MEMORANDUM FOR MR TAMM

RE: Stoll Case.

Mr. Ulric Bell, Washington Representative of the Louisville Courier Journal, telephoned and advised that there is a rumor going around in Kentucky which has been sent back to Washington through inquiries to different newspapers including the Cincinnati Inquirer and the Herald Post in Louisville to the effect that through pressure applied on the Department by Ambassador Bingham, the Department has let up on its chase for Robinson. I advised Mr. Bell that the rumor was one hundred percent untrue, and that if anything, we are putting more pressure on it. I further stated that I did not understand why Ambassador Bingham would have anything to do with it.

I further advised Mr. Bell that I was in New York, and that there were some rumors in New York that Robinson was in Harlem passing some of the ransom money; that we were bearing down on that angle, but unfortunately the race riots came just a few days after this rumor; that this upset any rumor that he was in Harlem because it was not safe for any white person to be in Harlem.

I advised Mr. Bell that there were three cases that we were concentrating on at the present time, the Stoll Kidnaping Case, the apprehension of Karpis, and the apprehension of Raymond Hamilton, desperado of the Southwest. I stated that Karpis is the leading man left in the Bremer Case. Mr. Bell inquired if Hamilton was a killer and I stated that he was one of the worst killers, but that he wanted by the Bureau for robbing a National Guard Armory.

Mr. Bell stated that he did not put any confidence in the above rumor, but he did want to send some positive item to the effect that it was positively untrue. He further inquired if he could say that the number of men working on the Stoll Case had been increased. I stated that it would be perfectly all right for him to say that.

During my absence from the city your communication of March 11, 1935, relating to Cassius M. McDonald, was received at the Bureau and was not brought to my attention until I returned to the office. I regret that some delay has occurred in giving proper attention to your letter.

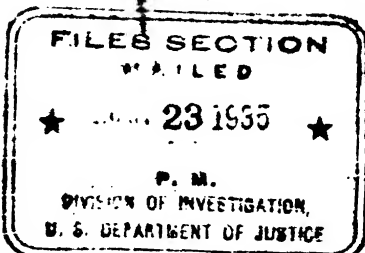
Cassius M. McDonald was taken into custody at West Palm Beach, Florida on February 7, 1935 and was subsequently removed to Miami, Florida, where he was held upon charges contained in an indictment returned against him in the Federal Court at Jacksonville, Florida on February 7, 1935, charging McDonald and various other individuals with harboring Alvin Karpis in Florida. You will undoubtedly recall that Alvin Karpis was indicted at St. Paul, Minnesota on January 22, 1935, charged with the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer of St. Paul, Minnesota, and that Karpis has been a fugitive since that time.

I have been advised that Cassius M. McDonald was released on a bond of \$15,000 on March 12, 1935.

I have personally reviewed the facts involved in the charges against Cassius McDonald and am convinced that he is the individual who participated in the harboring of Karpis in Florida and actually assisted in the negotiation of a quantity of the money paid as a ransom to the kidnapers of Edward G. Bremer. I am certain that this is not a case of mistaken identity and that Cassius McDonald actually participated in the offenses charged.

There appears to have been some error in the handling of the telegram which you addressed to Inspector James S. Egan of the Bureau, in which you made inquiry concerning the charges against Cassius McDonald. I sincerely regret that your telegraphic inquiry did not receive a proper and immediate response.

Dear Sir:

This is going to be rather an odd request. As you know the trial of alleged kidnapers of Edward G. Bremer, St. Paul banker, gets underway here April 8. For the week before I am planning special layout page including photographs of the prisoners, department of justice, agents, district attorney, the judge to preside etc. I understand that there is considerable evidence on hand--more than in any other case your department has had to handle, due mostly to the ~~large~~ number of suspects, length of investigation etc.

Now what I would like is permission from you to take a photopg ray of the evidence--not of the writing but just as it is stacked up. The acting agent in charge here, Mr. Coulter tells me he has not the authority. ~~Massama~~ If I could get an okay from you I certainly would appreciate it.

If possible I would appreciate a memo from you--not to be quoted if you wish so--as to the estimate cost in rounding up the Karpis-Barker mob, the number of lives it cost etc.

I always have cooperated with the department as your two assistants, Mr. Nathan and Mr. Clegg can verify.

If possible I would like your okay on taking pictures of the prisoners we have in jail here--Bolton, Farmer, Edna Murray, Doyle, Barker and a few others.

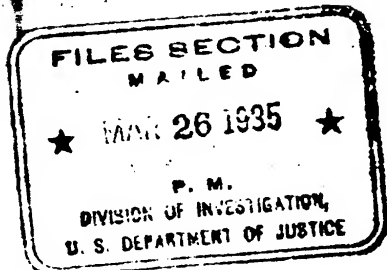

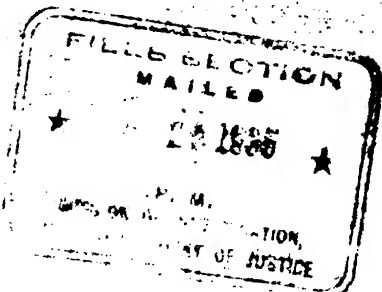

Mae Fatheree, "Get Acquainted Correspondence Club", correspondent, informs Volney Davis, under aliases, unknown to her and she fails to identify photographs of any Subjects.

Letter from Chicago Office to all Field Offices 2/14/35.

DETAILS:

Reference letter from the Chicago office contained an enclosure which contained a lead to interview Mae Fatheree, RFD 1, Box 34, Mobile, Alabama. Through the above address, Mae Fatheree was located at 815 Saint Francis Street, Mobile, Alabama, and she stated that she answered the advertisement of the "Get Acquainted Correspondence Club" of Denver, Colorado, furnishing her name to be added to their list, purely as a matter of fun; that afterwards, she received two letters, one from a man in California and another in Kansas or Nebraska, but that she did not answer or preserve them, and that she was now unable to recall the names. After being asked if the same was Harper or any known alias of Volney Davis, she replied in the negative and stated that she would be able to recall the handwriting if shown a sample. She was shown the photostatic copy of the letter written by Davis as Harper, and immediately informed that the same was not that of the persons who wrote to her but once. When shown the group photograph of the Subjects in this matter, she failed to identify the same as any person she knew or had seen. Miss Fatheree seemed very sincere throughout the interview and responded to all questions very quickly. She appears of a very poor family and with very little education, and is presently following her occupation of a trained nurse.

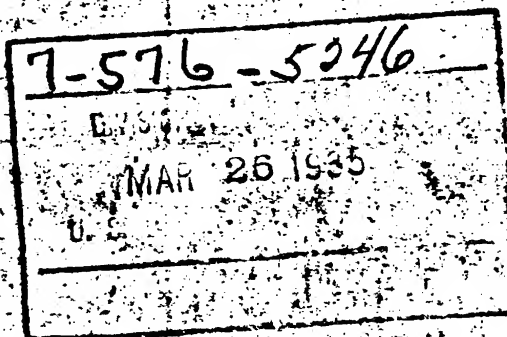
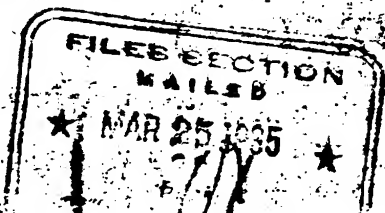

## MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Bremer Case.

Mr. Alt telephoned from the Jacksonville Office and advised that this morning at Miami, Florida, Dolores Delaney and Wynona Burdette were sentenced to five years each in an institution to be designated by the Attorney General, on charges of harboring Alvin Karpis.

I remarked that it was my understanding that the maximum sentence under the harboring statutes was two years. Mr. Alt stated that he was under that impression also, but he had asked one of the Agents to confer with the United States Attorney about this point in order to avoid a come-back, and he has just received a call from the United States Marshal advising that the sentences as given above are correct; that is, five years each. Mr. Alt mentioned that there were two or three counts in the indictment against these women, and this may account for the length of the sentences. Mr. Alt further stated that there are no qualifications to the sentences; that is, no time suspended and no probationary periods.

Mr. Alt stated that they are bringing these women back to Jacksonville, and will leave Miami at 11:05 A.M., and will arrive in Jacksonville about 6:20 P.M.

Special Agent B. F. Fitzsimons, Resident Agent at Miami, Florida, today advised that on March 25, 1935, Federal Judge Halsted L. Ritter, at Miami, Florida, signed an order directing the Superintendent of the Western Union Telegraph Company, Miami, Florida, to produce before the Clerk of the District Court, Miami, Florida, the original telegram.

Judge Ritter in signing the order declined to make it returnable prior to Monday, April 1st, 1935, on which date the Western Union Telegraph Company must show cause why the telegram should not be delivered, if it is not in fact, produced before the Clerk.

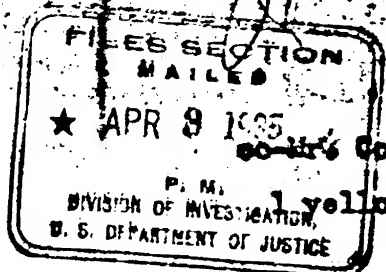

Reference is again made to the report of Special Agent D.E. Hall, Detroit, Michigan, 9-25-34, on page 22 of which it is shown that the apartment of ALVIN KARPIS, 3973 West 140th Street, Cleveland, Ohio, was raided by agents of the Detroit Office. Page 23 discloses that a letterhead of A. WHEBER BRAND ORGANIZATION, INC., 971 Dennison Avenue, Cleveland, etc., etc., was recovered. The Detroit Office is requested to advise as to the identity of the agent who can produce this paper at the trial in St. Paul when testifying as to having secured it from the above mentioned apartment. Page 24 of the above mentioned report discloses that two loaded clips for a .380 automatic pistol were also found. The Detroit Office should advise the St. Paul Office immediately as to the party who can testify as to the finding of these clips and what disposition was made of these clips. Page 25 of said report discloses that one, Mickey Mouse Watch, in a box wrapped in tissue paper with the following printing, "To Bobby Strutz from Dolores", was found in the apartment above noted. The Detroit Office should advise as to the identity of the party who found this article and the party who can introduce same in evidence. Page 26 of the above mentioned report discloses the finding of a business form postcard, dated at Cleveland, Ohio, September 10, 1934, etc., etc.. The Detroit Office should advise as to the identity of the agent who found this card and who can introduce same in evidence. Page 26 also discloses a business postcard from the East Ohio Gas Company, etc., etc. The same information should be furnished the St. Paul Office. Page 26 also discloses that one receipt from the Frankelit Company, etc., etc., was also found at the above mentioned apartment and the same information should be furnished the St. Paul Office. Similar information should be furnished the St. Paul Office with regard to the last four items mentioned on page 26 of the above mentioned report. Similar information should be furnished the St. Paul Office with regard to the second and third items mentioned on page seven of the above report.

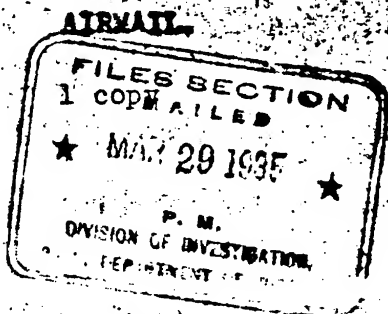

There are transmitted herewith mimeographed copies of the reports submitted by Special Agent in Charge J. H. Hanson and Special Agent R. D. Brown, dated at Jacksonville, Florida, February 20, 1935 and February 25, 1935, respectively. The Bureau desires that each Special Agent in Charge familiarize himself with the detailed information contained in these reports respecting the modus operandi of the fugitives, Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell, so that in the event these individuals, or any of their associates, should appear in your district, you will be prepared to act promptly and intelligently in the matter.

Under date of October 13, 1934, the Bureau transmitted temporary "wanted" notices reflecting the fingerprints and photographs of various members and associates of the Barker-Karpis gang. You were instructed to have an agent personally call upon the Chief of Police or Person in Charge of the identification bureaus, located in the larger cities in your district, and furnish them with a copy of the temporary "wanted" notices, requesting that if any information was received by them respecting the whereabouts of these individuals, your office should be promptly notified. You were also instructed to maintain flash cards so that the temporary "wanted" notices could be withdrawn at the proper time.

On February 2, 1935 the Bureau directed a letter to all field offices, requesting that the temporary "wanted" notices of Fred Barker, with aliases, Division No. 59163, be withdrawn. Since that date, Jess Doyle, Division No. 99402, and Edna Murray, with aliases, Division No. 9397, have been apprehended. There have been issued by the Bureau Identification Orders on: Harry Campbell, with aliases, Division No. 419856; Volney Davis, with aliases, Division No. 400441; William Weaver, with aliases, Division No. 17920; Harry Sawyer, with aliases, Division No. 421335, and Myrtle Eaton, with aliases, Division No. 337474, which, of course, will supercede the temporary "wanted" notices previously distributed by the Bureau. It is, therefore, desired that all of the foregoing mentioned temporary "wanted" notices now be withdrawn from the various police departments in the same manner that they were left with those police departments, and that the Bureau be advised by letter when this has been done. To permit these temporary "wanted" notices to remain in the files of the local police departments will undoubtedly result in confusion. Mere notice to disregard these "wanted" notices will also be confusing. Therefore, the Bureau's instructions should be strictly followed.

There should be left on file with the various police departments the temporary "wanted" notices issued by the Bureau on Clyde Ximerick, with aliases, Division No. 77961, and Charles J. Fitzgerald, with aliases, Division No. 95780. These two individuals are not under indictment in connection with this case. The Bureau is interested, however, in ascertaining their whereabouts, inasmuch as they are possible contacts for the remaining members of the Barker-Karpis gang. With reference to Fitzgerald, your attention is directed to the letter of the Detroit Office, addressed to the St. Paul Office under date of February 23, 1935, a copy of which was furnished to each field office. You are instructed to place with the Motor Vehicle Registration Bureaus in your District an appropriate "stop" notice with respect to the Buick sedan described in the letter of Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley, dated at Chicago, Illinois, February 19, 1935, and addressed to the St. Paul Office.

In the event any of the subjects or their associates are located in your District, you should immediately notify Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley at Chicago, Illinois, and the Bureau, before taking any action in the premise. This instruction should, of course, be disregarded in the event an emergency situation arises where it appears necessary to take any of the subjects into custody before notifying Mr. Connelley or the Bureau.

Miss Margey Henderson, 901 Woodland Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, whose name appeared on the list of women published by the Cat Acquainted Correspondence Club of Denver, Colorado, was recently interviewed by an Agent of this office to determine whether she had been in touch with Volney Davis, who used the name G. L. Harper and had been corresponding with her as a woman on that list. At the time of an interview she promised that should she receive any communications from Harper she would notify this office. Miss Henderson appeared at the Kansas City office on March 23, 1935, and presented a letter postmarked at Chicago, Illinois, Englewood Station, March 6, 1935, bearing return address 6624 Sangamon Street, Chicago, Illinois, which letter is signed by Clarence Anderson. The letter is written in long-hand with green ink and same is quoted for your information, as follows:

"6624 Sangamon Str.  
Chicago, Ill.  
Feb. 26th, 1935

"Dear Friend:- I am not so sure just how interesting I can make this letter, for it sure is a hard job writing to some one you have never met, but I'm going to do the best I can and then trust to luck that you find it interesting enough to make you want to answer it.

"You see I have onley lived here in the city for a little over a year now, and I've sure tried mighty hard to make friends, but for some reason havent been very successful, so now it looks like, for the first time in my life I have to admit being a failure. rescue and accept me as a friend, if you do pal I promise you'll never regret it.

"I will now endeavor and give you a brief description of myself. I am twenty nine years old, am five ft. nine inches tall and weigh one hundred and sixty pounds. Have light brown hair and blue eyes am Swedish descent. I don't happen to have any picture of myself right now, but I will have some taken and send you one later. In case you have a picture of yourself and could spare it, wont you please send it to me.

"I like all sports, both indoor and outdoor but baseball and hockey are my favorites. I like to swim, play golf, skiing and ice skating. I like to dance, go to good shows and read, also go on fishing trips and good long hikes.

"Now for a little about my work and for whom I work. I am a shipping clerk for a large cereal concern, Washburn & Crosby and have worked for them for over eight years. I started in for them in my home town before I was twenty one years old and worked there till Dec. of 1933 when I was transfered here to the city.

"Now that you know this much about me wont you answer and let me prove to your satisfaction that I can be a real true friend.

It is noted that while the writer of the letter stated he did not have a photograph of himself available at that time, there was a snapshot photograph of a man enclosed in the letter. The photograph is not a likeness of Volney Davis. However, this circumstance might not be of importance.

It is noted that the description furnished by the writer of the letter would in a general way fit Volney Davis. Also the name Clarence Anderson might be an alias used by Davis since he has been in the habit of using Scandinavian names for his aliases, especially the alias Hanson. Recently Esther Williams, 119 North Topping Street, Kansas City, Missouri, with whom Davis corresponded under the alias Hanson and who had received calls thought to be from Volney Davis, stated that during the second week of March, 1935, she



received a call from a man whose voice she believed to be identical with the party who formerly called her stating that his name was Hanson and on this occasion she understood him to say it was "Mr. Anderson" calling.

The envelope containing the letter and photograph, which was presented by Miss Henderson, had already been opened by her and the contents had been handled. However, the letter has not been handled since it reached this office nor has the photograph. The letter and its contents are being forwarded to the Bureau with two copies of this letter in order that a fingerprint analysis may be made. It would appear from casual examination that the handwriting might not be similar with that of Volney Davis although there is some similarity in the handwriting as compared with that of Davis when he wrote the Oct Acquainted Correspondence Club at Denver, Colorado. A photostatic copy of his letter to that organization is in possession of the Bureau.

Agents of this office are conducting further interview with Margey Henderson at Kansas City and she is to be requested to reply to the letter, furnishing suitable details in order that further correspondence may be had with the writer of the letter and that party will be encouraged in his suit for the present. It is noted that certain details are given by Clarence Anderson indicating that he has worked as a shipping clerk for Washburn and Crosby in some smaller town, name not mentioned, and that in December, 1933, he was transferred by that company to its branch at Chicago, Illinois. It is indicated by Anderson that he has worked for Washburn and Crosby for over eight years. The Chicago office is requested to immediately make a discreet investigation through the Chicago branch of the Washburn Crosby Company to determine whether Clarence Anderson is a real individual employed by that concern and residing at 6624 Sangamon Street, Chicago, Illinois. It is also requested that inquiry be made to determine who resides at 6624 Sangamon Street in Chicago although no open approach at that address is desired, unless same seems advisable from investigation by you. It occurs that a party in Chicago desiring the companionship of a young lady would under ordinary circumstances scarcely be communicating with a girl as far distant as Kansas City. It is known that Volney Davis desired to make contacts with the women on the correspondence list adjacent to Kansas City and it is thought possible that he may be corresponding from some other point, possibly Kansas City, having his letters mailed through the address given in Chicago.

Please advise the Kansas City office at your earliest convenience relative to your findings.

Reference is now made to the report of Special Agent D.E. Hall, Detroit, Michigan, dated 11-5-34, page 12 of which discloses that, "Twelve latent prints were developed on the pages of the notebook and two of them have been identified with the right thumb and the left thumb of FRED BARKER, our file #59163". For the assistance of the United States Attorney in this case, it is desired that you advise this office as to the identity of the person who can testify as to the receipt of this notebook at the Bureau and further inform as to the identity of the party who can testify as to the scientific treatment of this notebook and the identification of the right thumb and the left thumb print of FRED BARKER, together with such person who will be able to produce said notebook and testify to such finding.

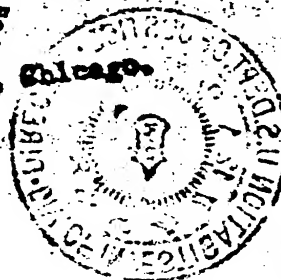
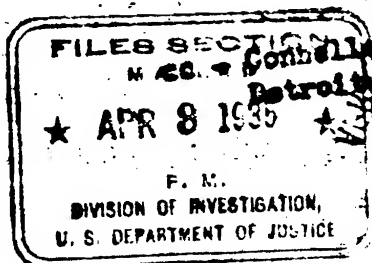

He advised that after the completion of the trial he would then consider the advisability of withdrawing the subpoena duces tecum on this property.

**SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:** Hal L. Norwood, former Attorney General of Arkansas, states Phoenix Donald, unknown to him and does not remember signing petition for parole.

**REFERENCE:** Report Special Agent in Charge E. E. Conroy, dated Little Rock, Arkansas, September 22, 1934.

**DETAILS:**

Hal L. Norwood, former Attorney General for the State of Arkansas, 408 Donaghey Building, Little Rock, Arkansas, advised he did not remember signing the petition for the parole of Phoenix Donald from the Oklahoma State Penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, on June 20, 1931; further, Phoenix Donald is unknown to him. Mr. Norwood stated that to the best of his memory, he signed this parole at the instance of John H. Caldwell, Assistant Attorney General, whose home is Mammoth Springs, Arkansas.

John H. Caldwell, Auditor's office, State Capitol, Little Rock, Arkansas, advised Phoenix Donald is not known to him but that he is acquainted with W. T. Bowling, brother-in-law of Phoenix Donald at Salem, Arkansas, and at the best of his memory requested Mr. Norwood to sign the parole at the instance of Mr. Bowling. Mr. Caldwell stated he could furnish no information relative to Phoenix Donald, his family or past personal history.

Inquiry in Little Rock, Arkansas, revealed Harvey Parnell, former Governor of Arkansas, who signed the parole of Phoenix Donald in 1931 is presently located at Halley, Arkansas.
