




Cos cu ta pasa cu ne, ta pasa cu mi tambe.

"Mi a perde un djente mas", Meera ta bisa. Mientras ami a perde un spina mas.





Tin biaha nos por ta un poco diferente. Meera ta inventa problema. Ami ta pone nan disparce.

Pero ami a haya un idea! Ata nos ta nabega riba un boto di papel.






