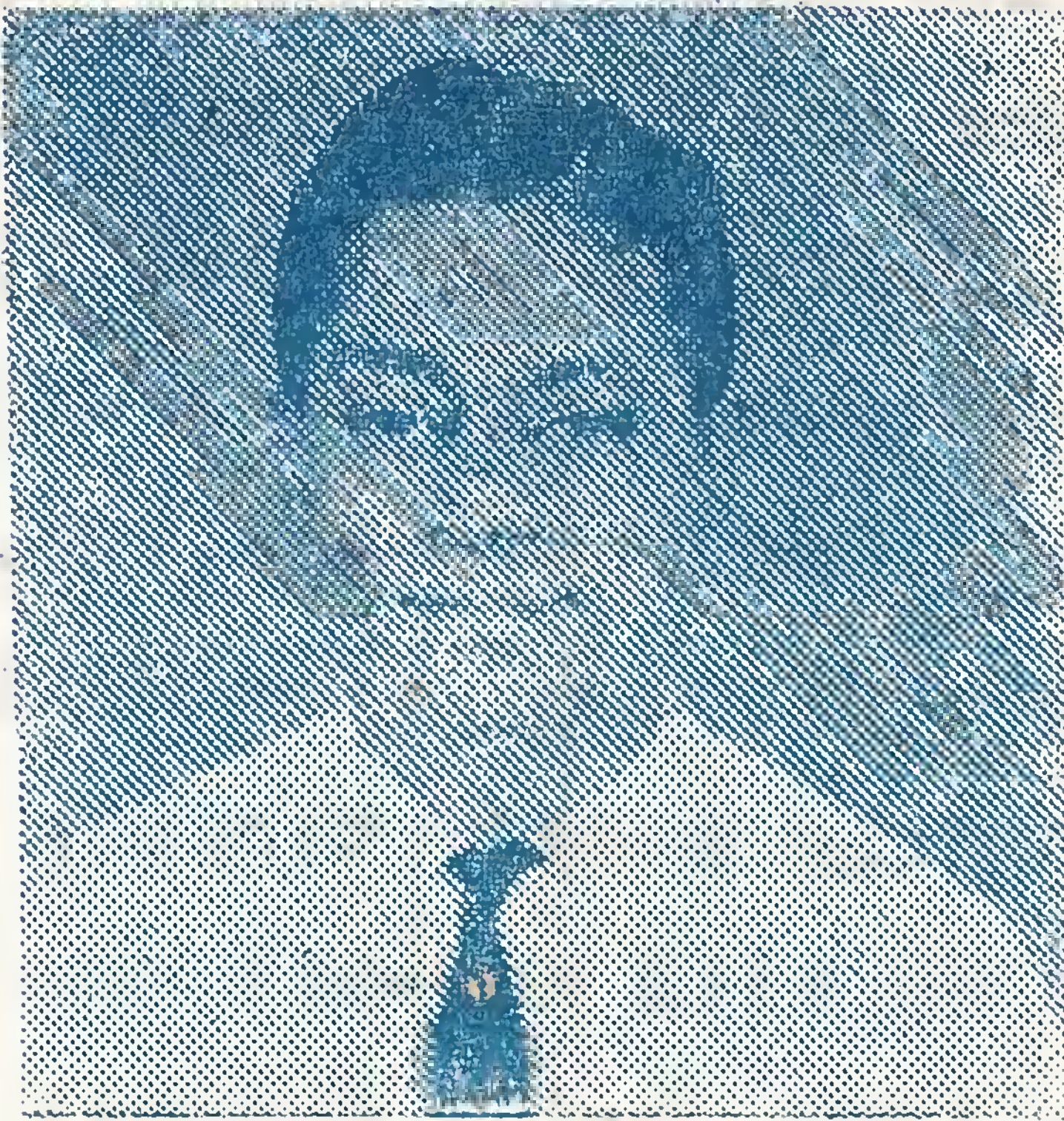

STEEL MILL AND DOCK JOBS FOR 1, 000.

Trinidad: Two Big Industries, a steel mill and a dock that could together employ up to 1,000 persons are on the threshold of reality. Work on the steel rolling mill, the country's first, may be started by March of next year. The proposed mill will be a venture of about \$2 to \$3 million that will make the maximum use of local scrap. It will be undertaken by one of two foreign interests that are anxious to establish operations in Trinidad.

VICAR SAYS: "I WAS MADE TO CONFESS".

Elburg, Central Holland: A dozen plain clothes policemen were among the 500 parishioners in this Calvinist fishing village at the service recently taken by the vicar who last week confessed to "adultery" with a girl attending his Sunday School. The Police were there in case of disturbances, but neither the vicar nor the Church Elders referred to the adultery charge, which the vicar has since denied blaming the Elders for having "talked me in admitting guilt". The Vicar, The Rev. Berend van der Weil, 54 year old father of five, last week read from the pulpit a statement admitting he had sinned against the seventh Commandment (banning adultery) with his Catechism pupil, Mtje Leusink, 26. Miss Leusink denied the charge. The Provincial Board of the Dutch Reformed Church has since reproved the local Church Board for "insufficient investigation of the complaint" lodged by Miss Leusink's boy friend. It will go into the complaint itself later. The Vicar who says that his wife has forgiven him, told the Amsterdam newspaper, "Volksrant". "The Church Elders told me :

Anyone who looks at a woman with the intention of committing adultery has in fact already committed adultery. I was not given any opportunity to give my side of the picture. The Church Elders spoke of sinning in thought, words and acts. But the charges they have brought against me are not true, thank God".

THINGS TO KNOW.

As has been stated, Representatives of the people were elected for the first time in 1937. The election was a novelty for the West Indies. There was no universal suffrage since certain conditions had to be complied with before a voter could be placed on the eligibility list. Women had passive voting rights, i.e., they could be elected to office but could not vote. The fact that the Governor could appoint 5 of the 15 members of the House of Representatives made it possible to strengthen a weak minority or weaken a strong majority by "packing" the Legislature with non-elected Representatives. The House of Representatives or "Staten" as it is called today cooperated in preparing and approving Government Regulations. Budget items also required Legislative approval. In addition, like other Parliaments, the "Staten" exercised the rights of amendment and initiative, official inquiry in cases of conflict between the House of Representatives and the Governor, an Article was provided in the new constitution whereby a proposal vetoed by the Legislature could again be introduced by the Governor after six months.

If again, no agreement was reached, the Crown decided the issue. Before 1936, Regulations enacted in Curacao could be abrogated by the Crown; now this could be achieved only through due process of the law. However, the Crown retained a limited right of suspension as well as the right to promulgate Regulations for Curacao in specific areas. Moreover, treaties with Foreign Powers having reference to Curacao required the advice and concurrence of the Legislature.

From its beginning, the new company had international interests. At first it sold directly to consumers only in northern New Jersey, but it shipped kerosene from Weekawken to light the world's lamps. By 1900 the Bayonne Refinery had become the world's largest. Meanwhile, Jersey Standard had started to acquire foreign affiliates. Foreign and domestic operations from the outset were logically related. For example, the entire Standard Oil system of economical manufacturing was based on producing far more than American customers alone could consume. Exports enabled Standard Oil to survive the panic of 1893 without closing any plants, and exports supplied capital needed for industrial development.

IT IS DANGEROUS. WATCH OUT!

"To date the National Safety Council has on record 17 deaths from the burning of charcoal in enclosed areas, a figure that is not complete. Washington alone reports four asphyxiations from that cause since 1957. Of the 17 fatalities, seven happened in vehicles, five in homes, two in a tent, one in a cabin, one in a shed and one in an undetermined area. Eleven of the accidents resulted when persons used the charcoal for heating.

For example, a honeymooning couple was discovered dead in their tent in a Maryland park one morning. Although the husband was an experienced camper, he apparently had set a charcoal-burning stove in the tent to keep them warm in the night. In Vermont, two hunters were asphyxiated by a charcoal-burning stove while sleeping in a pick-up truck on which they had built a hardboard living quarters. An autopsy confirmed that their blood was saturated with a deadly 60% carbon monoxide. One cause for alarm has been that manufacturers of charcoal grills and retailers have promoted the "indoor barbecue". Department stores often advertise hibachis for indoor and outdoor use.

One Midwestern producer of grills ran a number of advertisements urging people to take the grill inside and use it in the family room. A picture of the grill set up in a recreation room, surrounded by the family enjoying the barbecue, was shown. And what do the makers of charcoal briquets say of the hazard? Some are silent, preferring not to mention the risk of asphyxiation on their product's package. But several other companies, two or three years ago, added a warning on charcoal bags, cautioned against use indoors in an unventilated area.

MYSTERIOUS "OL' HIGUE".

"This gives the occupants of the house a chance to wake up and discover her. A fat cabbage broom made from twigs of the manicole tree is kept ready for beating her. Superstitions such as this chain people to senseless fears. To liberate them from such fears is one of the reasons why Jehovah's witnesses proclaim Scriptural truths from house to house. Those truths can make the people free from superstitions. On one occasion Jesus Christ said: regarding God's truth; "You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free".

(John 8:32). It sets them free from wrong ideas about life and death. It sets them free from superstitions and demon-inspired teachings that bring fear, uncertainty, unhappiness and misery. When I find a person who believes the superstition about "ol' higue", I reason with him, asking him: Can humans take their skin off and put it on again? If the skin is left in the gourd, what happens to the blood, muscles and bones while the "ol' higue" is a ball of fire? Such questions cast doubt on the superstition. I point out that there are wicked spirit forces that can do strange things, but no human can change into something else. I show them where God's Word says that the "whole world is lying in the power of the wicked one" and that he is "misleading the entire inhabited earth".

(1 John 5:19; Rev. 12:9) Fear-inspiring superstitions are from that great deceiver. They are falsehoods that contradict God's Word of truth and mislead the people. Instead of believing them trust should be put in Jehovah God.

PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST FRAUDULENT BUSINESS PRACTICES. (From an article in the "Awake" Magazine. Ed: We are proud to state that none of our advertisers fall under this delinquent category and they have always been known to be honest and genuine with their Customers and others. Support them. A customer at some places is robbed most times. "A steel plant employee, proud of the fact that he had ^{not} an unpaid debt in his life, was waiting for a bus in front of his plant. Someone in the crowd showed him an attractive ring for his wife, offered to let him have it on "approval" for just \$10 and, if his wife did not like it, to give him back his \$10 next day. The steel worker quickly scribbled his name on a "receipt". Only later did he find out he had signed a contract binding him to pay an additional \$300 for a ring worth much less. A fish market had flounder to sell, but instead of selling the lowly flounder at their proper price, the market passed them off as epicurean English fillets of gray sole, at double price. These disreputable business practices did not go unnoticed, for the proper authorities were notified and suitable action was taken. The customers were actually law-enforcement agents sent out to investigate such fraudulent

business practices. However, many who perpetrate fraud do not get caught. These operators strike anyone and anywhere, with increasing frequency. This is not to say that the problem is the same in all countries or even in different areas within a country. In some places it is normal to haggle over prices. In others, the prices are pre-set. In smaller communities, where shop owners may be known to you for a lifetime or may even be close relatives, you can have much more confidence in them, so the problem is not so great, but in most large cities and towns, especially in the larger industrial nations, the problem of fraudulent business practices is ever present. How is it possible for so many people to be taken in by dishonest business practices? The answer is that almost always those defrauded were guilty of a common human failing: they did not take the time to investigate the offer or claim, or to check with other knowledgeable persons or agencies. They just did not ask enough questions!"

Instead, he will spend it all, he said recently to sue the Trinidad Guardian for \$1,000,000. "I'm going to spend every cent of my \$20 million to sue you", stormed the Black Eagle from his Hilton Hotel room. "Money means nothing to me he continued". "I resent your report that I tried to sell you my book for a token fee of five to ten thousand dollars". "I am a millionaire several times over", boated the Colonel. "So what is \$10,000 to me? Name your charity now and I will donate to it \$10,000. I went on the Black Eagle. "I am not a pauper", continued the irate Black Eagle. "I may have left here a poor man but those days are gone forever".

UK MINISTERS STAYING CLEAR OF B.G. UNTIL...

British Ministers will stay clear of hot spot British Guiana until after December 7th.'s. controversial elections there. This was stated recently by Lord Taylor, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Commonwealth Relations, when he flew into Trinidad for talks with Prime Minister, Dr. Eric Williams. Lord Taylor said it was decided by the British Government that it would be unfair for any Minister to pay a pre-election visit to B.G. because of the possibility of getting involved in controversial matters "which would be a wrong thing.

SIR ALAN REECE FOR B.G. TRINIDAD SENDING 2 OBSERVERS TO DEC. 7 ELECTIONS.

Sir Alan Reece, Chairman of Trinidad's Boundaries and Elections Commissions,

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and Dr. Stephen Moosai-Maharaj, a member of the commissions, will be the Trinidad representatives on a four man Commonwealth team to observe the December 7th. British Guiana's general elections. The other 2 representatives are from Canada. Mr. John Homes and Mr. W. Parker.

MANO BENJAMIN'S APPEAL CONCLUDED.

Trinidad: Mano Benjamin, the "Beast of Biche", will be given 20 strokes with the cat-o-nine tails, but his 30 year jail sentence has been reduced to 20. "The flogging, plus a term of 20 years should provide adequate protection, especially as they should also be self deterrent", said the court in a written decision. In a separate judgment the Court dismissed as "entirely without merit", Benjamin's appeal against conviction. It upheld the verdict of the jury who found Benjamin guilty of acts of torture, against teen-aged sisters Dulcie and Luciana Celestine, blinding them. Reading the decision of the Court, Sir Hugh Wooding took to task Mr. Reginald Barnwell who argued the appeal for Benjamin in these words: "We were subjected to a torrent of argument, from which it became embarrassingly apparent that the prisoner's counsel on appeal was not prepared to make any attempt to measure up to his professional responsibility. We only hope that this performance will never again be repeated". The sisters Dulcie and Luciana are still patients in the Port-of-Spain General Hospital.

SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL WAS 90 MONDAY.

London: Sir Winston Churchill's Secretaries and Britain's Post Office Department estimate that Sir Winston may have received about 60,000 Birthday Gifts, telegrams, greeting cards and letters for his Birthday which was on Monday last chalking up 90 years.

ROOSTER JAILED.

Bangkok: A rooster is being held in custody by police for attacking a six year old girl, and its owner is to be charged for letting a dangerous bird loose. The owner has already paid 100 tials (about £1) to the girl who suffered cuts in the face.

KIDNEY TRANSPLANT.

Buenos Aires: A 16 year old girl is recovering in hospital here after a British doctor successfully transplanted a kidney from her father.

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TRUJILLO'S SON FREED OF FRAUD.

Geneva: Radhames Trujillo, a son of the assassinated Dictator of Santo Domingo, was acquitted recently of charges that he fraudulently obtained \$800 million of his father's fortune. The Court found that it was not competent to judge matters which occurred in the Dominican Republic during the Trujillo's regime. Radhames told newspapermen he would return immediately to his home near Rouen, France.

BODY OF MISSING GIRL FOUND NUDE IN RAVINE.

Trinidad: The partly decomposed body of 15 year old Anne Marie Bachan, was found in a Ravine about three quarters of a mile away from her home shortly after 1 O'clock Friday afternoon last. The girl had been reported missing on Nov. 21st. She was the only daughter of Mena Mahabir, of St. Fabian Road, Gasparillo. She was to be married next year. The body bore marks believed to have resulted from violence. Police believe that the girl was murdered.
