#### Aruba Butterfly Farm

Located in Palm Beach, the Aruba Butterfly Farm invites the whole family to step within its mesh enclosure to observe hundreds of butterflies representing many different species from around the globe as they flit and flutter among the flowering plants. Dedicated tour guides provide engaging, kidfriendly explanations of butterfly habits and the stages of metamorphosis, with each stage clearly on display within the farm. Indeed, a visit to the farm is a great way to "sneak" an educational experience into your family vacation.

Kids will enjoy exploring all the nooks and crannies within the farm, searching for the most beautiful butterfly, while Mom and Dad will enjoy the little ponds and trickling fountains that enhance the sense of tranquility within this tropical butterfly haven. 






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

#### Aruba Ostrich Farm

Aruba's desert landscape and arid climate provide the ideal conditions for the flock of ostriches and emus residing at the Aruba Ostrich Farm. Tours allow guests to interact with these two very unique bird species while learning about their natural behaviors and survival instincts from enthusiastic guides. Kids will get the biggest kick out of hand-feeding the ostriches, which are far from shy! The tour concludes with a visit to the incubator, hatchery, and the special pens for young ostriches and emus.

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#### Arikok National Park

Sprawled across roughly 20% of Aruba's land area, Arikok National Park is dedicated to the preservation of Aruba's nature and its cultural heritage. The park is home to a wide variety of native flora and fauna while promising substantial geological diversity and traces of Aruba's Amerindian and agricultural past. Clearly, there's much for the whole family to explore here! Start your day in the park at the Visitor's Center to peruse the various educational displays and pick up your park map upon paying the entrance fee. The map clearly identifies the many walking and biking trails, recreational areas, historical and geological sites, caves, and other attractions within the park. Highlights include:

Cunucu Arikok: This partially restored Aruban farmstead provides a glimpse of Aruba's agricultural past, featuring a traditional adobe house, called a *cas di torto*. It's the main attraction along the Cunucu Arikok Trail, an ideal walking trail for children.

Hofi Shon Shoco: Located next to the Visitor's Center, Hofi Shon Shoco is a garden of sorts featuring local plants and fruiting trees. Sit by the traditional adobe house and enjoy the many birds that are attracted by the fruit trees.

**Caves:** Guadirikiri Cave is famous for the natural light that pours in through openings in the cave roof, while Fontein Cave is well known for the Amerindian drawings decorating the walls and ceilings.

**Beaches:** Boca Prins is a secluded beach within the park that harbors stunning sand dunes, which are constantly being reshaped by powerful winds. Close by, the ocean carved twin coves out of a coastal bluff and filled them with soft sand to create Dos Playa, a favorite beach for surfing, sunbathing, and picnicking. (Swimming is not recommended at either of these beaches due to strong undertows.)

trip to Aruba's "Sunrise City," San Nicolas, offers culture seekers a variety of museum experiences showcasing various aspects of the island's heritage. Stroll the streets of this historic town for an up-close perspective of Aruba beyond the tourist-driven areas.

We encourage you to make a morning, afternoon, or entire day out of a visit to our southern side of the island. After touring the museums, journey down to Boca Grandi, Baby Beach, and Rodger's Beach to experience more of the island's scenic beaches; try refreshing coconut water right out of the shell at the roadside stand in Seroe Colorado (on the way to Rodger's Beach and Baby Beach); and enjoy local and regional cuisine at spots like O'Niel Caribbean Kitchen (local and Jamaican), Pueblito Paisa (Colombian), and Kamini's Kitchen (Surinamese). You can also shop for local crafts and artwork at Cosecha, where all products have the official national seal of local craftsmanship.

### Exploring Aruba's Museum of Industry

For the past few decades, the island's most important industry has been tourism. What started as locals graciously welcoming island guests to stay with them in their own homes has evolved into a full-blown industry that serves as Aruba's bread and butter. In fact, in terms of its reliance on tourism to power its economy, Aruba ranks second of all islands in the world.

Before tourism grew to its prominence here, islanders revealed their versatility by engaging in a number of industries, including gold mining, aloe cultivation, phosphate mining, and oil refining. The Museum of Industry, housed in the iconic and historic San Nicolas Water Tower, details the significance of these industries and their economic, social, and cultural impact on Aruba through artifacts, memorabilia, and personal accounts.

Be sure to check out the stairwell exhibit called Cultural Mosaic, which highlights the different cultures that have come together to power the various industries on the island. It's these cultures that have created the island's beautiful, multi-textured, multicultural social fabric that exists today.

The museum, which opened in March of 2013 in a temporary location near the San Nicolas Bus Terminal, now houses the collections of memorabilia in its new permanent location within the walls of the historic Nicolaas Store building.

Local families have donated precious memorabilia and antiques passed down through generations that represent the daily life of a bygone era—from antique record players, sewing machines, and telephones to vintage clothing, barber chairs, and even toilets! Much of the treasured memorabilia was curated by the Odor family, whose devotion to the Museo di Antiguidad created the foundation for the Community Museum.

The Carnival Euphoria Exhibition introduces the history, heritage, and cultural and social impact of Aruba's months-long Carnival season while highlighting some of the past and present personalities and organizations that have contributed to the popular celebration on our island.

The exhibit also features images from *Bacchanal*, a local magazine that is produced annually and dedicated to documenting and sharing this special season, as well as costumes and headpieces donated by locals from past Carnivals.











The Carnival Euphoria Exhibition also houses a creative space where various workshops on costume decoration, Carnival makeup application, and the like were held for the community throughout the 2019 Carnival season.

Although the exhibition is temporary, it will form the foundation for a permanent museum that will showcase more costumes, as well as road pieces and various memorabilia from the past 65 years of Aruba's Carnival.

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

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# with KUKOO

Let you have been to Aruba, you have more than likely spent a night or two raising heck and shaking your maracas on the island's original party on wheels—or at the least, you have seen the bright red bus with colorful artwork and graffiti ramble past. Ever since the first bus—a 1957 Chevy school bus—hit the road back in 1997, the Kukoo Kunuku has become a part of Aruba's lexicon of fun. The original Kukoo Kunuku tour, still popular today, is the Dinner & Nightlife Tour, and the Pub Crawl Tour was added a few years ago. Both tours are known for their mischievous but fun-spirited barhopping adventures (locally we call barhopping "going on a paranda"), and just as Aruba enjoys a high number of return visitors, so does the Kukoo Kunuku, with seven buses now running routes around the island.

Kukoo Kunuku owners Marcus and Cindy wanted to give their guests another reason to jump on the bus, recently adding the Wine on Down the Road Tour, coordinated by Maki Wiggins and hosted by sommelier Wouter Koeneman, both seasoned local enthusiasts of Aruba's wine and culinary scene.

Not only is the tour a great excuse for repeaters to come back for more fun, but it's also an ideal option for those wanting something a bit more relaxed and laid back, as well as foodies who want to experience tastes of several of Aruba's best restaurants with wine pairings chosen by the onboard sommelier. The restaurants visited on the tour vary, but often include stops at top restaurants like White Modern Cuisine, Bistro De Suikertuin, Aqua Grill, and Bohemian Bar & Restaurant.



# KUNUKU



#### First Stop: White Modern Cuisine

This chef-owned restaurant is located in the clubhouse of the exclusive Gold Coast residential community. It's an ideal first stop to clink glasses and toast to a magnificent sunset. At White Modern Cuisine, celebrated Aruban chef Urvin Croes presents artistic culinary creations where flavor and flair are perfectly matched. On this tour, three courses were presented, with wine pairings selected and presented by Wouter.

> A snack trio of deviled eggs with bell pepper vinaigrette, tomato arancini with mustard mayo, and truffled Gouda cheese balls with truffle mayo was matched nicely with Villa Sandi Prosecco from Italy.





Grilled cobia served with a shrimp, corn, sweet potato, and tomato succotash with Creole sauce and cilantro oil was perfectly paired with Chateau Ste. Michelle Rosé from Washington state.



Pine Ridge Chenin Blanc+Viognier was partnered with peppered tuna served with a passion-fruit leche de tigre, quinoa and wakame salad, lemon crème, teriyaki gel, and wakame chips.

#### Second Stop: Bistro De Suikertuin

The second stop was at Bistro De Suikertuin, housed in a historic manor on Wilhelminastraat in the heart of downtown Oranjestad. The interior features a cozy ambiance created by the original low ceilings and thick stone walls. The outdoor back patio features an adorable garden frequented by the local bananaquit, a yellow-breasted bird that is known for its love of sugar, hence the restaurant's name, Suikertuin, which means "sugar garden" in Dutch.



Chillin'at Rum Reef



In late 2018, a new bar and lounge experience was launched at Baby Beach. Rum Reef, formerly located on the ground level at JADS Dive Center, moved to a neighboring upstairs location, offering stunning elevated views of the Baby Beach area. There is some interesting history behind the location, which was once part of the Esso Club, a former community center for expats working at Lago Oil & Transport Company, its original construction dating back to the 1920s. Much of it burned in a fire in 1939, but it was rebuilt in the 1950s, and then abandoned in the 1980s. Businesses like JADS and Rum Reef have been slowly bringing the beachfront building back to life.

Many divers and regulars at Baby Beach have refueled and refreshed at Rum Reef for several years now and will be happy to know that Dennis Fang and his son, JP, have maintained the local, laid-back vibe in the new location, and yes, sassy bartender Maureen is still there mixing her cocktails from scratch (no packaged mixes)—like her famous piña colada made with real coconut cream. And now you can take that tropical libation out onto the terrace or sip it in the infinity pool, as patrons of Rum Reef can enjoy complimentary use of the terrace and pool. And no worries about kids jumping and splashing and cutting into your zen chill session—Rum Reef is for adults only!





On Aruba, one restaurant that celebrates some of the most beloved Caribbean cuisine is The Lazy Turtle, an outdoor eatery at Paseo Herencia Mall. Opening about four years ago, I must admit I had never dined there until recently. I have been to many islands around the Caribbean, and the food scene has always kept my fork delightfully entertained, but I really had no idea I could take a culinary journey around the Caribbean right here on Aruba.

Locally owned by Sheldon and Maryuri Leuden and Maryuri's sister, Liliana, The Lazy Turtle's menu reflects an eclectic melting pot of offerings. The signature dishes we sampled included the gorgeously presented and exotic Plantain and Coconut Soup, with grilled shrimp; the Seafood Trinity, with lobster, shrimp, and grouper delicately infused with a hint of lemongrass and citrus aromas in a seafood consommé; the spicy, African-inspired Kuvuta Kuku, with tender chicken breast (also available with tofu); Piri Piri Shrimp Pot, a Tunisian-influenced dish with fried quinoa and mushrooms; Moroccan Chickpea and Quinoa Salad, with honey passion-fruit dressing; and Shrimp Mandarin, with passion fruit, grilled pineapple, and mandarin. The portions are generous and the prices are reasonable.



It's Taco Time!

#### Lola Taqueria Debuts in Palm Beach

Wove over, gourmet burgers—tacos are now tops when it comes to the upscale street-food trend, utilizing high-quality, fresh ingredients, along with scratch tortillas and authentic salsas. Aruba's most notable entry to the luxe taco scene is Lola Taqueria. Lola's hip streetside digs in the heart of Palm Beach add some legit street cred to the trendy taco joint, which offers patrons a front-row seat to the action along the strip and in the open-view kitchen.


True taco supremacy starts with the tortilla, and Lola-which opts for the corn tortilla for most of the tacos-makes them fresh daily in-house. We sank our teeth into the carne asada taco and loved that Lola uses the traditional skirt steak in these; they are topped with fresh avocado sauce, white onion, and a sprinkle of cilantro. Given Lola's location just off of Palm Beach, we had to try the fish tacos composed of Caribbean sea bass, prepared in a batter made with the local Chill beer and garnished with shredded red cabbage and pica di papaya mayo. Lola also has several out-of-the-box tacos featuring non-traditional ingredients, and the roasted Brussels sprouts tacos were irresistible with just the right amount of sweetmeets-tanginess from the tamari soy glaze and fresh orange.

In total, Lola has nine gourmet tacos to savor (with more on the horizon), ranging from \$6 to \$9 (two per order). The tacos are served with a variety of house-made salsas, including pica de gallo, salsa verde, chile morita, and pica di papaya. There are also several appetizers, including another street fav—grilled corn on a stick with chipotle mayo and a dusting of cotija cheese.

Wash it all down with local and craft beer, fresh margaritas (the jalapeño-infused one rocks!), and signature cocktails from the next-door neighbor and sister restaurant, CRAFT.

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## Harbour House Aruba and the Revival of Waf Chiquito

he former Mar Azul Condominiums and the Mar Azul Marina Mall, the massive abandoned development on Weststraat, recently found redemption under its new name, Harbour House Apartments and the Harbour Stores.

The complex has also undergone a clever repositioning. Instead of its main mall entrance facing Weststraat, the new layout calls for major shopping and dining on the ocean side, with a spacious promenade, as an extension of the Green Corridor, showcasing the beauty of the Oranjestad harbor.

Developer Albert Perret Gentil of Blue & Azul Condominiums credits his brother with the brilliant idea of placing the parking garage under the building and elevating the infinity pool, à la Renaissance in Curaçao, for a more functional and dramatic use of the space.

With the project fully facing the water, seven harbor shops will be available for rent to reputable and experienced high-end F&B or retail experts. While Perret Gentil believes it will take a while to find synergy, he is confident that Weststraat, once a swinging neighborhood, will find a successful formula, perhaps à la Wynwood, Miami, and he is relying on the owners of neighboring real estate, including the harbor, Stichting Rancho, the fishermen, and the souvenir vendors of Waf Chiquito, to come together for a comprehensive urban revival plan of the area.

Harbour House offers 96 units, from studios to four-bedroom residences; on-site parking; 24-hour security; boat service to the beach; top-floor solarium with hot tub; food & beverage; a swanky lobby; a fitness center; and a rooftop with 360-degree views of the island.

Best of all, you're welcome to move in starting in 2020.

Perret Gentil remarks that an eclectic group of architects, designers, and engineers were required to transform the unfortunately bankrupt prime piece of downtown real estate, but it's done. And we should be proud of the rescue plan, breathing new life into the once-popular Waf Chiquito.

His company just opened the first AZUL tower, on Eagle beach, one of two, and is planning the further construction of some townhouses in the back, facing the green areas.  $\mathbb{T}$

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
