# Obama, Putin unite in warning to Syria

"AN INDEPENDENTLY OWNED AND OPERATED BUDGET SYSTEM LICENSEE"

LOS Cabos (AFP) - US President Barack Obama and Russian President Vladimir Putin called yesterday for an end to violence in Syria and said its people should be allowed to democratically decide their future.

"In order to stop the bloodshed in Syria, we call for an immediate cessation of all violence," the leaders said in a joint statement, after meeting in Mexico following days of antagonism between Moscow and Washington on the issue.

"We are united in the belief that the Syrian people should have the opportunity to independently and democratically choose their own future."

Putin told reporters after meeting Obama for the first time since he returned to the presidency that the two leaders had found "many common points" on Syria, where violence is spiraling into an allout civil war.

Washington has become increasingly frustrated over Moscow's refusal to allow the UN Security Council to take firmer action against President Bashar al-Assad over his brutal crackdown on civilians.

Obama said after the two

hours of talks that both he and Putin agreed on the need for a "political process" to prevent civil war in Syria and pledged to work with UN envoy Kofi Annan to try to end the crisis.

In their statement, the leaders said that Syria's future must be worked out by "Syrians themselves" in the "framework of Syria's sovereignty, independence, unity, and territorial integrity."

Russia has been concerned to avoid a repeat of the international mission in Libya when it was assured the West was not bent on regime change, but then saw allied warplanes help the opposition topple dictator Moamer Kadhafi.

US officials have said they want Russia's help to create a political transition similar to that which ushered Yemen's president Ali Abdullah Saleh from power in February after a year-long uprising.

"From my point of view we have found many common points on this (Syria) issue," Putin said after the talks, adding that Russia and the United States will continue discussions on how to deal with the ongoing violence.


# Fashion, fun and great music for Father's Day at Paseo Herencia



# Myanmar's Suu Kyi takes to stage in Dublin with Bono



DUBLIN (AFP) - Aung San Suu Kyi received a rock star welcome in Ireland Monday, with U2 singer Bono among those performing at a concert to honour the Myanmar democracy icon after flying in with her on his private jet.

Nobel Peace laureate Suu Kyi took to the stage with Bono to receive a prize from Amesty International at the rights group's "Electric Burma" concert in a packed Dublin theatre. She was met with cheers and a standing ovation.

Bono thanked her for being there, saying: "We know there are many many other places you could be and we understand the signal your presence here sends out and we are humbled, we are grateful."

"It is one of the great ironies that by your confinement, the world has become your home. Dublin is your world this evening"

Suu Kyi sat alongside Bono -- who has long supported Suu Kyi's freedom struggle and dedicated the song "Walk On" to her -- after the pair travelled from Oslo, Norway, where they had co-hosted a peace forum.

"To receive this award is to remind me that 24 years ago I took on duties from which I shall never be relieved but you have given me the strength to carry out," Suu Kyi said in reply. "I have discovered how much more people care. I had not expected this. I had not known how much they cared. This has come as a surprise to me and a very moving one."

Suu Kyi received Amnesty

International's Ambassador of Conscience Award, the rights group's most prestigious prize, after performances from world artists.

She won the award in 2009 but was under house arrest in Myanmar at the time so could not collect it.

After the concert at the Bord Gais Energy Theatre, thousands of people were expected at an open-air event where Suu Kyi will be given the Freedom of the City of Dublin, some 12 years after she was named for the honour.

She is expected to address the crowds, who will sing "happy birthday" to her a day before she turns 67.

An emotional Suu Kyi delivered her Nobel lecture at Oslo City Hall on Saturday, more than two decades after receiving the peace prize awarded to her in 1991 for her "non-violent struggle for democracy and human rights".

Suu Kyi's tour, which also takes in Britain, Switzerland and France, is her first trip to Europe for 24 years.

It has been clouded by con-

tinued violence in western Myanmar where dozens of people have been killed and more than 30,000 people displaced by clashes between Buddhist Rakhines and stateless Muslim Rohingya.

# Florida shooter used donated funds to pay off bills

MIAMI (AFP) - Neighborhood watch volunteer George Zimmerman and his wife used money from an online fundraising website set up for their defense to pay off credit cards and other bills, according to jailhouse recordings released Monday.

Zimmerman is accused of fatally shooting unarmed black teenager Trayvon Martin on February 26 in Sanford, Florida. The racially-charged case caused an uproar across the United States and set off a wave of protests.

Zimmerman was arrested on April 11 and released on bail April 23. He has been charged with second-degree murder.

A judge had initially set Zimmerman's bond at \$150,000, but prosecutors say that figure relied on "false representations and statements" by the defendant and his wife about the amount of money he had access to.

Zimmerman was ordered back to jail after prosecutors argued he misled the court about having no money, despite tens of thousands of dollars in donated funds raised online.

The recordings were released by the Seminole County court, along with transcripts, an affidavit and other court documents.

### Vatican's number two slams 'attempt to split Church'

VATICAN CITY (AFP) - The Vatican's number two, the reported target of a power struggle in the Church, alleged divisive forces at work on Monday.

In a rare outburst, the Secretary of State appeared to lash out at those who, according to religious observers, have been orchestrating the scandal in an attempt to oust him, and slammed media for "Dan Brown-style" reporting.

Tarcisio Bertone told the Famiglia Cristiana magazine that there was "a fierce and relentless attempt to create divisions between the Holy Father and his collaborators, and between the collaborators themselves."

However, the cardinal insisted he enjoyed support from many quarters within the Church: "I am at the heart of the fray. And I see painful things but I also see the Church by my side, people from every background who show affection."

Religious watchers have said it is unlikely that Pope Benedict XVI's butler Paolo Gabriele -- arrested on May 23 on accusations of leaking secret papal papers -- would have orchestrated such a large whistle-blowing operation alone.

Bertone said the pope had felt betrayed and "has asked himself several times, why Gabriele, who he loved like a son, should have behaved that way."

Vatican spokesman Federico Lombardi told a press conference Monday that the three retired cardinals appointed by the pope to head an investigative commission on the leaks scandal had already interviewed 23 people.

### Putin and Obama warn Iran

CABOS (AFP) - US President Barack Obama and Russian President Vladimir Putin jointly warned Iran on Monday it must comply with its nuclear obligations, as talks with Tehran in Moscow ran into trouble.

"We agree that Iran must undertake serious efforts aimed at restoring international confidence in the exclusively peaceful nature of its nuclear program," the two leaders said in a joint statement after meeting in Mexico.


The statement called for "minimisation of the civilian use of highly enriched uranium" and came hours after the first day of meetings in Moscow between Iran and five world powers attempting to find a diplomatic solution to the standoff over the Iranian nuclear programme.

Although there were few signs at the Moscow meeting of Iran's willingness to give in to western demands to scale down its program, Obama and Putin said they "look forward to constructive engagement with Iran through the P5+1 process."

Obama, who has warned he will not rule out military action against Iran's nuclear sights said that there was "still time and space" for diplomacy to work.

Russia has previously slammed the idea of military strikes against Iran but says it expects Tehran to take the first step in the diplomatic process in Moscow in order to avoid drastic scenarios.

Failure of the talks could have heavy repercussions, with the United States and its ally Israel refusing to rule out the option of airstrikes against the Iranian nuclear programme and Tehran facing sanctions that could cripple the economy.





# Women march in Rio to protest 'green economy'

RIO DE JANEIRO (AFP) - Thousands of women representing social and farm movements marched in central Rio yesterday to rail against the "green economy" advocated by the Rio+20 conference on sustainable development.

Behind a large banner from the international peasant movement Via Campesina proclaiming "the peoples are against the mercantilization of nature," they marched several miles to the Flamengo park, the venue for the "People's Summit" organized by civil society groups on the sidelines of the Rio+20 event.

Several hundred men closed off the march to show their solidarity.

# Court delays start of prosecution's case in Mladic trial

THE HAGUE (AFP) - The Yugoslavia war crimes court yesterday delayed the start of the prosecution's case in the trial of Bosnian Serb ex-army chief Ratko Mladic, the second time the proceedings were suspended.

The court "suspended the start of presentation of the Prosecution's evidence in the case of Ratko Mladic until further notice," the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia said in a statement.

It did not give a reason for its ruling, but the proceedings have been on hold since a day after the trial started on May 16 because of "irregularities" in the transfer of prosecution documents to the defence.

"The decision was made following submissions by the defence and the prosecution with regards to the disclosure of evidentiary material," was all that yesterday's statement said, adding that the reasoning would be given "in due course."

On May 31 lawyers defending Mladic asked for a sixmonth extension to the trial's delay.

Judges had set June 25 as the date for the former general's trial to resume with the testimony of the prosecution's first witness.

Mladic, 70, the so-called "Butcher of Bosnia," is charged with 11 counts of war crimes,

crimes against humanity and genocide committed during Bosnia's 1992-1995 war.

They include in particular the masterminding of the July 1995 Srebrenica massacre of almost 8,000 Muslim men and boys, the worst atrocity on European soil since World War II.

Prosecutors also hold Mladic responsible for the 44-month siege of Sarajevo that left an estimated 10,000 people dead, the vast majority of them civilians.

Mladic, who was arrested a year ago in Serbia after more than 16 years on the run, pleaded not guilty to the charges at an earlier court hearing. He faces life imprisonment if convicted

# US probes safety of 1.4 mn Toyotas after fires

CHICAGO (AFP) - US regulators have expanded a probe into a potential safety hazard in 1.4 million Toyota vehicles after nine people were injured in 161 crashes or fires.

No deaths were reported from the fires which began in the power window switch. Regulators did not provide details on the severity of the injuries in a notice posted on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration website.

The investigation comes as Toyota is still working to regain US market share after its reputation was damaged by a series of mass recalls beginning in 2009 and then its supplies were hit by Japan's March 2011 quake and tsunami disaster.

Toyota nonetheless regained its position as the world's number-one automaker by sales in the first quarter of 2012, stealing back the lead from US giant General Motors.

This latest potential defect was discovered after certain



Toyota vehicles experienced a "higher rate of fire and thermal event incidents," regulators said.

The affected vehicles include Toyota's top-selling Camry, the Camry Hybrid, the RAV4, Yaris and Highlander Hybrid, built between 2006 and 2008.

The investigation began in February and was upgraded to an "engineering analysis" on Thursday. It could, but may not necessarily, result

in a recall.

Toyota also reported 49 warranty claims linked to fires in the power window switch.

# Top court ruling on US health reforms hotly anticipated



WASHINGTON (AFP) - With the US Supreme Court set to rule within days on the constitutionality of President Barack Obama's health care reforms many Americans are fearful of the political fallout of the decision.

While the nation's nine top justices are meant to base their decisions on the framework provided by the centuries-old US Constitution, many believe the divided bench could be swayed by their own political leanings.

"What they're afraid of is that the subjective impulse of the judge, rather than something more objective, will control the decision," Justice Stephen Breyer told AFP.

The high court is expected to render its decision on the centerpiece of Obama's political legacy by the end of June as the nation gears up the November elections.

The Democratic president is fighting to win a second White House term as his Republican challenger Mitt Romney, who has vowed to repeal the health care reforms, erodes the gap in the polls amid the sour economy.

The court will decide if the core of the law, which obliges all Americans to purchase health care insurance or face penalties, is constitutional, and if not, whether the rest of Obama's reforms hold up.

Since oral arguments were heard in March, experts have been trying to read the tealeaves to offer up predictions on which way the court will

Many were surprised by the reactions of the conservative judges, the largest bloc on the bench, who seemed inclined to overturn the law, which aims to provide health insurance to 32 million Americans.

Overturning the law would deal a blow to Obama -- a trained constitutional lawyer - and offer a golden opportunity for Republicans to hammer him on his credibility and leadership qualities ahead

of November's vote.

But Americans don't buy it. Three quarters believe Supreme Court decisions are guided by judges' personal or political views. According to the recent survey for the New York Times and CBS, barely one in eight Americans believe the rulings are based solely on legal arguments.

The court's last most obvious foray into politics was in 2000, when it declared George W. Bush the winner of the presidential elections over Al Gore

"If the Supreme Court justices follow the constitution text and history and many of their own opinions on federal power, they would easily uphold the Affordable Care Act," said lawyer Elizabeth Wydra, who is more in favor of the administration.

"There are a number of previous decisions particularly about the Commerce Clause that the court would be ignoring if they strike down the act," she said.

But she said despite that some justices like the conservative Antonin Scalia could go "against some of their own words on the legal issue at hand."

But a former Bush administration lawyer David Rivkin denied the ruling would be based on the judges' own political preferences.

"It's political only because it benefits political parties, (that's) the only way we can say it's political," he argued.

"The criticism that it will be political is (itself) a political criticism," suggested Randy Barnett, in favor of the plaintiffs. "What is at stake is whether our federal government has limited powers."

Marcus also did not believe the Supreme Court will base its decision on partisan politics, but rather more on ideology. Five conservative judges on the court "fear big government swallowing up and supplanting the traditional role of the states," he said.

# 'Diet or quit' Pakistan tells pot-bellied police

ISLAMABAD (AFP) - A Pakistan police commander has ordered tens of thousands of pot-bellied officers to diet or quit frontline duties, officials said Monday in what one newspaper dubbed the "battle of the bulge".

Habibur Rehman, police chief in Pakistan's most populous province Punjab, has ordered 175,000 personnel not to allow their waistlines to exceed 38 inches (96 cm), spokeswoman Nabila Ghazanfar told AFP.

At least 50 percent of Punjab police are overweight, Ghazanfar said.

Local daily The News said the number overweight officers in the city of Rawalpindi, the headquarters of the army that has been hit by numerous Taliban attacks, stood at more than 77 percent, adding that "policemen appear to be losing the battle of the bulge".

Police said officers had been given until June 30 to shape up and those deemed too fat from July 1 would not be given jobs in the field.

Overweight officers are ineffective and "cannot chase bandits, robbers and other criminals properly", she added, blaming the problem on under-staffing.

"We have a shortage of personnel, what can you expect when one official is doing the job of six people? They don't get time for physical fitness," she told AFP.

Another official who did not wish to be named said 100 stations were initially singled out for the exercise order, but Rehman later decided to send warning letters to the entire Punjab police force.

## Faulty PIP breast implants not toxic



LONDON (AFP) - Faulty breast implants made by PIP, the French company that sparked a global health scare, do not pose any long-term medical threats, British health authorities said in a final report Monday.

But the experts warned that the implants, which used industrial-grade silicone gel intended for use in mattresses, are twice as likely to rupture as other brands.

More than 400,000 women worldwide are believed to have received implants made by PIP -- which was shut down in 2010 -- and many countries have urged women to have them removed.

NHS group's leader Professor Bruce Keogh said repeated

tests on different batches of PIP implants had been carried out in Britain, France and Australia and shown that the implants were not toxic.

"We have, however, found that these implants are substandard when compared to other implants, and that they are more likely to rupture."

The report said PIP implants have a 15 percent to 30 percent chance of rupturing after ten years, compared to 10 percent to 14 percent for other brands.

Rupturing of the PIP implants has caused symptoms such as tenderness or swollen lymph glands in a small proportion of women but there is no link to cancer despite earlier fears, the study said.

# CEOs urge Rio+20 leaders to make water security top priority




Sudanese refugees take water in buckets in the Sudanese refugee camp of Djabal, eastern Chad near Goz Beida.

SAO PAOLO (AFP) - Some 45 corporate chiefs attending the Rio+20 conference on sustainable development yesterday pledged to make water security a strategic priority and called for decisive action by governments.

Speaking on behalf of the 45 CEOs, Igal Aisenberg, chief

executive of Israel's Netafim micro-irrigation company, urged concerted action by governments, the private sector, civil society and others "to tackle the global crisis in water access, quality and sanitation."

Committing to water sustainability were chiefs of global companies such as Pep-

sico, Coca Cola, Nestle, Saint-Gobain, Royal Dutch Shell, Akzo Nobel, Bayer, Heineken and Pernod Ricard.

All have endorsed the UN Global Compact's CEO Water Mandate initiative launched by UN chief Ban Ki-moon in 2007

In a statement addressed to the Rio+20 leaders due to debate sustainable development here from Wednesday to Friday, the 45 executives urged them "to take decisive actions during and after this summit on one of our world's great challenges -- water."

"Problems related to water availability, quality and sanitation are undermining development in many regions of the world - exacting an enormous human cost while also undermining critical life-giving ecosystems," they said.

Roughly 800 million people

Roughly 800 million people around the world lack access to safe drinking water, and 2.5 billion lack basic sanitation," according to the United Nations.

The UN also estimates that two thirds of the world's sevenbillion-strong population will face water scarcity by 2025.

Adrian Sym, executive director as the Alliance for Water Stewardship, hailed the CEOs statement "as an act of leadership by the private sector".

"The problems are so vast that governments alone cannot solve them," he added, stressing that cross-sectorial leadership was a critical piece in solving the problem.

Robert ter Kuile, a senior executive at Pepsico, said water was critical to "our entire value chain" and reaffirmed his company's goal of "a 20 percent reduction (in water usage) per unit of production in (its) operations by 2015."

# Facebook pays \$10 million to settle ad suit



(AFP) - Facebook will pay \$10 million to settle a lawsuit from users who claimed their names, images and other information were improperly used in advertising described as "sponsored stories," court documents showed.

According to documents dated earlier this month and available online, Facebook and a series of plaintiffs submitted an agreement to a federal judge in San Jose, California.

The lawsuit was filed in 2011 by a group led by a Washington state Internet user named Angel Fraley. The suit alleged that Facebook users, including minors, had their names and likenesses used in ads without their permission.

The suit contended Facebook improperly used advertising when a member indicated he or she "liked" a particular company.

The "like" was passed on to

the friends of those members as an implied endorsement of a company or product. In some cases, the profile or picture was used in the "sponsored stories" that the suit said was a form of advertising.

A mediator assigned to the case said the agreement included the "substantial sum" of \$10 million "to be distributed to groups whose charters set out actions and programs relevant to advocacy related to the purposes for which the case was brought."

A settlement in the case was unveiled earlier this month but terms were not disclosed.

The company, which launched a massive public offering last month, is under growing scrutiny for its privacy policies. It is also under pressure from investors to find ways to monetize its social network with more than 900 million members.





### **Emerging economies pose conditions** on IMF boost

LOS Cabos (AFP) - Leaders of emerging economies said yesterday that they wanted the IMF to put in place reforms to increase their influence before they step up contributions to a fund to prevent future crises.

Leaders of the so-called BRICS -- Brazil, China, Russia, India and South Africa -said in a statement at a summit in Mexico that they were willing to step up their contributions to the IMF but only once existing funds dry up.

The International Monetary Fund, hoping to prevent a worsening of the global economic crisis, called last year for \$500 billion in an emergency firewall to support nations at risk of contagion, but the money has fallen short.

The five BRICS leaders "agreed to increase resources available with the International Monetary Fund. In this context, they agreed to enhance their own contributions to the IMF," said a statement released by India.

But the statement did not include numbers and the BRICS said that they expected their money to be used after current resources "are substantially utilized."

"This would promote adequate burden sharing amongst IMF creditors. These new contributions are being made in anticipation that all the reforms agreed upon in 2010 will be fully implemented in a timely manner, including a comprehensive reform of voting power and reform of quota shares," it said.

The BRICS leaders met in the Mexican resort of Los Cabos ahead of a summit of the Group of 20 major economies, which will spend two days looking for a way to slam the brakes on a spiraling debt crisis in the eurozone.

The emerging economies' call could be seen as a challenge to the United States, the world's largest economy, which has resisted contributing to the

new fund.

President Barack Obama is eager to stem the eurozone's woes, which are clouding over the US economy and his own re-election hopes, but faces intense political resistance at home to new financial commitments.

After Group of 20 finance ministers and central bankers met in Washington in April, the IMF announced a firewall size of \$430 billion but has come up with only \$340 billion in contributions.

The eurozone is by far the largest contributor, promising some \$200 billion, raising concerns by some potential contributors that the firewall would eventually turn into a new European bailout fund.

Japan has contributed \$60 billion, while Britain, South Korea and Saudi Arabia have each pledged \$15 billion. Singapore and other European governments have also contributed smaller amounts.

### Spain coal miners block roads in mass strike

### **US: Mexico to join Trans-**Pacific trade talks

WASHINGTON - The United States said yesterday it welcomed Mexico's entry into ongoing talks on a regional free trade agreement in the Asia-Pacific, but was silent about the status of Canada and Japan's bids to join the negotia-

### **Putin: Crisis-hit countries** need trade flexibility

LOS Cabos (AFP) - Russian President Vladimir Putin called yesterday for new trade rules to allow countries like Russia to erect protective trade barriers to save jobs when hit by financial crisis.

As the G20 summit of top global leaders opened in Los Cabos, Mexico, Putin also urged the group to take action to give emerging economic giants more say in the running of the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.

In an opinion piece published in the Mexican daily newspaper El Universal, Putin assailed the hypocrisy of countries advocating free trade but instituting protectionist barriers to support their economies in the past few years.

Putin said global trade fell 12 percent in 2009, "largely because, despite the public statements to the contrary, some countries made extensive de facto use of tough protectionist measures to protect their own markets.

He accused unnamed governments of declaring protectionism unacceptable while 'devising ever more sophisticated ways to protect their own economies, disguising protectionist measures as environmental or technical restrictions, for example."

While Russia has remained financially stable through the current crisis, Putin said, it remains vulnerable to slower growth and sharp swings in commodity prices, on which Russia depends heavily for export income.

Putin meanwhile urged the Group of 20 leaders to take concrete steps to reform the management of the US and Europe-dominated IMF and World Bank to reflect the new power of the emerging economies.

The G20 must move "from talk of increasing the developing countries and 'new' economic powers' role in these institutions' management to taking practical steps and giving them a greater say in drafting and adopting the major basic decisions."

The Russian leader also called for tighter regulation of derivatives, the complex financial instruments at the center of many banking blowups and wild swings on currency and equity markets.

He said global financial reforms in the wake of the 2008-2009 crisis were incomplete and that the world's financial structure still contains "many internal risks and contradictions" that fuel instability.

# Paul McCartney: rock's patriarch still going strong at 70

LONDON (AFP) - His ballad "Yesterday" is one of the most covered songs in history -- but as he turned 70, ex-Beatle Paul McCartney shows no signs of settling back to reflect on his extraordinary past.

Fresh from wowing huge crowds at Queen Elizabeth II's diamond jubilee concert and with another headline gig -- the London Olympics opening ceremony -- booked for next month, retirement looks a way off for the British legend.

"If I'm really enjoying this, why retire?" the most prolific, most commercially-successful former member of the Beatles told the British music magazine Mojo last year.

"People say to me, 'You work so hard'," added McCartney. "We don't work hard, we play music."

Between his years with the Fab Four, his work with Wings



ents in the port city in northwest England, McCartney met John Lennon at the age of 15 and the pair formed the Quarrymen, the skiffle band that eventually metamorphosed into the Beatles.

McCartney, Lennon, George Harrison and Ringo Starr would become synonymous with mobs of screaming fans, 1971, and used his ingenious ear for melody -- which had earlier given life to classics such as "Hey Jude" and "Blackbird" -- to rack up a decade of hits with the new group.

Linda, a renowned photographer and animal rights activist, died of breast cancer in 1998. After 29 years of marriage, McCartney described the loss as "total heartbreak".

But he was back late the next year with a new album, of mainly cover versions, and has continued the Beatles' experimental tradition -- a techno record and two classical works are among more than a dozen solo studio albums.

He has also famously duetted with the likes of Michael Jackson and Stevie Wonder.

Away from music, the singer has dabbled in painting, directed the film "Give My Regards To Broad Street", and campaigned on causes ranging from animal rights to peace between the Israelis and Palestinians.

and his solo career, McCartney has written or co-written more than 50 top 10 singles.

Macca, as he is affectionately known, released his latest album "Kisses on the Bottom" in February, and is just finishing a world tour.

And as he bounced onto the stage and belted out a string of hits in the shadow of Buckingham Palace this month, he did not look like a man with eight grandchildren.

It may be the singer's third marriage, to US heiress Nancy Shevell in October, that has put the spring back in his step after his bitter divorce from model-turned-campaigner Heather Mills in 2008.

The Sunday Times Rich List estimates that Shevell, 51, brings £150 million to the couple's coffers, giving them a combined fortune of some £665 million.

This makes him Britain's richest performer -- but he insists he has never forgotten his roots. "Deep inside I'm still the boy from Liverpool," he has said.

Born to working-class par-

mop-top haircuts, and an image of four men strolling


over London's Abbey Road at a zebra crossing.

Simply put, they were one of the most powerful cultural influences of their era. They are also the best-selling band in history, with their record label EMI estimating all-time sales of more than a billion discs and tapes.

Relentlessly imaginative, the band would develop the catchy tunes that sparked "Beatlemania" in 1964 into an evolving sound incorporating every influence from psychedelia to country and western.

Lennon and McCartney formed one of the most celebrated songwriting partnerships of the 20th century, but their creative differences ultimately helped bring about the Beatles' break-up in 1970.

McCartney formed Wings with his first wife Linda in



McCartney is often mistakenly described as "the last remaining Beatle" -- something that the oft-overlooked drummer Ringo Starr, who is also still recording, bears with good-natured amusement.

"We are good friends," Starr has said. "We're the only two who've experienced all this who are still here."

MONTREAL (AFP) - The drummer for the British rock group Radiohead paid homage Sunday to Scott Johnson, the sound technician killed when an outdoor stage set up in a Toronto park for a group concert collapsed. Johnson died Saturday when part of the metal-frame stage at Downsview Park collapsed, a Toronto police spokesman said. Johnson "was a lovely man, always positive, supportive and funny; a highly skilled and valued member of our great road crew. We will miss him very much. "Our thoughts and love are with Scott's family and all those close to him," read the message, signed simply "Phil." The late Johnson, 33, was a native of Doncaster, England, according to a group spokesman cited by Canadian media. The Saturday accident occurred about three and a half hours before the show was to start. According to Radiohead's official website, the Toronto concert was sold out. Downsview Park can accommodate up to 40,000 spectators.



# Spain, Italy through, as Group C concludes

GDANSK (AFP) - Defending champions Spain on Monday beat Croatia 1-0, ending Balkan dreams of a Euro 2012 knock-out berth, as Italy ran out 2-0 winners against the Republic of Ireland to qualify in second spot in Group C.

Vicente Del Bosque and Slaven Bilic's sides were goalless in Gdansk at halftime in a lacklustre affair from which Spain only

nio Cassano and Mario Balotelli.

The Italians -- who trailed both Spain and Croatia by two points going into the game with the Irish having already being eliminated after two defeats -- took the lead in the 35th minute with a Cassano header from a corner.

But Ireland goalkeeper Shay Given will be disappointed after he spooned away what seemed like a

needed a draw to top the group and go through.

But with Italy leading in the other game, top spot for La Roja looked uncertain until substitute Jesus Navas linked up with Barcelona's Andres Iniesta and the Sevilla man crashed the ball into an empty net as the Croatian defence looked on.

There was more than the suspicion of offside in both men's runs into the box but the Croatian appeal about the 88th-minute goal was to no avail.

In Poznan, western Poland, Giovanni Trapattoni's Ireland were beaten by two goals in each half from Antostraightforward shot to give away the set-piece kick in the first place.

Given, however, could do little about Italy's second goal, with Manchester City striker Mario Balotelli holding off Ireland defend John O'Shea on another corner to volley home from the six yard line on the stroke of fulltime.

As group winners, Spain, with seven points, now play the runners-up of Group D in Donetsk, Ukraine, on Saturday, while runners-up Italy, who finished on five points, take on the winners of Group D in the capital Kiev on Sun-

The last quarter-final qualifiers will be decided on Tuesday, when Ukraine take on England in Donetsk and France play Sweden in Group D. Every team except Sweden can still qualify.

UEFA meanwhile banned Denmark's Nicklas Bendtner for one match and fined him 100,000 euros (80,000 pounds \$126,000) for flashing the sponsored waistband of his underpants while celebrating a goal during his side's 3-2 defeat to Portugal.

The suspension means the Sunderland forward will miss Denmark's next World Cup qualifier for the tournament in Brazil in 2016.

Bendtner can appeal but the online betting firm whose name appeared on his underpants said the decision was 'hysterical and deeply cynical" while the fine was more severe than those handed out to football federations for more serious incidents.

UEFA president Michel Platini elsewhere condemned Croatia fans who racially abused Italy's Mario Balotelli in their group match last week, revealing that he had previously warned football's authorities in the Balkan nation about the problem.

A ruling on the case -- the first for racism at Euro 2012 -- is expected on Tuesday, with Croatia's football federation facing a possible stiff penalty after up to 500 fans were reported to have taunted Balotelli throughout the match.


Platini told reporters in Warsaw that he was "not happy" about the situation and said that he had warned the federation about the problem of racist fans when he visited last year.

"They (Croatia) have a good team which plays well but it's unacceptable when you've got a hundred or so arseholes among the crowd," he said. "They (the Croatian federation) knew (that it could happen)."

"Any form of racism is a problem. One case is too many."

Croatia, however, looked set for fresh sanctions as Monday's match referee Wolfgang Stark had to briefly halt the match when flares were thrown and smoke billowed over the pitch.

### Swedes not in the mood to roll over for French

KIEV (AFP) - Sweden may have no chance of qualifying for the Euro 2012 quarter-finals having lost both their games thus far but if France are expecting an easy ride into the last eight they are in for a shock today.

The Swedish squad are all determined to bow out on a high after twice letting leads slip to lose 2-1 and 3-2 to cohosts Ukraine and England respectively.

For coach Erik Hamren and the players the pride factor apart there are different things motivating them.

Hamren, who took over in 2009 after a successful club coaching career in Norway and Denmark, wants to come away with a win so as to be able to continue his project in developing the team into a more adventurous and technically capable side - defeat

could bring an abrupt end to his dream and his tenure.

'Today's match is important for Sweden and for other sides," said Hamren, an emotional character who accused some of his players of being cowards after the Ukraine loss.

"I want to see the same professionalism that the players have already shown here. We want to win the match.

"I believe that we can keep on working along the same lines and get closer to being the team that I want it to be.

"We have done many good things but the great teams know how to attract luck. We are not there yet."

However, Hamren said that he hadn't got a special speech prepared for motivating the players for the game but nevertheless he would say something.

# **Baseball:** Jury rules Clemens not guilty on all charges

WASHINGTON (AFP) - Former Major League Baseball star Roger Clemens was acquitted on Monday on charges of perjury, making false statements and obstructing Congress for denying he took performance-enhancing drugs.

Clemens was found not guilty by a federal jury on three charges of making a false statement under oath, two charges of perjury and one count of obstruction of Congress during a 2008 US Congressional hearing on doping in baseball.

If convicted, Clemens could have faced 30 years in prison and a fine of \$1.5 million.

Clemens had steadfastly de-

nied any wrongdoing even as his former trainer, Brian Mc-Namee, told jurors that he had injected Clemens with steroids and human growth hormones, an account he first gave US lawmakers in 2008.

"I put a lot of hard work into that career," Clemens said outside the courthouse after the verdicts were announced.

"It's kind of uncomfortable to sit there and hear people talk about you, good or bad. I want to thank the people who came in on my behalf. I appreciate my teammates who came in (and made) all the e-mails and phone calls."

Asked how he felt after the verdict offered a measure of vindication, Clemens said, "Just very thankful and appreciative. I just want to thank these guys (his lawyers), who from day one listened to what I had to say.

"It has been a hard five years."

Clemens thanked his family for support and paused, choked with emotion, before exclaiming in a sigh of relief, "Whew."

Rusty Hardin, Clemens' main attorney, said that they were surprised to be told there was a verdict because when they had departed the courthouse hours earlier they were told that a verdict was unlikely for two or three more days.

The verdict came after nearly 10 hours of deliberation by the jury, ending a 10-week trial that proved to be the deepest investigation yet into whether or not a Major League Baseball star had taken performance-enhancing drugs.


"You won't have a problem finding people who want to play," said Ibrahimovic, who



# NBA: James powers Heat past Thunder for 2-1 series lead

MIAMI (AFP) - LeBron James had 29 points and 14 rebounds and Dwyane Wade finished with 25 points and seven assists as the Miami Heat beat Oklahoma City 91-85 Sunday to take a 2-1 series lead in the NBA finals.

Wade sank two free throws with 13 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to cap the scoring for the Heat, who are in the finals for the second year in a row and trying to win their first championship since 2006.

James, the regular season NBA Most Valuable Player, made 11-of-23 shots from the field and was a force on both defence and offence. He finished just shy of posting his sixth consecutive playoff game of 30 or more points.

Miami, which will host the next two games in the series, can take a stranglehold on the Thunder with a victory in game four on Tuesday.

Chris Bosh had 10 points and 11 rebounds for the Heat, who scored their final five points from the free-throw line in front of a crowd of 20,003 at AmericanAirlines Arena

Miami won despite shooting just 37 percent from the field and committing 12 turnovers, one more than the

Thunder. It was one of the Heat's lowest field goal shooting games of this year's playoffs.

NBA scoring champion Kevin Durant had 25 points, Russell Westbrook scored 19 points and Kendrick Perkins had 10 for the Thunder, who got off to their best start of the series in the first quarter but couldn't execute down the stretch.

Durant got into foul trouble for the second game in a row and had to sit on the bench for a time in the third, which seemed to slow down the Thunder's attack.

Both teams made mistakes and turned the ball over in the fourth, but Miami had more composure at the end of the game.

With just 16 seconds to play, and the Thunder trailing by four points, Oklahoma City's Thabo Sefolosha tried to hit Westbrook but turned the ball over with a bad inbound pass, forcing the Thunder to foul Wade, who then made two free throws.

The Thunder came out much better in the first quarter than they had in the opening two games. But they couldn't stop the Heat offence as Miami's big three of James, Wade and Bosh started clicking from the opening tip-off.

James scored 10 points in the first for the Heat, who zipped the ball around quickly on offence, making the Thunder defence look slow and flatfooted at times.

For the third straight game, the Heat also dominated in the paint in the first quarter by scoring 20 points compared to 12 for the Thunder

But Oklahoma kept the score close all game thanks to Westbrook and Durant. Durant shot six-of-10 from the field and had 13 points in the first half while the sometimes erratic Westbrook had 13 points and didn't turn the ball over once.

Spoelstra said he was pleased with the way Miami didn't fold in the third quarter when the Thunder made a charge.

"This playoff run that we've been on, we've been knocked down to the canvas several times," Spoelstra said. "We got down by 10 tonight but our guys furrowed their brows and got back to grinding."

The teams traded three pointers to end the first half as Miami's Shane Battier nailed a three pointer just 20 seconds before Westbrook finished the scoring in the first half with a three-point shot that cut Miami's lead to

47-46.

Thunder guard Derek Fisher registered the first four-point play in the NBA finals in three years in the third quarter. The former Los Angeles Laker, who is in his 15th season, was fouled on a shot from beyond the arc then made the free throw with 4:33 left to give the Thunder a 10-point lead, 64-54.

But the Heat went on a 15-7 run in the final 5:41 of the third with Durant on the bench to take a 69-67 lead into the fourth.
