi-8.
- Avoid highly saturated images these can cause terrible amounts of colour bleeding.
- Use decent quality video cables, preferably cables designed specifically for video signals. These shielded cables cut down signal noise and interference to a minimum.
- 5. If you are using standard composite VHS, then it's well worth investing in a PAL encoder a device which gives better image quality when the genlocked signal is laid down on to videotape.
- 6. Keep your video graphics as simple as possible the bolder the image, the clearer it will be when recorded onto videotape.
- Titles look a lot clearer and more readable if you add a black outline around them. This also cuts down colour bleeding.
- A good investment is a sound mixer. This will allow you mix the sound from the original videotape with a commentary and possibly even a backing track.

The professional choice...

Most of the genlocks featured would be fine for serious video applications, but even these aren't quite up to the task of handling broadcast quality video like that required by video post-production

Thankfully, Amiga developers have got this covered too. It's beyond the scope of this article to mention them in any great detail, but here's a quick run down of some of the more common professional units available.

G2 VC3 - The big brother of both G2's VC1 and VC2 is the VC3, a broadcast quality genlock that is selling like hot cakes at the moment. The reason for this is simple - the VC3 is the only Amiga genlock that supports YCrCB (YUV) output. If you don't know what it is, then chances are that you don't need it!

MaxiGen - Like most professional gen-

locks, MaxiGen comes to you in 19in, 1U rack-mount format, so it can be installed easily and securely within a professional video environment. It supports Super-VHS and PAL composite with full broadcast quality output.

Neriki ImageMaster - Offering basically the same features as the MaxiGen genlock is the Neriki range of genlocks. These too come in rack-mount format and offer the usual selection of wipes and fades with broadcast quality output in PAL, composite and Super-VHS for-

Rendale A8806 - Rendale's flagship genlock is the A8806, a very nice little number that also comes in rack-mount format. It too offers broadcast quality output with the usual selection of wipes and fades. It's also dirt cheap - at just under £900, it represents very good value for money.

G2 Systems Video Centre is actually available in three different configurations starting with the basic Video Centre, moving up to the Video Centre Plus (reviewed) and finally the professional quality Video Centre 3. As a result, G2 is a company worth talking to regardless of whether you're working for the BBC or your Aunty Mavis.

Both the VC1 and VC2 consist of neat consoles which sit on the desk next to your Amiga. The VC3 is a rack-mounted unit which is controlled via a separate remote unit. The VC1 and VC2 are very similar apart from the fact that the VC2 has a few extra features which video professionals may find useful.

As you'd expect, both the VC1 and VC2 will allow you to perform a number of fade and dissolve effects via a pair of slider controls on the console front panel. These are basically the same as the fade options available on the RocGen - crossfading and fade to black - although they are performed rather better.

One nice feature of the VC series is that you can change the keying colour which is used when overlaying graphics.

This is a surprisingly rare function to find on an Amiga genlock, although - to be fair - it has to be

said that the Super-VHS Rendale can also do this. The key register is changed by setting a series of dip switches at the back of the genlock, so it's worth having a good ball-point pen on hand to do this.

Unique to the VC2 is a set of 20 wipe functions which will allow you to add a bit of class to your video productions.

These wipes allow you to view either the Amiga or background video through one of 20 variable sized and shaped patterns. These patterns include circles, rectangles and diagonals. These effects can be positioned anywhere on the screen thanks to a joystick control built in to the console.

Overall, the VC2 is a powerful and very capable genlocking system that. whilst not being broadcast quality, is suitable for most semi-professional video applications.

In fact, the only thing I could find to complain about is the price - at just over £1100, it is rather pricey, especially when you compare it to the Rendale.



You never see this action. However, each side's progress can be monitored via a series of reports and graphs. These graphs, percentages and status reports illustrate a variety of positions such as hangers, control towers etc. It is rather more tricky to find exact details of the enemy but there is a reconnaissance (recce) mission you can fly to find out what state the war is in.

The action you take part in is totally dynamic. For example, visual damage can be inflicted upon an installation. However, that damage will then be repaired over the course of time. If you knock out a hangar you effectively knock out all of the aircraft for a particular base. If you knock out a control centre you neutralise their control ability. If you attack aircraft-producing factories you will knock out their ability to produce new aircraft. The replacement rate drops while the factory is being repaired. You must try, therefore, to win a war of attrition.

As mentioned above, the "dynamics" do not extend to other ground elements. You do not see your side rolling forth with tanks and men, for example. Birds of Prey (BOP) is more orientated around air combat. There are elements of ground attack but they generally include air-related targets.

If you "die" you do not lose the game – you just take a different persona to continue the same ongoing battle. Nothing chan after your "death". You can save the battle at that point if wish. In fact, because of the routine you can have a number campaigns running simultame ously. The only item lost is dead pilot's record.





idway through the 21st century, man has finally mastered the technology required for travel to, and colonisation of, distant planets. The first starship, Daedalus I, set off in the year 2052 heading for Wolf 359, a small red star some 8.1 years away from Earth.

As the scientists arrived some generations later they discovered that the dual star solar system was entirely devoid of planets. There was no more in that solar system than a large number of asteroid belts. On closer inspection it appeared that among the asteroids there flew thousands of tiny craft, automatically controlled mining vessels. It seems the previous colonists has destroyed all the planets so that they could mine more efficiently.

Daedalus I headed for the only lump of rock bigger than an asteroid but smaller than a planet, a moon that no longer had a planet to orbit. This moon, christened Frontier Alfa, was inhabited by a race of independent, capitalist and unscrupulous robots and their creators the Remusians. The Remusians were small bug-eyed humanoids who took a much less active role in the colony than the Roboforms.

The Earth starship was soon captured by the Remusians, who enslaved the human habitants. Some of them escaped capture however, and established a small colony of their own. They set you up as a trader, with the ultimate aim of making enough profit to be able to buy the whole colony and become supreme leader, thereby being able to free the enslaved humans.

This 3D vector graphics-based games combines violence and trading on a planet's surface, in the classic formula that was pioneered by Elite in deep space. In Moonfall though, the gameplay is more regimented than the random nature of other games.

Ten missions lie in wait for you, ten objectives that must be completed very successfully so that the maximum gain is made from each, whether it be a reward for capturing an outlaw, or The trading room has been admired far and wide for its simplicity profit for some shrewd trading.



ou may not have noticed, but Robin Hood is pretty hot property these days. A few years ago he was just a bloke who wore green leg warmers and a stupid hat in some distant age, remembered only in songs sung by bearded men in real ale pubs with Aran sweaters and fishermens' smocks, then suddenly he was transformed overnight into an international film star and all round celeb'.

All I can say is that it's a good thing that Robin Hood looked like Kevin Costner, or they'd have had to get someone else for the film, and then where would he be?

Needless to say, this game has nothing to do with "Prince of Thieves", although there is a competition to win the video included with the game, but is instead based on the Olde English legends that spawned the original Robyn o' the Hoode. So don't expect to find Hollywood style stunts and chases, like the film. That's not to say that the game is without action, but it's action of a more sedate kind.

The game places you in the slightly sweaty tunic of Monsieur Hood, and asks that you merely elevate him to level of International Folk Hero. Ho ho ho. That should be easy, thought I, I'll just clobber some Normans, snog Marian and be home in time for a slap-up meal of dead stag. Oh boy, was I wrong. Let's take my first game as an example.

I started off happily enough, sat in my castle having a good old knees up with the Sherwood Posse. Then the Sheriff of Nottingham booted me out and made me an outlaw. I hung around for a bit thinking it might be some massive medieval Jeremy Beadle type prank, but 'twas not.

So, there I was. An outlaw. So I shot a few arrows around, got into a fight with a soldier and died. Not really an auspicious start for the Champion of the Oppressed, eh? What had gone wrong?

My first impressions of Robin Hood were "Look's like loads of fun, but what the hell am I supposed to do?". The instructions don't give anything away, To assist you in your green stockinged gallavanting, Gamer now presents the guide to gorgeous icons BOW AND ARROW
Oddly enough, this will make

uality of life is one of those nebulus ideas that is very difficult to quantify, let alone try and maintain at a high level for any period of time. You try being a Prime Minister and see how you get on. Attaining a high quality of life is the main aim behind Gremlin's first foray into the world of God games.

The approach they have adopted pitches the game somewhere in the land between Populous and Sim-City, fighting an opponent while you attempt to develop a viable city with all its attendant problems of taxation, population control, crime and who cleans up when the neighbour's dog craps in your garden.

You begin your life as commander of your first planet with little but a command centre, a few solar panels, a load of cash, a group of advisers and very little else. The Quality of Life begins at a meagre 40 per cent, and it is up to you to try and develop the city to a large bustling hubbub of parties and orgies, and organise an efficient workforce in between - sounds remarkably like being the editor of Gamer.

All sorts of things affect the QOL, anything from the view from the living quarters to taxation to how much food is available. Just hints are given in the manual, so only through playing and experimentation will you find out all the answers.

The first action you will probably wish to perform is a wee bit of construction. You have a choice of 24 different buildings, too many to list individually, which fall into loose cate-

gories. Resource-generating buildings, such as mines and chemical plants, must be built near appropriate resources to be effective, although power stations and similar electrical installations can be placed anywhere you like. In any case, planning is probably wise to maximise the efficiency of distribution of electricity to other build-

The next general category includes manufacturing installations. These make use of the resources to produce crucial items like tanks or food, vital to the survival of the colony and if neglected, quaranteed to send the QOL figure plummeting.

The final category includes those installations that actually improve the QOL as opposed to maintaining it. Food stores, stadiums, life-support systems, hospitals and fixed defence units like laser turrets are included here, and must be placed and used judiciously to maximise their effect.

For example a large event at the stadium will improve morale, an important factor in the QOL equation, but because everyone is off watching the games then the work rate will drop. A hospital is not essential but it will allow you to directly control the birth rate, and it will allow the population to recover more quickly from the effects of a virus, for example.


For the installations to be of any use they must be manned by colonists up to the maximum allowed - usually around ten per installation. You are perfectly at liberty to use less than this number should you feel that maximum production is not essential at any particular time, but it is also crucial that production levels are monitored so that you can up levels at any time should they be required. Not only do the installations

need manning, but construction will also occupy the colonists. It is entirely likely that a large number of fully-manned installations could mean that construction will not be possible, because all the available men are busy elsewhere.

Juggling manpower is one problem, but so is juggling your budget. Taxation levels must be set, but an eye must be kept on the long-term effects on the QOL - nobody likes heavy taxation, no matter what the reason.

Also, grants for civilian and military development must be closely monitored. A high grant to the military will provide fast development of new weapons, but it may not make the population too happy if they haven't yet got a sports stadium. Of course, too low a grant will mean that the military is under-developed, making the colony vulnerable to a more advanced attack.

Control of your military is just as vital

a part of the game as constructing a well ordered and shiny, happy city. Organising the static defence systems, such as laser turrets and missile launchers, is only one part. The other is the construction, control and deployment of the mobile forces.

Initially, the decision will lie in how much manpower you are willing to commit to the factories producing the equipment, and which type of vehicle you want to produce - the more advanced, the longer it takes and the more resources it will use.

Once you have built up your stockpile of equipment, decisions have to be made as to where it will be placed and how it will be manouevred. At your disposal you have eight markers which can be strategically placed anywhere on the map and used to guide the tanks and aircraft around the play area, by sending one or a group to any one of the markers. They can also be guided to

attack an enemy city, although the location of this will not become known to you unless you sponsor spying activity, another demand on your stretched bud-

There is no way of individually controlling the tanks or aircraft. The only control you have is of general movement patterns, as all of the attack responses are automated. Defence may seem an unnecessary burden on a budget which could be better devoted to improving the QOL, but it will never be very high if the colony is overrun by aliens.

To help you make these weighty decisions are a panel of advisers. The advisers give information about each of the different aspects of the colony population, budget, number of manufacturing installations, morale etc - and will occasionally give recommendations. Simple things like: "We need more food ya bugga!" will not appear, but more succinct hints will be apparent.

It all sounds very complex and it is. but this is the next generation of God-games and will appeal to those who have successfully met the challenge of Sim-City and Populous and are looking for something more challenging to take them on to the next level of game-

It skilfully combines both the constraints of building a city that can be happily lived in with the problems of trying to defeat a malevolent opponent, and all the time you have to try and keep every one happy by not overspending and leaving everyone to starve.

There is no fixed objective to aim for, no timespan across which your efforts are measured. The only target is a Quality of Life which reaches above and beyond 90%.

But its complexity does not make it difficult to use,.Simple point and click systems and an isometric large-scale map mean that the game's system becomes almost second nature after a period of familiarisation.

Don't make the mistake of comparing this game to Image Work's Mega Lo Mania, one of last issue's Gamer Golds they are very different to one another. MLM is far less complex and geared to fun and humour, while providing a large amount of challenge and a fabu-

Utopia goes for the more involved and time-consuming approach which has no definite answers. It doesn't have that many definite questions to be honest. And it will provide hundreds of hours of brain-blowing to those willing to invest the time needed to be successful. They are both excellent games doing two different things.

The crisp and colourful graphics are easy on the eye and the sound is quite simply superb - a dramatic tune coupled with stunning effects make it worth turning the sound up. Quite simply Gremlin have produced a very slick package which takes the notion of controlling and developing a city or planet one stage further than anything before.

Be warned however - it may be easy to use, but it is anything but easy to beat. If you can't invest the time needed, think carefully before purchasing. This isn't a criticism, merely something to be aware of. But whether you have the time or not, this is a game worthy of Thomas More's legacy.

This turns memory and disk drives on or off, forces a hard reset and installs itself on to standard bootblocks without creating any damage.



Disk U616 - NBS

This is a text and graphics editor with the ability to import different character sets. Written by a German there are various language versions of the program on the disk, including slightly dodgy English.

The text functions of the package are rather simple, merely incorporating disk filing and search and replace functions, plus importing character

The printer prefs set up is poorly presented, in broken English, so making it work with your machine is probably hit and miss. Speed-wise, the text editor is merely average, and disappointingly you can't even load the instructions file into the program.

The graphics editor allows you to mess around with .IFF piccies, and adds basic drawing and filling routines, but a challenge to an art package it is not. If you want to make alterations to pics, why use a very underpowered system and spend all night trying to get it right?

I'm afraid that this program, while offering both text and graphics functions, offers far too little in either category to give it precedence over any professional package, even at a PD price.

Messy Dos

Disk U619 - NBS

If you work with the PC at all then utilities such as Dos-2-Dos probably get an airing quite often. The trouble with utilities like Dos-2-Dos is that they only enable you to copy files to and from an MSdos disk.

Messy Dos goes one stage further in allowing you to use either Amiga disks or PC disks in the same drive, and to save or read files on to or from those PC format disks. So you can work on

stuff at home, save as Ascii on to a PC disk, and take it into work the next day.

Simply auto-booting with the Messy Dos disk sets up the system for use, and there are instructions on how to incorporate it into your own versions of Workbench. When you come to read or write to a PC disk all you have to do is name the drive as MSO: or MS1: for example.

The clever part is when you save a file on to an Amiga disk, stick a PC disk into the same drive, and save as Ascii on to that. If you swap between the PC and Amiga with any frequency this is a very useful utility.

page, some average music and the choice of games. Gridrunner is based on that ancient classic Centipede, but with mobile guns down the side and along the bottom of the screen, shooting at you.

From the top, one or more centipede-type insects race, though the graphics are so bad they could be anything. Shoot a part of the centipede and it turns into a green blob. Unless you continue to destroy the green blob it will eventually crack open and fire at

That's it really. It's dull and boring, the graphics are dire, and the gameplay is repetitive.

So much for Gridrunner, the other two at least look smart. In fact, they look like games written by demo programmers. All flash and no gameplay.

Rebound is the only game on the disk bordering on playable. It's Breakout, turned on its side. Power-ups and special effects abound, but the annoying thing is the speed of your bat. It's just too slow to make skill the winning factor.

Never mind, at least it's almost there. The Invaders doesn't even come close. A sideways scrolling Defenderstyle game with two very flashy spaceships, an energy top up, homing missiles and mines, and bonus point

icons are all the components. When you see the first lumbering spaceship bearing down on your homebase you think "hey this kid can program". Clever and skilful shooting will bring the alien down in a shower of exploding chunks and pyrotechnics.

Very nice indeed for PD. The trouble is that that's all there is to the game. You get lots of these spaceships on every level, which merely consist of more spaceships.

After you've cleared four levels stuffed full of just one style of alien ship you reach for the off switch in disap-

This is generally a good looking collection, but none of them qualify as good games, and only Rebound scrapes in to the average category.

Disk Master

Disk 1723 - Virus Free PD

Using Workbench for menial tasks or just the odd disk operation is fine, but when you want a little more information and a bit more power, and have a few more disks to process, a decent collection of utilities is a godsend.

The unoriginally titled Disk Master sports a very clear front end, listing the main functions down the centre of the screen, with the contents of one drive

down one side, and a second drive down the other. Initially, the left side is designated as the source and the right as the destination, for copying files, but this can be switched around with one

The main functions are Copy, Delete, Rename, Make Directory, Select All, Clear All, Read File, Show Picture, Play Module, Info (length in bytes and blocks plus whether there is any protection or not), Print File, Hex Dump, Print Directory, Add Protection to a file, and Execute a file.

That's just the ones in the centre. The mundane functions such as Format - with or without verify - Verify Disk, Virus Killer, Block Editor and Disk Copy are on a separate screen.

All the functions are easy to use, and you can specify which device is being read or written to in any order. I liked the Show Pic option since you can scan through a demo disk of digitised pics say, see which are the good ones and copy them.

What makes this set of utilities valuable is that the disk auto-boots straight

into the main program. There's no messing about with title pages, just go straight in there, select what function you want and the job is done.

There are a couple of related bugs to avoid that are annoying since they are fairly obvious. If, when selecting functions like Make Directory, you don't enter a new directory name but just click on the Close Window gadget which activates the function rather than cancelling it - the program crashes.

Not providing exits from a couple of the functions, and then crashing when you try to get out isn't too hot, but apart from that these utilities are fast, friendly, clearly laid out and useful.

Air Ace II

Disk 1765 - Virus Free PD

When Palace released the original C-64 version of SEUCK, it was a cracking good program, only lacking in the facility to include power-ups and extra weapons.

Not enough memory, said Palace. Aha, we thought, the Amiga and ST versions will soon see to that. But they didn't, because then you the man - or woman - in the street might create something which would embarrass those software houses charging £25 a chuck for their games.


And so the Amiga and ST SEUCKs were a disappointment, and having ploughed through a pile of dismal games created with the things, I wonder why Palace was ever worried in the first place. Air Ace II personifies everything that is bad about unimaginative games created with SEUCK.


- 1. It was the only tune sent in.

We also aim to differ the tune each month. As an example, for September's tune we provided you



with pH-1, an 808 State bleepy kind of tune which although not particularly melodic was most definitely original.

We are a reasonable team here at Amiga Computing and the message is simple – If you can do any better then stop writing and start tapping those keys! If it's any good, it just might make its way onto the best coverdisk in the business.

3D Master

It's brill. It's fab. It's fandabadosy. What am I talking about? 3D Master of course. I have been using an Amiga for years now, and as such I was beginning to get a wee bit bored (well I do use it every day) so I've been looking at the world of ray tracing. I used the Real 3D demo disk on the Amiga Computing mag and I thought it was a bit too much (including the price), so when I saw the Senlac Software PD ad showing 3D master at £35 I thought "could this be what I'm looking for?".

A quick phone call to Senlac convinced me to buy it without trying the demo version. Order placed at

2.30pm and I received it at 7.00 the next morning. Now I have no experience with ray tracing and can't draw for toffee but within an hour I was drawing (dull, shiny, mirrored) balls, boxes, triangles, changing the angle of view, putting lights in the sky and then ray tracing. It's so bloody easy. One feature I do like is that you can edit anything at any time.

It is the best editor I've used in any package. Rendering is very fast, taking only minutes to do a picture, so do not think it's PD, because it's not. The author Martin Staley has done a very good deed indeed by giving us this little gem at such a low price—it's worth much, much more.

So do the right thing and support him, as he will update the package and I believe when he does you will be seeing 3D Master as the best ray tracing package at any price.

Phone up the awfully nice people at Senlac, on 0424 445498, and order 3D Master now...you won't be sorry.

Credit where it's due?

WorkStation winner

I am writing to say how good "WorkStation" is. I thought, could this be as good as everybody claims in your letter pages? Well I tested it and I think it is better than I could ever imagine. I mean, I thought those flashy icons which changed from one picture to another totally different frame were too advanced for the likes of me, but they are just so simple to do with Iconmaster.

The SID program is brilliant, although I can use Shell and CLI it is all much easier using SID. Work which takes two hours in CLI or Shell will only take a quarter of an hour.

Screen X is very useful, and so is that small utility called Zoom, which will get rid of your mouse pointer to save memory, and is easily retrieved by nudging the

mouse. Why sell this software so cheaply? This could be a £30 effort, like Workbench, or maybe even more.

I would like to say "thank you" for selling it to me, and "thank you" for that page in your magazine each month. I would also like to say "goodbye" to Workbench 1.3 and hello WorkStation.

Finally, how do you format text as bold, italic or underlined using the QED text editor? If it isn't possible, could you suggest a goodish PD wordprocessor, and where to get it from?

Thanks for your kind words about WorkStation, it's good to hear that it is proving useful.

In reply to your QED question, I consulted Paul Austin, our WorkStation expert, and he says the QED text editor can't format text as bold face or italics because it is essentially a text editor and not a dedicated wordprocessor.

The PD wordprocessor that I suggest you get is Text Plus which can be obtained from Softville PD or any other large, well stocked PD library.

We don't charge £30 for the WorkStation because we aren't out to make a massive profit from it. We just wanted to compile the best PD utilities around onto a useable disk – with decent documentation. By all accounts it has been a great success.

The Gamer's up

It is my opinion that all your games tests should indicate the following

- 1. Is the game hard-disk compatible?
- 2. Is the game fully OS 2.0 compatible?
- 3. Does the game take advantage of power accelerators eg.the 68030 processor?

Unfortunately most games released for the Amiga do not fulfil these requirements. I think that it's your responsibility to inform about any advantage or disadvantage of any piece of software. Also in my opinion the game rating percentages in *Amiga Computing* are way too high. You cannot give every game 90% ratings...yes I know you depend on software companies' advertising, but please try to rate games a bit more seriously.







orget all that scribbling rough outlines on scraps of paper, and sketching in ideas as they pop out in chaotic fashion. With an ideas processor, so the theory goes, you can neatly organise anything from a rough schedule to an entire book, and by controlling the creative process arrive at the finished product in a structured

New Horizons' Flow, now in its third version, is a fairly straightforward piece of software. In operation, it works just like a wordprocessor, except instead of lines you have potential headings, leading in to sub-headings, and so on.

To start a project, a main heading is required. For, say, ideas on a management seminar, this could be "Day

One". To add sub-headings, you simply press Tab to indent the next heading. Carry on in this way, and you can define headings to a depth of twenty levels.

Day One's first sub-heading could be "Morning Session", and could include a list of its own sub-headings such as "Discussion Topics", "Methods", and so on. By double-clicking on any heading or sub-heading, it is expanded to show the next level of headings, and by double-clicking again, it is collapsed.

House of cards

It follows that when a screen becomes cluttered by all of these sub-headings, it is an easy task to click on the highest level of heading – the main heading, Day One – and collapse the whole project back down to one line of text.

You needn't stop at one main heading, of course. There's always Day Two and Day Three, not to mention "Sobering up on the train home before the loving partner realises your residential management seminar was nothing more than an excuse for a giant booze-up". Easy as pie.

The beauty of a program like Flow is the extent to which a simple initial layout can be extrapolated through various sub-levels until a full outline is generated.

The ease with which this is achieved by Flow is rather deceptive, however, as you could be forgiven for thinking you're using little more than a wordCan you order your thoughts with an ideas processor? Stevie Kennedy takes a look

processor with collapsible headings. That's because Flow is just that – it is designed as a structure into which your ideas will "flow". All the hard work is left to the user, who must supply the ideas in time-honoured fashion. Where the program departs from its appearance as an electronic scribbling pad is in its simple yet highly organised structure.

I found using the program extremely easy, and was fairly surprised when I ended up with a tightly constructed set

of ideas for future articles. Even better, when I wanted to go back through the outline in search of a single idea, Flow's wordprocessor facilities came into their own.

The Search function is fast and will find any word, no matter how deeply nested in sub-levels, a lot quicker than I would have been able to rummage through my doodle-infested notebook. The 50,000 word spell checker – with American spellings, unfortunately – is the same as that supplied with QuickWrite, and is slower than I would have liked, but as it will only be used when an outline is to be printed for someone else's benefit it doesn't let the package down too much.

Edited ideas

I found particularly useful the program's capacity to grab a heading at the highest level and drag it up or down the list of headings, taking all its sub-headings with it. In this way, whole schedules can be rearranged with a mouse drag in a few seconds, or your outline can be laid out in a more logical manner.

By opening up to four outlines at once, it is also possible to cut and paste entire sections between them. If, for example, you have a separate project for the second day of your management seminar, but wish to re-schedule the 10am slot so that the two days swap over, you can cut and paste from Day One to Day Two, and vice versa.

This sort of post-idea re-working is

the sort of exercise which normally results in your notebook becoming completely covered in arrows, circles, exclamation marks, and comments like "maybe swap 10am slots". With Flow, the change is accomplished the minute you think of it.

The program also has the invaluable ability to automatically number headings and re–number them if dragged to another location. This means you can generate lists and re–order them to your heart's content safe in the knowledge that the list is always in the correct order.

For lovers of officialdom, Flow's numbering options also include the chapter-section-paragraph standard to be found in all long and confusing documents. If you really want, you can generate outlines to baffle even the most hardened insurance salesman!

I was a little disappointed to find that Flow's Search function can't handle a search for a numbered paragraph. You cannot, for example, tell it to look for paragraph I.A.1.(c), as the numbers are scattered around tagged on to the beginning of their respective headings. As they don't appear together in the document, the search function doesn't pick them up.

You can jump to the page of your choice, of course, but as Flow is organised far more on the basis of headings and sub-headings, the lack of a decent "go to section" option is a major omission.

More macros


Yes, you guessed it – Flow is ARexx compatible. You can define any number of macros, ten of which are available from a pull-down menu, and send or receive commands via an ARexx port. As just about everyone and his dog seem to be using ARexx these days, and as it can, with practice, be a powerful tool, its inclusion is a welcome sight.

Conclusion

Flow is a useful package which, after a short time, can surprise you by how much it helps your thought generation and organisation. It won't have the ideas for you, but it is an ideal tool to apply to them once they've struggled from your over-burdened brain.

For the money, it could offer a bit more, and is a fairly expensive alternative to the good old spiral bound notebook, but if your business involves a lot of work based around a developing idea, Flow would make a perfect complement to your planning process.







Ithough C itself is an easy language to learn, newcomers learning it on the Amiga frequently run into problems.

Why? It's usually because they attempt to tackle both learning about the C language and learning about the Amiga at the same time! Taken together these two things produce a lot of headaches and the easiest way to avoid this situation is to become comfortable with C before you start delving into the Amiga-specific world of Intuition windows, gadgets and menus.

The best way to do this is to start by writing simple CLI/Shell based programs which just use C's standard input/output functions rather than begin by trying to open Intuition screens and windows.

Within a few weeks you'll find that you come to terms with the general idea of writing the code, compiling and linking etc., and you can then concentrate on getting a decent understanding of C's pointer and structure operations.

These latter topics are vital and once a little experience in these areas has been placed under your belt you are likely to find that examples in the Amiga manuals, including the official Addison Wesley RKM reference manuals, will make quite a bit

One thing that should be mentioned to the aspiring C programmer is the business of ANSI C because, if you're new to C, you won't know about the big change that has occurred recently. Since C's birth there's been a defacto standard based on a book written by Brian Kernighan and Dennis Richie called The C Programming Language (affectionately known as K&R). Somewhat surprisingly there has not been an official standard.

The growing popularity of C, the creation of compilers by software houses who were not involved with the original design of the language, together with a number of other related issues led to the formation of an ANSI (American National Standards Institute) C committee.

Their objective? To look at the language, look at possible improvements which could be made, and to create an official standard.

The standard formally defines things that were only hinted at in the original definition of the language and it provides a number of alterations which make it easier for a compiler to check the validity of C source code.

For the first time it also specifies a set of standard function libraries which all

Minding the language new compilers will support. All of the

major C compilers are already almost fully ANSI C compatible but the same is not true about the growing number of public domain offerings that are nowadays avail-

The biggest difference is likely to be the way that functions are written and declared and, if you are learning C from a PD version of the language, you may in fact need to use function declarations based on the old style K&R C!

Many existing introductory C books, incidentally, are are based on a pre-ANSI, ie K&R style, version of the C language. In your early C days only the function-declaration/function-prototype orientated changes are likely to concern you - but it is as well to know that a number of other differences do exist.

A new dimension

The C world has quite a lot to offer the Amiga programmer, including two excellent commercial compilers...

Lattice/SAS C: This is the most expensive Amiga C compiler environment but you do get an awful lot for your money including the compiler, editor, linker, a

powerful source level debugger and a collection of other programming tools. Throw in an assembler, all the Amiga header files, the massive Lattice/SAS function libraries and superb documentation and it doesn't take long to appreciate why this is the package the professionals tend to go for.

Manx's Aztec C: This is the other main commercial offering available for the Amiga. It also has many good points and, like the Lattice/SAS environment, comes with its own set of programming utilities (editor, librarian, debugger and so on). You get the Amiga header files, the very comprehensive Aztec function library and some good documentation.

On the public domain/shareware/anything-ware front there is now quite a collection of environments available. When you buy one of these compilers you will not get the official Commodore header files and this starts to be a problem once you get into Amiga programming proper. The header files are, however, available from Commodore for around £30.

So what choice do you have when following the non-commercial road? Here are some of the goodies that, for a few quid, can get you into the world of C pro-

Sozobon C: This Amiga version of the freeware compiler forms the basis of a number of offerings. It started life on the ST and the Amiga port seems to have been reasonably trouble free. Sozobon C is a K&R style compiler so you will not be able to use things like ANSI C's function

Z C: This would seem to be a modified

version of the above compiler. I've heard about it but have not personally used it -Margaret Stanger however did look at in the September issue!

NorthC: Produced by Steve Hawtin, the NorthC disk is one of the newer offerings to hit the Amiga world. In the main it has proven to be quite good, and its library functions are growing with each release. The only real drawback is that it doesn't support the new ANSI style of function declarations but, with a little practice at using and converting between the two C styles, this is less of a problem than might at first be imagined.

PDC: This is the only non-commercial offering I've come across that is usefully near to the ANSI standard in terms of its support for function prototypes, function declarations and structure passing. After some preliminary trials PDC looks to be about the best of the bunch as far as a cheap ANSI style C goes.

A bit of advice...

If you choose one of the public-domain/anything-ware compilers then you'll probably find your first job will be de-archiving the disk. Your second job should be to print out all the document files you can find on the resulting disks.

Also, print out some of the program examples which are invariably included. Chances are that not only is all this printing going to take you ages but, if you are new to programming, you will not understand much of it anyway. That however, doesn't matter - access to the hard copy will make it easier for you to browse through the documentation, and for you to see the example programs as whole units rather than just fragments on the screen. All this will help you come to terms with the C language more easily.





ith no more ado we'll dive straight back in where I left off last month. This time we'll round off our look at SID by revealing the mysteries locked within the remaining command panel.

Rename, Delete and Disk

Rename, as you're probably aware, will do exactly that to any file which has been highlighted. It's possible to highlight multiple files and jump from one to the next, simply hitting Return to add the appropriate name as you proceed through the list.

Delete is another fairly self-explanatory command, which will have the desired effect on any highlighted directory or file providing, of course, that the disk and files in question are unprotected.

The third member of our initial trio is Disk which can be a very handy addition to SIDney's repertoire, giving an instant rundown on the status of any device on your system, whether that be a floppy volume, a hard drive or a partition.

Protect, Set

The second trio kicks off with two files that at first glance appear to be identical but which have one very distinct difference.

The first of the two, namely Protect, is designed to work on individual files, assigning a unique combination of flags or bits for each. With the aid of this little addition SID can help you to decide whether a file should be hidden, protected, undeletable, or in fact, any combination of the eight available bits.

Once a combination is complete and the protection set the next or previous file in the selected list can be accessed and adjusted accordingly. When the final file is set and protected, all the flags are assigned and the selected files released.

To check the status of any file simply click on bits after hitting the right mouse button at the bottom of the screen. This will display the bits status of all listed files instantly.

The Set option is almost identical, but once a bit combination is set it's applied to all the highlighted files. This may seem a little brutal but it can be invaluable if you want to universally change a bit, for example, hiding some incriminating art work or ensuring that

all files can be deleted if necessary. Info works in a similar way to Disk but applies to files and directories rather than to disks.

Simply highlight the file in question and hit the Info icon to reveal all the necessary information from the format, size, status and so on.

All, None and Pattern

All and None are, in effect, a reflection of each other and are simply used to highlight or de-select entire directory lists ready for copying, deletion, viewing, hearing or, in fact, anything you fancy.

The third of the trilogy is related to its predecessors but is a great deal more subtle as it can be defined to select files by their suffix alone. For example, all files with the suffix .pic could be selected from a list of hundreds merely by adding the word .pic after the #? — or wild card — in the Pattern requester.

Hit Return and all the files with the suffix .pic will be selected regardless of the name in front of the suffix. Once selected, all the options are available.

Pattern matching is very useful for all

manner of disk management so keep it in mind when you're working with large numbers of files: it can save hours of arduous clicking.

Bytes, memory and time

Bytes is another method of measuring the size of a file and the number of files and sub-directories within any directory. The command can also be applied to individual files.

After any entry is selected a rundown of the bytes, blocks, number of files and directories appears below the command panel for your perusal.

Memory gives a detailed measurement of available Chip and Fast ram plus a running total of the two. This is another very handy option for single drive users who want to squeeze a few more files into ram before dumping them back to a fresh floppy.

Time. Yes, you've guessed it, this one tells the time and before you reach for a biro to tell me... "that would be all well and good if you could set the bloody time with the Workstation", in fact you can, but it must be done through the CLI – or dare I say it, use Workbench.

This seemingly strange state of affairs is due to the cut down preferences used on the Workstation which has all the options of the original – apart from clock adjustment, of course – and still manages to do it using only 18K as opposed to the 56K of the original preferences.

The final three buttons are mostly ignored due to the inclusion of Lharca back on the main Workstation screen. Nevertheless if you want to go straight to Lharca rather than return to the main screen simply highlight a file and click on ARC. Now hit Return and Lharca will auto-load.

Once loaded all the archiving options are ready and waiting so there's no need for the sometimes complex syntax usually associated with archiving.

For those of you who need alternative archiving routines, next month's issue will be a must because we'll look at swapping some of SID's commands to suit you and your system.

Until next month that's about it. Next time we'll also look at customising SID's config file along with how to tinker with the internal workings of a few of his contemporaries.

Hard times

About a year ago I acquired a GVP 40Mb hard drive for my A500, and since then I have had quite a few problems with read/write errors. Initially, the problem was fixed by the local Commodore importer who could not explain to me exactly how he did it – the language is a bit of a problem here.

However, the problem recurred and I am now pretty sure that it is due to inadvertent use – by my inquisitive three-year-old twins! – of the boot off/on switch on the front of the drive. I have used FixDisk and DiskDoctor several times to repair the disk structure, but on re-formatting the drive (always in FFS) the errors gradually reappear until the drive no longer auto-boots. I fear the root block is affected, and I wonder whether this is addressed by the FORMAT command.

In view of my problems I wish to seek your advice on the following:

- What utility software is available to fully prepare a hard drive, partition it, write the boot block, and so on?
- Is FixDisk capable of repairing the problem, and if so, how should that be done?
- FixDisk tells me the device handler is SCSIDEV.DEVICE. Where does it find that? Is it hard wired on rom as part of the drive?

Please help! The drive was purchased from Power Computing in the UK, but it'd mean enormous phone bills to contact them.

The game switch is innocent! Before you tape it down or otherwise restrict what is actually a handy feature of the Impact Series II drives, consider the real problem. If you're still getting read/write errors after repeatedly re-formatting your hard drive (ouch!), the problem most likely lies with the drive mechanism.

If the drive has received a knock in transit from the UK, or in a Bangkok warehouse, the drive heads will probably be damaged. The only practical solution would be to replace the hard drive itself with a slimline Quantum ProDrive mechanism. This will fit snugly in the GVP's casing and shouldn't cost too much in your part of the world.

As for the software you mention, FixDisk is about the best shareware hard and floppy disk repairer, and the GVP FaaastPrep software you should have received with your drive is perfectly adequate to prep, partition, and format your hard drive.

Take the drive to your local dealer and have him fit a new Quantum mechanism in the shop. Make sure he does it on the spot because it's not a difficult task and it sounds like he did a poor job the first time you went to him.

PC piccies

I would be obliged if you could help me with a query on the utility IFF2PCXII on the CoverDisk.

I can convert the image to PCX with no problems on an Amiga formatted disk, but when I put the disk into an IBM PS/2 it refuses to be recognised, which I can understand.

Could you please tell me the steps to load a converted IFF file in PCX to the PC?

Judging by the number of letters we get along a similar vein, there are armies of Amiga owners trying to force PCs to accept Amiga files. The process is fairly simple. First, you buy a PD or shareware

MSdos transfer program such as MessyDos, or go for one of the commercial ones like Dos-2-Dos. Once you've set this up on your Amiga, it's a simple matter of formatting a PC disk and copying the file on to it.

Transfer programs usually allow you to specify which of your floppy drives is to be treated as a PC drive, but I'd recommend MessyDos as it's shareware and allows the floppy drive to act as an Amiga drive or a PC drive, depending on what format of disk is inserted. It's a bit trickier to install than one of the commercial programs, but MessyDos is worth the effort.

Bother with bugs

I am in desperate need of advice as I have a problem with a virus and can't get rid of it.

I recently purchased an A500 with A501 memory upgrade, and bought separately a Zydec external drive. However, nearly all my disks have read/write errors or Not A Valid Dos Disk in Unit 0 or 1.

My friend suggested I try a virus killer, so I went to my local software store who supplied what they considered the best killer for £10. I loaded it up and bingo, a requester with the message "Unknown (virus) task in memory" popped up.

Having followed the onscreen instructions I terminated it, or so I thought. The virus killer then crashed.

My fault, I thought, and went through the same procedure but was rewarded with another crash. I tried six times to load the killer, and each time after terminating a virus it crashed. The virus killer is not at fault as I have replaced it with a new one and used my friend's version with the same results.

I need help as I am stuck with £400 worth of useless junk until the problem is solved.

You say the virus killer is not at fault, but if you paid £10 for a commercial killer, it almost certainly is. All the best Amiga virus killers are available for a small fee as shareware or PD programs, and the only commercial killers I can think of are hopelessly out of date.

Check out this month's CoverDisk! You will find a copy of John Veldthuis's excellent freeware Virus Checker.

It is the latest version, which recognises many new file viruses, including the Saddam virus, and comes with a program called FixSaddam.

Use this to check all your disks and kill off the viruses you find, then run it at regular intervals to ensure your collection isn't infected again. As a sensible Amiga owner, you should also keep an eye on the PD/shareware scene for the latest developments on the virus front.

Wrong driver

I use the Pen Pal wordprocessor, and whenever I try printing anything using the Amiga Fonts/Amiga Graphics option, after printing what I have asked, the printer, upon reaching the start of the next sheet of paper, starts printing a load of continuous black lines and the program just freezes then gives me a guru.

This can't be due to lack of memory, because I have an A590 with extra 2Mb, and ProWrite 3.1.1 gives me no problems. I have checked the obvious, such as setting up the correct printer driver, but to no avail.

Please can you help, as I have £80 of software just sitting on the shelf? My printer is a Seikosha SP180ai and the printer driver I use is the MPS_1250. One other question – assuming you can solve the printing problem, how do I import Photon paint pictures into Pen Pal without them looking like they've gone through a shredder?

Your problem almost certainly lies with the printer driver. The CMPS_1250 driver is specifically designed to work with the Commodore printer and will be only incompletely compatible with other printers.

The Seikosha is an Epson-compatible printer, so you should use the standard EpsonX driver supplied with Workbench and on the Pen Pal extras disk. If you still have problems, check your printer's DIP switches to ensure they're set up correctly for graphics printing. It's highly unlikely that the fault lies here, but it's always worth checking them.

The reason your Photon Paint pictures are looking a bit bedraggled is because Pen Pal is designed to cope only with eight colour images. If, therefore, you want an accurate representation of your graphics, you'll have to restrict yourself to the smaller palette. No HAM printing for you I'm afraid!

Imported drives

I am considering buying a GVP series II 52Mb hard drive for my A500, and have seen advertisements in an American magazine where they sell this hard drive for approximately \$600. At the current rate of exchange, this works out at £361.

In the UK, the same product is advertised for approximately £500. Many other products are also cheaper in the US. I appreciate the risks involved, especially if the goods are faulty, but if purchased on a credit card, are there any savings to be made?

How do you overcome the power supply differences, and how much would shipping and import duties cost? Are there any other potential pitfalls?

The GVP power supplies which come with Impact Series II drives work both in the US and the UK without the need for an adaptor. The question of postage and import duties is another thing entirely.

Check with the retailer and find out how much more they charge for overseas delivery. You might find they will charge little or no more, but you may find yourself landed with a hefty courier bill. As for import duties, I'm not genned up on such matters and can't really say how much it'd cost. However, we regularly receive packages from the US, some of which require duties of £60 or more to release them from the clutches of the Excise man. Your best bet would be to phone Customs and Excise.

The only other problem I can see arising is if the drive develops a fault or is damaged in transit. The process of having it replaced by the retailler would undoubtedly be much more prolonged than if the drive was bought in the UK.



All the best

o kick off my spell as Amiga Computing's new comms columnist, I thought I'd give you a mini-review of all the comms packages I've used on the Amiga.

All of the systems mentioned below work quite well, so it's down to my personal opinion of each one. Some people will swear by the ones I don't recommend - but choice of comms software is a very personal thing.

I would always recommend that you try the free or shareware packages first, before graduating to the commercial systems. Shareware packages tend to be more up to date than commercial ones, since the former have no distribution delays and can be updated quickly without the need for expensive repackaging.

Access!

Registration: \$25 (but see below)

Let's start with a package I wouldn't recommend, despite its very neat presentation and reasonable ANSI graphics support. Unfortunately, the author, Keith Young, seems to have disappeared off the face of the earth, making registration difficult.

Access! is quite old now, and other programs offer more. So saying that, it's not that bad if you already have it, since it does work most of the

A-Talk III

A-Talk tries to be everything to everyone. It can emulate a wide variety of terminals, from the slightly obscure Heath H19 through the more usual VT100/ANSI emulations, to the rather specialised Tektronics 4014 graphics terminal.

Strangely, only the Tek and Workbench screen options support PAL screens; the rest are short 200-line NTSC efforts.

As befits a program which will be used with mainframe and BBS connections, A-Talk offers all the common file transfer protocols, including ZModem and Kermit. Facilities for adding more protocols are supplied through External Protocol (XPR) library support.

For such a comprehensive program, it is surprising to find that there is no way of configuring the package to your modem, beyond choosing from a small list of supported hardware. Since most of the modems on the list have been superseded or were never approved for use in the UK, you may encounter problems if you have an obscure setup.

A-Talk offers the most powerful script language of any Amiga comms program. It integrates ARexx with its own commands, allowing data captured online to be processed offline by other programs. Several examples are provided, including a simple BBS and a powerful remote access system.

The program is supplied with a very fine manual, which provides an excellent introduction to communications terminology and practice, along with clear descriptions of the workings of the sys-

Unlike other systems, A-Talk is supplied with some of the archiving and file maintenance utilities required for day-to-day BBSing. Unfortunately, the very common Lharc archiver is not included, possibly because A-Talk was around before it made an appearance on the Amiga.

A-Talk is a "nearly" program. It is rather steeply

priced, with an RRP of around £90, and there is rather too much to complain about for that sort of money. Still, it is a well presented program which is both reliable and useful.

AZComm

Free Fish Disk 171

AZComm is very old, and compared to most other programs, very basic. It has no phonebook editing facilities - a text editor is used instead - no support for ANSI graphics, no PAL support and no call time logging either.

It sounds like it's a turkey. How could anyone recommend it over something as pretty as Access!? There are two extremely good reasons.

Firstly, AZComm has a very fast implementation of ZModem. This protocol is generally regarded as the best way of transmitting data across a telephone line, because it automatically adjusts itself to suit varying line noise conditions.

Secondly, AZComm is very small as Amiga comms programs go. It's around 64Kb long, allowing it to fit on a fairly full startup disk without displacing too many useful utilities.

AZComm will certainly be adequate for starting out in comms, since it doesn't have too many confusing options. It was the first piece of comms software I used on the Amiga, and I still rate it highly.

JR-Comm 1.02a

Registration: US\$35 Most bulletin boards

JR-Comm is a program shaped by the requests of hundreds of BBS users worldwide. Jack Radigan, the author, has a very definite vision of how the program will evolve, and has been known to flatly refuse to implement ideas which don't fit in with his philosophy.

The program is designed to be the best for serious BBSing with fast modems. Although it will emulate a VT100 terminal, it's most at home with its full ANSI terminal emulation, right down to mimicking the keyboard of an IBM PC.

JR-Comm supports the Amiga-specific SkyPix terminal standard. This allows windows, menus, bitmap graphic animations and sampled sounds to be used in an online system. It's not quite multimedia, but it's fun if you find one of the very few boards which support it.

The ZModem adaptive file transfer protocol is supported better than any Amiga program. These options are set via a large array of gadgets, which has a tendency to bewilder the new user. Personally, it gives me the raving technofear habdabs every time.

At least the documentation isn't too frightening. The documentation actually amounts to more



Unregistered versions of JR-Comm have delay screens built in, plus plaintive messages are posted after 30 days' use. For such a powerful program, JR-Comm is very reasonably priced at US\$35. That's around £21 in Real Money, or less than the price of one possibly mediocre game.

JR-Comm doesn't support scripts yet, but a version with this plus ARexx support is in the works. As it stands, it's an uncompromising sports model of a terminal program - some people won't be able to handle it.

NComm 1.92

Registration: Giftware Most bulletin boards

NComm is the sole European effort in this whole overview. It was originally written to allow the Amiga to support the IBM-Norwegian character set, but over time it has matured into what has to be my favourite terminal program.

The outstanding feature of NComm is its internal multitasking - you can be browsing through the scrollback buffer while the terminal is still receiving and displaying information from the remote system. You might think that this is of limited use, but once you've tried it, you really can't

Registration is easy and novel - just send the authors a gift. The nature of the gift is entirely up to you, but it should reflect the value of the program to you. Hmm, how am I going to post a gold brick to Norway ...?

The usual protocols are supported, plus any extra you may wish to add via XPR library support. There are known problems with certain versions of the XPR ZModem library, and NComm is supplied with an old, but serviceable, version.

There are also problems with high speed support for YModem-G, the fast minimal protocol for use with error-correcting modems. Despite these problems, I can still get momentary bursts of over 1900 characters per second with ZModem on an A500 and a Courier HST, so it's not slow.

NComm does have quite a powerful script language, but because it doesn't support ARexx, it cannot readily control external programs. It is quite powerful enough to write a small BBS system, and one is supplied in script form with the distribution archive.

The latest version of NComm (v1.92) isn't available outside the BBS circuit. However, the very serviceable NComm 1.9 is on Fish Disk 356. The later version adds better file requesters and fuller support for XPR protocols (including Kermit) plus the ability to change the program's task priority for enhanced performance.

I use NComm 1.92 daily, and I keep hearing tales of woe about how it doesn't work on other

people's systems. For once, my ageing and sometimes incorrigible A500 works perfectly with a piece of "difficult" software. It gets my vote as the best Amiga comms program around.

Free

Fish Disks 468 & 455 - both required

VLT is a special purpose comms program. It could be used for connecting to bulletin boards, but it is really designed for mainframe connections.

It emulates a DEC VT100 terminal to a very high standard, with character graphics and 132 column operation. It also pretends to be a Tektronics 4014 graphics terminal, a standard used in mainframe CAD applications, right down to coordinate input using the mouse.

VLT supports XModem and Kermit file transfer protocols, plus any XPR external protocol library so ZModem can be used if desired. Since the system is tailored for graphics applications, it can save the screen as an IFF bitmap or as PostScript structured graphics. ARexx is fully supported, allowing the program to be customised to the user's prefer-

In short, if you need to connect to a large remote computer system, VLT is the program to do it. It has more features applicable to this sort of usage at a lower cost than any of the other sys-

Online! Platinum

Published by Micro-Systems Software Inc Distributed in the UK by HB Marketing Ltd Tel: 0753 686000

This program can be bought separately, or as part of The Works! Platinum Edition software bundle. If you really shop around, The Works! can be bought for under £80, which offers good value for money. Online! costs around £40 if bought separately, which is still very reasonable.

Online! isn't sure whether it's a BBS users package or a technical users system. It offers all the necessary protocols for good BBSing - including the extremely obscure SADIE protocol, used only in MSS products - plus it tries its hand at VT100 and Tek 4010 emulation.

It offers a very powerful scripting language, with full ARexx support. It isn't quite as powerful as A-Talk's scripting language, but it would certainly be able to run a small BBS host, or feed captured data to external applications.

If I have to pick holes in Online! Platinum, I found a very tiny irregularity in the elaborate installation sequence. It missed out a vital colon in an Assign command, causing it to fail. As it appended it to one of your startup files, it would have prevented the system working in a very subtle and nasty manner. Once discovered, the problem is embarrassingly simple to fix - just add the missing colon.

Onlinel also manages to look old, somehow - it has all the old-style requesters, with none of the pseudo-3D WB2.0 look. Despite the aesthetics, it works well, but as a stand-alone package, NComm and JR-Comm offer more for less money. If you also want the other packages in The Works!, it offers usable features at a very low cost.

Conclusion


So there we have it - a brief look at most of the Arniga comms programs. I know I've missed out a few, but those omitted are the ones I have never used.

So which one is the winner? For general BBS work, it's a straight fight between JR-Comm and NComm. They're pretty much level on features, and they are both top-line pieces of software.

Since NComm and JR-Comm are shareware, you can make up your own mind about which is best. I prefer NComm; it happens to work the way I like working.



DTP for DTV

fter last month's look at how you can use DPaint within your video productions, I thought I'd continue on the theme with a look at a few more packages that could make your video productions look a lot more professional.

Rather than waffle on endlessly about the more obvious programs – presentation systems and video titlers, for example – I thought I'd restrict the coverage, for the meantime, to some of the more unusual programs.

Believe it or not, many of the packages that you may use for such things as DTP and solid modelling work can be used for genuinely useful video work. You may not think that DTP is something that translates to video particularly well, but you'd be surprised. All that is needed is a little bit of imagination and an understanding of the technology available to you.

One package that I use a great deal is Soft Logic's excellent PageStream 2.1. Why? Well, now that PageStream supports Compugraphic fonts, it's ideal for producing titles.

OK, several video titler manufacturers are now starting to use Compugraphic fonts too, but PageStream offers distinct advantages. For starters, PageStream's ability to scale fonts simply by dragging them in or out to the required size is a real boon. If you've ever tried producing video titles using conventional bitmap fonts, you'll soon start to appreciate just how useful this feature is.

Unlike bitmapped fonts, Compugraphic fonts are scalable, so you can stretch and compress them to just about any size without any degradation in quality. Even at very small point sizes, Compugraphic fonts still look a lot better than their bitmapped cousins.

Obviously the resolution that you are working in will degrade the title a little, but Compugraphic fonts still manage to look good, even in low res.

a program like PageStream, don't forget to turn off the page grid. If you don't, you'll have lots of little dots which must be painted out before the graphic can be used.

Pagestream's box rotation is far more powerful.

It's not just restricted to straight box rotation – like

ProPage – instead, you can slant and twist fonts,
which not only helps to add a bit of variety, but
can also make your titles look more professional.

Right so we've discussed how to manipulate all

Right, so we've discussed how to manipulate all those lovely Compugraphic fonts, all that now remains is to turn them into something that can be used within a video titling, paint or presentation system. For this, I use a very powerful little screen grabbing utility called PicSaver.

It's a PD program, so there's no excuse whatsoever for not buying yourself a copy of it today. Pic Saver is on TBAG disk 56 which is available from AmigaNuts United on 0703 785680.

PicSaver isn't just a screen grabber though. What makes it so special is its ability to grab any rectangular section of any screen. Simply by holding down three hot keys, you can drag out a box around a particular section of the screen. When you release the mouse button, PicSaver saves the graphic block to disk as an IFF file. If you are using

Great effects

Once you have your title on disk as an IFF file, all that remains is to tart it up a bit in a paint package like DPaint. The demo image shown elsewhere on this page was created using nothing more than PageStream and a copy of DPaint 3.

I'm sure you'll agree that it looks a lot nicer than the kind of effects that are obtainable using conventional bitmapped fonts. It's also worth noting that I've put a 2 pixel black border around the graphic. As discussed last month, this helps to minimalise colour bleeding when the image is laid down on to video tape.

PageStream isn't the only package that can be used for video work. Another very fine DTP program that I use extensively is Gold Disk's Professional Draw 2.0.

ProDraw handles all its graphics in structured form, therefore they can be twisted and stretched without any loss of image quality. Fonts are particularly well handled in ProDraw, although I must admit that the results don't always look as good as they do within PageStream.

Those of you with unexpanded Amigas may find the going a bit tough when you start playing around with large sections of graphic like those used within the screen shown. If you can afford it, it really is worth it to buy a ram expansion of at least 2Mb.

Even better, get your machine converted – in the case of the A500 – to work with the new ECS Agnus. This new chip, which is now installed inside all new Amigas, allows you to use up to a megabyte of chip ram, which can be very useful indeed for this kind of work.

Anyway, that's enough for now. I'll leave it to you to find even more ways of using packages like PageStream. If you do come up with a particularly good idea, why not write in and let me know?

Amiga Toasters for Macs

Amiga owners can no longer look on smugly at other professional computer users with the news that Kansas-based NewTek have developed a Video Toaster system for the Macintosh.

The Mac Video Toaster comprises of a black box which connects to the Mac via a smart serial interface. Contained within is all the usual Video Toaster hardware, plus an extra bit of circuitry that Mac owners may be rather reluctant to admit to – that is, it contains an Amiga.

Instead of developing a brand new Video Toaster for the Mac – which is something that probably wouldn't even be possible without considerably more circuitry – NewTek have decided instead to develop a stand-alone Video Toaster that contains much of the Amiga's custom hardware.

The fairly hefty box is basically an Amiga B2000 without a keyboard, although the software side of the Video Toaster is controlled almost entirely by the Macintosh. In reality though, the Mac is treated as nothing more than a dumb terminal, with all the hard work handled by the

Amiga itself, so we Amiga owners can still retain a certain amount of smugness.

Also on the Video Toaster front, NewTek have released version 2 of the Video Toaster. Little was known about this new release at the time of going to press, although sources close to the company revealed that the new Video Toaster offers double the resolution of the original Toaster plus much improved software. The new software offers many more video effects, plus a lot more besides.

There's still no news of the PAL Video Toaster which is definitely going ahead. NewTek are talking in terms of about a year, although I wouldn't be surprised if it took considerably longer.

The current Video Toaster is tied very closely to the peculiarities of the NTSC video system, working around loop holes to produce its effects. Producing a PAL version would also certainly require a total rethink, so don't hold your breath for this one.

Rest assured though, I'll be bringing you a full review as soon as a PAL Video Toaster appears.

How to score

Keeping scores and other info in a fast-moving game requires some fast code. Margaret Stanger has the answers

his month's Machine Code is all about the display on a scoreboard and there is a fully working program on the CoverDisk that demonstrates these techniques.

There are several ways to put the empty scoreboard on the screen. If the scoreboard is fairly simple, it could be generated by drawing into the rastport. This takes up no extra space on the disc or in the program.

The disadvantage is that drawing lines and colouring in rectangles can be rather time consuming, even for an Amiga.

The scoreboard could be generated by an art program like DeluxePaint, stored on disk, and read in whenever the scoreboard is to be cleared. The design can be more elaborate, perhaps even a posh scoreboard designed by an artist.

If the program has enough free memory, the scoreboard picture can be read into a bitmap in memory, stored there during the program run, and copied to the screen when needed. Usually I prefer this method but there is no hard and fast rule.

Status symbols

To add variety, sometimes a gameplayer's status can be displayed in picture form. Usually the small number of lives left is shown pictorially.

Time used and damage sustained are often displayed as an increasing line. Available weapons, energy, health and stamina can be a line that decreases depressingly quickly. These lines can be updated with a dot in the foreground or backgound colour very quickly.

The demonstration program shows decreasing energy and increasing time. To keep track of the passage of time, a green rectangle is slowly built up until it fills the rectangle. This is done by drawing an extra line every few game cycles.

The decrease in energy is done by adding black lines, and making the energy rectangle smaller.

The writing on the wall

For text and numbers that vary during the game, the graphics library text routines can be used. I find this process rather too slow for a fast moving game that needs its scores updating quite often. Instead I keep a copy of my system or designer font in picture form in memory.

The demonstration program reads in a DPaintll 320 x 256 4 Bitplane picture called fontpic. This contains both the blank scoreboard and the font.

I use the BltBitMap command to copy the text from memory to the screen. The letters are not copied very often, so I have used a routine that puts a mask of the letter on the background first, then the letter in the chosen colour. This could easily be adapted for multicoloured letters. The routine to display the numbers is slightly different. As the numbers are updated fairly often, I keep a copy of the number and its backgound, so that it can be copied to the screen in one operation.

To make life easier, I have written a small routine to display a chosen text string, or string of numbers:

Keeping score

The game score is kept in memory in a hexadecimal form in a byte, word or long word. This form is terrific for arithmetic, but not so good for display. An Ascii string of numbers is perfect for display, but useless for sums.

Whenever the scoreboard is updated the score has to be converted to its display form. The routine that does this conversion also has to make sure that the score does not overflow the scoreboard:

The key to it all

The keycode of the key pressed can be calculated from the value of the CIA sdr register. First the byte is copied from this register into one of the data registers, then it has to be unscrambled. If a key with code 6 is pressed down, the value from the register is:

11110011

This value is EOR'd with 255 (11111111) to give:-

00001100

This gives the keycode in positions 1 to 7, and the key up/down flag in postion zero. Rotate the byte one place to the right, and put the key up/down-

flag in position 7. This will give the RAWKEY CODE:

00000110

If a key with code 6 is released, the value from the register is:

11110010

this value is EOR'd with 255 (11111111) to give:-

00001101

This gives the keycode in positions 1 to 7, and the key up/down flag in postion zero. Rotate the byte one place to the right, and put the key up/downflag in position 7. This will give the RAWKEY CODE:

The routine _addscore looks at the RAWKEY CODE and discards key releases. If the code is for letter Q, the energy is put to minimum so that the program will exit. Numbers 1 to 9 conveniently have RAWKEY CODES from 1 to 9. These are displayed and added to the score. Number zero, with as RAWKEY CODE of 10, has to be intercepted first.

How the program works

The display is initialised, and the blank scoreboard and font are read in from the disk. The text is put in place, and the initial energy displayed. Each game cycle is counted. When the number of game cycles reaches the chosen rate then energy is decreased and time increased.

When a key is pressed down, the keycode is stored. If the key is a number between zero and nine, it is displayed as a number and added to the score. Key releases and most letters are ignored.

The program exits when the energy runs out, or Q is pressed. The numbers will have been echoed to the calling CLI window. Press Return, or delete these numbers to continue.

A great performance

Does the release of SunRize's Audition 4 mean the end for AudioMaster? Jason Holborn finds out

or years now, Aegis/Oxxi's AudioMaster sample editor has ruled the sampling waves. With its ultra-friendly user interface and powerful editing options, AudioMaster has remained the sampling fanatic's favourite.

Despite the fact that Aegis have only recently started bundling the program with a sampler, virtually all serious sampler users choose AudioMaster over the sample editors bundled with their sampling hardware.

I recently received a review sample of SunRize Industries' Audition 4. Billed as the program that "carries on where AudioMaster 3 left off", SunRize are certainly making brave claims. Does it live up to them?

Sound choice

SunRize have optimized Audition 4 to work with their own Perfect Sound 3 sampler, although it also supports a number of other samplers including Perfect Sound 1 and 2, SoundMaster and a general purpose Generic option. If you own a sampler that isn't directly supported, then it's worth trying both the SoundMaster and Generic settings to see which works best with your kit.

One surprising omission is the lack of support for high speed samplers like RamScan's excellent Audio Engineer. These will work perfectly well with the SoundMaster setting, but they won't be used to their full capacity.

Once you've told Audition 4 which sampler you are using, you're ready to get down to some serious sampling.

Play away

Upon loading, you'll notice that the Audition 4 screen is split into two distinct areas. At the top of the screen is the usual display which plots your sample in graphical format. Below this is a selection of gadgets which allow you to carry out all the basic functions including Play Waveform, which plays the entire sample held in memory; Play Display, which only plays the area of sample currently being displayed; and Play Range, which plays a marked range. There are also gadgets which allows you to zoom in and out of the sample and turn looping on and off.

Audition 4's Zoom function is particularly impressive. Most sample editors – including AudioMaster 3 – require you to mark out a range which the software instantly jumps to when you click Zoom.

However, the zoom function is considerably more sophisticated than this. Instead of jumping straight to the marked range, Audition 4 zooms in on it, increasing the amount of magnification until the desired range is fully displayed. It's a little like using a zoom lens on a camera. All the

rest of the Audition 4 functions must be selected from the pull-down menus, with extra gadgets appearing at the bottom of the screen whenever a function is selected. The first function that you will want to play with is the sampler section, so we'll take a look at that first.

Sample city

Audition 4 fully supports both mono and stereo sampling when used with a compatible sampler. Those like Sound Trap 3 or MasterSound won't allow for stereo sampling, so you'll need something like TechnoSound, AMAS or SoundMaster to grab stereo sound.

The sampler section is split into a number of gadgets which allow you to alter the sample rate, monitor the incoming sound source and finally grab a sample.

Surprisingly, you can't dynamically control the size of the sample. Instead, Audition 4 tries to allocate as much contiguous memory as possible. When you set the sample rate, it then tells you how long the sample will be in seconds. A 512k Amiga will grab five seconds worth when sampling at the maximum rate.

Depending on which sampler you are using, you can grab at up to 55 KHz. However, these really aren't a great deal of use, as the vast majority of sample-compatible music packages can't handle samples at this kind of rate.

The Amiga's own DMA sample playback hardware only supports rates of up to 29 KHz, so it's best to restrict sampling to these rates.

One very nice feature is Audition 4's ability to record samples direct to floppy disk, allowing you to produce your own sample demo disks. For this, Audition 4 uses its own high speed custom disk format and then tacks a player program on to the boot block of the disk.

As a result, the only way of playing back the sample once recorded to disk is to boot from the floppy that it is stored on. This is perhaps a little too limited for serious use.

I'm surprised that SunRize didn't build in a facility to allow direct recording to hard disk, so I guess we're going to have to wait for SunRize's new Studio 16 software which is bundled with their new 12 and 16-bit sampling cards.

All the usual editing functions are there, and are accessed by first selecting an area of sample using the mouse and then clicking on the appropriate option from the pull-down menus. You can cut areas of sample, copy and then paste areas of sample, zero marked ranges, insert sections and a lot more besides.

Even more interesting are Audition 4's special editing functions which include: Mix, which mixes two samples together; Echo, which adds echo to a marked range; Fade, which fades out a marked range; Flange, which adds a sort of "worbly" effect to a sample; Filter, which filters out specified frequencies; Smooth, which takes out higher frequencies; Maximise, which boosts certain frequencies; and Lift Treble and Bass, which lift the treble and bass of the sample respectively.

Many of these operations is that they can be previewed before you commit yourself. This way, you can control the effect of the operations dynamically, allowing you to get your sample sounding just right.

Conclusion


Because Audition 4 is such a complex program it would be almost impossible to cover every aspect of the program within this single page. Suffice it to say that virtually everything that can be done within AudioMaster 3 can also be done within Audition 4. This includes sequenced loops, waveform tuning and much more besides.

It is without doubt one of the most comprehensive sample editors available for the Amiga. I'm not quite sure whether I'd stop using AudioMaster 3 altogether in favour of Audition 4, but I'd most certainly have Audition 4 at hand whenever I wanted to apply certain effects to a sample.

There's no escaping the fact that Audition 4 is a very capable system indeed. For the price, it represents extremely good value for money. So if you are after a sample editor, check out Audition 4 first. You won't be disappointed.

All together now!

ntertainment software is big business now, and people have to be a little bit more creative to produce a good game, something which can be distinctly different to a good seller! Hopefully Amos will help you to spend a lot more of your time exercising these creative energies.

One important thing to remember about games software is that a lot of programmers cheat. We have covered different methods of "cheating" in previous issues. Some of the most amazing effects seen in games are, in fact, merely illusion – screen swapping, colour cycling and palette switching are just some of the ways to get amazing results without compromising the speed of your program.

Almost anybody can use these methods, but the real skill is in integrating them with the software so that they are invisible to the player, while at the same time making him or her think "wow, I wonder how they did that?".

OK, the first step in any piece of software is to set up your screen. we've done all of this before – if you missed it then buy the back issues – so I won't take you through all of the old details again:

> ' Set up Screen Open 0,320,200,16,Lowres Curs Off Flash Off Cls O Get Sprite Palette Double Buffer Autoback O

Now we have the task of initialising all of the variables that we will use. Although Amos - and most other versions of Basic for that matter - does not require you to do this, it is a habit you should get into. After all, you won't be using Amos forever, will you?

We will need to keep track of the X and Y position of our character, so we will use two variables called X_GOOD and Y_GOOD. As well as storing the position of our character the joystick status will have to be stored, so we will call that variable WAY:

X_6000=150 Y_6000=100 WAY=0

Of course we will also need to move the bad guy around, so we will call its X and Y coordinates X_BAD and Y_BAD:

X_BAD=0 Y_BAD=0

Finally we may want to introduce individual speeds for each of the characters in the game, so we will call these – guess what? – GOOD_SPEED and BAD_SPEED. Notice that by using meaningful variable names we can tell a glance what a particular section of code is doing, but be careful of falling into the trap of ending up with variable names 40 characters long – they can be a real drag to type in!

BAD_SPEED=1

Ohhhh, I almost forgot. This game is very simple and because of this it is going to be blindingly fast, so in order to slow it down we will only update everything occasionally. It sounds strange I know, but all will become clear very soon.

The variable we are going to use to control this

is called T – or time! – and the variable used to hold the score is called SCORE:

T=1 SCORE=

Now we have to stick the player and the bad guy on to the screen. For this example program we are using BOBs, but you could use hardware SPRITEs:

> Bob 1,X_GOOD,Y_GOOD,1 Bob 2,X BAD,Y BAD,2

Now for the main part of the game:

Repeat

The first line here tells the program that we only want to execute everything inside the IF structure when the variable T has a value of two. At the moment it only have a value of one:

If T=2

Our next task is to check the joystick to see if a movement has been made. We will use the JOY() function rather than the JUP/JDOWN functions, because it is more versatile. A fuller explanation as to why this is will be given in the next issue.

We store the current joystick value – which is a number between 0 and 16 – in the variable WAY. If WAY has a value greater than zero then we know that the joystick is being moved, and we can then test the direction and move our character:

WAY=Joy(1) If WAY>0

At this point we know that our man has moved so we can increase the score by one:

Inc SCORE

Now comes the joystick testing bit. In a previous issue we saw how the JOY() function returns values depending on how it is currently positioned. Just to recap, these are the values for the four basic directions: UP=1, DOWN=2, LEFT=4, RIGHT=8.

Knowing this we can see if the player wants to move the character and so can increase/decrease the X_GOOD/Y_GOOD variables accordingly:

If WAY=8
Add X_GOOD,GOOD_SPEED,O To 319
End If
If WAY=4
Add X_GOOD,-GOOD_SPEED,O To 319
End If
If WAY=1
Add Y_GOOD,-GOOD_SPEED,O To 199
End If
If WAY=2
Add Y_GOOD,GOOD_SPEED,O To 199
End If

Another trick when writing a game is not to update anything on the screen unless it has moved. For this reason we will only redraw our little character when the joystick has been moved:

Bob 1, X_6000, Y_6000,1

Here is a tricky question, with a very simple answer. How do you make a nasty home—in on your good guy? Well, imagine you were playing a game where you had to run after somebody. The brain would follow a simple set of rules, like: "If the person is to the left of me, I must move left," and, "if the person is in front of me I must move forward."

These are the simple rules we can follow to make a "homer". Of course most games have a slightly longer list of rules to control movement of bad guys and good guys, but at the end of the day they are still only a list of rules that the program must follow.

I am sure you have played many games where after a while you realise that if you perform a certain action at a certain point, you can make the program do the same thing almost every time. This is because it is just following a set of simple – or complicated – rules:

If X GOOD<X BAD
Add X_BAD,-BAD_SPEED
Else
Add X_BAD,BAD_SPEED
End If
If Y_GOOD<Y_BAD
Add Y_BAD,-BAD_SPEED
Else
Add Y_BAD,BAD_SPEED
End If

At this point we update the position of the bad guy and increase the value of the variable T. Remember that the ADD statement below has been written so that the number will wrap around from 1 to 2:

> Bob 2, X_BAD, Y_BAD, Add T,1,1 To 2

As we have seen earlier, to slow the game down we only update characters every second time we go through the loop. If the value of T is not 2 the program will just execute the next couple of lines and go back to the beginning:

Else Add T,1,1 To 2 End If

Finally, we must set a stop condition on the REPEAT/UNTIL loop. In this case the program will stop if BOB number one collides with any other BOB. If a collision is detected your score is printed and the game ends!

Until Bob Col(1)
Boom
Print "YOU ARE DEAD!!!! YOUR SCORE IS";SCORE
Update

The game is on the coverdisk for those who want to try it out. How long can you run around avoiding the nasty invader type beastie? Why not experiment a little bit and see if you can add more bad guys and perhaps objects to collect. Before long you could be writing the follow up to lamatron!

Finally, do not try to compile the game unless you slow it down, because it will end up impossibly fast!

Remember that no piece of software is fixed, and if you do not like something about a game you write then change it!

Oh well, that's about it for this month. But don't worry, I'll be back!

Short cuts

his month's Code Clinic is all about using requesters and gadgets in a program to communicate with the outside world. When I am writing programs in any language, I try to build up a library of software routines so that I do not need to reinvent the wheel for every

The software on the support disk demonstrates requesters and several different gadgets from my collection, with a runnable program and fully documented source code.

Automatic

Intuition provides AutoRequest. This function will display a two gadget requester with text of your own choosing.

This command works well, but I prefer to have more control over the requester design than the AutoRequest command gives me. The mouse pointer can disappear if it wanders out of this automatic requester area.

Gadgetry

I decided to make my own generic requester, and give it its own window and choice of gadgets. In the demo program the window and gadgets are plain but graphics could easily be copied into the bitmap or drawn into the rastport.

All that the window needed was a pointer to its first IntuiText structure for its little warning, or chunk of information, and a code to indicate where to find its first Gadget. The IntuiText structure contains all the information for a piece of text, including a pointer to the next text.

Warnings, strings & props

The first requester, code 1, has one gadget with text "OK". When this is pressed, the window will close. A second type of requester, code 2, has text and a "yes" or "no" selection; the window only closes if "no" is chosen.

The third requester, code 3, is more dignified, with a choice between Cancel and Continue. These kinds of requesters are used for information, warnings, and when confirmation is required from the user.

The fourth requester uses a string gadget to input some text. This gadget is linked to the Cancel and Continue gadgets, so these appear as well. This is invoked by the gadget named String Gadget on the main window. If Cancel is pressed

when the requester closes, the old contents of the string are put back into the buffer. This would be a useful gadget for putting a name, or other small piece of text into a program. Gadgets like this are used a lot in file requesters.

The final requester demonstrates a Horizontal and a Vertical Proportional gadget, and is linked to the third gadget list, and invoked by the gadget called "propgadget" in the main window. The position of the slider in a Proportional gadget can be read and used in the main program.

The maximum value is divided by 100 to give a divisor. When this divisor is used on the HorizPot value, a number between 0 and 100 is given. This number is displayed in the main window but it could be returned from the function and used

Vertical Proportional gadgets work in a similar way. Gadgets with sliders like these feature in colour requesters.

The demo program

The program opens a window with four gadgets; Request, String, Proportional and Quit. Click on Request to display a simple informational requester, and press its OK gadget to close the requester window and return to the main win-

Click on the main window gadget called String to display a string gadget and two simple gadgets named Cancel and Continue. Move the mouse to the String gadget, and click where you want to start entering text.

Enter the text, edit by moving the mouse and clicking, delete if necessary. If you click on the Continue gadget, the new text will replace the old and be displayed on the main screen. Click on Cancel, and the old text, if any, will be shown.

The main window gadget called Proportional will invoke a requester with two proportional gadgets, one vertical and one horizontal. Move the slider on one of these gadgets, and when released a value between 1 and 100 will be displayed on the main screen. Either Cancel or Continue will close the requester for you.

Click on the Quit gadget on the main screen when you get bored with all this.

COMING SOON - Next month I hope to demonstrate a dynamic menu that will display any fonts available and their sizes.











Colourful talk

t might have just been the smoke and the dim lights, but I prefer to think it was a question of colourspaces when Nicola accused me in the pub last night of wearing white socks. I wasn't, of course – even I have my standards, and they were canary yellow – but there's always room for disagreement when it comes to colour.

We all know that people see colours differently. There's not much we can do about this, but as certain colours are universally regarded as disgusting and others as lovely-lovely, we can assume that there's some consensus.

Trouble arises when we try to define a colour precisely, in terms more mathematical than the Autumnal Beige and Sunset Orange beloved of paint manufacturers. And, of course, defining colours precisely is just what we have to do when we put them on a DTP page.

There are two common methods of colour definition, sometimes called colourspaces, sometimes called colour systems. In fact, a true colourspace such as XYZ is a rather more abstruse thing, of concern at the moment only to the optical physicists, but why make an issue impenetrable when it's already complicated?

Two choices

These two methods are CMY (Cyan, Magenta, Yellow), and the more familiar RGB (Red, Green, Blue) – familiar because it's the colour system used in TVs and all computer monitors.

The RGB system is called "additive colour" – that is, combine red green and blue and you get white. CMY is called "subtractive colour" – take all three elements away and you get white, add them together and you get black.

Unfortunately, RGB is not used in conventional

printing, where CMY, or "process colour", is the norm. Most colour laser printers, inkjet printers and dye-sublimation printers, as well as image-setters – in fact anything more advanced than the dot matrix printer – work on the CMY model.

A roll of paper on the press has each of these inks printed in turn, building up an almost infinite variety of colours in their combination. But it's the translation between these two colour systems, RGB and CMY, which can cause difficulties for the desktop publisher.

In the CMY model, colours are specified as percentages. For instance, a warm red is usually achieved through a combination of 100 per cent – or solid – magenta and yellow, and this would be specified as 100M 100Y. A rather queasy green might be achieved by combining yellow and cyan in the the proportions 40C 60Y.

In fact printing presses, along with colour lasers and inkjet printers, use a fourth black ink rather than combining CMY to produce black, hence the moniker CMYK (Cyan, Magenta, Yellow, and black, or Key depending on whom you listen to).

Designers sometimes add a bit of another colour to the black to produce a richer effect, but the separate black makes economic sense, otherwise black-and-white jobs would, effectively, be three-colour jobs.

Nearly all colours can be reproduced using the CMY system, but special effects, such as glittering gold, require special inks called Pantones, manu-

factured by a company of the same name. There are now 1,012 Pantones available – the number has recently been increased – and the company supplies designers with a book of samples, showing what each Pantone looks like on both coated and uncoated paper.

Only simulated

The designer then specifies the required Pantone, and the paper goes through a fifth stage on top of CMYK, in which this Pantone ink is applied. An increasing number of DTP applications allow the user to specify Pantones, but because special inks are required they can't be printed on computer printers, only simulated, and then sometimes pretty badly. Moreover, the weird and wonderful attributes of Pantones mean their screen display is far removed from the reality.

Even with simple CMY printing, problems arise in the software conversion between the RGB and CMY models – in the limitations of monitors, which can rarely produce the same fine gradations of colour as the CMY process, and the different reflective qualities of screens and paper. As Nicola found out with those socks, colour is, at best, a subjective thing.



What's on

ven though the CDTV has not been on sale for long, there are now over 60 titles available, ranging from Lemmings to the Illustrated Holy Bible.

I have now had the chance to look at quite a few of the early releases on CDTV, some of which I've perused in greater detail than others.

Although some of the titles are very impressive, unfortunately most seem to have been rushed for early release. But with the launch of a new product like CDTV this is inevitable.

The first products I looked at were Lemmings and the Hutchinsons Encyclopedia. These come free with the CDTV in the UK.

Lemmings

Lemmings, from Psygnosis, is fun. If you haven't played the Amiga version of this classic game, you've missed out on a real gem. It involves trying to guide a group of mindless creatures from one side of a level to the other while avoiding all sorts of traps and dead-ends. Really addictive stuff

The CDTV version is almost identical to that on the Amiga. The only change is that two player mode has been removed – because the CDTV comes with only one controller – and the "B" button now pauses the lemmings so you can move the cursor to select an icon. This doesn't ruin the gameplay because the clock is still ticking down in the corner.

The CDTV version of Lemmings comes with a bonus animation for a possible future Psygnosis game called Planetfall. It's a very long, ray traced

animation of a futuristic jet fighter flying over a fractal landscape, chasing and finally destroying a cruise missile.

If Psygnosis' claim – that they will have an interactive game with graphics like this – is to be believed, the CDTV will have some amazing software for it by this time next year.

Hutchinsons Encyclopedia

The Hutchinsons Encyclopedia is, unfortunately, pretty poor despite the fact that it no doubt holds a lot of extremely interesting information, with over 20,000 entries on subjects ranging from Akko to Zygote.

Browsing for entries is particularly awkward, involving selecting each letter in turn from an A to Z list at the bottom of the screen, much like the method for entering high scores for games.

Once you have selected the first letters of the

entry you are searching for, you get a list of possible entries at the top of the screen. For example, entering "COMMOD" gives entries for "Commodity" and "Commodus, Lucius Aelius", a pretty unremarkable Roman Emperor. There is no entry for Commodore, you will notice, and neither is there an entry for CDTV.

The main problem with Hutchinsons is that it is dreadfully boring. There are a few still photos, and snatches of digitized audio, but it still feels like it belongs in a reference library.

Multimedia is meant to make things fun, but it hasn't worked for Hutchinsons. As a free disk it's OK, but it's certainly not worth the £49.99 they would have been selling it separately for.

24-bit art

Everybody seems to be talking about 24-bit graphics nowadays. There has been an explosion of cards and add-on boxes providing all sorts of extra graphics modes for every Amiga and to suit almost every pocket.

Ranging from the £299 HAM-E to the £1,500 Harlequin board, these products have one purpose: to provide better quality graphics on the Amiga.

But these boards also have one major drawback: they are all completely incompatible. To make things worse Commodore will, no doubt, soon launch their A2410 graphics board for the Amiga 2000 and 3000. At the moment this only works under Unix, so don't expect it too soon.

Until one of the products establishes itself as the standard you won't find much software that will support these products. In America a standard appears to be emerging – which, unfortunately, is probably the least technically capable of all of the options: Digital Creations DCTV.

Commodore even appear to be backing this as the official 24-bit upgrade for CDTV. At the moment DCTV is NTSC only, so it won't work on European PAL systems. A PAL version is being worked on, but it won't be here for a while.

The Video Toaster also has a 24-bit-quality display, and yet again, this is NTSC-only, with a PAL version a long way off. The Video Toaster has proved immensely popular in the States; already third party software and hardware is being written for the Toaster.

All of these add-ons – with the exception of the higher resolution boards like the Harlequin, and the Toaster, which is much more than just a 24-bit card – may be rendered obsolete overnight if Commodore release the new superenhanced chipset they are rumoured to be working on. This will have DCTV/HAM-E quality graphics built-in to the Amiga chips.

Which one?

So, with two possible official enhanced colour options from Commodore, and the success of the – currently – NTSC-only DCTV and Video Toaster in the States, which do software developers choose to support?

In the States most software that supports 24-bit graphics directly uses the DCTV box. HAM-E and DCTV have an advantage in that their graphic modes allow most software that can display IFF images – like slideshow programs, Can-Do, AmigaVision and even Amos – to display their 24-bit images directly.

Most software developers are waiting for a standard to develop. Deluxe Paint IV from Electronic Arts, for example, does not support any 24-bit graphics board.

Within a year a standard for 24-bit will have developed. At the moment it looks like DCTV and Video Toaster – since they work well together – will become the leaders in the States, with the HAM-E board being the best seller in Europe. Of course, who knows what new products will emerge in the next few months?
