Australian PM warns of 'zombie, K-Pop' doomsday

SYDNEY (AFP) - Australian Prime Minister Julia Gillard Thursday weighed into the debate about whether the world will end on December 21 under the Mayan calendar in a spoof video about Korean pop and flesh-eating zombies.

In a one-minute video address recorded for the youth radio station Triple J, a sombre-looking Gillard said the pending apocalypse was at hand despite there being no proof found by the "best and brightest" government scientists.

"My dear remaining fellow Australians, the end of the world is coming," she said, tongue in cheek.

"Whether the final blow comes from flesh-eating zombies, demonic hell-beasts or from the total triumph of K-Pop, if you know one thing about me it is this -- I will always fight for you to the very end."

"Good luck to you all."

Gillard recorded the message for a special "end of the world" programme being broadcast on Triple J Friday after Australian science writer Karl Kruszelnicki warned December 7 was the world's real end-date.

Kruszelnicki, a renowned author and science commentator, said he reached the date by putting the Mayan and Gregorian calendar into a complex algorithm combining mathematics and comedy. The video went viral on social media after being uploaded to YouTube, with most people seeing the funny side, although a few questioned whether it was a waste of taxpayers' money.

Triple J host Tom Ballard admitted he had been surprised when Gillard agreed to take part "but I'm grateful because everyone needs to be warned and informed", joking that he understood she had now retreated to a bunker.

"I don't think it's hilarious at all, I think it's a very serious matter and people are worried," Ballard told AFP.

He said he was anticipating "zombies, natural disasters, people not getting along very well, being quite mean to each other, and of course all the world's religions proving to be false" when the end came on Friday.

December 21 represents the end of a cycle in the Mayan long count calendar that began in the year 3114 before Christ.

Washington state lights up as marijuana legalized

LOS ANGELES (AFP) - Potsmokers lit up in Washington state Thursday as recreational marijuana became legal in a historic first for the United States, clouded by the fact that federal law still bans the practice.

Midnight pot parties were reported across the western US state as a new law came into force following a November 6 referendum to legalize private consumption of marijuana for recreational use.

The law made it legal for those over 21 to possess and use up to an ounce (28 grams) of marijuana. A number of US states have already legalized pot for medicinal purposes, but Washington is the first allowing it purely for fun.

Colorado residents approved a similar law last

month, on the same day President Barack Obama's was reelected, but its pot-lovers will have to wait until January 5 to light up with impunity.

But even while Washington's marijuana fans partied, the limits of the new law were underlined: the Space Needle gathering was technically illegal, since the new law allows only private, not public, consumption of weed.

Entrepreneurs are already eyeing the lucrative business opportunities provided by the advent of legal marijuana. Some have already dubbed them "ganja-preneurs."

"Our stores are going to have the feel of a fine cigar shop," Jamen Shiveley, an ex Microsoft executive who hopes to open as many as a couple of dozen pot shops, told CNN.

Brazil mourns iconic architect Niemeyer

BRASILIA (AFP) - Brazil on Thursday mourned its iconic architect Oscar Niemeyer as tributes poured in from around the world eulogizing a towering figure of modern architecture.

"I join the whole of Brazil in mourning him," ex-president Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva wrote Thursday, a day after Niemeyer passed away in Rio at the age of 104.

"He left us but will always be among us, present in the lines of buildings he designed in Brazil and around the world," he added.

Dressed in his favorite blue navy blue suit and a blue striped shirt, Niemeyer was embalmed in Rio early Thursday before being flown here.

A solemn memorial cere-

mony was being held in the Planalto presidential palace in Brasilia, the futuristic capital he helped created.

Late Thursday, Niemeyer's body was to be flown back to his native Rio for a private wake by family and friends.

And early Friday, the body will lie in state hours before the burial at the Sao Joao Batista cemetery in Rio's Botafogo district.

Soon after Niemeyer's death was announced, President Dilma Rousseff hailed him as "one of Brazil's geniuses" and a "revolutionary who "always dreamt of a more egalitarian society".

Tributes poured in from abroad as well, with fellow winners of the Pritzker prize, likened to architecture's Nobel, remembering Niemeyer as a colossus in his field and his flare for wavy, curvaceous structures as a source of inspiration and creativity.

UN Chief Ban Ki-moon hailed him as "a towering figure and one of the original architects of United Nations Headquarters in New York."

Foreign ministers of the Mercosur regional trade bloc gathered in Brasilia Thursday ahead of Friday's summit named him "an illustrious Mercosur citizen".

From Europe, British architect Norman Foster led tributes to Niemeyer, remembering him as an inspiration for himself and a generation of architects and that meeting him --last year in Rio -- was like meeting one's hero.

Egypt's Morsi says will not tolerate killings or sabotage

CAIRO (AFP) - Egypt's President Mohamed Morsi said he will not tolerate killings or sabotage but will respect free speech, in a live address to the nation on Thursday after bloody clashes between his supporters and opponents.

"We respect peaceful freedom of speech but will never allow anyone to take part in killings and sabotage," he said in the speech which came amid the worst political crisis since his election in June.

On Thursday medics reported seven people had died in overnight clashes between Islamist Morsi supporters and secular-leaning opponents outside the presidential palace.

The anti-Morsi camp is furious with the president for his assuming sweeping powers two weeks ago and by what it feels was the railroading through by an Islamist-dominated panel of a draft constitution.

Egyptian protesters set fire to the Muslim Brotherhood's main headquarters in Cairo on Thursday after storming the large villa, a spokesman for Islamist movement told

Eccentric tech guru McAfee arrested in Guatemala



GUATEMALA CITY (AFP) - US Internet security guru John McAfee, on the run from authorities in Belize over a murder probe, has been arrested in Guatemala for illegally entering the country, police said.

The arrest of the eccentric 67-year-old entrepreneur-turned-adventurer marks the latest twist in a novel-like tale of intrigue involving a murdered American expatriate and allegations of drug-fueled escapades with guns and prostitutes.

Police spokesman Pablo Castillo told AFP that McAfee

had been arrested for entering the country illegally and Guatemala rejected an asylum petition from US Internet security guru John McAfee and said it would deport him back to Belize, where he is wanted for questioning in a murder probe.

The former Silicon Valley entrepreneur had been in hiding for more than three weeks until he crossed the border into Guatemala on Monday with his girlfriend Sam Vanegas, 20, after devising elaborate ruses to confuse police.

Belizean authorities are seeking to question McAfee as a person of interest over the November 11 killing of his neighbor, fellow American Gregory Faull, 52, who was shot in the head with a 9-mm and found in a pool of his own blood.

McAfee amassed an estimated \$100 million fortune during the early days of the Internet in the 1990s, designing the pioneering anti-virus software that bears his name.

London council rejects plans for mega-mosque

LONDON (AFP) - Plans by an Islamic group to build a giant mosque able to accommodate more than 9,000 worshippers in the shadow of London's Olympic Park have been rejected by the local authority.

Tablighi Jamaat, a missionary group with roots in India, has been trying since 1999 to build the mosque on a former chemical site in West Ham in east London, which would have become one of the biggest Islamic centres in western Europe.

It would have included a prayer hall for up to 7,440 men and a separate facility for almost 2,000 women.

Newham Borough Council rejected the proposal at a planning meeting yesterday, saying it was not consistent with development plans for the area and citing concerns about the size of the project and its impact on traffic.

"There are 90,000 Muslims around the borough,""The Muslim community is growing and there is need for bigger worship. We are extremely let down. We think it is unjust because of the demand of the local people and the Muslim community."community leader Ala Uddin Ahmed said.

The council is engaged in a separate legal fight against Tablighi Jamaat which it says no longer has permission to use part of the 6.6 hectare (16.5 acre) site to house a temporary mosque complex that can accommodate 2,500 people.

The plans to build the giant mosque sparked nationwide concern because of its size and past accusations that Tablighi Jamaat has radicalised young Muslims.

Tablighi Jamaat is the world's biggest Islamic missionary movement although it focuses its energies on Muslim communities rather than nonbelievers, according to a book on the group published by the charity Lapido Media.

Founded in India in 1926 to oppose Hinduism and British imperialism, it now operates in all countries where there are Muslims and has a worldwide membership of about 80 million. It has been active in Britain since 1944.

Chavez will not attend Mercosur summit

BRASILIA (AFP) - Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez, who traveled to Cuba for further cancer treatment a week ago, will not attend this week's Mercosur regional summit, host Brazil said Thursday.

Foreign Minister and Vice President, Nicolas Maduro, said last week that Chavez was doing well and closely following events from Cuba, where he is undergoing sessions of hyperbaric oxygenation, the breathing of pure oxygen in a sealed and pressurized chamber.

He did not say when Chavez would return to Venezuela.

The South American trading bloc plans to hold summit talks here toay to mull the admission of Bolivia and Ecuador, with Venezuela attending for the first time as full member.

Brazilian officials said Presidents Cristina Kirchner of Argentina and Jose Mujica of Uruguay have confirmed their

presence while Bolivian President Evo Morales and his Ecuadoran counterpart Rafael Correa are scheduled to attend.

It will be the group's first enlargement since Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay set it up in 1991.

Paraguay, where the senate had blocked Venezuela's membership since 2006, was suspended from the organization in June, after the dismissal of Paraguayan President Fernando Lugo, and will not take part in the Brasilia summit.

With the admission of Venezuela, which boasts some of the world's largest oil reserves, the bloc is a now an energy and farming giant with a GDP of \$3.3 billion (83 percent of that of South America) and a population of 275 million.

Bolivia and Ecuador would boost Mercosur's population to nearly 300 million.

CNN to launch programming for Latinos in US

LOS ANGELES (AFP) - Cable news giant CNN is to launch a new programming block aimed specifically at the growing Latino population living in the United States, the broadcaster announced.

CNN Latino, which will launch next month initially in Los Angeles, is "a new brand extension that targets the growing and diverse US Hispanic market," said Cynthia Hudson-Fernandez, general manager of CNN en Espanol.

The eight hours of daily programming will include news, lifestyle, documentary, talk and debate, as an alternative to

other established Hispanic networks. Over 14 million people in southern California will be able to tune in.

Hispanics constitute the largest minority tracked by the US Census, making up about 16 percent of the US population, but the proportion is expected to continue to grow in coming years and decades.

CNN en Español, CNN's independently produced 24-hour network in Spanish, is currently available in 30 million households Latin America, and seven million households across the United States.

Americans' biggest worry is access to health care

WASHINGTON (AFP) - Access to healthcare and its cost remain Americans' top medical concerns, two years after President Barack Obama's reforms were passed, a poll said.

Forty-two percent of those questioned in the Gallup poll said access or cost were the biggest problems the country faces in terms of health care.

Obama's reforms, which were upheld this year by the Supreme Court, oblige people to have health insurance. But the reform will not take full effect until 2014, which might help explain the lingering worries, Gallup said.

Access was the most urgent public health problem for 23 percent of those questioned, while cost was problem number one for 19 percent.

Not far behind was obesity, which 16 percent of those polled cited as the most urgent public health problem. Back in 1999, only one percent said the

The more acute jitters over obesity go hand in hand with a rise in the demographic, which has doubled between 1980 and

In fourth place, was cancer, health concern number one for 13 percent of Americans.

Mother beat son to death for failing to memorise Koran

LONDON (AFP) - A mother who beat her seven-year-old son to death for failing to learn the Koran by heart was found guilty by a British jury of murdering him and burning his body to hide the evidence.

Sara Ege, 33, a mathematics graduate from India, treated her son Yaseen like a "dog", beating him with a stick when he failed to memorise religious texts, Cardiff Crown Court in Wales heard.

Yaseen died in July 2010. It was initially thought that he had been killed in a fire at the family home in Pontcanna, Cardiff, but tests later revealed that he was dead before the blaze began.

Ege denied killing her son, instead blaming her husband. Yousef Ege, 38, was cleared of failing to prevent the death of his son.

She confessed to the murder, but later retracted the confession saying she had been forced into it by a threat of violence from her husband and his family.

In her confession, which was recorded by police and shown to the jury, Ege detailed how her son had collapsed after being mistreaded on the day of his death still murmuring extracts from the Koran, the holy book of Islam.

Ege decided to burn his body and went to fetch barbecue gel from the kitchen. She told police she decided to destroy his corpse because "I was too nervous"

She claimed she could not stop herself beating her son and repeatedly pledged to God that she would not do it again, but her good intentions only lasted a few days.

The court heard how, after she was charged with murder, Ege had what appears to have been a breakdown and was sent to a psychiatric unit for several months. At various times she claimed to have been motivated by voices from the devil.

Beer is good for you: study finds anti-virus powers



TOKYO (AFP) - Consuming large quantities of a key ingredient in beer can protect against winter sniffles and even some serious illnesses in small children, a Japanese brewery said citing a scientific study.

A chemical compound in hops, the plant brewers use to give beer its bitter taste, provides an effective guard against a virus that can cause severe forms of pneumonia and bronchitis in youngsters, Sapporo Breweries said Wednesday.

In research with scientists at Sapporo Medical University, the compound -- humulone -was found to be effective in curbing the respiratory syncytial (RS) virus, said the company, which funded the study.

The virus tends to spread in winter and can also cause coldlike symptoms in adults.

"We are now studying the feasibility of applying humulone to food or non-alcoholic products," he said. "The challenge really is that the bitter taste is going to be difficult for children."

The research also found that humulone alleviated inflammation caused by infection from the virus, the brewery said.

Apple's CEO to bring production back to US



NEW YORK (AFP) - Apple plans to bring some manufacturing of its computers from China to the United States next year, chief executive Tim Cook said, in a move which may help spark more domestic high-tech production.

Cook, in two interviews released Thursday, said one line of Mac computers will be made exclusively in the United States, but did not say which one, nor did he say where the manufacturing would be done.

The interviews with NBC News, aired later Thursday, and with Bloomberg Businessweek, were the first since Cook took the reins at Apple from Steve Jobs, who died last year from cancer.

Cook told NBC one of the existing Mac lines will be manufactured exclusively in

the United States, which appeared to confirm rumors on some Apple-monitoring blogs saying people had seen iMacs inscribed with "Assembled in USA"

"We've been working for years on doing more and more in the United States," Cook told NBC.

Asked why Apple would not move out of China entirely and manufacture everything in the United States, Cook told NBC, "It's not so much about price, it's about the skills."

Cook also told the broadcaster that he hopes the new project will help spur other US firms to bring manufacturing back home.

"The consumer electronics world was really never here," he said. "It's a matter of starting it here."

Scientists say NASA's budget inadequate for its goals

WASHINGTON (AFP) - NASA suffers from a "mismatch" between its goals and the budget it has been given to achieve them, according to a panel that said the US space agency may need a complete overhaul.

The National Research Council, which convened an independent group of top US scientists, urged the White House to set a clear agenda for the agency, amid disagreement in the scientific community, and in the country as a whole, regarding just where the agency should be going.

"One stated goal for NASA's human spaceflight program is to visit an asteroid by 2025," he said, but he noted that scientists inside the agency have questioned this objective.

The study, which was sponsored by NASA, called on the White House to take the lead in setting long term priorities for the US space agency.

The panel said there were several possible ways to reduce the "mismatch," though it acknowledged any path would be difficult.

One scenario would involve "an agressive restructuring program to reduce infrastructure and personnel costs and improve efficiency," the panel suggested.

Another would involve "more cost-sharing partner-ships with other US government agencies, private sector industries, and international partners," while a third possibility would be to "increase the size of the NASA budget."

Thieves steal Israeli F-16 warplane engines: *radio*

JERUSALEM (AFP) - Thieves have made off with several US-made engines for F-16 warplanes worth millions of dollars from an airbase in central Israel, army radio reported on Thursday.

Israel's Walla Internet site said preliminary findings after an investigation by military police indicated there may have been collusion between the thieves and personnel, either military or civilian, at the base.

Army radio said a military spokesman had refused any comment on the incident, except to say that an official report on the inquiry would be sent to the military prosecutor.

Last year, the Israeli military police launched an investigation after parts for F-15 and F-16 warplanes from the Tel Nof airbase near Tel Aviv were discovered when police searched a warehouse used by scrap metal merchants.



Brazil unveils \$27 bn port upgrade plan

BRASILIA (AFP) - Brazil on Thursday unveiled a \$27 billion concession plan to upgrade the country's ports and stimulate the country's sluggish economic growth.

President Dilma Rousseff announced the plan -- which calls for \$15 billion in investments during the 2014-2015 period and \$12 billion during 2016-2017 -- at an event attended by government and cor-

The program is a call for business leaders "to invest in the modernization and expansion of port capacity in partnership with the state,' Rousseff said.

The plan includes a \$1.3 billion investment in improving access by land to the ports, a new regulatory system, an overhaul of the port network administration and incentives for investors.

The main goal is to speed up the movement of goods through the ports while lowering costs, said Leonidas Cristino, the official in charge of managing the network of

Brazil, the world's sixth largest economy and host of the 2014 World Cup and 2016 Rio summer Olympics, has 8,500 kilometers (5,200 miles) of waterways and a network of 37 ports, including three under private concession.

In August, the government launched a similar investment plan worth \$60 billion for roads and railways.

Costa Rica gets world's newest Chinatown



SAN JOSE (AFP) - Costa Rica on Wednesday opened the world's newest Chinatown, thanks to a million-dollar donation from China.

The Central American nation's capital, San Jose, is the new home of the 650-meter area lined with shops decorated with symbols of Chinese culture.

Mayor Johnny Araya, one of the project's main backers, opened the area, which is crowned by a traditional Chinese arch, and also includes jewelry shops and Asian restaurants.

The Chinese government paid for half of the project's two-million-dollar price tag, according to its architect Mariano Urena.

Costa Rica renewed diplomatic ties with China in June 2007. Subsequently, Beijing made a number of large donations including \$100 million for the new National Stadium which opened in March 2011.

Treegonometry solves Christmas decoration dilemma




PARIS (AFP) - Mathematics has provided an answer for those striving for the perfect Christmas tree, Britain's University of Sheffield says. The university's Maths Society was set the challenge of decorating a tree so that greenery and glitz are in harmonious proportion, resolving the problem of a tree that is either too barren or gaudy.

Here's their formula:

- Number of baubles: Take the square root of 17, divide it by 20 and multiply it by the height of tree (in centimetres).
- Length of tinsel: 13 multiplied by pi (3.1415) divided by 8, then multiplied by tree height.
- Length of tree lights: Pi multiplied by tree height
- Height (in centimetres) of star or fairy on top of tree:
 Tree height divided by 10.

"For example, a 180cm (six-feet) Christmas tree would need 37 baubles, around 919 cms of tinsel (30 feet) and 565 cms (19 feet) of lights, and an 18cm (seven-inch) star or angel is required to achieve the perfect look," the University says. Raphael drawing smashes record at London auction



LONDON (AFP) - A drawing by Italian Renaissance master Raphael fetched £29.7 million (\$47.8 million, 36.6 million euros) at a London sale on Wednesday, a record for any work on paper sold at auction.

Following a battle between four bidders, the hammer eventually came down at Sotheby's auction house on a bid cast by telephone, making "Head of an Apostle" (c. 1519-20) the second most expensive Old Master artwork.

"If you are lucky, at some point in your career a work like this comes along," said Gregory Rubinstein, Worldwide Head of Old Master Drawings at Sotheby's.

"A number of the world's greatest collectors stepped up tonight in recognition of the genius of Raphael and the extraordinary beauty of this drawing with its exceptional provenance."

The drawing, executed in black chalk, depicts one of the key figures in Raphael's "Transfiguration", one of the most important Renaissance paintings.

The painting was hanged at the artist's head when his body was laid out in his studio following his death in Rome in 1520, aged 37.

The winning bid smashed the pre-sale estimate of £10-15 million.

NASHVILLE. -- When the Winter Meetings began this week, the top free agents available were outfielder Josh Hamilton and pitcher Zack Greinke.

When the annual baseball conclave ended yesterday, Hamilton and Greinke remained the top free agents on the market.

There was plenty of activ-

ity in the sprawling complex, but few announcements. The Rockies got Wilton Lopez from the Astros. The Rays acquired shortstop Yunel Escobar form the Marlins. The Tigers picked up catcher Ramon Cabrera from the Pirates. The Phillies addressed their need for a center fielder by getting Ben Revere from the Twins for right-handers Vance Worley and Trevor May.

There were several lesser free-agent signings that were widely reported, but won't become official until physicals are completed.

But the fact that Hamilton and Greinke still haven't landed are the major reasons why the big podium set up for breaking news was empty most of the week, executives say.

"When those first-tier free agents fall into place, that determines where the other free agents will sign. And a lot of the trade options don't become real until the free agents are in place. I think between now and Christmas, you'll see a lot of those deals fall into place."said Orioles general manager Dan Duquette.

One of the reasons the market has developed slowly is that teams have money to spend after agreeing to lucrative new television deals. The Red Sox were one of the teams to jump out there, signing both Napoli and Victorino to deals reported to be worth \$39 million over three years. That came after giving outfielder Jonny Gomes a two-year, \$10 million contract. Those numbers may have helped raise the expectations of the remaining free-agent market.

"I think the indications of what some of the signings were means it's a very healthy industry," said Phillies assistant general manager Scott Proefrock. "I was maybe a little surprised there weren't more trades but, again, when you get in these situations, it's sort of a percolator for ideas. A lot of discussions go on at all levels in the organization. A lot of those get flushed out and then the ones that have some legs to them, those get pursued over the course of the next couple weeks.."

While the Winter Meetings provide a focal point for attention on baseball in the offseason, the reality is that many of the discussions and negotiations that took place this week won't result in actual moves until later.

Football: Henderson leads Liverpool into last 32

PARIS (AFP) - Jordan Henderson fired Liverpool into the Europa League knockout stages, scoring the decisive goal in the five-time European champions' 1-0 win at Udinese on Thursday.

Brendan Rodgers' side ended up topping Group A, ahead of already qualified Anzhi Makhachkala, beaten 3-1 by Young Boys - with this trio all finishing the group stage on 10 points.

Two of the other five last 32 round tickets on offer in Thursday's closing group stage action were claimed by Steaua Bucharest and Vfb Stuttgart from Group E.

Tottenham can emulate Liverpool's feat by avoiding defeat to Panathinaikos at White Hart Lane later.

Liverpool turned up in Italy with their Europa League destiny in their own hands knowing a win would assure them of passage to the knockout stages, irrespective of the outcome of the other Group A tie between Anzhi and Young Boys.

Newcastle travelled to Bordeaux with qualification already in the bag but Alan Pardew's men missed out on denying the French side of top spot in Group D after a 2-0 defeat

Czech side Viktoria Plzen beat Atletico Madrid 1-0 to deny the defending champions top spot in Group B.

The top two teams from each of the 12 first round groups are joined by the eight Champions League castaways, featuring for the first time ever the defending European champions in Chelsea.

The Blues' presence adds spice to a competition which UEFA is considering scrapping in favour of an extension to the Champions League format later this decade.

It's been a lot of sacrifice on my part and my family's part' At 34 years old, he's the youngest player in history to reach the milestone. Chamberlain was 35 years old, while Malone and Abdul-Jabbar were both 36 and Jordan 38.

However, Bryant was the fifth-fastest player in terms of games played to reach the milestone, achieving it in his 1,179th contest. Chamberlain got there in 941 games.

NBA Commissioner David Stern was on hand to see the feat, but Bryant was just as concerned that the Lakers reversed their recent fortunes with a victory.

He finished with 29 points and six rebounds as the Lakers ended a two-game skid. They bounced back from a disappointing loss at Houston -- where they surrendered a double-digit fourth-quarter lead -- to win for just the second time on the road this season.

Dwight Howard added 18 points, eight rebounds and five blocks for the Lakers.

Juan Manuel Marquez's newfound muscle questioned!

LAS VEGAS - Juan Manuel Marquez said he's "ready to go to war" with Manny Pacquiao, but the presence of an admitted steroids distributor in his corner Saturday night and a vastly more muscular body has skeptics questioning his new physique. Marquez will meet Pacquiao for a fourth, and likely final, time on Saturday at the MGM Grand Garden in a 12-round welterweight bout on HBO Pay-Per-View. Though he believes he won each of their first three fights, Marquez is winless, losing the last two after getting a draw in the first. Three years ago, when Marquez was 36, he moved up from lightweight to welterweight to fight Floyd Mayweather Jr. Marquez looked puny next to Mayweather and had no muscle definition. It was hardly a surprise, though, since Marquez had never weighed more than 135 in a fight and weighed less than 130 in 50 of his 55 fights to that point. Now, Marquez's physique has undergone a transformation, he has big, bulging biceps, thick shoulders and a wide, broad chest. He accomplished this after he hired Angel Guillermo "Memo" Heredia as his strength and conditioning coach. Marquez vehemently denies the use of any performance-enhancing drugs. If he dominates or knocks out Pacquiao, he likely won't receive the acclaim and the respect he seeks because so many would believe it to be a tainted victory.

Messi came on in the 58th minute of Wednesday's tie only to collide with Benfica goalkeeper Artur Moraes six minutes from time in a match that was meaningless to Barcelona but where he was chasing his 85th goal of the calendar year which would have equalled Gerd Mueller's long-standing record.
