

Lago's Retirement Plan which gives a paltry pittance to the locally hired veteran annuitants of Lago who have over the years given their best including their youth to the Company, is way out of line. This retirement plan which came into being in 1948 by the Company taking away three per cent arbitrarily of employees' earnings from the amount of 10% which they were receiving as Company's contributions which amounted to 61% which was stated at the time that the company would use the 3% as the employees' contribution towards a pension or retirement plan. Employees worked with the belief that when they would have retired they would be able to relax and enjoy the fruite of their labour. But several annuitants here and abroad and future annuitants have complained to me about the small pittance which they are receiving and which they will get when they retire is hardly sufficient/and other utilities costs, excluding food, clothing, and other miscellaneous expenses for the things which these people have
