

Legislative Updates

Responsible **tree trimming** practices are essential for protecting and enhancing our City's urban forests. When tree trimming and tree removals occur recklessly, it

deteriorates our City's urban forests. This week, the Public Works and Gang Reduction Committee considered a law that would establish monetary fines for negligent tree trimming practices. Read the full motion, <u>here</u>.



Preferential Parking Districts (PPDs) are designated restricted parking areas within the City. Given the high demands from residents for PPDs, the City accumulated a large backlog of applications. This week, I supported LADOT's plan to streamline the PPD application process to ensure that public safety for residents' parking is prioritized. You can read LADOT's recommendations, <u>here</u>.



Update: Baseline Mansionization Ordinance (BMO)

Many residents in our District are concerned with the "mansionization" of single-

story traditional houses. Last year, City Council took action to limit the scale of the construction and directed the Planning Department to revise the City's rules which govern the amount of residential floor area that can be developed on a single-family lot. The Planning Department is currently working on amendments based on community input it received. For more information, read <u>here</u>.




Upcoming Neighborhood Town Halls
