### In surprise visit to war Pope opens solemn Holy Week amid zone, Obama prods sex abuse crisis **Afghans** VATICAN CITY (AP) - Pope

KABUL, Afghanistan (AP) -In a surprise visit, President Barack Obama pressed Afghan leaders yetserday to do more to rein in rampant corruption and improve their government as he got a firsthand look at the 8year-old war he inherited and dramatically escalated.

During meetings with President Hamid Karzai and his Cabinet, Obama told them he was pleased with progress made since his last discussion with Karzai, by secure videoconference on March 15. Obama also invited Karzai to visit Washington on May 12.

He praised recent steps in the military campaign against insurgents. But in discussions that lasted about 30 minutes at the presidential palace, Obama stressed that Afghans need to see conditions on the ground get better.

The trip, its secrecy forced by security concerns, was an

extraordinary capstone to a momentous week in Obama's presidency. He achieved the most ambitious domestic policy initiative in decades with a historic health care overhaul and scored first major foreign policy achievement with a significant new arms control treaty with Russia.

Karzai promised that his country "would move forward into the future" to eventually take over its own security, and he thanked Obama for the American intervention in his country.

He told Obama he has begun to establish more credible national institutions on corruption and made clear he intends to make ministerial appointments more representative of the multiple ethnic and geographic regions of the country, according to a U.S. account of the meeting

# **Red Cross: Colombian rebels** freed captive soldier

VILLAVICENCIO, Colombia (AP) - Colombian rebels released a soldier to the International Red Cross yesterday after holding him for almost a year in captivity.

Red Cross spokesman Adolfo Beteta said 23-year-old Pvt. Josue Daniel Calvo was in the hands of the humanitarian group and heading home.

Beteta spoke to reporters at the airport in the city of Villavicencio, where a Brazilian helicopter emblazoned with the Red Cross logo took off earlier yesterday bound for the undisclosed hand-over point in the Colombian jungle.

He said officials "have no worrying news" about the health of Calvo, who according to the rebels has been suffering from an unknown ailment. He was captured on April 20, 2009, by the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia. or FARC.

Peace commissioner Frank

Pearl said Calvo would be taken to a military hospital in the capital, Bogota, upon arrival.

Calvo is the first FARC captive to be released since early 2009, when the guerrillas handed over two politicians and four soldiers who had spent more than six years in the custody of the rebels.

Piedad Cordoba, the opposition senator leading the rescue mission, says the FARC will turn over another soldier early next week: Sgt. Pablo Emilio Moncayo, 32, who has been held for 12 years.

The FARC then intends to halt unilateral releases and press its old demand for talks with the government on exchanging jailed rebels for the 20 or so police and soldiers still in captivity, according to Cordoba.

Moncayo's father became famous for walking halfway across Colombia to press for his son's release.

Benedict XVI opened Holy Week yesterday amid one of the most serious crises facing the church in decades, with protesters in London demanding he resign and calls in Switzerland for a central registry for pedophile priests.

Benedict made no direct mention of the scandal in his Palm Sunday homily. But one of the prayers, recited in Portuguese during Mass, was "for the young and for those charged with educating them and protecting them."

Jesus Christ, Benedict said in his homily, guides the faithful "toward the courage that doesn't let us be intimidated by the chatting of dominant opinions, towards patience that supports others.'

Palm Sunday commemorates Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and is the start of the church's Holy Week. which includes the Good Friday re-enactment of Christ's crucifixion and death and his resurrection on Easter Sunday.

This year, the most solemn week on the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar has been stained by a clerical abuse scandal that has spread across Europe to the Pope's native Germany.

In London vesterday, a few dozen people gathered outside

Westminster Cathedral to demand the Pope resign. Demonstrators carried placards saying "Pope? Nope!" and "Don't Turn a Blind Eye."

The Archbishop of Westminster Vincent Nichols insisted the Pope wouldn't and shouldn't — quit. "In fact, it is the other way around," he told BBC television. "He is the one above all else in Rome that has tackled this thing head on."

In Austria, where several cases have come out in recent weeks, the archbishop of Vienna announced the creation of a church-funded but clergyfree and independent commission to look into Austrian abuse claims.

It will be run by a woman, the former governor of Styria province, and is not meant to take the place of a possible state-run investigative commission, Cardinal Christoph Schoenborn told public broadcaster ORF yesterday.

And in Switzerland, Swiss President Doris Leuthard told the weekly SonntagsZeitung that Switzerland should consider creating a central registry of pedophile priests to prevent them from coming into contact with more children.

# **Right group: Over 300 killed in DR.** Congo massacre

KINSHASA, Democratic Republic of Congo – Ugandan LRA rebels killed at least 321 civilians in a previously unreported "well-planned" fourday attack on villages in the DR Congo last December, Human Rights Watch said yesterday.

In a report released in Kampala, HRW said 250 others, including at least 80 children, were abducted in the December 14-17 Lord's Resistance Army attack in the remote Makombo area of northeastern Haut Uele district.

A Catholic clergyman at Isiro-Niangara in the same district, speaking before the report was issued, confirmed that 30 members of the rebel LRA attacked a dozen villages of Haut Uele, which is in Orientale province.

"They killed at least 300 people. They also kidnapped between 200 and 400 others before disappearing," clergyman Dieudonne Abakuba said.

'The vast majority of those killed were adult men, whom LRA combatants first tied up and then hacked to death with machetes or crushed their skulls with axes and heavy wooden sticks.

"The dead include at least 13 women and 23 children, the youngest a three-year-old girl

who was burned to death.

LRA combatants tied some of the victims to trees before crushing their skulls with axes," said the report, written after a mission visited the region in February.


# Minister of Health Richard Visser visits the Blood Bank Foundation



the end he got an explanation of the different areas and sections of the Blood Bank.



# Cactus



#### **Prickly Pear**

Edible cactus is also known as nopales, nopalitos or cactus pads. This vegetable is popular in Mexico and other Central American countries, parts of Europe, the Middle East, India, North Africa and Australia. Its popularity is increasing in the United States where it can be found at Mexican grocery stores, specialty produce markets and farmer's markets.

Edible cactus is characterized by its fleshy oval leaves (typically called pads or paddles) of the nopal (prickly pear) cactus.

With a soft but crunchy texture that also becomes a bit sticky (not unlike okra) when cooked, edible cactus tastes similar to a slightly tart green bean, asparagus, or green pepper.

Cactus pads contain beta

carotene, iron, some B vitamins, and are good sources of both vitamin C and calcium. Fruit

As part of the cactus plant, the prickly pear is a fruit that is 2 to 4 inches long and shaped like an avocado. Its skin is coarse and thick, not unlike an avocados and it ranges in color from yellow or orange to magenta or red. Tubercles with small prickly spines can be found on the prickly pear's skin. This fruit's flesh, which ranges in color also from yellow to dark red, is sweet and juicy with crunchy seeds throughout.

The prickly pear can be diced like pineapple and used as a topping on yogurt or cereal or blended into a smoothie. Cacti with ripe fruit There is no way to talk about Aruba's cunucu without talking about cactus. We have so many kinds, and most people think of the tall pipe-like stems of the cadushi, when they talk about cactus, but even those

found a very big, old cactus that had fallen and was dying. It probably had wood ants, (termites) and this year has been very, very dry, so it fell. Things will still live in it, lizards and such, and eat the insects that also live there, so it is part of the way of things, it will give life even as it dies.

I am much sadder when I see whole areas of cactus and trees, home to all sorts of birds and animals, die from the bulldozer. Those will never give back to the cunucu like this old cactus, which had seen its time. I think we must all think about this a lot more as Aruba keeps building and building; all the creatures that will die along with the cactus.



### You know you've got issues if your skivvies start texting



SIMsystem, hailed as the world's first electronic underpants, are being rolled out across Australia's largest state--New South Wales--following what have been deemed successful trials.

Resembling its politelynamed predecessor, the incontinence pad (not to be confused with the iPad), SIMsystem's new-and-improved skivvies come equipped with a sensor strip that alerts caregivers to wetness via text message or, as if the situation couldn't get any more embarrassing, over a facility's paging system. All without ever zapping one's private regions!

The above diagram really says it all. When the "event"

occurs, the sensor strip is read by the close and ever-attentive SIM box, recorded in real time on the computer with which it wirelessly communicates (using ZigBee), cataloged in a bladder report that can be printed at any time, announced via text message or pager, and finally wiped to near oblivion, though it has left its indelible, electronic mark. It's nice to know that in the

The island is never in precisely the same place, and it changes size from one minute to the next. In fact, you never know when its gleaming shore might disappear altogether, because it's

loggerhead sea turtles. The funny thing is, sea turtles, unlike the Mediterranean's human denizens, aren't supposed to like to float, says Sandra Hochscheid, a marine biologist at Stazione Zoologica Anton Dohrn in Naples, Italy. Scientists believe that loggerhead sea turtles (Caretta caretta), the dominant sea turtle in the Mediterranean, spend most of their lives underwater or on the sea floor, coming to the surface only for brief gasps of air. "Everything we'd found out about turtles: feeding, mating, migrating, searching for good places, resting .... has all taken place underwater," she says.

Hochscheid knew about Turtle Island and had heard about basking turtles from tourists in Naples, but she'd never seen the behavior for herself. So she decided to figure out just what the loggerheads were doing spending so much time among the waves. "I've been looking 10 years into what they do under the water surface," Hochscheid says. "But I've never looked at the time they spend at the surface.'

Sun-worshipper. Loggerhead turtles (left) bask with their shells above the water's surface (right)


Hochscheid and colleagues collected 10 loggerheads from various locations in the Mediterranean and glued tracking devicessmall black boxes with flexible antennas-to their shells. Over a year of observations, it became clear why the turtles had developed a reputation as bottom dwellers. The tagged loggerheads spent about 98% of their time underwater. And when they did come up, it was irregularly, sometimes twice in 2 days and sometimes not for a week.

There was a hint to the reason for the behavior, however. The turtles almost always surfaced during the day, 82% of the time, in fact, and mostly at about midday when the sunlight is most direct. Another clue: Daylight basking sessions almost always occurred after the turtles had returned from a dive below the thermocline, the transitional zone between the sunwarmed shallows and frigid depths. Hochscheid believes that daylight surfacing helps

the loggerheads warm up quickly; she speculates it could also aid digestion, though she's not sure how.


Night surfacing, on the other hand, almost always followed dives that were long enough to cause the turtles to run out of air, a duration that the team calculated based on the turtles' weight. Night sessions, then, would help the turtles clear large amounts of lactic acid, produced when the turtles keep swimming when they've run out of oxygen, the team reports today in The Journal of Experimental Biology.

Basking may have a downside for the turtles, says Brendan Godley, a conservation biologist at the University of Exeter, Cornwall, in the United Kingdom, because it makes the turtles more vulnerable to boat strikes. He says that if more research uncovers a preference for certain spots or times of year, the findings could feed into conservation efforts. The work also exemplifies how technology is transforming marine biologists' understanding of the turtles, he says. "Especially with satellite tracking, the more we look, the more we find that highlights how complicated these animals are."

# **HEALTH** Is your relationship abusive?



All couples fight. The usual topics include spending habits, in-laws, fidelity, children, chores – the list continues. But when is a relationship abusive? When does the occasional bicker become a warning light?

"There are many different types of abuse", says Ilse Pauw, Cape Town psychologist. "Some involve physical attacks or aggressive behaviour which can range from slapping to bruising, to serious assaults, to murder."

"Then there is sexual abuse within the relationship. Often the physical abuse culminates in sexual violence. Then there is psychological battering, which can constitute verbal abuse, harassment, excessive possessiveness, isolating the partner from family and friends, depriving the person of food, money and clothes, destroying her property and her self-esteem," she added.

SIGNS OF ABUSIVE RELA-TIONSHIPS

**Constant putdowns.** If your partner ridicules you in

front of other people, implying that you are stupid, uninformed and that your opinion on things is irrelevant, the behaviour is abusive.

Who was that who looked at you? Extreme jealousy and possessiveness is often a sign of an abusive relationship. If you feel as if you are constantly being watched and constantly questioned about everyone you spoke to, all your movements, chances are your relationship is abusive.

Demure and downtrodden. If you find yourself growing quieter and rather saying nothing at all than saying something that could unleash a torrent of abuse, you are in a danger zone. The same goes for starting to do things purely in order to avoid another verbal or physical attack. The sad thing, though, is that it is not your behaviour causing the abuse, so changing your behaviour won't put a stop to it.

# **Tip:** If You Notice Blood in the Stools

#### It should be checked by a doctor

Bloody stools can indicate an internal injury or abnormality. A doctor should evaluate the condition without delay. The University of Maryland Medical Center suggests these possible causes of blood in the stools:

- \* An abnormality in the blood vessels, or an esophageal tear. \* An ulcer in the duodenum, gastritis, or bleeding in the stomach.
- \* Insufficient blood flow to the intestines.
- \* An injury or object lodged in the gastrointestinal tract.
- \* Anal fissures, colon cancer or polyps in the colon.
- \* Hemorrhoids.
- \* Diverticulosis or inflammatory bowel disease.
- \* An infection in the intestines.
- \* A tumor in the small bowel.

Not a cent to be spent. Financial control is another form of abuse. Obviously unbridled spending on unnecessary luxuries cannot be justified. But if one of the partners is forced to hand over their entire salary, or ask for every little thing that is needed, or is not given any spending money, or is made to account for every single cent that is spent, it could be seen as abusive.

**Temper tantrums.** No one is always in a good mood, but there is a difference between feeling rather miffed and losing control, shouting, screaming and breaking things. If your partner is destroying your property, the message is clear: You could be next. If you are unable to raise even small issues without unleashing a torrent of abuse, there is a problem.

Violent assaults. Whether this happens once a year or every week, if there are violent episodes in your relationship, the relationship is abusive. Being bruised, battered and assaulted by your partner is not acceptable. No one ever deserves to be treated in this manner, whatever the reasons the batterer chooses to give. It is not your behaviour that causes this – if you do some research, you will more than likely find that there is history of this kind of behaviour long before you were ever on the scene.

Your children are quiet and withdrawn. Children who live in a home where the parental relationship is physically or emotionally abusive, quickly learn that it is better not to attract any attention. They are often withdrawn and overcompliant, and sometimes develop behavioural problems or psychosomatic symptoms as a resault of the stress they're under.



# Fruit compound may help those with asthma



AUCKLAND, New Zealand -- Natural chemicals from blackcurrants may help reduce lung inflammation in those with allergy-induced asthma, researchers in New Zealand said.

The study, published in Molecular Nutrition and Food Research, found in laboratory experiments the blackcurrant compound enhances the natural defense mechanisms in lung tissue by both suppressing inflammation-causing reactions and minimizing inflammation. Dr. Roger Hurst of New Zealand company Plant & Food Research said fruit consumption has been shown to reduce symptoms in allergyinduced asthma, yet this research is the first to give insights into the mechanism by which this may occur.

Hurst said the cells from lung tissue were used to test the effects on the immune system of a proanthocyanidin rich extract, from blackcurrant cultivars grown in New Zealand.

When the lungs are exposed to allergens, the body's natural response is to attack the perceived foreign body that in some individuals results in long-term inflammation.

Selective compounds found in fruit and vegetables may work together with the body's own natural defense mechanism to suppress longterm lung inflammation, Hurst says.

### **Big Smiles, Longer Lives?**



If you're always the one in the photo flashing the biggest smile, a new study suggests you can count on living a long life.

Researchers from Wayne State University in Detroit evaluated the photographs of 230 Major League Baseball players who started playing before 1950, rating their smiles as nonexistent to full.

"People who had the most intense smiles lived the longest, compared to the other two," said Ernest L. Abel, a professor of obstetrics and gynecology and of psychology at Wayne State.

"The more intense smile, we infer, indicates an underlying happiness, if you will, a more positive attitude," he said. "It's hard to fake an intense smile."

The researchers gathered other information potentially linked with longevity from a longstanding data base on the players, such as college attendance, marital status, birth year and body-mass index.

They asked reviewers who didn't know the study's purpose to rate the player's smiles as a 1, 2, or 3, with 1 being no smile, 2 a partial, and 3, a broad full smile, the kind that makes your eyes crinkle. As of June 1, 2009, all but

As of June 1, 2009, all but 46 players had died, and they looked back to see if the smile intensity in photos was linked with longer life. It was.

On average, the longevity of the non-smilers was 72.9, 75 for the partial smilers and 79.9 for the big smilers.

The big smilers had what is known as a Duchenne smile, named after the French neurologist who discovered it. Cheeks and the corners of the mouth are raised, and crows-feet wrinkles appear around the eyes.

After Abel and his team controlled for variables such as marital status, birth year and body-mass index, they found the smile-longevity link still held. Those with the biggest smile were half as likely to die in a given year than the nonsmilers. But in this regard, broad smilers didn't differ significantly from partial smilers.

Libya and EU patch up

SIRTE, Libya – Libya lifted a visa ban on citizens of 25 European countries on Saturday after EU president Spain said a Swiss-instigated visa blacklist against 188 Libyans in those countries had been scrapped.

The end to the visa ban and the Schengen zone blacklist will likely defuse a crisis that has threatened to damage growing business ties be-tween Europe and oil exporter Libya.

"In the interests of strengthening its cooperation with the European Union, Libya lifts the restrictions it earlier imposed on the citizens of the Schengen zone," Libya's Foreign Ministry said in a communique carried by JANA, the state news agency.

Spain's foreign ministry had earlier issued a statement announcing the visa blacklist had been torn up and expressed regret as part of a diplomatic drive by EU leaders.

"Libya expresses its appreciation at the European Union for this move," JANA quoted the Foreign Ministry statement as saying. "This is a defeat for Switzerland by means of collective European action. Libya accepts the EU

Libya stopped issuing visas to citizens from the Schengen borderless travel zone in retaliation for Switzerland, a Schengen member, barring entry to 188 Libyan citizens including the country's leader Muammar Gaddafi and members of his family.

The Swiss move prevented the blacklisted Libyans from entering any of the other Schengen states because the terms of the Schengen agreement obligate all members to refuse visas to citizens of countries blacklisted by fellow Schengen nations

The Schengen area is a borderless travel zone grouping 22 EU nations plus Switzerland, Norway and Iceland.

Switzerland has been locked in a diplomatic dispute with oil exporter Libya since July 2008, when police in Geneva arrested Hannibal Gaddafi, a son of the Libyan leader, on charges of mistreating two domestic employees. In February Gaddafi urged



RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil --Latin American economies are on the mend, with varying results for performance since the 2008 global downturn but the recovery remains patchy and fragile, new financial data indicated on the weekend.

# Sweetener eyed as cause of belly bulges

Federal health experts say the American obesity rate has skyrocketed since the introduction of high-fructose corn syrup 40 years ago.

Princeton University scientists say they've found new evidence that a sweetener commonly found in processed foods and drinks result in abnormal weight gain and other obesity-related health issues.

Even when overall caloric intakes were equal, lab rats with access to high-fructose corn syrup gained "significantly" more weight than those with access to table sugar, according to Princeton Neuroscience Institute researchers.

They also found that longterm consumption of high fructose corn syrup leads to high triglyceride levels and increased belly fat.

The Corn Refiners Association, a national trade group, insists that multiple health and nutrition studies show there are no significant differences in calories or how the body metabolizes table sugar and high fructose corn syrup.

High-fructose corn syrup is made from cornstarch, and is essentially sugar in liquid form. The main difference from table sugar is how it affects food texture. The sweetener is found in many foods and beverages, including fruit juice, soda, cereal, bread, yogurt and ketchup.

In the Princeton studies, lab animals with access to highfructose corn syrup gained 48 percent more weight than those eating a normal diet. In humans, this would be like a 200-pound man gaining 96 pounds, researchers said. In one study, rats were fed the high-fructose corn syrup over six months.

"When rats are drinking high-fructose corn syrup at levels well below those in soda pop, they're becoming obese, every single one, across the board," said Princeton psyprofessor chology Bart Hoebel, who specializes in the neuroscience of appetite, weight and sugar addiction.

High-fructose corn syrup and sucrose are both compounds that contain the simple sugars fructose and glucose, but there are at least two differences between them.

Sucrose contains a 50/50 breakdown of fructose (fruit sugar) and glucose (blood sugar). High fructose sweetener is 55 percent fructose, 42 percent glucose and 3 percent higher saccharides, which are larger sugar molecules.

The differences may relate to excess fructose being metabolized to produce fat, while glucose is largely processed for energy or stored as a carbohydrate in the liver and muscles, researchers suggest.

The Corn Refiners Association, which launched a \$30 million market campaign designed to dispel misinformation about the sweetener, cites recent studies showing similar blood glucose concentrations and similar insulin responses among people who ate high fructose corn syrup and regular sugar.

However, in the 40 years since the introduction of highfructose corn syrup as a costeffective sweetener in the American diet, U.S. obesity rates have skyrocketed, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

A worker tends plants at a stevia plantation in Caacupe, east of Asuncion, Paraguay WASHINGTON - A sweetener derived from the South American herb stevia is taking the global marketplace by storm, promising a zero-calorie product that also has the ap-

peal of being natural. The global market for stevia sweeteners has already hit 500 million dollars following US regulatory approval and could reach 10 billion dollars in a few years, according to market research firm Mintel.

Stevia, which originated in Paraguay but has been used for decades in Japan and other Asian nations, got a major boost when the US Food and Drug Administration cleared the use of a stevia extract called rebaudioside A (Reb-A) in December 2008.

Since then, stevia-based sweeteners have been adopted by big food and beverage giants such as PepsiCo, Coca-Cola, Nestle, Danone, Unilever and others, and are on its way to becoming a household name.

"Reb-A suppliers report huge growth in a market that is set to explode," Mintel said in a recent report.

"Reb-A and stevia is projected to penetrate 20 to 25 percent of the global sugar and sweetener market, which is currently still growing.'

Others say the product comes at the right time with concerns growing in the United States and elsewhere about obesity linked to sugary soft drinks and other products.

"In an era with serious political and social and health ramifications of sugar and high-fructose corn syrup, stevia's new 'natural' label will give it a prime spot as the holy grail of sweeteners," says food policy consultant and blogger Naomi Starkman.

The Reb-A extract from stevia is an estimated 300 times sweeter than sugar, which means it is generally mixed with other ingredients for bulk and to ensure proper sweetening dosing.

It is being used in zerocalorie drinks or foods or reduced calorie items.It has a low glycemic index, so it can be used by diabetics and in diet products... and the product is natural.

The largest producer of stevia leaf is China, which has long supplied extracts widely used for sweeteners in Japan, where stevia has been used since the 1970s.

Most European Union

countries still prohibit stevia, with the exception of France, which last year authorized a two-year trial period for certain stevia extracts.

Stevia producers hope for a favorable ruling this year from EU safety officials, and note that it is approved in many countries including Australia, New Zealand and Switzerland.

Yet stevia still has skeptics as well. Some claim it was hastily approved in the waning days of the administration of president George W. Bush as a favor to soft drink companies, after being banned for many years.

"It's hard to know whether stevia is safe or not, as research is minimal," says Marion Nestle, a professor of nutrition at New York University, who argues that it may be a stretch to call stevia products "natural."

"We can debate whether a chemical sweetener isolated from stevia leaves is really 'natural' but here's another problem: stevia doesn't taste like sugar," she said.

"Companies have to fuss with it to cover up its 'off' taste. And they must do so without detracting from the perceived benefits of its natural status."

US restaurant menus to carry calorie information of every food item

The health care legislation passed by President Obama is now going to observe all the big restraint chains with more than 20 wings updating their menus. The new law makes it compulsory for all the restraints menus to carry the calorie information of all the food items listed on it.

The new bill makes use of the language observed in the MEAL Act, which was proposed in 2003 by Senator Harkin of Iowa, Chairman of the Senate Health.

She explained that for over two decades, the consumers have been receiving the advantage of nutrition labels mentioned on packaged foods, but they have always been away from the nutritional information on the restaurant meals.

However, the information about the calories can be obtained from restaurant literature or on their websites. But with the recent move, the Government will be able to motivate a majority of the Americans for avoiding consumption of high calorie items, as the calorie information will now be available at the tables.

Sue Hensley, a spokeswoman for the National Restaurant Association said that the restaurant sector is supposed to accept the legislation to maintain uniformity in the various outlets across the nation.

# **Ex-Scientology lawsuits reveal elite** Sea Org group

SAN JACINTO, California – At the edge of arid foothills far outside Los Angeles, hundreds of Scientology followers live on a gated, 500-acre campus and work long hours for almost no pay reproducing the works of founder L. Ron Hubbard and creating the church's teaching and promotional materials.

The church says its 5,000 so-called Sea Organization members are religious devotees akin to monks who are exempt from wage requirements and overtime. But two lawsuits filed by two former Sea Org members, as they are known, allege the workers are little more than slave laborers, forced to work 100-hour weeks for pennies and threatened with manual labor if they cause trouble.

Marc Headley and his wife, Claire, are seeking back pay and overtime that could add up to \$1 million each, according to their attorney, Barry Van Sickle.

Experts say the plaintiffs face an uphill battle; one similar lawsuit in state court has already been dismissed, although the plaintiff plans to appeal.

But the dispute has nonetheless focused unwelcome attention on the Sea Org, which operates as a nerve center for the church's most important business. While Sea Org members hold positions of authority within the international church, from the public relations team to the top leadership, lower-ranking members make up much of the work force.

The members are Scientology's most devoted followers: they sign a billion-year pledge, vow not to have children and live and work communally.

Scientology has been sued by disgruntled members before, but experts believe these suits are the first to use labor law to challenge the premise that the Sea Organization is akin to a fraternal religious order.

A victory for plaintiffs would "certainly go to the heart of Scientology's selfidentification as a religion," said J. Gordon Melton, director of the Institute for the Study of American Religion and author of a scholarly book on Scientology.

"If they were to win this suit and the people who are in the Sea Org decided they wanted money, that would lead to, if not the collapse,

then a great deal of harm," he said. "They depend upon these people."

Marc Headley devoted half his life to churning out the works of Scientology founder L. Ron Hubbard on an assembly line before working on in-house films and designing the audiovisual displays seen in Scientology churches worldwide.

Headley, who claims he escaped the gated facility in 2005, says he and others were threatened with forced labor and psychological abuse if they caused trouble.

"These folks are working for a year or two or three in a row on an hour or two of sleep a night. They're zombies," Van Sickle said. "If people had some money in their pockets or a good night's sleep, they probably wouldn't stick around."

The Church of Scientology vehemently denies the allegations and claims the plaintiffs are liars looking for money.

"When you sign up as a Sea Org member, you're signing up as a member of a religious order," Jessica Feshbach, a church spokeswoman and 16-year Sea Org member, said of the plaintiffs. "You're a volunteer. You sign a contract that says, 'I'm not going to be paid minimum wage and I know that."

Headley's federal lawsuit, which alleges labor violations at the Hemet facility, is set for trial in November in Los Angeles. His wife, Claire, makes similar allegations, but also claims she was coerced into having an abortion to comply with the Sea Org members' no-child policy, Van Sickle said.

Church officials say Sea Org members are not asked to have abortions, but must leave the order if they become pregnant.

The lawsuits are similar to unsuccessful claims filed by an ex-seminarian who left the Roman Catholic church and sued for minimum wage over menial labor, said Melton, the Scientology expert. A federal appeals court last week upheld a finding that minimum wage law did not apply.

Headley joined Sea Org at 16 after being raised by Scientologist parents. He moved to the gated campus near Hemet in 1989.

At first, he devoted himself to Hubbard's teachings, a blend of Eastern religion, alternative psychology and management theory.

Practitioners believe they can eliminate negative energy from past lives through study and "auditing" sessions that use electronic devices called "e-meters" to detect mental trauma. Adherents hope to attain a state called "clear" before becoming "Operating Thetans," or pure spirits. The Sea Org traces its roots to 1967 when Highbord

The Sea Org traces its roots to 1967, when Hubbard, who was also a science fiction writer, took his most dedicated followers on sea voyages to explore early civilizations and spread his teachings. Its members called ministers — live communally and often wear maritime-style uniforms with ranks.

Headley, 36, says he began to question the religion while working for an average of 39 cents an hour to mass produce cassettes that he says cost the church \$1 to make but sold for \$75. He also helped make CDs and DVDs and the expensive e-meters used in auditing sessions before gradua- ting to working on in-house film production, he says.

In 15 years, he said he earned \$29,000, a total he surpassed in his first year of business on his own.

Church leaders, who have labeled Headley a heretic, dispute his story and say he was an incompetent troublemaker.


Sea Org members happily receive room and board, medical and dental care, a \$50 weekly personal allowance, three weeks of annual vacation and free auditing and religious instruction for their lifetime devotion, church officials said.

Each day includes two hours of Scientology study and short meal breaks.

A boat aptly called the Plastiki, made out of 12,500 recyclable plastic bottles filled with carbon dioxide, has set sail for a great voyage through the Pacific. While it seems like an extreme stunt, the journey has more of a purpose than just seeing if a plastic boat can make the trip.


By now, many of us have heard about the giant collection of floating plastic known as the Great Pacific Garbage Patch. The large aquatic dump is located in the North Pacific Gyre, one of the five major vortices of currents in the world's oceans. It is twice the size of Texas and contains billions of tiny pieces of plastic.

The boat's crew including David de Rothschild, Jo Royle and David Thomson came up with this interesting way to draw more attention to the tons of plastic that make it into our oceans. They constructed the Plastiki to tour the Pacific Ocean, teaching us about recycling and lowering our consumption along the way.

The team will take approximately three months to reach Sydney, Australia from San Francisco, heading straight through the garbage patch. They will also visit other environmental hot spots including damaged coral reefs and lowlying island nations threatened by rising sea waters.

The boat is outfitted with rain collection tanks for fresh water, a gas stove for cooking food, a vertical garden on the back mast for growing food and fishing tackle for catching fresh fish. It also has solar panels, wind and sea turbines and exercise bikes for power generation.
