



The STby appointment



IF there was ever any doubt that the ST is a superb entertainment machine, this has now been removed.

For it has been given the seal of approval by MicroProse no less – for the uninitiated, that's akin to sporting a "By Appointment to Her Majesty".

Not that the name MicroProse may be all that familiar to some ST users in the UK, for the moment at least. After all it has only just released its first title for the machine.

However, MicroProse just happens to be the Rolls Royce of the software industry in the USA with its award winning sophisticated simulations.

"So when you get MicroProse writing for your machine, you know you've got a winner on your hands", observed one leading industry figure recently.

For the corporation is known to select the names it hops into bed with with extreme care.

The most pressing reason for this being that it budgets up to \$1 million on developing each of its titles. So the end product must essentially become a blockbuster.

"What they have aimed for and what they have got with each of their 14 titles to date is something equivalent to Gone With The Wind in film terms", a leading American computer journalist wrote recently.

As a result, quality for once has ensured quantity and that has translated into the corporation becoming the third largest entertainment software house in the States.

Nor is it a stranger to the world of Atari. For on the 8 bit front it already provides 25 per cent of all software sold in the United States. And MicroProse recently received an award as the most consistent supporter of Atari in the USA.

Its first title for the ST is Silent Service, a mind-blowing submarine simulation which arrives with the most impeccable of credentials.

Previously released for the IBM and Apple, it recently topped the famous Billboard Chart in the States for four weeks, having been at number two for three months before that.

In all Silent Service has won five major awards, the latest being the Best Computer War Game of the Year, presented by the Gaming Association of America.

So what makes it so good as to be able to beat the pants off 25 other top class nominations?

The answer seems to lie in the corporate slogan "The Action Is Simulated – The Excitement Is Real". For the experts behind the MicroProse simulations make them accurate in every detail.

Such is the realism involved that one of the MicroProse packages - Solo Flight - is used as a teaching aid by Cessna Flying Schools in the States.

All the titles call for making real life judgments and decisions as the users are called upon to perform a variety of challenging roles. And Silent Service is certainly no exception.

The thrill and danger of captaining a World War II submarine in the South Pacific can be experienced

through a wide selection of historical scenarios ranging from single-ship attacks to multi-patrol missions with heavily escorted convoys.

All of the submarine's critical battle stations are replicated — the conning tower, engine room and ship's bridge.

Player selected "reality levels" provide challenge and complexity. Automatic time scaling insures that actions and decisions are constantly required.

In his review of Silent Service in the American Antic magazine, Naval Commander Rich Moore wrote:

"The simulation experts at MicroProse have outdone themselves . . . you can almost smell the diesel oil and feel the deck rolling beneath your feet".

Nor was the ST version of Silent Service simply a question of porting it over from a previous version. MicroProse doesn't do things like that.

The program has been completely re-written to take full advantage of the machine's graphics, sound and play-action capabilities.

It features a detailed map system and enemy targets, intricately designed instrumentation and

submarine interior, and an expanded enemy fleet to include heavy cruisers and aircraft carriers.

The sound effects of the sea, engine, enemy ships and submarine klaxon have been compared to studio recordings.


Game controls have been simplified to employ on-screen icons for all activity selections so that the submarine can be controlled entirely by using a mouse only. Naturally it also operates with a joystick or the keyboard.

Silent Service promises to be the first in a whole-line of high-quality simulation software for the ST from MicroProse.

The reason for this — according to a company spokesman — is that they see the ST "as one of the most exciting machines to enter the home computer marketplace in a long time".

Given the quality of its games and its commitment to the ST, the entry of MicroProse to the ST market promises great things for the future. Mike Cowley reporting



Just the thing for budding Kasparovs

COMBINING the most stunning chess graphics you're ever likely to see on a home computer with fast and powerful play, Psion's new release is set to checkmate every other chess program on the market.

The graphics grab you by the throat. The large board and pieces are shown in full screen 3D perspective, the view being almost identical to what you would have if you were sitting in front of a real chess board.

You make a move by pointing and clicking the mouse on the desired piece, dragging it to the destination square and clicking again. Unlike the desktop facilities, there's no flicker or ghostimaging while dragging – the pieces glide across the board like a finger across satin.

When a piece is moved by the computer, it too slides smoothly and unerringly to its destination square. Should a check result from either side the involved pieces gently pulsate.

No illegal moves are permitted – a warning bell sounds if you attempt to make one. Any move can be cancelled before the second click by returning the piece to its original square.

Psion Chess is rich in options, all accessible from pull-down menus. The accompanying manual gives you enough information to get started but most of the detail is built into a Help option which can be called up at any time. All text within the program is available in any of six selectable languages, including English, French and German.

Games may be between player and computer, two players or computer against computer. There is a wide range of computer speed/skill levels to choose from, ranging from novice through matching your own speed (equality) going right up to infinity (the computer keeps analysing until you force it to move).

An excellent two-dimensional display is also available. This only takes up half the screen, leaving room for chess clocks and move records to be displayed alongside the board.

A graphically superb and simple to use board set-up facility allows you to arrange your own positions for playing or for solving mating problems. The pieces skate on to and out of the board at your command. Psion Chess can solve mate problems of up to nine moves ahead by either side.

Some of the many other options are hint, take back, offer a draw, enable/disable computer's ability to resign, automatic replay (with optional forward and backward stepping) and analysis (computer's evaluation of position and current line). It's also possible to save a game for later reloading, invert the board, force the computer to make its best move so far, play its next best move and change sides.

The beauty of this program is not just skin deep. Behind the astounding graphics and wealth of options there lies a powerful chess-playing program. Psion Chess was in fact a recent winner of the World Microcomputer Chess Championships.

The program comes handsomely packaged and includes 50 classic games for you to study and replay.



GO FAR TARGLIDE

WHEN Starglider was first shown at the 1985 PCW Show it was six months into development and consisted of just a few 3D routines written in machine code. A year later it has grown into a game which author Jeremy San had trouble squeezing into the ST's 512k of memory.

Having previewed Starglider in the September issue of Atari ST User we're going to take a more detailed look at the finished product and its gameplay.

The first thing that strikes you when you run Starglider is the stunning title screen and amazing music which accompanies it. The music the Starglider song - has been specially recorded then digitised and stored in 170k of the ST's memory.

A quick press of any key and you're flung into your Airborne ground attack vehicle (AGAV) flying low over the planet Novenia, which has been overtaken by the evil Egron fleet. The graphics give a stunning 3D representation of the planet's surface and the multitude of enemy craft through the AGAV's window. They are based on the vector graphics from such games as Battlezone, but use the ST's resolution and colours to far more effect. The game can be played in black and white or colour.

Your ship is controlled with the mouse acting

as joystick: A move to the left and the AGAV banks to the left, a move forward and the AGAV loses height, and so on. Speed is also controlled by the mouse. Keeping the right hand button pressed, you move the mouse forward to speed up and back to slow down.

Your primary weapon is the trusty old laser beam which is backed up by missiles. You are supplied with only one missile at the start of the game and must dock in a supply silo to replenish your stock. The laser guns are aimed using the cross hairs in the centre of the display and fired by pressing the left hand mouse button.

The Egron fleet is vicious, ranging from the magnificent red Starglider One with its flapping wings through tri-launchers - which fire three missiles at once - to ugly land based walkers. Most of the enemy fire deadly red missiles which can cause a quick depletion of your shields.

For their part, some of the enemy can only be destroyed with a missile while most need multiple hits with the laser. Some of the more menacing Egrons such as Starglider One require more than one missile hit, which is difficult because you must return to the supply silo for each missile.

A missile is launched by pressing the spacebar. A voice says: "Missile Launched" and a view from the missile's nose cone is shown. You only have a few seconds to steer it to its target before it detonates.

Docking with the silo is a tricky business which requires practice. When you have successfully docked you can call on the computer in the silo to report on the relative strengths of the various enemy craft. Entering a silo gives you an extra missile and replenishes your energy and shield. Dock again too soon and a missile won't be available since it takes a fixed amount of time to be manufactured.

Refuelling is probably the most difficult part of the game. I don't want to give too much away, but I will tell you that this is accomplished using the three energy towers on the planet surface and a very tricky flying manoeuvre.

The full background story is given in a 64 page novella which also gives clues for gameplay. You could play Starglider on its shoot-em-up merits alone for some time, but eventually a read of the novella will allow you to refuel and get more out of the game.

With some arcade-type games the danger is that you can explore them fully during a demonstration in a shop without realising it. Then, when you get the game home, you find there's nothing left to do. This won't happen with Starglider: The further you get into it, the more it offers you. It definitely gets my vote for Atari ST User game of 1986 (and possibly 1987 as well).

Buying a present for your ST?

IF your ST has been crying out "What are you going to get me for Christmas?" or if you have a loved one who owns an ST, this article will help you through the hardware and software jungle so that you can easily decide what Christmas presents to buy them.

The problem with buying presents for a computer mad friend is that you often have no knowledge of what is good or bad — and computing can be a very expensive hobby. To help you decide, we've split the presents into three sections depending upon their price.

In the computer market the least you can get away with paying is probably in the £5 to £20 bracket. There are dozens of programs and accessories for the ST that fall into this category, and at this price they make the best small presents or stocking fillers.

Two ideas from the Macintosh market that have just appeared for the ST are the mouse mat and mouse house. The mouse mat – which sells for £9.95 – is a small vinyl covered mat which sits beside your ST and under your mouse. Moving the mouse over the mat, instead of your dusty desktop, will keep its insides clean and trouble free.

The mouse house is a cover for your mouse which costs £7.95. However, this is no ordinary plain dust cover — it's furry and has two small eyes, which make your mouse look both cute and alive. Not recommended to those who don't like real mice!

Dust covers also fall neatly into this price category. If you leave your ST unattended for long periods, you should make sure that large amounts of dust cannot build up inside the ST itself or its disc drive and monitor. Moulded to shape, a dust cover protects against this.

There are covers available for the drive, monitor or the ST. If you are going to buy the ST cover you should make sure that you get the correct size as the 520 models are smaller than the 1040ST.

Items such as printer ribbons, paper and blank discs are always being used up at alarming rates and will be gratefully received. Make sure though that you buy the correct sizes and specifications for the equipment owned. Ribbons are different for nearly every make of printer, but simply naming the printer will ensure that you get the right one. Printer paper is most commonly 9 inches (22.5cm) wide, with a sheet length of 11 inches (27.5cm).

Blank 3.5in discs for the ST can be either

double or single sided. There are many makes of disc, which can often confuse the beginner who is naturally drawn to names that he recognises — but may have to pay a lot more for. As with video tapes there are only four or five actual manufacturers of discs — most of the cheaper brands are simply relabelled versions of the more expensive names. Nobody will hate you for buying X brand discs instead of Y. Prices range from about £15 to £35 for a box of ten.

Disc boxes can be bought for as little as £12.95 for a box which holds 25 discs. Once again a box for 3.5in discs must be purchased. A disc box will stop you losing discs and will keep them clean and dust free.

Although the average computer game costs between £9 and £15 for 8 bit micros, the majority of ST games fall into the £20 to £35 range. However, there are some games under £20. The most notable of these are Colourspace and Major Motion.

Colourspace from Llamasoft is described as being to light what a music synthesiser is to sound and is the modern equivalent of a kaleidoscope. Its effect is hypnotic. Everyone should have a copy.

Major Motion from Microdeal costs £19.95 and puts you in charge of a small car which is released on to a busy highway from the back of a van. It was reviewed in the August 1986 issue of Atari ST User.

With the ST being more expensive than the average micro, the £20 to £50 range is where most of the products for it fall.

For starters there are literally dozens of games, some conversions of 8 bit versions and other brand new titles.

With the ST's speed and large amount of memory, arcade games are getting closer and closer to real arcade quality – and among the best of these are Joust and Starglider.

One of the first commercial programs written for the ST, Joust the has only just been released by Atari. You're in charge of a strange emu-like bird in a contest against the computer controlled enemy. It is a faithful reproduction of the arcade game of the same name, even down to the flapping of the bird's wings.

Based on a Star Wars scenario Starglider – reviewed elsewhere in this issue of Atari ST User – is probably the ST game of the year and well worth the money at £24.95 from Rainbird.

A title that might be in the shops before Christmas is Marble Madness from Electronic Arts. This game puts you in control of a ball

bearing as it careers around a course and is true in every way to the arcade original.

Adventure games for the ST fall into two camps: text only and graphic. The text only titles from Infocom have become classics since their introduction to the micro scene in the late 70s. However as the graphics capabilities of home computers have increased over the years, adventure games which also include pictures of their various scenes have grown in popularity.

One game which caused much favourable comment when it was introduced earlier this year is The Pawn from Rainbird. Costing £24.95 and billed as an Infocom-type game with graphics, The Pawn includes many professionally drawn pictures.

Also worth looking out for are the range of adventures from Activision. Borrowed Time has you as a Sam Spade-type character who must solve a crime. Tass Times In Tone Town is set in an alternative universe populated by strange creatures and where everyone speaks Teen Speak.

There are many simulation games available for the ST ranging from golf to flying. The ones to look out for in this category are Leader Board from Access, and Mean 18 from Accolade – both golf games. Leader Board costs £24.95 and gives a true 3D representation of each hole, while Mean 18 costs £44.95 but offers the ability to design your own courses with its built-in editor. Silent Service, from Microprose, simulates undersea warfare and is well worth its price of £24.95.

Strategic games for the ST are few and far between at the moment. Probably the most interesting and notable is the newly converted Psion 3D chess. This is a complete computer chess player that is better than most dedicated machines and sells for £24.95.


Also in this price range are a number of utilities, including ram discs, printer buffers, desk accessories and disc doctors. The best value desk accessory is probably the Back-Pack cartridge from Computer Concepts (reviewed in last month's *Atari ST User*) which includes nine desk accessories for £49.95.

Always welcome is a good disc doctor program – these repair faulty or corrupted discs. Best known of these are Michtron Utilities from Microdeal and Disk Doctor from Antic software.

When we enter the £50 to £250 price range we start to leave the area of software and enter the region of small hardware devices and add-ons.

First off the mark is Fast ST Basic, the cartridge language from Computer Concepts (reviewed in last month's Atari ST User) which costs £89.95. Judging from ST owners' reaction to this new Basic, Computer Concepts is going to sell thousands during the next few months.

Several other languages fall squarely into this price range. The favourite language for the ST is still C, and the most popular C compiler is from Megamax which includes a linker, editor and resource program for £157.55.



Additional disc drives for the ST are made by three manufacturers. Atari makes the most expensive of these with single sided drives at £150 and double sided at £199. Cumana and Advanced Technologies and Techniques both produce double sided drives at lower prices. Cumana charges £159 for one 1 Mb double sided drive and £269 for two. AST's drive costs just £99, but requires an Atari drive to connect to.

For those with colour systems £150 will buy an Atari black and white, high resolution monitor. Definitely not a downgrade, this will allow you to use some of the ST's professional programs which only operate in high resolution which is unavailable in colour.

In these days of cheap disc drives, adding a printer to the system is usually left until last. ST compatible printers can cost anything from £150 to several hundreds of pounds. An Epson compatible printer is best, since the ST is set up to do graphics and screen dumps on an Epson printer. And make sure you get the lead when you get the printer!

And that about sums it up. Of course if you've got money to burn you might consider upgrading from one ST model to another. By Christmas Atari will be shipping the new 2Mb and 4Mb ST models. If you are friendly with your dealer, perhaps he'll be prepared to take your current model in trade in for one. If you are prepared to spend this much on your ST, then I'm sure that it will be very happy with you for the rest of the, year

BOX 68 ST AUSTELL CORNWALL **PL25 4YB**

I HAVE had some interesting correspondence this month. Top of the agenda was the ST v Amiga rivalry. Among many others Mr R.J. Griffin has asked about their relative merits.

The machines are bound to be compared: Both are 68000 based computers. Both offer excellent colour graphics and both have large amounts of memory. When making comparisons between the systems, you might like to take the following points into consideration.

Although, on paper the Amiga specifications seem more impressive, it has been hampered both by a lack of built-in memory and Commodore's indecisive marketing. The Amiga has better graphics with more available colours than the ST. Graphics displays are made much faster by the presence of the Amiga's blitter chip, which automatically speeds up all such operations. The Amiga also has better sound capabilities and offers full stereo.

While the ST lags behind on most of these features, being first on the market has meant that the ST can call on four or five times more software titles than the Amiga. In addition, the Amiga has also been slow to catch on because of its price — for a 512k computer with 512 colours and very high resolution graphics (for a micro) the ST is truly "Power Without The Price".

And the ST's capabilities are increasing: Atari has a blitter chip for the ST which will be available before the end of the year (see Atari ST User for November) and hope to introduce both stereo sound and graphics chips before the middle of 1987. Their addition will bring the ST up to and in some cases surpass the Amiga.

My advice therefore is to buy an ST now and expand it by adding the new chips when they become available and if you find you need them. In this way you'll finish up with the computer best suited for your needs without paying for any unnecessary frills.

Many of you have asked how the 512k version of the ST is termed the 520ST. Leonard Tramiel gave me the answer, expressing slight annoyance at the names of the two new machines.

He explained that up until now all of the recent Atari computers have been numbered by taking the number of bytes of built-in ram that the computer has and rounding it down to the nearest 10,000.

This means that a 2Mb computer should be numbered 2090 and a 4Mb model should be numbered 4190. It seems that the development department at Atari (where Leonard Tramiel works) was over-ruled by the marketing men who thought that double a 1040 is a 2080 and double that is a 4160. But, of course, now we know better . . .







ONE of the great things about Gem is that you can load up to six desk accessories into memory at once. Cornerman is such an accessory, containing 10 different utilities.

An Ascii Table display 16 characters at a time with their decimal and hexadecimal values, and you use conventional sliders to look through the table. Ascii codes are often required during program development but unfortunately editors supplied with some languages are not Gem based, thus preventing Cornerman's facilities from being accessed.

The 16 digit calculator provides three memories, base conversion and operates in binary, octal, decimal or hexadecimal. There is a direct correspondence between the positioning of the calculator's keys and those of the ST's numeric keypad.

To enter the extra characters required for hexadecimal numbers you use the cursor keypad. Above the main display is a reminder of the last four numbers and functions entered which can also be echoed to the printer.

Notepad allows storage of up to 32,767 pages of seven lines each of 32 characters. Facilities provided are to edit, delete, load or save text. Data is saved to a file on disc, together with the date and time. However control codes in the file prevent you from using text editors or word processors to edit notepad data.

Dialer is an address/phone directory designed for use with a Hayes-compatible auto-dial modern. The information is again saved to a file on disc.


Phone Log, used in conjunction with Dialler, records the date, time, person and duration of every phone call. It is assumed that telephone numbers are in the American format of three numbers for the area code, followed by another three for a local area code and four for the number itself.

The Setup utility allows you to select how these numbers are interpreted and it is possible to store British numbers, although their textual representation in the directory will probably be incorrect with spaces in the wrong places. The Setup utility also allows the RS232 parameters to be changed but the 1200/75 baud rate is a noticeable omission.

Fifteen is an identical puzzle to that found on the Macintosh desktop, involving shifting numbered tiles until they are in numerical order. It's a great novelty when you first use it, but I would question its inclusion in a utility suite.

The Clock utility produces a small analogue clock which, by clicking the "full" box, fills the whole screen. To prevent screen phosphor burn the screen colour changes every minute on a colour monitor and inverts on a monochrome monitor. You can set up a facility so that a

password must be entered before the large clock will be removed from the screen, enabling you to conceal what you are working on.

On booting up the system a small rectangle in the top right corner of the screen gives a digital time display in hours and minutes. A minor irritation is the periodic flickering of this rectangle and the mouse pointer, but you can disable it.

The *Print* utility allows printing from the files generated by Notepad, Dialler, Phone Log and Setup. You can print all entries, the currently displayed entry or entries between specified dates.

Dos Window allows you to run a non-Gem program from within another program without returning to the desktop. The program must be stored on disc as "command" and have the .PRG, .TOS or .TTP file extension. This facility will allow access to MichTron's Dos Shell program which permits the user to issue commands to the operating system from the keyboard.

Cornerman takes up about 107k on the disc and 175k of ram when installed. The difference





Figure I: Cornerman's Notepad, Dialer, Fifteen puzzle and Clock



between these two figures represents the workspace required for saving the screen, creating a RS232 buffer and for buffering data before it is saved to disc.

The memory is claimed when Cornerman is installed rather than dynamically when the utility is used, ensuring that the accessory will only be installed if there is enough memory to use all the utilities. An exception is the RS232 buffer, which is not created if there is insufficient memory. In this case, a warning is given to the user and the auto-dial facility is disabled.

The memory constraints become very limiting on 512k machines. In 1st Word there isn't enough memory left to run the printer driver program, regardless of the size of the document. In ST Basic there is only about 25k of free memory. Both these examples are with the TOS in rom without which there wouldn't even be enough memory to run Basic.

Cornerman can easily be transferred to a startup disc, thus alleviating any disc space problems using the 500k drive. The data files for the utilities such as the notepad must also be on this disc.

The limitation of six desk accessories encourages writers to pack as many utilities as possible into one accessory, but this means that you cannot separate the utilities and discard the




Figure II: Cornerman's Calculator and Ascii Table

ones you don't need. The result is an accessory that is so large that it is not always practical to use it in conjunction with other applications on a standard ST. Owners with 1Mb machines should not have any problems unless they install other accessories such as ram discs and printer spoolers.

In conclusion, Cornerman is an excellent package – if you can spare the memory!







WE tend to take the wealth of games software available on our STs for granted. However, it wasn't always like that. After all, computer software doesn't write itself.

The first games were written by professional programmers during their spare time, using the mainframe computers owned by the large corporations or universities where they worked.

They contained very few graphics, since most of the mainframes weren't connected to screens, their output going to teletype printers. Adventure games were prevalent, with the original Colossal Cave and Zork being written during the midseventies.

The first game with graphics – later to be called Space War – put the player in charge of a simple triangular ship which could be steered around the screen while shooting another ship piloted by a friend.

When Pong, or Ping as it was called in the UK, was introduced into pubs and clubs in the late seventies, the arcade game was born. This of course brought about the arcade craze and such games as Space Invaders. It was in this period that Atari introduced its home computer game which accepted cartridges.

Next came the Atari 400 and 800, 8 bit computers which brought about a vast influx of brightly coloured games. Although they would rather not admit it, Atari now has a new games winner on its hands in the shape of the ST series. With its minimum 512k of memory and high resolution colour graphics, the ST represents the best yet in affordable home game systems.

At present there are some 200 game titles for the ST. Some are simply ST versions of ones which have appeared on older 8 bit machines. Most have been transferred to the ST "as is", not having been upgraded to take account of the ST's extra memory or better graphics capabilities.

Other games for the ST have been converted from the mono Apple Macintosh. In general these games have taken account of the ST's extra power and memory but have failed to use its colour capabilities.

Just a few games have used the ST's capabilites to greater effect. Three outstanding ones are The Pawn, Psion Chess and the newest release, Starglider.

The Pawn, from Rainbird, was one of the first games to be released for the ST. It uses both the ST's colour and memory capabilities to achieve an adventure which has given Infocom a run for its money.

Psion Chess was specially written for 68000-based computers such as the ST. Written by a professional chess machine programmer it represents the best attempt yet at a perfect chess program. You'll find a full review on Page 5.

Also reviewed in this issue is Rainbird's Starglider. Under development for over a year, programmer Jeremy San tweaked every line of machine code to get maximum speed.

So much for the present. What will the future

ST games - the way ahead



bring in the games field? If you had asked that question of Atari 400 owners in 1981, would they have foreseen such famous names as Preppie, Mercenary or Flight Simulator II? I think not. Yet the games titles of 1981 were at the forefront of game design.

Impossible as it is to predict future developments we can get a fair indication of the direction that ST games will take by looking at its capabilities and how they might be exploited by dedicated games programmers in the future.


Some of the features that will be used in the games of the future already exist. Starglider's 18 second burst of digitised music is an indication of how special hardware will be used to produce effects that can then be heard or viewed on a normal ST.

Psion Chess represents how the ST's speed and large amount of memory will be used to produce more intelligent games because they draw upon more and more information before making decisions.


Adventure game writers will also use this to their advantage. Future games will appear more realistic with better graphics, more detailed locations and highly intelligent characters.

It will be possible to meet real characters

rather than just hacking them to death. You will be able to make real friends or enemies of these characters who will be far more "three dimensional" than today's hobbits and robots.

Adventure games will also be much faster than in the past. The ST's large amount of memory means that its games no longer have to pause while more data is brought in from disc.

Infocom's offerings have been updated to be almost completely memory resident and the

increase in speed is noticeable to everyone who played their games on 8 bit machines.

Arcade games will also be much closer to their coin operated counterparts. For example Electronic Arts are about to release a version of Marble Madness for the ST, almost indistinguishable from the arcade original.

This is possible because the ST's 320 by 200 16 colour graphics mode matches many of today's arcade machines. Although the resolution is similar to that of many 8 bit machines, the older machines must half their horizontal resolution in order to display more than two

With the system employed on the ST, each one of the 64,000 dots on the screen can be any of the 16 colours available, these 16 colours being in turn chosen from the ST's pallette of 512 colours.

And of course the ST's blitter chip, discussed in detail in last month's Atari ST User, will make graphics operations much faster than ever before, giving smoother graphic displays.

Overall though, the ST games player today can no more tell what is coming than could his 8 bit counterpart five years ago. We can only sit back, mouse in hand, and wait to see what appears on our monitors - certain that it will be at the forefront of games creation.





ONE of the most annoying features of the ST is the fact that each of the three graphics modes is stored in memory in a completely different format. This means that pictures created in one mode can't be used in another. Here are two short Basic programs that will convert a low or medium resolution colour picture into a form that can be displayed on a black and white monitor.

Program I converts the colour picture into a quarter size black and white screen. You can use it to try out various settings before you process the picture through the longer, slower Program II which also allows you to set different shades for each colour used.

Type in both programs and save them to disc. When you run Program I you will be asked for five pieces of information:

- The picture's name on disc
- The load offset the number of bytes at the start of the file before the actual picture data starts. For Neochrome files this number is 128 and for Degas files it is 34
- The number of planes two for medium mode picture, four for low resolution
- The start column the column where the conversion will begin
- Reverse or normal


A quarter screen picture will quickly be produced which will allow you to experiment with the various settings before moving on to Program II.


After you have the various settings as you want them, run Program II. It has one extra prompt – Shading – which allows you to set the type of shading pattern that you require for each colour. Enter four numbers in the range 0 to 5

separated by commas. Some experimentation will be required for the best results.

When the conversion is finished, you can type R to load another picture or any other key to save the picture to disc. It will be saved with the extender MON.





SanTa's tips for Christmas



AS a special Christmas present to all of you who are new to the ST or Atari ST User, we include here a selection of hints and tips which will let you use your ST more productively – and hopefully more enjoyably.

* * *

IF you find that memory is running short you can save a few k by erasing some accessories from your boot-up disc. The accessories are held in various files that end in the extender .ACC. You can save the memory these would normally use by renaming the ones you don't use very often.

To rename an accessory, click once on the file and then select Show Info from the File menu. Now press backspace three times and type in a new extender name for the file. To remind yourself that these files are in fact accessories you should rename them to something like .AC1. If you ever wish to use them as accessories again, simply change the extender back to .ACC.

IF you have a program that you always use when you turn on your ST, you can make it auto run by creating a folder called AUTO by using the New Folder option from the File menu. Programs that you place in this folder will automatically be run when you use that disc as the boot disc.

Unfortunately only simple text programs which have little or no graphics can be auto run in this way, because the ST runs the contents of its AUTO folder before it has completely initialised itself. You must experiment to see which of your programs will work.

TAKE very good care of your ST mouse. If you should lose it or if it needs repairing outside its twelve months' guarantee, a replacement from Atari will cost you a staggering £52!

POSSIBLY some of you are still using version 1.01 of 1st Word. If so, you should take or send your 1st Word disc back to where you bought your ST and have it upgraded to version 1.06. This will fix some of the annoying bugs found in earlier versions. Make sure that you don't have any documents on the disc, because they'll be erased.

* * *

YOU might have noticed the Save Desktop option on the Option menu. This lets you save your preferred desktop configuration. Set the desktop up with whichever disc windows you

wish to open and place them where you want them to be. Now select Save Desktop and a file called DESKTOP.INF will be saved on to the disc in drive A. Now whenever you boot with that disc in drive A the desktop will be restored exactly as you like it.

* * *

IT IS possible to change the name which appears under the disc icons on the desktop, for example to MYDISC. The method is fairly simple. First select disc A by clicking on it once, then select Install Disc Drive from the Option menu. You will be presented with the name and letter of the drive.

Move the mouse pointer to the name line and click once. You can now backspace over the name and type in your replacement. Certain characters, such as space, cannot be used but a little experimentation will show the acceptable characters. When you have finished entering the name, don't press Return, but click on the Install box and your name will now appear under the icon and will be saved if you save the desktop.

ALWAYS set the clock using the control panel at the start of a session. Since the time is saved along with the file it will help you to differentiate between different versions of the same file.

* * *

IF you have been opening and closing directories to find a particular file or program, you may like to know that you don't have to close the directory window every time you change discs. First open a directory window as normal. Next change the disc in the drive and press Escape once. The new directory will be read in and will replace the old one on the screen.

* * *

THE file selection section of most ST programs is easy to use – simply point at the file that you want and click on OK. The only problem arises when your file is on a different disc from your program. You have to read in the directory of the new disc. This is quite easy. After the file selection box comes up on the screen change the disc in the drive, then click once on the top of the small window which contains the file listing. The new disc's directory will now be read in.

You must always use this method when changing discs as doing it without rereading the directory might lead to your discs becoming corrupted and unusable.


HOT news this month has to be the developments with the Magic Sac cartridge which, at a shade under 150 dollars "makes your ST think like a Mac".

Yes, that's right – an Apple Macintosh. You believe it? I didn't until I read all the press releases from Dave Small, proprietor of Data Pacific, a Denver Colorado firm which seems to be cocking a snook at Apple's Mac copyright.

In case you missed last month's news pages when Atari User outlined the Magic Sac, the unit plugs into the ST's rom cartridge slot. When you add the twin Mac rom set – not supplied with the unit – it allows you to load and run genuine Macintosh software.

The roms will set you back around \$15 (ten pounds in Britain) — if you can persuade your Apple dealer to sell them to you. That shouldn't pose too much of a problem in the UK though, as I hear that Robtek (more of which later) has more than 10,000 rom sets "just in case".

In the US, two versions of the Magic Sac are available at the time of



writing. Magic Sac 1 sells for \$129, while Magic Sac Plus is \$149.

Magic Sac 1 consists of a cartridge, an ST disc with transfer and other software, a Macintosh disc with a transfer program and a manual.

Magic Sac Plus is the more expensive product. It includes an onboard clock calendar with battery back-up to keep time. The clock may be used, or paged in, from either ST Tos or the Macintosh operating system.

Both systems include a transfer cable to port data across from the Mac to the ST. You plug in the cartridge and rom set and boot the disc up. The cartridge contains around 64k of code which, coupled with the 33k disc based program,

gives you a Mac environment to work in.

The ST's disc format is thus remapped into a ten sector format with 400k storage capacity (as opposed to the nine sectors with 360k normally available on the ST). This psuedo-Mac format is, I am reliably informed, similar to the Macintosh's, except for the variable speed rate.

A problem with the Magic Sac is that while the Mac has two serial ports the ST has just one. Thus under the Magic Sac's program environment the modem is assigned to the ST's serial port. Printing is handled via the parallel port — not standard I know, but it works.

Dave Small designed the Magic Sac and unveiled it in late '85 at the West Coast Computer Faire. In a conference held on-line in the Compuserve Atari SIG (Special Interest Group) he said that the parallel function was there to support Epson and similar parallel printers that most ST owners had already. Quite rightly Dave's argument was that there is no point in forcing ST owners to invest in serial interfaces for their printers.

During the conference Starglider author Jeremy San raised the interesting question as to whether it would be possible for him to develop a Mac version of Starglider on his ST. Dave Small replied that since Starglider manipulated the ST's screen memory directly, and the Mac has a limited cpu running at 5.9Mhz, Starglider will run, though at a much slower rate. The fact that the ST's screen is 80 bytes wide, compared with 64 bytes on the Mac may also cause problems, although Dave is working on this.


Dave also made the valid point that Apple may be adopting a tolerant attitude towards the Magic Sac since, if Apple did quash Data Pacific, it would be foregoing a whole new generation of Mac enthusiasts.

The Mac has always been a second runner in the American PC stakes. In allowing the ST to run to the Mac standard, Apple is insuring against the possibility that there aren't enough Macs in circulation to maintain an effective user base.

Magic Sac suffers from one great disadvantage compared with owning the real thing – Macintosh discs run at variable speeds, with data being written proportionally to the disc over all its surface. As every ST owner will know, the ST writes its data at the same speed over the whole of the disc surface.

So even though Dave Small's software remaps the disc format, in its present configuration the Magic Sac will not run protected Macintosh software. Sadly, this rules out wonderful packages such as Jazz, Excel and Pagemaker running on the Magic Sac alone.

All is not lost, however, as Dave Small committed himself to bringing



out a plug-in and go Macintosh disc drive for the ST by the new year. Once this beast becomes available at Dave's projected price of "around the \$200 mark", then the ST will really fly.

In fact, once Data Pacific starts marketing its ST/Mac conversion kits for \$350 (drive and Magic Sac included), we'll see 512k ST/Mac combinations becoming available for around the \$900/£600 mark - an interesting situation when one thinks that a 512k Macintosh itself will set you back the better part of £2,000.

As I've said, Magic Sac is produced by Dave's Denver-based company, Data Pacific, for North American consumption. At the time of writing I hear that Robtek, a London-based firm, is planning to manufacture the units under licence. But because of the licencing costs and such, I gather that the cost will be around the £150/200 mark. Still, even at that price, it makes a 2Mb Mac/ST combination available for the same price as a 512k Macintosh.





THE Nexus development system allows you to develop software which can later be placed on to rom or eprom to make an ST cartridge. The system consists of an uncased printed circuit board which plugs into the cartridge slot at the side of the ST.

It contains two Zero Insertion Force (ZIF) sockets to hold roms while programming, 64k of static CMOS ram to emulate roms during development, and two header sockets which can connect the board into the cartridge address space of another ST.

The printed circuit board is quite robust and I have had no problems with it. The disc-based driving software uses Gem to present a very friendly user interface. The documentation – supplied on disc – is of a high standard.

The development system is very easy to use — Nexus has gone to a lot of trouble here to make you feel at ease. Having started up the driving program and selected one of the 12 rom types a desktop is displayed with five icons down the left hand side and a dump of the static ram in a window.

You can carry out various tasks such as searching for values in a specified range, filling or clearing the static ram and verifying the eproms against the contents of the static ram. Sub-options include the facility to edit the static ram, as well as letting you choose how it is to be displayed in the dump window — in byte, word or long word form.

From this point programming the eproms becomes quite simple. First a binary image of the eproms must be loaded into the static ram. Then the ram icon, which looks like a male sheep, is dragged to the eprom icon. The Ext. Simulate option allows you to run the eproms on the SIM sockets on the printed circuit board or a program in static ram. You can also choose whether to leave the eproms/static ram enabled when you quit the program.

The system has its teething troubles. The


software version I was supplied with (1.02) overwrites the last byte of a 64k object file with a \$FF byte. This problem can be overcome, but it is annoying and time-consuming, as is blowing a pair of 32k eproms using the so-called "fast" algorithm. This takes about 20 minutes.

Also the development system works best with Intel's eproms. Trying to program units from other manufacturers can prove unreliable.

It would be nice if Nexus had allowed the board to take 64k eproms instead of restricting them to the smaller 32k 27256 chips. This means that it takes four eproms to blow a master copy of 128k cartridges such as Fast Basic instead of the two used in the production versions.

Having said this, the system is constantly being updated and Nexus gives a very good technical backup for any problems the user may come up against. If you are interested in producing cartridge-based software for your ST, this is the product for you.




