We must seize our opportunities with eagerness and zeal, we must be willing to run the risk of taking chances; we must not wince if life is not a bed of roses.



members of Parliament what it means to do about Wilhelm von Hohenzollern's activities.

Recently agitation was increased when the former kaiser sent a message to the "League of the Upright" meeting in Germany in which he quoted Christ in the following statement:

"Without me ye can do nothing."

The League had been permitted to hold its first meeting since being suppressed ten years ago, and

the fact that it almost coincided with the birthday on October twenty-second of the kaiser's first wife, the late Empress Augusta Victoria, was in official circles regarded as most significant.

Although the Versailles Treaty forbids a Hohenzollern dynasty again in Germany in recent months the names of the former Crown Prince Friedrich Wilhelm and his four brothers have bobbed up frequently in association with right wing politics in Ger-

many. The fifty year old former Crown head and Prince Oscar, the younger son of the former kaiser, made flying visits to Doorn recently which also has caused speculation to arise.

F. Vos, an independent, and Herr Wynkoop, a communist, have been deputies most insistent in demands for a statement of the government's plans. The government spurned request of some allied governments to expel the ex-kaiser but it has promised to be on guard against any

political activities by him.

Unconfirmed reports were that a Dutch official visited Doorn several times recently to convey official warnings. RAY HESS.



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

Three-Minute Journeys

The Sudan—Earth's Most Fascinating Wilderness

By TEMPLE MANNING.

SEARCHING for new and interesting scenes, many travelers, in recent years, have made repeated trips to both North and South Africa. A trip to Egypt is quite a commonplace affair, but now ever so many visitors journey up the Nile and visit the Sudan. That immense tract of land has held a fascination for explorers ever since man first ventured centuries ago into its mighty area.

One realizes the great expanse of the Sudan only when looking at a map and marking the fact that it is bounded on the north by Egypt, on the east by the Red Sea and Abyssinia, on the south by Kenya, Uganda and the Belgian Congo, and on the west by French Equatorial Africa. It embraces an area of more than one million square miles, its length from north to south being about 1,800 miles, while from east to west it varies in width from 500 to more than 1,000 miles. Through its great desert trekked the caravans of the Pharaohs, where now the Cape to Cairo traveller rides in soft comfort.

The Historic Towns

When explorers started their search for the source of the Nile they began to attract interest to the Sudan. After about 1820, the Egyptians, themselves, began to open up and occupy the northern parts of the desert tract. Wars, rebellions, decades of bloodshed and famine have halted the occupation and development of the Sudan, but nothing has stayed its progress, and now there are thousands of miles of railroad, river fleets navigating 2,400 miles of waterways, colleges and

hundreds of schools where before was only a wilderness.

The opening of the Sennar Dam has brought under cultivation more than half a million acres of land. Much cotton is now grown where side by side with a highly organized system of cultivation can be seen a civilization as primitive as any in Africa.

In the northern zone of the Sudan are some towns that have historic associations. Omdurman and Khartum are two spots connected with the Mahdi Rebellion of 1881, that was put down by General Gordon. Khartum particularly is rich in as-

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
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
