

Revival brewing for the defunct Bushiri Hotel and school



With the last court case won hands down, the Aruba government is now legally free to do business with new candidates interested in the defunct Bushiri Hotel complex.

On Wednesday, March 28th the Judge pronounced the sentence in the case of Baron Investment LCC versus the government of Aruba. Plaintiff in this case (Baron) urged the Court to prohibit the government of Aruba to bequeath the property of the defunct Bushiri Hotel to any other party and to continue negotiating with Baron or be sued for damages for noncompliance. However, much to the chagrin of Baron Investment LCC, the Judge ruled in favor of the government of Aruba and dismissed all the demands made by Baron.

Baron Investment is the Group that qualified in second place in the Public Tender submitted by the former government administration in 2007. The current government administration had attempted to reach an agreement with the Baron Group for acquiring the Bushiri Hotel complex before they had submitted a new Public Tender. This reportedly failed for a number of viable reasons. Baron Investment consequently refused to accept the government's position on the matter and filed a court case. The Judge, however, declared that Baron Investment has no legal rights to oblige the government because the process that the government had pursued with them was transparent and correct.

Several weeks ago Fresnos, the Group that the previous government administration had negotiated with for the reconstruction of the Bushiri Hotel complex, also lost their case in Court which they intimated against the government of Aruba. Fresnos had the full support of the previous government and even had the former Minister of Tourism to testify in their favor in a court of law.

As it now stands, after Baron Investment and Fresnos both lost their cases in Court, the government of Aruba can now proceed with their negotiations with other parties for the new project for the Bushiri complex.

This week the government received the advice they anticipated from the president of the commission regarding the

two remaining groups who have indicated serious interest in acquiring and operating the former Bushiri Hotel. It is expected that by the end of this year the ruins of the defunct Bushiri complex will be cleaned up and we will begin to see construction taking place to renew the facilities and return the complex to what it was in the past.

The government's vision is to return Bushiri to the success it once enjoyed as a training center coupled to a hotel offering our people the opportunity to receive 'onthe-job' training. Aruba must again become (it was this during the years 1983 to 2003 under the expert leadership of Dr. Tony Green who was Director of the training school from its inception), the in-strument for exporting our knowledge of the hotel and tourism industry.

There are currently several International institutions interested in the training school. One of the conditions of the project is that the operator must invest at least 10 million dollars in developing a training center on the complex or elsewhere.

By September or October construction must have begun on a new hotel at the site which will contribute to the upgrading of the entire area and provide the area with a brand new appeal for Aruba and for practically every tourist who goes by that complex.

Aruba is drawing closer to a positive end to the ugly and sore eved debris of the defunct Bushiri Hotel complex. Revival is, indeed, brewing for a new Bushiri on the L.G. Smith Blvd.'s entrance towards the rest of the beautiful spread of our hotel plant.

'Hunger Games' box office king for second week

LOS ANGELES (AFP) - Teen action film phenomenon "The Hunger Games" stayed on top of the North American box office for a second weekend, easily outsmarting Greek gods and Snow White, industry estimates showed Sunday.

The movie, which opened with a record \$152.5 million last weekend, has surged to a total of \$250 million in just 10 days in theaters, Exhibitor Relations said on its website. It made \$60 million this weekend.

The movie is based on a book for young adults by Suzanne Collins, in which a teenage girl played by Elizabeth Banks fights to win a death match TV reality show in a post-apocalyptic world.

In distant second place was new film "Wrath of the Titans" with \$36 million.

A contemporary take on the Snow White fairy tale, "Mirror Mirror" also had a disappointing opening, with \$22 million. Julia Roberts plays an evil queen who seizes control of a kingdom, while its exiled princess Lily Collins seeks the help of seven rebels to regain her realm.

In fourth were the youthful policemen of 1980s remake "21 Jump Street," which pulled in \$15 million for its third weekend in theaters.

Fifth was the animated film "Dr. Seuss' The Lorax" with a \$9 million weekend take and \$190 million in the bank after four weekends on the big screen.

The Disney critical flop and huge loss-maker -- "John Carter" came in sixth, with \$2.25 million in its fifth weekend in theaters.

New release "Salmon Fishing in the Yemen," grabbed \$1.75 million to land in seventh.

In eighth came "Act of Valor," a war film starring active duty US Navy SEALs, with \$1.5 million in receipts.

"Project X," came in ninth after snatching \$1 million.

Rounding out the top 10 was the Eddie Murphy comedy "A Thousand Words," also earning an estimated \$1 million.



Obama 'stated the obvious' in Russia remarks: Biden

WASHINGTON (AFP) -Vice President Joe Biden said Sunday President Barack Obama "stated the obvious" when he assured Russia's president he would have more flexibility to deal with missile defense after US elections.

In an interview with CBS's "Face the Nation," Biden dismissed Republican criticism of Obama's remarks to President Dmitry Medvedev in Seoul on Monday, which were caught on an open microphone.

"Look... the president just stated the obvious," Biden said.

"The idea that in this election year we're going to be able to deal with an agreement with the Russians on further reducing our nuclear arsenals in the environment that we have in... Congress right now is difficult."

In their last meeting before Vladimir Putin is inaugurated president in May, Obama told Medvedev that it was important for Russia to give him "space" on all issues, but particularly missile defense.


Romney, the frontrunner to become the Republican nominee to run against Obama in November elections, also attacked Obama for congratulating Putin on his victory in recent presidential elections, polls that activists said had irregularities.

The former Massachusetts governor "acts like he thinks the Cold War's still on," Biden said.





International News 'Friends of Syria' tighten screws on Damascus regime



US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton Says Syrian President Assad 'Must Go' The six-point peace plan calls for an end to violence, a daily two-hour humanitarian

ISTANBUL (AFP) - Western and Arab nations called Sunday for Syria's Bashar al-Assad to be given a deadline to meet the terms of a peace plan as fresh clashes in a year-long uprising claimed another 40 lives.

An international conference in Istanbul by "Friends of Syria" countries also urged the United Nations to act to stop the violence, but steered clear of backing opposition appeals for arms to fight the regime clampdown.

In a final declaration, the conference urged Syria mediator Kofi Annan "to determine a timeline for next steps, including a return to the UN Security Council, if the killing continues." "The regime will be

judged by its deeds rather than its promises. The window of opportunity for the regime to implement its commitments to joint special envoy Annan is not openended," it added.

The gathering brought together the Arab League and countries such as the United States, France and Germany.

Assad on Tuesday said he accepted the plan proposed by Annan. But this has not stopped the shelling of opposition strongholds.

The six-point peace plan calls for an end to violence, a daily two-hour humanitarian ceasefire and access to all areas affected by fighting, as well as an inclusive Syrian-led political process, the right to demonstrate, and the release of people detained arbitrarily.

The Istanbul gathering, which followed one in Tunis in late February, came amid continuing fighting on the ground as Damascus said it had no immediate plans to pull back its forces.

Conference host Turkey warned the world would have no choice but to recognise Syrians' right to take up arms if the UN fails to act.

"If the United Nations Security Council refrains from taking on the responsibility, the international community will have no chance but to accept Syrians' right to self-defence," Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan said as he opened the conference.

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton criticised Assad's regime for launching new assaults just days after accepting the Annan plan.

"Nearly a week has gone by, and we have to conclude that the regime is adding to its long list of broken promises," she said, adding that Assad was "mistaken" if he thought he could defeat the opposition against him.

Arab League head Nabil al-Arabi urged conference participants to demand that the UN Security Council pass a binding decision to stop the violence.

Ahead of the gathering, Assad's regime declared victory over rebels and again voiced support for Annan's plan, but kept up its shelling of rebel positions and said it had no plans to immediately withdraw troops.

The "Friends of Syria" meeting recognised the opposition Syrian National Council as the "legitimate representative" of all Syrians and the "leading interlocutor for the opposition with the international community."

SNC chief Burhan Ghalioun said this meant that "the government has now become illegitimate."

A leading Syrian rebel meanwhile hit out at the conference for avoiding the issue of arming the insurgents, saying such meetings "prolonged" the life of Assad's regime.

The SNC on Saturday renewed calls for arming rebels, but the final statement of the Istanbul conference did not make any reference to the pleas.

Romney nomination push by Republican leaders

WASHINGTON (AFP) -Senior Republicans on Sunday pushed the "overwhelming" case for Mitt Romney to be crowned the party's presidential election nominee, but his main rival Rick Santorum vowed to fight on.

The White House signaled that it, too, sees Romney as the likely Republican challenger in November with Vice President Joe Biden devoting an entire television interview to an attack on the former Massachusetts governor.

Three months into a bitterly fought Republican race for the nomination, Romney is the clear frontrunner and polls suggest he will win three more primaries Tuesday -- in Wisconsin, Maryland and the US capital Washington.

McConnell the Republican leader in the Senate,did not explicitly endorse Romney but suggested that the party should follow the lead of former president George H.W. Bush and Congressman Paul Ryan, a leading Republican and representative for Wisconsin, who did.

Romney, who has won 21 out of 34 nominating contests so far, is polling ahead of Santorum in Wisconsin.

But unless Romney can clinch the 1,144 delegates needed for the nomination -he currently has 565 -- he could be forced to wait until late August to get the nod at the Republican party's convention.

Santorum, who has racked up 11 victories but has less than half Romney's number of all-important Republican delegates, said Sunday he was determined to fight on despite Republican efforts to anoint his rival.

A fervent Catholic and strong critic of abortion and gay rights who is popular with evangelicals, the former Pennsylvania senator again urged voters to back him instead of Romney.

Romney has begun focusing almost exclusively on his likely battle against Obama.

In a campaign speech on Friday in Wisconsin, he didn't mention his Republican rivals once, opting instead to highlight his and the president's "fundamentally different visions for America."

Biden, meanwhile, laid into Romney, brushing off his attacks on Obama's handling of the economy.

Romney's two other opponents in the Republican race -- former House of Representatives speaker Newt Gingrich and Texas Congressman Ron Paul on Sunday said they were not going to quit, despite lengthening odds.

Paul, who has no victories, when asked if he would continue, added: "Obviously, yes."

International News Flood-hit Fiji declares state of emergency



NATADOLA-FIJI (AFP) -Flood-ravaged Fiji declared a state of emergency Sunday and warned tourists to stay away for the time being, as heavy rain and high winds continued to pound the South Pacific nation.

Officials said they could not guarantee visitors' safety in the wake of flash floods that have killed at least two people and forced more than 5,000 to take shelter in evacuation centres.

With roads to the international airport in Nadi cut off and extreme weather expected to continue until Tuesday, officials asked airlines not to bring in any more tourists until Monday at the earliest.

"This action is being reluctantly taken by the Fijian gov-

ernment to ensure the safety and convenience of international visitors and Fijian citizens seeking to return to Fiji," Tourism Minister Aiyaz Sayed-Khaiyum said.

The request is believed to be unprecedented for touristdependent Fiji.

National carrier Air Pacific said it had cancelled all inbound flights scheduled for Sunday and was operating only limited outbound flights for passengers who had already checked in at Nadi airport.

Airports Fiji Limited chief executive Tony Gollin said hundreds of international passengers were at the airport awaiting departure.

Many more have been unable to reach the airport, in the west of the main island Vita Levu, after fallen trees, landslides and swollen rivers cut road access.

The government declared a state of emergency in flood-affected areas, saying the move would make coordinating flood relief more effective.

"It's all about efficiency, allowing all parties to just go in there and get going," a government spokeswoman said.

Police and the military were helping coordinate cleanup efforts but the ferocious weather meant that in some areas makeshift repairs to damaged homes were torn apart almost as soon as they were completed.

The entire centre of Nadi was declared off limits to the public because police said the force of water running through the streets after the town's river burst its banks threatened to sweep people away.

The latest flood disaster comes after a six-day deluge in January claimed 11 lives.

Myanmar opposition claims landmark Suu Kyi win

YANGON (AFP) - Myanmar's opposition claimed a historic victory on Sunday for prodemocracy leader Aung San Suu Kyi in her first bid for a seat in parliament, sparking scenes of jubilation among supporters.

Thousands of people clapped and cheered outside Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) headquarters in Yangon after the party announced the Nobel Peace Prize laureate had won a parliamentary seat after by-elections.

Some people danced in the street while others wept with joy at the news, which if confirmed would mark a stunning turnaround for the former political prisoner, who was locked up by the former junta for most of the past 22 years.

Suu Kyi won an estimated 99 percent of the votes in Kawhmu constituency, according to NLD official Soe Win, based on the party's own tally. There was no independent confirmation and official results were expected within a week.

The party also claimed it was on course to win all 44 seats it contested in Sunday's





by-elections, in which a total of 45 seats were at stake -- not enough to threaten the armybacked ruling party's huge majority in parliament.

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, in Istanbul for a meeting of the "Friends of Syria" group, said Washington was committed to supporting the nascent reforms in Myanmar that have been cautiously welcomed by the West.

Observers believe Myanmar's new quasi-civilian government wanted Suu Kyi to win a place in parliament to burnish its reform credentials and smooth the way for an easing of Western sanctions.

A European Union official invited to observe the vote hailed "very encouraging" signs at the roughly dozen polling stations her team visited

US experts give nod to publish mutant bird flu studies

WASHINGTON (AFP) - A panel of US science and security experts on Friday said two papers on a mutant bird flu should be published after all, reversing its earlier decision to

withhold key details. The announcement came after the latest research and revisions to the papers led by a Dutch and a US team of scientists were reviewed by the nongovernmental US National Science Advisory Board for Biosecurity (NSABB).

The US experts had previously opposed publishing the research -- which showed how an engineered H5N1 flu virus could pass easily in the air between ferrets -- over fears it could end up in the wrong hands and unleash a deadly flu pandemic.

After meeting to review the latest details on March 29-30, the experts saw "new evidence has emerged that underscores the fact that understanding specific mutations may improve international surveillance and public health and safety.

The NSABB faced criticism after it ruled unanimously in December that a pair of USfunded studies, one by a team from Wisconsin and the other led by Netherlands-based scientist Ron Fouchier, should

At the latest NSABB meeting, experts agreed unanimously that the Wisconsin team's research should be published in full, as planned by the British journal Nature.

Meanwhile, Fouchier has insisted that the mutant virus is not as lethal as the public has been led to believe, and urged its publication so that scientists can prepare remedies should such a variant arise in nature.

Bird flu is believed to kill more than half the people it infects, making it much more lethal than typical strains of the seasonal virus.

Dutch pensioner's decision: when to die with dignity

ENSCHEDE (AFP) - With a deadly dose of barbiturates stashed in his home in a small eastern Dutch town, pensioner Hans Hillebrand is a "self-determinist": he alone wants to decide when it's time to die with dignity.

"I want to do it myself, to be responsible for it myself," the former business manager, 78, told AFP he was still perky and alert, loved tending his flower garden, listening to opera and reading.

But the day he loses his independence and the ability to participate in village life will be the day to consider "going away." "I shall be the director of my own final scene," he said.

Hillebrand is one of a growing number of aging Dutch people who prefer to make their own decisions about when and where to die -- and in a dignified way.

Senior citizens today like to decide things for themselves, more than previous generations," said Ton Vink of De Einder (The Ender in Dutch), an organisation dedicated to "informing" people who want to end their own lives

More and more Dutch voices are being raised in support of a right to claim assistance to die with dignity after "an accomplished life" and not just when the requirements by law for euthanasia are fulfilled.

A citizens' initiative called "An Accomplished Life" which supports the idea, has already gathered more than 117,000 signatures, more than the 40,000 required for a debate in the Dutch parliament, which was held in early March.

Even with the country's liberal laws on euthanasia, a doctor still has the final say whether the criteria have been fulfilled for assisted suicide.

A book titled "Solution" written by Dutch psychiatrist Bowdewijn Chabot and published in February 2010, explained how people could end their lives



(AFP) - New York's Empire State Building, the Eiffel Tower in Paris, and the Sydney Opera House were plunged into darkness for the annual Earth Hour campaign, leading a global effort to raise awareness about climate change.

Secretary General Ban Kimoon said the UN was turning off its lights "in solidarity with the men, women and children -- 20 per cent of all humankind -- who live with no access to

electricity," adding that the Earth Hour movement was "a symbol of our commitment to sustainable energy for all."

The Pacific island nation of Samoa was the first to make the symbolic gesture, with New Zealand's city landscapes later dramatically darkened as lights on buildings such as Auckland's Sky Tower were cut.

Since it began in Sydney in 2007, Earth Hour has grown to become what environmental group WWF says is the world's largest demonstration of support for action on carbon pollution.

A total of 5,251 cities took part in 2011, as the movement reached 1.8 billion people in 135 countries, it says. Newcomers to the worldwide initiative include Libya and Iraq.

"Earth Hour 2012 is a celebration of people power -- the world's largest mass environmental event in support of the planet," said chief executive of WWF-Australia Dermot O'-Gorman.

"And we're seeing hundreds of millions of people in different countries around the world take actions to go beyond the hour in support of positive actions for climate change and the planet."

The lights at the Eiffel Tower, however, were only turned off for five minutes for security reasons.

The effort was also being observed from the International Space Station, where Kuipers is hoping to share photos and live commentary as he watches from above.

"There is no better way to raise awareness for the future of the most beautiful planet in the universe," he said earlier this month.

Smartphones taking over **US market:** study



SAN FRANCISCO — Nearly half of US mobile phone owners have smartphones, with adoption of Internet-linked handsets rocketing in the past year, according to findings released by the Nielsen research firm

The number of telecom subscribers with smartphones increased 38 percent to account for 49.7 percent of the handset market by February, Nielsen reported.

Devices powered by Google-backed Android software were the most popular, accounting for 48 percent of smartphones owned, while about a third of the people had Apple iPhones, according to Nielsen.

Blackberry smartphones made by Canada-based Research In Motion accounted for 11.6 percent of the market, but buying patterns in recent months indicated people were more interested in Android devices or iPhones.

Apple chief a hit with workers

(AFP) - Apple chief Tim Cook has won over the company's employees, according to a workplace study released on Friday showing he may be better liked than his legendary predecessor Steve Jobs.

Cook topped Glassdoor.com ranking of corporate chief executives with a 97 percent approval rating by those he commands at the California-based maker of iPads, iPhones, iPods and Macintosh computers.

In comparison, Jobs had a 95 percent approval rating in the Glassdoor ranking in March of last year.

Jobs's cumulative approval rating was 97 percent when he ceded the Apple helm to Cook in August of last year due to a battle with cancer, which took his life two months later.


"While many speculated how Cook would be received by employees and how he would lead the tech giant, he seems to have settled in quite nicely," Glassdoor said in its report.

The heads of chip maker Qualcomm and consultancy Ernst & Young were close behind Cook with approval ratings of 95 percent each.

The list of the top five most popular chief executives was rounded out by American Express boss Ken Chenault and Google co-founder Larry Page, who were each given 94 percent approval ratings.

Kurds halt oil exports in payment row

BAGHDAD (AFP) - Iraq's Kurdish region halted oil exports on Sunday after Baghdad's top energy official warned it to reconsider before following through on the threat over the government's non-payment of funds

The move by Kurdistan is the latest in a long-running row between Baghdad and Kurdish authorities in Arbil, who have squabbled over payments, revenue-sharing and the central government's refusal to recognise deals Kurdish officials have signed with foreign energy firms.

Kurdistan said a week ago that it had reduced exports to 50,000 barrels of oil per day, and threatened to stop exports entirely if Iraq did not hand over \$1.5 billion Arbil said was owed to foreign oil companies working in the region.

"After consultation with the producing companies, the ministry (of natural re-sources) has reluctantly decided to halt exports until further notice," the Kurdistan regional government said in a statement on its website.

The statement said exports would be diverted to the local market for processing and refining.

Panasonic to make all mobile handsets overseas: report

Tokyo (AFP) - Japan's Panasonic is considering shifting all its production of mobile phone handsets overseas as early as this summer, a report

The electronics giant, which already produces some handsets abroad, is considering ending production at a factory in central Shizuoka prefecture, where nearly half its handsets are made, the Nikkei daily said.

Work from the Shizuoka factory will be moved to Beiiing and Malavsia, and some will be outsourced to other manufacturers abroad, although the report did not say where.

The electronics giant has warned it would see its worst-ever net loss of 780 billion yen (\$9.4 billion) for the year to March, blaming factors including the strong yen and flooding in Thailand.

Germany wants EU financial watchdogs

BERLIN (AFP) - Germany wants expert watchdogs to oversee public spending by members of the European Union to prevent future Greek-like near-bankrupcy scenarios, Spiegel magazine said in its latest edition out Monday. Finance Minister Wolfgang Schaeuble is suggesting that independent expert commissions be set up at both national and European level to do so, Spiegel said citing an internal ministry document. The commissions would be tasked with providing early warning of "abnormal developments" likely to spark a financial crisis. Germany has been called upon to provide the lion's share of EU funds to shore up debt-ridden fellow members states, such as Greece.

Roche could withdraw hostile bid of US Illumina: report GENEVA (AFP) - Swiss pharmaceutical giant Roche could withdraw its takeover bid for US gene mapper Illumina, the SonnatgsZeitung reported Sunday, citing sources close to the deal. "Illumina would be an interesting business to acquire for Roche, but it is not essential to its development, the unnamed source told the paper. The Basel-based giant launched its bid -- previously estimated at \$5.7 billion -- for Illumina on January 25. But the US provider of integrated systems for DNA sequencing, had opposed the hostile move saying Roche's offer price was too low. On Thursday, Roche increased its offer price by 15 percent but it is not clear if the sweetened proposal will persuade Illumina's leadership to back the takeover. According to SonnatgsZeitung, Roche will not increase its offer again.

SPORTS Basketball: US names 11woman squad chasing fifth gold

DENVER (AFP) - USA Basketball Friday named the first 11 members of the 12-woman squad that will seek a fifth straight Olympic gold at the London Games, a group that includes a trio of two-time Olympic champions.

Sue Bird, Tamika Catchings and Diana Taurasi, all of whom won gold medals at the 2004 and 2008 Olympic Games, return.

Four players who have each earned one Olympic gold and four newcomers to the Games are included, with the final player to be named at a later date.

Among the previous gold medallists on the team, Swin Cash was on the US team in Athens in 2004. Seimone Augusts, Sylvia Fowls and Candace Parker who all won gold in Beijing in 2008.

Tina Charles, Angel Mc-Coughtry, Maya Moore and Lindsay Whalen are headed to their first Olympics.

All 11 play professionally in the WNBA and most of them spend the US league's off-season in playing in China or Europe.

Five of those selected . Bird, Taurasi, Cash, Moore and Charles -- formerly played at the University of Connecticut, whose coach Geno Auriemma will guide the Olympic team.

Seven countries have claimed spots in the eventual 12-nation field, including host country Britain. The US clinched their berth with the 2010 world title, while Angola, Australia, Brazil, China and Russia have secured berths by winning their regional qualifying tournaments.

Twelve nations will fight for the last five spots at the Olympic qualifying tournament June 25-July 1 in Ankara, Turkey.



Cycling: Boonen wins record equalling third **Tour of Flanders**

AUDENARDE-Belgium (AFP) - Belgian cyclist Tom Boonen won the one day classic Tour of Flanders for a record equalling third time here on Sunday.

The 31-year-old - previously a winner in 2005 and 2006 - beat home Italian duo Filippo Pozzato and Alessandro Ballan in a sprint finish to the 255km race.

Boonen admitted that he hadn't been very confident of winning when he was left with just the two Italians for company.

His task had been made easier when Switzerland's Olympic time-trial champion Fabian Cancellara, the winner in 2010, fell 62km from the finish and was later diagnosed to have broken his right collarbone in three places.

Cancellara, who was one of the pre-race favourites for the second one day classic of the season, will be transferred to a hospital in Baszel, Switzerland, where he will undergo an operation.



"I'm stubborn. That's probably what it is," Bryant said of his decision to go for the shot, which gave the Lakers an 8685 lead. "If I'd have missed that shot, everybody would have killed me."

Bryant had never before missed more than 11 shots to start a game or more than 13 consecutive attempts during a game.

Despite Bryant's struggles, the Lakers led by 14 after the first quarter, but the Hornets had stormed back to take a 10point lead in the fourth.

Bryant played just over 38 minutes Saturday, right around the 38.6 he was averaging coming into the contest.





US coastguards scramble to stricken yacht in Pacific

LOS ANGELES (AFP) - The US Coast Guard scrambled Sunday to help a yacht hit by a "monstrous foaming swell" in the Pacific that injured four crew members, including two Britons and an Australian, officials said.

The 68-foot (21-meter) "Geraldton Western Australia" was caught in severe weather some 400 miles (640 kilometers) off the California coast that swept away its steering wheel and some communications equipment, race organizers said.

The injured crew members sustained suspected broken ribs and were being treated by medically-trained colleagues on the craft, one of 10 similar boats taking part in the Clipper Round the World yacht race.

A long-range HC-130 Hercules aircraft was able to drop medical supplies late Saturday, but an attempt to lower rescuers was thwarted because of the weather, and the aircraft had to return to shore, a Coast Guard statement said.

On Sunday, a Coast Guard cutter was dispatched with a helipad and chopper to link up with the stricken yacht and possibly airlift one or more of the injured, race organizers said.

The yacht, which the Coast

Guard says has 13 people on board, is sailing under secondary steering toward San Francisco. A container ship was also diverted to reach them if necessary.

In comments posted on the race's website, South African skipper Juan Coetzer said the boat was hit by a massive wave at dawn Saturday.

"We were racing along in 40-60 knot gusts. The sea was alive with rage. We were making good speed... Then at our watch change, just before the sun came up, a monstrous foaming swell broke over our stern," he said. "Mark Burkes was on the helm at the time. The water had so much force in it that it pushed Mark into the helm, snapping the pedestal clean off. We had no steering and crew were falling all over the boat."

The yacht was on the latest leg of the round-the-world race, sailing from Qingdao, China to San Francisco. The next leg should take race participants to New York, via the Panama Canal, the Coast Guard said.

Six of the 10 boats competing have now arrived in San Francisco, while three others were expected to arrive within 24 hours, said race organizers, as the stricken yacht limped toward land.

MIAMI (AFP) - World number one Novak Djokovic de- and Sampras three. feated Andy Murray 6-1, 7-6 (7/4) on Sunday to win his second straight ATP Miami Masters title and third overall.

Djokovic, who won here for the first time in 2007, became just the third man to win the title three or more times, along with Andre Agassi and Pete Sampras.

"I thought I played a great match from start to end," said Djokovic, who didn't drop a set in the tournament.

Djokovic, 24, captured his 30th ATP title, and his second this year after his triumph at the Australian Open. It marked his 11th victory in the ATP's elite Masters 1000 series.

Murray had beaten Djokovic in the semi-finals at Dubai in February, and the Serb was then upset by American John Isner in the semi-finals of the Indian Wells Masters last week.

Djokovic said that made this win, which made him the first man since Roger Federer in 2006 to successfully defend the Miami crown, all the sweeter.

Murray, who beat Djokovic in the 2009 Miami final, was playing his first match since Wednesday, when he downed Janko Tipsarevic in the quarter-finals.

He advanced to the title match on a walkover when world number two Rafael Nadal withdrew before their

semi-final with a left knee injury.

Oddly, that was Murray's second walkover of the tournament, after Canadian Milos Raonic pulled out of their scheduled third-round clash with an ankle injury.

Whether it was the layoff or not, Murray wasn't at his sharpest, his 39 unforced errors making things easier for Djokovic.

His only break chance in the entire two hour, seven minute encounter came in the fifth game of the first set, but he was unable to convert it and

stem Djokovic's momentum.

The Serb had gained the upper hand in the fourth game of the opening set, which Murray led 40-0 but ended up losing on Djokovic's second break point.

Djokovic eventually closed out the opening set with his first ace of the match, and Murray promptly found himself in a 0-30 hole in the first game of the second -- typical of the pressure he faced throughout the second set.

Murray said his biggest problem was his return game, normally his strong point.
