DODGERS HOME OPENER: MITIGATING TRAFFIC AND PARKING CONCERNS

ECHO PARK - Opening Day at Dodger Stadium is this Tuesday, April 12 at 1:10 p.m. The Los Angeles Dodgers host the Arizona Diamondbacks. The Office of Councilmember Mitch O'Farrell has been working with the Dodgers management, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, and the Los Angeles Police Department to make sure residents and fans have a successful event.

The Councilmember's staff will be out on the day of the event to assist with questions or concerns from residents, and has worked with departments on the following mitigations for increased traffic and visitors in the Echo Park neighborhood:

- Secured eight porta potties and trash bins, four at the corner of Elysian Park Dr and Scott Ave, and four at Elysian Park Dr & Academy Rd.
- Worked with LADOT to place 2-hour posted parking from 8 a.m.-2p.m. at the following locations: Portia Street, 1300-1500 Sutherland St, 1300-1500 Quintero St, 1400 block of MacBeth Street.
- Helped secure parking permits for residents on Portia St from Scott Ave to the dead end, and on Morton from Academy to Elysian Park Drive.
- Dispatched Clean Team and the Trash Free Earth Team will be out in the area before and after the event.
- Worked with LADOT to approve one way access on Academy Drive at Morton/Ave of the Palms.
- Requested LAPD to increase patrols on Sunset Boulevard.

LOS ANGELES - President Obama's Promise Zone initiative aims to elevate communities across the United States, such as our very own Hollywood neighborhood in the 13th Council District. The Promise Zone was the topic of a panel discussion co-Hosted by the Annenberg Foundation, California Community Foundation, The California Endowment, Weingart Foundation, and Southern California Grantmakers. Councilmember Mitch O'Farrell joined the panel and discussed how the initiative will provide local non-profits and businesses the opportunity to work together on solutions for quality of life issues.

CD13 residents have already seen improvements through a grant that was secured by Councilmember O'Farrell, Los Angeles Police Department, the Department of Recreation and Parks, and Youth Policy Institute. The grant funded a new high-tech camera which is being monitored by LAPD Hollywood Division, and a beautification project that discourages graffiti.
