Friend --

Los Angeles is a city on the move.

My office is working on neighborhood improvements every day to enhance your quality of life and make our streets safer for pedestrians. As you'll see below, this week we collaborated with the Department of Transportation to install a new four-way stop in Echo Park and an advanced pedestrian warning device in East Hollywood. Since taking office in July of 2013, we have completed 21 pedestrian safety measures across the district. Many more are on the way.

Also this week I helped break ground on a new affordable housing project just a short walk from the Vermont/Beverly Metro Station. Meridian Apartments will provide 100 affordable units, and is a truly sustainable development that will improve the built environment near a major transit corridor in the City of Los Angeles. This LEED-certified project is something I am extremely proud of -- it's one of the first that came through my office for approval. In order to provide additional affordable units at the site, my office supported and facilitated the applicant to ensure the project would include larger apartments to match the needs of low-income families.

And as I work on solutions to our affordable housing and homelessness crises, my colleagues and I approved a <u>Comprehensive Homelessness Strategy Report</u>, a blueprint to ending homelessness in the City of Los Angeles. These strategies include fully funding the affordable housing trust fund, creating more bridge housing and emergency shelters, and exploring solutions for addressing youth homelessness. There is still more to do on this issue, and the real work will begin in the coming months as we identify funding for these strategies in the upcoming budget process.

Folks, we are a city on the move. We are tackling the issues and improving our neighborhoods, Together, every day, we are making Los Angeles better than ever.




NEW FOUR WAY STOP CALMS CUT-THROUGH TRAFFIC AT BONNIE BRAE AND KENT STREETS
