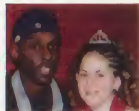
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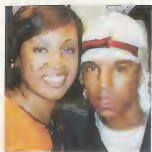

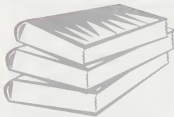
# An Educational Week

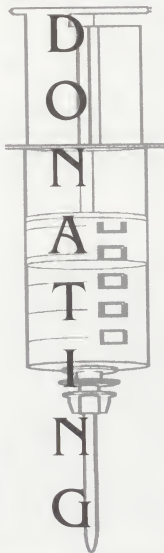

To donate blood there are a few things that have to be done. You first have to sign in and fill out a form about your personal



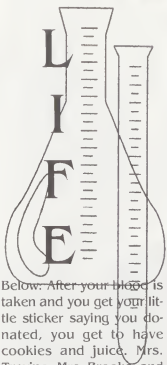

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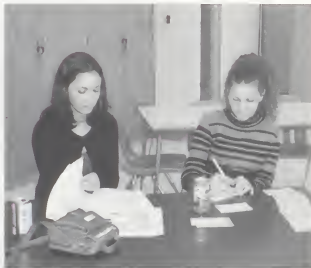

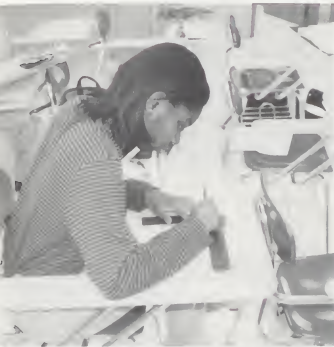

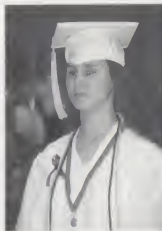

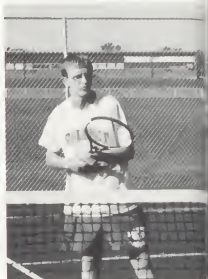

"I enjoyed visiting other schools and meeting new people," said Brandy Litki.



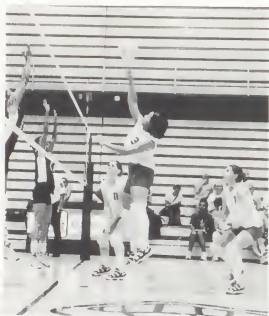

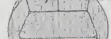

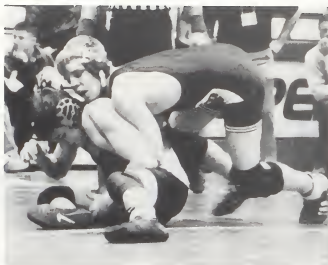

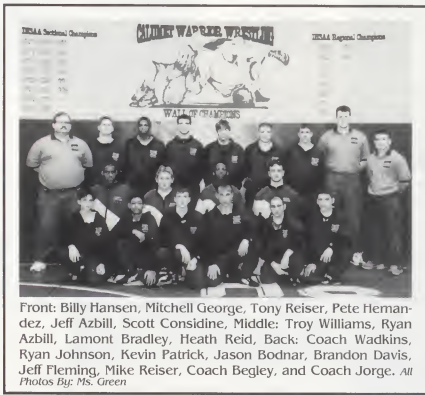
# Grapplers Come up Short this Season!

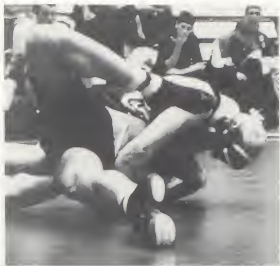
make their personal records a best for the season. This season was a trying one for the Warriors, who lost to teams they have beaten in past seasons, but this

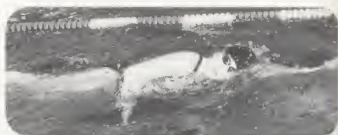

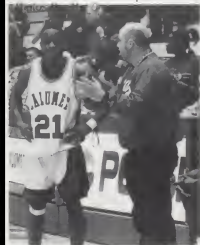

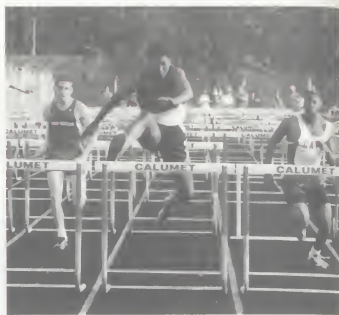

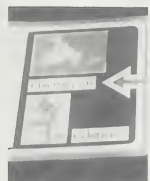

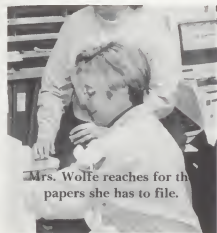
# Office

assistants to help them run errands such as collecting and passing out attendance, running the copy machine, getting mail from central office, plus more.



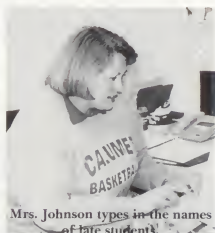

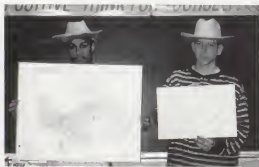

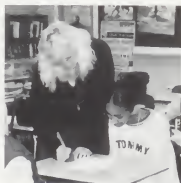


French and Spanish are the two foreign languages offered at Calumet. They expand over four years and teach the student different things each year.

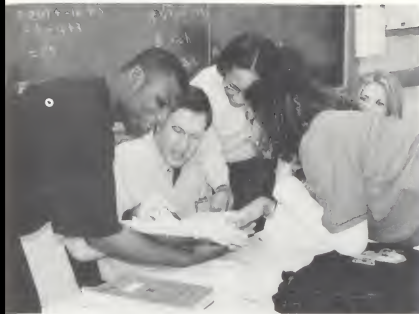

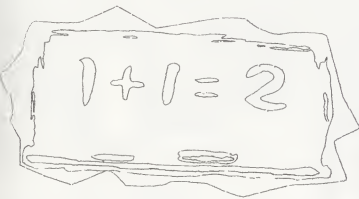

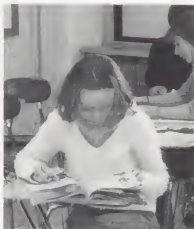

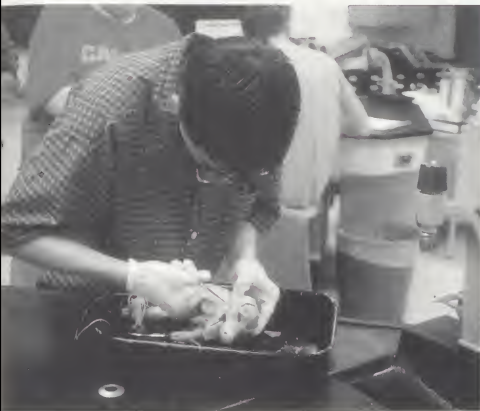

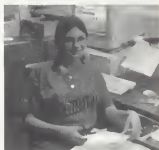

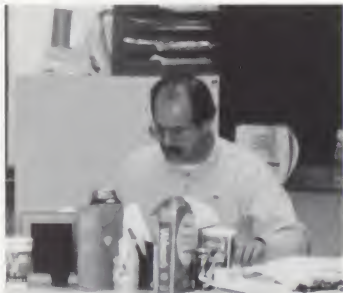

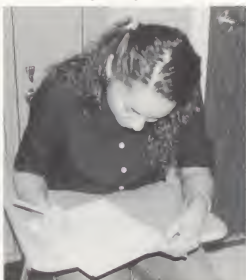

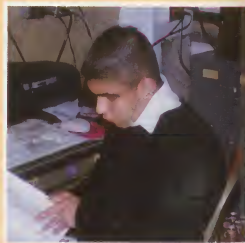

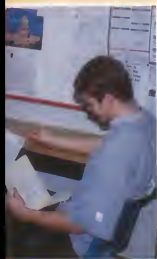
