**SCHOLAR CONFERENCE**  
**"FIRST" PRIME MINISTER OF MONGOLIA,**  
**SAIN NOYON KHAN T. NAMNANSUREN - 140**  
**December 28, 2018**

T. Namnansuren is a prominent Mongolian statesman of the 20th century with a progressive democratic view who resolutely fought for the consolidation and safeguarding of the independence of Mongolia, gained as a result of the 1911 National Liberation Movement, securing international recognition of the country's independence and for the establishment of Mongolia uniting all the Mongols. He was a great patriot and an innovator who worked steadfastly for bringing the country into the mainstream of mankind's development course and reforming all the sectors of Mongolia. A total of 21 very interesting papers were presented and discussed at the conference. The papers dealt with the relationship of the Khalkha Sain Noyon with the Manchu Qing Dynasty, the Khalkha Sain Noyon's relations with the State Great Khural, the contribution of T. Namansuren to Mongolia's legal



reform, as well as his relationship with the Buddhist Lamas. Some of the documents related to Sain Noyon Khan T. Namnansuren's visit to Tsarist Russia from the State Archives in the Irkutsk Region of the Russian Federation were also presented at the conference.



## The Mongols and Global History

An international conference organized by Anne Dunlop

With the rise of global history and art history, there is an ever-more intense interest in the Mongol period as a historiographical watershed. The so-called Pax Mongolica lasted less than two hundred years, but both the size and the scope of the Mongol empire were unprecedented. At its fullest extent, the Mongol states claimed territories from Hungary to Korea, and they reconfigured the basic zones of Afro-Eurasian trade and contact. People, objects, and ideas traveled across Asia, Europe, and into Africa, in a movement that has been framed as the first step in an accelerating global modernism based on circulation of goods and capital. It is the aim of this conference to take stock of this historical turn and to explore the

Mongol impact and legacy in the early modern world and in contemporary histories. What is at stake for instance in framing the Mongols as harbingers of modernity? What are the rewards and limits of taking the Mongol moment as a defining case for the project of global history or art history as a whole, and what does the Pax Mongolica model offer that is distinctive from examples in later colonial periods?

A scholarly conference "Regarding the Question of Buddhist Study in Mongolia and the History of Social and Political Thinking" was held in Ulaanbaatar to commemorate the 60th birth anniversary of late Doctor, professor G. Lhagvasuren.

Prof. G. Lhagvasuren is a Mongolian scholar who has carried out a systematic study into Buddhist Yogachara philosophy and the Philosophy of Noyon Khutagt Danzanravjaa and has written many scientific works, which today have become the key reference and a key source for researchers and students.

The conference commemorating the birth anniversary of the late Prof. G. Lhagvasuren was jointly organized

by the Institute of Philosophy of the Mongolian Academy of Sciences, the Department of Philosophy and Religious Study of the National University of Mongolia and the "Gurjavyn Lhagvasuren" Foundation.

Inaugural speeches at the commemorative conference was made by Academician G. Chuluunbaatar, First Vice President of the Mongolian Academy of Sciences, Mrs. Ts. Khulan, Cultural and Religious Advisor to the President of Mongolia, Doctor and Professor G. The Forum is held by the Institute of Oriental Manuscripts of the Russian Academy of Sciences, one of the authoritative world research Orientalist centers and the keeper of the collection of Oriental manuscripts and early printed books

of the Asiatic Museum. The event is intended to consolidate together the representative members of Academic Oriental Centers in the Eurasian Space, restore broken links and create a basis for new international projects in the Oriental studies.
