## Safety Booklets, Pencils Given To Mark "Lago's Best Year"

Special safety talks for employees all through the refinery July 7 provided the occasion to turn employee thoughts back to last year's notable safety performance. Serving as memory-joggers were two items distributed to every man and woman in the plant: a copy of the 1957 safety annual report, and a shiny mechanical pencil, stamped with the proud claim, "Lago's Best Safety Year—1957".

Supervisors passed out the items to employees at small safety talks throughout the day, and congratulated them on the safe performance of duties which last year won for Lago no less than three awards.

The booklet, done in an attractive green and white design, is a summary of the year's happenings in safety, and contains a statistical breakdown of the safety successes. It describes the long accident-free record of 6,520,829 consecutive man-hours, the establishment of the Off-The-Job Safety Study Group to reduce employee injuries outside the gates, and the traffic safety campaign carried on under the BTAOTA slogan. Showa were the places in the plant where most of the accidents of the year took place, the parts of the

body most injured, and the primary causes of accidents.

In their talks most supervisors stressed that these statistics were included in the annual report to serve as reminder of the sore spots, the places where extra care was needed to avoid injury.

The theme of the book matched the slogan on the pencil: "Lago's

Best Safety Year". In 1957 there were eight disabling injuries, a new record; the injury frequency rate was 0.61, also a new company record, and head and shoulders above the next best record for refineries of comparable size.

Three awards from safety associations came to the company. One was an award for finishing first in the National Safety Council contest, that is, for having the best record of all large refineries; a second award, also from the NSC, came to us for improving our best company performance, and the third was from the Consejo Inter-Americano de Seguridad for having the best safety record of Latin and South American refineries. This group is the South American equivalent of the U. S. National Safety Council.

A utilitarian feature of the 1957 book was a large removable page showing 64 of the international traffic and road signs in use in Aruba.

In a Safety Newsletter to all employees the Safety Division, which in collaboration with the Public Re-

lations Department produced the book, said that the 1957 safety story was "a good story to be told, and retold by you..." "The safety annual and the pencil are reminders that safety is real and very personal. It is the difference between your physical welfare and painful injury... The year of 1957 proved that Lago employees can work safely. What happens this year, the next and the one after that depends solely on how safely you work."

## College Training Program Enrolls 23

Twenty-three college students whose parents reside in Aruba are enrolled in Lago's summer college training program. Under this plan, students spend approximately two months gaining, so far as practicable, experience in their chosen fields of study. The only eligibility requirements are first, a completed year of college, and second, parents residing in Aruba. This is the fourth summer Lago has offered the program.

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## At The Halfway Mark

At midnight June 30, the first half of 1958 slipped quietly into the past, six months irrevocably past; six months to come. At the midpoint of this eventful year it is perhaps profitable to take a backward look at the past's achievements and missed opportunities and to reflect on what is to come. Businesses are run in such a fashion: correcting the mistakes of the past, planning on the future.

So it should be in the field of personal safety. There are hundreds of employees who, in the first half of the year, came to some sort of grief in the off-the-job accidents. The thing to be gained by their misfortune is an increased awareness of the hazards found in daily life, in working, playing, driving.

A study of some sobering statistics will indicate just how much room this leaves for improvement in the six months of 1958 yet to come. Off the job in June there were 154 minor injuries and 25 injuries serious enough to cause time lost from the job. This last group of injuries actually resulted in 286 days lost. Over the entire first half of the year these figures zoomed: 90 disabling injuries, 528 minor injuries, 1438 days lost from work. There were also three deaths.

Comparing these statistics of off-the-job accidents with the company safety figures leaves unanswered a big question: "why are men so safe inside the gates and not outside?" For in all of last year, only eight men suffered disabling injuries.

Perhaps each employee can find the answer to the question in his own heart as he looks back and looks forward at this midpoint of 1958. For that is where the answer lies.

# Aug. 16 Commissary ID Cards Deadline Set

The General Services Department, engaged in the enormous task of bringing up to date the lists of eligible shoppers in Lago Commissary, has announced that application blanks for the new identification cards are now available only at the Commissary.

At the same time, Aug. 16 was set as the deadline for use of the current cards for shopping. Beyond that date only new identification cards will be valid in the Commissary. Approximately two weeks are required to process a completed application, photograph the applicant and prepare the completed card. Customers will pick up the new cards at the Lago Police Department.

Two types of cards will be issued. Pink cards will go to all permanent users of the Commissary, and will be valid until 1959 cards will be issued. Users of the pink cards are wives of employees or annuitants, and their children between 15 and 19. The second group is composed of "special category" shoppers, persons not falling under the other classifications, and whose applications must be approved by the General Services Department. Their cards will be yellow and will be valid for only three months from the date of issue.

Any cards which have been mutilated or tampered with will be picked up and replaced without charge. However, between the pick-up time and the issuing of the new card the person losing the card will not be permitted to shop in the commissary.

Up to the present time wives and children have been photographed in the Commissary itself, using their current cards as identification, and having their names checked for validity against a master list of employee dependents. Heretofore only shoppers other than wives and children had to file formal applications. This is now changed, and anyone seeking a new card must submit the application. The blanks, written in English and Papiamentu, are available in the Commissary.

### Eligibility

In order to obtain Commissary shopping privileges, a person must fulfill one of the following conditions:

- 1) be a staff or regular employee currently on the company payroll;
- 2) be an ex-staff or regular employee receiving normal, special or disability retirement income;
- 3) be the legal husband or wife of a staff or regular employee, or the legal husband or wife of an ex-employee receiving normal, special or disability retirement income;
- 4) be an unmarried, legally acknowledged child of an employee or ex-employee as defined above, and be between the ages of 15 and 19;
- 5) Special or exceptional cases

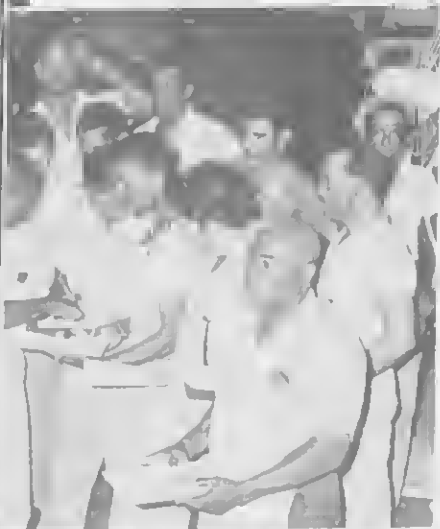

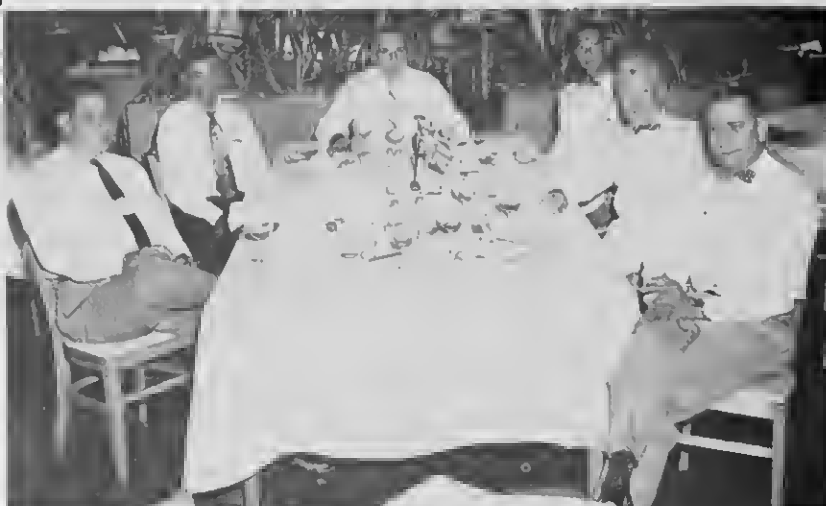

# Hundreds Add Service Time Under New Contract Article

The number of service buttons and watches will increase sharply as effects of Article 19 of the Lago-LEC contract are felt. Under the terms of this section of the new working agreement, more than 500 employees picked up service time which had heretofore been non-creditable. The agreement allows employees to connect periods of broken service.

Service accumulated under this article applies to all company benefits except retirement income. Affected are vacation accrual, sickness and accident benefit schedule's, layoff allowances, service emblems and watch awards, service-in-grade increments and seniority. Income for retirement is still calculated under the terms of the Lago Retirement Plan, and these are unchanged by Article 19.

Service time was accumulated by 563 men, of whom 283 work in the Mechanical Department. The Process Department had the next highest

number, 133, and the remainder are scattered through the other departments. The new credited service arrangement made three employees eligible for 25-year service watches, 220 can now sport 10-year emblems, and 34 will receive 20-year buttons. One man finds himself in the 30-year class with the added service.

The average gain among the 563 employees was just short of four years. The most service picked up belonged to a Mechanical Department employee who added 22 years, nine months and 24 days to his Lago career.

Areas in which improvement may result include vacation accrual, disability benefit schedule, service emblems, watch awards, service-in-grade increments and lay-off allowance.

# Construction Starts in Japan On World's Biggest Tanker

The keel for what will be the biggest ship afloat has been laid in a Japanese shipyard, according to a recent announcement in the New York Times. Owned and constructed by interests of D. K. Ludwig, the tanker, as yet un-named, will be 103,000 dead-weight tons, dwarfing some 85,000 monsters already at sea.

The Kure Shipyards, formerly a Japanese Imperial Navy Yard, is leased by the Japanese to National Bulk Carriers, Inc., which in turn is building the vessel for Universe Tank Ships. Both companies are owned by Ludwig.

Scheduled for completion next February, the ship will be 935 feet long, 135 feet wide, and from bottom to main deck will measure 67 1/2 feet. She will be powered by a 27,500 horsepower turbine engine, enough to establish a cruising speed of almost 15 knots, and a maximum of 17 knots. The cost of this vast ship is roughly \$15 million. Most of the steel and machinery used in it will come from Japan.

The shipyard, with a large and skilled labor force, last year built 11 percent of all tonnage constructed in Japan. During the war the 72,000-ton battleship "Yamato" was built there.

This vast ship, which was put into service only in the last few months of the war, never got a chance to prove her builders' hopes and claims. She was sunk off Okinawa by American aircraft.

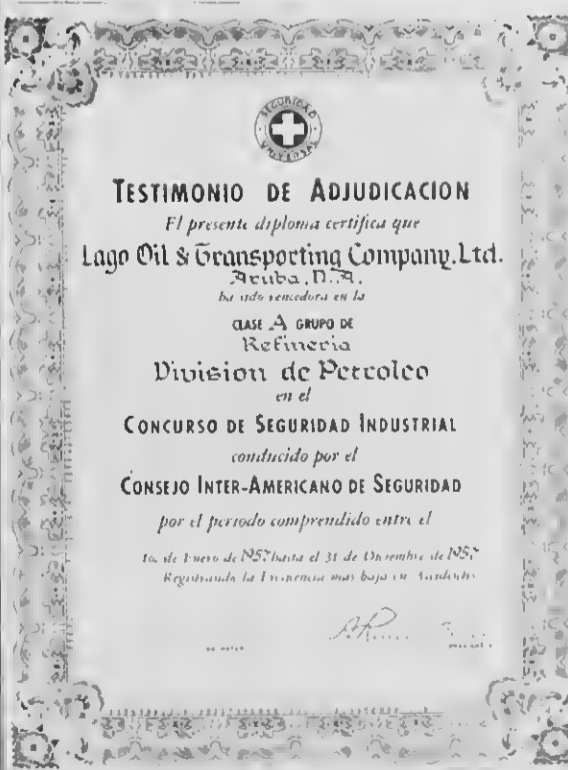
