Concrete Street Repairs in Hancock Park

In the last few months, our team has worked with the Mayor's office on the City's **proposed budget**. Included in the proposal is \$750,000 for work on concrete street repairs in Hancock Park. The City will seek private bids for the work to determine approximately how much these repairs will cost. For years, concrete streets have not been repaired due largely to a lack of funding. This move could set the stage for more extensive repairs throughout Hancock Park and other

neighborhoods with unique street repair needs.
