Hi Joe, the cameras at Lexington/McCadden, Sycamore/Romaine, Santa Monica/Highland, Santa Monica/Las Palmas are out and have been out for several days. This is happening on a very frequent basis. I understand from Jim Sage there is some discussion about a service contract going on to continue maintenance. However, since these cameras are of no use to us if they don't work, I will be taking them out of the Squad room and putting them back into a storage room unless you can tell me they will be put back into service. We will put the space to better use. There have been several calls that we could have captured on video had they been working.

The BID cameras are great and we use them on a daily basis. There are a couple of problem areas though--one is on Hollywood Bl just west of Gower on the south side of the street. There is a pole with a banner that blocks the view westbound. If that banner was not there, we could see all the way west to Vine. The other is on Cahuenga/Yucca. There is a Palm tree on the west side, just south of Yucca that blocks the view of the 7-11, where most of the issues are.
