The Motion Picture Association of America had wanted France to lower its trade barriers for film and television. But with backing from the UK, Germany and Spain, the French get the audiovisual category dropped from the accord. Adding to the MPAA's chagrin, provisions are made to extend the system of

taxing American films (to subsidise domestic film production) to other European countries Sommersby (Le Retour de Martin Guerre) and The Assassin (Nikita) continue the trend of "le remake" - Hollywood versions of French movies. Other European titles include Three Men and A Baby (Trois hommes et un couffin) and The Vanishing. Some argue that Hollywood is using such French films as demo tapes, although remake rights are worth up to \$1m for


