I saw them at breakfast at the Hot Springs Confectionary around 7:30 in the morning - I personally know some of them, but none of them said anything to me. I figured they were up to something - that's the way those guys operate.

You know, I had a clash with Hoover on that Karpis raid that those fellows made last April - a whole bunch of them came into town and almost burned up Woodcock's place. I told them that I didn't like them sneaking into town like that without letting anyone know Christ sake, we could have gone out there and tangled with them, and some of us or them might have been killed - that's what every police department in the country is bitching about - Look what they did in New York - they almost got a couple of five men killed - they shot this apartment full of lead and then threw

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in some tear gas and set the place on fire.
The New York police raised plenty hell
about it. (at this point someone apparently
by entered the room, as agent heard others
introduce Mrs. Lewis to Sheriff Ellis)

At this juncture the operator plugged in
and advised that Rogers Landing doesn't answer.
