What Makes a Good Process Man? Survey Will Seek to Find Out

What kind of man makes the best Process Department employee? Right now, it's pretty hard to answer that question in any scientific Are Revised way. Even men who have worked for years in the Process Department might have difficulty telling you just what the characteristics are of Two Regular Classes Now a good Process employee.

Within a few months, though, we may be able to answer that quest-

ion. Beginning this month, a study will be made in the Process Department to find out the characteristics of Process employees. Why do some

people like Process work and others not? Why do some people succeed at it while others fail? Those are some of the questions the study hopes to answer.

The study, of course, is just another instance of the Company's using the latest scientific aids to determine what type of person is best suited for a particular type of work. Such studies have already been carried on with supervisors throughout the refinery, with men from the M&C crafts, and in the selection of Vocational Training School students.

Employee Benefits Expanded to Include Permanent Disability

A major addition to the Company's various employee benefit plans will take place May 1. At that time, increased disability benefits will go a hanja beneficionan pa enfermedad into effect for staff and regular y cu ta totalmente y permanentemen-

The Disability Benefit Plan has cionan aki ta aumentá na e suma lobeen set up to include the former sickness and accident benefit provisions, as well as permanent disability benefits for employees with 15 years service or more. At the same pa sigui traha. time, minor changes go into effect in sickness and accident benefits.

Permanent disability benefits apply to employees under 60, with 15 or more years of service, who have received maximum sickness benefits and who are totally and permanently disabled. These benefits will amount to the sum that the employee has already acquired toward annuity payments at the age of 60. Payments may continue for the life of the employee, provided he remains unable to work.

Work. Under the sickness and accident langes, an employee becomes clisichanges, an employee becomes eligible for maximum benefits at the end of 10 years service, rather than after

11 years.

Beginning last week, orientation sessions started where provisions of the Disability Benefit Plan are being explained to supervisors. Copies of the Plan will be handed out to all best entry from the NWI. employees before May 1. Also handed out will be a summary of the three types of disability benefits: sickness, accident, and permanent disability.

Labor Rates **And Titles**

Replace Former Three

Mr. Hasler's assignment with Lago is another instance of the popular trend of industry leaning heavily on universities for scientific help in solving industrial problems. He is in Aruba for a year's assignment as a psychology intern; he is working on his doctor's degree in industrial psychology at New York University. The work he accomplishes here he plans to incorporate into his doctor's thesis.

Hasler will use methods to gather the material he is seeking. At first, he will spend time around a particular unit just talking to people and observing. These talks will give him ideas as to what makes a successful Process worker. Some employees will be asked to fill out questionnaires telling what they think about Process work; these questionnaires will not be signed. Based on the information he gathers, Mr. Hasler will see if he can develop a method which will help determine if a man will make a good Process worker before he is assigned to the Process Department.

This study will have no effect on the men presently doing Process work; it won't help them, and it won't hurt them. It will help other people in the future, though. By finding out why some people succeed in Process work and others don't, the Company may possibly have a scientific basis for predicting whether or not a person will be a good Process employee. And the potential Process worker will know whether he will be qualified for or satisfied doing Process work. An employee who is able to do his work well is most likely to be happy in it. Company and employee have a common interest in making certain the right man is in the right job, so his talents can be used for their mutual benefit.



Flying Club Hunts For Overdue Ship

Members of the Aruba Flying Club responded promptly this month to a Government request for assistance in locating an 18-foot single masted schooner that was overdue between Curação and Aruba. Despite an intensive search of a wide area, how-ever, no trace was found of the ship or of the two men aboard.

The schooner, the Stella-Maris C-49, had evidently run into trouble in the unusually heavy seas of April 10 and 11. When it became known that the ship was overdue, the Attorney General's office in Curação asked the Flying Club to start a search.

A search was immediately organized by Club members, and four planes went out. The large area covered by around Aruba, between here and the Paraguana Peninsula, along the eastern coastline of the Paraguana Peninsula, and the waters between Aruba and the Colombian coast, as well as the Colombian coastline it-self. Although a large number of ships were sighted during the search, no trace was found of the missing schooner.






