




Sweet Pan Music In San Nicolas!

HOW TO WEAR A NON-MEDICAL FABRIC MASK SAFELY

Adjust the mask to your face without leaving gaps on the sides



Pull the mask away from your face



Cover your mouth, nose, and chin



Store the mask in a clean plastic, resealable bag if it is not dirty or wet and you plan to re-use it



Avoid touching the mask



Remove the mask by the straps when taking it out of the bag



Clean your hands before touching the mask



Clean your hands before removing the mask



Wash the mask in soap or detergent, preferably with hot water, at least once a day



Inspect the mask for damage or if dirty



Remove the mask by the straps behind the ears or head



Clean your hands after removing the mask







Do not wear the mosk under the nose

Do not remove the mask where there are people within 1 metre

Do not use a mask that is difficult to breathe through



Do not use a mask that looks damaged



Do not wear a dirty or wet mask



Do not wear a loose mask



Do not share your mask with others

A fabric mask can protect others around you. To protect yourself and prevent the spread of COVID-19, remember to keep at least 1 metre distance from others, clean your hands frequently and thoroughly, and avoid touching your face and mask.



"Happy to give back – Meals on Wheels project"

The Covid-19 pandemic hit the world and we, Aruba are no exception on the rule. Since the 'hit' Aruba went on a total lockdown. During that lock down many families reached at the brink of financial/economic collapse. To support those in need the project "Happy to give back" was created by CEDE-Aruba. Many famous Arubans such as Xander B. Saraquita Offringa, Dr Edward



Cheung and many have given their support to the project. Through this project CEDE generated funds to support three major projects.

The Fundacion pa Nos Communidad, Un man pa nos muchanan(school breakfast) and the YMCA meals project are financed with the collected funds. The funds are being divided as follow, 75% goes to FpNC, 15% goes to the school breakfast program and the rest, 10% goes to the YMCA Meals on Wheels project.

Meals on Wheels project;

On april 20, 2020 the project was initiated. The contents of the project is, that with the 10% of the collected the CEDE-Aruba will purchase the necessary material and the kitchen staff of the YMCA together with a group of volunteers will prepare meals that will be distributed by the Aruban Red Cross over the whole island.

Initially the project started by preparing one hundred meals per day, but this was of short duration. On Monday April 27 the petition was filed to increase the amount from one to two hundred meals per day. The YMCA has complied. Up to today, July 19, 2020 the YMCA of Aruba and its San Nicolas division has produced



seventeen thousand five hundred meals and we are proud to contribute.

YMCA has two paid staff in service for their kitchen duties and they work from Monday to Friday, together with a group of volunteers, provided through CEDE-Aruba volunteers bank and a special end of the week volunteer staff (Friday-Sunday) provide the necessary services.

During the week end the volunteer staff invites special groups/entities and more to support the project. On Saturdays they mostly invite youth groups to give a helping hand so they can transfer the volunteerism spirit from the elderly to the youth and on Sundays they try to get organized elderly entities to join in their endeavors.

Past Saturday the DeMolay Aruba Chapter group was participant to the project and on Sunday it was the San Nicolas Business Association.
