Dear Sir:

Chief Deputy Coroner Schlaeger of Cook County, Illinois, called at this office this morning after the inquest into the death of Russell C. Gibson and said that they had definitely identified Byron Folton, alias Konty Carter, as the chauffeur of "Killer" Burke, who, as the Division knows, is now serving a life sentence in the State of Michigan. He says that they were very desirous of securing the gun used by the late Russell C. Gibson in order that they might make ballistic tests with a view to determining the possible complicity of Byron Bolton in the St. Valentines Day massacre and possibly other crimes, they having certain guns which could be used in this comparison.

The Coroner's office, as the Division probably knows, was very liberal with us in connection with the Coroner's inquest into the death of Russell Gibson, permitting us to put on two witnesses who were not actually eye witnesses of the tragedy and also permitted us to use Mrs. Russell C. Gibson as a witness when they might have demanded that the other inmates of the apartment, i.e., Byron Bolton and Buth Heidt, be present.

I told Chief Deputy Coroner Schlaeger that in accordance with the established custom, it was necessary to send this gun immediately to the Division in order that the Division might make ballistic tests and comparison there, and that after these tests had been made the Division would be glad to cooperate with the Cook County authorities. I am rather of the opinion that if this gun is returned to Chicago it will remain in the hands of the Cook County authorities. I believe that some steps should be taken to make some kind of a gesture, possibly as Mr. Tamm suggested this morning, concerning enlarged photographs of the test byllets. Of course, if the Division desired the gun might be returned to Chicago.



Dear Sir; beforence is made to your letter of Juneary 10, 1935, in somestion with the three Browning Automatic rifles and the Thompson Sub-Machine gun recovered in the apprehension of Rescall Albeen in Chicago and from the synthest of "Doe" Burker. Test specimens have been taken from those guns and are enclosed in order that they may be transmitted to the Cooks County authorities for comparison with ballistic specimes.

The three Browning Automatic rifles were received in the Laboratory, one marked as the gun used by Gibson in an attempted and escape, one found intest in the apartment, and another disassembled. It has been found after assembling the latter gun that it was defective and the firing pin was replaced in order to fire a cartridge, therefore, the firing pin mark is not significent. 

TWEEDALE states that he cashed several small checks for O B CARTER but he does not remember the bank or banks on . which same were drawn but that they were in Chicago; that he also assisted GEORGE ZIEGLER in cashing a Western Union check for \$1100.00 or \$1150.00 from Chicago to Trinidad, Colorado. He does not remember the name of the party sending said money. No information relative to present whereabouts of O. B. CARTER. Report of Special Agent A. R. Gere, Benver, Colorado, dated 12-15-34. Agent interviewed HENRY J. TWEEDALE and wife, 4301 South Central Ave., Los Angeles, California, Telephone: Century 28165; they stated that they were well acquainted with GEORGE ZIEGLER and wife and O. B. CARTER and wife and two children at Trinidad, Colorado, in 1929 and 1930; that these parties came to Trinidad and vicinity to spend the summer and they became close friends and visited them at their camp on several occasions. 5 Division COPIES DESTROYED 2 Chicago 11 MAR 22 lbs 2 K. They stated that they remembered that O. B. CARTER received several small checks from Chicago, which they cashed or which they aided in getting cashed, but that none of the checks were for a larger sum than \$300.00 and that they remember only one check for that amount; that the checks all came from Chicago but that they cannot remember the party or parties sending same or the bank or banks on which said checks were drawn. Mr. TWEEDALE stated that he remembered one transaction very well. That GEORGE ZIEGLER received either \$1100.00 or \$1150.00 by Western Union check; that ZIEGIER approached him to get his assistance in having same cashed; that he endorsed this check and verified same with the manager of the Western Union, Mr. John Boles at Trinidad, Colorado, before he aided in the cashing of same; that they then took said check to the First National Benk at Trinidad and presented same to Neal Bryning, Teller of said bank, and that he, Mr. Tweedale, endorsed said check and that same was cashed; that he believes that Mr. Bryning will remember this transaction quite well, as it was not an every day occurrence for said bank to receive a check of this size by Western Union; that he, Mr. Tweedale, does not remember the bank on which said check was drawn, nor the party sending same, but he does remember that it came from Chicago; that this transaction took place either in August or September, 1929; that he remembers the incident well and is sure that it was in either August or September.

At first Mr. and Mrs. TWEEDALE thought that they had some kedak pictures of Mr. and Mrs. O. B. CARTER and ZIEGHER but they made a search of their home and later reported by telephone that they were unable to find the pictures at their home. They stated that, while they were very good friends of the CARTERS and ZIEGHERS while they were at Trinidad, when they left, supposedly for Chicago, that they never heard from them or never as much as received a post-card from them and that they have no information at present relative to their present whereabouts.

Agent made investigation at the office of the Western Union in Los Angeles and was advised by the manager that a record of the above transaction would be kept at the Trinidad, Colorado, office for a period of one year, at which time it would be sent to the Denver office and that, in due course, would be sent to the headquarters office at Chicago, Illinois, where same would be kept for a period of five years and that a record of this transaction could no doubt be found in the main office of the Western Union at Chicago.

No lead is being set out in this matter but same is being left to the discretion of Mr. E. J. Connelley at Chicago as to what further investigation should be made.

I called Mr. Nathan in connection with Monte Carter's proposition and advised that we must consider the possibility that in making the complete statement about the case he may implicate himself. Consequently we should be careful, in making inducements to him, that no promises be made to him to hold him free of any of his own activities. Mr. Nathan advised that we have nothing against Carter now, and I stated that you had suggested, in questioning him, we not show how little we know about the facts in the case. Mr. Nathan stated that this would be kept in mind.

I advised Mr. Nathan that you desired that he also consider the desirability of taking this individual to an apartment in Chicago rather than to Detroit, if Nathan had no reason to believe that a writ might be served; that, however, you had no objection to his going to Detroit if Nathan thought that should be done. Mr. Nathan advised that the atmosphere in Chicago is antagonistic and the newspaper reporters so "snooping" that, while it might not seem confident of our own ability, he had in mind that they might be shadowed to an apartment in Chicago. He stated that this matter would be given considerable study.

I advised Mr. Nathan that you had indicated we desired the story by all means, but that if Monte puts himself "in the middle" we can't turn him loose, but we should indicate to him that if he cares to enter a plea of guilty we will make available to the court the fact that he furnished us with full and complete information. I advised that his record was being checked in the Identification Unit to see if he was wanted anyplace. I advised Mr. Nathan that I had told you that, to the best of my knowledge we had had no official request from the local authorities or anyone else for Carter when we got through with him. He stated that this was correct, although the morning "Tribune" had stated a request had been received by us. I further advised that, if our records did not show Carter as being wanted, and no official request was received, there was no reason why we could not turn him loose when we had finished. Mr. Nathan stated we would undoubtedly receive a request. I advised Mr. Nathan that you desired to emphasize the fact that Carter must be held while his story was being crecorded & INDEXED

I advised also that you desired a telegraphic report, when they received a copy of the coroner's report, as to thether there was anything of a derogatory nature therein. WAN 14 1500

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR I talked with Mr. Nathan at Chicago and stated that I understood that it was Alvin Karpis who was in custody at Chicago. Mr. Nathan stated it was not that Mr. Purvis had talked with you about the matter, giving you the information; that he was "in and out of the room" at the time; that he was not certain but he was fairly sure Mr. Purvis had said "Doc" Barker, who is spoken of in Chicago as "No. 5". I advised that the Director desired a full and complete report on the entire matter, the pick-up of the individual, the shooting, etc. He stated he' would see that this leaves the Chicago Office today. I stated that the Director desired & report every day on developments at Chicago. I advised that a teletype message would be the best manner in which to transmit the information daily to the Division; that investigative reports as often as practicable. Mr. Nathan stated that the Chief Deputy Coroner has been at the Chicago Office, and has stated that Monte Warter, whom they have at that office, has been identified as the chauffeur for Killer Burke, who is now confined in the Michigan Penitentiary under a life sentence. It is believed that Carter was a perpetrator of the St. Valentine's Day killing and the authorities in Chicago desire the gun used by Gibson the night he was shot, for ballistic purposes. Mr. Nathan told the Coroner that the gun was being sent in to Washington today for bellistic tests, and that he had no doubt but that after we had completed our tests here, we would turn the gun over to him; that we would be glad to cooperate. I advised that we could furnish the Coroner ith specimen bullets immediately. He advised we had no immediate leads. Ir. Nathan stated that there was an article in the Tribune this morning thich indicated that Federal Agents were using the State of Illinois as a conquered province. The article also indicated that we had put gas in the wrong room. He stated everyone knows we have Carter and also that we have Clara Gibson. He stated Carter be charged with violation of the Unregistered Gun Act. I esked if Polton alias Carter knew we had #5 in custody, and Mr. Nathan replied that he did not. While talking with Mr. Connelley he advised in connection with the Gibson matter at Chicago that he had just returned from the coroner's hearing, at which Mrs. Gray, the wife, testified that that was her husband; that the Agents had ordered them out of the apartment and they had come out the front door and he went out the back door and she had heard some shots. He stated that they had not yet received the coroner's report.

I advised Mr. Connelley that I had been told he or Mr. Nathan advised the Director that Karpis was in custody, but that the fingerprints received this morning were those of "Doc" Barker. Mr. Connelley stated he did not believe he had said anything to the effect that Karpis was in custody and there must have been some misunderstanding, as Barker is the one in custody. He stated the other individual is Monte Carter whose right name is J. B. Folton; that the State has been looking for this individual in connection with the St. Valentine's day massacre in Chicago in 1928. Connelley advised that neither of the individuals in custody will talk very much.

I asked Mr. Connelley whether he thought the associates of Barker, when he does not show up for several days, will assume he is in custody and attempt to get a lawyer and get a writ on us. Mr. Connelley stated they had anticipated this possibility and had been considering filing against him for possession of an unregistered gun, which carries a five year penalty; that, of course, if this done publicity will result, but his associates obtain a writ there will be nothing else we can do. 



Mr. Nathan called in connection with the Bremer kidnaping case to advise that Monte Carter had made a proposition to furnish all information concerning this case, including the hide-out, provided we put him on the street. Mr. Nathan indicated that there were indications in the papers that he wanted for the St. Valentine's day massacre, but we don't have anything on him anyway and, if necessary, we could live up to the letter of our agreement by putting him on the street, even if the police pick him up a minute afterward. I stated we should, of course,

Mr. Nathan stated he had been considering the advisability of moving Monte Carter to Detroit (because it is near Chicago) or some other place before he is questioned and, if he comes through with enough information, we could then file on Barker, advising that he was of the opinion, as had been indicated, that it is almost impossible to keep five persons in any prison without their knowing of the identity of the other prisoners, and requested information concerning the accommodations in Detroit. I advised that Detroit was not ideal by any means but that I believed he could be kept safely there.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

At the forthcoming conference on the Bremer case in the Chicago Office, no one from the Selt Lake City district is being called, although the Bremer kidnapors ere known to have frequented Reno, Mevads in the past. I do not feel that there is anyone in the Selt Lake City Office with a sufficient knowledge of this case to justify bringing them to Chicago to attend the conference, nor does the Salt Lake City Office have any contacts in Reno, Hevada which are worthy of discussion at the conference. Special Agent J. T. McLaughlin has, however, been on special assignment in Remo for a period of several months, and I am advised has developed good contacts throughout the northern section of Meveda. Agent McLaughlin, who has now returned to Chicago, his headquarters, will attend this conference, and I recommend that after the conference, Agent McLaughlin be assigned to the Salt Lake City Office and instructions issued to Mr. Dowd to have Mr. McLaughlin handle the work in the northern section of Mevada. This will keep McLaughlin in the vicinity of Reno, and will enable him to develop contacts and maintain those contacts which he has already developed, without wasting any time and will in addition permit him to cerry a full assignment of work from the Selt Lake City Office. If you approve this recommendation, appropriate instructions will be issued for the transfer of Agent McLaughlin.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

I talked with Mr. Nathan concerning Mr. Newby's suggestion that a conference of Agents in Charge and Agents be held in Chicago in connection with the Barker-Karpis case. He believes it would be desirable for this conference to be held and have Mr. Connelley participate. I think Mr. Nathan should be there also.

I reviewed with Mr. Nathan, Mr. Newby's suggestions and he wanted to make the following comments with regard to Agents Hurt and Campbell now at Chicago:

Mr. Nathan stated he has submitted a communication to the Division recommending that these agents be transferred from the special detail to regular investigative work. However, I do not feel that action on this will interfere with their attending the conference which Mr. Nathan and I feel should be held next Friday, January 11th.

With regard to the Kansas City office, Mr. Nathan suggested that Special Agent Trainor might be brought with Special Agent Spear. He also stated that any one at Philadelphia other than Agent Fallon who is acquainted with this case would be of more value in a conference of this kind.

If you approve holding the conference I will be glad to forward the necessary telegraphic instructions so that all representatives of the Division listed will be in attendance. I also will be placed to receive your views concerning Mr. Nathan's participation in the proposed conference.


MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Connelley telephoned from Chicago and stated that they had succeeded in getting Monty to talk, and he has given them the location of the hideout there in Bensenville, Illinois. He has furnished the identity of the persons who occupy the two houses, and Mr. Connelley stated that Mr. Bremer undoubtedly lied to them as to the actual identification of the house. He has also furnished the information as to where we can find the location of the hideout of these fellows for the winter; that the place is in Florida on a lake there. Monty furnished information and directions as to how the place may be reached, he having been down there about December 18, 1934, at which time he made a contact with Doc Barker and "Slim".

Mr. Connelley stated that he believes that if the place at Bensenville is contacted with this man known to be in custody, it will serve to tip off the men down in Florida. I suggested that the necessary check, though, should be made of the place at Bensenville. Mr. Connelley stated that it might be well to take sufficient men from Chicago and establish a base of operation near the locality of the men in Florida; that from there they could conduct an investigation to ascertain the name of a responsible person to act as a guide. Mr. Connelley stated that if and when they rented cars down there to travel around, they should not attempt to use the Division Hudsons; that it would be better to use Fords or small cars of that nature.

I suggested the possibility of taking the men and the equipment in sirplanes and establish at base at either Atlanta or Birmingham; that at this base, the men could split up or rent the cars and complete whatever plans may be made there.

Mr. Connelley stated that he would inform the Division of the results of the check of the location at Bensenville tomorrow.

Johnston, had been attempting to get him to sign an affidavit stating that he did not think Harry Sawyer had anything to do with the kidnaping of his son, Edward G. Bremer.

Mr. Bremer insisted that his name not be used in connection with this matter inasmuch as he did not want his son Edward to know he had this information, neither did he want other members of the family or employees of the brewery know of his having this information. Agent Fortenberry assured him that his name will not be used in this matter.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Kindly be informed that Mr. Nathan telephoned from the Chicago Office this morning with further reference to the Karpis-Barker case and stated that Gibson, of course, had been killed and that the lindividual that he had reported to you during the night as Willie Harrison was not in fact this individual; that his true name is Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter, a minor member of the Karpis-Barker gang and is supposed or alleged to have received his cut of the Bremer ransom money in making arrangements for the hideout; that they also have in custody three women. Mr. Nathan stated that the press realizes that they have some women in custody but do not know their identity; that the true identity of these women is as follows:

> Clara Gibson - wife of the deceased Gibson. Mildred Kuhlman RECORDED JAN 19 1905 & Ruth Heidt. INDEXED

Mr. Nathan stated that in all probability Mildred Kuhlman was living with Doc Barker and that Ruth Heidt, according to her statement, alleges that she was visiting the other two women. However Mr. Nathan believes that possibly she was the girl-friend of Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter.

He further stated that the Crime Conference with regard to the Bremer case which was scheduled to be held at Chicago today will not go forward this morning in view of the fact that most of the men were up all night and that arrangements have been made for the Agents reporting to attend this conference to find them plenty to do until the conference starts; that it is entirely probable the conference will be held this afternoon. If not, it will go forward without any question tomorrow.

Concerning the Allen Cressler Bomberger kidnaping case, Mr. Nathan stated that this case had been entirely washed out in view of the fact that the victim 'phoned the Chicago police at 3:30 A.M. this morning stating that he had been released near the Great Northern Hotel in Chicago and arrangements were made for Agents of the Chicago Office to have him immediately brought to the Chicago Office. Mr. Nathan states he has conferred with the victim and does not believe his story. He claims he was kidnaped, taken to Indianapolis, brought to Chicago and released without any ramsom being paid.

Mr. Nathan states that under a little pressure he believes the true story of this case could be ascertained, but that he does not believe it would be advisable in view of the prominence of the victim's parents and that he is more convinced than ever at this time that there was actually no kidnaping involved in the case at all. He stated that the parents of the subject were on their way to the Chicago Office in order to obtain custosy of the victim and that he will be released shortly; that he furnished several leads which will be checked thoroughly.

Mr. Nathan stated that he will hold shortly another session with the press and furnish them with information concerning Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter, but will give no information to the press relative to the women in custody; that, of course, no information would be given out relative to the apprehension of Karpis.

He stated that a Coroner's inquest would be held this morning relative to the shooting of Gibson and arrangements have been made for Agent Brown to attend, in view of the fact that Brown was at the scene during the shooting; is friendly with the investigator for the Coroner, and will tell the facts as they actually occurred; that is, that Gibson came out of the house armed and that five or six Agents fired - the identity of the person or persons that actually hit Gibson, of course, being unknown.

Mr. Nathan further stated that everything was well under control and that he would communicate with you later on in the day.

Mr. Tracy ... The fingerprints of A. R. (Doc) Barker, with alias, received Miss Gandy in the Division from the Chicago Division office, and identified with the fing erprints of Dock Barker, Identification Order #1219, were observed to show mutilation. Accordingly, when the fingerprints were received in the Identification Unit, they were compared immediately with the fingerprint cards filed in the special Mutilated Fingerprint File which was inaugurated as indicated in my memorandum of September 17, 1934. The fingerprints received currently were identified with a photographic copy of the fingerprints of Doc Barker which had been placed in this special file, as indicated in

An examination of the impressions of Barker appearing on the current fingerprint card shows that a considerable portion of each finger tip was scarred. The mutilation is centered in each finger about the core. An examination of the ten impressions allowed the correct primary and secondary classifications. The ridge counts were in doubt in so far as the exact number was concerned. However, from the general appearance of the ridges, the sub-groups necessary could be determined.

It is believed that in this particular case which shows a rather serious mutilation an identification could have been effected in the regular fingerprint files within a reasonable time. The existence of the special Mutilated Fingerprint File, however, expedited the identification.

The developments during the past week in the Brewer kidnaping case were the apprehensions of Arthur R. Barker, Byron Bolton alias Monte Carter and the killing of Russell Gibson at Chicago, Illinois on January 8, 1935.

At the time Barker was taken into custody he was accompanied by one Mildred Kuehlman. At the time Gibson was killed while resisting arrest, there were also taken into custody Clara Gibson, his wife, and Ruth Heidt, the ex-wife of Willie Harrison. The questioning of these individuals is being conducted at the Chicago Division Office and the indications are that considerable information will be obtained from these individuals.

There was also held at the Chicago Office on January 9 and 10, 1935 a conference of those Special Agents who are familiar with the Barker-Karpis gang, for the purpose of discussing the case and its various ramifications with the view to bringing it to an early conclusion. The results of this conference will be reported by me in a separate memorandum.

Mr. Nathan stated that Barker is a tough one and is not going to talk. They are going to work in shifts during the night.







Two machine guns were found in the room, a rifle was found downstairs, and the coroner was sent for before anything was touched. Connelley stated he had a tip on something at Miami; that he had a plane at Ocala and would send five men there, and would go himself as soon as things were cleared up at the house. I advised that Hanson and about six men were coming by plane to Jacksonville where they would stop to see if Connelley had plans for them. Mr. Connelley asked if I would call Jacksonville and have them proceed to Kiami. I advised Stapleton is coming from Charlotte by plane with two men and will stop in Jacksonville for instruction.
