LOS ANGELES (AP) — The nation's two biggest school systems — New York City and Los Angeles — received threats of a largescale attack Tuesday, and L.A. reacted by shutting down the entire district. New York dismissed the warning as an amateurish hoax and held class as the threat had watched a

raised fears of another attack like the recent deadly shooting in nearby San Bernardino.

Authorities in New York reported receiving the same "generic" email that was sent to other cities around the country. They decided

there was no danger to schoolchildren, with Mayor Bill de Blasio concluding the threat contained "nothing credible."

"It is very easy in hindsight to criticize a decision based on results the decider could never have known," LA Police Chief Charlie Beck said at a news conference.

The threatening email sent to the New York City school superintendent warned that every school would be attacked with pressure cooker bombs, nerve agents and machine guns. The email claimed the writer and "138 comrades" would carry out the attack. Students "at every school in the New York City school district will be massacred, mercilessly.

And there is nothing you can do to stop it," the message said.

The anonymous writer claimed to be a student at a district high school who had been bullied.

with access to the document provided the email to The Associated Press.

The official was not authorized to disclose details of an ongoing investigation and spoke on condition of anonymity.

The person who wrote the note also claimed to be a jihadist but made errors that suggested the writer really a prankster, including spelling the word "Allah" with a lowercase "a."

The threats came in simultaneously to New York and LA school officials at about 1:20 a.m.

Kerry calls for common ground with Russia on Syria, Ukraine

MOSCOW (AP) — The United States and Russia need
to find common ground to
end Syria's civil war and
restore stability in eastern
Ukraine, U.S. Secretary of
State John Kerry said Tuesday, as he met with Russian
President Vladimir Putin to

try to narrow gaps in the

countries' approaches to the crises.

"Together the United States and Russia have the ability to make a significant difference here," Kerry told Putin as they began meeting at the Kremlin. Perhaps seeking to ease some tension in what were expected to be tough talks, Kerry praised Russia's role in seeking to create a political transition process for Syria with other nations, including the U.S.

"It's been a good cooperative effort, and we're very appreciative for what has been achieved so far," Kerry said. Putin offered only perfunctory comments at the start of the meeting, but noted that "together, we are looking for ways out of the most urgent crises," despite several "outstanding issues." Earlier, in talks with Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov, Kerry said the world benefits when great powers agree in their approaches to major crises. "Even when there have been differences between us, we have been able to work effectively on specific issues," Kerry said. "Today, I hope we can find some common ground."

Russia and the U.S. are at odds over the mechanics of a political transition

aimed at halting the war in Syria, as well as the military approach to fighting the Islamic State group. The results of Tuesday's meetings will determine whether or not a new international diplomatic conference on Syria will go ahead as planned Friday at the United Nations.

On Ukraine, the two countries are split over the implementation of a February agreement meant to end hostilities between the Kiev government and Russian-backed separatists in eastern Ukraine.

Lavrov noted "outstanding issues" with the U.S. on the Syrian political transition that is supposed to bring representatives of Syrian

President Bashar Assad's government together with the opposition for negotiations by early January. And on Ukraine, Lavrov said the U.S. should use its influence with the government in Kiev to settle the conflict with the separatists by respecting a shaky cease-fire and moving ahead with political reforms in eastern Ukraine.

Kerry praised Moscow for having been "a significant contributor to the progress that we have been able to make" on Syria and said the U.S. and Russia both believe the Islamic State group must be eliminated. "Russia and the United States agree that this is a threat to everybody, to ev-

ery country," he said. "They are the worst of terrorists. They attack culture and history and all decency. It leaves no choice but for civilized nations to stand together, to fight and destroy them."

However, ahead of his arrival, Russia's foreign ministry said Moscow would be looking for a "revision" in U.S. policy of "dividing terrorists into 'bad' and 'good' ones." It also complained that the U.S. was unwilling to engage in "full-fledged coordination" between the two powers' militaries while both are conducting airstrikes in Syria.

Russia says its airstrikes since late September have targeted the Islamic State group, but Western governments claim Moscow is bombing mostly moderate Syrian rebels and is primarily concerned with shoring up Assad.

Assad's future and his potential role in the political transition will be prime topics of Kerry's conversations with Putin and Lavrov.

Russia has consistently said Assad's future is for the Syrian people to decide, while the U.S. and many of its allies insist that he go, although they have softened their stance somewhat to allow Assad to play a temporary but asyet undefined role in the transition. Syrian opposition groups, however, demand that Assad leave at the start of the process. After his lengthy meeting with Lavrov, Kerry took time out for a brief stroll through Moscow's Stary Arbat pedestrian shopping street, stopping at stores including a Dunkin' Donuts under a light snow and exchanging greetings with Russians. Kerry's trip to Moscow is his second to Russia this year. Since the first, President Barack Obama has seen Putin briefly twice at summits in Turkey and France. Regarding Ukraine, Kerry is asking for Russia's full implementation of a February cease-fire in exchange for sanctions relief. That truce called for the removal of heavy weaponry from front lines, a Russian troop withdrawal, the release of detainees and full access for international monitors. But the cease-fire has become increasingly

strained.



Massachusetts:

Teen convicted in rape, killing of high school teacher

SALEM, Massachusetts (AP) Chism

— A teenager was convicted Tuesday of raping and killing his math teacher at a high school in the state of Massachusetts when he was 14. Philip Chism, now 16, followed his 9th grade algebra teacher, Colleen Ritzer, into a school bathroom, strangled her, stabbed her at least 16 times and raped her.

Chism was convicted of a raping Ritzer inside the bathroom but was acquitted of a second rape, committed with a tree branch in woods near the school where Chism put her body. He was convicted of armed robbery for stealing Ritzer's credit cards and her underwear.

stared ahead and did not have any visible reaction as the verdicts were being read in Salem Superior Court.

During his trial, his lawyer admitted Chism killed Ritzer, but said he was suffering from severe mental illness and was not criminally responsible for his actions. A psychiatrist who testified for the defense said Chism was hearing voices and in the throes of a psychotic episode when he killed Ritzer.

Ritzer, 24, was a popular teacher at Danvers High School, about 25 miles (40 kilometers) north of Boston, doing her dream job, teaching math, Assistant District Attorney Kate Mac-

> On Oct. 22, 2013, Ritzer asked Chism to stay after school. Another student who also stayed late that day testified that Ritzer tried to engage Chism — a student who had recently moved to Massachusetts — in light talk about how his new community compared with his old town of Clarksville, Tennessee. The student said Chism became visibly upset and Ritzer eventually changed the subject.

Chism faces life in prison on the first-degree murder charge. As a juvenile, he cannot receive a life sentence without parole following decisions by the U.S.

According to LA school police, the FBI and LAPD were contacted late Monday, which would mean within 90 minute or so of the threat coming in.

The decision to close Los Angeles schools was announced at 6:25 a.m. PST, well after NYC had already concluded a hoax and kept schools open.

Los Angeles Superintendent Ramon Cortines said every campus would be searched, and he asked for a report on the searches certifying that all buildings are safe.

Bratton called the closure in Los Angeles a "significant overreaction."

"We cannot allow ourselves to raise levels of fear," said Bratton, who once ran the LA Police Department.

Hours later, the ranking Democrat on the House Intelligence Committee also said the threat was believed to be a hoax.

White House spokesman Josh Earnest said he would not second-guess the decisions made in Los Angeles or New York. He said the FBI has been in touch with California authorities.

The decision to close the district disrupted the morning routines of many Los Angeles families.

Lupita Vela, who has a daughter in the third grade and a son who is a high school senior, called the threat "absolutely terrifying" in light of the San Bernardino attack, which killed 14 people earlier this month.

"I know the kids are anxious," she said.

Clinton: US needs '360-degree' anti-terror strategy

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Democratic presidential frontrunner Hillary Clinton plans to address Tuesday the need for a "360-degree strategy" to keep the U.S. safe and prevent domestic terror attacks.

In a speech at the University of Minnesota, Clinton will address proactive steps for capping Islamic State recruitment in the U.S., especially online, and for stopping potential jihadists from training overseas, her campaign said Tuesday, previewing her remarks.

The Democratic hopeful was addressing her counterterrorism strategy hours before Republicans were holding their latest debate in Las Vegas. As President Barack Obama's former secretary of state, Clinton holds direct ties to the White House's national security policies and has largely

endorsed the president's approach to dismantling the Islamic State group. Like Obama, Clinton has said she would not send American ground troops to the Middle East, saying it would provide a recruiting tool for IS.But Republicans view Obama's handling of foreign policy and terrorism as a weakness and have tried to link Clinton to the president's record, arguing that his policies in the Middle East allowed terrorist groups to flourish since the drawdown of troops in Iraa. The former first lady is the overwhelming favorite for the 2016 Democratic nomination. She faces two rivals in the primary contest that begins in February.

Clinton will also talk about ways to stop foreign fighters from coming to the U.S., discover and disrupt plots before they can be carried out, work more closely with law enforcement agen-

cies and empower Muslim-American communities, her campaign said.

Clinton's campaign billed the speech as a "360-degree strategy to keep America safe." She sought to reassure Americans that she would keep the homeland safe in the aftermath of high-profile attacks in Paris and San Bernardino, California, incidents that have thrust terrorism to the forefront of the presidential campaign. Clinton planned to say the nation needs a comprehensive strategy to address every step in the process that could lead to an attack like the one that occurred in San Bernardino, including recruitment, training, planning and execution.

US envoy: Raid in May led to plans to attack IS oil targets

WASHINGTON (AP) — A U.S. military raid that killed an Islamic State leader in Syria last spring yielded intelligence that allowed the U.S. to more effectively target the extremist group's oil revenues, the State Department's top diplomat for energy affairs said Tuesday

Amos Hochstein, a special envoy and coordinator for international energy affairs, told reporters at the Pentagon that the raid by U.S. special operations forces in May was a key to building a military and diplomatic plan to hit the extremists' most important source of income.

The raid killed Abu Sayyaf,

who was known as the Islamic State's oil emir. Sayyaf's wife, an Iraqi known as Umm Sayyaf, was captured. U.S. officials have said she was cooperative during interrogations and provided significant amounts of useful intelligence. She is now in Iraqi custody.

"With that raid we got this enormous amount of information that was very detailed as to how they operated their energy sector and allowed us to learn more about the operation and how to attack it or address it," Hochstein said. It enabled the U.S. to "put together the picture" of the most effective way to attack the group's oil infrastructure in Syria, he said.





Freddie Gray jurors deadlocked, judge says keep deliberating

BALTIMORE (AP) — Jurors said they were deadlocked Tuesday as they weighed manslaughter and other charges against a police officer in the death of Freddie Gray. The judge told them to keep deliberating and they went home for the night without reaching a verdict. The jury sent a note to Baltimore Circuit Judge Barry Williams after about nine hours of discussions over two days. They are deliberating in the trial of Officer William Porter, the first of six officers to stand trial on charges stemming from Gray's death in April.

As the jury deliberated, armored vehicles and police were stationed around the city ahead of any verdict, and city and state officials promised they were prepared to prevent the unrest and rioting that saw parts of the city burned and looted last spring.

It was the fifth note the jury had sent the judge Tuesday. They had earlier requested highlighters, an easel and sticky notes, suggesting they were taking a businesslike approach to assessing Porter's role in the arrest and death of Gray.

The jury also received a set of external computer speakers to improve the sound quality of recordings in evidence, including Porter's videotaped interview with Baltimore police detectives, police radio transmissions on the day Gray was arrested and cellphone videos made at two of the wagon's six stops, starting with Gray's arrest.

The panel spent three hours deliberating Monday. Porter faces charges of manslaughter, assault, reckless endangerment and misconduct. If convicted of all charges, he could face 25 years in prison.

The judge refused a jury request for the clerk's list of trial exhibits, since the list isn't evidence, and denied defense motions for a mistrial and change of trial location. The latter

two requests were part of a motion seeking ask jurors if they've seen a letter the city schools chief sent home with children Monday, warning of consequences for violent responses to any verdict.

Williams said it wouldn't be appropriate to query the jury about the letter.

In closing arguments Monday, prosecutors said Porter could have save Gray's life with two clicks: one to buckle him in with a seat belt and another to summon medical help with his police radio. Defense lawyers said Porter was not to blame for Gray's death.

Gray died April 19, a week after his neck was broken while he was in the back of the van with wrists and ankles shackled. The autopsy concluded that the injury probably came as Gray was slammed against a wall during cornering or braking.

"Is two, three, four seconds worth a life?" prosecutor Janice Bledsoe asked the jury Monday.

Jurors must determine whether they believe prosecutors, who say Porter's indifference makes him criminally responsible for Gray's injury, or the defense characterization of Porter as a conscientious officer who told supervisors to bring take Gray to the hospital.

Rate Hike:

Fed betting it will avoid errors of the past

LONDON (AP) — The Federal Reserve is poised to raise interest rates Wednesday for the first time in 9½ years. It may not take so long to know whether its decision was correct.

History is filled with cases, from the Fed in the 1930s to the European Central Bank in 2011, when central banks raised rates prematurely, sometimes with dire consequences. Raising rates or otherwise tightening credit too soon can slow borrowing, jolt confidence and choke growth. When the global financial system started buckling in 2007, central banks cut rates to fight the worst economic catastrophe since the 1930s. As the crisis escalated in late 2008, many rates were slashed to record lows. The Fed cut its benchmark rate to near zero.

Mindful of the risks of higher rates and of the U.S. economy's lingering weaknesses, some economists have suggested that the Fed could wait a bit Ionger before raising rates, especially with inflation still low amid slumping oil and commodity prices. In a survey of top academic economists, the University of Chicago found that while 48 percent favored a rate hike, 36 percent felt the Fed should hold off.

Andrew Levin of Dartmouth College is among those who think the Fed is acting too soon.

"The economy is not that close to normal yet," Levin says. "Inflation has been persistently falling short of the Fed's target."

Levin notes, too, that while the unemployment rate is a low 5 percent, millions without jobs have given up looking for one. Levin says employers would have to add 200,000 jobs a month for at least another year to restore the job market's health.

For any central bank, the hardest task is to continually straddle a delicate balance:

Keeping rates too low for

too long can inflate asset bubbles as investors seek returns that are higher — but riskier — than returns on government debt. Low rates can also weaken the ability of central banks to combat a new crisis or recession.

But equally, central bankers must take care not to increase rates too soon. Since the global financial crisis, several central banks, from Israel's to New Zealand's, have raised rates only to have to reverse course soon after.

Chair Janet Yellen summed it up in a speech Dec. 2. Yellen said delaying a first increase too long might later compel the Fed to raise rates faster than it would like.

"An abrupt tightening would risk disrupting financial markets and perhaps even inadvertently push the economy into recession," she said. "Holding the federal funds rate at

its current level for too long could also encourage excessive risk-taking and thus undermine financial stability."

In 1936-37, during the Great Depression era, the Fed sought to normalize its policies by increasing the amount of money banks had to hold as reserves. Many blame that decision, along with a tougher budgetary stance from the U.S. government, for helping prolong the Depression. The economy fell back into a brutal recession in which around 2.5 million Americans lost jobs.

By 1938, President Franklin Roosevelt reverted back to the expansionist policies associated with the New Deal that he had been implementing since 1933. And the Fed rescinded the increased reserve requirement. The economy then enjoyed a spectacular recovery, helped by wartime spending.

Merriam-Webster declares 'ism' as the word of the year for 2015

NEW YORK (AP) — Merriam-Webster has picked a small but powerful suffix as word of the year: ism.

But not just any ism. The top isms to earn high traffic spikes and big bumps in lookups on the dictionary company's website in 2015 over the year before are socialism, fascism, racism, feminism, communism, capitalism and terrorism.

"We had a lot on our minds this year," mused Peter Sokolowski, the Springfield, Massachusetts-based company's editor at large, in a recent interview. "It's a serious year. These are words of ideas and practices. We're educating ourselves."

Pinpointing reasons why words go on the run at Merriam-Webster is an educated guess. The dictionary company tracks corresponding news events to link lookups to real life. And its researchers also crunch data in a way that filters out common words frequently looked up year after year after year when making their top annual choices. Lookups for fascism corresponded to release of video in November showing a white police officer shooting a black teenager in Chicago, and the criminal charges that followed. Merriam-Webster also saw a stronger correlation in heavy traffic on its site for that word and "fascist" and flash points in Republican Donald Trump's presidential campaign, including reports on his anti-Islam rhetoric. The isms often collide, driving each other in popularity, Sokolowski said.

"Fascism we more closely associate as the response to various acts of terrorism. After the attacks in Paris and the attacks in Colorado Springs and in San Bernardino, and because of Donald Trump's proposal to ban Muslims, we then see the word fas-

cism spike," he said.

Lookups of racism were high all year but had two noticeable spikes, one after the South Carolina church shootings and another amid the University of Missouri protests.

Sokolowski, a lexicographer by training, said one spike in lookups for feminism came in April and corresponded with reports on an Ohio middle school student who wore a T-shirt with the word printed on it in a school photo, only to have it digitally blacked out by school administrators. The school later apologized. Reports on Caitlyn Jenner, Amy Schumer and Hillary Clinton all included discussion of feminism, as did reviews of the film "Mad Max: Fury Road" and chatter about previews

In addition, Emma Watson's 2014 UN speech made the news again twice this year; first for inspiring Nobel Peace Prize winner Malala Yousafzai to call herself a feminist in a viral video, and again when it was revealed that Watson was asked not to use the word at all in the speech, Sokolowski noted. The word socialism has Bernie Sanders to thank for its popularity.

of "Star Wars: The Force

Awakens."

"The big spikes have been associated with the fact that we have a presidential candidate who identifies as a Democratic Socialist," Sokolowski said. "We saw that even though socialism was in the Top 10 of the most looked-up words in the whole history of the site, it increased in a spike beginning in late July when Bernie Sanders had a multicity rally that was organized through social media and attracted about 100,000 people in 3,000 communities or more around the country."

In October, lookups for socialism spiked again during the first Democratic debate featuring Sanders and Clinton.

Consumer prices unchanged but core inflation moves up

MARTIN CRUTSINGER AP Economics Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. consumer prices were unchanged in November as declines in energy and food held down overall costs. But core inflation was up 2 percent over the 12 months ending in November. That was the fastest pace in more than a year and the kind of increase Fed officials want to see to justify the start of a round of interest rate increases. The flat reading for consumer prices last month followed a modest 0.2 percent increase in October and outright declines in August and September, the Labor Department reported Tuesday. Core inflation, which excludes energy and food, was up 0.2 percent in November and has risen 2 percent over the past 12 months, the fastest gain since a similar 2 percent rise for the 12 months ending in May 2014. Over the past year, overall inflation has risen just 0.5 percent. Overall prices are being held back by a sharp fall in energy costs and a stronger dollar, which makes imports cheaper. Fed Chair Janet Yellen has said she expects both of those impacts will soon start to fade and because of that she expects overall inflation will start rising back to the Fed's 2 percent target. Private economists said Fed officials, who were holding their final meeting of the year on Tuesday and Wednesday, are likely to use the rise in core prices as justification to support a quarter-point rate hike at this meeting, the first rate increase in nearly a decade. Paul Ashworth, chief U.S. economist at Capital Economics, said he expects rising inflation will prompt

the Fed to raise its key interest rate to near 2 percent by this time next year. This rate has been at a record low near zero for the past seven years. Other economists are predicting a much more gradual rise in rates of less than half that amount to around 1 percent for the Fed's benchmark federal funds rate. Overall energy costs fell 1.3 percent in November, led by a 2.4 percent drop in gasoline pump prices, the third decline in gasoline costs in the past four months. Nationwide gas prices now stand at \$2.01 per gallon, according to AAA's Daily Fuel Gauge. That is down from \$2.56 a year ago. In some parts of the country, gas is already below \$2 per gal-Ion. Food costs retreated 0.1 percent in November, the first monthly decline since March. The price of meats, poultry, fish and eggs dropped for the third month in a row.Meanwhile, prices rose in some categories. Saudi Arabia creates Islamic bloc to fight terror groups

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia (AP) - Projecting its ambition for regional leadership, Saudi Arabia said Tuesday it has lined up most of the Arab world, NATO member Turkey and several African and Asian countries behind a vaguely defined "Islamic military alliance" against terrorists.

The move allows the kingdom, which follows a deeply conservative interpretation of Islam, to cast itself as a leader in the fight against extremism.

But absent from the alliance are the Shiite-led countries of Iran and Iraa, as well as Syria, whose government is backed by Tehran. And that omission raises questions about whether the 34-member bloc is primarily intended to present a unified front against extremists — or to also serve as a Sunni deterrent to Iran, Saudi Arabia's main regional rival.

state media said the Saudiled alliance is being established because terrorism "should be fought by all means."

Deputy Crown Prince and Defense Minister Mohammed bin Salman said at a rare news conference that the bloc will develop mechanisms for working with other countries and international bodies to support counterterrorism ef-

Though few details were given, the statement said the alliance would not just be countering Sunni extremists but protecting Muslim nations from all terrorists "whatever their doctrine."

When asked if this meant the alliance would also counter Shiite militants, the Saudi defense minister replied the coalition would fight terrorist groups "regardless of their categorization," particularly in Syria and Iraq, where he said there will be cooperation with the international com-

The U.S. and its allies have trained militarily with the Gulf states and other friendly countries in the region for years, encouraging them to work more closely together.

Last year, Saudi Arabia and other Gulf states joined the U.S. in carrying out airstrikes in Syria against the Islamic State, also known as ISIS and ISIL. Many of the Arab countries in the new Saudiled coalition are part of that existing alliance against IS, though their contributions have waned since March, with Gulf efforts diverted to the Yemen offensive.

The Saudi endeavor appeared to catch some in Washington off-guard. A senior defense official said the U.S. did not know in advance about the plan for the alliance and that officials were working to find out details. The official was not authorized to discuss the matter publicly and spoke on condition of anonymity.

Defense Secretary U.S. Ash Carter, visiting Incerlik Air Base in Turkey, said: "In general, at least, it appears that it's very much aligned with something that we've been urging for quite some time, which is greater involvement in the campaign to combat ISIL by Sunni Arab countries." White House spokesman Josh Earnest said the alliance wouldn't be a substitute or a replacement for the U.S.-led coalition fighting IS militants, noting the

Saudi effort was intended to focus on broader targets. The Saudis have made "important contributions" to the anti-IS coalition led by Washington, "and we anticipate that they will continue to do so," he said.

Dozens killed, hurt in airstrikes on fuel market in Syria

BEIRUT (AP) — Airstrikes on a fuel market in a rebel-held village in northern Syria killed and wounded dozens on Tuesday and destroyed several tanker trucks, two Syrian opposition monitoring groups reported.

Opposition activists said warplanes also struck a popular market in the northern village of Maskaneh that is under the control of the Islamic State group, killing at least 18 people and wounding many others.

It was not immediately clear whose warplanes carried out the strikes, although the monitoring groups said the Russians targeted both markets.

The fuel market in the village of Maaret al-Naasan mostly sells diesel brought from areas under the control of the Islamic State group. The airstrikes on the market are likely part of a campaign to target the oil trade that is a major source of income for IS. The extremist group controls nearly half of Syria.

Russian warplanes as well as those of the U.S.-led coalition have destroyed hundreds of tanker trucks that are used to ferry oil from fields under the control of IS in eastern Syria to other parts of the country. The warplanes have also struck oil facilities in the eastern province of Deir el-Zour in recent weeks.

The Local Coordination Committees said Tuesday's airstrikes on Maaret al-Naasan were carried out by Russian warplanes and that they killed and wounded dozens of people.

Britain-based ian Observatory for Human Rights said the airstrikes killed 16 and wounded dozens more.

New austerity bill changing loan rules approved

ATHENS, Greece (AP) — Greek lawmakers on Tuesday approved legislation granting the right to sell bad business loans from local banks to overseas funds as part of a new austerity bill demanded by bailout lenders from the rest of the eurozone.

All 153 members of Prime
Minister Alexis Tsipras' leftled coalition voted in favor of the draft legislation,
while all 138 opposition
lawmakers present rejected it, and nine were absent

The changes will only affect larger businesses and follow months of pressure from lenders as the number of non-performing loans in the Greek market rose above 40 percent.

The legislation was set as a condition for the release of the next loan installment of 1 billion euros (\$1.1 billion). Other provisions in the bill include a new pay scale for civil servants, while plans to partially privatize the national power grid operator, ADMIE, were delayed until next year.

Labor unions, which oppose the reforms, staged two separate, peaceful protest marches in central Athens late Tuesday. Nearly 2,000 people in total participated.

Tsipras' coalition, which suffered the defection of two lawmakers in a previ-

ous vote on creditor-demanded reforms, still faces a major hurdle next month, when the government has pledged to legislate unpopular pension reforms and hikes in taxation for farmers.

Greece has depended on international rescue loans since it nearly went bankrupt in 2010. Tsipras first came to power in January, pledging to reverse resented austerity measures creditors sought in return for the loans, but he was forced a few months later to sign yet another bailout with further tough cutbacks. Nevertheless, he won a second four-year term in early elections held in September.

"This is a safety net, which like all safety nets, we hope will never need to be used," European Commission Vice President Frans Timmermans told EU lawmakers on Tuesday.

The plan is contentious because it requires countries to surrender some of their sovereignty — something many have viscerally opposed so far — and it's unclear whether the scheme will win enough backing among the bloc's 28 members to pass. EU leaders will discuss it for the first time at a two-day summit beginning Thursday.

The proposal is just the start of a potentially long and divisive legislative process. Still, the EU has planned a 2016 budget for the agency of 238 million euros (\$260 million). According to the International Organization for Migration, more than 920,000 people have entered the EU so far this year. The influx has overwhelmed national border guards and reception capacities, notably in Greece, where some 770,000 migrants have arrived, most of them from Turkey.

Greece has struggled to respond, sparking anger among its European partners as unregistered migrants move further north. The border and coast guard would monitor EU borders to the outside world — like Greece's — and have the right to send border guards, ships, planes or other assets when a country is unable or unwilling to enforce border laws.





Yemen peace talks underway as some rebels ignore cease-fire

GENEVA (AP) — U.N.brokered peace talks between Yemen's internationally recognized government and Shiite rebels opened Tuesday in Switzerland with expectations of a deal low as fighters failed to honor a weeklong cease-fire in some parts of the country.

The truce, scheduled to start at noon on Tuesday,

was meant to give the warring factions a chance to find a solution to the conflict that has engulfed the Arab world's poorest country. Airstrikes by a Saudi-led coalition targeting the rebels were halted, but

security officials said rebel shelling and ground clashes continued in southwestern Taiz province.

Yemen has been torn by fighting pitting the rebels, known as Houthis, and army units loyal to former President Ali Abdullah Saleh against forces of the internationally recognized government, which is backed by the Saudi-led coalition and supported by the United States, as well as southern separatists, religious extremists and other militants.

According to U.N. figures, the war in Yemen has killed at least 5,884 people since March, when the fighting escalated after the Saudi-led coalition began launching airstrikes targeting the rebels.

In a statement, the U.N. special envoy for Yemen, Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed, emphasized the urgency of the talks in Switzerland — the latest in a series of negotiations and cease-fires that have so far failed to end the fighting.

"The people of Yemen are daily, indeed hourly,

anticipating the outcome of these discussions. This meeting is their only glimmer of hope and must not be extinguished," the envoy said. "The tongues of fire, the scenes of destruction, the reverberation of bombs and the soaring prices have turned their daily lives into a series of ongoing tragedies."

Previous efforts to end the violence have ended in failure, as the government insisted the Houthis comply with a U.N. resolution that requires them to hand over weapons and withdraw from territory they captured over the past year, including the capital, Sanaa. The Houthis have demanded the country's political future be decided through negotiations.

In the past, the rebels have said they are willing to honor the U.N. resolution but did not specify to whom they would hand over weapons and territory. Yemen's civil war has divided the armed forces, which have units loyal to ousted president Saleh, a Houthi ally, and others who answer to the internationally recognized government of President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi.

Negotiations were taking place at the Swiss Olympic House in the village of Macolin, a training center for elite athletes. On Tuesday, police armed with automatic weapons were on patrol outside the facility, which was cordoned off with metal barriers requiring journalists to keep about 50 yards (meters) away. The talks, which could go on for days, were shrouded in secrecy.

Man arrested, held for questioning over Paris attacks

PARIS (AP) — Police arrested a 29-year-old man on Tuesday and held him for questioning about the Nov. 13 Paris attacks, officials said.

The prosecutor's office said the man was arrested in the morning at his home in Villiers-Sur-Marne, a farflung eastern suburb of Paris.

The spokeswoman for the

prosecutor's office, Agnes Thibault-Lecuivre, refused to identify the man or provide further information about his suspected links to the attacks that killed 130 people. Two police officials who confirmed the arrest also gave no further details.

The man arrested Tuesday can be held for questioning for up to six days before being charged or freed. Two people have been placed under investigation in France and more than a half-dozen in Belgium in connection with the attacks. France moved into a state of emergency after the attacks, which were claimed by the Islamic State group. The coordinated attacks targeted a noted music hall, restaurants and cafes and the main sports stadium, and left hundreds wounded in addition to the dead.

Police in France and Belgium, where the attackers began their journey, are sweeping wide to find those behind it.

Police are still investigating two January attacks around Paris that killed 17 people. The Paris prosecutor's office said two people have been arrested in that case on suspicion of helping provide guns to the man who attacked a kosher supermarket.





Eduardo Cunha is a bitter nemesis of Rousseff and faces federal charges of corruption for allegedly accepting at least \$5 million in bribes linked to a sprawling kickback scandal at state-run oil company Petrobras.

As speaker of the house, Cunha had the power to allow the impeachment process against the president to begin. Her government is accused of fiscal irregularities by using funds from state-run banks to cover budget gaps.

Cunha for months has been the leader's biggest congressional roadblock to passing austerity measures to jumpstart the moribund economy and other legislation.

The push against Cunha and several high-ranking members of his powerful party, which is split into pro- and anti-Rousseff camps despite serving as the ruling Workers' Party's strongest coalition partner since it took power in 2003, is seen as a political boost for Rousseff.

"This weakens the whole impeachment process because there will be even

more fragmentation in Congress," said Francisco Fonseca, a political science professor at the Gertulio Vargas Foundation university in Sao Paulo.

Fonseca noted that protests this past weekend that called for Rousseff's impeachment were far weaker than previous rallies against her, and that while "the economy might be affected by the political turmoil in the short run ... it's important to show that Brazilian institutions" like federal police and prosecutors are independently doing their jobs, regardless of the poisonous political atmosphere. Cunha, who told reporters on Tuesday that he's "totally innocent," has said the millions investigators found in Swiss bank accounts and linked to him was made through business dealings, was not the only figure caught up in the raids, which saw police confiscating phones, computers, documents and other items but as yet not arresting anyone. Also targeted were two

government ministers and a senator from Cunha's Brazil Democratic Movement Party, known as the PMDB. Rousseff's Vice President Michel Temer is the head of the PMDB and, should she be impeached, would take the presidency. Cunha's fate as speaker of the lower house is being determined by an ethics committee of that body, which may rule this week on whether he should step down. Speaking in Brasilia, Cunha lashed out on Tuesday saying that the police action was prompted by his stand against Rousseff, and that "everybody knows" that the Workers' Party "is responsible for this assault on Brazil, for the assault on Petrobras."

Social Communications Minister Edinho Silva insisted "this has nothing to do with party politics."

"This tends to raise the political instability," he acknowledged, speaking at a news conference. "That is never positive. But these facts have to be investigated." Meanwhile, the Supreme Court could rule this week on the legality of how a special impeachment committee was formed last week in the House of Deputies. By Cunha's decree, it was created without any debate and by secret ballot, and so far its members are predominantly in favor of impeaching Rousseff.

Beckham scores 2 TDs to help Giants beat Dolphins 31-24

MIAMI GARDENS, Florida (AP) — The New York Giants forged a three-way tie atop the NFC East division by winning 31-24 at Miami on Monday, with Odell Beckham Jr.'s 84-yard touchdown reception putting the visitors ahead to stay with 11 minutes to go. New York quarterback Eli Manning completed 27 of 31 passes for 337 yards and four scores. His passer rating of 151.5 was his highest since 2009. The Giants (6-7) broke a three-game losing streak and are tied with Washington and Philadelphia for the lead in the mediocre division.

The Dolphins (5-8) were mathematically eliminated from the playoff race, extending their postseason drought to a franchise-worst seven consecutive years. The Dolphins topped 20 points for the first time since October, but couldn't keep up with Beckham, who had seven catches for 166 yards and two scores. The 100-yard

game was his sixth in a row, a Giants record.

Beckham missed one series but didn't let that slow him

when he went to the locker room due to cramping, but didn't lot that slow him down. And with the score 24-24, he took advantage of broken coverage to score the go-ahead touchdown.

Cornerback Jamar Taylor and seldom-used safety Shamiel Gary were the closest defenders, but Manning hit Beckham in stride at midfield and he sprinted to the end zone for his 12th TD this year.

Earlier, Beckham made a 45-yard reception to set up a touchdown and had a 5-yard scoring catch. The latter pass was initially ruled incomplete because Beckham was out of bounds, but the decision was overturned by a replay review that made the score 24-24. His final catch, a diving grab on third down at midfield, sealed the victory with less than two minutes left. Miami quarterback Ryan Tannehill threw for 236 yards and went deep to Kenny Stills for a 47-yard score that had put Miami ahead 24-17. But Tannehill overthrew an open Landry with his team trailing and less than five minutes to go.

Shiffrin unsure how long she will be out with injury

Over the next few weeks, Mikaela Shiffrin will slalom between rest and rehab. Usually so fast on a race course, the Olympic and world slalom champion is taking things at a much slower pace as she recov-

ers from a torn knee ligament and painful bone bruise. There's no timetable for her return to skiing, either. But there is some promising news: She won't need surgery. Just rest. Lots and lots of rest after tearing the medial collateral ligament in her right knee

during a wipeout while preparing for a giant slalom last Saturday in Are, Sweden. "I know lots of people are anxious to predict when I might return to skiing and then racing, but we just don't have any crystal balls," Shiffrin posted Tuesday on Instagram.

"I will work as hard as possible, take it week by week." Don't write off her return this season just yet. There's still a possibility the skier from Eagle-Vail, Colorado, returns to the slopes, maybe even for the World Cup Finals in March. Now that would be quite a birthday present for Shiffrin, who turns 21 on March 13.

"Frankly, we have not talked about (a return) at all yet as it simply depends on how fast it'll heal and you never really know with a bone bruise how long that will take," Shiffrin's manager, Kilian Albrecht, told The Associated Press. "You can only take it week by week

first, and then day by day. "Obviously, there is hope that she can return as the season is still pretty long. But unfortunately all of the tech races are now, which is not good as she will for sure miss a lot of the races." Shiffrin was hurt when she crashed during a free skiing session on the competition hill. Albrecht said she basically flipped over and into the net. She flew back to Colorado for more tests on her knee. Pena, who is from Havana, was met by at least 20 family members, who laughed at stories of the catcher's life in America and handed him the phone to talk to relatives who hadn't been able to make it.

The players will hold two days of youth clinics while league and Major League Baseball Players Association executives talk business with their Cuban counterparts, including former President Fidel Castro's son Tony, one of the most powerful men in Cuban baseball.

League officials said they were optimistic about sealing a deal by early next year for the Tampa Bay Rays to play two spring training games in Cuba. They also hope to make progress in creating a legal route for Cuban players to make their way to the Major League.

"It's the goal of our commissioner and our owners to ultimately negotiate with the Cuban Baseball Federation and with the cooperation of the U.S. government and the Cuban government a safe and legal path for Cuban baseball players who desire to play Major League Baseball to reach the Major Leagues," Dan Halem, MLB's top lawyer, told a press conference covered by what appeared to be virtually every state newspaper, radio and television station in Cuba.

Cuban television avoids games featuring defectors but fans watch their idols' performances on pirated recordings distributed on computer USB drivers. A group of fans who gathered in the lobby of the Nacional waiting for the Cuban stars to pass by said the defectors' return to Cuba filled them with optimism about the future of the sport in Cuba.

"I see it as a big step forward in baseball in general," said Gustavo Fernandez, a 21-year-old sculptor. "I think we'll see better facilities here, players' contracts with other leagues, relations with Ma-

jor League Baseball."

U.S. teams played spring training games in Cuba before Castro's revolution but none appeared here from March 1959 until the Baltimore Orioles faced Cuba's national team in Havana in March 1999. MLB has not returned since.

Under Fidel Castro, a passionate baseball fan who saw sports as an expression of national glory, defectors were barred from returning. Most were banished from official memory, never mentioned on Cuban television even as they made headlines on U.S. sports pages.

Castro's brother and successor, President Raul Castro, has eased the treatment of players who leave as part of a broader easing of social controls. That included the 2013 removal of a required exit permit for all Cubans, except those considered essential to the country.

Some Major League players have been allowed back on low-key trips to see family. A few others, like star infielder Yoan Moncada, have received permission from Cuban authorities to depart legally to start careers in the United States. Moncada won a \$31.5 million signing bonus with the Boston Red Sox in March.

Players sneaked off Cuba's coast by smugglers in powerboats are a different matter. Their illegal departures have been treated until now as deep betrayals of the socialist system. Many have been banned from returning for eight years, like other Cubans who leave illegally.

Peter Bjarkman, author of the upcoming book "Cuba's Baseball Defectors: The Inside Story," said that he had counted 102 national-level players who had left Cuba this year, nearly a third of all those who have departed since 1980. It's part of a broader wave of Cuban emigration sparked by the fear that the U.S. will cancel special Cold War-era privileges for Cubans as part of the broader warming with the island.

Spurs rout Jazz 118-81 to improve to stellar 21-5 start

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — San Antonio built a giant 46-point lead thanks to its smothering defense before easing up to beat Utah 118-81 on Monday and extend its stellar start to the NBA season.

The Spurs improved to 21-5 — the second-best start in franchise history — and retained their 6-1/2 game lead in the Southwest Division.

In other key games, Atlantic Division leader Toronto had its four-game winning streak ended by Indiana, the Los Angeles Clippers defeated Detroit with a 3-pointer with 12 seconds remaining in overtime, and Miami took a share of the Southeast Division lead with a win over slumping Atlanta.

San Antion has held 13 of its past 14 opponents under 100 points and the Spurs defense was again well on

Kawhi Leonard had 22 points while LaMarcus Aldridge and Tony Parker added 18 points each for the Spurs, who are 13-0 at home.

Derrick Favors led the Jazz with 16 points.

Indiana's Jordan Hill had season highs with 20 points and 13 rebounds as the Pacers beat Toronto 106-

Monta Ellis had 18 points for Indiana, which went on a 39-4 run in the first half to overturn a 21-point deficit. Kyle Lowry and DeMar DeRozan each scored 20 points for the Raptors, who had beaten the Pacers in their past five matches.

The Clippers edged Detroit 105-103 when Jamal Crawford hit a 3-pointer with 12.4 seconds left in overtime.

Blake Griffin made a pair of free throws with 38.8 seconds remaining to put the Clippers ahead 102-101 but Kentavious Caldwell-Pope tied it for the Pistons by going 1 for 2 from the foul line with 30.5 seconds left.

After Crawford's basket, the Clippers fouled Reggie Jackson with 9.3 seconds left. He made the first shot, missed the second, and teammate Andre Drummond got two chances for a tying tip-in, but missed both. Jackson missed a desperation shot at the buzzer.

Griffin finished with 34 points for the Clippers, and J.J. Redick had 24.

Jackson finished with 34 points and 11 rebounds for Detroit.

Miami led comfortably throughout in winning 100-88 at Atlanta.

Chris Bosh scored 24 points and Gerald Green had 20 for the Heat, who moved 1-1/2 games above their Southeast rival.

Kent Bazemore returned to Atlanta's starting lineup and scored a career-high 28 points.

Dallas' Chandler Parsons scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half to guide the Mavericks to a 104-94 win against Phoenix.

Parsons has been on restricted duty, coming off the bench lately, following offseason knee surgery. He had eight points during a 20-4 run to finish the third quarter, when Dallas made 13 of its last 14 shots to take a 77-58 lead.

NBA referee Kennedy tells Yahoo he is gay after slur

NEW YORK (AP) — Veteran NBA referee Bill Kennedy has told Yahoo Sports he is gay, nearly two weeks after Sacramento Kings guard Rajon Rondo directed a gay slur at him during a game.

Kennedy said he is "proud to be an NBA referee and I am proud to be a gay man," adding that he chose to come out in hopes of sending a message "that you must allow no one to make you feel ashamed of who you are." Rondo was suspended one game by the NBA for directing a derogatory and offensive term toward a referee in the Kings' game against Boston in Mexico on Dec. 3. Rondo apologized Monday and the Kings said his comments were disrespectful and offensive.

Kennedy is in his 18th season as an NBA official, having worked more than 1,050 regular-season games and five in the NBA Finals.

"I wholeheartedly support Bill's decision to live his life proudly and openly," NBA Commissioner Adam Silver said in a statement. "Throughout his 18-year career with the league, Bill has excelled as a referee because of his passion, dedication and courage. Those qualities will continue to serve him well both as a game official and as a positive influence for others. While our league has made great progress, our

work continues to ensure that everyone is treated with respect and dignity." Kennedy worked San Antonobody's business. The expression "breaking of bread", some believe, must be qualified. "Breaking of bread" signified the dividing of the bread cakes or loaves, which were used by Orientals. Sometimes "breaking of bread" is used concerning partaking of a common meal (Mk. 6: 41; Acts 27: 35) and "Breaking of bread: is also used in connection with the religious memorial called the Lord's Supper. We are talking about Christmas dinner and before we can sit down to enjoy our meal, we need to plan our menu.

For several years already we have said goodbye to the traditional holiday smoked ham. Ham, as all

There is nothing wrong nutritionally here.

Additionally, hiding in the 32 grams of protein is tryptophan an essential amino acid. Tryptophan is needed for the production of Niacin (vitamin B 3) and is the precursor of our brain chemical serotonin. Serotonin is the calming, sedatina substance essential for normal mood and sleep patterns. Now you know why you are so inclined to take a nap after a turkey dinner.

Did you notice the blood building qualities of pumpkin? Only people with blood group B cannot enjoy this delicious and nutritious vegetable. In Aruba, pumpkin soup is a specialty. If I am lucky Amy might bake me a pumpkin pie, yum! Or maybe we will make pumpkin with onions.

As in every meal at our house brown rice is the staple carbohydrate. For this meaningful occasion we will add some zest (and even more nutrition) to our brown rice with wild rice and quinoa. Brown rice can be enjoyed by all blood groups. White "polished" rice is nutritionally lifeless since the bran, which contains all of the nutrition, has been stolen to sell to pharmaceutical companies to make B complex vitamins.







British officials make arrest in VTech hacking

NEW YORK (AP) — Police in the UK say they've made an arrest in the hacking of kids' technology maker VTech, which compromised the personal information of more than 6 million children around the world.

The South East Regional Organised Crime Unit, a regional task force made up of a handful of English police departments, says a 21-year-old man was arrested on hacking-related charges Tuesday morning in Bracknell, a town about 30 miles west of London. Police seized a number of electronic items that will be examined by a cybercrime forensics unit. The hacking of Hong Kongbased VTech Holdings Ltd. compromised the profiles of 6.4 million kids around the world, along with the 4.9 million parent accounts that they were connected to.

Firms vow hate speech deleted within 24 hours

BERLIN (AP) — Facebook, Google and Twitter have agreed to delete hate speech deemed illegal in Germany within 24 hours. The move follows pressure from German authorities concerned about the increasing volume of racist abuse being posted on social networking sites. In a joint statement Tuesday, the Justice Ministry and the three companies said that it will become easier for users and anti-racism aroups to flag hate speech. 🔲

Tech Review:

Dueling digital assistants Siri, Cortana and 'OK Google'

BRANDON BAILEY AP Technology Writer SAN FRANCISCO (AP) -

Cortana's learning the neighborhood. Google's digital assistant can't tell a joke. And Siri apparently has a thing for the metric system.

Those are just a few of the things I learned after staging a face-off for the three leading digital assistants. Apple's Siri and "OK Google" - they're not big on personification at Google — are now standard on smartphones; Microsoft recently added its Cortana service to Windows 10, so it works on PCs,

Now that just about anyone can talk to their phone or computer, we wanted to see what happens when

Unsurprisingly, none of the assistants is perfect. Surprisingly, they do have distinct personalities, even if they're just deliberate artifacts of their creators.

I asked the same 10 questions of each service, using an iPhone with Siri, a Nexus phone with Android's "OK Google" and a Microsoft Surface Pro tablet with Cortana.

INFORMATION PLEASE

First up: Some basic factual questions. All three did pretty well when asked, "What's it like outside?"

Cortana earned extra points for answering with a spoken weather report. Google and Siri each showed a screen image that listed current conditions and a forecast.

All three supplied President Obama's age. When asked "What's his wife's name?" they all remembered that the question referred to the president, and correctly identified the First

Lady: Michelle Obama. Similarly, they all knew the length of the Golden Gate Bridge. But for some reason, Siri answered in meters, while Cortana and Google stuck to feet.

AT YOUR SERVICE

Next came more complicated tasks, like finding the nearest pharmacy. Google and Siri listed three within a half-mile (800 meters) of The Associated Press bureau in downtown San Francisco. But neither mentioned the drug store on the ground floor of the building where the bureau is located. Cortana did.

Ever feel like ducking work to catch an afternoon movie? (Shhh! Don't tell my editor.) All three assistants had local movie listings at their digital fingertips. But Siri led off with a new release at a theater just half a mile from the AP bureau. With a couple of taps, Siri had opened Fandango, an app that lets you buy

tickets online.

Google also connected with Fandango. Cortana had more trouble; Microsoft lags behind Apple and Google in the number of apps that work with its software, and I couldn't get the right Fandango app to load on a Surface tablet.

JUST FOR LAUGHS

Finally, a personality test. I challenged each to tell a joke. Siri had the best answer: "If I told you a joke in my language, I'd have to explain it."

Then I tried the famous line from "2001: A Space Odyssey" in which astronaut Dave Bowman tells the ship's computer: "Open the pod bay doors." Cortana knows the right answer: "I'm sorry Dave. I'm afraid I can't do that." But Siri had a better one: "Doesn't anybody knock anymore?"

To be clear, these aren't the witty rejoinders of some artificial intelligence. The creators of Siri and Cortana

thought it would be fun to pre-load each service with humorous answers to predictable questions.

Google doesn't bother with such frills. Sticking to its search-engine roots, "OK Google" answered the "2001" question by silently presenting a series of Internet links, starting with one for a YouTube clip from the movie.

Likewise, when asked about the meaning of life, Siri and Cortana were both ready with a quip. Google just recited a dry definition that only a biologist could love: "Life is the condition that distinguishes animals and plants from inorganic matter...."

FINAL SCORE

All three services are good factual questions. Siri's programmers have the best sense of humor. Google stays focused on the task at hand. And Cortana is quickly catching up to both of them.

Wall Street posts biggest gain in a week

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks posted their biggest gains in more than a week Tuesday, led by rising energy companies and banks.

The market was higher all day, building on a late gain the day before. The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose for the second day in a row, something that hadn't happened since early November. Energy stocks rose as the price of crude oil jumped 3 percent, and banks moved higher a day ahead of an expected rate increase by the Federal Reserve.

The Dow Jones industrial average added 156.41 points, or 0.9 percent, to 17,524.91. The S&P 500 increased 21.47 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,043.41. The Nasdaq composite index gained 43.13 points, or 0.9 percent, to 4,995.36.

Stocks have been on a bumpy ride ever since a six-week winning streak ended in early Novemon the economy, many expect the Fed to begin returning borrowing costs back toward normal levels with its first interest rate increase in nine years.

The government said early Tuesday that prices for a variety of goods and services rose last month, including plane tickets and medical care. Overall prices were unchanged from last year because food and energy prices are weak, but "core inflation," which leaves out energy and food, rose 0.2 percent. That's the best result in more than a year.

Michelle Girard, chief U.S. economist for RBS, said the reassuring signal on inflation should remove any last barriers to the Fed to raise rates. The inflation report gave the Fed "a green light to take action tomorrow," Girard said. The Fed's key short-term interest rate has been near zero for seven years.

Energy stocks were the top-performing sector as U.S. crude rose \$1.04, or 2.9

on Mobil had its best day since late August. Its shares jumped \$3.40, or 4.5 percent, to \$79.43. Offshore drillers Ensco added \$1.21, or 8 percent, to \$16.40 and Transocean rose 74 cents, or 5.9 percent, to \$13.38.

Natural gas continued to tumble. Its price gas slid 7.2 cents, or 3.8 percent, to \$1.822 per 1,000 cubic feet. That's the lowest price since March 1999, not adjusting for inflation. Industrial demand for natural gas has been weak, and the warm weather means most Americans haven't needed as much heat for their homes as they usually do this time of year.

In other energy trading, wholesale gasoline fell 1.1 cents, or 0.9 percent, to \$1.2444 a gallon and heating oil rose 1.9 cents, or 1.7 percent, to \$1.147 a gallon. Bank stocks climbed as investors anticipated that higher interest rates would help banks become more profitable by charging more for loans. JPMorgan

Valeant in new distribution deal with Walgreens group

AP Business Writer Valeant Pharmaceuticals has a new distribution deal with Walgreens, sending shares of the beleaguered Canadian drug company up sharply in morning trading. The company said Tuesday that the agreement will help to lower the prices of its branded prescription-based dermatological and ophthalmological products by 10 percent. The reduced pricing will apply to the wholesale list prices of the products and be phased in over the next six to nine months. The deal also covers over-thecounter products made by Valeant Pharmaceuticals International Inc. The deal will allow consumers to get Valeant's dermatology and ophthalmology products — including Luzu and Zylet — at a lower outof-pocket cost from more than 8,000 Walgreens U.S. retail pharmacy locations and participating independent retailers. Walgreens is the nation's largest drugstore chain. The 20-year deal takes effect early next year. Patient advocates, doctors and Congressional leaders have attacked Valeant and other drug companies like Turing Pharmaceuticals for aggressively increasing prices on some prescription drugs. Critics say the companies have exploited a system lacking in competition to hike prices for critically needed medicines. Valeant, in particular, has taken criticism for its practice of buying smaller drug developers, hiking drug prices and

then slashing spending on research into new drugs.

The Laval, Quebec, company drew the attention of Congress following its purchase of the life-saving heart drugs Nitropress and Isuprel. The company jacked up prices on both drugs shortly after buying them from Marathon Pharmaceuticals in February, tripling one and raising the other sixfold. Those drugs were not mentioned in Tuesday's announcement regarding price reductions, but the companies said they hope to expand their agreement "over time" to include other therapeutic areas. In October, Valeant cut ties with the mail-order pharmacy Philidor, saying that it had lost confidence in the company's operations. That followed accusations from the short seller researcher firm Citron that Valeant used Philidor to create a network of "phantom pharmacies" to steer pharmacy benefit managers toward Valeant's more expensive drugs, instead of lower-priced alternatives. Valeant had previously disclosed that it had pur-

chased an option to buy Philidor, which it used to help deliver drugs more quickly to patients through the mail. Federal prosecutors have subpoended documents

tied to Valeant's drug pricing and other practices ahead of a presidential election in which the soaring price of prescription medicines has become a top political issue and the chief health concern of many Americans.

the company stuck to that plan. Starboard and other investors were worried the Alibaba stake would be taxed at a cost of more than \$10 billion after the Internal Revenue Service declined to auarantee it would qualify for an exemption.

Yahoo Inc. didn't immediately respond to requests for comment about the critiques from SpringOwl and Canyon Capital.

Now that two more shareholders expressing their dismay with Yahoo's direction, Mayer's fate could be tied to a cost-cutting reorganization that she has been working on for the past two months. Mayer, who is on a brief maternity leave after giving birth to twins last week, says the overhaul will jettison Yahoo's least profitable products — a shake-up that could lay off a large number of workers. The details of the reorganization are supposed to be announced next month when the Sunnyvale, California, company releases its fourth-quarter earnings. In its Dec. 11 letter to Yahoo's board, Canyon Capital indicated that Mayer already has been given too much time to turn things around.

"We do not understand the board's continued support of the company's senior management team, given its track record," Canyon Capital wrote.

UK astronaut Tim Peake puts space back on agenda in Britain

LONDON (AP) — Britain has decided to boldly go where others have gone before.

More than half a century after Yuri Gagarin became the first human in orbit, the U.K. is experiencing a surge of space mania thanks to its first official astronaut a soft-spoken pilot named Tim who will spend some of his six-month stint on the International Space Station attempting to brew a decent cup of tea in zero aravity.

Millions around the country paused in front of TVs and computer screens Tuesday to watch a Russian Soyuz spacecraft carrying Maj. Tim Peake and two other astronauts — Timothy Kopra of the United States and Yuri Malenchenko of Russia blast off from Kazakhstan's Baikonur Cosmodrome. The Soyuz spacecraft moored smoothly at 8:33 p.m. Moscow time (1733 GMT) at the International Space Station

ter lifting off from Baikonur launch pad in Kazakhstan. Peake, a 43-year-old former army helicopter pilot, is not the first Briton in space.

But Peake is Britain's first publicly funded British astronaut and the first Briton to visit the International Space Station. The spacecraft docked successfully at the space station roughly six hours after liftoff.

For decades, cost-conscious British governments declined to invest in human space flight, confining the U.K.'s space contribution to robotic missions.

"The U.K. has taken an understandably hard economic view of human space flight over the years and asked itself what it might be worth," said Kevin Fong, an expert in space medicine who will explore how to survive in space in this year's Royal Institution Christmas science lectures. "The answer to that question is quite a lot, actually." He said Peake's voyage "has already inspired schoolchildren, and will go on to do so. But there's a wider importance in showing that Britain is not done exploring yet."

The government has been raising Britain's space aspirations for several years. In 2010 it set up the U.K. Space Agency, which has a relatively modest budget of about 320 million pounds (\$485 million) a year.

This week the Conservative government announced Britain's first National Space Policy, which aims to capture 10 percent of the global space industry and create 100,000 high-tech jobs — though it's unclear how these goals will be funded. Peake's voyage helped millions of Britons rediscover an excited interest in outer space.

One British reporter at a pre-launch press conference told Peake that "you will be taking the pride and excitement of everybody back home, so much so that you probably won't need any fuel to get into orbit."

As Peake psyched himself for liftoff Tuesday by listening to tracks by Queen, U2 and Coldplay, the BBC offered wall-to-wall TV coverage, complete with good-luck messages from Sting, Prime Minister David Cameron and "Doctor Who" star Peter Capaldi. At London's Science Museum, hundreds of students cheered wildly as the rocket lifted off.

And in a distinctly British contribution to science, he will try out a new tea-making process that lets him remove the teabag from the drink pouches used in zero gravity.

"That way," Peake told students during a questionand-answer session last month, "I can spend as long as I like drinking my tea and it won't get stewed, and hopefully it won't get cold either."

Howard Stern announces 5-year deal with Sirius XM

NEW YORK (AP) — Howard Stern has signed a third fiveyear deal to keep his radio show at SiriusXM and will be expanding into video, allowing fans to see him do the show and have access to 30 years of his career highlights. Once radio's ultimate shock jock, Stern at 61 has grown mellower

and his show's signature is becoming its in-depth interviews with celebrities like Bill Murray, Gwyneth Paltrow, Neil Young, Bradley Cooper, Madonna, Chris Rock and others. Terms were not disclosed, but since it includes a 12-year provision giving the company control of Stern's library, it is likely well north of the \$500 million deal Stern

signed when he moved to satellite radio in 2006. Sirius is the house Stern built: a money-losing venture with 600,000 subscribers when he signed, it merged with competitor XM in 2008 and now has 29 million subscribers and annual revenue of \$4.5 billion, with more than \$1 billion in profits. Stern, on his show Tuesday, described the deal as a move

into the future. "You'll be able to get everything you want in audio and video and then some," he said, as the music to "Star Trek" played in the background. More specific plans for Stern's video will be announced later. Stern works on his own channel Monday through Thursday from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m., although some weeks he works three

days. He has two satellite channels on Sirius. Stern increased his public profile as a judge on NBC's summertime show, "America's Got Talent," but said in June that he was stopping that. Shares of SiriusXM Holdings Inc. rose 12 cents, or 3 percent, to \$4.12 in morning trading. They are up almost 18 percent so far this year.

Sting regales Carnegie Hall crowd with old favorites

NEW YORK (AP) — They say it's practice, practice, practice that gets you to Carnegie Hall. But for Sting, it was a chance encounter with Britain's Queen Mother when he was 10 years old that gave him the ambition and drive he needed to reach that hallowed stage.

The rocker told the story of that fateful encounter Monday night during an ebullient show — at once intimate and grand — that marked his first solo headline gig at the venerable New York venue, despite his having performed many times there. He was accompanied by the powerful Orchestra of St. Luke's, with many of his old classics arranged by conductor Rob Mathes.

The 64-year-old singer arrived to a standing ovation, and immediately began with "Englishman in New York," aptly enough, with the crowd singing along to the lyric, "Be yourself no matter what they say."

"I sincerely hope that THIS Englishman in New York has earned a place here," he said, to cheers.

He performed many of his hits from his Police years and then from his solo career, and included a couple songs from his recent Broadway show, "The Last Ship." He also paid tribute to Frank Sinatra in his centennial year, performing "In the Wee Small Hours of the Morning" along with trumpeter Chris Botti. He recounted how Sinatra had addressed an autograph to him — the only autograph he possesses as "the new blue eyes."

"Except my eyes are green," Sting quipped. The rocker prefaced the

soulful title song from "The Last Ship" — his debut as a Broadway composer, which closed in January after a brief run — with the anecdote about the Queen Mother, who came to his hometown more than a half-century ago to christen a ship, and rode down his very own street "in a giant Rolls Royce" as he waved a Union Jack,



The Affair,' 'Mad Men' and 'Frontline' Among Year's 10 Best

NEW YORK (AP) — Sure, 10 is an arbitrary number. If we were to add an 11th show, it might very well be HBO's sublimely shrewd comedy "Silicon Valley," or ABC's unbridled melodrama "Scandal," or Fox's noir thriller "Gotham." It

Perhaps the best but leastcelebrated drama on the air, it marked a third season of crafty storytelling as it continued to explore the complex, death-defying lives of two Soviet KGB officers posing as an American married couple during the Cold War. The tangled storylines remained intrigu— "Fargo" (FX). A second season of doing the impossible — reimagining the 1996 film classic — this cycle has, if anything, improved on Season 1 with its completely new tale and slate of characters. Once again, it's a bizarre melange of heartland propriety, steely violence and

especially in plotting its farewell to glam gumshoe Kalinda (Archie Panjabi). But so far in Season 7, it's back in the swing. Adding Jeffrey Dean Morgan as its new investigator was a masterstroke. And the newly rejiggered storylines are as smart, snarled and zesty as ever. And funny!

- "Mad Men" (AMC). For anyone who was there, the '60s felt all-inclusive yet passed in a flash. Same for "Mad Men," whose saga began at the dawn of the '60s and closed out that decade when its final season aired last spring. Surprisingly, nearly everyone involved lived happily ever after, including the wily but often self-destructive ad man Don Draper (played by series star Jon Hamm). Most viewers were happy, too, with its slyly appropriate conclusion, but also sad to bid farewell to a TV masterpiece.

— "Narcos" (Netflix). This serialized, true-to-life thriller follows the exploits of Columbian drug kingpin Pablo Escobar and the Medellin Cartel, as well as the U.S. drug agents Escobar repeatedly outwits. Shot in Colombia and starring Brazilian actor Wagner Moura, it is a riveting portrait of evil, power and supreme craftiness. Happily for viewers, there's more evil to come from Escobar, with "Narcos" renewed for a second season. Until then, a warning: One taste of this first season could lead to a 10-episode binge.

— "Sense8" (Netflix). A fluid narrative takes viewers to eight cities where eight characters are somehow linked by an ability to share thoughts, feelings and visions they can't explain to themselves or anyone else. Viewers are invited to embark on this enchanting sci-fi thrill ride from the Wachowskis ("The Matrix"). Daryl Hannah and Naveen Andrews ("Lost") join a sprawling cast of mostly new faces in settings that range from Chicago to Seoul, from Mexico City to Mumbai. The visuals are dazzling, the soundtrack score is haunting, and the interlocking storylines may tax your understanding — that is, until you submit. After that, if you hear thunder on a bright, sunny day (as does one of the characters), no worries. Somewhere, it's storming and you might be there soon.

— "The Affair" (Showtime). A New York novelist has an affair and creates havoc for two families — his own and his lover's. The second season of this heated drama has been even better than the first, as the rewards of his infidelity disintegrate and the consequences mount. Meanwhile, quietly among its splendid cast, Maura Tierney as the wronged wife continues to prove herself as one of the finest actresses around.

— "The Americans" (FX).

— "Better Call Saul" (AMC). — "Frontline" (PBS). Airing

Somehow immune to the pressures and failings that compromise so much of TV public affairs, it continued its long reign enlightening the public.

— "The Good Wife" (CBS). This legal drama had a few false moments last spring, Alan Cumming's fitful campaign strategist scores laughs in his every scene and, thanks to the fullness of all the characters, no one is immune from daffy moments. As it has been all along, "The Good Wife" remains a sophisticated dra-

ma full of human comedy.

— "Last Week Tonight with John Oliver" (HBO). Religion, chicken, net neutrality, voting rights for Guam, the injustice of bail— they're all the same to Oliver. In each weekly sermonette he sheds light on absurdities and scandals no one else is likely to be exposing, or, if they are, not with his thoroughness and/or wicked sense of humor. "Last Week," every week, is an indispensable half-hour.
