MEMORANDUM FOR INSPECTOR E. J. CONNELLEY:

Re: Brekid.

On January 8, 1937 the Garland Grand Jury met to probe the death of John Dickson, a city prisoner, who died in the New Park Hospital on December 24, 1936. John Dickson died of what physicians said was pneumonia, but his father, James Dickson, charged that his son had been mistreated while confined in the Hot Springs City Jail. An autopsy, instigated by Attorney Scott Wood who was retained by the elder Dickson, revealed that young Dickson had suffered terrible injuries and apparently had been tortured.

The following conversations and investigation reveal a possible "fixing" of the jury in this case by Municipal Judge Verne S. Ledgerwood.

This conversation over telephone #125 was overheard by the writer:

4:55 P.M. (1/4/37) - Incoming on #125

Ledgerwood: Is Dutch there

Akers: Hello -

Ledgerwood: This is Verne - do you know the two colored fellows who are on that jury - one's name is Page.

Akers: Yes -

Ledgerwood: I wish you would contact them and tell them to I want to see them in front of the City Hall at 8:30 in the morning.


Akers: O. K. Judge.

* * *

The local newspapers disclosed that Will Page and E. I. Puckett are the two colored persons on the Garland County grand Jury.

At approximately 4:40 P.M. Special Agent H. A. Snow observed "Dutch" Akers in the police Oldsmobile Sedan drive towards the negro section of Hot Springs.

At 4:53 P.M. a man called in over telephone #446 and asked to speak to Akers. Jailer Tucker advised that he was out just then.



It might be stated at this point that on January 2, 1937, Mayor Leo P. McLaughlin suspended Chief of Police Joe Wakelin, Lt. Ceciml Brock, Day Captain Arch Cooper, and Detective Glynn Buchanan, pending investigation of the charges made by the elder Dickson in that his son had been mistreated while confined in the Hot Springs City Jail.

It might also be stated that it was learned that Chief of Police Joe Wake-line is a brother-in-law of Municipal Verne S. Ledgerwood, the former having married Ledgerwood's sister.

The following observations were had by the writer on the morning of January 5, 1937:

8:10 A.M. - Agent saw "Dutch" Akers in "Jim and George's" Restaurant on Central Avenue.

8:15 A.M. Akers was called to the telephone, and thereafter he left the said restaurant.

8:18 A.M. - Agent observed Akers talking with a dark complexioned man carrying a cane in front of Spencer's Cigar Store. The Police Oldsmobile Sedan was observed parked close by.

8:25 A.M. - Agent observed a short, stocky colored man, wearing a dark overcoat, blue suit, and horn-rimmed glasses try to gain entrance into the City Hall. The doors were apparently closed. Agent then observed this colored man walk across the street and stand in front of the Rock Island Railroad Depot being visible to anyone at the City Hall.

8:26 A.M. Agent observed another colored man cross Benton Street at the City Hall and greet first colored man by shaking hands. The second party was approximately 5'11" tall, 175-140 lbs., wore a dark overcoat, tan hat, and had gold-rimmed glasses.

8:26 A.M. Both colored men remained standing in front of Rock Island Railroad Depot, being visible to anyone at the City Hall.

8:35 A.M.

8:32 A.M. Agent observed "Dutch" Akers and a second party (believed to be Judge Ledgerwood) drove by Post Office, agent's point of surveillance, and then back into the driveway between the City Fire Department and the Chamber of Commerce Building. This driveway leads to the City Jail.

8:35 A.M. Agent observed Judge Ledgerwood walk across Benton Street from the City Hall to the Rock Island Railroad Depot, and greet the shorter of the two colored men. Thereafter agent observed this colored man and Judge Ledgerwood walk to the rear of the Depot. None of the parties were visible to anyone at the City Hall, nor were they visible to agent who was still maintaining the surveillance from the steps of the Post Office.

8:35 A.M.
to - Judge Ledgerwood talked with both colored men in rear of Rock
8:42 A.M. Island Depot for approximately seven minutes, none of which could
be overheard by agent.
8:42 A.M. - Agent observed Judge Ledgerwood cross Benton Street and enter
City Hall.
8:43 A.M. Agent observed the two colored men, described above, walk west
on platform in back of Rock Island Depot towards Central Avenue.
8:45 A.M.
to Agent followed the two colored men who were walking and talking
8:50 A.M. together, to the Garland County Court House on Ouachita Street.
8:55 A.M. Agent observed the two colored men enter the Grand Jury Room on
the third floor of the Court House.

* * * * *

Agent will be able to identify the two colored men and Judge Verne S. Led-
gerwood should the same ever become necessary.

On January 6, 1957 the Garland County Grand Jury made the following report
to the Honorable Circuit Judge Earl Witt:

"We have been in session three days investigating the circumstances sur-
rounding the death of one John Dickson. We have heard 38 witnesses, and
have endeavored to develop every particle of evidence that would have any
bearing upon the death of John Dickson, a prisoner in the city jail re-
cently. We have called upon every person who might have any testimony
or who might know of any one who might have some information that would
tend to throw light on the investigation.

We have returned true bills in cases of seven defendants whom we believe
under the testimony developed during our investigation should face trial
in connection with the death of Dickson.

During our investigation we found no evidence to connect Chief of Police
Joe Wakelin with the actual mistreatment of any prisoner, but the evidence
revealed by our investigation leads us to believe that should Chief Wake-
lin have exercised a more dominant control over the officers under him such
circumstances as those revealed in the Dickson case and other cases of al-
leged mistreatment of prisoners, would not have existed.

We, the members of the grand jury, strongly condemn any type of brutal so-
called "third Degree" methods used upon prisoners. Such practices tend
to destroy the credibility of the evidence of officers in criminal trials,
aside from being inhuman and which no civilized community should tolerate.

We deeply appreciate the helpful co-operation of the mayor, the sheriff's office, the municipal judge, and the circuit judge in our investigation of the Dickson case." (Signed)

Indictments charging second degree murder were returned against the following police officers:

Captain L. A. (Arch) Cooper
Captain R. L. (Bob) Moore
Lieutenant Cecil Brock,
Detective Glynn Buchanan,
Patrolman Press Griffin,
Patrolman Joe Scott,
Patrolman Andrew Irwin.

All of the above members of the police department immediately surrendered themselves at the Sheriff's Office and were released under a \$1500.00 bond.

Several hours after the Grand Jury made its return as to these individuals, Mayor Leo P. McLaughlin discharged each and everyone from the Hot Springs Police Department, and issued the statement that they will never be ~~remembered~~ again connected with the city's administration during his term of office.

As the subsequent telephone logs will indicate, none of the above discharged police officers are apparently much concerned over their predicament. Several of them have been overheard to say that there isn't anything to the ~~new~~ charges made against them.

The Mayor has as yet made no definite statement concerning whether he will re-instate Chief Joe Wakelin on the police force.

Although this is not definitely known, it is believed that the Mayor's action in suspending the four named police officers is merely a political gesture, and that nothing further will ever be done concerning the seven officers indicted. Recently there appeared a news article in the local newspaper to the effect that a member of the Arkansas Legislature, since identified as Rev. Lee Nichols of Logan County, will introduce in the next legislature a resolution providing for a committee to investigate conditions in Hot Springs, particularly the John Dickson case, the Luciano case, and the recent democratic state primary in which Garland county gave top heavy favorites to those candidates who had the endorsement of the Hot Springs City Administration.

With reference to the above resolution the following conversations were overheard, and speak for themselves:

11:21 A.M. (1/8/57) - Incoming over Mayor's phone J.L.M.

Grady Manning of Little Rock called long distance for Mayor McLaughlin.

Manning: You asked me the other day about this fellow Nichols - and I said that he was a reasonable fellow. Well, I'll retract that statement. He's got a resolution drawn up about six or seven pages long. The Speaker of the House let me read it, and the things it recites in there are awful. I can't believe them. I wish that you and I and Jim Campbell can get together, and discuss how we should handle this situation.

Mayor : That thing was written in Hot Springs. I got wind of it a couple days ago. Joe Denby who lost the Circuit Judgeship in the next county, this fellow Nichols, and Scott Wood collaborated on it.

Manning : It would leave an awful bad taste if this thing were introduced. It mentions a lot of names, and ~~xxxxxx~~ cites many instances of alleged corruption that I don't believe are true. If the newspapers get a hold of it, they'll blast the hell out of us down there, even if that damn thing isn't introduced.

Mayor : Can't we discourage the introduction of it in some way.

Manning: That's what I want you down here for. Bransford is our friend and he let me read the paper.

Mayor : Can't we get the head man to drop it. He's here, you know.

Manning: That's what I want to discuss with you - how to proceed on it. I would suggest that you and I and Campbell talk to John (Bransford) about this. Better come over this afternoon or tomorrow.

Mayor: Will you be able to have Jim and John there?

Manning: John is here all the time, and Jim said he'll stay until tomorrow.

Mayor: All right Grady, I'll be over there around three or four this afternoon.

Manning: That's fine. I'll round up John and Campbell, and we'll be all set when you get here.

* * * * *

For your information Grady Manning is President of the Southwest Hotel Corporation and is located at the Marion Hotel in Little Rock, Arkansas. The Majestic and Kingsay Hotels in Hot Springs are owned and controlled by this corporation. John Bransford is the designate-speaker of the Arkansas State House of Representatives, and Jim Campbell is a local attorney in Hot Springs.

The following conversation was overheard on January 8, 1957:

11:50 A.M. (1/8/57) - Incoming over #688

G.R.M.

Grady Manning called long distance for Mayor McLaughlin from Little Rock, Arkansas.

Manning: Leo, I had a talk with that fellow and everything was very satisfactory. He said that only we two would know about it.

Mayor: Yeah, well that's fine.

Manning: I think you did a fine bit of work, and I'm glad you came over yesterday.

Mayor: Joe and Raymond said they would get in touch with me this morning.

* * * * *

It is not known exactly just who Joe and Raymond are, but it is believed that "Joe" might be Joe Schneider, a close personal friend of the Mayor's, and "Raymond" might be Raymond Robsamen of Little Rock. The Mayor place a call for him at Little Rock at noon on January 8, 1957, but he was not in.
