Whether celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other private occasion, gather with friends and family on the beach at Atardi and feel the warmth of the sand between your toes.

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
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

Friendship turned into romance, but the couple kept it under the radar for several months before finally letting the family and coworkers in on their secret. "It got more and more difficult as we started to fall in love and couldn't stop flirting with each other," teased Claudia.

When the couple became engaged, they faced a dilemma: "Initially, we expected to have our wedding in Italy, as it is a tradition to get married in the town my family is from, but the idea of a Caribbean wedding had always been a dream of ours," Claudia explained.

The couple had vacationed in Aruba before. "It's our happy place. We love Aruba for its landscapessun, sea, and nature everywhere," said the bride. They hired wedding planners Maryla Colandrea and Giuseppe Scotto of Art of Perfection, a company that specializes in luxury weddings abroad, to coordinate their destination wedding-whether it be Aruba or Italy. "Since they, too, are from Italy, it was easy to communicate our needs to maintain traditions and to speak Italian when needed with guests," the couple shared. The wedding planners suggested Aruba, specifically Renaissance Island, a small private island just a short boat ride away from the Aruban mainland. The couple felt complete confidence in their wedding planners, and went ahead and secured the venue, sight unseen. "This made the day of the wedding even more exciting for us-it was not only a surprise for our guests, but an unbelievable one for us as well!"

### The Décor

The couple went for a whimsical island-chic atmosphere, wanting the ambiance to feel natural but also luxurious. The couple chose to utilize a lot of greenery matched with a variety of white flowers, accented with touches of gold and silver. "The ceremony had an unbelievable arch that overlooked the water. This palm-leaf arch, together with bamboo chairs, created the island feel we were looking for. With the privacy of the beach, the intimacy of the atmosphere, and the flamingos walking around as we said our vows at sunset, it was like being in a deserted paradise, and that was the feeling we wanted."

The reception was decorated with string lights, candlelight, and lanterns everywhere. "It was truly a whimsical paradise. The rustic feel of the white-

washed furniture combined with the elegance of the spectacular floral table garlands really brought our idea to life."

### The Attire

Claudia has a background in fashion, formerly working for Kleinfelds, which was a natural choice for the bride when it came to shopping for her gown. "I said 'yes' to a Maison Signore gown with an illusion back and delicate lace detailing," informed the bride. She paired it with Stuart Weitzman wedding shoes. The groom wore Hugo Boss attire and accessories.

### The Reception

The couple infused many layers into their reception. A steelpan musician greeted guests for the cocktail hour gathering, where guests enjoyed sushi, pulled pork, lamb chops, lump crab cocktail, lobster fritters with truffle mayo, a ceviche bar, and a variety of other hors d'oeuvres.

A plated dinner—with each place setting marked by a palm leaf with personalized calligraphy—followed, featuring a seafood risotto action station, pan-fried sea bass, and prime rib. A dessert station included a variety of mini Italian pastries. "Coming from a restaurant background, we are a tough crowd to please, but overall the food was tasty," informed the couple.

The couple combined musicians from Italy, New York, and Aruba to form their band, which played all their favorite old and new songs, with Kiel—who is a musician/singer—joining in. The couple also incorporated local touches like hand-rolled cigars and a troupe of Carnaval dancers. The couple made sure the guests stayed well-nourished for the long night of dancing, offering a late-night snack of cheeseburger sliders and coconut shrimp kebabs.



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
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## Saving Lives & Sharing a Life Together

#### The Décor



# The rhythm is contagious!

ack in 2014, *Rolling Stone* had them on the "10 Artists You Need to Know" list. Today, many people in Europe know them, thanks to their dedication to hitting the road and touring throughout Europe. If you don't know them, let me make some introductions: meet Kuenta i Tambu, aka KiT, a band with a sound like no other.

This eclectic, colorful group of musicians includes founder, leader, and frontman Roël Calister (Curacao), lead vocalist Diamanta von Lieshdek (Aruba), percussionists Daniel Camacho (Aruba)

and Yariv Vroom (Suriname), and deejay Vijay Weemhoff (the Netherlands).

This past December, Kuenta i Tambu took a break from their European tour for pit stops in Aruba and Curacao to refuel on some homegrown Caribbean vibes, reconnect with family and friends, and introduce their newest CD, *RAIS* ("roots" in Papiamento, the creole language of Curacao, Aruba, and Bonaire), during several live shows. For some of Aruba's younger generation, this was their first exposure not only to Kuenta i Tambu, but also to





the flavors of traditional Afro Caribbean music and the rhythms of tambú drums, which is exactly what Roël's original mission was when forming the band—to share the Afro Caribbean culture and musical roots of Curacao.

Kuenta i Tambu means "words and drums" in Papiamento, but this band's intoxicating beat-driven music goes beyond words and drums to deliver a surprising balanced symphony of percussion, singing, chanting, and samples of electronic dance. "Tambú is not just the name of the drum, it's the way you play the drums, the emotions and energy coming off you and the drums, the feeling people get listening to the music—it's a culture all its own," explains Roël. "And it's also the singing, the chanting, the foot stomping, and clapping and dancing—it's what we grew up with and a part of who we are. We took that and crossed it with everything we have learned to love in Europe—the electronic, four-on-the-floor (a pattern of rhythm common in disco), and different types of genres—and fused that into one big explosion," adds Diamanta.


But to truly experience Kuenta i Tambu, you have to see them live. I dare you to even think about



sitting this one out—the energy is contagious. "When we share our music, we share it with everything we have," says Diamanta. The audience is on their feet, jumping, swaying, and winin'. Roël and Diamanta explain, "The most important thing in our show is that the audience is never the audience; the audience is actually part of the show, part of the band, and that's how we make them feel. We make them sing along with us, clap, dance. Without the energy they give us, there is no Kuenta i Tambu!"




met artist Vanessa Paulina 16 years ago. I saw some of her paintings on display at the clubhouse of Tierra del Sol Resort & Golf. I could not take my eyes off of one of her paintings, which depicted a cherubic Caribbean boy. He had this unmistakable twinkle in his eyes that pulled me in. The artist was as intriguing as her paintings—we had an instant connection, and she was the subject of the first article I ever wrote about an artist and has remained a good friend ever since.

About ten years ago, I decided to venture into children's fiction. The island of Aruba would be the setting, and a mystical sea turtle named Streya and two local children would be my main characters. Who better to depict the spirit of two beautiful Aruban children than Vanessa? She loved the idea and waited patiently for me to finish my rough draft so she could bring my characters to life on canvas.

Lots of patience was required. I started, stopped, scrapped it all, and started over again so many times. I am seasoned in producing news articles and magazine features by the dozen on a weekly basis, but this was a completely different ball game. One would think that writing a children's book would be easy-it's not like I have to write an 80,000-plus-word novel. But when writing for children, word count is the challenge. Many publishers prefer picture books for children to be under 1,500 words. I would set the project aside again and again, frustrated that I could not tell the story the way I wanted to. One day, I went back to some of the books my kids loved growing up-specifically the masterfully illustrated and award-






winning books *The Polar Express* and *Jumanji* by Chris Van Allsburg. My kids could not get enough of these books, and we read and re-read them many times—all 3,000-plus words! Maybe publishers, in general, are not giving our youth enough credit when it comes to reading and their attention spans; maybe they're not placing enough importance on the introduction of new and sometimes challenging words to help children grow their vocabulary. I know from my own experience and the incredible bonding we had as a family reading books—if it's a good story, they will stay tuned in.

About a year ago, I was finally able to read my rough draft to Vanessa. When she had tears in her eyes and said, "I can't wait to paint your words," I knew we were on the right track as a team!

Vanessa went to the drawing board and presented me with her vision of the characters in the book—she nailed it! Next, we had to decide on all the details: hairstyles, clothing choices, and colors. We drove all through Mangel Halto and Savaneta, picking certain aspects of the landscape and various wooden docks and local fishing boats to use as inspiration for the settings in the book. Vanessa then worked on the final images to match the story from page to page. Once it was completed, I didn't want to wait the months, or even years, that it takes to have a major publishing house possibly accept a book. Self-publishing was the way we wanted to go.


