





PROBE FOR ARMY SHOOTING IN B. G. Georgetown: The British Guiana Government is to appoint a commission to probe the shooting of two Indian farmers by a British Soldier, acting Premier Hon. Brindley Benn announced here fecently. Army headquarters said that after the incidents during a house-tohouse police search, the patrol had fired at the man who was shot and killed when he approached in an "aggres-in Trinidad on Monday, November 9, sive manner" after being told four times to halt. Mr. Benn said that a strong protest had been sent to the Governor, Sir Richard Luyt, about "assaults and acts of brutality meted out by troops". In an official statement from the Prime Minister's Office, Mr. Benn said: "It is quite clear even on the statement issued by the military authorities that there was absolutely no justification for the shooting of these unarmed and innocent persons with machine guns. Mr. Benn also charged that policemen stood by with+ out taking action when two Ministers of the ruling People's Progressive Party Government were stoned during an c election campaign public meeting at Suburban Kithy's Market Square. He alleged pelting by "an organised gang" in which Education and Social Development Minister Cedric Nunes was wounded on the head and taken to hospital and Finance Minister Charles Ramkissoon Jacob hit on the chest. said that Mr. Nunes unleashed an extended verbal onslaught against Mr. Burnham.

DR. J.M.A.H. LUNS IN TRINIDAD. Trinidad: The Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands Dr. J.M.A.H. Luns is in Trinidad. His visit in Trinidad and Tobago is from October 31st. to today Nov. 4th. When Queen Wilhelmina ascended the Dutch Throne in 1898, a new political New thinking on the part of the Colonial people as well as a changing viewpoint with respect to outdated Colonial Rule festered the concept of a Union of the entire Dutch Kingdom. The idea was first expressed in the amended constitution of 1922 as a political formula. This Constitution no longer recognized any Colonies or Possessions; only Overseas Territories. The representative bodies of Indonesia, Surinam and Curacao were given Constitutional Status and their functions and authority with respect to internal affairs were defined. Although only general guides were posted and so many exceptions were incorporated into the Constitution that Self-Rule was most limited, nevertheless, the foundation was laid for the possibility : Kingdom of four Terriof one tories sharing equal rights. The Constitution of 1922 made no provisions for the future addition of other Territories to the Kingdom; This meant that Holland no longer desired to expand Her Overseas Possessions. IT IS DANGEROUS. WATCH OUT! PREVENTION IS BETTER THAN CURE.

When it began to rain one evening recently during a backyard barbecue in a Chicago suburb, the hostess was undaunted. She moved two braziers (metal containers to hold burning coals or charcoals) and the guests in the garage to continue the party. Within half an hour, a number of persons became ill. (Continued from page 7). Fifteen of the party-goers were rushed to the hospital, where they all recovered, although five remained overnight. Not a single one of the victims suspected that the cause of their mysterious illness was carbon monoxide poisoning until doctors mentioned it. In California last year a 13 year old boy on a camping trip, with his family, slept in a station wagon one night. Since it was cool, a hibachi (believed to be a container to hold brisks made of compressed coal dust), with burning briquets, which had been used to cook supper, was placed in the vehicle to keep him warm. All the windows were closed except one side ventilator that was an open crack. In the morning the boy could not be anakened. An autopsy showed that his blood was saturated with 52% carbon monoxide, which had been given off by the smoldering char-

ACAPNIA.

Acapnia is a deficiency of carbon dioxide (CO2) in the blood, which occurs after strenuous exercise or after excessive deep breathing, as advised by faddists. This lowering of the carbon dioxide content of the blood causes very shallow respiration, dizziness and muscle cramps and may even produce convulsions. Taking a few deep breaths when out in the fresh air will do no harm, but don't follow the cultists' advice of excessive deep

breathing exercises as a cure for all ills. Excessive deep breathing causes overventilation (hyperventilation) and a disappearance of the normal amount of carbon dioxide (about 5%) from the blood. This amount of carbon dioxide is absolutedly necessary for the stimulation of the breathing center in the brain, which is indispensable to keep up the breathof life.

Once this stimulant to the breathing center is greatly reduced, respiration becomes slow and shallow and is followed by the other symptoms mentioned above.
