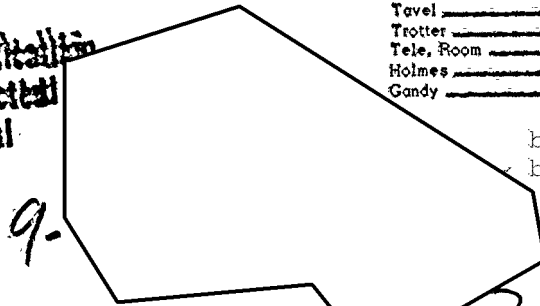

The Bureau investigated Marovitz for the position of Federal Judge in 1951 and in June, 1963. He was nominated for his present position by former President Kennedy in July, 1963. During the investigation, comments were received from persons interviewed that Marovitz would not "add any luster" to the Federal Court; that he did not have the type of moral character to be placed in a position to pass judgment on others; and that he would be prone to "play political favorites." During a trial of a pinball machine manufacturer in 1961, it was disclosed that Marovitz and others had received gifts from the defendant. Marovitz reportedly represented known gangsters in the 1930's, and in 1943 represented Willie Bioff, the notorious extortionist. He was an active member of the National Lawyers Guild (cited by House Committee on Un-American Activities) from 1939 to 1949 and was listed as a delegate to a 1939 conference sponsored by the International Labor Defense (cited by Executive Order 10450).

During the 1963 investigation, [redacted] of the Chicago Crime Commission stated he had "heard" from a source he declined to identify that Marovitz was "close to the boys," meaning those close to organized crime.

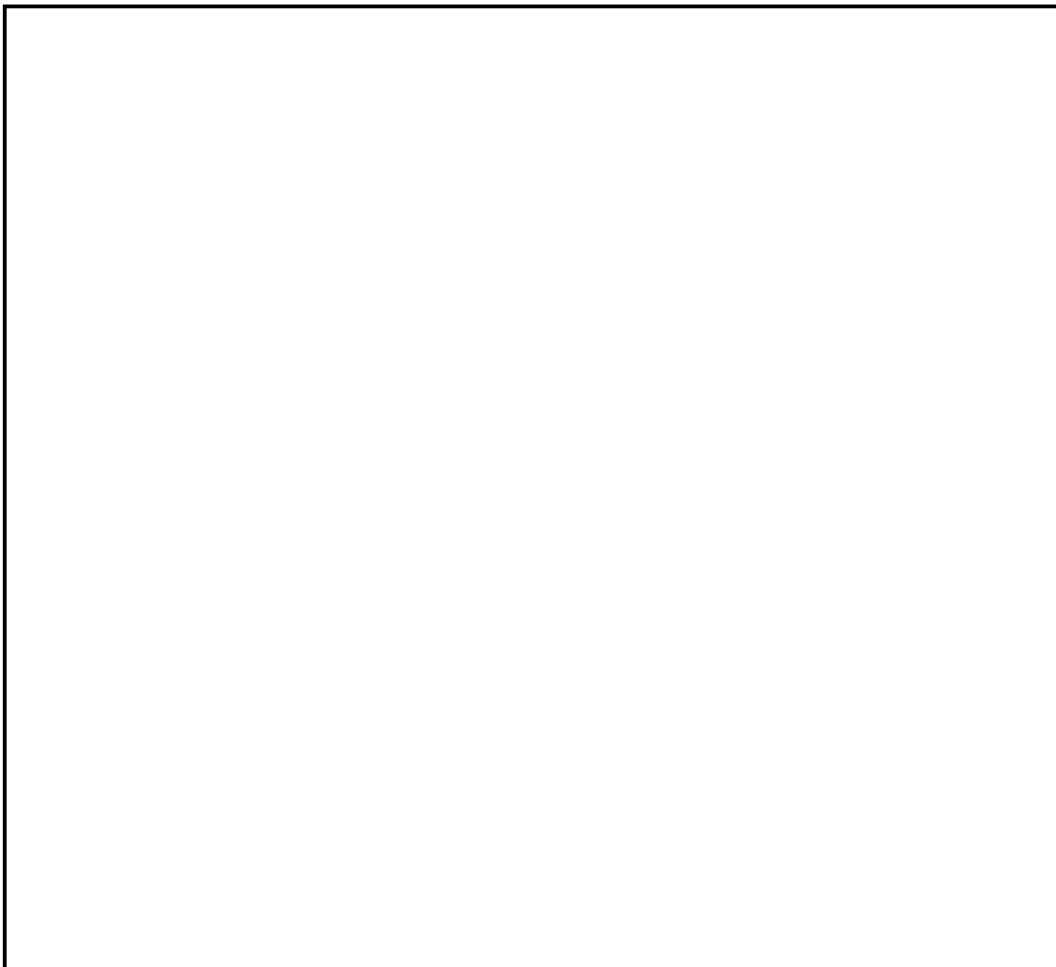

The "Chicago Tribune" of 11/11/66 has an article indicating that subjects were found guilty on 11/10/66 of dope peddling by a jury in Federal District Court, Chicago. U.S. District Judge JAMES B. PARSONS sentenced [Redacted] to 18 years in prison and [Redacted] to 9 years. Both subjects were denied bail pending appeal of their convictions and sentences. Judge PARSONS ordered this move

after being told by the Government prosecutor, AUSA [Redacted] that several days ago, [Redacted] discovered his car ignition had been tampered with and since that time he has been looking under the hood for a bomb before starting his car. [Redacted] also disclosed that at 3:15 a.m., last Friday, a man telephoned his home and said, "We're going to beat your brains out." [Redacted] also informed the Court.
