WILLEMSTAD—The P.N P.(Partido Nacional di Pueblo) party of Curacao requested a conference to specifically discuss the matter of an Aruban currency. In a letter to the ministers of general affairs, of state structure, and restrucration of the Antilles of 5, the faction leader of the P.N.P. in the Senate, Rufus McWil-

liam, urgently requested a conference on Round Table Level to analyse and debate the matter of an Aruban currency. McWilliams said in his letter that presently there is a problem to determine the cooperation between Aruba and the Antilles of 5. The cooperation on political, financial monetary and economic level

is doubtful,he said.Mcwil liams said that the decision which Aruba made, to introduce its own cur rency,coupled to the Antillean guilder (with a special stamp for the bank notes used in Aruba) until Aruba gets its own cur rency, underlines the fact that there must be in reality an economic, moneContinued on page 3





The Irony of life-The president elect of Brazil, Tancredo Neves, 75, the man to whom the people of Brazil gave the mandate to return the country to democracy after 21 years of military rule became ill on the day before he was to be inaugurated as president. From that day the attention of Brazil and the world was focused on the president elect In spite of his advanced age he underwent no less than 8 operations. The people of Brazil hope that his sucessor Jose Sarney will uphold the democratic principles of Tancredo Neves who died on Tuesday after a valiant struggle for his life.



RESTRICTION

The people of the Netherlands Antilles have always been free to move from any one of the six islands of the Netherlands Antilles without any restriction whatsoever. But as we understand from a recent statement made by the Minister of State Structure, Mr. Frank Rozendal, after Aruba becomes a separate part in the Kingdom of the Netherlands on January 1,1986, such freedom of movement would no longer be possible, as far as Aruba is concerned. According to Minister Rozendal, natives of the other five islands will not be allowed to enter Aruba unless they are guaranteed of a job and a place of residencce on the island. The law will also restrict Arubans from going to any one of the other five islands under the same requirements!!Since the rebirth of the Status Aparte movement we were under the impres sion that after Aruba left the six-island constellation there would be harmonious cooperation throu gh certain agreements and/or treaties, but apparently entry to Aruba is not in that category. As we see it restriction of other Antilleans to enter Aruba will mean much more than just that. It will mean the elimination of familiar and social ties which exi sted for decades. Natives of all of the other five islands have lived in Aruba for many years, if they lea ve the islands for some time they have always felt free to return whenever they feel like. Throughout the years there have been intermarriages between Arubans and natives of the other five islands, and the family ties are strong adn bonding. That is only one of the many reasons why we cannot sanction the idea of any kind of restriction against the people of the other islands which are also a part of the Kingdom of the Netherlands. We think that by restricting the entry of other Antilleans to Aruba, and by restricting Arubans to enter the other islands Aruba will not only be discriminating but will also be isolating itself from the other islands.



ARUBAN CURRENCY WILL BE COUPLED TO ANTILLEAN GUILDER

ORANJESTAD-During a press conference held Friday, Betico Croes said that at no time at all has MEP changed its opinion about the Antillean currency. After gathering advice from various experts from Holland,"Den Dunne", IMF experts who were in Aruba and feeling out the opinion of UNDP who is working with CO in the framework of technical assistance the conclusion was arrived at to introduce Aruba's own currency inJanuary while the Antillean currency will continue to be used in a temporary form until Aruba's currency is ready. Betico said that during the meeting of the commission of independence last week, after several meeting with all the advisers, those of the DP came to the conclusion that at the moment it is difficult for Aruba to introduce its own currency. This is for technical reasons, the Aruban bank

notes will not be ready in time. However, the coins be ready in 1985 Betico Croes said that the re were several alternatives:One was to introduce the American dollar of the Antillean guilder cou pled to the Aruban currency.After evaluating alternatives the both MEP decided to couple the Aruban currency to

the Antillean currency, not only for historic-cultural and economic and monetayr reasons, but also for political reasons. Of course for historical and cultural reasons, because for years Aruba has been in the Dutch kingdom and we know what is the "Gulden" but in papiamento its name is "florin" which got its name since Florence was the commercial center of Europe.In reference to the political part, there are agreements from the Round Table Conference and the Mullet Bay conference that Aruba will get its status aparte and will remain

in the Dutch Kingdom. Concerning the economic aspect, local experts and United Nations experts after consulting Dutch experts reached the conclusion that to use the dollar

land could postpone the whole Status Aparte process, basing its reason on the fact that what Aruba

would create grave consequences which Holland cannot accept. The P.N. P. is of the opinion that Holland must not be gi-

ven the possibility to reject the changes in the Status which must take place in order for Aruba to obtain Status Aparte. It is for that reason that the P.N.P. is requested a meeting from now at the highest level, either in Hol land or in the Antilles, where as adults the parties involved can sit down and discuss the matter of monetary cooperation with Aruba to avoid any confrontation on this important matter, Mr. McWil liams concluded.

28 PROSTITUTES DIED IN A CONTAINER

WILLEMSTAD-The fren ch newspaper"Le Matin" reported that the bodies of 28 prostitutes were found in a container which was unloaded in the harbor of St. Thomas last week. The report said that there were 60 women in the container and that 32 who survived the trip from St. Maarten were in such a condition that they were unable to speakAccording to"Le Matin", regular shipments of Dominican prostitutes originate in St.Maarten. The paper said that the operation collect between 800 to 1000 dolmen and then they are shipped in containers to various parts of the Caribbean. Normally the containers have ventilation holes bored in them, but apparently in this case the ventilation was not sufficient. "Le Matin" even went so far as to say that

the operator in St.Maarten is a certain "Chapotin" owner of a nightclub on the Dutch part of St. Maarten and that he is "protected by the authorities". According to the paper the St. Thomas immigration is conducting an investigation of the matter.

conference the Soviet Union's decision to freeze deployment of its missiles aimed at western Europe until November is unlikely to persuade the Dutch Parliament not to accept its allotted share of U.S. missiles under a N.A.T.O. plan.

Western diplomats had interpreted the Soviet moratorium, announced by leader Mikhail Gorbachev, as an effort to influence the November 1 vote in the Dutch Parliament on whether to accept 48 Cruise missiles it had earlier pledged to deploy.

N.A.T.O. agreed in 1979 to station 572 Pershing 2 and

The Aruba Oranje Asso-

Cruise missiles in five European countries to respond to the Soviet's 1977 decision to deploy the triple-warhead SS-20s. West Germany, Britain and Italy began their deployments in late 1983 and Belgium joined last month.

The Dutch Parliament voted last June not to deploy the U.S. weapons if the number of Soviet SS-20s had remained steady between June 1984 and November 1985. The governments of both Belgium and Holland have been under heavy pressure by peace groups not to accept the U.S. missiles.

According to U.S. figures released in March, the Soviets have 414 operating SS-20sabout two-thirds trained on targets in Europe and the rest on Asia-compared with 378 when the Soviet walked out of Geneva Arms Control talks in late 1983. New talks resumed last month in Geneva.

"I can say the reply of my Soviet colleague was somewhat disappointing and I doubt very much whether this appeal as such has been very positive," van den Broek said atfer three hours of talks with Gromyko.

"If it proves that the number of SS-20s on November 1985 is higher than on June 1984, then for the Netherlands it is inevitable that it has to accept the intermediate-range systems on its territory," the Dutch Foreign Minister said.

He said that Gorbachev's decision to order to freeze "implies recognition that the deployment of SS-20s since June last year has continued because if not, I couldn't understand what the exact sense is of the proposal made."

Van den Broek said, "it was useful and informative to have these discussions even if at the end of the day we had an agreement to disagree."



Latin superstars raising money for Latin American hungry

LOS ANGELES, California — (UPI) — Dozens of Latin music superstars such as Julio Igleias, Placido Domingo and the young singing group Menudo gathered for an all-night recording session to raise money for the starving in Latin America and Africa

Forty-eight entertainers comprising Hermanos del Tercer Mundo, or Brothers of the Third World, began recording "Cantare, Cantaras," in the same A&M Records studio where 45 American singers under the U.S.A. for Africa banner recorded the single "We Are The World" last January.

"We Are The World," featuring Bruce Springsteen, Stevie

Wonder, Bob Dylan and 42 other American stars, has ascended to the No. 1 position on the Billboard music charts and \$20 million has been raised by the project.

The Hermanos group will tentatively donate 90 percent of the proceeds from the sale of the single, album and related products such as T-shirts to U.N.I.C.E.F., the United Nations Relief Organization, which will in turn distribute the money throughout Latin America.

The remaining ten percent will go to African nations.

"After we realized the amount of money we could generate...we decided to give the majority to Latin America and U.N.I.C.E.F.," said Peter Lopez, Attorney and President of the group.

The song, whose title means "I Will Sing, You Will Sing" in English, produced by Albert Hammond and Jose Quintana, will be distributed by A&M Records in Spanish, Portuguese, English and a mixture of Spanish and English, Lopez said, adding that the combined effort was expected to raise "millions of dollars."

U.S. churches urging resistance to Reagan's Central America war policy

WASHINGTON (UPI) Several American churches have begun issuing calls to their constituencies to work to defeat White House funding for troops seeking to overthrow the government of Nicaragua.

Within days of each other, leaders of two major U.S. Protestant denominations—the United Church of Christ and the United Methodist Church -have made statements opposing the administration's request for \$14,000,000 in public funds to supply guerrillas.

Those calls follow a February 28 appeal to U.S. Congress by leaders of ten other Protestant denominations urging it to reject Ronald Reagan's request for the renewed funding and a growing campaign sponsored by the Evangelical Sojourners Peace Ministry for citizens to promise resistance to any U.S. military escalation in Central Amer-

Libel verdict against "Washington Post" upheld

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A Federal Appeals Court yesterday reinstated a libel verdict against the Washington Post, saying the newspaper had a "reckless disregard" for the truth in an article about former Mobil Oil Corp. President William Tavoulareas.

The U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, in a 2-1 decision, said evidence introduced at the libel trial was sufficient to show the Post held "actual malice" toward Tavoulareas when an article was published saying he used his position at Mobil Oil to set up his son in a lucrative business.

The case now returns to the trial court to determine how much the post must pay Tavoularea; in damages.

"I hope this decision will make for a more responsible press," Tavoulareas said in a statement read to reporters by a Mobil press officer:

Tavoulareas said he believed all along "that the Post either knew the story was false or published it with reckless disregard for whether it was true or false."

Boisfeuillet Jones, the Post's vice president and legal counsel, said the newspaper will ask for a review of the decion by the entire ten-member Appeals Court.

He said the newspaper management continues to believe the Mobil article was "carefully done" and "substantially accurate."

The Libel suit stemmed from a November 30, 1979, article written by Patrick Tyler that said William Tavoulareas had used his position as Mobil chief to get his son, Peter, a job at Atlas Maritime Co., a London shipping management firm that did inillions of dollars worth of business with Mobil.

The article also hinted that Tavoulareas and Mobil may have violated securities laws by failing to disclose the younger Tavoulareas' involvement in the company.



Proving the unicorn is not a goat

NEW YORK CITY (UPI) — Circus officials yesterday countered recent charges that a star attraction—the "living unicorn"—was a goat and said they will prove its authenticity within ten days.

Allen bloom, vice president of the Ringling Bros, and Barnum & Bailey Circus, said in a statement that the American Society for the Prevention or Cruelty to Animals has made "irresponsible charges" the animals are goats with bull horns implanted in their skulls.

The circus said a news conference to allow the press "see and judge" the animal—and its three under-studies—will prove the animals are real unicorns, Bloom said. The exact date of the conference

was not immediately released, but officials said it would be held within ten days.

"Eyewitnesses (at the news conference) will find out that the unicorn's horn...is a living vital tissue, not an implant," he said.

The controversy over the animals arose last week when the A.S.P.C.A. was given grudging approval to visually inspect the animals, but not to X-ray their horns or speak with the circus' veterinarian.

Humane Society investigators later charged the "living unicorn" was actually a goat.

on Monday, the U.S. Department of Agriculture said investigators were going to examine the animals to see if they were being mistreated. No date for the inspection was set.

Venezuela and Ecuador support Reagan proposal

NEW YORK CITY (UPI) — Venezuela and Ecuador yesterday voiced their support for President Reagan's new Nicaraguan peace initiative which called for a dialogue between the Sandinista regime and rebels fighting against it.

Venezuelan President Jaime Lusinchi and Ecuadorian President Leon Febres Cordero told a joint news conference that if such a dialogue is possible between the government and the guerrillas in El Salvador, then it should be possible between the Sandinista regime and the opposition in Nicaragua.

The two leaders met in New York during their separate unofficial visits to the United States during which they discussed their countries' economic problems and external debt and devoted considerable time on issues concerning Central America.

there was no interest at all to involve the opposition, business sector, or labor unions. Our island Government should keep in mind that their object should be our island, our whole island, and nothing




