Metro Purple Line Construction Notice

Construction is scheduled for **Monday**, **April 11th - Wednesday**, **April 13th** to reroute an underground conduit to support traffic flow. This work will require a temporary signal shutdown at the **Wilshire and La Brea** intersection from **9am-3:30pm**. Traffic officers will be dispatched to the Wilshire and La Brea and the Wilshire and Sycamore intersections to facilitate traffic movement. For more information, click **here**.



Discretionary Funds

The <u>Discretionary Funds Task Force</u> is a volunteer-driven advisory team that works to identify, review, and prioritize projects that will benefit Council District 4 in the long-term. The Task Force reviewed funding for the following community projects:

Lake Hollywood Community: Reviewed funding for the installation of a wildlife protection fence south of Lake Hollywood to mitigate public safety concerns for both humans and wildlife.

Greater Toluca Lake Neighborhood Council: Reviewed funding for the annual Toluca Lake Earth Day Celebration (e.g. tables, chairs, and sanitation materials) to promote the beautification and sustainability efforts.
