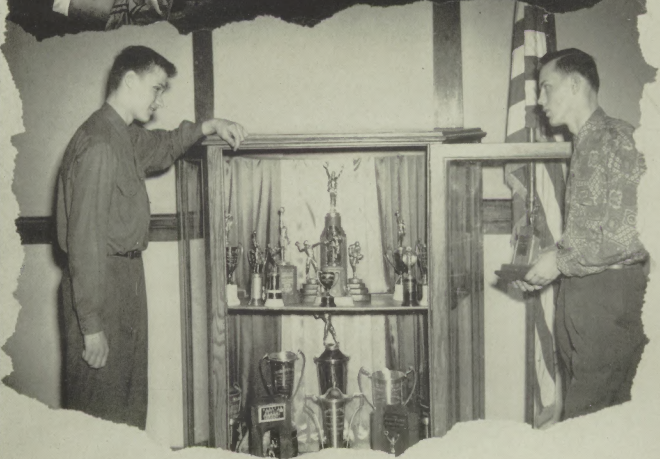






ATHLETICS

MR. JAMES BUCKLEY

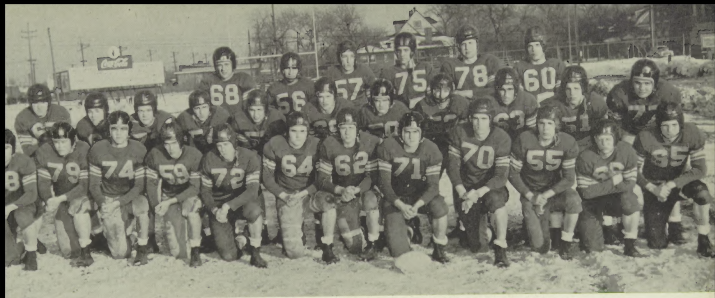

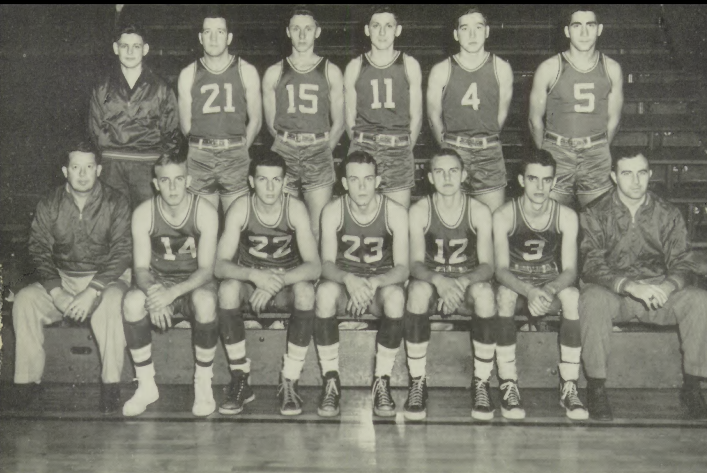
Noll 13— Evansville Memorial 13
