



Another speaker paid attention to the way that George Floyd life is put to and end. In this case he focused on the knee of the White Police officer, placed 8 and 45 seconds on Floyd's neck. And this with a racist intention. Also was put to the attention of those present ,to support the businesses in San Nicolas, that creates a sense of unity in the Community. The event ended by saying: Be proud of who and what you are, stand up for your rights, and consider yourself as an Arubian the same way others consider themselves as being an Arubian.
