Advocating for Increased Funds for After School & Safety Programs

On Friday, City Council unanimously approved the resolution I introduced in support of <u>Assembly Bill 2663</u>, authored by Assemblymember Jim Cooper. This bill will increase funding to California's After School Education and Safety programs for lowincome children. On a personal note, I was fortunate enough to be a beneficiary of free meals and after school programs. I witnessed firsthand how important these programs were for my mom and dad raising our family. It is absolutely critical that the State Legislature vote to approve AB 2663 and that Governor Brown sign it into law so our children can continue to live up to their fullest potential.



Legislative Updates

For 40 years, the City has been stuck with a broken policy for sidewalk repairs. There have been attempts to find solutions but there has been no consistent and comprehensive plan for decades. This week, the Public Works and Gang Reduction committee gave initial approval for a \$1.3 billion plan to address citywide sidewalk repair needs.
