The report of special Agent J. R. in inton, Cincinnati, Ohio, Sated February 7, 1936, reflects that 13 Ohio liceuse number this was issued to John Alexander, 2419 at Avenue, Edienceville, Chie for a 1989 Whippet readster bearing in himber 423350. It is noted from the reports above mentioned from the Little Book office that the 1955 Ohio license number HESM was on a Rudson coups driven by an individual known only as George. who was described as being 30 to 55 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches tull and of modium builds

Attention is now invited to the report of Special Agent Thu, above referred to, in which it is noted that an interview his had with one Edward pickson, exleaned for the Manning Barione of Company, Youngstown, Ohio, this interview apparently relating to the purchase of 1925 Midson coupe bearing motor number 60549. The report indicates that the photographs of the subjects in the Bremer are were exhibited to Mr. A. Marions and Mr. Maward Dickson, who willed to identify may of these subjects as being identical with the F. Parker or F. Hunter. this Hudson soups and who was known to him as Empter as being 35 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches in height, weighing 120 pounds and less in one log.

It is to be noted that the description of Harry Campbell appearing on the Identification Order issued by the Bureau indicates that Harry Campbell in 5 feet 5 inches in height, weighs 135 to 140 pounds and is lame in right leg.

The report of Special Agent E. J. Nyun, previously mentioned, also sets forth the information that Post Office Inspector E. E. Tavner of Youngstown, this had been making inquiries concerning Fred Eunter at Leavittshurg, this as being a possible suspect in the Correttsville, this mail train robbery which occurred at Correttsville, this en Kovember 7, 1935, for which trime the Post Office Inspectors are now searching for Alvin Karpis, Burry Compbell, Som Coker and one Milton Lett.

From the circumstances described above it appears possible that the George who was driving the Hudson course bearing 1935 Chie license number HEE! might be identical with Harry Geophelis. A discrepancy in the description of George as furnished by the individuals at Not Springs, Arkaneas is noted, these persons stating that George was 5 feet 7 inches in height. However, it will be noted that Raveld King, who was later identified as being identical with Hunter, was described as being 5 feet 9 1/2 inches in height when in fact Fred Hunter is only 5 feet 6 inches in height. It is therefore possible that the George referred to was not in fact 5 feet 7 inches in height, "George" is a known alies of Harry Campbell.

The Cleveland office is requested to expedite investigation at Scienceville, Ohio concerning 1935 Ohio license plates number HESE, it being noted that these license plates were issued for a Whippet ear and were observed in Hot Springs, Arkansas on a Hudson coups, as previously stated. It is possible that these plates were stolen from Mr. Alexander and all facts conserming same should be obtained from him.

It is also suggested that Mr. Diekson at Youngstoum, Ohie again be interviewed and shown the photograph of Fred Hunter to ascertain if he can identify this individual as baying Hudson coupe, motor number 60348. Investigation should be conducted to determine if this individual purchased any other Hudson coupes from this firm. The photograph of Marry Campbell which was recently furnished to all field offices by the Burcou should be displayed to Mr. Mickeon and Mr. Marione at Youngstown, Ohio inasmuch as Nymons Burdette has advised that this is a good likeness of Marry Campbell and probably more easily identified as Marry Campbell than the one appearing on the Identification Order issued for this individual.

The Lit. sock office is requested to some a thorough investigation at the both houses located at Not Springs. Arkansa to escential whether harry Compbell is presently frequenting these places. Information has been obtained by the Chicago Bureau office that Earry Compbell is suffering with generative Incumation. This 1931 is possibly what causes the lameness in his right leg as is indicated on his description in the Identification order. It is possible that Harry Compbell is using the facilities of the bath houses at Hot Springs, Arkansas for treatment as to the disease which he is alleged to have.

A copy of this letter is being designated for the Oklahoma City office for their information in connection with the surveillance presently being conducted on the Campbell family at Tules, Oklahoma so that this office will be fully advised in the event a cor answering the description of the one observed at Hot Springs, Arkaness is seen in the vicinity of the Campbell home.

A copy of this letter is also being furnished to the Kl Paso, los Angeles and Phoenix offices for their information in connection with the surveillance presently being conducted of Charles J. Fitzgorald. A photograph of Fred Hunter is also attached for the El Paso, Phoenix and Los Angeles offices.

For the information of the Los Angeles office, investigation by the Little Rock effice at Not Springs, Artempta at a place known as Eurah's Landing revealed that Mr. Horris B. Loftic, Hot Springs, Arkansas, furnished the information that Fred Parker, Tomay Coleman and Barold King departed from Dyer's Landing on the afternoon of Cetober 2, 1935 for San Disgo, having supposedly received a call through "George" from a friend at San Disgo. It is not known whether this circumstance has any significance. However, should the investigation by the Cleveland office determine that Harry George is in fact in association with Fred Hunter and has purchased or is predently in possession of a Hudson coupe, it might well be that the George referred to is in fact Harry Campbell and communicating with Charles J. Fitzgerald at Los Angeles.



details concerning her association with a man she claimed to be Karpis, and all the facts surrounding the situation.

Lillian Moore, who at the present time is residing at the Larsen Apartments, located at 441 Ellis Street, San Francisco, California, stated she occupied apartment No. 305. She further stated she had first encountered the individual she knew as John Kendall, on the road outside of Vallejo, and that she and her mother had picked him up, end carried him into the city. She further stated that in conversation with this individual, she suggested that he might get relief from the W. P. A. in Vallejo, but he immediately replied that he could not contact any organization where he might be fingerprinted, since he was a fugitive from justice.

Lillian Moore also stated that John Kendall stated to her that he had stolen two automatic pistols from the pistol range on the U.S. Navy Post, at Mare Island, and that he carried these guns constantly.

Lillian Moore stated that she again saw John Kendall a few days later in the City of Vallejo, and that after that particular meeting she did not see him any more until December 31, 1935, at which time she brought him from the City of Vallejo down to Cakland, California. She said that at that time John Kendall was drinking heavily, and during the time that she was with him he told her that he was Alvin Karpis, and that he was wanted by all the authorities in the United States. She stated that at this point she became quite agitated over his identity, and left him in his drunken state.

Lillian Noore further stated that John Kendall was at the present time residing at 728 Delaware Street, in the City of Berkeley, California, and that he never left this particular residence except at night, and while he was in the house he kept a constant guard of the door, having his automatics ready at all times to combat any intruder.

Lillian Moore stated that she would cooperate in every way with the San Francisco Bureau Office in apprehending this particular individual.

She gave the following as a description of John Kendall, who claimed that he was Alvin Kerpis:

Age 30 years.
Height 5'10".
Hair Dark brown.
Eyes Blue.
Complexion Ruddy.
Build Heavy.
Weight 160 lbs.

Lillian Moore also claimed that John Kendall had told her he had killed a Federal Officer near New Brunswick, New Jersey.

At Berkeley, California

This Agent, at Berkeley, California, was accompanied by Special Agent E. X. Humphrey.

With the assistance of informant Lillian Moore, John Kendell was observed, and it was quite apparent from his physical make-up and appearance that he was not Alvin Karpis, but from his general demeanor it seemed advisable to report his present whereabouts and activities to the local police.

This Agent contacted J. A. Greening, Chief of Police, Berkeley, California, and presented to him the facts in connection with this matter, stating that it was very apparent this man was not Alvin Karpis, and probably not a fugitive that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in, and that he would probably, under the circumstances, want to pick this individual up for investigation.

The state of the state of the state of

Chief Greening stated that he would like to have this man picked up for investigation, and together with Lieutenant Laird, John Joseph Kendall was picked up at 728 Delaware Street, in the City of Berkeley, California, and brought to the office of the Berkeley Police Department, where he was questioned vigorously by members of the Berkeley Police Department and this Agent. It was disclosed from this interview that John Joseph Kendall apparently was not a fugitive from justice, and from his credentials was a former Marine, who was, at the present time, doing relief work in the State of California.

Following is the description of John Joseph Kendall, as observed by this Agent:

The suspect was fingerprinted and photographed by the Berkeley Police, and these prints were given No. 3624, and forwarded by air mail, along with photographs of the suspect, to the Bureau of Identification, at Washington, D.C.

Photographic copies of the fingerprints and photograph of the suspect are being retained in the files of the San Francisco Office, in connection with any further investigation that might arise.

The records of the Berkeley Police Department show that John Joseph Kendall was brought in for investigation on information received by the United States Department of Justice, to the effect that he was a fugitive from justice; that the investigation disclosed mistaken identity, and that the suspect was exonerated, and released pending receipt of information based on the fingerprints that were sent in to the Bureau of Identification, Washington, D.C.

R. O. Griffin, of the Bureau of Identification, Berkeley Police Department, stated that their records failed to reveal any former arrest concerning John Joseph Kendall.

A photographic copy of the fingerprints of the suspect, together with a photograph of him, are being forwarded to the Bureau under separate cover.

DETAILS:

Surveillance at the registry section of the Main Post Office, Cleveland, Ohio, with reference to letters willed at that point, addressed to Mrs. Maggie Lett, Wanh, Oklahoma, was discontinued on January 20, 1936,

in view of the information which has proviously seported in this case indicating that undoubtedly the sender of the registered letters was kilton Lett, son of Mrs. Maggie Lett, who was in the vicinity of Cleveland, Ohio during part of which time he was employed at the Harvard tlub.

Effective February 4, 1936 a telephone tap was placed on the telephone of Marie Flynn, 11835 Lake Avenue, Apartment 19, Lakewood, Ohio, telephone number Lakewood 6554M, previous Bureau authority having been secured. This telephone tap was for the primary purpose of covering conversations of James "Tip" O'Neill, who lives at that address, and who, as previously reported in this investigation, is closely associated with the operators of the Harvard Club at Cleveland, Ohio. The plant from which this telephone is being tapped is located at 1297 Idlewood Avenue, upstairs, and is being maintained by Special Agents W. B. O'Mahoney and H. B. Dill.

Effective February 6, 1936, prior authority having been secured, a telephone tap was placed on the telephone of Art Hebebrand, 3909 West 158th Street, Cleveland, Ohio, telephone number CLearwater Ol71, the tap being run into an upstairs apartment at 3830 West 157th Street, and is presently being maintained by Special Agents E. J. Dowd and L. A. Ducommun. As a result of information obtained on the telephone tap of Art Hebebrand, indicating that he was about to leave town on the late evening of February 7, 1936, he was invited to the Cleveland Bureau office where he was thoroughly interrogated by Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley and Special Agent in Charge J. P. MacFarland, and the interview with Hebebrand has been covered by letter submitted by Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley, dated February 11, 1936.

The confidential informant of the Cleveland office, who was formerly employed at the Harvard Club, called at the Cleveland office on January 21st and 27th, 1936, at which time he advised that on January 25, 1936 Art Hebebrand had been out all day with William F. Fergus and that upon coming home he was somewhat intoxicated and very much worried and told his brother-in-law, Bill Carlisle, that he, Hebebrand, was being investigated for alleged income tax violations and also for harboring Karpis. The confidential informant received this information

/ k

The confidential informant further advised that Art Hebebrand has been having an affair with a girl by the name of Ruth, who, when at the Harvard Club, was head Keno girl. The confidential informant's information was that Ruth originally came from Marion, Ohio, and lived in Cleveland with her aunt somewhere in the vicinity of 138th and Lorain Avenue; that she has two daughters, ages about ten and eight years, who attend St. Joseph's Academy at Cleveland, Ohio; that Ruth at one time befriended a dealer at the Harvard Club, who was discharged by Art Hebebrand, this dealer being known to the informant as Benny the Lug, and that the latter owned a Packard automobile. As will be set out in detail subsequently in this report, Ruth at the present time is driving a Packard Victoria with Ohio license plates #JU663, which were originally issued to Benny Levine. He died in December, 1935.

The confidential informant advised, upon viewing a photograph of Fred Hunter, that the latter was employed at the Harvard Club in the spring of 1935, and that while employed there as a card dealer he appeared to be very intimate with Art Hebebrand and Tony Amersbach; that he was under the impression that Hunter resided somewhere in the vicinity of Madison and Rocky River Road in an apartment building. He was unable to associate Milton Lett intimately with Fred Hunter.

Investigation was made by this Agent and Special Agent E. J. Dowd in the vicinity of Madison Avenue and Riverside Drive, the latter being an extension of Rocky River Road, at the Parkview, Riverside, and Larchmont Apartments. However, Hunter could not be identified as ever having resided in any of the above mentioned apartments.

Special Agent C. E. Smith and this Agent, at Akron, Ohio, with the assistance of Detective Robert Van Steenberg, interviewed J. T. Dunn, a local gambler, mentioned in reference report of Special Agent E. J. Wynn, Cleveland, Ohio, dated January 20, 1936. Dunn stated upon viewing a photograph of Milton Lett that he knew the latter by the name of Thomas JAShaw, it appearing that he first became acquainted with him over a year ago, at which time he was brought to Dunn's place by Fred Hunter, the latter being known by Dunn at that time as Fred King; that Lett played cards at Dunn's gembling place and always appeared to be "well healed" with money, having in his possession at all times sums of money aggregating \$1,000; that he last saw Lett in his place at Akron, Ohio, in about April of 1935, that is previous to the occasion of his seeing Lett at the time the latter was arrested in Akron, Ohio on October 19, 1935; that on the occasion of Lett's arrest, Fred Hunter came to Dunn and requested him to call the police department to see what charge Lett was being held on; that on the occasion of Lett's arrest, one Clayton Hall of Youngstown, Ohio, was picked up with him, but was released; that since the release of Lett by the Akron Police Department he, Dunn, has not seen him and has no information concerning his whereabouts.

With reference to Clayton Hall of Youngstown, Ohio, Detective Van Steenberg advised that it is his understanding that Hall is a gambler of some prominence in Youngstown and has some employment connection with the Bethlehem Steel Company of Youngstown, Ohio. It would appear according to the facts related by Detective Van Steenberg that there is a definite connection between Fred Hunter, Clayton Hall, and Milton Lett.

Detective Van Steenberg, at a time subsequent to the interview, furnished the Cleveland office with the following memorandum concerning information he had received in regard to Fred Hunter:

mended to one Akron man where to sell some gambling equipment in Cleveland. Hunter was taken to Cleveland by the local Akron man on the 18th of October. Hunter gave the Akron man an introduction to Mr. Hebebrand of the Harvard Club and Mr. Patton of the Thomas Club. Both Hebebrand and Patton placed orders for equipment with the Akron man, who in turn gave Hunter a commission for the sale and connection.

"On this date Hunter, alias King, told the Akron man that he had traded his Ford coupe in Cleveland for a new V8 sedan, and that the deal would go through in several days; that the V8 was not yet ready. Fred Hunter had his Ford then in the name of Harold King and supposed to be registered in Warren County under that name, and Hunter then asked for and received a courtesy card from the Western Union in Akron under the name of King, and gave as his address 1394 Oak Street, S. W., Warren, Ohio, care of Mr. Anderson of the Single G Club.

"Fred Hunter was in Washington, D. C. some time in October and sold to one John Evans, who runs a gambling joint in Washington, D. C., a large order for gambling equipment. It was then that things began to happen and the Akron man never received the order from Hunter directly, and has not heard of Hunter since then. On November 6th John Evans telegraphed from Washington, D. C. to the Akron man about the delayed order he had placed with Hunter. The Akron man then shipped to Evans in Washington, D. C. the order. He is still holding the \$25.00 check of Fred Hunter for Hunter's commission, and will notify us if and when Fred Hunter writes or places any other orders for the Akron man."

Referring to the report of Special Agent R. C. Coulter, Little Rock, Arkansas, dated October 19, 1935, it is noted that an individual, apparently Fred Hunter, but known as Harold King, was in the vicinity of Hot Springs, under suspicious circumstances, with a person thought to be Tommy Coleman, reputedly a Cleveland gangster.

J. T. Dunn was interrogated with reference to any knowledge he had in regard to a man by the name of Coleman. He identified Akron Police Department photograph #17333 as being a person who travelled with Fred Hunter, by the name of Trafton who is a crooked gambler and a suspicious individual. He is described as follows:

The Bureau is being requested by separate letter for the criminal record of this individual, and based upon further investigation in the vicinity of Akron, Youngstown, and Warren, Ohio, the Cleveland office will consider the advisability of checking further with reference to this individual in the hope that through him Milton Lett may be located.

In view of the fact that Lett has been reported to have been in possession of considerable money while in Ohio, and further since his description fitted somewhat generally the description of participants in various bank robberies in the Cleveland district, investigation was conducted for the purpose of determining whether or not witnesses could identify Lett as having participated in any of the recent bank robberies.

Following is the result of such investigation conducted by Special Agent H. B. Dill:

The following bank robberies occurred in the Cleveland erritory:

- (1) Citizens Bank of Madison, Madison, Ohio on 10/25/35 at 1:45 P. M. Cleveland file No. 91-29;
- (2) The Farmers National Bank Salem, Ohio on 11/4/35 at 3:30 P. M. Cleveland file No. 91-32;
- (3) The Union Banking Company Columbiana, Ohio on 12/26/35 at 12:30 P. M. Cleveland file No. 91-37.

In connection with the instant case, pictures of the following men were shown to witnesses of the above bank robberies for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not any of these men were involved in any of the above-mentioned robberies:

- (1) William Hunter
- (2) Sam Coker,
- (3) VerlyLove,
- (4) James F. O'Neill
- (5) Fred Hunter,
- (6) Milton Lett,
- (7) Tommy\Trafton, alias Coleman.

Witnesses to the robbery at Salem, Ohio, who were shown the above-mentioned pictures made no identifications. Those witnesses are:

- (1) W. L. Hart, Cashier, Farmers National Bank, Salem, Ohio;
- (2) Mrs. L. B. Smith, 531 Aetna Avenue, Salem, Ohio;
- (3) James Gurleo, 406 Franklin Street, Salem, Ohio;
- (4) Russell Stallsmith, 808 South Washington, Salem, Ohio.

George Gottschling, 956 East Fifth Street, Salem, Ohio, was a witness to the Salem, Ohio robbery and he was shown the above pictures with a number of other pictures. From the group, Gottschling selected Milton Lett's picture and stated that although he could not positively identify Lett as being one of the men, his picture most resembled one of the two he noticed closely. Gottschling stated that he was going south in his model T Ford and that the bandits were headed north on the road he was travelling by the Salem Post Office. He stated that there were two men seated in the front seat of the bandits' car and that Lett's picture resembles one of them. He could not state which one. He stated that the two men got out of the car when the other bandits returned with the money, and that one of the men who had been in the front seat went to the rear of the car and turned up the license plate, but that he did not know whether he was the one who resembled Lett or not.

Charles Safreed, 541 Ohio Avenue, Salem, Ohio, was also a witness to the Salem robbery. He was contacted by the writer at the Mona Manufacturing Company, where he works, and he was shown the above-mentioned pictures with a group of other pictures. Safreed selected Milton Lett's picture and stated that he could not make a positive identification, but that Lett resembles the man who picked up the money after Mr. Vincent was told to drop it by one of the bandits. He stated that the man resembling Lett then ran with the money to the rear of the bandit car and turned up the license plate.

The following witnesses of the Union Banking Company robbery, Columbiana, Ohio, were shown the above-mentioned pictures without making any identifications. The list of witnesses named below also includes those who were not actual eye witnesses to the robbery, but who had an opportunity, either before or after the bank was robbed, to see the bandits:

- (1) E. P. Funkhouser, Vice Pres., Union Banking Company, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (2) Miss Sylvia Smith, Union Banking Company employee, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (3) Miss Mary Crawford, Union Banking Company employee, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (4) Emory C. Wilkinson, 608 Parkwood Ave., Youngstown, Ohio;
- (5) W. A. Pearson, 1232 South Street, SE, Warren, Ohio;
- (6) R. T. Baker, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (7) Charles Keller, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (8) Richard Reedsaw, 228 Railroad Ave., Columbiana, Ohio;
- (9) Charles Rapp, Columbiana, Ohio;
- (10) Mr. and Mrs. Alton Higley, Columbiana Floral Co., Columbiana, Ohio;
- (11) Paul E. Myers, 517 Twelfth St., NE, Canton, Chio.

Mr. J. T. Tidd, Tidd Department Store, located just across the street from the Union Benking Company, Columbiana, Ohio, was a witness to the robbery. On being interviewed by the writer, Tidd stated that the day the bank was robbed his wife was upstairs over the store and she called to him and told him the bank was being robbed. He got the shot gun, left at his store by the bank, and went to the window over the department store and fired at the bandit, who was watching the front of the bank while the others were inside. Tidd was shown the above-mentioned pictures with a group of others and selected the pictures of Milton Lett and Tommy Trafton, alias Tommy Coleman, as resembling the bandit in front of the bank. He stated that he could not make a positive identification, however. He further stated that the picture of Tommy Trafton resembled the bandit more than the picture of Milton Lett, but he thought the bandit was taller than five feet five and one-fourth inches, which height was given on the back of Coleman's picture.

Mrs. J. T. Tidd, wife of J. T. Tidd, on being interviewed by Agent, stated that she saw the bandit who was standing in front of the bank while the bank was being robbed. She was shown the group of pictures and from it she selected the picture of Tommy Trafton as most resembling the bandit in front of the bank. She did not, however, make a positive identification. Mrs. Tidd's selection was made entirely independent of her husband's and at a different time than that when he selected the picture of Tommy Coleman as resembling the above-mentioned bandit.

Robert Sponseller, 26 Union Street, Columbiana, Ohio, on being interviewed stated that on the day the Union Banking Company was robbed, he was walking on the sidewalk just across the street from the bank and was told to "move along" by the bandit who was standing on the outside of the bank. Sponseller was furnished with the above-mentioned pictures and other pictures. From the group he selected Tommy Trafton as the one who most resembled the man on the sidewalk in front of the bank. He stated, however, that the identification was not positive.

George Barr, Barr Barber Shop, Columbiana, Ohio, on being interviewed stated that at the time the bank was being robbed he came out of his shop, which is located across the street and up the alley from the instant bank, and walked up the alley toward the bank; that the bandit, who was standing outside of the bank, shot several times at the upstairs window of Tidd's Department Store, and then shot down the alley toward him. He was shown the above-mentioned group of pictures and from it he selected the picture of Tommy Coleman, alias Tommy Trafton, as the individual who most resembles the bandit he saw.

Mr. Emory C. Wilkinson, 608 Parkwood Avenue, Youngstown, Ohio, on being interviewed stated that at about one P. M., December 26, 1935, he was driving an R. B. Bakery truck north on highway No. 7; when he reached the intersection where Highway No. 7 intersects Highway No. 14, he noticed a car coming at an exceedingly high rate of speed. He stopped to let this car get by. He stated that the car was a large, black, Buick sedan; that he could not see how many men were in the back seat, but that there were two in the front seat. Wilkinson stated that he turned east onto Highway No. 14, and just after he had gone through Unity, Ohio, four men in a black Plymouth sedan passed him at a high rate of speed. He stated that he did not know whether or not the Plymouth had a trunk on the rear, nor did he know whether it was a two-door or four-door model. Wilkinson stated that the Plymouth was going too fast for him to get the license number.

Mr. W. A. Pearson, 1232 South Street, SE, Warren, Ohio, on being interviewed by Agent, stated that on December 26, 1935, about 12:30 P. M. he was in Columbiana, Ohio on business; that he was on his way out of town and he drove by the Union Banking Company and noticed a hig, new, black, Buick sedan near the bank. He stated that he paid little attention to the driver of the Buick, instead he was looking at the car because he had been considering buying one like it. He stated that just after he had left Columbiana on Highway No. 14, this Buick passed him; that he was travelling about fifty miles per hour, and it was his opinion that the Buick was travelling about ninety miles per hour; that he noticed someone looking out the back window and heard the chains beating against the fenders as if they were broken. Pearson further stated that just before he reached Unity, Ohio, he noticed a gray Plymouth or Ford; that he was fairly certain it was a Plymouth, but that it might have been a Ford; this Plymouth was about one city block ahead of him. He stated that he was certain the car did not have a trunk on the rear; that there was a spare tire on the rear; that he did not know how many men were in the car, but when he first noticed it a man was getting in on the right side of the car, probably in the front seat.

Continuing, Pearson stated that the gray car started at a fast rate of speed; that the last time he saw it it turned north from Highway No. 14 at Unity, Ohio onto Highway #170 (toward Petersburg, Ohio.) Pearson stated that he later learned that the place at which he saw the gray car start was the nearest point on Highway #14 to where the Buick (the getaway car) was found.

Mr. Pearson stated that he did not believe he would recognize the man he saw driving the car (Buick) near the bank at Columbiana, Ohio. He was shown the above-mentioned pictures, but made no identification. He stated he did not get close enough to read the license plates on the gray car.

Mr. Emory C. Wilkinson, Youngstown, Ohio, stated he did not see the men in either the Buick or the Plymouth. He was, therefore, not shown the pictures.

The above mentioned pictures were shown to the witnesses of the Citizens Bank of Madison, Madison, Ohio, Cleveland file No. 91-29, case entitled, LELAND E. CUMMINGS; UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; CITIZENS BANK OF MADISON, Madison, Ohio - Bank robbery.

MADISON, Madison, Ohio - Bank robbery.

Mr. George D. Lippert, Cashier of the instant bank, on being shown these pictures, made no identifications.

Mr. C. C. Lawson, Assistant Cashier of the instant bank, on being shown these pictures made no identifications.

Mr. L. E. Robinson, 55 Park Street, Madison, Ohio, stated he was sitting in the park just across the street from the bank, and he saw the men leave the bank, get into their car, and speed down the street. However, he did not see them at close enough range to be able to identify them from the pictures.

Mr. S. A. Shupe, manager of the Schio Oil Station located just across the park from the instant bank (about a block away) stated that immediately after the bank was robbed, he noticed an automobile, of which he could not give a definite description, pass west in front of his station. He stated, however, that he did not see any of the occupants of the car and, therefore, could not identify any of them from the pictures.

Mrs. Ava Nelson, 123 River Street, Madison, Ohio, selected the picture of Milton Lett and stated that he looked very much like the man who sat out in the car while the other two robbers were in the bank, but who came into the bank at the time she, as a customer, entered the bank to get a check cashed; that after she had been told by one of the bandits that there was no cash with which to cash a check, she started to leave the bank, but was told by Bandit #3, as he pushed a gun into the small of her back, to go back into the bank. She stated that she had been speaking of this bandit as Bandit #3.

It will be noted that the bandit mentioned above is referred to as Bandit #3 in reports submitted in the above mentioned bank robbery, and Mrs. Ava Nelson is the only one who could give a description of this bandit. Mrs. Nelson stated that of the numerous pictures she has seen, including the pictures in the bank robbery album of the Cleveland office, and other pictures shown to her by Agents of the Cleveland office, and other pictures, this is the first time she has seen a picture which resembles Bandit #3. This statement of Mrs. Nelson's is verified by the Cleveland office file No. 91-29. It will be noted on page seven of the report of Special Agent D. E. Wells, Cleveland, Ohio, dated October 30, 1935, in the above mentioned file, that after being shown the bank robbers' album, Mrs. Nelson did not make an identification; that she did, however, state that Cummings resembled Bandit #1, after it was called to her attention by an Agent of this office and also by Mr. Lippert, cashier of the instant bank.

The description of Bandit #3, set out in the report of Special Agent D. E. Wells, Cleveland, Ohio, dated October 30, 1935, page 7, is as follows:

Age 30-35 years 5'6" Height 150 pounds Weight Broad and short Build \ Ruddy Brown Complexion Hair Light brown or hazel with peculiar glint
Low and hard Low and hard Voice Face Looked young, except for deep furrows and wrinkles, deep wrinkles in face, skin loose, loose lips Noticeably long fingers in . spite of short height and and stocky build; talked from corner of mouth. Gray felt hat, brown loose fitting suit.

A description of Milton Lett as is given on the back of his picture taken by the Akron Police Department on October 20, 1935, Akron Police Department #26337, is as follows:

21 years Height 143 pounds Weight Dark brown Hair Blue Eyes White Race Medium Build Marital Status Single Nationality American Aliases 🛴 Thomas J. Shaw, Carl Baker Clean shaven

Mrs. Nelson stated that of the picture taken by the Akron Police Department, the picture on the extreme right in which Lett is wearing a hat, beers the most resemblance to Bandit #3. She stated that she could not positively identify Lett from the picture, but that she was almost certain that he was the man known to her as Bandit #3. She stated that Bandit #3 wore his shirt and tie just as Lett does in the picture taken of him by the Akron Police Department. She stated, however, she did not notice any wrinkles in the picture, but she did seem to notice wrinkles in the man's face, known to her as Bandit #3.

The following investigation was conducted and reported by Special Agent E. J. Dowd:

On the morning of January 21, 1936, Post Office Inspector S. J. Hettrick in interview at his office advised that post office inspectors have been conducting investigations at Coffeyville, Kansas and Oklahoma in an effort to locate MILTON LETT. He stated that from reports received by him Lett was last seen at Coffeyville during the middle or latter part of December, 1935; that the four inspectors who are now exclusively engaged on the Carrettsville mail train robbery, under his supervision, have a line on Lett and hope to locate him in the near future.

According to Inspector Hettrick the Post Office Department is in a position to pay as much as \$2,000 reward on each of the five men who actually participated in the Garrettsville mail train robbery, end in addition thereto Inspector Hettrick stated he can pay immediately \$1,000 to any person furnishing information to him which will lead to the arrest of any or all of the men who participated in the robbery. He advised that in addition to paid confidential informants, peace officers are cooperating with the post office inspectors and making a diligent search to locate a number of suspects, among them being Lett, Fred Hunter, Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell. He advised that in the event any of the last named suspects are located or taken into custody the Cleveland office will be promptly notified.

Mr. Hettrick advised that he requived information to the effect that Agents of this Bureau were making inquiry concerning one FRED HUNTER. In this connection Mr. Hettrick stated that the post office inspectors have been making an extensive investigation to locate Hunter, who is a possible suspect in the Garrettsville mail train robbery, inasmuch as Hunter has been reported as having been in company with Milton Lett on the night of October 24, 1935, when inquiries were made by the Latte Plymouth Agency of the Knowles-Brown Company, 1440 West 25th Street, Cleveland, regarding the Plymouth sedan which was purchased from that company on October 25, 1935 and used in the Carrettsville mail train robbery on November 7, 1935. While he d not reveal the source of this information about Fred Hunter, it is probable that Post Office Inspector H. W. Tavener of Youngstown, Ohio, has furnished Inspector Hettrick with the information, inasmuch as he is one of the inspectors working on the Carrettsville mail train robbery.

In this connection the name of Fred Hunter is mentioned in the report of Special Agent E. J. Wynn. Cleveland. Ohio. deted January 20, 1936. The same report reflects a detailed account of the investigation conducted by the Cleveland Bureau office as to Fred Hunter. During the course of this investigation a photograph of Fred Hunter was procured and additional copies were made by the

Chicago Bureau office, three of which were furnished to Post Office Inspector Hettrick upon his request.

On January 28, 1936 this Agent in company with Special Agent W. B. O'Mahoney, interviewed Post Office Inspector Hettrick, who at that time stated that the latest information received by him from Oklahoma and Kansas was to the effect that Milton Lett had not been located, as he evidently had been "tipped off" that the Government was looking for him, inasmuch as he failed to show up at any of his usual contact places in Oklahoma, Kansas and Missouri.

Continuing, Inspector Hettrick stated that one of his confidential informants at Cleveland reported that Alvin Karpis is apparently travelling alone. In this connection Inspector Hettrick stated that Karpis is reported to have visited the Wooden Shoe Inn located on West 117th Street, several blocks south of Lorain Avenue; that the last time Karpis is reported to have visited this place was just before the Harvard Club closed; that while at the Wooden Shoe Inn Karpis is supposed to have contacted James "Tip" O'Neill, later going to the Harvard Club with him. Inspector Hettrick stated that his informant made some mention about a married sister of "Tip" O'Neill harboring Karpis, and that it is quite possible that when Karpis visited the Wooden Shoe Inn he remained over night in one of the rooms located on the second floor of the building. Inspector Hettrick advised that "Tip" O'Neill is not in Cleveland at the present time as that not seen him and has been unable to contact him. The Harvard line was raided and closed on January 10, 1935 by the County Prosecutor's office.

The Cleveland telephone book lists the Wooden Shoe Inn as 3501 West 117th Street, telephone Clearwater 2323, which is in the vicinity of the location where Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell formerly resided when they were in Cleveland in 1934.

On January 31, 1936 this Agent in company with Special Agent E. J. Wynn visited the Wooden Shoe Inn but there was no activity of any kind noted. Further investigation as to the Wooden Shoe Inn will be found in report of investigation conducted by Special Agent C. R. Smith.

On page 23 of the report of Special Agent D. E. Hall, St. Paul, Minnesota, dated September 25, 1934, there is a notation on a blank deposit slip of the Cleveland Trust Company, Cleveland, Ohio, "7735 Dercum, off Jones Road." According to the Cleveland city directory there is a 7733 Dercum Road. The name of William J. Richards appears as owner and occupant of the premises, with his wife, Edna F. Discreet investigation revealed that Mr. Richards bears a good reputation and is

.

presently employed, and has been for several years, with the Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company as a watchman, and prior thereto, for a period of about eighteen years, he was with the inspection department of the Cleveland Police Department.

Upon being interviewed on January 28, 1936 by this agent, Mr. Richards verified the above information and stated that in addition to being employed as a watchman at night, he is a dog fancier, and has raised pedigreed dogs for quite a number of years; that in this connection he occasionally advertises in the Cleveland Press and the Cleveland Plain Dealer newspapers; that he recalls that in response to one of these advertisements a man called on him one Saturday afternoon in August, 1934, and gave his name as H. GPMilgreth; that at the time this man purchased a bull terrier pup for \$35.00. In making payment the man exhibited a large roll of bills. At the time of purchasing the dog, this man, Milgreth, who was later identified as Alvin Karpis, requested Mr. Richards to keep the dog until the following day as he was going to the Harvard Club to do " a little gambling." The next morning Milgreth returned for the dog and at that time he was accompanied by a woman whom he introduced as his wife. This woman was later identified by Mr. Richards as Dolores Delaney. Mr. Richards stated that on both occasions Milgreth drove to his home in a new Ford coupe. According to Mr. Richards he carried on quite a conversation with Milgreth and was convinced that Milgreth was quite familiar with Cleveland and adjoining suburbs. Mr. Richards advised that three weeks after Milgreth purchased the dog he noticed in the Cleveland newspapers that the apartment raided was that of Alvin Karpis; that shortly thereafter officers from the Cleveland Police Department visited him and took him to the Cleveland police headquarters where he was interviewed and made a signed statement in connection with his acquaintance with Milgreth.

Agent exhibited to Mr. Richards the photographs of Alvin Karpis and he immediately identified them as the same person who called at his home under the name of H. G. Milgreth.

Mr. Richards further stated that after Milgreth took the dog he requested that the pedigree be mailed to him at 3973 West 140th Street, Cleveland, which is the address where Alvin Karpis and Dolores Delaney resided under the name of Mr. and Mrs. H. G. Milgreth, and which apartment was raided during their absence on September 5, 1934 by Cleveland police officers. According to Mr. Richards the photograph of Alvin Karpis bears an excellent likeness of him.

He further stated that on a number of occasions before the Harvard Club closed he visited the place in search of Karpis, but failed to find him there. The address and telephone number of the

Cleveland Bureau office were left with Mr. Richards in the event he received any information indicating the whereabouts of Karpis.

tig this trade of the art of the appropriate from the first of the ex-On February 2, 1936 Agent and Special Agent C. E. Smith interviewed Post Office Inspector S. J. Hettrick, who advised that Milton Lett had not been located by them. When Mr. Hettrick was informed of the report of a recent raid on the home of Milton Lett at Wann, Oklahoma by Kansas City State Highway officers, and possibly post office inspectors, he stated that if such a raid had taken place he had no knowledge of it and furthermore advised that he doubts very much if any post office inspectors participated in this raid inasmuch as the inspectors especially assigned to the Garrettsville mail train robbery case and working under his supervision received no such instructions from him. Mr. Hettrick stated that the last report received from Oklahoma and Kansas, dated January 25, 1936, stated that Lett was last seen in Nevada, Missouri the latter part of December, 1935, at which time a confidential informant of the post office inspectors talked to Lett and received information from him to the effect that he was making a trip to Fort Scott, Kansas. At this time Lett is reported to have left his car behind him at Nevada, Missouri, and it was later driven away by an unknown person.

Mr. Hettrick stated that from the information in his possession he is convinced that Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell are two of the men who actually participated in the mail train robbery at Carrettsville, Ohio on November 7, 1935, and there is a possibility that Sam Coker was also with them, together with two other men whose names are known to the post office inspectors, but whom he would not reveal at that time. He stated that Sam Coker is presently in Oklahoma and that he can be picked up at any time, but that the post office inspectors are confining their efforts to locate and interview Milton Lett, whom they believe is in touch with Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell and other members of the Carrettsville mail train robbery gang; that when Lett is located and interviewed Inspector Hettrick believes he will be able to furnish valuable information inasmuch as Lett is reported to have purchased the Plymouth sedan used in the mail train robbery at Carrettsville, Ohio.

Recent information concerning the possible whereabouts of Alvin Karpis, Inspector Hettrick stated, was secured by a post office inspector working in the vicinity of Cleveland, Ohio. This information was received through a confidential woman informant, who indicated that Alvin Karpis, three or four days before the Carrettsville mail train robbery, was within 150 miles of Cleveland; that Karpis visited with this woman, who received a new \$5 Federal Reserve note, series 1928B, \$\int_D25041434A\$, on the Cleveland Federal Reserve Bank. Mr. Hettrick stated that the reason for the toman's taking the number of this bill was because she recognized Karpis, who at the time displayed a large

roll of bills and when he removed his clothing he took two guns from underneath his clothes and placed them beside the bed. According to this woman, Karpis came to her home driving a 1934 or 1935 dark, Eudson coupe. "She was unable to get the license number but did notice that it was an Ohio license plate beginning and ending with the letter "H". She also stated that she noted that Karpis has upper false teeth and two gold crowns in the lower jaw; that he also has a slight scar on one side of his face from his ear to his neck; that when he visited her he wore dark glasses. No information was available as to which side of Karpis' face the scar was on.

The Cincinnati office was requested by letter dated February 3, 1936, to check all Hudson automobiles having license numbers beginning H-1-H to H-999-H.

Inspector Hettrick stated that he desires to cooperate to the fullest extent with the Cleveland office, and in furnishing any information in his possession, he impressed upon Agent the necessity of treating it in strict confidence so that no other post office inspector will know from where the information comes.

Special Agent C. E. Smith interviewed Post Office Inspector S. J. Hettrick on the 8th of February, 1936 and was advised by him that the post office inspectors working on the Carrettsville mail train robbery had interviewed Mrs. Lett, mother of Milton Lett, after deputy sheriffs had made an unsuccessful raid on her home, said raid being made for the purpose of causing the apprehension of Milton Lett. According to Inspector Hettrick the postal authorities have covered all possible contacts of Lett in and around Tulsa, Oklahoma and other localities that he has been known to frequent.

Continuing, Mr. Hettrick stated that he had recently come into possession of information, the source of which he did not divulge to Agent, that Karpis had caused a package of some description to be sent to Miami, Florida for him within the past three or four weeks and the package had been forwarded to some place in the west for Karpis. In the lattrick was unable to state, or would not state, whether Karpis almself had been in Miami, nor would be advise whether the package had been shipped by parcel post, express or regular mail.

According to Mr. Hettrick he had been advised by a postmaster, whose name he would not disclose, that he, the postmaster, had talked with Karpis, but had withheld the information for about three weeks. Continuing, Hettrick Intimated that the postmaster had a brother who is an attorney.

It was Agent's impression, gained from what Mr. Hettrick stated, that the postmaster came in person to Mr. Hettrick. Agent also gained the impression that the package forwarded from Miami for or to Karpis was forwarded to Oklahoma. Continuing, Mr. Hettrick stated that Karpis is now travelling alone and had considerable money on his person, somewhere in the amount of \$50,000.

Bureau letter of reference dated January 14, 1936, advised that the Bureau was in possession of information indicating that a confidence man known as Mile-A-Minute Kid of Cleveland, Ohio, was allegedly harboring Karpis at the present time. Special Agent C. E. Smith and the writer contacted Chief of Detectives Joseph Sweeney of the Cleveland Police Department, who, for a number of years, has been actively engaged in investigating confidence rackets in Cleveland, Ohio, and who has a reputation of knowing all of the important confidence men in this section of the country. He advised that he had never heard of the Mile-A-Minute Kid. In this connection reference is made to the summary report of Special Agent P. M. Plunkett, Boston, Massachusetts, dated January 22, 1936, particularly to page seven, wherein it is indicated that one George L. Farry, alias George Ferry, alias Mile-A-Minute is set forth as a possible contact of William Elmer Mead. It is suggested that possibly this individual may be the person referred to by the Bureau letter of reference as Mile-A-Minute Kid.

In addition to the investigation conducted at Cleveland with reference to the Mile-A-Minute Kid, Special Agent C. E. Smith made inquiry at the Toledo, Ohio Police Department among officers, who were acquainted with confidence men, but no information was obtained reflecting that the Mile-A-Minute Kid is known in that city.

From time to time in the past, as set out in previous reports in this case, information developed has indicated that undoubtedly some member of the Cleveland Police Department tipped off Karpis and Campbell to the fact that Glady Sawyer, Paula Harmon, and Wynong Burdette were in custody of the Cleveland Police Department in September, 1934, and that as a result of this, Karpis and Campbell and other members of the gang immediately fled from Cleveland. Inspector Frank Story of the Cleveland Police Department has been cooperating closely with the Cleveland office in this matter, and recently advised Special Agent C. E. Smith and this Agent that he had determined that a member of the police department, now deceased, made a call to the Harvard Club at the time of the aforementioned arrest of these women, it being Story's opinion that possibly this was an innocent call, inasmuch as the officer was of the opinion that the women were associated with some gambler employed at the Harvard Club. He further advised that the information was that on the following morning, Captain Potts, then captain of detectives, also called the Harvard Club with reference to the arrest of the women, but that he, Story, could not learn definitely the circumstances under which Potts called, or just what he said during the conversation.

Agent D. E. Hall, Detroit, Michigan, dated September 25, 1934, that at the time the Cleveland Police Department, in September, 1934, raided the home at 3973 West 140th Street, formerly occupied by Karpis and

Dolores Delaney, there was found a slip of paper bearing the following written notations: "Phillip Amersbach, 7124 Clark Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio; Edward Summers, Charles Ward, Jesse Donovan. It is definitely known that Tony Amerebach is a Cleveland gangster of the muscle type, and undoubtedly a bodyguard for Art Hebebrand of the Harvard Club, and that he has served a sentence in the Ohio State Penitentiary for burglary. Captain Story advised that Phillip Amerabach is Tony's brother, and that Phillip is presently incercerated in a penitentiary in the state of Indiana for bank robbery, presumably the Indiana State Penitentiary at Michigan City, Indiana. Inasmuch as no information has ever been obtained concerning the identity of the other names appearing on the aforementioned slip of paper, other than Phillip Amersbach, the Indianapolis office is being requested to appropriately interview Phillip American for any information he can offer concerning the presence of the slip of paper in the apartment of Karpis, and the identity of the other men whose names appear on the paper.

Frank J. Noonan, operator of a private detective agency at Cleveland, Ohio, has been mentioned from time to time in past investigations in this case, it being recalled that on the occasion of the raid at 3973 West 140th Street in September, 1934, certain pay envelopes of his agency were found in the house with the name of H. G. Milgreth written on them, which was an alias of Karpis at the time he resided there. It is also to be recalled with reference to Noonan that Dolores Delaney recently indicated that Karpis at the time he was in Cleveland, Ohio, had a private detective's credentials.

For the purpose of securing some history of Frank J. Noonan, Agent contacted Jake Mintz, who operates a private detective agency in Cleveland, and who is well regarded and is reputed to conducted a . respectable business. He advised that Frank J. Noonan came from a 🛝 very good family and inherited considerable money; that as a young man, however, he was quite a play-boy around Cleveland, and always was a mysterious individual; that as time went on he became closely allied with Tommy McGinty, a powerful Cleveland politician, and undoubtedly McGinty was instrumental in setting Noonan up in the detective agency. business and securing business for him; that McGinty is interested in various racetracks and gambling institutions in the city of Cleveland, and as a result the racetracks are always protected by Nopnan's men; that of late Noonan has made no pretense of conducting actively a detective business, but spends most of his time around the Hollenden Hotel "chinning" with the various racketeers and confidence men, who are always found loitering there.

Mr. J. M. McGrath, who operates one of the largest private detective agencies in Cleveland, was interviewed with reference to Noonan and he advised that so far as he could determine Noonan is not actively engaged in the private detective business, but is more or less of a contact man for various racketeers in Cleveland and vicinity.

Mr. McGrath furnished the following anonymous letter received by him from some member of the Cleveland Police Department:

"My dear Jim: "I want to put you wise to what is happening about race tracks and why you cannot get the job. This fellow, Frank V Noonan, who was a strike breaker, was run out of Cleveland . many years ago for passing bum checks and double-crossing Pop Coach, his employer, and is now soliciting the race track work through the aid of Gideon Rabshaw - the biggest crook and dummy that was ever in the Police Department.

"Rabshaw is telling the race track people that if they do not employ Noonan, Sheriff Hanratty will not let them race. The reason of this is, that Rabshaw and Noonan and Joe Ball are going 50-50 on the profits. If the race tracks open, watch these fellows work together. When Rabshaw was in the police department and even now, as you know, he did not have a friend. When Frank Woods was a member of the detective department, Rabshaw and Noonan tried to frame him but several of the other boys got wise to it and Frank Woods was so mad that he chased Noonan out of town and Noonan never returned until after Woods' death. He met him on Euclid Avenue and ran him to the Star Theater, over the stage and out on Vincent Street.

This Rabshaw has been double-crossing Hanratty ever since he has been in office and if they use the power of the Sheriff's office to get your work, I will furnish you the names of pay-off guys who settled with Rabshaw on the slot machines and booze joints in the county. Nate Weinberger and Tony Fitspatrick are some of the pay-off guys.

"You can use this letter for whatever it is worth. Only last week Rabshaw and Noonan were at the Hollenden Hotel in a conference with Ed\Stronge and his bunch making arrangements to protect Thistledown. If you want to know anything further about Rabshaw, ask Emmett Potts, Inspector Cody, Andy Hagen, or John Toner.

"Noonan and this fellow Biddlemeyer, who/is now in a jam in the Fleming double-cross racket which Ray Miller, the County Prosecutor, is now checking up, blackmailed a lot of people when they worked together. This fellow, Noonan, recently double-crossed Sheriff Maloney out of Painesville. He was employed to investigate liquor cases and get his money and afterwards tipped the bootleggers off. Ask Maloney about this and he will tell you the facts. Now Noonan wants to work with Gideon and shake the bookmakers down. Now you know why you, the Burns', Jake Mintz, Folger, and McGrath, cannot get any of the detective

and police work in the county. If I were you, I would make some copies of this letter and mail them to everybody concerned. Some day when you are down in the department, I will let you know who wrote this but under the conditions that are now existing in the police department, I will just have to remain, your friend

The above letter is dated May 10, 1930.

As indicated above, Dolores Delaney, in a recent statement, advised that Karpis at the time he resided in Cleveland was in the possession of credentials of a private detective, and that he "flashed" these credentials at a vacuum cleaner salesman, whom he thought was prying into his business. In an effort to trace this down, Agent enlisted the cooperation of Mrs. O. W. Blackman, 3969 West 140th Street, who borrowed the Yvacuum cleaner from the people now occupying the premises at 3973 West 140th Street, it appearing that this latter place was rented furnished after being abandoned by Karpis and Dolores Delaney. The sweeper was noted to be a Kenmore Deluxe model, serial #13923321. This type of sweeper is sold exclusively through the Sears Roebuck Company.

Investigation conducted at the Sears Roebuck Company, 110th and Lorain Avenue, through Mr. A, Lachstadter, failed to locate the fa sweeper as having been sold through that store. However, it was ascertained that the records were maintained in a rather haphazard manner and, therefore, the names of all vacuum cleaner salesman employed from May until September, 1934 were secured for the purpose of locating the salesman who sold the particular machine. After considerable inquiry and interview with numerous salesman, Mr. Ralph W. Pierce, Leroy, Ohio, was contacted and advised that he recalled the circumstances of the sale of the vacuum sweeper in question, stating that on an occasion that he was demonstrating sweepers at the Sears Roebuck Store at 110th and Lorain Avenue, a woman, whom he identified by the photograph as being Dolores Delaney, came into the store and purchased a sweeper, paying for same with four \$10 bills all on some bank in California; that he carried the sweeper down to the street and loaded it into a new Pontiac coupe, which was being driven by a man, whom Mr. Pierce now identifies as Alvin Karpis; that at the time of this sale Dolores Delaney gave an address on Flamingo Road, near Rocky River Drive. is to be recalled that Karpis and Dolores Delaney resided for a while at 18109 Flamingo Road, which is put a few doors off Rocky River Road.)

Mr. Pierce further stated that he was rather suspicious of the transaction because of the four \$10 bills, and replaced one of the bills with a bill of his own when making payment to the store; that a few days later he called at the address occupied by the people who purchased the cleaner, for the purpose of inspecting the sweeper to see that it was in working order, and also to provide them with another bill of sale, inasmuch as he had written the wrong serial number on the bill of sale first given; that Dolores Delaney was at the house and he made several adjustments on the machine, but she would not permit him to try it out inasmuch as someone was sleeping; that at that time he recognized the house as being one in which the Mitchell Realty Company was interested and he, himself, having a business on at that time with the said realty company, mentioned to Neil Mitchell the fact that the people had purchased a vacuum cleaner and that he was suspicious of them, and at that time exhibited to Mr. Mitchell one of the \$10 bills on the California bank, whereupon Mr. Mitchell told him that the people were alright and that they had been purchasing a lot of new things; that a few days later he called at 35 the address on Flamingo Road for the purpose of again inspecting the machine, and was met at the door by a person he now identifies as Karpis, who would not permit him to enter the house, stating that the machine was alright; that a short time thereafter he, Mr. Pierce, was demonstrating vacuum cleaners at the Sears Roebuck Store and Karpis came in and "balled him out" and asked him if he thought he was an amateur detective and made it plain that he was displeased because Mr. Pierce had made inquiries concerning him; that at that time Karpis reached in his pocket and pulled out a card and shoved it under Mr. Pierce's nose and stated. "For your information I am a detective too." Mr. Pierce stated that Karpis at that time did not state with what agency he was connected. and Mr. Pierce obtained but a momentary glance at the card, and does not recall if there was a photograph on it; that for some reason or another he is of the opinion that this was a card of the McGrath Detective Agency, although he is not in a position to state this positively. He was unable to describe with any degree of particularity the card, and stated that he doubted whether or not he would recognize a similar card if he saw one.

On February 9, 1936 Frank J. Noonan was invited to the Cleveland Bureau office where he was interrogated by Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley in the presence of reporting Agent. Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley has reported separately the results of the interview with Noonan.

As a result of the circularization of the postmasters in the state of Ohio, concerning Mary Forth, George Benton, and G. R. Benton, the postmaster at Holloway, Ohio, has advised that there is a George R. Benton residing on Route #2, Flushing, Ohio. The superintendent of mail at Dayton, Ohio, has advised that persons of the above names reside at Dayton, Ohio at 333 Pleasant Street. It is to be recalled that the above mentioned names were used on correspondence at Cleveland to

Mrs. Maggie Lett of Wann, Oklahoma, and that the information now indicates that this correspondence was between Milton Lett, the son, and his mother, Mrs. Maggie Lett.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent H. B. Dill:

On January 25, 1936, in compliance with Bureau instructions Agent interviewed Kay Glazier, 1021 Cherry Avenue, NE, Canton, Ohio, who stated that she and her sister, Eileen Glazier, met a man whose name was Ivan wheeler, but whose name they thought to be Alvin wheeler, until they saw Alvin Karpis' picture in the Canton Repository and questioned the man who had introduced them to Wheeler (Clint Berger). They stated, however, that no one knows that they suspect Ivan wheeler as being Alvin Karpis.

Eileen Glazier was interviewed first. She said she was the one who had a date with Wheeler; that about nine PM, December 21, 1935, she was skating at the Land-O-Dance skating rink when Clint Berger, who is one of the floor managers, asked her to have a date with a friend of his by the name of Alvin Wheeler. Eileen then met Wheeler at the Land-O-Dance, 12th Street and Market Avenue, NE, shortly after nine o'clock and was with him until about two AM. Eileen stated that Kay, who had a date with Clint Berger, met Wheeler about eleven FM and they were all together from eleven PM until two AM. She stated that Wheeler did not talk about where he was from, where he worked, or anything else about himself; that he did state, however, that he was a member of the Christian church. She stated that he, Wheeler, did not skate; that he left his coat on all night; that he sat around the rink until eleven PM; then she and Wheeler with her sister, Kay, and Clint Berger went to Keefer's night club and stayed until 12:45. They then rode home in Clint Berger's coupe and stood in front of the house and talked until two AM. She stated at the time she did not notice anything unusual at all.

Eileen Glazier described Wheeler to the writer as follows:

(Alvin) Ivan Wheeler Age 27 years (he told her his age) 5'10" Height Weight 140 pounds Build Slender Color unknown Eyes Color unknown
Brown Hair: None noticed Scare. Road construction work for Occupation: Jane & San San company at Syracuse, N. Y. Ashtabula, Ohio Residence Unknown Marital Status Member of Christian Church Faith Nationality American

When Kay Glazier returned from work she was interviewed and she gave the same facts as were given by her sister and related above. She stated that she wrote to the Bureau to ascertain Karpis' description, after she had seen his picture in the Canton Repository on January 1, 1936. She said when she saw Karpis' picture she felt sure that Wheeler was Karpis; that she cut the picture out of the paper end several days later when Eileen returned to Canton from Akron, she showed her the picture and asked her who it was; that Eileen answered, "Alvin Wheeler", without hesitation.

She stated that the night she met Wheeler she was told by Clint Berger that his name was "Alvin" Wheeler and that both she and her sister had called him Alvin that night. When she saw the picture she had Eileen ask Clint Berger about Wheeler's present whereabouts. When Eileen asked where Alvin was, Berger told her his name was not Alvin, but Ivan. Berger told her that wheeler was in Syracuse, N. Y.; that he worked for a construction company there. Berger also told her that Wheeler had had \$2,000 or \$3,000 cash with him the night he was in town; that half of it belonged to Wheeler and the other half to the company for which Wheeler works.

Eileen was present during Agent's interview with Kay, and she verified all of the statements made by Kay.

Kay gave a description of Wheeler and it was practically the same as the description set out hereinbefore, which was given by Eileen.

Both the girls stated that they had not seen Wheeler since January 1, 1936; that Berger told them that Wheeler always comes to visit him when he gets near Canton.

Karpis' picture was placed with about twenty-five other pictures and both of the girls picked it from the group. This, however, might be explained by the fact that they had seen the same picture in the Canton Repository. This picture of Karpis (clipped from the paper) is being retained in the Cleveland office file.

Kay stated that Clint Berger told her that he formerly peddled dope, but that he stopped because of his mother. She and Eileen stated that they knew very little about Berger; that they met him about the latter part of September, 1935 at the skating rink and had never been out with him except on the night they met Wheeler. They said they think he lives in Canton now, but they don't know how long he has lived here, or where he comes from.

When asked if they could positively identify the picture of Karpis as being that of Wheeler, both Eileen and Kay stated they were "prefty sure" it was Wheeler, but they would not say positively. They stated that the picture in the paper looked more like Wheeler than the picture shown to them by Agent, because of the mouth. It will be noted that these pictures were the same, but the clipping is shaded differently.

The Glazier girls seemed to have been telling the story straight with the purpose of aiding, if possible, in apprehending this man, if he is Karpis.

Eileen was asked to get Wheeler's address from Berger. After talking to Berger, Eileen said that he told her he would try to get his address for her; that he thought he had it at home. Berger told her, however, that Wheeler's headquarters are in Ashtabula, Ohio, and the company for which he works is in Syracuse, New York. Berger stated that he would contact Wheeler and have him come back to Canton if she wanted to see him. She stated that as soon as she learns Wheeler's address she would notify the Cleveland office.

The address of the Cleveland office was left with her.

Agent contacted Mr. L. R. Lemiell, assistant postmaster at Canton, Ohio, for the purpose of securing information regarding the character and reputation of Clinton Berger. It had been previously ascertained by the writer from the Canton City Directory that Clinton Berger lives at 1433 Second Avenue NE, and that Homer J. Berger (Celia M., wife)-also lives at this address; that Homer's occupation is "auto repairing at rear of house."

Mr. Lamiell stated that J. E. Donze, carrier No. 46, carries mail to that address. Lamiell called Donze into his office and Donze stated to Agent that he had been carrying mail to the Bergers, 1433 Second Avenue, NE, for about five or six years; that he has carried mail to Mrs. Homer Berger, Mr. Homer Berger, and Clinton Berger. He stated, however, that he had very few pieces of mail for them; that most of it was advertisements and that he cannot remember any particular place that the mail was postmarked. He further stated that since he has been carrying mail to the Bergers that he had never seen either of the men and that he had only seen Mrs. Berger once or twice. He stated that on the occasions that he saw Mrs. Berger she did not speak to him as do most of the women on his route; that for this reason, in addition to the fact that they get very little mail, he did not know much about them.

Concluding, Donze stated that the neighborhood in which the Bergers live is made up of a very poor, but quiet class of people. He stated that he did not know anybody in that neighborhood whom the writer might contact without fear of the purpose of his investigation being told to the Bergers.

At Agent's request, Mr. Lamiell called C. D. Meek, carrier No. 15, to his office. Meek stated to the writer that he had been carrying mail to "Land-O-Dence" (skating rink where Berger works) for over a year; that about four or five months ago the Land-O-Dance changed hands and that Lee Maytimer and Russ Golden are apparently the new managers; that both of them receive mail at the Land-O-Dance and he thinks the letters are postmarked Akron, Ohio; that they also get COD packages quite often; that he thinks these packages contain skates. He stated that Mr. Maytimer usually pays for the COD packages; that he has never seen Mr. Russ Golden and that most of the time there is nobody there, but the janitor whose name is Regberg.

Meek stated that he did not know Clinton Berger, nor had he ever carried mail to the Land-O-Dance addressed to Berger.

all politically and a series of the series of a political series.

Mr. Lamiell stated that he did not know Clinton Berger, nor was he acquainted with the neighborhood in which Berger lives.

The writer called at the Canton, Ohio Police Department, and interviewed Mr. E. E. Clark, Sergeant of Detectives. Sergeant Clark stated that a search of the Canton Police Department records does not disclose that Clinton Berger has ever been arrested by that department. Sergeant Clark asked Detectives E. C. Ronk and Steve Skotnicky if they knew Clinton Berger, but they answered in the negative. Sergeant Clark stated that the people in that neighborhood were largely composed of foreigners and that he knew of no one whom the writer might contact with regard to this investigation, who would keep the matter confidential. Detectives Ronk and Skotnicky stated that they knew of no one in that neighborhood whom Agent might contact confidentially.

The purpose of this investigation was not disclosed to any of the persons interviewed by the writer.

AT ASHTABULA, OHIO

Mr. Mark E. Miller, postmaster, and H. L. Watrous, assistant postmaster, upon being interviewed by Agent, stated that they did not know anyone in Ashtabula by the name of Ivan Wheeler. Mr. Watrous searched his records of "Orders to Change Address" and located a card filled out by Ivan H. Wheeler, dated October 10, 1934. On this card was the following information:

Mr. Watrous called the Koski Construction Company, Ashtabula, Ohio, and asked the clerk at that company if they ever had a man work for them by the name of Ivan Wheeler, to which question Mr. Watrous stated the clerk answered in the negative. Mr. Watrous further stated that there are no other construction companies in Ashtabula.

At Agent's request Mr. Watrous checked with the other employees at the post office to determine if any of them knew a person by the name of Ivan Wheeler. Mr. E. D. Hyde stated to Agent that he has known Ivan Wheeler all of Ivan's life; that Ivan went to school with his daughter, and that Ivan is now about twenty-five or twenty-six years old; that he is of a good family and that they have been in and around Ashtabula for the past three or four generations. Mr. Hyde further stated that his daughter Winifred might have a picture of Ivan Wheeler. Mr. Hyde celled his wife and told her to have Winifred see if she could find a picture of Ivan Wheeler in order to show it to Agent. Mr. Hyde described Wheeler as follows:

Mr. Miller, postmaster, after hearing the conversation between Agent and Mr. Hyde stated that he then recalled the Wheeler family, and that although he did not know Ivan Wheeler personally he knew Mrs. Wheeler and had known the Wheeler family for many years. He stated that Wheeler's mother now lives on North Ridge about two miles north of Ashtabula, Ohio, on RFD #3.

Mrs. E. D. Hyde, 5111 Perry Avenue, stated that her daughter Winifred had searched the house for a picture of Ivan Wheeler, but was unable to find one. Mrs. Hyde stated, however, that Wheeler had worked for the M. C. Robinson Coal Company last summer and that he might be working there at the present time.

Agent called at the M. C. Robinson Coal Company and ascertained from Miss Senter, clerk, that Ivan Wheeler had worked for that company last summer, but that he quit during the latter part of August, 1935 and that she has not seen nor heard of him since.

 (\cdot,\cdot)

Captain A. C. Snow of the Ashtabula Police Department, at Agent's request, searched the Ashtabula Police Department records and stated that the search did not disclose that Ivan Wheeler had been arrested by that department. He stated that he did not know Ivan Wheeler.

Agent called at the home of Mrs. H. S. Wheeler, RFD #3, under pretext, stating that he knew a friend of Ivan's in Canton, Ohio, and that this friend had asked Agent to see Ivan when he was in Ashtabula. Mrs. Wheeler stated that her son was not at home at that time, but that he could probably be reached through General Delivery, Warren, Ohio. She further stated that her son might, at the present time, be in Youngstown, Ohio, but that she expected him home this week end (February 1, 1936). Mrs. Wheeler stated that her son is working for Chuck Reynolds as an advertising agent. After Agent stated to Mrs. Wheeler that he had never seen Ivan, she showed Agent a picture of Ivan which resembles to a great extent the picture of subject Alvin Karpis, Tulsa Police Department #8008, A description of Ivan Wheeler, as was ascertained by Agent from Mrs. Wheeler is as follows:

while Agent was in Ashtabula he went to the Swallows Restaurant and talked to Murray Cook for quite some time. During the conversation between Agent and Cook, the question of travelling was discussed. After some time Cook stated that he had received a call about one and one-half hours ago from his girl friend at Beverly Hills, California (it was then 4:45 PM, Eastern Standard Time, 1/28/36) and that this girl told him she was at that time having breakfast with Mildred Morgan. During this Agent's surveillance of the Swallows Restaurant from December 20, 1935 to January 4, 1936, Cook had mentioned on several occasions about a girl friend of his in California. When the name of Mildred Morgan was mentioned Agent asked him if that was the girl with whom he had gone to Honolulu. Cook answered in the negative and stated that the girl with whom he had gone to Honolulu was Jean Robertson, but that Mildred Morgan had gone with them. He stated that Mildred Morgan was the girl whom he had mentioned to Agent on previous occasions, who

is a transcontinental airplane racer. The trend of the conversation seemed to indicate that Jean Robertson was at the time of the call visiting with Mildred Morgan.

Murray Cook further stated that he had been in California twice since 1929. When he was there in 1929 he stayed at the Biltmore in Los Angeles, and on his second visit he stayed at the Oxford Arms Apartments, which apartment was secured for him by Mildred Morgan, who got a tourist rate of \$1.00 per day for him. He stated that he intended to go to California prior to the call from Jean, but that he had now changed his plans. He stated that his purpose for going there was to remain a month or two in order to "look around" to see if he could find some means by which he could make a livelihood (apparently either practicing law or opening a cocktail lounge.) He stated that Jean told him that the easterners were having a difficult time in and around Los Angeles in view of the fact that the westerners would not patronize them; that they were endeavoring to give all the business possible to the westerners. Cook stated that he could make the trip for approximately \$300.00, and that he did intend to go to Los Angeles next spring, but at the present time his plans are not to go before that time. He stated that another reason for not taking the trip at the present time is because he owes a great many people in ... Ashtabula and that he feels it is his duty to remain there and use his money to pay his debts.

Cook stated that he receives a call from Jean about every two or three weeks. He further stated that he was worried about the calls in view of the fact that they cost her so much money, and he had told her several times that he had to go, but she stated to him that he was not to worry about the vost in view of the fact that she was quite prosperous at the present time. Cook stated that he also talked to Mildred Morgan during this last conversation with Jean, and that was the first time he had heard her voice for over three years.

It was not ascertained just what Murray Cook thought Jean's business was in California. However, during Agent's surveillance at Ashtabula, Cook mentioned on our or two occasions that the girl "with whom he was going" was now teaching school in California.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent W. B. O'Mahoney':

Reference is made to report submitted by Special Agent E. J. Wynn, Cleveland, Ohio, dated January 17, 1936, particularly to the telephone call received by William F. Fergus from one Durbin, instructing Fergus to call a telephone number, which was found to be listed at the address of William Durbin, 2063 East 82nd Street, Cleveland, Ohio. Investigation reflects that this address is a rooming house operated by Mrs. Susan K. Goodman, whose husband's name is John Goodman and whose occupation is listed as "driver." It was also ascertained that Goodman is a driver for the Yellow Cab Company.

Through Sigmund Wegline, Superintendent of Station "B", United States Post Office, which station serves the address 2063 East 82nd Street, it was learned that additional roomers at the above mentioned address are John Brenich, and Miss A. Teanline.

Inquiry was conducted in the vicinity of 2063 East 82nd Street with the idea in mind to secure a room from which the premises 2063 might easily be observed. Agent failed, however, to find any vacant rooms in the immediate vicinity of 2063, which could be rented.

Further investigation was conducted at the Better Business Bureau, Federal Reserve Bank Building, in an effort to obtain information regarding William Durbin and his activities. Mr. Jancke examined the records of the Better Business Bureau and stated that William Durbin was associated with the firm of Durbin & Lattin, formerly located at : 209 Cleveland Trust Building, Euclid and East 79th Street, but at the present time this firm is maintaining offices at 1006 Scofield Building on East Ninth Street. Durbin & Lattin is listed as an industrial and real estate financing, as well as business investments company. It was learned that there is a William Durbin listed as having office space at 538 Guardian Building, Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, and further investigation developed that this particular office space is rented by E. M. Kortya Company, industrial and real estate financing, and business investments. Edward W. Stease, attorney at law, also shares this office. Mr. Jancke further stated that the only notations appearing in their records indicate that on August 19, 1935 William Durbin offered one Elmer Karrer, 3283 East 103rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio, a quarter interest in his business. Durbin, at the time, refused to enter any contract with Karrer unless cash was put up in advance. Karrer was unable to get the money and the deal was never completed. Since that time there has been litigation in connection with the transaction, in that Durbin claimed that Karrer had signed a contract and Durbin attempted to obtain specific performance. Karrer claimed that he had never signed a contract and if his signature appeared it was a forgery.

The records of the Better Business Bureau also reflect that on April 12, 1935, Durbin & Lattin were criticised by the Better Business Bureau as a result of an advertisement which was placed in the Plain Dealer on April 7, 1935, which claimed that the firm of Durbin & Lattin had been established since 1915, when in truth the firm had only been in operation a matter of months prior to the insertion of the advertisement.

Investigation was conducted at the office of the clerk of Federal Court regarding the application for passports of William F. Fergus, Joseph J. Vraniak, Nicolao Nestor, and Ioan J. Banatenau, all of whom left the United States in the summer of 1934 for Roumania with the idea of establishing a slot machine racket. C. H. Trivison, deputy clerk, stated that his records fail to show that William F. Fergus made an application for a new passport, or had made application for an extension of the passport issued to him on July 3, 1934. In further checking his records, Mr. Trivison found that Nicolao Nestor had made application for a passport on June 25, 1934. No record, however, of application for passports was found for Joseph J. Vraniak, or Ioan J. Banatenau.

Agent then contacted Mr. George Anagnostache, Roumanian Consul, 1501 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. Mr. Anagnostache stated that Ioan J. Banatenau is a Roumanian subject, and that several years ago he had been associated with a Roumanian newspaper at Cleveland. At the present time he stated that Banatenau is on the editorial staff of the New Life, a Roumanian paper published at 5330 Russell Street, Detroit, Michigan. Mr. Anagnostache stated that Joseph J. Vraniak is not a Roumanian subject and he added that from the name he was positive that Vraniak was either a Czech or a Slovak. He also informed Agent that it had been his information that at the time Fergus, Hebebrand and Mitchell sailed for Roumania, they had taken with them a machinist from the factory which manufactures the slot machines, and that this machinist had come from Chicago. He stated that it was his belief that Joseph J. Vraniek was the machinist who had been taken to Roumania to service the slot machines. Mr. Anagnostache also advised Agent that when the above named parties were unable to locate in Roumania, due to the laws of that country, they then moved what slot machines they had. transported from this country to Poland, where, be believed, they intended in the near future to establish the slot machines in operation. 1

Investigation was conducted in the vicinity of 4419 West 171st Street, which address was previously occupied by subjects in this case during the month of October, 1934. Photographs of Art Hebebrand and James Patton were exhibited to Mrs. Pohlman, 4411 West 171st Street, Mrs. William Klinger, 4415 West 171st Street, and Mrs. Olive Rowe, 4418 West 171st Street, All of the above mentioned women have been interviewed and have identified photographs of Campbell, Karpis and Harry Sawyer. They were unable, however, to identify photographs of either Hebebrand or Patton as persons who were observed to have visited 4419 West 171st Street.

In view of the fact that the telephone tap which had been maintained previously on the Harvard Club indicated that Art Hebebrand might be reached at the Lake Shore Hotel under the name of McKay, investigation was conducted at the Lake Shore Hotel. Mr. Preston Markward was contacted and a photograph of Hebebrand was exhibited to him. He immediately identified the photograph as being one known to him as George Conway and takay. He also stated that he knew Conway by the name of Hebebrand. When questioned regarding any suites maintained at the Lake Shore Hotel by Hebebrand, Mr. Markward stated that under prior management of Mr. Joyce, Hebebrand had maintained room 904 for a period of about fourteen months. He stated, however, that about November 1, 1935, Mrs. Hebebrand had become apprised of the fact that Art had been keeping a woman at the Lake Shore Hotel, and had raised quite some commotion. He stated that on November 4, 1935, Hebebrand gave up room 904 and that the girl with whom he was living had taken room 404 in the name of Ruth lager. Mr. Markward stated that the hotel is trying to get rid of Miss Eager, and in an attempt to do so has raised her rent from \$55.00 a month to \$80.00 a month. However, Miss Eager is still occupying room 404 and Art Hebebrand is known to have spent several nights with her.

Mr. Markward referred Agent to Mr. Nolan, auditor, for the purpose of obtaining information regarding telephone calls placed by the occupants of rooms 904 and 404. Mr. Nolan stated that the records of the hotel were only maintained for a period of a year and that he was only able to furnish information regarding telephone calls for this period. He furnished Agent with the following calls made from room 904 starting January 27, 1935:

It is noted from the above list of telephone numbers that there are several instances where the number and exchange called are not clearly set out. Particular attention is directed to the telephone call placed on October 24, 1935 to Chicago, Illinois showing that Chicago, Illino

In a further interview with Mr. Markward he stated that he believed Miss Eager's correct name is Spangler, and that she had two children by a previous marriage. This information would appear to identify Ruth Eager as being Ruth Spangler, who was previously employed at the Harvard Club in connection with the operation of the Keno game.

Information was also received through Mr. Markward that Ruth Eager is at the present time driving a Packard sedan, 120 model, bearing 1935 Ohio registration JU 663.

Special Agent C. R. Smith contacted the license bureau at Cleveland, Ohio, and ascertained that registration JU 663 was formerly issued to Ben Levine, 1618 Harvard Street for a 1931 Packard coupe, and the address given by Ben Levine at the time of filing this registration is a vacant lot opposite the Harvard Club. It also appears that Packard sedan now being driven by Ruth Eager does not bear proper registration.

Ben Levine, alias Bennie the Lug, was a former gambler employed at the Harvard Club. Further details concerning Levine and his association with Ruth Eager, or Ruth Spangler, will be treated separately under report of investigation conducted by Special Agent C. E. Smith.

Mr. Markward of the Lake Shore Hotel was subsequently interviewed by Special Agents E. J. Dowd and W. B. O'Mahoney on January 29, 1936. At this time the above named Agents, through the cooperation of Mr. Markward, were able to search and examine the room occupied by Ruth Eager. The search indicated that Ruth Eager has no hand baggage and has just four or five cheap dresses hanging in the closet. No papers or documents of any nature were discovered in the examination of the writing desk, and the dresser.

Mr. Markward stated that the hotel would be most willing to cooperate to any extent, and he again reiterated the statement that the hotel is trying to get rid of Miss Eager as a guest. He stated that there are very few telephone calls placed by Miss Eager, and they perhaps total four or five a month. He also advised that a close check would be made on these telephone calls and that the conversation would be noted. He further stated that he would attempt to trace any incoming calls made to the room of Miss Eager, room 404, and information obtained by such tracings will be furnished to the Cleveland office. He advised that he would attempt to establish the identity of any persons, other than Art Hebebrand, who are observed to visit Ruth Eager at the hotel.

Mr. Markward suggested that Agents contact the night clerk, whose name is Gestner. Mr. Gestner is on daily from twelve o'clock at night until eight o'clock in the morning. Mr. Markward stated

that on several occasions when he has returned to the hotel at a late hour, he has observed Gestner in conversation with Ruth Eager at the desk.

Investigation was conducted at Shaker Heights, Ohio, with the idea of establishing the identity of one Marjorie Forth. It was established that Marjorie Forth and her father, E. J. Forth, reside with Mr. and Mrs. Perry C. King, 3662 Rownsdale Road, Shaker Heights, Ohio. Perry C. King is secretary of the Cleveland Storage Company, and E. J. Forth is a brother of Mrs. Perry C. King. It was learned that Marjorie Forth is a child six years of age, and could possibly have no connection with instant investigation.

Inquiry was made at the Hotel Hollenden where Mr. R. F. Marsh, manager, was interviewed. Mr. Marsh was requested to ascertain whether or not Jemes "Shimmy" Patton, or Art Hebebrand were presently maintaining rooms at the hotel, or whether they had maintained a suite or rooms recently at that hotel. Mr. Marsh, after making inquiry, advised Agent that as near as he could determine, neither Patton nor Hebebrand had stayed at the hotel for any period whatever for several months. He stated, however, that both Hebebrand and Patton are known to the clerks at the hotel and they had been seen in the lobby on various occasions, but he was definitely sure that they had not rented any suite or rooms, either under their true names or aliases. He further stated that in making his inquiry he had been advised by the clerks that Hebebrand was believed to be living at the Lake Shore Hotel and Mr. Marsh suggested that Agent make further inquiry at that place. Mr. Marsh was also unable to find any indication that Ruth Spangler, or Ruth Eager, was presently registered, or had recently been registered at the hotel. The only notation of a Spangler being registered at the Hollenden during the past year was one Helen Spangler, 914 East 7th Street, Toledo, Ohio. The records of the hotel indicate that Helen Spangler was given a complimentary room and, according to Mr. Marsh, it is indicated that she might possibly have been connected with the Hotel Secor at Toledo, which is also operated by the DeWitt interests.

Inquiry at the office of the county prosecutor, indicated that Mr. Tansey bears a good reputation in business. Additional investigation relative to Mr. Tansey's associates and connections will be conducted.

As previously indicated by investigation, Tony Amersbach of Cleveland, Ohio, is a close associate of the operators of the Harvard Club and is evidently a bodyguard of Art Hebebrand. He is presently driving a 1934 model Graham Paige coupe, 1935 Ohio license HY 655, and he resides at 7124 Clark Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio

devised that the beer parlor which Rene Holst was operating at Point Place, Ohio, has been closed and Rene is presently residing with Bertangus at his residence on Berdan Avenue in Cleveland. had been unable to obtain any additional information as yet relative to the name of the girl whom Harry Campbell is alleged to have married recently, however, he expects to see Rene in the near future and will endeavor to obtain this information.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents H. B. Dill and W. B. O'Mahoney on February 3, 1936:

Art . In view of the fact that Dolores Delaney furnished information that a small tayern in the vicinity of the western and of the High Level Bridge in Cleveland, Ohio, had been frequented by Alvin Karpis and William UHarrison during the summer of 1934, the above named Agents made a discreet surveillance of a tavern, the address of which is 2460 Superior Street, N. W. This tavern is apparently owned and operated by one William Parker, who resides at 1792 West 44th Street, with his mother, Mrs. Anna Parker, three brothers, Ray, George, and Bill; and three sisters; Florence, Loretta, and Anne. It was also found that William Parker, the proprietor, acts as bartender during the day, and that Martin Parker, a nephew of William Parker, tends bar during the night. There are also employed as waitresses one Hazel Jacobs, who has been employed there for eight months, and one Mae Neame, who has been employed there for a period of six months. The instant tavern is named the Last Chance Cafe and is located on the corner of Superior Street and West 25th. The tavern occupies the corner fronting about 65 feet on Superior Street, and about 65 feet on West 25th Street. Immediately behind the tavern and fronting on West 25th Street is a Gulf Service Station, which is operated by one Harold M. Holwell. The address of this station is 1385 West 25th Street. Harold M. Holwell resides at 2231 West 93rd Street. This filling station is connected on the inside with the tavern, in the the tayorn makes use of the gentlemen's rest room in the Gulf Service. Station. The building in which both of these enterprises are located is a five-story, brick building and from the second floor to the fifth are cheap apartments.

The above-mentioned Agents discreetly contacted Mae Neeme and she was invited to accompany Agents to the Cleveland Bureau office where she was thoroughly questioned regarding the possibilities of

having at any time seen Alvin Karpis at the Last Chance Cafe. She gave her address as 1712 West 32nd Street. She stated that she is twenty-two years of age and lives with Mrs. West at the above address. She was shown several photographs, including all subjects of this case, but failed to make any identification of photographs shown her as being the likeness of anyone known to her to have visited the Last Chance Cafe. Mae Neame stated that she would be willing to assist the Bureau in any way possible in the location of fugitives wanted by this Bureau, and it is believed that if it can be definitely ascertained that the Last Chance Cafe is the same place to which Dolores Delaney had reference in her statement, that Mae Neame will be a valuable informant.

It was deemed advisable to ascertain definitely from Dolores Delaney whether or not the Last Chance Cafe was the place she had in mind, therefore, several photographs of the Last Chance Cafe were taken by the above named Agents and were subsequently forwarded to the Detroit office in order that they might be exhibited to Dolores Delaney.

The above Agents also conducted a surveillance of the premises at 7124 Clark Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, which is the residence of Tony Amersbach. During the time that the surveillance was maintained no person resembling or answering to the description of Tony Amersbach was seen in that vicinity.

Special Agent W. B. O'Mahoney attempted to locate a party by the name of McAddie (or MacAddie), who is believed to be occupying a house owned by Art Hebebrand, said house being located somewhere in the vicinity of Parma, Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland. It was ascertained that all deliveries of mail to Parma, Ohio are made from Brooklyn station at Cleveland, consequently Mr. H. F. Hotes, Assistant Superintendent of Mail, was contacted and he was requested to ascertain from rural and city carriers serving residents of Parma, Ohio, whether or not there is a person by the name of McAddie (or MacAddie), or some similar name, receiving mail. A later contact was made at said station where Agent interviewed Mr. C. Snow, Superintendent of the station. Mr. Snow advised that an inquiry had been made of all carriers, but that no information regarding anyone by the name of McAddie (or MacAddie) had been forthcoming.

Special Agent W. B. O'Mahoney attempted to secure information regarding the identity and whereabouts of one Smoky Sharkey, a gambler, who is believed to have frequented the Harvard Club during the time it was in operation. Smoky Sharkey is believed to have been formerly engaged in the prize ring as a boxer, however, inquiries made at the sports departments of various newspapers failed to reveal any definite information in regard to any fighter using such a name. Inquiries were made at the post offices serving the vicinity of 98th and Madison Avenue, where Smoky Sharkey is reported to reside. Carriers were unable to furnish any information regarding Sharkey.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent E. J. Dowd:

On page twenty-five of the report of Special Agent D. E. Hall, Detroit, Michigan, dated September 25, 1934, mention is made of a notation on a paper found in the apartment of Alvin Karpis on 140th Street, which notation read: "Goletman, 3115 Lorain." This is probably meant for 3115 Lorain Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, where the Goldman Glass Company is located.

Agent interviewed Nat Goldman, one of the partners, who stated that shortly after the police raided the apartment of Alvin Karpis on West 140th Street, Cleveland, Ohio, he, Goldman, was interviewed by an Agent of this Bureau and recalled at the time that in response to a telephone call, one of his men went to the premises occupied by Alvin Karpis, and replaced a broken pane of glass. However, he did not know Karpis or Dolores Delaney, and they were unknown to any of his employees, none of whom were able to identify their photographs which were exhibited at the time Agent called at his place of business. Mr. Goldman stated that he advertised in the telephone directory, and the party ordering the pane of glass probably got his name in this way, when consulting the classified section of the telephone book.

On February 4, 1936, from 10 A. M. to 5 P. M., and on February 5, 1936 from 9:30 A. M. to about 2 P. M., Agent covered the home of Art Hebebrand, 3909 West 158th Street, in a Bureau car, with a view to determining what contacts Hebebrand made, if any, after ... leaving his home. During this period Hebebrand did not enter or come out of the house. Agent then placed a telephone call to the Hebebrand residence, which call was answered by a Mrs X Devlin. The latter is a sister-in-law of Art Hebebrand. In a discreet manner 1 Agent ascertained that Art Hebebrand left the house on the afternoon of February 3, 1936 and had not as yet returned home, but he was expected to be heard from at any time. Mrs. Devlin suggested that he probably could be located through Shorty Conway, or by placing a call at the Hollenden Hotel and having him paged in the lobby. Shorty Conway is a former dealer at the Harvard Club. Inasmuch as it is known that Art Hebebrand has been living with and keeping a woman named Ruth Eager at the Lake Shore Hote, Cleveland, Ohio, Agent interviewed Mr. P. M. Markward, Manager, who advised that he had been keeping close check on Ruth Eager's room; that on Saturday, February 1, 1936, he received a telephone call from her from the outside, telling him that she was giving up her room and to place her personal effects in the storage room until she called for them. The following afternoon, Sunday, February 2, 1936, Ruth Eager came to the hotel, had the colored bellboy take her things and place them in her Packard car, which was on the wash rack at the time. She was alone when she called and while paying her bill, she was asked for a forwarding address, but refused to leave one, saying that she did not want anyone to know where she was staying.

UNDEVELOPED LEADS

The INDIANAPOLIS OFFICE at Michigan City, Indiana, at the Indiana State Prison, will ascertain whether Phillip Amersbach is incarcerated there and if so will appropriately interview the prisoner with reference to the slip of paper bearing his name and address, described on page 19 of this report, which was found on the occasion of the raid in September, 1934 on the residence of Alvin Karpis, 3973 West 140th Street, Cleveland, Ohio, where Karpis resided with Dolores Delaney under the name of Mr. and Mrs. H. G. Milgreth. This inquiry should be made for the purpose of ascertaining the reason for his name and address being in Karpis's apartment and the significance thereof, and also efforts should be made to ascertain the identity of the other persons whose names appeared on the slip of paper, their backgrounds, activities, and present locations, it being felt that if this information is properly developed it may be instrumental in furnishing leads as to the present whereabouts of the subjects in this case.

For the information of the Indianapolis office, Tony Amersbach, a brother of Phillip Amersbach, was closely allied with the proprietors of the Harvard Club prior to the time of its closing by the county prosecutor at Cleveland, Ohio on January 10, 1936, and since that date Tony has been very active in arrangements which are being made by the promoters of the club to reopen. It is felt that undoubtedly at the time Karpis and Campbell and other subjects were in Cleveland in the spring and fall of 1934, they frequented the Harvard Club and were acquainted with the operators of that club, namely, Art Hebebrand, and James "Shimmy" Patton, as well as Tony Amersbach.

The CINCINNATI OFFICE at Flushing and Dayton, Ohio, will ascertain the identity of George R. Benton, who is reported to reside on Rural Route #2, Flushing, Ohio, and at 333 Pleasant Street, Dayton, Ohio, will ascertain the identity of the occupants at that address. The superintendent of mail at Dayton advised the Cleveland office that people by the names of Benton and Forth reside at that address.

In connection with the investigation at Dayton and Flushing, please bear in mind that this is being requested for the purpose of determining whether or not the persons could be those who addressed registered mail at Cleveland, Ohio to Mrs. Maggie Lett, Wann, Oklahoma, as reflected by previous reports. It is felt that possibly the sender of these letters was in fact Milton Lett and it may be that he is residing at either Flushing or Dayton under the name of Benton or Forth.

At Columbus, Ohio, at the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, will conduct appropriate investigation for the purpose of determining all pertinent details with reference to any automobiles under registration and in the name of Fred Hunter, alies Fred King, alies Harold King, whose home is in the vicinity of Warren, Ohio, and in this connection refer to the body of this report, noting that recent information indicates that in about October, 1935 this individual allegedly purchased a new Ford V8 automobile, and that the car which he had previously was registered in Warren, Ohio under the name of Harold King. In the event a registration is located for this individual, appropriate stop notice should be placed in order that your office will be notified immediately in the event the car is registered in the future.

Will refer to long distance telephone calls set out in the body of this report, and conduct appropriate investigation with reference to the telephone numbers located in the Cincinnati territory for the purpose of determining whether or not Karpis or Campbell are located at the places listed.

In the recent trial of Harr Tamyer, William Yeaver and Cassius McDonald, at St. Paul, Minnesota, in connection with the kidnaping of Edward Go Brener, it would appear that Harry Casyer, in testifying, endeavored to explain why, if he were not guilty of any offense, he proceeded to run away from April, 1934 to May, 1935, and in his examination it was brought out by his attorney that the reason he did not surrender was because of the alleged treatment certain individuals were supposed to have received at the hands of Government Agents handling the investigation of the Brener kidnaping case at St. Paul. This atstement was amplified to the effect that he, Sawyer, understood Tom Philbin had been held a considerable period of time in this case and questioned in the Federal Building in St. Paul and, in fact, had been required to stand in a corner, after having been stripped of his clothing. This alleged situation was dwelt upon by Sawyer's counsel in his argument to the jury.

Will you please advise the Bureau at the earliest possible moment as to your recollection of any andeall matters relative to the questioning of Tom Philbin in St. Paul during the early part of the investigation into the Bremer kidnaping.





A photographic copy of Mead's fingerprint card showing the mutilated condition of his fingerprints, as forwarded to the Phoenix office on December 19, 1935, was supplied to Mr. J. F. McDonald, fingerprint expert, Bureau of Criminal Identification, State Office Building, Phoenix, Arizona, and same was searched through the files of the fingerprints of that Bureau without results. This photographic copy of Mead's fingerprints was left with the Bureau of Criminal Identification with a request that should a copy of Mead's fingerprints be received by that Bureau, that the Phoenix office be immediately notified. The files of that Bureau were also searched for the various aliases used by Mead through the former fingerprint classification of Mead prior to the mutilation of his fingerprints, and it was ascertained that no record existed of Mead's arrest under any of his aliases in the State of Arizona since the Bureau of Criminal Identification has been in operation.

Agent also interviewed Captain T. J. Lucey, Phoenix Police Department, and exhibited to him photographs of Mead, but Captain Lucey advised that he does not recall having ever seen Mead.

Mr. Lloyd Estes, Criminal Identification Bureau, Phoenix Police
Department, searched the records of his department and ascertained that the only
record now on file in the Phoenix Police Department is a wanted notice and fingerprint card of Mead under the name of John Henry Foster, which wanted notice was
issued by the Denver Police Department, on December 12, 1931, giving Mead's fingerprint classification as 1 U 5, which wanted circular indicated that Mead

is wanted by the Jacksonville, Florida Police Department for jumping bond and that his known aliases at that time were W. Elmer Mead and "Christ Kid". Mr. Estes advised that should Mead be subsequently arrested by the Phoenix Police Department, that the Phoenix Bureau office would be notified immediately.

Agent interviewed Officer Joe Murphy, of the Phoenix, Arizona Police Department, as suggested by Captain Lucey as being an officer familiar with confidence men operating in the vicinity of Phoenix, and was advised by Officer Murphy that he cannot state postively that he has ever seen Mead, although the photograph exhibited to him somewhat resembled a man who stopped at the Westward Ho Hotel in Phoenix approximately one year ago and registered under the name of Blair, who was thought to have been engaged in the promotion of a confidence scheme at that time, but that Blair checked out of the hotel before he, Officer Murphy, could apprehend him.

Agent interviewed H. F. Granthan, Assistant Manager of the Westward Ho

Hotel who advised that Mead's photograph somewhat resembled a man named Blair who stopped at the Westward Ho Hotel in March, 1935, and subsequently left the hotel without paying his room rent in the amount of \$25.00, but that Blair was a younger man than Mead appears to be and he is sure they are not identical.

Agent interviewed C. T. Radey, Post Office Inspector, Post Office Building, Phoenix, Arizona, with reference to whether or not Mead has ever come under investigation by his office in connection with mail fraud schemes. Mr. Radey produced a photograph of one Harry J. Kelly, alias Walter G. Kelly, alias Osborne, who Mr. Radey advised had registered at the Westward Ho Hotel in March, 1935, using the name of H. R. Blair, and who was thought to have been involved in several confidence schemes throughout the country. The comparison of Kelly's photograph with that of Mead revealed that Kelly is not identical with Mead and appears to be somewhat younger. Mr. Radey also advised that Kelly had used the name Hunnington on occasions in the past in connection with confidence schemes.

After viewing the photographs of Mead, Mr. Radey advised that he does not recall having seen the man before and has no record of an investigation made by his office in connection with him. He stated that on February 23, 1935, one Paul Sawyer, who resides at Elm Creek, Nebraska, was fleeced out of \$25,000 by a man whose correct name is believed to be W. C. Douglas, but who resided several weeks at hotels in Phoenix under the name of S. W. Maloney; that Douglas was associated with one J. Sloan, of San Francisco, California, who is known also as "Boons Kid", Jim Whitney, Abbott S. Whitney, and who is described as being about 65 years of age and of slender build, but that he, Radey, did not believe Douglas to be identical with Mead; Radey was of the opinion that at the time Paul Sawyer was fleeced out of \$25,000 the Phoenix Police Department could have arrested Douglas but failed to do so.

Agent presented photographs of Mead to hotel clerks and employees of the main hotels in Phoenix, Arizona, with negative results, the following being the hotels at which Mead's photograph was exhibited to employees: Westward Ho Hotel; San Carlos Hotel; Luhrs Hotel; Jefferson Hotel; Adams Hotel; Arizona Hotel.

As set out in the summary report of Special Agent K. R. McIntire, dated at St. Paul, Minnesota, April 10, 1935, it was noticed that William Bryan Bolton, now incarcerated in the Ramsey County Jail at St. Paul, advised (page 105) that in January, 1934, he was residing at Phoenix, Arizona, and also Irene Dorsey advised that she sent a telegram to Monty Carter (Bolton) (page 178) when he was residing at 3348 Northeast Seventeenth Avenue (there is no Northeast Seventeenth Avenue in Phoenix; Carter's correct address at that time was 3448 North Sixteenth Street.)

In the elimination of that address as being a possible meeting place for the remaining subjects in instant case, it should be noted that no such address exists at Phoenix, but that an investigation made by the Phoenix office in an effort to connect Bolton with the case entitled OSCAR HERBERT ROBSON alias "BUSTER" ROBSON, UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; JUNE ROBLES - VICTIM: EXTORTION, the following is quoted from the report of Special Agent Enos Sandberg, dated at Phoenix, Arizona, February 10, 1936:

"Agents Sandberg and Sorola ascertained that Byron Bolton as Owen B. (Monte)—Carter lived at 3448 North 16th Street, Phoenix, Arizona, from October 4, 1933, to May 18 or 19, 1934. It was ascertained at the Osborn School that his two children, Vonnie Carter and Junior Carter, attended school in Phoenix, Arizona, from October 4, 1933, to May 18, 1934. School records show the following information: Vonnie Carter, 6th grade, 3448 North 16th Street; parent - Owen B. Carter; born January 31, 1921, age 11 years 8 months. Entered school from Chicago. Entered school October 4, 1933. Promoted to 7th grade on May 18, 1934. Teacher - Arden Staples. Junior Carter, 8th grade, 3448 North 16th Street, Phoenix, Arizona; parent - Owen B. Carter; born July 25, 1920. Entered school October 4, 1933, from Chicago. Promoted to High School May 18, 1934.

V. D. Jones - teacher.

"Agents interviewed Frank Madison, owner of the Madison School of Golf, corner of McDowell and Sixteenth Streets, Phoenix, Arizona, and he stated that he was very well acquainted with Mr. Carter; that Carter played golf at his place nearly every day while in Phoenix; that he came early in the mornings and was there when he closed up at nights; that he spent from \$1.50 to \$3.00 every day at the golf school; that he told Mr. Madison that he was just waiting until school was out; that he was all packed up and ready to leave; that he left a day or two after school was out."

On February 5, 1936, the Tucson, Arizona Police Department was supplied with photographs of Mead and his wife, by letter, with the request that the Phoenix office be notified should any information be received by the Tucson Police Department as to their possible past connections at Tucson. Should any information be received, same will be immediately transmitted to the Bureau.

CONSTABLE L. E. MacCROSHEE was contacted in a further effort to ascertain whether either Campbell or Karpis might have been in the area. He advised on examining the photographs of both that he had never seen any individuals resembling either in or about Harrisville. He was supplied with a detailed description of both Campbell and Karpis and was advised to contact the Pittsburgh Office by telephone if he observed individuals resembling either in or about Harrisville. He further stated that he knew the Danoff femily quite well and would make it a point to visit their home periodically in the future in order to keep a better check on their home. In addition, he stated that he knew CLANDECE BIXLER having had some dealings with him and would also arrange to drop in occasionally on him to ascertain whether he might have any strangers living with him.

MRS. CHARLES FRIMAN, Rural Route #5, stated that since last interviewed, she and her husband have been maintaining a close watch on the Denoff residence for the possible appearance of any strangers. She advised that subject Compbell's mother and father visited the Denoff femily in early December, 1935; that her husband did not know it at the time of Agent's last visit; that she was positive of their identity since the daughter, Ellner Danoff, came over to her house to use the telephone at the time and stated to her that her "granden and grandpa from Oklahoma" were visiting at her home. Mrs. Denoff could not recall but was of the opinion that they had come in a car bearing Oklahoma tags. She stated, however, that they were apparently alone and could recall seeing no person recembling subject Compbell with them. She further edvised that she will continue to maintain a watch on the Denoff home and that if she observes any strangers or suspicious care at their home she will promptly contact the Pittaburgh Office by telephone.

AT GROVE CITY, PA

The SAYON TAYEN adjacent to the home of Clarence Bixler was re-visited. The proprietor, engaged in pasual conversation, advised that he rents the tayern from Clarence Bixler for which he pays \$40,00 a month; that Clarence Bixler, as far as he has been able to observe, has few visitors;

that Bixler lives with his wife and her daughter by a former marriage and his youngest son Welter; that he has no boarders residing at his home and has had no visitors at his home recently.

EDWARD BURTON, who resides in close proximity to Clarence Bisler, stated that he, his wife and daughter Jean have kept a close watch on his home since last interviewed; that they have noticed no unusual activity at the Bixler home and have observed no strangers visiting there, nor anyone particularly resembling the descriptions and photographs of Campbell or Karpis. He advised, however, that he would continue to keep on the alert for any information or any activity that might indicate the presence of either subject in the locality and notify the Pittsburgh Office at once.

Postmaster OLIVE MCCOT stated she has had her carriers maine taining a watch on the homes of Nell Bixler Surema, Mrs. Bernice Bixler Boyd, Mrs. Sarah Bixler Bobson and the home of Clarence Bixler, but that to date none of the respective carriers have noticed any strangers at the homes of either; that she has made the respective carriers study the photographs and descriptions of both subjects in order to be able more readily to identify them if they appear in that area. She stated that she is very much interested in the possibility of Campbell and Karpis being in around Grove City, and will exert every effort and means at her disposal to assist the Bureau in determining whether either of the subjects might be in that area. She further advised that if anything develops that appears worthwhile she will telephone the Pittaburgh Office immediately.

VanEMAN were again interviewed. All stated that they have been alert to serutinize strongers coming into Grove City since they were impressed with the possibility of having such notorious criminals visit their town. They all advised that they have not observed anyons in or about Grove City that resembled either Campbell or Earpis but that they would continue to be on the alert for any strangers coming into Grove City answering their descriptions and promptly contact the Pittsburgh Office if they developed any information indicating the presence of either subject in that sections

MANY HAZIETT, R. D. \$1, stated that she and har brother William have been keeping a watch on the home of MRS. JOHN BOYD but that to date they have noticed no strangers at their home or anyone in that vicinity resembling either of the subjects; that her brother has been likewise on the alert when passing the Windmill Tavern operated by FLOREST BRUNKER for the possible appearance of any persons resembling the subjects but to date he has observed no one that would answer the description of either. She stated, however, that they would continue their surveillance and that if they noticed


any persons in that vicinity answering the descriptions of either they would telephone the Pittaburgh Office.

The Windmill Beer Garden was visited around 7:30 PM. on Saturday but igent observed only two individuals there drinking beer, neither of whom resembled either of the subjects. The place has a notorious reputation as a hoodlum hangout, particularly for Saturday night brawls.

AT WEST MIDDLESEX, PA

Postmaster CHESTER BOAL stated that he has observed no mail going to or coming from Tulse, Oklahoma since Hell Bixler Surena moved back to Grove City, Pa. He advised, however, that he would be on the alert for any mail from or to Tulsa, Oklahoma on the possibility that Campbell or Karpis might be hidden in that area.

High Constable RAIPH S. GARMAN stated that he has observed no strangers in the vicinity of West Middlesex since the photographs of both subjects were shown to him, resembling Campbell or Karpis, He advised that he would continue to scrutinize all strangers closely coming into the town and notify the Pittsburgh Office if he believed any might be either of the subjects.

In connection with letter from this office to the Cleveland office dated February 12, 1936, a copy of which was designated for your office, there was contained a suggestion to make suitable investigation at Hot Springs, Arkanses to determine whether herry campbell was presently frequenting this town. It may be rentioned that a review of the file in the Chicago office indicates that Campbell has been in the habit in the past of frequenting such places for treatment.

In this connection reference is made to the statement of Eynome ardette dated September 13, 1934, as contained in report of opecial Agent R.D. Brown dated September 19, 1934, where on page 36 is noted her statement that in 1933 Wynona Purdette and Harry Campbell spent three weeks at Hot Springs, Arkensas taking hot baths deily. It is noted that a copy of the above report was designated for your office.

The report of Special Agent A.J. Horatron, Ransas City, Missouri dated December 9, 1938, page 5 contains thromation from Milton Brooks to the effect that Compbell is periodically efflicted with severe spells of gonorrheal rhoumstimm, and had made frequent trips to mineral wells. 





The report of Epecial Agent A. R. Gere, Denver, Colorado, dated December 9, 1935, sets forth the list of correspondents of William Elmer Yead during the time he was confined in the Colorado State Penitentiary at Canon City, Colorado, as John H. Prester.

It is noted from the list of correspondents that Mead received over 200 communications from Sears Roebuck & Company, Chicago, Illinois, and forwarded to this address 54 letters. Investigation at Sears Roebuck & Company, Chicago, Illinois, has failed to reveal the nature of this correspondence, elthough it has been admitted by Mr. Williams, Treasurer of Sears Roebuck and Company, that this is an unusual situation in that so many letters were forwarded to Mead in such a short period of time.

It is requested that your office conduct further investigation at the Colorado State Penitentiary in an effort to determine the nature of this correspondence in order that further investigation can be conducted at Sears Roebuck and Company, as it appears probable that due to the voluminous correspondence had in the past with Mead, Mead might possibly be continuing this correspondence. There are over 150 departments in Sears Roebuck and Company, and unless more definite information is obtained concerning the nature of the correspondence it appears that it will be highly improbable that appropriate investigation can be conducted at Sears Roebuck and Company.

It is requested that you expedite this investigation.

A General Delivery clerk who was on duty at the time Mrs. Davenport called for mail under the name of GILHERTSON conversed with her for about five minutes while pretending to be searching for mail, and has stated that he can recognize this woman should she again call for mail, and will notify the St. Paul Office if she calls for mail under any name what seewer.

Tr. F. F. Helly, District Superintendent of the Mestern Union, Mr. A. A. McLaughlin, District Superintendent of the District Diegraph Company, both have been contacted and might be hade with them to advise him office concernments of the State of Days one at the best for to Days the have here to fore

The question of placing certain telephone lines under observation, has been discussed with Mr. Glen Allen, Manager of the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, and with Mr. J. P. Mason, Commercial Superintendent of that company, but the Minnesota Statute making it an offense punishable by jail sentence in furnishing any information of this nature to any person whatsoever, has been cited, and it appears that no further communication can be obtained from the telephone company than notification of calls made from DAVENPORTS, telephones, which are being furnished by Mr. Masone

the DAVENPORT residence and who is the informant previously contacted by Special Agent Melvin while that Agent was assigned to this office, has been confined in a hospital, and interviews have been had with his wife who stated that she has noticed no

unusual activity at the DAVENPORT residence, and has agreed to keep this place under observation.

The residence of DAVENPORT, 4108 Columbus avenue, Minneapolis, Minnesota, is a bungalow situated in a residential district. Most of the homes thereabout are owned by the occupants. There are two apartment buildings on Chicago Avenue in the rear of the Davenport residence where it may be possible to obtain quarters from which to operate a telephone tap on the telephone of the Davenports, should this be desirable.

DAVENPORT operates the Third Street Buffet at 301
Hennepin Avenue in the downtown section of Minneapolis, which consists of a saloon and restaurant adjoining, on the first floor of a third rate hotel building. The telephone in this saloon is semi-public, in other words a pay station, the charges for which are paid by the various users, and if a deficit exists it is made up by the subscribers.

DAVENPORT also owns one-half interest in JACK DOYLE'S Smoke Shop, 413 Hennepin Avenue, where a hand book is operated; also has an interest in the Hollywood Club which is now closed; also has part of the Cocoanut Grove, a second floor night slub 5th and Hennepin, Minneapolis, Minnesota,

It will be recalled that DAVENPORT robbed a bank in Milwaukee with WICKE HANSON who is now bodyguard of Charlie Ward who has been active in politics in Minnesota. He has enjoyed the friendship of various law enforcement officials in Minneapolis in the past, but more recently because of police shake-ups in the Twin Cities, the murder of Walter Liggett, and other crimes which have caused various grand jury investigations, he has not maintained the open contacts he has in the past, and it is doubtful that a telephone tap on his telephone would be productive of any information of value at this time, particularly in view of the publicity given to telephone taps maintained during investigation of various police officers and their contacts with the underworlds

This is borne out in part by the manner in which FITZGERALD communicated with DAVENPORT by addressing a letter to DAVENPORT'S wife under a fictitious name, care of General Delivery, instead of communicating directly with him. This, coupled with the fact that the utmost discretion is desired in covering means

of communication with the DAVENPORTS, that nothing be done to cause them to communicate with FITZGERALD, leads to the suggestion that Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley, advise as to his instructions as to whether telephone taps should be installed on the telephones of JACK DAVENPORT.

In report of Special Agent S. K. McKee referred to above, there is set forth a list of alleged contacts of the KARPIS-BARKER gang, a number of whom are located in the Twin Cities.

may be found at the West Hotel, Minneapolis, He is with the Peoria Liquor Company which is a wholesale outfit operating a small distillery in Peoria, Illinois, He operates liquor stores in downtown Minneapolis, BANKS owned the Admiral Hotel with JACK PFEIFFER in 1931 at which hotel various members of the KEATING-HOLDEN gang resided, but he disposed of his interest in this hotel several years ago, and his alleged connection with the KARPIS-BARKER gang is not apparent.

THOMAS BROWN, who is in charge of the Auto Theft Bureau of the St. Paul Police Department, was placed in charge of the Kidnap Squad of that Department while Thomas Dahill was Chief of Police. Since the BREMER kidnaping Dahill has come to the conclusion that BROWN had maintained contact with the KARPIS-BARKER gang while estensibly working on the kidnaping. In fact the belief that BROWN had been impelled to do this, at least in part, by reason of his desire to embarrass Dahill who was then Chief, has become an obsession with Dahill, who has spent much of his time in an endeavor to procure information from police officers whom he believes he can trust, which would lead to the prosecution of BROWN.

While it is generally rumored in St. Paul that BROWN is a crooked police officer, should be have participated in either the Hemm of Bramer kidnapings through furnishing information to the perpetrators as to the police activity, he has apparently been smart enough to deal only through HARRY SAWYER, as neither Dahill nor anyone else has been able to furnish any concrete evidence of these rumors.

It was noted during the recent police investigation at St. Paul involving a number of police officers who were in

contact with various gamblers, that BROWN'S name was conspicuously absent, and Agent was confidentially advised by Mr. Jack McKay, Associated Press representative, that BROWN was associated with Commissioner Warren and Mr. Kahn of the Deily News, and knew that the investigation was in progress.

ALICE CONRAD of 601 South 9th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, was employed by Dr. Henry Hall who testified in behalf of the Government in the recent trial, in her capacity as a practical nurse for GLADYS SAWYER. Since removal of SAWYER to the Leavenworth Penitentiary, GLADYS SAWYER went to Cmaha, Nebraska to stay with SAWYER'S brother, and it would not appear that information could be gained from Miss Conrad at this time. However, arrangements will be made with Dr. Hall to obtain such information as may be desired in the future from ALICE CONRAD.

With reference to JACK Decouracty, Attorney at Law, St. Paul, it is believed that more information can be gained by direct contact with Decouracty than through other parties with reference to his activities. His ability as an Attorney is somewhat questionable and did he not have an independent income would probably starve to death. He may usually be found at the Lowry Bar in a semi-insbriated state, and there discourses at length concerning matters which ordinarily would be considered privileged communications between attorney and client. The usual contacts with Mr. Decouracy will be maintained.

MRS. HELEN DELANEY, mother of Dolores Delaney, informed Agent on the way to the County Jail prior to interview with her daughter, that she did not desire Dolores to know that she would furnish any information to the Government, and requested that no discussion be entered into concerning interviews had with her during the time Dolores was with KARPIS. It may be that the letters written by her to Dolores at Milan, indicating that she would not approve of her daughter doing anything which might result in the capture of KARPIS, may have been written to assure her daughter that she was not furnishing any information, should any suspicion be aroused in the mind of her daughter. As it now appears that Dolores has herself furnished information in this regard, and that in all probability Dolores will not be paroled while KARPIS is a Fugitive, further interview will be had with Mrs. Delaney to enlist her cooperation in procuring information from the Karpovitz family.

LARRY DuVOL referred to in Agent McKee's report, is now in the Minnesota Asylum for the Criminal Insahe at St. Peter, Minnesota.

TOM FILEEN resides at the St. Francis Hotel in St. Paul. It was his brother James who was killed in an automobile accident in January, 1936. FILEEN formerly operated the Federal Acceptance Company, an automobile finance concern which is now out of business. He was also engaged in operating slot machines in Ramsey County, but the operation of such machines has been discontinued, though he is alleged to be operating slot machines in South Dekota. GLADYS MERKINS, referred to as his paramour, is in fact GLADYS MERCENS, wife of RAY I. MERGENS, a painter, and resides with her husband at 1668 Dayton Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota, Apartment 2. She has an interest in the Mer-Sha Candy Store, 23 West 7th Street, which is in the St. Francis Hotel Building.

FILEEN is not on overly friendly terms with JACK
PFEIFFER and JACK DAVENPORT of Minneapolis, and as FILEEN banks
at the Commercial State Bank, and is well known to EDWARD
GEORGE BREMER, an interview with Filben will be arranged through
Bremer, when Bremer returns from New York next week through
which it is hoped some further information concerning the
activities of PFEIFFER and DAVENPORT might be obtained.
—FILEEN'S connection with previous investigation made by this
office is as to the purchase of automobiles by the Dillinger
mob through the Federal Finance Company, and it does not appear
that he has been associated with the KARPIS-BARKER gang other
than HARRY SAWYER.

Interview with BESSIE SKINNER GREEN now Mrs. J. L. Garrett, has recently been reported.

Surveillance of EDDIE JAMES was maintained for several months upon information furnished by BESSIE GREEN to the effect that JAMES had taken care of repair work on the cars of the KARPIS-BARKER gang when they were operating in and out of Stepaul, but no information was ever obtained to verify this.

OPAL MILLICAN, St. Faul prostitute, concerning whom it is stated that general information possibly as to KARPIS can be secured, separated from her husband, became acquainted with, and lived with PAT REILLY for about six weeks prior to the time she notified this office as to REHLY'S whereabouts. Her present whereabouts is not known. However, effort will be made to locate her and secure such information as she may possibly have concerning the KARPIS-BARKER mob.

Investigation concerning the activities of JACK PFEIFFER will be set forth in a separate reporte

MRS. HELEN "BABE" REILLY, daughter of Mrs. Helen
Deleney, and wife of PAT REILLY, is a common prostitute. She
has been interviewed by Agents of this office but no information whatsoever has ever been obtained from her. Her mother
has requested that interviews with Mrs. Deleney be conducted
out of the presence of "BABE" REILLY. Arrangements will be made
to receive advice concerning her activities while in St. Paul.

The Republic Finance Company which was operated by LECN GIRCKIAN at 414 University Avenue, has been out of business since the conviction of Gleckman of an income tax violation.


FRISCO DUTCH STEINHARDT is an old Chicago pickpocket, is alleged to have murdered a man in Chicago in 1927 and come to the Twin Cities where he engaged in muscling beer and was later a bouncer at the Plantation Inn at White Bear Lake. He has not been seen in the Twin Cities for the past two years. The Boulevards of Paris, which it is reported he is alleged to have operated, was a night club located on Snelling and University Avenues, St.Paul, Minnesota, operated by Bob Hamilton, an associate of JACK PFRIFFER and JACK DOYLE, and in 1934 it became the Vanity Fair, degenerated into a ten cent joint, and is now out of business. So far as is known STEINHARDT had no connection with the operation of this establishment.

It is not known how he would have any connection with the KARPIS-BARKER gang unless it would be that he met the BARKERS while they were residing at White Bear Lake in 1933 and frequented the Plantation, at which time FRISCO DUTCH was employed there as a bouncer.

HERBERT WILDS worked in a garage at the foot of Cathedral HIII in St. Paul about two years ago, which garage was

owned by Leon Gleckman and Harry Sawyer. This garage went out of business and WILDS thereafter sold cars on a commission basis for various dealers. His present whereabouts is unknown.

Reference is made to your report of February 5, 1936, setting out the results of investigation conducted by your office in connection with information furnished by one Virgil Stewart to the effect that Grady Courtrey had been visited by Compbell and Karpis on two or three occasions in the past month.

In this connection your ettention is called to the report of Special Agent Paul Hansen, Oklahoma City, dated August 28, 1934. On page 8 of this report there is set out an interview had with Grady Folurtrey at the Tulsa Folice Department, at which time McMurtrey admitted being acquainted with members of the Karpis Berker geng, and provided information indicating that Tom Mill of South Coffeyville, Oklahoma was a probable contact for the gang. ". The above report indicated that McMurtrey had agreed to become a confidential informant of the Bureau. At that time McMurtrey indicated that his address was in care of his father George P. Vocurtrey, located one mile west of West Tulas, Oklahoms on the Midco Road.

In view of the above information, it is possible that Campbell is in touch with McMurtrey, and it is suggested that a discreet investigation be made at the above address to ascertain whether McMurtrey is presently residing there, and whether he is in communication with Compbell.







AT GALENA, OHIO

R. E. Fissell, Postmaster at Galena, Ohio, advised that the George Benton who formerly lived on R.R. #1, Galena, Ohio, had moved to Westerville, Ohio, and that he, Mr. Fissell, had answered an inquiry sent out by the Cleveland Office advising them of this fact. Mr. Fissell advised that he has been in the town of Galena for about 10 years and that while he did not know this George Bentom exceptionally well he did know that he was married and had lived in the vicinity for several years and that his people had also lived around there for many years. He stated that Mr. Benton was tall, about 6° and was quite slim and appeared to be about 30 years old.

Agent exhibited a photo of Harry Campbell as well as photos of other persons and Mr. Fissell stated that Harry Campbell's photo was not similar to the Mr. Benton he knows.

AT QUAKER CITY, OHIO

Postmaster C. S. Hendershot, Quaker City, Ohio, advised that he had received an inquiry concerning any registered mail that George Benton might receive and stated that he had watched the mail, but that Benton had moved to Flushing, Ohio, about a month ago and left a forwarding address to that town and that no registered mail had been received for him. Mr. Hendershot advised that he did not personally know this George Benton and agent arranged to contact Harold Smith, the postal carrier on this route. Mr. Smith stated that he had seen George Benton on many occasions and described him as being about 45 years old, married, three children and quite tall. He estimated that he is about 5'10-11" tall and weighs about 175 pounds. Agent exhibited a photo of Harry Campbell to Mr. Smith as well as other photos and Mr. Smith advised that none of the photos exhibited resembled this George Benton.

AT FREDERICKTOWN, OHIO

Agen't contacted W. C. Foote, Postmaster at Fredericktown, Chio, who advised that E. M. Rowley operates a filling station in
Fredericktown, Chio, located on Route #13 as one enters the town from
Mount Vernon, Chio. He advised that Rowley is formerly from Mount Vernon,
Chio, and bears a good reputation. Mr. Foote stated that he did not
know either Mr. or Mrs. Howard Emerson, but arranged that agent contact
one of his assistants named Ross Postal.

Ross Postal advised that he recalls both Mr. and Mrs. Howard Emerson and stated that they lived with Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Rowley and stated that Mrs. Rowley was an Emerson girl before her marriage and is a sister of Howard Emerson. He advised that the Emersons lived with the Rowleys for a short time and then lived at the Kirby hotel in Fredericktown, Ohio. He also advised that he had eaten

lunch with Howard Emerson on various occasions at the Kirby Hotel and that Howard Emerson had given him to believe that he was only recently married and that his wife formerly worked in a night club at Toledo or Cleveland, Ohio. (Mr. Postal could not recall which place). Emerson also told him that he had worked for the Chevrolet people at Toledo, Ohio, and had earned 80¢ an hour for his work. Mr. Postal advised that Emerson did not have a car and that when he was leaving Fredericktown, Ohio, that he came into the post office to mail a package to Toledo, Ohio, and that he did not have a return address on it and that he, Mr. Postal insisted that he put one there and that Emerson then put the name of the Kirby Hotel as a return address. Mr. Postal stated that Emerson was tall, about 6°, and weighed about 165 to 170 pounds and had very light sandy hair and blue eyes. No record was made of the address in Toledo to which the package was sent. The Emersons did not send or receive any registered mail through the Post Office at Fredericktown, Ohio.

Mr. J. G. Kirby, owner of the Kirby Hotel and restaurant, Fredericktown, Ohio, informed agent that Emerson and his wife lived at the hotel for about one month and left for Toledo, Ohio, about Thanksgiving time of 1935. He advised that they lived quietly and paid their bills promptly. He was unable to recall the name of Emerson's wife and stated that he did not believe that he ever heard Emerson call her anything except some endearing term such as "honey" or "dear". Kirby talked quite freely and informed agent that he sometimes thought that they were not married. He advised that Mrs. Emerson did not mix much with people and did not seem to know anyone in town except the Rowleys, who came after them on occasions and that most of the time she stayed in her room and slept and yet never did any of the cleaning of the room herself.

Mrs. J. G. Kirby advised agent that she cleaned the room of the Emersons all of the time that they were at the hotel and advised that they never locked any of their belongings and the grips and valises were always open and unlocked even when they were both away from the hotel. Mrs. Kirby advised that sometimes (1984) Mrs. Rowley would come for Mrs. Emerson and take her to Mount Gilead, Ohio, as Emerson's family lived there and they had some sickness in the family at Mount Gilead for a while. Mrs. Kirby advised that Mrs. Emerson was a blond and quite small and slight, stating that she was about 5'3" tall and would not weigh over 115#. She advised that Emerson was rather tall but did not think that he was 6° tall, as did Mr. Postal when he described him. Mr. and Mrs. Kirby do not keep any register of guests and could not supply the dates that the Emersons were at the hotel. They both stated that they believed that the Emersons intended going to Toledo, Chio, when they left, but that they did not leave a forwarding address and had never written any letters or cards back.

Inquiry at the Sun Glow Industries Company,
Fredericktown, Ohio, reflected that Howard Emerson was employed
there from the latter part of September until about November 20, 1935.
During his employment there he earned \$155.38 and the records do not
indicate whether he resigned or was discharged. Inquiry among several
of the employees developed that he had previously been employed at
Toledo, Ohio, as a mechanic and that he was accustomed to earning more
money than he could earn at the job he was holding. Some of the men
believed that he intended going to Florida and others thought that he
intended to return to Toledo, Ohio. He left no forwarding address
with this firm and the records maintained by the firm are very brief
and do not indicate the type of work done by him, his age, previous
employers or references.

Hanson, who is employed by the Fairbanks-Morral Company in St. Paul, that he had recently made a trip to Hayward, Wisconsin, at which time, es I recell, he either spent the night, or had dinner at a hotel in Hayward that is operated by Jos Saltis. My brother mentioned that there is some talk In Rayword about Sultis' connection with Capone. The also stated that a cousin of mine, Algot imnson, is a forest ranger stationed in Hayward, and that this cousin seems to know something about Saltis and about other headlung and sho are residing in northern "isconsin. I personally have not seen this cousin for fifteen or twenty years, but according to my brother he is a clean, intelligent and honest young men. I do not know if he is employed by the Federal Covernment or by the State of Maconsin, but it occurs to me that if you are to conduct any investigation in Hayward, you might be desirous of eccuring the name of an informant, and for this reason I suggest this cousin, Algot Tenson.

I might also say that this cousin's fether, No Wartin Fancon, io rurel mail cerrier in the general vicinity of Sayward. I believe that he lives at Minter, Wisconsin. Reference is made to Bureau letter dated February 10, 1936, in connection with the recent trial of Harry Cawyer, William Weaver and Jassius Tebonald at St. Paul, Minnesota, wherein Sawyer indicated that third degree methods were used on Tom Thilbin.

Tom Philbin was apprehended at his place of business at St. Paul, according to my recollection, on March 31, 1934, by Special Agent in Charge W. Hanni, former Agent O. G. Hall, and myself. His apprehension was in connection with the escape of John Dillinger and not in the Brekid case, and investigation at that time showed that he was instrumental in securing Hudson and Terraplane automobiles for the Dillinger associates. He was brought to the office of Mr. Hanni, where Hanni and I questioned him for several hours. He was kept at the St. Faul office, I believe, for exactly one week, having been apprehended on a Saturday and released the following Saturday.

At no time were any third degree methods used; he was never struck nor was he verbally abused, according to my knowledge, and I am quite sure that if he were abused, even verbally, I would have known of it. He appeared extremely friendly at all times and indicated he was perfectly satisfied to remain in the custody of the Bureau. He was never required to stand or sit in any one position for any length of time and upon his release he appeared to be very friendly to the Eureau and appreciated the kind attention which he received.

I am confident that the only persons who questioned Philbin were Agents Hanni, Hall and myself.





MEMO ANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

During a telephonic conversation which I had with Mr. Ladd at Chicago, he mentioned his teletype to the Bureau of this date in the case of UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; St. Charles National Bank, St. Charles, Illinois; Bank Robbery, in which information is set forth to the effect that subject Dimenza of this case, who was apprehended, advises that he end some others, among them Alvin Kerpis, have contemplated robbing the payroll at Peoria, Illinois on or about February 24, 1936. Mr. Ladd said that he has talked to the Chief Impactor and to Chief Sullivan about this case, and they state that Fred Hanson, one of the participants in this bank robbery, is a known contact of Alvin Karpis, and can put Karpis on the spot if anybody can.

I asked Mr. Ledd what the possibilities were for a release on this matter at this time, and he said that to release this information at this time would ruin the entire situation; that they have a couple of plants on as yet, wo of the robbers still being at large, and to release the information would ruin everything. He further said that they are cooperating with and are being given cooperation by the Chicago Police Department in connection with this matter, and if we were to release the information, it would be ruining the chances which the Chicago Police have of getting informatic from the subjects concerning a number of local cases in which they are suspects.

Mr. Ladd suggested that this situation ought to be discussed with Mr. Connelley, to which I concurred, and Mr. Ladd said that he would et in touch with Mr. Connelley right away.

- Reference is made to bureau letter, dated December 19, 1935, (Bureau file #7-576), regarding the instant matter.

A review of the St. Louis office file covering this case reveals that the only investigation conducted in the St. Louis district in an effort to locate William Elmer Mead, with aliases, was conducted at Springfield, Ill., where Mead, according to information contained in bureau letter, dated Sept. 5, 1935, had registered at the Empire Hotel. It was indicated in report of Special Agent J. M. Jones, dated at Chicago, Ill., 7-18-35, that Mead was known to salesman L. H. Hart of the Ford Motor Sales Co., Chicago, as C. C. Chase, and had purchased a Lincoln automobile on April 6, 1932, which was registered in Florida license W-9085, owner Mrs. C. C. Chase, 33 W. Adams St., Jacksonville, Fla., and that this automobile was also registered in Illinois in the year 1933 license number 32864, in the name of Mrs. C. C. Chase, Empire Hotel, Springfield, Ill.

Reference to the report of Special Agent D. S. Hostetter, St. Louis, Mo., dated 9-5-35, reveals that investigation was conducted at the Empire Hotel, Springfield, Ill., and that Mead was unknown there by his true name or any of his aliases. It is also observed in the report of Special Agent V. J. Wolfe, St. Louis, Mo., dated 9-20-35 that an investigation was conducted at the Empire Hotel, Springfield, Ill., without results.

The letter of reference indicates that in the year 1933, Martin Wunder-lich, of 530 Des Noyer St., St. Paul, Minn., was mulcted out of \$200,000 in a confidence scheme by Mead at St. Louis, Mo.; however, reference to the summary report of Special Agent W. E. Hopton, Kansas City, Mo., dated 1-20-36, indicates that, although Mr. Wunderlich and one Charles Layton, one of Mead's associates, met at the Hotel Statler in St. Louis, Mo. during March of 1933, they subsequently proceeded to the Hotel Oliver at South Bend, Ind., where they met one Taylor, later identified as William Kimer Mead, and that Wunderlich was actually swindled out of \$200,000 in South Bend, Ind.

In view of the fact that no investigation other than that indicated in the foregoing has been conducted in the district covered by the St. Louis bureau office, a summary report was not prepared by this office.

and it is known that Karpis and his associates have frequented that Club in the past. It appears that Bert Angus has been apprehensive recently of harboring prosecution and Connelley is certain that he can frighten Angus into cooperating with us.

I discussed with Mr. Connelley leads in the Dallas and El Paso districts upon Harry Campbell and I told him that the Bureau would force those offices into giving these leads proper attention but that, in view of the fact that he was in charge of the field investigation in this case, it would be incumbent upon him to likewise follow up these leads.

I inquired of Connelley what had been done recently at Topeka, Kensas with the Grooms woman, who is a sister of Alvin Karpis. Connelley stated that the Kansas City Office has recently been working on this again but that the Topeka Police have been so overly anxious of this contact that they have made it so "hot" as to be almost valueless.

I pointed out to Connelley that investigation in the Pittsburgh district of the many distant relatives of Harry Campbell has not been pushed very vigorously, and he stated that he did not consider these leads of very great value in view of the fact that when Campbell fled from -Atlantic City he traversed the district occupied by these relatives without contacting any of them. I stated that, regardless of this fact, I believed a careful check should be made upon these individuals.

Appropriate instructions will be issued to the Dallas, El Paso, Kansas City and Pittsburgh offices by the Bureau and appropriate check maintained to see that these leads are properly followed out.

It may be noted that the Post office inspectors believe Karpis participated in a recent mail robbery at Garrettsville, Ohio and, consequently, have been conducting considerable investigation. ing considerable investigation trying to find Karpis. Connelley doubts the accuracy of the identification at Garrettsville but will not take any chances in ignoring this potential source of information.

Connelley is of the opinion that the surveillance being maintained at Tulsa, Oklahoma, by Agents Buchanan and McCain should be continued indefinitely. In this regard, you will recall that there has been some question as to making these men's headquarters at Tulsa, Oklahoma. In view of the fact that one of the Agents is a married man and the nature of the assignment would not permit a man to take his family to Tulsa, it does not appear that these men should have headquarters at Tulsa.

Connelley believes that Agents Wynn, O'Mahoney, Dowd and Dill should be maintained at Cleveland to cover leads arising there and at Toledo, and that taps be maintained, but sees no objection to making the headquarters of these men at Cleveland. A memorandum is attached hereto instructing the Chief Clerk to change the headquarters of these Agents.

The application reflects that Jordan resides at 1022 North Fifteenth Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and that he was born in Brooklyn, New York on December 8, 1898, and is married.

Agent interviewed Mr. V. Berger, mail carrier covering 756 North Elenkinton Avenue, and ascertained that Joekresno or / Frasno, Joe Renner, Louis Simon and Sam Matz have received mail at 756 North Plankinton Avenue in addition to Fred Jordan. He addised Agent that he does not recall where mail addressed to these prities originates, but that the amount of mail received by each party is very small; that other letters from time to time are addres od to 756 North Plankinton Avenue, and that he leaves them with the bartenders; that these letters obviously are for patrons of the tavern who do not want their mail to go to their home addresses. Agent made inquiry at the Milwaukee Police Department and ascertained that Fred Jordan has been arrested on two occasions for traffic violations but has no other criminal record. Louis Simon, however, on May 17, 1934, was fined \$100 for keeping a gambling house. Joseph Krasno on June 18, 1932, was fined \$100 for keeping a gambling house also, and according to Sergeant Martin Fallon of the Milwaukee Police Department who knows Krasno and Simon well, these individuals both are gamblers and follow dice and card games. Sam Katz also, according to Sergeant Fallon, is a well known gembler, and Joe Renner is the operator of a gymnasium at 756 North Plankinton Avenue.

756 North Plankinton Avenue was observed by Agent and was found to be a four-story building, the first floor being operated as a tavern and the remaining three floors being operated as a gymnasium by Joe Renner, who is also active in managing prize fighters in

Milwaukee, Wisconsin. According to Sergeant Martin Fallon, the second floor of 756 North Plankinton Avenue was used as a gambling den and was operated by Krasno and Simon until they were told to leave by the police. Sergeant Fallon advised Agent that Jordan is not interested in gambling and runs a fairly high class establishment; that Jordan bears a good reputation and is not known to have any gangster or criminal hookups; and that Jordan's tavern, as well as other taverns in that vicinity are checked regularly by the Detective Bureau for suspicious characters, but no one has ever been seen there who would arouse the suspicion of the police.





In the recent Brekid trial, in which Harry Sawyer, William Weaver, and Cassius McDonald were defendants on January 20, 1936, a subpoena was issued in the U. S. Clerk of Court's office at the request of defense counsel for Harry Sawyer for the appearance of Melvin Passolt, Superintendent, State Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, as a defense witness. It appears that the purpose of the defense counsel in summoning Mr. Passolt was to show that persons of good reputation occasionally frequented Harry Sawyer's saloon at 451-453 Wabasha Street during 1933 and somewhat prior to the Bremer kidnaping.

Not knowing in advance that Passolt was to be called as a witness by the defense, I was not present in court to hear the testimony. However, Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley was present and has advised me of the circumstances of the information, which will be set out hereafter. United States Attorney George F. Sullivan and Assistant United States Attorney George A. Heisey, who were Government counsel, have also confirmed the substance of the testimony given by Passolt on this. occasion.

RECORDED & INDEXED Under questioning of the defense counsel Passolt testified that in 1933 he occasionally dropped into Harry Sawyer's saloon for the purpose of obtaining refreshments or lunch. Under cross-examination by United States Attorney Sullivan, he made the same statement, and also stated that he occasionally went in

United States Attorney Sullivan, by the questions propounded by him to Passolt, gave the latter plenty of opportunity to amplify his answers to place him in a more favorable light. However, Passolt reiterated his statements that he occasionally entered Sawyer's saloon to secure refreshments or for lunch. It appears that if Passolt had the right attitude he could have very properly answered Mr. Sullivan's questions by stating that he occasionally entered Sawyer's place because he knew it was a hangout for criminals. Although asked leading questions in that respect he failed to answer as suggested above, and which was in all probability the truth.

It appears that to say the least Passolt exercised very poor judgment in consenting to be a defense witness for a man of the character and reputation of Sawyer, particularly since both are St.Paul residents. In view of Mr. Passolt's official position I believe that his appearance and testimony places him in a particularly reprehensible light. The same views are concurred in by United States Attorney Sullivan, Assistant United States Attorney Heisey, and Mr. Connelley.

With reference to Frank Sommers, Chief Investigator for the State Bureau of Criminal Apprehension. and who works directly under Mr. Passolt, Grady L. Boatwright, Secret Service Operative in Charge at St. Paul, furnished me some additional information concerning him the other day. Mr. Boatwright stated that in 1922 a Federal Reserve truck was held up in Denver, Colorade. The Secret Service secured information which tended to show that Frank Sommers, then Chief of Police in St. Paul, was implicated in the disposal of some of the loot. Accordingly they tapped his official telephone, as well as his residence telephone, and secured information that Sommers was interested in disposing of \$85,000.00 of the loot. Mr. Boatwright stated that in view of the nature in which the Secret Service secured this information, and because of Sommers' official position at that time, this evidence was never brought to light.

Mr. Boatwright further stated that because of Sommers' unsavory reputation he has orders from his chief, Mr. Moram in Washington, D. C., not to permit Sommers to ever enter his office.

In accordance with a previous letter from you regarding Frank Sommers, the Agents of this office have been instructed to have no dealings of any kind with him whatsoever. Since Mr. Passolt's recent appearance as a defense witness in the Brekid case, I have instructed the Agents attached to this office to be very careful in their dealings with him and with the State Bureau of Criminal Apprehension. They have been instructed that it is permissable to secure information from Mr. Passolt in cases in which there is a joint interest, but under no circumstances are they to furnish him any information without my prior approval.



The principal work to be pursued by the Cleveland office at the present time in conjunction with the telephone taps being maintained on the telephones of Art Nebebrand and James "Tip"
O'Neill, and the various miscellaneous leads contained in the file at Cleveland are as follows:

A tap is to be arranged on the telephone of Edith Barry at Toledo, Ohio, and an apartment rented for this purpose. This apartment can then be used as a sort of headquarters for two Agents, who can also cover various leads at Toledo. If necessary, in establishing this tap, the Chicago office will have Agent J. E. Jones proceed to Toledo, Chio for this purpose.

To should follow closely the tenson Hebebrand and O'Neill in order to be advised, if possible, when end if they oven a new gambling establishment, as it is believed that by certain action which can be taken as to this gambling place, we can force the hand of Esbebrand by such pressure to have him jury in targle and Campbell.

With reference to the report from the Cincinnati office furnishing the names of certain former convicts released from the Ohio State Penitentiary, these should be very carefully worked out with the idea in mind if any of these parties can be used to advantage they should be degeloped as confidential informants; these parties should also be considered for their confidential informant value even though they might not be able to deliver in connection with this particular case.

A check should be made of the Silver Grill, 25th and Detroit, to determine who runs this place, and the possibility of establishing a telephone tap should be considered to this place. Incident to the work at Toledo, we should keep in close and develop any further possibilities calling to the attention particularly importation supplied by him to us as previously furnished by and as to which she would not disclose the details at the time of recent interview with her.

It is noted from the synopsis of this report that one George Felatico, alias John Hobil, reported to be a good friend of Keed, is presently residing at St. Augustine, Florida. From the details of the report it appears that one James Ja Knowles, a close friend of Kend, is reported to be at St. Augustine. There is nothing in the details of the report to indicate that Falatico is at St. Augustine.

It is suggested that the Philadelphia Office edvise this office which of these individuals is supposed to be in St. Augustine, and whether it is considered desirable that efforts be made to locate and interview that individual.

It is also suggested that, if investigation is desired in St. Augustine, efforts be made to obtain and furnish the Jacksonville Office with a photograph of the person to be interviewed.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: an old time confidence man, is now connected with a haberdashery at Daytona Beach, Florida, and is spending his time there. A. P. Askew, would be informant, not located at Deland, Florida, but advice obtained indicating he is unreliable and has poor reputation. Bruce Upshaw being prosecuted at Deland, Florida, for confidence swindle forfeited \$25,000.00 on 1-29-36 and whereabouts not known. Was treated by Dr. Haliday at West Pelm Beach, Florida, for heart trouble recently. Bureau letter of 1-22-36, and report of Punkett, Boston, Mass., 1-22-36. REFERENCE: Bureau letter of 1-22-36, and report of Special Agent P. M. AT DAYTONA BEACH, FLORIDA; Inquiry regarding William Elmer Mead was made at the Post Office in Daytona Beach, and also at Police Headquarters, without obtaining any information of value. Similar inquiry regarding Thomas O'Dell was made and nothing definite as to his whereabouts was ascertained at Daytona Beach. Agent did learn however, that one Joseph Osborne, who operates the Osborne Hotel at 215 Orange Avenue at Daytona Beach, has been cooperating with Postal Inspector Graham of New York in his efforts to run down confidence men, including Elmer Mead. This advice was obtained from Postmaster C. H. Talton.

It was also learned that Mr. Osborne, for several years past, has been eagerly checking information on confidence men hereabouts, and in fact this has been one of his hobbies or sidelines. He is reported to have pictures of a number of them, and also has taken upon himself, while passing about the city and seeing any of them, or individuals suspected as being confidence men, to snap a photograph of them and keep it for future reference. It seems he has carried this to the extent that any stranger appearing in Daytona Beach, who could not be accounted for, is suspected of being a confidence man.

Notwithstanding this, however, it is Agent's opinion that Mr. Osborne would be a good contact for the Jacksonville Office to promote, and while Agent was not able to locate him in town on the date of this investigation, it is expected that he will be contacted and his assistance enlisted at a very early date.

AT DELAND, FLORIDA:

In a conversation with Sheriff S. E. Stone at this place, he informed Agent that Bruce Upshaw, an old time confidence man, was about to be prosecuted in the local state court in connection with a swindle perpetrated several years ago on a Northern Tourist. Thomas O'Dell has been prosecuted in this same case and now is at liberty.

Upshaw was at liberty under a \$25,000.00 bond, and a few days before his case was to be called he sent an affidavit to the County.

Prosecutor, signed by Dr. John Haliday, with offices in the McGinley Building, West Palm Beach, Florida, which affidavit certified that Dr. Haliday had been treating Upshaw for heart trouble, which was in advanced stages.

Sheriff Stone says that it is his information that Dr. Haliday is a reputable and ethical physician, who would have no part in harboring criminals or assisting them; and that on January 29, 1936, when Upshaw's case was called and he failed to put in his appearance the Court ordered his \$25,000.00 bond forfeited, and issued a capies for him.

Sheriff Stone has made every effort within his power to locate Upshaw, and is now satisfied that he has absconded from these parts, and does not intend to face the charge against him.

Sheriff Stone does not have any information that Upshaw or Thomas O'Dell have been associating with Elmer Mead. He does have information, however, that Thomas O'Dell at the present time, has a one half interest in a haberdashery store at Daytona Beach, located on the main street, on the beach side of the city; further that O'Dell is at the present time staying around Daytona Beach and this particular store.

In the hope of locating Upshaw, Sheriff Stone has arranged through some confidential source, which he would not disclose to Agent, to have an eye kept on O'Dell at Daytona Beach in the belief that Upshaw might possibly put in appearance there. Nothing has resulted from this direction up to the present time.

In conclusion it may be stated that Agent was definitely assured by Sheriff Stone that should he receive any information which might assist us in locating Mead, he would communicate it to us immediately, and in turn he earnestly solicits any assistance the Bureau can give him in connection with locating Upshaw.

Photograph of Upshaw was supplied Agent by Sheriff Stone, which photograph had been obtained by the Sheriff from the State Police, Commonwealth Pier, Boston. This photograph is being submitted to the Bureau with the request that copies of same be made to be distributed to such offices as the Bureau may deem necessary on the theory that Upshaw is likely either to contact Mead or to be able to supply some information about him.

Regarding A. P. Askew, who called at the Jacksonville Bureau Office several weeks ago, stating that he was some sort of a detective, and that he had information that O'Dell was in Daytona Beach, Agent made an effort to locate and interview Askew.

It was ascertained from Sheriff Stone that Askew has, for some time past, held himself out as a sort of private detective and informant; that he has never given any information yet of value to the Sheriff, and that it is understood he has contacted the narcotic Agents at Jacksonville, purporting to supply them with information, but it is not believed that anything of value was ever reported by this man.

Sheriff Stone states that Askew in his opinion is entirely unreliable and probably not honest. He has been arrested several times for writing worthless checks. He has no particular occupation, and his parents

who reside some ten miles from Deland, have refused to come to his assistance any further in connection with his writing of bad checks.

Askew does not stay at home, but frequents cheap hotels in Deland when he is here. At the present time he has a room at the Athens Hotel in Deland. On inquiry there it was found that he had not been around for sometime, and that his whereabouts were not known, although it was reported that he had been in the city that day.

Accompanied by the son of the proprietor of this Hotel, Agent made a tour of the city of Deland, and tried to locate Askew, but without any success.

INDEVELOPED LEADS

THE JACKSONVILLE OFFICE at Daytona Beach, Florida, will interview and try to establish as a contact, Mr. Joseph Osborne, who operates the Osborne Hotel at 215 Orange Avenue, and enlist his assistance in locating William Elmer Mead; also Thomas O'Dell. If O'Dell can be located at his haberdashery on the Beach, he will also be interviewed regarding Mead and Upshaw to learn whether he has any idea of the whereabouts of either.

At West Palm Beach, Florida, will interview Dr. John Heliday in the McGinley Building, for any information he may have regarding Upshaw's health and whereabouts.


