At the age of sixteen, Yong Soo was abducted and forced to serve as a "comfort woman" to Japanese soldiers during World War II. Thank you, Grandma Lee, for your activism, courage, and resilience. Most importantly, thank you for sharing your story to remind us of the thousands of human trafficking survivors whose voices often go unheard.

This year, I had the pleasure to nominate Cindy Chvatal as the Fourth District's Pioneer Woman.
