



I, WILLIAM OWEN ROBERTS, being first fully advised that any statement that I may make will be used against me, do make the following statement of my own free will and without any force or duress being used against me.

I was born at St. Michaels, Marland in 1879. I was married for about a period of two years to Edith Miles, but don't know on what year the ceremony was performed. We separated and since that time, which is about twenty five years ago, I have not seen Edith and have been living by myself mostly in rooming houses.

I live at 1110 Commodore Ave., Atlantic City, New Jersey, having moved the e about the first of this year. Before that I lived at 105 Pennsylvania Ave. I am a bell boy at the DANMORE HOTEL statting work there about the last week in September of 1934. I am paid five dollars a week and whatever tips that can make.

I work the night shift at the hotel and come to work at seven in the evening and leave at seven or seven thirty in the morning depending on whenever the day bell boy, GRAT BONEY, relieves me. In addition, Mr. Young, the manager, stays at the hotel until the last train comes in which is about one ten in the morning. Sometimes he stays until three or four in the morning and then again he may leave at about nine or ten. When he is away in the early morning hours, I would check in any guests and assign rooms. Then when the manager comes in the morning he would take over his duties.

As far as I can recall, GRAT, the day bell boy, roomed the two women who occupied room 400. I think they came in on Friday. It is customary for each of us to tell the other how many guests we have roomed during our shift and what rooms they occupy. In the morning when I relieved GRAT, he told me that he roomed two women in room 400. He did not describe them to me and he did not tell me their names.

About three or four in the morning of the nineteenth two men came in. They left their car outside, came in to talk with the manager who was there at the time and engaged in the usual conversation as to rates and accomodations. I went out and got their luggage and took out of the back of the car three dark brown Gladstone bags; one of these bags was heavier than the rest and I judged it to weigh between fifty and sixty pounds. I did not pay any particular attention to the car but did notice that it was a dark sedan. Mr Young called a garage and an attendant came over and put the car in the garage. I took these men up on the elevator, opened the toom, 403, and carried their bags in. One of the men asked me to get him some whiskey. I went across the street to the saloon by tavern where Mr Ford is manager and bought a bottle of whiskey for two dollars. I brought the bottle back and charged the man what I paid for the whiskey.

me gave me a quarter tip and then I left. This man was about five feet ten inches in height was of a thin build and had a long narrow face. I did not see these men for the rest of the morning and did not have a ring from them or from the women in room 400. When I was relieved by GRAT a little after eight in the morning, I told him that I had roomed two men in 403.

When came to work on the morning of the twentieth I talked with GRAT about heating the hotel; no mention was made of any of the guests in room 400 or in 403. I made several trips to the fourth floor on the night of thenineteenth and saw a light in room 400 through the transom. put the lights out on the fourth floor about one thirty in the morning of the twentieth. At that time i did not notice any lights in either room 400 or in 403. After that did not go up to the fourth floor again.

When am waiting for a call or to carry some bags usuallu sit down near the desk or wlak over to the windows at the front of the hotel. From the chair can see anybody coming in or going out of the hotel and can see anybody going down the stairs.

Early this corning, I dont know the exact time, five men of the law came in. They were dressed in civilian clothes and two of them had on uniforms, one of them having leggings and a short coat with a badge on his cap. I dont distinctly recall what the other one had on. I thought they were guests and walked over to the desk. One of the law asked me who was in charge and I thid him I was at the present time. They asked me if there were any people registered from Florida. I told them I did not know. Then some one asked me if there was a pregnant woman in the hotel and I thid him that I did not know that either. Then called Mr Morley on the room phone and he came down in about four minutes. he had on a bath robe over a pair of pajamas.

After ir Morley came down I walked over to the window and then later sat down near the desk. I did not hear any of the conversation. While they were talking, irs Morley called down on the room phone and asked me to tell-ir Morley to come upt to bed. I told him this and after a short while he went up stairs.

Then two of the law went outside to their car and stay ed ther about half an hour. The other three stayed in the lobby talking. After half an hour the two who had gone outside came back in again and all five of them made a few remarksand then one of them made several telephone calls which I think were made to the police headquarters. After a short while one of the law brought me over to the police station and questioned me about the two men who were in room 403. After about a quarter of an hour we went back to the hotel. Before I had left the hotel I called Mr Morley so he could be down on duty. He was there when the law and I got back to the hotel. The law asked for the names of the men in room 403 and he gave them. Then all of the law

H.O.R

walked upstairs. I stayed down stairs and went to the back of the building and shook the furnace. I stayed there about three minutes and then left. On the way back I heard three shots in rapid succession. There may have been more shots thatn that but I was sure that I heard three and they were very quick and all had the same sound. I ran into one of the side room, 106, closed the door and leaned up against the side of the wall. While was in the room I heard footsteps of about four or five people who seemed to be walking or running quickly toward the steps. Soon after that I peeked out of the door and heard some body in the lobby. I saw Mr Lynch, the guest in room 100, two fine of the law and Mr Morley. Then after that the lobby filled up with guests.

In about half an hour the two women who occupied room 400 entered the hotal and I took them up to the fourth floor. I noticedone of them had some bllood on her right foot. Then I came down in the elevator and must have waited about five minutes or even ten minutes and then took two of the law up to the fourth floor.

A doctor had been called to look after one of the girls and he must have called an ambulance. I went up on the elevator and took down a woman on a stretcher with two of the law and another person who itsemmed was the doctor. The girl was taken away in the ambulance. The other girl was already down in the lobby and she was taken away in the patrol. Shortly after that the law came down stairs carrying three bags which looked like the ones I had taken up to room 403.

BONEY came in about eight oclock in the morning and asked me what had happened. I repleid that did not know; I wanted to get home and get some sleep. I did not talk about this matter from the time I left the hotel until being questioned

I have read the following statement consisting of three typewritten pages and know the same to be true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

I have forgotten something which I wish to add to what have already said. After the law came back with me to the hotel and they asked r. Morley how to get to room 403, one of them said to come up with them and show them the room. Mr. Morley told me to go up with them. I led the way up the stairs and when I got to the landing on the third floorand was about to go up to the fourth floor, I noticed a light and got scared. I stepped aside and let the law go up and then I hurried down. When the law first came in the hotel I was scared, but when I was going up the stairs and saw the light I became greatly fright ened.

I, D.B.Sutton, freely and voluntarily make the following signed statement to F.M.Stone and J.W.Going, Special Agents, Division of Investigation, U.S.Department of Justice.

As near as I can remember, Joe Adams phoned on December 22,1934 stating that someone in his office wanted to buy a Christmas present and asked if I would send up a selection. for them to choose from. Mrs. Sutton selected a dozen pieces from our stock and these pieces were delivered to a messenger that Joe sent to the store. This messenger brought a card signed by Mr. Adams and the said signature was identified by both myself and Mrs. Sutton. I do not have the card in my possession now and it has probably been destroyed.

Later the messenger returned all of the jewelry except two pieces and brought with him cash for the two pieces which were kept. The pieces kept were a platinum bar pin #2680 valued at \$175.00 and one diamond bar pin #809 valued at \$85.00

While the jewelry was out of the store Mr. Adams called a second time and stated that the parties had selected two two pieces but the price was a little more than they wanted to pay and asked me if I could reduce it any. I told Mr Adams that I thought the price was very reasonable but if it would help to make the sale I would reduce the price on pin #2680 from \$200.00 to \$175.00 and on pin #809 from \$100.00 to \$85.00.







I. DOLORES De LANRY, make the following signed statement to D. P. Sullivan and John L. Medala, whom I know to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. This statement is entirely voluntary and no promises or threats have been made to me.

I am twenty years of age and was born in Aberdeen, South Dakota. I have three sisters, Frances, Helen, and Margaret, and one brother named Robert. My father's name is James De Lancy, and my mother's name before her marriage was Helen O'Donnell. They have now been separated for the past ten years. I attended grade school in Saint Paul, Minnesota, and discontinued my education when I was in my third year is high school in Chicago, Illinois. I thereafter proceeded to here I worked at various places. I thereafter proceeded to saint Paul, Minnesota, and lived with my sister Helen, who is the wife of Pat Reilly, until May of 1933.

I first met HARRY SAWYER either in 1929 or 1950 through Pat Reilly, who at that time was working for HARRY SAWYER at Sawyer's eigar store on Wabasha Street. I saw him frequently at this store when I stopped in to see Pat Reilly. During my acqueintanceship with HARRY SAWYER I very often During my acqueintanceship with HARRY SAWYER I very often referred to him as "Sea Lion", and I believe that Pat Reilly is the person who gave him that name.

During 1932 and the early part of 1933 I kept company with Clarence DuVol, who is the brother of Lawrence DuVol, who is presently serving a life sentence in the Minnesota State Penitentiary at Stillwater, Minnesota. In Minnesota State Clarence DuVol was arrested by the St. Paul March 1933 after Clarence DuVol was arrested by the St. Paul Police Department for participation in the robbery of the Police Department for participation in the robbery of the Police Department for participation in the robbery of the Interested Burnesota, I appeared Third Northwestern Bank of Minnesota, Minnesota, I appeared in the State Court as one of his witnesses, testifying to the fact that he was in my company at the time the bank was the fact that he was in my company at the time the bank was on this sharge.

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I first met ALVIN KARPIS in Saint Paul, Minnesota during the early part of May 1933 at the Hollyhocks Inn. I met him as "Ray", no last name given at this time. He was with someone whom I do not know, and a few days later I saw him again outside of the Plantation Club in Saint Paul, ALVIN KARPIS at this time merely modded his head to me. I thereafter on this occasion I associated with him and told him that I was going to Chicago, Illinois, in the next few days. I gave him my address in Chicago and at this time we made an appointment for him to meet me in Chicago in a few weeks.

Around the latter part of May 1935 I proceeded to Chicago, Illinois, to visit my sister Margaret, who is also known under the name of Jean. At that time she was living in an apartment located on the South Side of Chicago, Illinois. One day as I left the apartment I met ALVIN KARPIS in an automobile near my home. He was coming up to see me at this time and was driving a Graham-Paige automobile. Upon recognizing him I entered his automobile and we thereupon drove about Chicago, Illinois, for the remainder of the day.

I was in his constant company for several weeks thereafter, and at his suggestion I went to live with him as man and wife in a furnished apartment which he had rented at River Forest, Illinois, the address of which I do not know. To my recollection this apartment house is located on the first street south of Lake Street near the 8000 West block. The building is a large three or four story brick structure with several entrances and a large lawn in front of it. ALVIN was living at this place under the name of MAYES. When I went to live with ALVIN KARPIS he told me that he was working for some cutomobile agency as a salesman and that he at one time resided in Saint Paul, Minnesota.

We lived at his apartment in River Forest, Illinois, for about a month, during which time he made two or three trips, staying away possibly three or four days at a time. The first time, as I recall, he stayed away for possibly four days and when he returned he brought a man and woman with him whom he introduced as Freddie and Paula, and whom I now know as FRED BARKER and PAULA HARSON.

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PAULA lived with us for three days at this time and it is my understanding that FREDDIR was living with his mother, who I later learned had an apartment in Oak Park.

Illinois, as I recall on the day PAULA left FRED BARKER came after her and they thereafter moved to a place on a lake somewhere in Illinois, the exact location I do not know. When PAULA left she told me that she would invite me to their place on this lake HARMON left our spartment in River Forest, Illinois, ALVIN KARPIS mobile with me. I recall he left alone in a taxi on this occasion. He remained away for possibly four days on this trip.

I also desire to state that while living at Hiver Forest, Illinois, we frequently ate at a place I believe is called the Rainbow Inm, and which I believe was a barbeque stand. Across the street from this place was located another barbeque stand with the name Hayes on the front of it. I distinctly recall this place with as ALVIN KARPIS and I were at that time living is Biver Percent Illinois, under the name of HAYER as stated above. We also frequently visited a dime and dence place which is lected approximately thirty miles from Chicago, and it is possible that this is Louis Cornocky's place in Fox River Grove, Illinois, The only persons I recall meeting at this place are JESS DOYLE and his wife Doris. There were several other of ALVIN'S friends there, the identities of whom I do not now recalls.

Also while living at River Forest, Illinois, ALVIN and I made an automobile trip to Saint Paul, Minnesota, He told me before leaving that he was going through Saint Paul, Minnesota, and that if I desired I could go with him as far as Saint Paul and visit with my people. Upon arriving in Saint Paul, Minnesota, I registered at the St. Francis Hotel under the name of MRS. HAYES. While in this city I visited with my sister Helen and Pat Reilly and at this time told Helen that I had merried some automobile salesman at Chicago, Illinois. I endeavored to see my mother on this trip and learned that she was out of the city, and therefor did not see her. I also saw HARRY SAWYER at this time while I was visiting with Pat Reilly at Sawyer's saloon. I returned to Chicago, Illinois, by train several days later and upon arriving at my apartment in River Forest, Illinois, ALVIN KARPIS was there, having previously returned from his trip.

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During the latter part of June 1935 Alvin KARPIS and I moved to the Country Club Hotel at \$950 South Shore Driv Chicago, Illinois, registering there under the name of LOHMAN. We lived in this apartment for possibly ten days and did not have any visitors during this period. About a week or so later ALVIN MARPIS and I moved to a beautiful summer home at Long Beach, Indiana, which I believe is comed by a man known to me as Konvalinka, ALVIN and I lived at this summer home for approximate ly two months, and on one occasion during the middle part of July 1935 I noticed ALVIN KARPIS' picture in a newspaper identifying him as a suspect in the Kansas City Massacree I exhibited this photograph and newspaper article to ALVIN and maked him if it were true. He admitted his identity but denied that he was involved in that erime, stating however that he had done a few little things, none of which he described. This is the first knowledge I had of ALVIN KARPIS' true identity, and as a result thereof a quarrel between us arose and he told me at that time if I desired to leave him he would give me some me go where I desired. However, because of my affection for him refused to leave.

While living at Long Beach, Indiana, ALVIN KARPIS and I were visited on two occasions by FRED GOETZ, whom I only knew as George, his wife Irene, and a little boy called Bobby. FRED BARKER and PAULA HARMON also visited us on one or two occasions while at this place. On another occasion FRED GOETZ and his wife Irene, and ERYAN BOLTON, his wife and two children, whom I at that time knew as the CARTERS, were our guests for three days.

On or about September 1, 1933 ALVIN KARPIS and I moved from this home at Long Beach, Indiana, to the Country Club Hotel in Chicago, Illinois, where we again registered under the name of WILLIAM LOHMAN and wife. On the day we left Long Beach, ALVIN KARPIS left me that morning for Chicago, Illinois, and returned in the evening in company with DOC BARKER, whom ALVIN introduced as "DOC" and as the brother of FREDDIE BARKER. I recall that he accompanied us to the Country Club Hotel and shortly thereafter he left for an unknown destination.

while living at the Country Club Hotel during this period we were visited by HARRY SAWYER, his wife Gladys, and their daughter Francine. I judge this to be around the middle of September of 1933, and they lived with us for approximately,

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one week. I wish to state that this is the first intimation I had that ALVIN KARPIS and HARRY SAWYER were known to each other. Upon seeing HARRY SAWYER I naturally asked him about Pat Reilly and my sister, and he replied that they were all right.

while HARRY and GLADYS SAWYER were living with us I spent most of my time with Gladys and Francine visiting the Worlds Fair, going to movies, and doing shopping. On one or two occasions upon our return to the apartment the condition of it indicated that there had been some visitors there, although I never did see anyone else other than ALVIM KARPIS and HARRY SAWYER there on these occasions. As stated above, HARRY and GLADYS SAWYER and Francine, lived with us for approximately a week and thereafter the SAWYERS obtained an apartment in the same hotel, either on the same floor or the floor above us under a name I do not recall. I never visited than at their apartment, although Gladys Sawyer and I continued to shop and travel in Chicago together. As I recall, the SAWYERS lived in this apartment for about one week and I do not have any knowledge of any visiters which they might have had.

On or about September 25, 1933 ALVIN KARPIN and myself left for Reno, Nevada, in his Dodge Sedan. We did not pass through Seins Paul, Minnesota, on this trip but drove direct to Reno, Nevada, arriving there three days after our departure. We registered into the Anderson Hotel under the name of either BURNS or LOHMAN, at which hotel we stayed approximately one week. We knew no one at this hotel, nor did we see any of ALVIN'S friends at this time. I this hotel, nor did we see any of ALVIN'S friends at this time. Around this period ALVIN KARPIS and myself drove to San Francisco, California, and checked into the William Taylor Hotel under the name, I believe, of LOHMAN. While in San Francisco for alvin purchased an Auburn Sedam. We stayed in San Francisco for two days and visited various taverns, the addresses of which I do not know, with the exception of one place which ALVIN and I visited not know, with the exception of one place which ALVIN and I visited more frequently than the others and which is located about two blocks around the corner from the William Taylor Hotel. It appeared that ALVIN was well acquainted there. We returned to Reno, Navada, shortly thereafter in ALVIN'S new Anburn automobile and ment to live at Steamboat Springs, a health resort a few miles from Reno, live at Steamboat Springs, a health resort a few miles from Reno, while living at Steamboat Springs, and after we had been

there approximately one week, PAULA HARMON and WYNONA BURDETTS visited the Springs, where I met them. A day or so later, at ALVIN'S suggestion, PAULA and I drove to San Francisco, California, to pick up the registration card for the Auburn Sedan previously purchased by ALVIN and which was to be sent to the William Taylor Hotel. PAULA and I registered at the William Taylor Hotel and got the letter addressed to ALVIN under the name of LORMAN and left that same night to return to Reno, Nevada.

On or about November 2, 1955 we moved to the Alvada Apertments, and FREDDIE and PAULA, who had been living in an apartment the address of which I do not know, rented a place at the Belmont Apartments. While living in the Alvada Apartments ALVIN wanted to get someone to work for me but I told him that I would much rather do the housewheeping by myself. In our discussion about this matter ALVIN commented on the fact that the Japs were very good domestics, and at this time stated that he had a Jap working for him while he was living at white Bear Lake, Minnesota, and that he was entirely satisfied with him. From the conversation that followed I gained the impression that FREDDIE BARKER was living with him at this lake.

Also during the time I was living at the Alvada Apartments in Reno, Nevada, I met KDNA MURRAY, under the name of "Rabbits" at PAULA HARMON'S apartment. On one occasion VOLNKY DAVIS came to our place and asked for PAULA HARMON and FREDDIE BARKER. This was the only occasion I met VOLNKY DAVIS while living in Reno, Nevada. I likewise saw DOC BARKER on several occasions during this period although I de not know where he was living. HARRY CAMPHELL and WYNONA EURDETTE were also living in Reno at this time, the exact address I do not know.

ALVIN and I frequently went to various taverns and night clubs with FRED BARKER and PAULA HARMON, and the places I recall we visited were The Town Club, The Tavern, The Bank Club, and a small night club which is located on the road between Reno and Steamboat Springs, Nevada, We usually made the rounds of all four of them when we went out, and it appeared that the boys had been to these places sometime previous as they appeared to be quite friendly with the employees there.

Shortly after we moved into the Alvada Apartments FRED and DOC BARKER left for an unknown destination. ALVIN KARPIS and I a day or so later drove to Las Vegas, Nevada, and on the outskirts of town, and purely by chance, we met DOC and FRED BARKER, who were perked at a barbecus stand. All four of us checked into the best hotel in town, which I believe is the Sal Sagev. That same afternoon the four of us went to visit the dam sutside of Las Vegas which was then under sen-

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struction. On the following morning DOC and FRED BARKER left Las Yegas and I do not know where they were going. However, ALVIN and I stayed in Las Yegas for three or four days more and then we drove to Los Angeles, California, and checked into the Roselya Hotel under an alias which I do not recall. We remained in Los Angeles for two days and it appeared that ALVIN KARPIS was waiting for a message from some person inaxmuch as he did not leave the hotel at any time while we were living there. He apparently did not receive this message, and although he did not make any remark not receive this message, and although he did not make any remark in connection therewith, I observed that he was somewhat perturbed because of ite We did not go anywhere nor did we see anyone while in Los Angeles, California, and at the end of two days ALVIN and I returned to Reno, Nevadae

on or about December 2, 1955 DOC BARKER, ALVIN KARPIS, and myself left Reno, Mevada, in our Anburn Sedan and drove to Chicago, Illinois, arriving on or about December 5, 1955. ALVIN and I checked into the Orlando Hotel, and after we carried our baggage to our room ALVIN left with DOC BARKER and shortly there after ALVIN returned by himself. I do not know where the rest of after ALVIN returned by himself. Thereafter we visited a tavern in a small town, the location of which I do not know, where Harrison was acquainted with most of the customers and employees, and after remaining an hour or so we returned to the Southmoor Hotel. The following day I spent almost the entire day at Mother Barker's apartment, and Harrison called for me at approximately 4:00 P.Me

Willie then drove me out on the West Side of Chicago to an apartment located on or near Washington Boulevard, where he

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picked up BRYAN BOLTON. The three of us then drove out to Cicero, Illinois, to a furniture store, the location of which I do not now recall. BOLTON went in and returned a few minutes later and stated that he had arranged for somebody to deliver a package to our apartment at 7135 Yates Avenue for the purpose of learning whether the apartment was being watched.

We then left BOLTON off at his apartment and Willie drove me to the vicinity of Vlst and South Shore Drive, where he swaited in a drug store. About a half hour later Willie returned and told me that it would be safe for me to go to my apartment, which I did. After packing we proceeded straightway to Toledo.

Upon arriving at Toledo, Ohio, we went direct to FRED BARKER'S apartment where PAULA and I found FRED and ALVIN, and that same afternoon Willie Herrison essisted ALVIN and myself in obtaining an apartment at the Jarvie Apartments approximately April 10, 1934 and we lived here under the miray M. BEAULKY and wife. Emption did need of the case the luggage inasmuch as ALVIE was still recuperating from operation and could not handle any of the baggage. While living at the Jervis Apartments DOC BARKER stayed with us for three or four days, and after about two weeks later EDNA MURRAY and VOLNEY DAVIS likewise moved into the apartment. YOLNEY DAVIS at this time had been operated on, and although his fingertips were not bandaged; his fingers were still sore and tender. VOLNEY and EDNA remained for two or three days, during which time EDNA MURRAY located an apartment in Toledo. I recall that one evening during this time VOLNEY DAVIS, JIMMIE WILSON, OILIE BERG, DOC BARKER and ALVIN KARPIS had dinner in the apartment. This was the first and only time I BOW OLLIE BERG.

After locating an apartment, the location of which I do not know, VOINKY, KNNA, and DOC then moved from our apartments. I recall that ALVIN and myself visited the Casino Club on four or five occasions. We talked with people working in the Club, and I recall meeting two brothers who either worked there or who were recall meeting two brothers who either worked there or who were owners of the Club. Harmon, according to the Club I likewise saw on several occasions DOC BARKER, FRED BARKER, HARRY CAMPBELL, PAUIA HARMON, WILLIAM HARRISON, EUSTY GIBSOM, and probably wynona HURDETTE.

ALVIN KARPIS generally assumpanied me to the Club drank with the two brothers who were often present at the Club drank with

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members of the gang, and I likewise know that members of the gang frequently went riding in a boat on the lake; however, I do not know who was the owner of the boat.

About a month after moving into the Jarvis Apartments, on or about May 15, 1934, I made a trip to Chicago by plane to visit Mother Barker and to let her know that DOC and FRED BARKER were all right, FRED having intended visiting his mother but had been unable to do so. I stayed over night at the Southmoor Hotel, and visited MA BARKER, who was alone; spent that evening with her, and returned to Toledo alone the following day by plane.

Some time in the middle of May 1954 ALVIN KARPIS and I left Toledo, Ohio, and drove to Cleveland. The reason we left Toledo at this time was to get away from the crowd, inasmuch as everyone was moving into Toledo at this time, and also for the reason that I was in my first stages of pregnancy and ALVIM did not want them to know of my condition and likewise did not want me to know of my condition and likewise did not want me to make the mobe.

building which had a "For Rent" sign on the front of it. This place
I believe was on 159th Street immediately off of Euclid Avenue.
ALVIN drove past this place and told me to take a cab back to the
apartment house and inquire whether they had any apartments vacant,
which I did. I rented one and ALVIN and I immediately moved into
it, and inasmuch as the manager of the building did not ask us for
our name we did not give them any. We remained in this apartment
for approximately one month, and after a week or so from our
arrival in Cleveland, ALVIN KARPIS drove to Toledo, Chio, and returned with FRED BARKER and PAULA HARMON. They lived with us for
about three days at this time and then moved to another apartment
somewhere in Cleveland, the address of which I do not know. I
visited their apartment on only one occasion.

While living in Cleveland, Ohio, around this period I made a trip to Chicago, Illinois, by plane to pick up some mail at the post office which ALVIN KARPIS apparently expected to receive at General Delivery. Upon arriving at Chicago I proceeded direct to Mother Barker's apartment and visited with her for several hours. Mother Barker's apartment in proceeded to downtown Chicago to pick Mother Barker's apartment I proceeded to downtown Chicago to pick mail at the post office, and enroute I thought that two men were following me, and in order to lose them I made several trips around Chicago and finally Aid lose them in the Worlds Fair

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As a result of this observation I did not desire to pick up the mail at the post office, and that same evening I returned to Cleveland, Chio, by plane, Upon my return to Cleveland I told ALVIN KARPIS about my observations as above indicated, and he conjectured that they were police officers. I never returned to Chicago, Illinois, for the mail in question, and it is my belief that ALVIN sent someone else after its

ALVIN KARPIS at this time stated that he was going to rent an unfurnished apartment and he apparently did so Inaamuch as he took me out to visit it. This house was located on Flemings Street. I had purchased furniture for the house at various furniture stores in Cleveland, and about two weeks later had it delivered and ... we moved into the house. A few days after moving FRED BARKER visited the house, alone, and thereafter he visited us on several occasionse; On one occasion PAULA HARMON was with him

On or about June 1, 1984 ALVIN KARPIS dro-Cleveland Ertel, stating that he was going to need some met HARRY and GLADYS SAWYER and their little daughter Francisco HARRY SAWYER asked ALVIN what had been keeping him; that he had been waiting for him for two days at the hotel. After talking with them for a while ALVIN invited HARRY SAWYER, his wife Gladys and daughter Francine, to live with us until they located an apartment in Cleveland, Ohio. That same evening ALVIN KARPIS and HARRY SAWYER left and later Gladys, Francine, and I departed from the hotel and went to our home. HARRY and Gladys remained with us at our place over night, and on the following day PAULA HARMON came over, after which Gladys, Paula and myself proceeded to the Cleveland Hotel to check out the SAWYERS. At that time the floor clerk stated that a long distance telephone call from New York City had come to the hotel for MR. and MRS. FRANK JAMES during their absence, and that the party calling gave the room in which they were registered. Gladys remarked to Paula and myself that she could not understand who could have made this call because nobody knew where she and HARRY SAWYER were, and was greatly worried about this call, and in conversation with Paula and myself she mentioned the possibility that it might have been "The coppers" checking up on theme

We then took the baggage and made a roundabout trip to our home, figuring that we possibly might be followed, and when we arrived there we told HARRY SAWYER and ALVIN about the calle They

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both were very much worried concerning it. HARRY being especially so, and thereafter ALVIN went to a public telephone and called the long distance telephone operator, asking her whether anyone had called MR. JANES at the Cleveland Hotel. He was advised by the operator that she had no record of such a call. ALVIN told HARRY about this but he still was very much worried about the sall as he still insisted that no one knew that he and his wife were living in the Cleveland Hotel.

During the time HARRY and GLADYS SAWYER were living with us FRED BARKER and PAULA HARMON visited us on several occasions, and quite frequently HARRY, GLADYS, and ALVIN visited FREDDIE and PAULA at their apartment in Cleveland, the address of which I do not know. I did not visit their apartment during this period as I did not get along very well with PAULA and on the occasions HARRY, GLADYS, and ALVIN were away I remained at home with Francine.

If ying at our house I can recell that a large summer that alrest was broadcasting above the city. As it peaced over our house HARRY SAWYER looked up and stated that it was possible that there might have been "coppers" in the airplane, and actually seemed afraid that they might be looking down at him.

About the first part of July or the latter part of June 1934 ALVIN and myself moved into a house on West 140th Street, the exact address of which I do not know. After we had been in the house about a week WILLIAM HARRISON moved in with us. PAULA HARMON and FRED BARKER visited us on one occasion with HARRY CAMPBELL, GLADYS and HARRY SAWYER, Because I did not especially care for PAULA HARMON and was a bit incensed that she should visit my home, I remained in the kitchen and did not overhear any of the conversation had by my visitors.

During this time ALVIN KARPIS took me to a gambling place located on the outskirts of Cleveland. This place was a large gambling house having a large parking lot located immediately outside. I recall that on the first occasion that ALVIN took me there he had said "Hello" to the man at the front door as though he had been previously acquainted with him. Thereafter ALVIN took me there on several occasions and I frequently visited it alone. On one occasion, I saw PAULA and FREDDIE there but I did not speak to them.

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While living at this house ALVIN and myself drove out to BILL WEAVER'S cottage located outside of Sandusky, Ohio, I recall that BILL WEAVER and MYRTLE EATON were there and several other of the gang whose identities I cannot now recall. AIVIN got out of the ear but I did not. After remaining about a quarter of an hour we returned to Cleveland, Ohio. On another occasion we again visited WEAVER'S cottage. EDNA MURRAY and possibly Volney DAVIS, HARRY CAMPBELL, WILLIE HARRISON, and BILL WEAVER were there, and MYRTLE EATON propered dinner for us. After dinner ALVIN and myself returns to Cleveland, Ohio

On or about September 5, 1954 ALVIN and I went to bed about 9:00 P.M. WILLIE HARRISON, who had been living with us, left Cleveland, Ohio, with some of his clothes four or five days previous. I do not know where he went. At about 11:00 P.M., while ALVIN and I were in bed, HARRY CAMPBELL, FRED BARKER and DOC BARKER came to the At this time PRED house. ALVIN went to the door to let them in. ALVIN that WINGHA BURDETTE, GLADTS SATTER, PAULA RAISON OF arrested, and ALVIN stated that 2 was not errosted, FREDRIE then told ALVIM that Tyrone, disper and Paule once to at the Cleveland Hotel for equaing some cort of a disturbance, thereupon told me to get dressed and go into the living room a maintain a lookout. HARRY CAMPHELL and DOC BARKER laid down to get some sleep while FRED and ALVIN talked privately, none of which come versation I overheard. About an hour or so later ALVIN and FRED went out and returned about 45 minutes later stating that there were cops and squad cars all around FRED'S house. I was still maintaining a watch when I observed at about 4:30 A.M. two police squad cars drive slowly by the house, and it appeared that they were watching our place. They apparently drove up the block some distance and returned again driving slowly by the house. I immediately called to ALVIN and told him of what I had seen. He then instructed me to start packing the things that we would absolutely need and to forget about the rest. I started to pack and about fifteen minutes later ALVIN awakened FREDDIR, DOC and HARRY and we departed at about shortly before 5:00 A.M. in three automobiles. ALVIN and I drove away in our Pontiac coupe.

We drove out on the highway and by pre-arrangement met the other two cars, which had taken different routes from the one we took. I got into the Pontiac and ALVIN, FRED and DOC BARKER, and HARRY CAMPBELL got into the other two cars. ALVIN thereupon instructed me to drive to Toledo, Chio, and to check into the Algee Hotel where he would telephone me. I thereupon drave to Toledo and checked into the hotel as instructed. That afternoon AINIE

telephone me and I met him downtown. He told me to take a train t Thicago and to register at the Southmoor Hotel. I took a train to Chicago and on my arrival registered at the Southmoor Hotel and waited for ALVIN to get in touch with me. Two days after my arrival ALVIN telephoned me and told me to get an apartment on the North Side of Chicago; that he would call me back the following day. I thereupon got an apartment located on Diversey Avenue, possibly in the Diversey Park Arms Hotel. ALVIN called me at the Southmoor Hotel the following day and I met him outside the hotal. We went to Mother Barker's apartment and Mother Barker accompanied us to the apartment I hadrented on Diversey Ivenue, there we registered under a fictitious name as mother and daughter. ALVIN KARPIS stayed outside and left immediately after we had registered. We stayed at this apartment, and after approximately two days Russell Gibson and Willie Barrisca called at this apartment for a short while. A couple of nights later ALVIN KARPIS called at the apartment and told me to pack our belong ings, that we were going to Rismi, Florida. He then told Nother that TRID BLAKER sould see her in a seaste of dayes with the At this time ALTIE gave me at 2 \$1000 bills t

me to keep. He did not tall me where he had gotten this money, need do I know at the present time where he obtained its

miles outside of Chicago, probably near Gary, Indiana, we stopped at a gas station along the road. WILLIE HARRISON was there and he introduced me to a girl named Ruth. I do not know who this woman is. We stayed for about a half hour, during which time Ruth and I casually talked together and WILLIE and ALVIN talked alone. Upon leaving WILLIE said he would see us sometime soon. Ruth apparently had met ALVIN before inasmuch as he was not introduced to her and they acted as though they were not strangers to one another.

On the way we did not stop off at any place or see anyone with whom ALVIN was apparently acquainted, and on our arrival in Miami, Florida, we proceeded to the Kl Commodoro Hotel. ALVIN asked the room clerk for Mr. Adams. When told Mr. Adams was not there he left word to be notified when Adams returned. I later gathered from the conversation of ALVIN and WILLIE HARRISON that WILLIE had been friendly with Adams prior to our coming to Mismi and had referred friendly with Adams. We checked into Room 1005 under the name of ALVIN to Mr. Adams. We checked into Room 1005 under the name of WACNER. An hour and a half or two hours later Adams called ALVIE on the telephone. ALVIN went downstairs apparently to see Adams and I went shopping. On my return ALVIE told me that we were going

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to Havana, Cuba, in the morning; that Adams was taking care of the

The following morning ALVIN went downstairs and returned with two letters of reference, one addressed to Mathaniel Heller, Parkview Hotel, Havana, Guba, and the other addressed to George Harris, American Bar, Havana, Cuba, and our tickets to Havana, which ALVIN told me Mr. Adams had gotten for us. I inquired of ALVIN what he intended to do with our Ford Coupe, and he stated he was leaving it with Mr. Adams, who would get rid of it. We packed our beggage and on leaving we met Mr. Adams in the lobby. Adams referred to ALVIN as RAY, and ALVIN introduced me as his wife. We left immediately, proceeding by train and boat, arriving in Havana the same evening.

Upon our arrival we registered at the Parkview Hotel under the name of WACHIM. After elecating up we went downstairs to the bar, where we met him hellows ALVIN gave him the letter which introduced us as ML and MML HARMIN, good friends of Mr. Adams, who was the writer of the letters Me same evening we sent to the American Bar where ALVIN presented to George Marrie ALVIN'B letter of reference, which letter was similar in wording to the one addressed to Mr. Heller. We stayed but a short while and then returned to the hotel. We stayed at this hotel for approximately a week and during this time we frequently visited the American Bar.

Varadero Beach, where we met Mr. and Mrs. Bermudez, who aided us in renting a cottage. We finally located a cottage owned by a Cuban family and arranged for its rental and thereupon returned to Havana, Cuba, About two weeks after our arrival we moved into the house. This was around the first part of October 1934. We rented the cottage under the name of E. N. WACNER. We lived at Varadero Beach until November 15, 1934, during which time we were visited on one occasion by Mother Barker, who came to Cuba to look over the country as she thought she might want to live there. We were also visited on one occasion by George Harris, above mentioned, and his wife. They remained with us for two days and two nights. Also during this period, that is, while living at Varadero Beach, ALVIN and I made several trips to Havana, Cuba, on which occasions we visited George Harris and his wife.

on one occasion while in Havana, Mathaniel Heller took me to a ford agency and he told the salesman that I wanted a Ford Sedan.

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I thereupon purchased a Ford Sedan, paying \$1074,00 for it in cash, consisting of American money. Heller thereupon took me to Marinao, a town located outside of Havana, where I registered the car under the name of DOLORES WAGNER.

While at Varadero Beach ALVIN mentioned that he was expecting to either see or hear from WILLIE HARRISON and wondered what was keeping him. About this time ALVIN had received a couple of cablegrams addressed to him, under the name, I believe, of WAGNER. I do not know where these sablegrams were sent from nor do I know who the sender was.

One day ALVIH asked me to write a letter for him. I then distated a letter, which I wrote and addressed to Mr. Adams at the El Commodoro Hotel, Mismi, Florida. In this letter ALVIN inquired concerning WILLIE and "that party". I have no idea of the identity of "that party" but I do not believe it referred to any of the gang inasmuch as he would undoubtedly have mentioned them under the name they were using at the El Commodoro Hotel. I have been shown a letter addressed to Mr. Adams, signed by Mr. Wagner, which I recognize as being identical with the above mentioned letter, which I wrote and which was dictated to me by ALVIN KARPIS. I notice that the top of the first page of this letter, which I believe I dated, has been torn off. I feel certain that I likewise addressed the envelope containing the letter to Mr. Adams in care of the El. Commodoro Hotel, Miami, Florida. A day or two after I wrote the above mentioned letter ALVIN stated that he had received a cablegram at Varadero Beach under the name of WAGNER from Adams at Miami, Florida, I saw this cablegram, which stated that WILLIE had not been there (referring to Miami, Florida) and Adams had no idea where WILLIE was.

Likewise during this period, at the suggestion of ALVIN KARPIS, George Harris arranged for us the rental of a safety deposit box at the National City Bank of New York at Hawana, Cuba, which box we obtained under the name of E. N. WAGNER. Under the instructions of ALVIN, I placed in the box five \$1000 bills, which was the same money ALVIN had given me in Chicago.

given me in Ghicago, I may state that on our arrival at Miami, Florida, ALVIN asked me for a \$1000 bill, which I gave him. Although we were only in Miami overnight, on our arrival in Havana, Guba, ALVIN had only about \$250 from the \$1000 bill. I do not know of any expensive purchases or in what way ALVIN could have spent

this money unless he gave it to someone for some purpose of which I do not have definite knowledge.

On one occasion I went to Mismi, Florida, in company with Nathaniel Heller, as at that time we were planning on moving to Mismi and possibly live there and wait for the baby to be born, The reason I went to Miami with Mr. Heller at this time was due to the fact that he at that time mentioned that he was likewise going to Mismi and ALVIN believed that it would be best if I go with him: rather than go by myself. On this trip Mr. Heller and I travelled by boat, and upon our arrival in Mismi both Mr. Heller and I 🚟 🗟 registered at the El Commodoro Hotel. On arriving at the hotel I asked for Mr. Adams but was told he was out of town. ALVIN had told me before leaving Varadero Beach to get in touch with Mr. Adams, who would help me in locating a house or apartment in Mismi where we could live, inasmuch as I did not know anything about the city of Mismi. At the hotel I was given Room 1005 and Mr. Heller occupied the adjoining room, No. 1004, although I did not know this until the following morning when I met him in the hallway. was around the latter part of October 1934. While in Miami, Florida, I spent several days looking for an apartment but did not find any one that suited my desires. Also on this trip Mr. Heller accompanied me on one occasion to purchase an American pet bull dog, which we called "Wimpy".

Prior to my leaving Havana, Cuba, for Miami, Florida, on this trip ALVIN KARPIS instructed me to ascertain whether Mother Barker and FREDDIE were residing at the El Commodoro Hotel, and on the day I registered I inquired for them under the name they were registered, which name I do not now recall. I was advised by the clerk that they had checked out several days previously. As stated before, I remained in Miami, Florida, for three or four days and thereupon returned to Havana, Cuba, with my dog "Wimpy" by plane. Upon arriving in Havana I proceeded to the Parkview Hotel and telephoned ALVIN at Varadero Beach to pick me up, which he dide

About ten days or possibly two weeks later ALVIN left Varadere one morning at around eight or nine o'clock for Havana, Cuba. He returned home at midnight that same day and told me that we were going to move immediately as he had heard that the "G" were in Havana. We packed our things that night and left Varadere at six or seven o'clock the next morning, and upon our arrival in Havana we drove about the city and did not go near the Parkview Hotel. ALVIN instructed me to proceed to Mismi by plane and to

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pick him up either the next day or the day after at Homestead. Florida, stating that he was going to proceed to Key West, Florida, by boat and then traval by train from Key West to Homestead, Florida. which town is located about thirty miles outside of Mismi; I procooded to Mismi. Florida. Upon my arrival there I registered at a small hotel about three blocks from the El Commodoro Hotel: ADVIN had told me not to register at the El Commodoro but to check in the some other hotel and then inquire at the El Commodoro to ascertain whether any of the rest of the gang were there. I followed his instructions, and after checking into this small hotel mentioned above, I went to the Kl Commodoro Hotel and inquired at the deak for Mother Barker and FRED BARKER under the fictitious names which they were then using, which names I do not now recall. The elerk advised me that they were not there but that their friends, the Summers, were living in the hotel. Believing that the Summers were persons connected with our crowd, I proceeded to their room, which was Room 1005, and met WYNONA BURDETTE there. This was the first 🔗 time I had seen WYNONA since their departure from Toledo. I stayed with WYNONA in her room overnight.

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ALVIN had told me before we left Havana that I should see Mr. Adams about borrowing an automobile which I could use in meeting him at Homestead, Florida. On the following morning I went downstairs to see Mr. Adams, who was busy at the time. While waiting for him WILLIE HARRISON came into the lobby. We talked together for a while end then went into Mr. Adams' office together. On entering Adams said, "Hello, Willie", and Adams addressed me as Dolores. I do not know from whom he ascertained the name Dolores inasmuch as I was always registered at the hotel under the name of MRS. E. N. WAGNER, and only members of the gang knew my name to be Dolores and addressed me as such. I asked Adams if he had seen "Freddie" and "Mother". He told me he would try to get in touch with them for me. Upon mentioning the borrowing of a car Willie told me that I could use the car which he and DOC BARKER had. Adams asked concerning "RAY" and I told him I was going to meet him down at Homestead, Florida, Adams then mentioned to Willie that George and his wife were registered at the hotel. Adams apperently had reference to HARRY CAMPBELL and WYNONA BURDETTE. We left shortly thereafter and WILLIE told me that he and DOC BARKER had just arrived in Miami that morning. WILLIE and I then went up to WYNONA'S room and later the three of us went to WILLIE'S room, which was Room 405, where we saw DOC BARKER.

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That evening in DOC and WILLIE'S car I went to Homestead and picked up ALVIN as he got off the train, and returned with him to Mismi. We did not register at the El Commodore Hotel at this time but went up to WILLIE HARRISON'S room. I know that ALVIN did not register but that later the same evening we somehow obtained Room No. 404, the room adjoining Room No. 405, which was occupied by DOC and WILLIE, ALVIN told WILLIE and DOC what had happened in Havana, stating he had recognized a \*G\* man in the Parkview Hotel as he was registering. This was the same story he had told me in Cuba and which was the reason prompting us to leave Cube. WYNONA BURDETTE, WILLIE HARRISON, DOC BARKER, ALVIN KARPIS and myself were all together in Room 405 that evening, where we engaged in general conversation. This was about December 10, 1954, I did not see Adams that night, but the following day ALVIN went downstairs to see Adams. I believe that he did see Adams but I do not know what conversation was had between them.

Property of Spirit Spirit States and Bridge About three or four days later DOC BARKER and WILLIE HARRISON left Mismi, Florida, by sutomobile for parts unknown and the same day shortly after their departure Mother Barker, FRED BARKER, and HARRY CAMPBELL arrived in Miami, Florida, and checked into Rooms 904 and 905 at the Kl Commodoro Hotel. FRED BARKER had a quantity of fish with him which he claimed he caught on a lake where he and his mother were living, and either that same day or the following day we had a fish dinner in one of our rooms, and present at this dinner were Mother Berker, FRED BARKER, ALVIN KARPIS, HARRY CAMPBELL, WYNONA BURDETTE, and myself. That same evening I became very ill and believed that the baby was about to be born. ALVIN called the desk clerk and had them send a doctor to our room to examine me. The doctor likewise believed that I would soon give birth to the baby and suggested that I immediately get in touch with Dr. Nichols, who had been attending me,

On the following day Mother Barker, FRED BARKER, HARRY CAMPERIL, and WINONA BURDETTE, left Miami for Oklawaha, Florida, ALVIN and I continued to live at the El Commodoro Hotel for several days thereafter. Around this period Joe Adams, who was at this time the Manager of the hotel, told ALVIN and I in our room that he wanted us to keep in our room as much as possible and did not want us running in and out of the hotel, and in order to keep us company sent a large radio up to our room. Some days later ALVIN told me that we were going out to rent a house. Mr. Adams, ALVIN, and I went down to a ear, where Adams told us that he had located a house which he thought would please us. Adams then drove us out to the

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house, where Adams introduced us as MR. and MRS. CREEN to Mrs. Thomas, the owner. We rented the house and I believe ALVIN then paid Mrs. Thomas \$750.00 rental for the season. On the way back Adams remarked that he had introduced us as MR. and MRS. CREEN because he had forgotten to ask ALVIN beforehand what name he wanted to use and that GREEN was the first name that came to his mind. I recall signing the lease for the rental of this house under the name of MRS. S. A. CREEN.

A few days after AIVIN and I moved to the above mentioned house, Joe Adams drove AIVIN KARPIS to Cklawsha, Florida, to visit with FRED BARKER, MOTHER BARKER, HARRY CAMPBELL, and WYNONA BURDETTE, as at this time ALVIN did not have a car of his own. ALVIN returned the following day with FRED BARKER and HARRY CAMPBELL. ALVIN later told me that Adams did not stay overnight at Oklawsha but returned to Mismi shortly after he arrived there. FRED and HARRY remained with us for about five days before returning to Cklawsha, during which time they did a great deal of fishing. Thereafter I did not frequent many places or make any visits as I was very sick and was expecting our baby any day.

About a week or so before Christmas FRED BARKER and HARRY CAMPBELL came to Miami, Florida, and visited with us. They brought with them a quantity of baby clothes which were from Mother Barker and Wynona Burdette. They remained at our home for about two days on this occasion. I recall that during this time Adams visited our house and he talked with ALVIN, FRED, and HARRY in the living room outside of my hearing. After remaining about a half hour Adams left.

I distinctly recall Christmas day and on this day, sometime in the afternoon, ALVIN received a telephone call from a party called JOE. I overheard him ask the party calling what time they would be there, and from the conversation which followed I gathered that these people would be at our house right away. After ALVIN hung up the telephone he told me that I should prepare dinner for two more people, but did not volunteer any further information concerning them. About five minutes later he left the house apparently to meet them someplace but returned alone about ter minutes later stating that he did not see them. However, a short time later, while I was in the kitchen with Theresa Carmichael, who was working for us as a maid and nurse, I heard voices and went to the front part of the house. Standing near the front door was ALVIN and a tall grey-haired man dressed in sport clothes with a

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Penema hat, ALVIN merely said, "This is my wife" and introduced him to me under the name of Mr. CRAWFORD. This man stated that he had heard that we were expecting an heir. I cannot recall any reply that I made.

while at the front door I noticed a large automobile parked in front of the house, and I recall that someone was sitting in the car, although I do not know whether it was a man or a woman. I believe I went to the rear of the house inasmuch as I did not see this man again, and a few minutes afterwards ALWIN came back to the dining room and told me that the man and his companion had left, that they could not stay for dinner because they had a previous engagement. I cannot recall any further conversation had with ALVIN concerning the identity of these people.

I have been shown a photograph of CASSIUS McDONALD wherein he is wearing a Pansma hat, and I can only state that the person represented in the photograph bears a resemblance to the man who visited us on Christmas day.

Sometime about New Years day in January 1935 DOC BARKER and RUSSEIL GIBSON called at our home and delivered a white pit bull dog named "Tuffy" which I had left in Cleveland with FRED and DOC BARKER. DOC and RUSSEIL GIBSON stated that they had either seen Mother Barker and FRED BARKER or would see them on their way back. They stayed about three days and went fishing with ALVIN every day. DOC BARKER and RUSSEIL GIBSON did not indicate where they were living, and after three days they left. During the early part of January 1935, while I was downtown visiting my doctor, I read in the newspaper of RUSSEIL GIBSON being killed in Chicago while resisting arrest by Government Agents.

On the night of January 13, 1935 WYNONA BURDETTE and HARRY CAMPRELL came to our house. At that time they did not know of Gibson's death until I had told them of it. Before coming to our house they had checked into the El Commodoro Hotel, but ALVIN, believing it would be safer for them to stay at our house, invited them to live with us. On the following day I went to the El Commodoro Hotel with Wynona and assisted her in checking out of the hotel. HARRY CAMPBELL and ALVIN went fishing every day and HARRY intended returning to Oklawaha, Florida, on both January 15th and 16th but was prevailed upon by ALVIN to remain inasmuch as he desired HARRY to accompany him fishing.

On January 16, 1935, while HARRY and ALVIE were fishing, at approximately 10:00 A.M., Wynona and myself heard over the
radio that it was believed that two of the BREMER kidnapers had
been trapped in a house which was then being gassed. About an
hour later we heard over the radio that MA and FRED BARKER had
been killed in a house at Oklawaha, Florida.

At 3:00 P.M. the telephone rang and someone called asking for RAY GREEN, and when I told him it was RAY GREEN'S wife and that RAY CREEN, meaning ALVINg was not there, this unknown party, whom I later learned to be DUKE RANDAIL, told us to get out of town immediately. Wynona and I immediately packed our baggage. put it in our ear, and kept driving around the neighborhood until about 7:50 P.M. At that time we met ALVIN and HARRY, who were returning from fishing, on the street near our house. I told them what had happened. ALVIN and HARRY left after telling us to follow; them. When we got out into the country I told them of Mother Barker and FRED BARKER'S death and the telephone call, whereupon ALVIN and EARRY left and returned in about an hour. They told Wynona and myself to drive their car to a dog track to get DUKE RANDALL and to bring him to a street near the race track where ALVIN and HARRY would be. We went to the race track, and not finding DUKE RANDALL outside, Wynona went inside and on her return stated that DUKE was not able to leave the track at that time and to have ALVIN come out to the track to see him. Wynona and I thereupon left and met HARRY and ALVIN in the spot outside of Miami where we had formerly conversed and told them what had happened. They left without further words and did not return for an hour and a half. With them in another car was DUKE RANDALL. All of us thereupon went to a point further outside of Miami where we parked our cars. Wynona and I stayed in the car and HARRY CAMPBELL, ALVIN KARPIS, and DUKE RANDAIL conversed near one of the other cars.

At that time I had \$500.00, most of which I gave to ALVIN, who told me that DUKE RANDAIL would give me \$1000 the following morning. He thereupon told Wynona and I to follow DUKE, who would take us to some place where we could spend the night, and instructed us that we were to take a train in the morning for Atlantic City, where we were to register at the Danmore Hotel, and that I was to use the name of LOUISE GRAHAM. ALVIN stated that he would get in touch with we at that hotel.

Shortly after this conversation Wynona and I, in MINING Ford Sedan, followed DUKE RANDALL in his Ford Coupe, which

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I believe was likewise owned by ALVIN KARPIS, to the Ti-Mismi Hotel, which hotel was located near the El Commodoro Hotel. DIKE RANDALL took us into the hotel and introduced us to the clerk as the c his sisters. He then took us to his room, where we stayed overnight. While in DUKE'S room he showed Wynona and myself a pistol which he 🚈 carried in a shoulder holster, and made the remark, "Put your glimmers on this rod". He also showed us at this time a badge which was pinned on his west and remarked that he was wearing it for protection. He also stated, "I am lamming from a nurder rap in New Joisey". DUKE thereupon pulled me to one side and asked whether I was afraid when I received the telephone call that afternoon 🕾 telling me to get out. I told him that I was not, and that I was too used to that to be frightened. He them said that he would like to get in with the boys, and inquired whether they were as tough first as they were gracked up to be. DUKE departed after this conversation stating that we would be safe at this hotel and that he would see us the following morning

On the next morning DUKE came to our room and while Wynona was in the bathroom he gave me an envelope which contained \$800, stating that Adams could not get the money from where he was supposed to; also that Adams had taken this money from the hotel and that he, Adams, would try to get the remainder of it to me some time. DUKE also gave me at this time a sealed note addressed to the people at the Danmore Hotel in Atlantic City, New Jersey, stating in this connection that the note stated that these people, meaning Wynona and myself, were good friends of his and that they should take care of us. I recall that the \$800 which DUKE gave me were in \$100, \$50, and \$20 denominations. I thereupon gave DUKE \$200 of the \$800 which he had given me for the purchase of our railroad tickets and a drawing room to Atlantic City. He went out and returned with the tickets shortly thereafter and gave me approximately \$50 in change from the \$200 I had given him. DUKE then took us downstairs and cab for us. got a taxi cab for us.

Wynona and I boarded the train about 9:00 A.M., the date being January 17, 1935, and arrived in Philadelphia the following afternoon. We thereupon got a train for Atlantic City and arrived late that afternoon and sheeked into the Danmore Hotel under the name of LOUISE CRAHAM, as ALVIH had instructed me. I delivered the note which DUKE had given me to a man who appeared to be the manager and he stated that he hoped that we would be comfortable during our stay at his hotel. Wynona and I ate dinner and went to bed. About two or three o'clock the following morning a knock sounded on the door and when I opened it I found ALVIN KARPIS, who stated that they had

just arrived in town and were registered in another room. We had little conversation at this time, ALVIN KARPIS stating that he would see us in the morning. He left and returned at eight of nine o'clock that morning with HARRI. Later that morning ALVIN went out and purchased a sult and an overcoat. We stayed at the hotel until late that afternoom, when Wynona and I went out and bought some clothes.

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The day after ALVIN and HARRY arrived in Atlantic City I told ALVIN what IUKE had told me about the money and he said it was O.K. Our conversation them drifted to the killing of Nother and FRED BARKER, and ALVIN remarked that he later learned that Adams had warned them three or four different times to get out and stay out but they did not heed his warnings.

AIVIN also told me at this time that when I was with Wynona at the time she checked out of the El Commodoro Hotel on Jamuary 14, 1935 there were "G" men sitting in the lobby of the hotel. He did not volunteer the source of this information.

I also asked AIVIN at this time what DUKE was doing with our Ford Coupe; that I thought Adams was to have gotten rid of it, and ALVIN replied that he told Adams to destroy it but later found out that he had given it to DUKE for his personal use. ALVIN also told me at this time that of the \$2000 which AIVIN had left some time previously with Joe Adams at the El Commodoro Hotel for safekeeping, and which \$2000 was a part of the six \$1000 bills he gave me in Chicago, there still remained one \$1000 bill at the hotel. ALVIN told me at this time that I could go down and get this money which Adams was holding when I needed it.

I have previously related to Government Agents my activities and the activities of ALVIN KARPIS, HARRY CAMPBELL, and WYNONA BURDETTE subsequent to this time.

I have read the foregoing statement, which consists of 25 pages, and here sign to wouch for its truth.

I, Daniel Francis Young, make the following statement to F. d. Wright and N. . . Harzenstein, knowing them both to be special agents of the Division of Investigation, U. J. Department of Justice, of my own free will, without any threats or romise, having been made to me, and knowing that this statement may be used against me.

I live with my mother at 6203 Ventnor ave., Ventnor, N. J., and stend most of my time at the Danmor Hotel, #123 So. Kentucky Ave., Atlantic City, N. J., of which I am a part owner, partner, and manager. I also run a number game at #2435 Atlantic Ave., Atlantic City. My father has a cafe at #102 N. South Carolina Ave. I have no interest in the cigar store or horse books of William Morley, who is my partner in the Danmor Hotel. We have had this hotel since april, 1934, and have had it open since Decoration Day. I am single. I am actively in charge of the hotel, and spend most of my time there. Morley does very little about the hotel, but is usually across the street at his cigar store, #126 So. Kentucky Ave. We em.loy four coole at the hotel: Owen Roberts, the night bell-boy; the day bell-boy, Gregory Boney; the utility man, who works irregularly, i known to me only as "Clint" or Clinton; the hou ekeeper, Mrs. Estella Wilson, who lives on So. Florida Ave. Mra. Wilson is white, and the three men are colored. Some of the trade of the hotel, both steady and transient, are brought by vari ous texicab arivers, with whom I have an arrangement providing for a kick back to them on the business they bring. I am a member of the Hotel Greeters Ass'n of America, in which my 1935 number z is #389,- New Jer ey, Charter #43. I am 37 years of age, have lived the last 30 years in Atlantic City, and have known Morley for about 22 years. Samuel Morely is the brother of William Morely, and I met him through billiam Morely. I have known of him around Atlantic City for 16 or 17 years, and have known him intimately for the past 6 or 7 years. I think wam is a couple of years older. To fer as I know, william and his wife own the store, and Sam work; for them. He has been around the store about 6 years. I have a number; book at the store, which Bill runs as my agent, but I have no interest in his Horse book. My sole sources of income are the hotel and the numbers game, in which I have to partners.

On the afternoon of last Friday, January 18, 1935, at about 1.15 or 2.30, a La alle limousine taxi drew up in front of the Danmor Rotel, and two women got out and came into the hotel. The cab was driven by a colored man, about 5'7" tall, heavy build, dark color. I know this man, and could recognize him again, but I do not know his name, not what company he . drives for. The to homen came to the deak and asked for a room. I asked how lang the; exjected to stay, and they said it was indefinite, but maybe two or three weeks. One of the women was pregnant. I believe it was the other woman who signed the registrate card. I have been shown registration card #868 of the Hotel Danmore, and recognize this as the card they signed, as it bears my handriting across the bottom. It bears the name Ers. A. B. Graham and sister, which was written by the woman I mentioned above. I assigned them to Room #400, and Boney took them up in the elevator. I believe they had two bags, although I do not recall what kind. I said yesterday, to F. E. Wright, that the women, or one of them, phoned me on the house phone several hours later in the day, but I now recall definitely that they phoned about ten minutes after they registered. The house phone at the hotel does not how what room is calling, o that it is necessary

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to ask what room is calling. I do not remember whether I asked them what room it was, but I am sure that #400 made that call. A noman's voice asked where-Mry-Merley-was,-and-I-sa if this were D.FY Mr. Morldy, and I said it was Mr. Young, but that Mr. Morley was over in the store, and asked whether she wanted him. The said she did not, and hung up. I remained at the hotel about ten minute after this home call, and then left, to check up on my numbers business. I alway: stop first at a place on Michigan Ave., to add up the slips of a book I have there. The books all close at 3 PM, and I alway arrive at the Michigan Ave. place at that time. I Stayed there until 3.35 PM, and then went to the place at Florida Ave., which is my headquarters. I remained there until at about 5 MM, and then went directly back to the hotel, arriving about 5.15 rM. I did not see either of the women that evening, not did - receive any calls from them, or any messages from them or concerning them. I think I went to my Lother's house for dinner that night, as it was Friday, and I think that I left about 6.45 FM. I left my Mother's house about 8 FM, and arrived at the hotel about 8.15 or 8.20 PM. About 11.30 LM, I left the hotel with Mr. Lynch, a guest of the hotel, and we both went to the New Yorker Restaurant, where we staged for a while. I said yesterday to F. E. Wright that we returned to the hotel about 1...30 AM, but I now wish to change this time to 1.30 AM. 10 or 15 minutes later, two men came into the hotel. Lynch was still there at the time. The men drove up in a black sedan, which they sarked in front of the hotel. I believe they had two bags with them. One of these men was taller and thinner than the other. I have been shown a jicture labeled alvin Kar is, and I have identified this as a likeness of the xxx taller, thinner man. This man came to the desk and asked, "Mr. Morley?" I said, "No, I am Mr. Young." He asked, so far as I can recall, "Lo you have a Mrs. Graham and sister registered here?" The two women I mentioned above were the only tersons who checked in during see day, but I was not familiar with the names xx of all fithe guests, and checked the room cards. I found the name, and told him they were here. He said he wanted a room, and proceeded to regi ter, signing the card as Carson. He then told the other man he had betwer sign, too. The other man baid nothing at that time. Both men imelled somewhat from liquor. I started to assign them to Room #300. Carbon asked whether the women were on that floor, and when I said they were not, he alked to be put on the same willook with the women. The other man had registered in the name of Cameron. I then assigned them to #403. #401 and #402 were then taken. I told them that the women were in \$\frac{1}{2},00\$. They did not call the women on the house phone. They asked if there were a garage in the neighborhood, and + mentioned the Coast Garage at Kentucky Ave. and the boardwalk, which is the garage I always refer my guests to, and told them that they could either take the car there themselves, or the attendant would call for it. I do not recall what answer they made to this. Owen Roberts took them up to the room in the elevator. Owen came down and asked for a dollar for a few minutes, as the men vanted him to get them lone whiskey. I gave him the dollar. and he went out and returned shortly with a fint of liquor. He showed it to me, and said it had bost two dollars. The brand was G & W, or Golden Wedding. before the man went u, Carson cold me to have bill Morley call him in the morning, so I wrote a note for Morley: "Bill, please call doom #403 at 9 o'clock," and signed it, "Dan." hortly thereafter, Owen came down and returned the dollar to me. He then told me that the men wanted me to call the garage and have the car jut away. I believe they had left the key in the g car. I called the garage, and the man came, in about ten minutes, and took the car away. I think this was about 2.30 AM of Waniel 7. young &

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January 19, 1935. The registration card of the men is #870, of the Hotel Lanmor. It is dated 1/18/35 so that it will show a charge for that articular night's u.e. At about 2.30 AM, just after I had fini hed rooming these men and taking care of the car, I decided to go out for a drink before going to bed. Lynch was still in the lobby, but he said he was going to bed. I went across to the cigar store. am horely was taking care of the store. I believe Bill Morley and his wife had gone to bed. George Patterson was coming out of the store at the time, and, after discussing the matter of a drink, we went to the Monticello Tavern, intending to have a scotch and soda before retiring. While there, we were joined by William Hagis and his wife, who were mouring the death of their little dog, and we all stayed there together, for some time during which time, I might have had as many as a dozen drinks. I was recept drunk by the time I returned to the hotel, and I do not know what the hour was.

Sometime the next day, Bill Morely woke me. I was still relty groggy, but I think he said something to the effect of its being one o'clock. He told me he wanted me to put on a robe and come with him to meet some men. I was then in #405, which is my room in the winter time. During the summer, I occupy #404, which is a maller room. I put on a robe and went with Bill to #403. There were two men in the room, the same two that I had checked in early that morning. They asked me to have a drink, and I refused. Carson was wearing glas es, and was dressed in a grey suit, but I do not think he was wearing the coat. The bother man wore neither coat not vest. Carson lay on the bed, and the other two tere standing. I sat down next to the bed. bill introduced the men to me, although I do not recall what names he called them by. He told me that the mentere looking for a furnished a artment or house, and were willin to pay \$75 per month. I do not recall any conver ation concerning locations desired nor do I recall being asked to recommend an agent. If i had been asked, the only agent - would have recommended would be Firicusa, who is an old employer of mine. I suggested that the, remain at the hotel and take two communicating rooms. They said they would probably look around. Yesterday, I told F. 2. Wright that nothing concerning the note I had written to Bill, nor that I had been in the room with Bill and the two men on Saturday. I was then given an opportunity to recall this, but was unable to do so until today when I was reminded. I do not recall any conversation between Bill and Carson concerning the latter occupation. I was in the room about ten minutes, and then went back to my room. Bill advised me to take a bath and try to straighten out, but I went back to bed instead.

I arose about 4.30 or 5 PM that day, and went down to the desk in the lobby. I did not go out to eat until 6.30 or 7 PM, when I went out to Kent's, and returned to the hotel at about 7.30 PM. At About 9. PM, I had a call to get a cab. I believe a sked what room it as calling, at was told #400. The voice was a soman's. I sent Clint out for the cab. He brought a yellow cab from in front of the Jefferson Hotel, on Kentucky ave., nearer the beach. I did not know then who the driver was, but obtained that information today, and gave the man's number to Special agent sharpe, and no longer have it. I called the women in #400, and they came down and drove away in the cab, although I do not know where they went. I saw them return about 10 FM, in a different cab with two shopping bags. These bags were big manila bags, with rope handles. I saw nothing protruding from them, and do not know

what was in them, although they a peared towell filled. The women went upstairs. I did not see them again that evening, nor aid I see either of the men. I did not see any of them that afternoon in the lobby. If any of them had been in the lobby while I was there, I must have seen them.

At 10.15 or 10.30 PM, I left the hotel, and went with a woman friend, in the Buick belonging to Rameninsky, one of my partners in the number business, to Weber's Hofbrau, at the Camden airport. We returned to Atlantic City at about 4.30 AM on Sunday, January 10, 1935. I spent the rest of the night at this friend's apartment. I left there about 8.30 AM, and went to church, for 9 o'clock mass. I left there about 9.50 AM, and went to kent's restaurant for breakfast. At the restaurant, I was told by a Mr. Arbuckle, one of the guests of the hotel, that there had been some shooting at the hotel that morning.

I never knew anything concerning any note that might have been brought by these people to Bill Mordey, until after the shooting, when Mrs. Morley told me something about Duke Randall having sent them to the hotel. Later that day, I saw one of the detectives leaving the hotel, and he told me he was going over to the store to get a note that was supposed to have been torn up. He came back a little later, and I was given the impression that he had not found any note.

I have read the above statement, con isting of four lages word for word, and have had whatever corrections made that I wished. Everything that is contained therein is true, and I am voluntarily signing each lage at the end, and also signing the statement at the end of it.

I, WYNONA BURDETTE make the following statement to D. P. Sullivan and John L. Madala whom I know to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. This statement is entirely voluntary and no promises or threats have been made to me.

Around the first part of November, 1934, while I was a living with my sisters, Eunice and Bone, who also have name of "Vinnie", at Ponca City, Oklahoma, and while broadcasting one evening from radio station WBBC in Ponca City, Oklahoma, I observed HARRY CAMPBELL drive by the radio station.

Upon recognizing HARRY CAMPBELL I immediately left the radio station and upon entering the street I observed HARRY CAMPBELL turn his car around some distance away and return. He drove past me and parked his car about 1/2 block shead of me down the street. I walked to the car alone and talked with CAMPBELL.

At this time I informed him that I had made a signed statement to Bureau Agents at Chicago, Illinois, and asked him how he felt about it. He replied that it did not make any difference to him and thereafter he told me that he had come after me, and asked if I would care to again live and travel with him. I consented and he then suggested that I take a cab from my home and meet him at the swimming pool located immediately outside of the city limits of Fonca City.

I returned home and told my sisters that EARRY CAMPBELL had come after me and that I was again going to live with him. They did not approve of this but after arguing with them for several minutes I left in spite of their unwillingness to let me go, and proceeded in a taxicab to the appointed meeting place. I did not take any clothes with me.

Upon seeing HARRY CAMPBELL again at this time he told me that we were going to Miami, Florida to live and that we would not be in association any more with the crowd. He also told me that he had driven up from Miami, Florida, and that we would stay at the El Commodoro Hotel until we found a place to live. I surprisingly asked, "At a hotel - how come you are staying at a hotel?" and he said "Well, the place is all right". We drove to

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Miami in a week's time, stopping at numerous towns for refreshments and rest.

Upon arriving in Mismi, Florida, which was three days before Thanksgiving, HARRY CAMPBELL and I proceeded direct to the El Commodoro Hotel. It appeared that HARRY CAMPBELL was already registered in room 905 under the name of G. L. SUMMERS. We lived in room 905 for approximately three weeks at the end of which time HARRY CAMPBELL and I moved to Oklawaha, Florida.

JOH ADAMS, the manager of the Kl Commodoro Hotel on numerous occasions in the lobby of the said hotel, and although he was never formally introduced to me, he would always address me as "Mrs. Summers". Also during this period HARRY CAMPBELL frequently met JOE ADAMS on the 10th floor of the hotel, but I do not have any knowledge of the nature of their business at these times. Also during this period HARRY CAMPBELL and I ate practically all of our meals in our room, which was at my suggestion inasmuch as I was afraid I might be recognized by some of the Agents who saw me in Chicago, Illinois, during the time I was detained there. I also recall that on several occasions while living at the El Commodoro Hotel JOE ADAMS sent special dinners to our room with his compliments, and which were free of charge.

During this period the bell boy at the El Commodoro Hotel brought Chicago and Miami, Florida, newspapers to our room, but only when the newspapers contained either articles or photographs of some of the boys or when the articles referred to either the BREADR kidneping case or to some crime which they were suspected of. I know this to be trum because I usually read these newspapers or HARRY would read them to me. On one occasion HARRY CALTBELL remarked that if ADAMS continued to send the papers up to the room by the bell boy, the boy would soon get wise as to who we were.

I also recall on one occasion during this period, either the bell boy or someone else, who possibly might be JOE ADAMS brought a newspaper to our room which carried a story of the killing of Cowley and Hollis at Barrington, Illinois. I had previously met both of these individuals at Chicago, Illinois, and I knew them to be Special Agents of the Government.

I also recall that a few days later there appeared in one of the Chicago newspapers which was delivered to our room, the photograph of ALVIN KARPIS as the companion who assisted "Baby Face" Nelson in the killing of Agents Cowley and Hollis.

On or about December 5, 1934, HARRY CAMPBELL left Miami, Florida, stating that he was going 500 miles up the road and would be gone for a few days. On one afternoon while he was away I went down town shopping, and on my return I ordered some refreshments. The bell boy who always waited on us told me when he brought the refreshments, that a woman who appeared to be pregnant had called while I was away. HARRY had previously instructed me not to see anybody that called at the hotel and to tell the bell boy to tell such persons that I was out of town, which I did at this time.

That evening DOLORES DeLANEY whom I had previously known, came to my room and asked whether GEORGE, meaning HARRY CAMTBELL, was there. I told her that he would be out of town for a few days. She then told me that she desired to see HARRY and asked at this time whether I had seen any of the rest of the bunch around there, and I replied that I had not. DOLORES also told me that at that time she had to see Mr. Adams and she would wait until the next day to see him, as he wasn't in then.

I invited DOLORES to stay with me until HARRY CAMPBELL returned, and she accepted. On the following morning at about 11:00 o'clock, DOLORES went downstairs, presumebly to see JOE ADAMS, and about one hour later she returned with WILLIE HARRISCH who asked about "Buff" meaning HARRY CALPBELL. Sometime thereafter I went down to room 405 at HARRISON'S invitation and saw DOC BARKER there with WILLIE HARRISCH and DOLORES DeLANTY. That afternoon the four of us went riding around Miami, Florida, and had some refreshments.

Later that evening ALVIN KARPIS accompanied by DOLORES Delaney, came into room 405 while In was there with WILLIE HARRISON and DOC BARKER. I do not know where KARPIS came from at this time.

On the following evening I went with WILLIE HARRISON to the Biscayne Kennel Club to attend the races. While there WILLIE of ynone Sursite.

introduced me to Duke Randall as "Squaw". Duke was working behind a cage at the time and appeared to be very friendly with WILLE.

On the following morning WILLIE HARRISCN and DOC BARKER left Mismi, Florida, and later that same day HARRY CAMPBELL, FRED BARKER, and MOTHER BARKER came to the El Commodoro Hotel from Oklawaha, Florida. At this time HARRY asked me whether I would like to go deer hunting at FRED BARKER'S place in Oklawaha for a few days. I told him I would not mind if it were only for a few days.

I forgot to state that on one occasion while in room 405 with DOC BARKER, ALVIN KARPIS, DOLORES DeLANKY and WILLIE HARRISCN, JOE ADAMS came to room 405, after which DOLORES and I went into room 404, leaving the above named persons together in room 405. I also recall that the day after HARRY CAMPBUIL returned to Miami, Florida from Oklawaha, JOE ADAMS came into room 905 and visited with HARRY CAMPBELL.

on or about December 13, 1934, FRED BARKER, MCTHER BARKER, HARRY CAMPBELL and I left for Oklawaha, Florida, in HARRY CAMPBELL'S Ford automobile. Upon arriving there I met WILLIE WOODBURY and his wife ANNABELLE, who are colored, and who were working for FRED BANKER in taking care of the place.

About two or three days leter JOE ADAMS came to our place in company with ALVIN KARPIS.After ADAMS talked with the boys privately for several hours, he left. On one occasion I overheard ADAMS tell FRED BARKER and HARRY CAMPBELL that there were some Government men in Miami, and that they, meaning HARRY CAMPBELL and FRED BARKER better get out of the place in Oklawaha, as the Government men might find out that they were there. After JOE ADAMS left FRED BARKER remarked that he did not believe there was anything to it.

I desire to state that immediately after JOE ADAMS left our place HARRY CAMPEIL and FRED BARKER asked MOTHER BARKER and I whether we would like to take a short trip about the state of Florida, that they, meaning ALVIN KARPIS, HARRY CAMPBEIL, and FRED BARKER, had to go to Miami, Florida, and stay there about a week or week and a half.

On the following morning sometime before daybreak, the boys left Oklawaha, Florida, and that same evening MOTHER BARKER and I proceeded by automobile to Jacksonville, Florida, thence to Tampa, Florida, and other places, this being merely a pleasure trip.

MOTHER BARKER and I returned to Oklawsha, Florida, about a week later and that same day, as I recall, HARRY CAMPBEIL and FRED BARKER likewise came back. Upon our return from the trip WILLIE WCODBURY gave MOTHER BARKER a note stating that some fellows left it with him for Mr. BLACKBURN. I subsequently read this note which was contained in a sealed envelope and was signed by JOE ADAMS, and to my recollection it stated in substance that we had better get out of the place and stay out of there as the place was hot; also that he, meaning JOE ADAMS, was getting tired of warning us and that he wanted to see the boys at the hotel as soon as they got back.

After reading the note we had WILLIE WOODBURY describe the men who delivered this message to him, and his description of these individuals answered to that of JOE ADAMS and DUKE RANDALL. WILLIE also told us that these men came to the place in a Ford Coupe.

We destroyed the note by throwing it in the fireplace immediately thereafter, and when HARRY CAMPBELL and FRED BARKER returned to Oklawaha that evening MOTHUR BARKER told them in my presence about JOE ADAMS' message. I heard FRED BARKER say that he did not think there was anything to it. However, HARRY CAMPBELL was very much concerned and worried over this possibility. In fact he and I discussed it at length that night and he wanted to send me home then but I refused to go.

Two days later HARRY CAMPBELL and FRED BARKER again left for Miami, Florida, leaving MOTHER BARKER and I in Oklawaha. They returned two days later by themselves and I believe they went to Miami at this time to do some Christmas shopping.

Shortly after Christmas HARRY CAMPBELL received a letter from DOC BARKER stating that he and SLIM would be down to see us for New Years.

On or about December 27, 1934, DOC BARKER and SLIM, whom I now know as RUSSELL GIBSON, came to our place in Oklawsha

and stayed there until January 3, 1935. They fished and hunted considerably during this period.

January 3, 1935, SLIM and DOC BARKER left for Chicago Illinois. Nothing unusual took place thereafter until on or about January 10, 1935, when JOE ADAMS came to our place alone. He remained for about four hours during which time he talked with TRED BARKER and HARRY CAMPBELL in the boathouse. I do not know why he came there and whether he brought anything with him.

HARRY CAMPBEIL and I left Oklawaha on January 13,1935, for Miami, Florida, and upon arriving there we checked in to the El Commodoro Hotel in either room 905 or 705 under the room of SUMMERS. HARRY left the hotel and returned shortly thereafter, at which time he advised that DOC BARKER had been arrested and that SLIM had been killed. He stated that we had better get out of the hotel and live with ALVIN KARPIS and DOLORES DeLANEY, which we did.

while DOLORES Delaney and I were alone, the boys having gone fishing that morning, we heard over the radio that there was some shooting going on at Oklawaha, Florida, and later learned through radio dispatches, that MOTHER BARKER and FRED BARKER had been killed by Government Agents. At about 3:00 P.M. DOLORES told me we had better leave. She did not mention at this time that she had received any telephone call warning them to get out of the place. We packed our clothes and DOLORES told the maid that she had received a message to the effect that her mother was seriously ill and that she and I were going out of town to visit her, and that she would wire her.

After leaving the place DOLORES and I drove around its vicinity waiting for ALVIN KARPIS and HARRY CAMPBELL to return home. We later met ALVIN KARPIS and HARRY CAMPBELL at about 7:30° P.M. approximately one block from the house. We told the boys what had happened, that is, about the shooting in Oklawaha. HARRY CAMPBELL then told DOLORES and myself to follow KARPIS and him in the Ford car; they were driving KARPIS° automobile. We followed them to a point outside of Miami, Florida, where they stopped and came to the car which DOLORES and I were in. They then took some of the baggage from our car and placed it in the Buick, whereupon

they left, stating we should wait at this place; that they would be back in an hour. HARRY CAMPBELL and ALVER KARPIS returned sometime later and KARPIS stated at this time that DOLORES and I should drive to the dog track and instructed me to go in and see Duke Randall and tell him that he, KARPIS, wanted to see him; that DOLORES and I then drove to the track and I contacted Duke at his station inside of the track and told him that RAY, meaning KARFIS, wanted to see him as soon as possible. Duke stated that he could not get away and that Ray should come to the track. I told him that RAY did not want to come there, and he replied that I should tell Ray for him, to come to the track, through the back way and that he would have an old man there waiting for him. I returned to the car in which DOLORES was still waiting and drove to the place where we were supposed to meet HARRY CAMPBELL and ALVIN KARPIS and found them there.

I gave KARPIS Duke's message, whereupon EARRY CAMPHEIL and KARPIS went to the track, and before leaving they told Dolors and myself to wait at a certain point about one mile from the race track. KARPIS and CAMPHELL returned shortly thereafter and we then followed the boys to a point outside of Miami, Florida.

. . .

Duke Randall showed up about two or three hours later and went into conversation with KARFIS and CALT'RELL, none of which either DOLORES or I overheard. HARRY CAMPBELL thereafter told me to follow Duke into town and that he would keep DOLORES and myself that night and send us to Atlantic City the following morning; that he and KARPIS would go there by automobile. HARRY gave me at this time either \$100 or \$200.

DOLORES and I followed Duke Randell in our Ford Sedan, he driving a Ford Coupe, to the Ta-Miami Hotel. Upon arriving there we drove our car up a driveway which is adjacent to the hotel. I asked Duke what he was going to do with the car and he told me to leave the keys and the baggage in the car and that he would take care of it. He later told me that he would get rid of it by running it into the ocean. Duke took us into the hotel and introduced DOLORES and myself to the hotel clerk as his sisters, stating that we were going to stay in his room over night.

after we entered his room he told us to make ourselves comfortable and that we would be safe there. At this time he took If ynand Quiditle.

off his coat and we noticed that he carried a pistol in a shoulder holster. We also observed what appeared to be a police badge and he later removed it from his coat and showed it to us, stating that he got it for protection. He also told DOLORES and myself at this time that he was wanted for murder in the state of New Jersey and that he had "jumped the rap". He left shortly thereafter stating that he would see us early the next morning.

On the following day sometime before eight o'clock, Duke returned to the room in which DOLORES and I were located, and said that he would run down to the station and get our tickets to Atlantic City, New Jersey. He left and returned soon thereafter with the railroad tickets, which he gave to DOLORES. He then accompanied us downstairs where he called a taxicab from the lobby of the hotel and DOLORES and I left for the railroad station, leaving Duke at the hotel.

I forgot to state that while living at Oklawaha. Florida, JOE ADAMS sent Chicago and Miemi newspapers to us, some of which were addressed to BLACKBURN and some to SUMERS. HARRY CAMPBLIL told me on one occasion that JOE ADAMS had been given money to send these papers to us. I recall that in some of the papers which were sent to us by JOE ADAMS, there appeared photographs of ALVIN KARPIS, HARRY CAMPBELL, FRED BARKER, DOC BARKER, and VOLNEY DAVIS; also various articles which connected them with the BREMER kidnaping case.

I have read the foregoing statement which consists eight pages and swear same is true to the best of my recollection.

I, William A. Morley, make the following statement to C. K. Fierstone and A. C. Harzenstein, Knowing them both to be Special Agents of the Division of Investigation, U. A. Department of Justice, of my own free will, without any threats or promises having been made to me, and knowing that it may be used against me.

I live at the Danmore Hotel, #123 So. Kentucky Ave., Atlantic City, N. J., of which I am a part owner and partner. I also own a cigar store across the street from the hotel, at #126 So. Kentucky Ave.

On last Friday, January 18, 1935, at about 3 PM. I was in the back room of my store, and was called to the front of the store by my wife. There was a woman in the store, who gave me a note, adressed to me. It was written on the stationery of the Tamiami Hotel, Miami Florida, so far as I can recall, in green ink. I do not remember any date on this. I think the message said," Dear bill: Take care of my friend Mr. Graham, and see that the gets a good doctor, and get good care." It was signed, "Duke." The girl, who was pregnant did asked whether her hasband had arrived, and, then I said he had not remarked that he would be there soon. I asked thether she wanted the doctor right away, and he wid that the morning would co.

The only Duke I know is Duke Randall, who used to be a drummer in bands around Atlantic City. I met him who He stopped E.M. at the hotel for a few days, probably last June, and for a few days again, several months later. At the latter time, he was employed on a construction job in Atlantic City, was I have never known Dake to be a criminal, nor to have been mixed up in any rackete.

I walked back acro s the street with the woman. She asked hether her hubband had arrived get. The was registered, together ith the other commas "Lrs. A. B. 
if he could change a \$1000 bill. Nothing more was said by either of a concerning either the men or the women, until early the next morning.

On the morning of Sunday, January 20, 1935, at about 3.30, my husband was called on the shone by the colored bellboy who was on duty downstairs. This man's name is Owen Roberts. He told my husband that there were some detectives downstairs who wanted to see him. My husband put on a robe and went down. I was awakened kxt by the telephone, and remained awake until about 4.20 AM, when my husband returned, and lay down on the bed. He told me that the detectives were looking for two men from Florida, and that he wondered whether they wanted the two who had come in and who were in Room #403. He said that the had asked for the register, and that he did not know what to do, - whether to send them upstairs, or whether to make them wait for Mr. Young, as the regis ter was locked up for the night, and Young had the combination. My husband and I stayed in the room for about an hour after that, unable to decide what to do, as we had had no experience in such matters, and were afraid of a disturbance in the hotel. At about 5.20 AM, I heard the detectives talking in loud voices downstairs, and told my husband to dress and go downstairs. He did so, and I also dressed, intending to go to six o'clock mass. A few minutes before six, I decided to go upstairs. I walked up from my room, on the econd froor to the fourth floor, and knocked on the door of #403. A man's voice antwered, and I told him to come out, as I was the proprietress, and wanted to see him. A man came out of the door, and I called him into #404, telling him that I wanted to talk to him. My pur, ose in going up to talk to him was because I did not want to see anyone who was innocent involved, and because I wanted no disturbance in the hotel, and thought that, if these were the men that the detectives were looking for, that I could get them to come down and purpositor. I did not know at the time that the mon had registered from Florida. The women had registered from Georgia, and I thought that the men had done the same. The man who can out was dressed only in his underwear, which was a long sleeve, ankle length style, a parently a union mit. It has either white or cream colored, and seemed to be medium weight. He see on to be about 5'8" in height, and was n a very thin. I have been shown a jicture of Alvin Harpis, and identify the front view as being a jisture of the man I spoke to that morning. I-tela-kim-that I asked him where he was from EM and he said "Savannah.' I told him that the law was downstairs. and that if he were the man the; wanted to go along duietly, as I wanted no disturbance, and that both the front and back were guarded. As I was telling him this, I heard the detectives running up the stairs, and heard them shout," Of en the door, or I'll shoot!" The man wanted to hide under the bed, and wanted to borrow a suit of hr. Young's which was hanging on the back of the coor. I would not let him do either. The man was trembling, and seemed very much frightened. I jushed him out the door into the hall. As we came into the hall I saw at least four detectives there. The ink diagram which forms page 3 of this statement represents an accurate diagram of the hall and the parts of it which featured in what followed. It was drawn by N. S. Harzenstein at my direction: The four detective: that I remember seeing were standing at the four points marked X on this diagram. I put a pass key into the lock, and then turned to the detectives, fearing that they might start shooting when I opened the door, and might hit me. I then asked the man in the hall that the other man's name was, and he said it was George £. M. He walked over beside me, to the point marked A in m dots, and called to the man inside. I turned the key in the lock, and he suddenly pushed the door open and slipped between me and the door, and into the room, at this instant I caught a glimpse of a man standing inside the room, at the point marked C on the diagram, with a gun held in his hands. This gun was not a pistol, but a longer gun, which he held with both hands, with the front pointd in my direction and the rear end under his arm it. He was not holding the gun to his shoulder. I moved into the side hall leading to 4401, where I would be out of the gun fire. After I was in there, I think I heard one shot, which I thought came from the third floor. I do not think I heard more t than 15 shots fired on the fourth floor. I have heard simulated machine gun fire in sound pictured, and the shots I heard on the fourth floor were not that raid. At no time do I recall seein either of the men entering or leaving  $\frac{d}{d}400$ , nor do I know which was which as they ran down the hall. I do not know how any of the peo, le were dressed as the, ran, a though I saw several coats flying, and and had the impression at that time that they all had coats on. I did not look at the legs of the girls, and do not recall seeing blood on either of them.

I do not know anyone in the hotel tho might have known these copie or who they were before they arrived, or this they were there. I had no idea of protecting them when I did what I did and no suggested that I protect them. E.M.

Duke Randall, as nearly as I can remember, is about 33 yrs old, 5'10" tall, 160-165 lbs in weight, slender build, has very dark brown, curly hair, blue eyes, and a quick, easy smile. He is a drummer in bands, and I think he is also a lather. When I last saw him, he said he was going to Florida, to work at a dog track. He used to be married, but - do not know whether he still is. His wife was a small woman, about 4'10-11" tall, now about 28 yrs. old, about 15 lbs. in weight, light brown hair, blue eyes. She had a good figure, and was not thin, but had a well

developed bust, and she carried herself erectly. She sang in the same place where her husband played in the band. I last saw her in the submer of 1938. I later heard that she had left Duke. I do not recall her first name. At that time she and Duke stayed at New Richmond Hotel, on Kentucky Ave., near the Boardwalk.
