PLANTING DIRECTIONS

PREPARE SOIL WELL FOR BETTER LAWNS

A lawn can be no better than its foundation, the soil in which it grows!

Prepare soil 8 inches or deeper. Remove rocks, roots and litter. For most soils, additional amounts of humus will be needed to make them mellow and more moisture absorbent. Add at least 1 bale of peatmoss per 1,000 sq. ft. to sandy or clay soils. Work in well before applying fertilizers. Apply 100 lbs. ground limestone, 100 lbs. of Pulverized Sheep Manure and 50 lbs. Hastings' Lawn Fertilizer to each 1,000 sq. ft. (50 x 20). Rake in thoroughly, mixing fertilizer with soil and working the surface and level. Soak dry ground thoroughly then let soil settle a few days to a week before planting. Break surface crust with lawn rake before planting.

SEEDING OR SODDING THE LAWN

Most grasses, except Hulled Bermuda, Merion Blue Grass and Ryegrass, are seeded at the rate of 5 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. Double the amount for Ryegrass. For special seeding rates of individual grasses, see lists on page 20. Broadcast seeds evenly by hand or with the use of a seeder. For hand application, divide amount for a given area in half. Broadcast first half as you work across lawn in a lengthwise direction. Broadcast other half in a crosswise direction. Firm with roller or drag lightly and smoothly with back of rake, and water thoroughly.

Set strips or plugs of Bermuda, Centipede, Zoysia or St. Augustine grasses in 12 inch rows and 12 inches apart in the rows, stepping on each planting to firm it. Water thoroughly afterwards.

LAWN MAINTENANCE IS VERY IMPORTANT

Always keep newly seeded lawns well watered to insure good germination and quick rooting. Make first mowing when new grass is 3 inches high. Subsequent mowings are made as growth conditions permit. Set mower to cut at 2 inches high. On established lawns, keep down weeds by spraying with a 2, 4-D weed killer, and Crabgrass with Sodar Crabgrass Killer. Feed lawns in April, September and February with 20 lbs. Hastings' Lawn Fertilizer (50 lb. bags, \$3.50 each. 250 lbs., \$17.25. F.O.B. Atlanta) per 1,000 sq. ft. In dry weather, water lawns thoroughly with a rotary or oscillating sprinkler, soaking ground to a depth of 4 inches or more.

PREPARING BULB BEDS

Dig out the beds at least 18 inches. Mix in fibrous material, such as Peat Moss, until your soil is loose and porous. This provides easy root penetration and drainage beneath bulbs. Add 8 lbs. bone meal or bulb fertilizer to each 100 sq. ft. bed area for ample feeding. Plant after Thanksgiving in extreme lower South, in October to December elsewhere. Bulbs keep best in over summer storage by spreading to provide air circulation. **Set tulips 10 inches deep to give better results.**

CULTURE: A Tulip is best planted 10 inches deep in average soil in the South. Smaller bulbs, such as Grape Hyacinths, Scillas, Crocus, Snowdrops are planted about 4 inches deep.

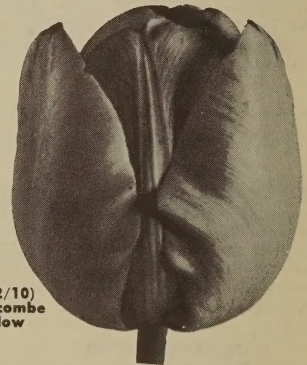
Depth of Lily planting varies. Candidum or Madonna Lily is only covered 2 to 3 inches. Regal and most other Lilies 6 to 8 inches.



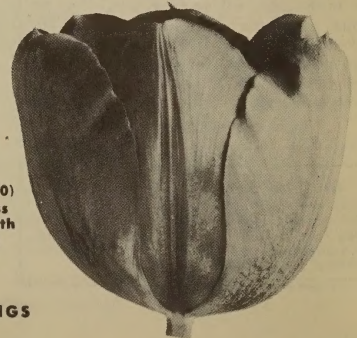

CULTURE: Plant in rather rich, exceptionally well drained beds during fall. Set small bulbs 4 inches and large bulbs 8 inches deep after mixing bone meal or high potash fertilizer (8 Lbs. for each 100 sq. ft. bed area) deeply and completely in soil. In Florida and along coastal sub-tropical locations plant Daffodils in December and particularly set deeply for best blooms. In tropical and semi-tropical South they behave more as annuals. Dig bulbs in early summer when tops die naturally, but only when they become crowded.

GUIDE to PROPER PLANTING, PRUNING, SPAYING

PLANT, PRUNE, SPRAY RIGHT FOR FINE FRUITS AND FLOWERS.

APPLES AND PEARS. Planting and Pruning. Set trees 40 ft. apart. Plant young trees with strong roots. Select 3 buds or small branches a foot apart around trunk, lowest bud at height desired for lowest limb. Other buds and top or tip are cut out with sharp knife. If other branches develop, cut them off the following spring. As desired branches develop after the first year, select buds to retain as on the whip, pointing in different directions for balance. Keep other branches off by pruning close to limb or trunk. Besides, prune out all dead, diseased, weak branches and any which would interfere with more desirable branches each spring.

Spraying. For home orchards 4 or 5 sprays are needed each year to prevent fungus and insect infestations as follows. 1. Dormant spray. This delayed spray is made when fruit buds become silvery colored and before young leaves develop. Use Lime-Sulphur with addition of Malathion, as directed on packages, against scales, scab, red mite and aphids. 2. Pink bud spray. Use when fruit buds show pink color, DuPont Fruit Tree Spray for scab, codling moth, worms. 3. Calyx spray. Use when petals drop and before calyx closes, DuPont Spray as on package directions. 4. Use same spray 10 days later. 5. Same spray 15 days later. If only 2 sprays are made a year, use numbers 1 and 3 as most important.

CHERRIES, PEACHES AND PLUMS. Planting and Pruning. Plant young trees 25 ft. apart and prune to 3 or 4 chosen buds or branches 8 to 12 inches apart on trunk and pointing in different directions to make balanced tree. Prune back the main stem above chosen top bud or branch. The second year, before buds swell, cut off all shoots not needed for the tree's framework, keeping tree rather low and open in center. After bearing begins, cut back new shoots in midwinter at least half way.

Spraying. The general program is 4 sprays. 1. In winter use a strong Lime-Sulphur spray according to package instructions against leaf-curl and San Jose scale. 2. After petals drop and husks split from young fruits, use DuPont Fruit Tree Spray for scab, brown rot and curculio. 3. Repeat 15 days later. 4. Use DuPont Fruit Tree Spray 15 to 20 days later against scab and brown rot. Borers may infest trunks at or beneath the

soil surface. Examine for injury in June and September. Dig borers out with knife and wire. Use Special Borer Spray on and around trunks of affected trees about October 1st and as directed on package.

Keep fruit trees cultivated, pruned, sprayed and well fertilized and your rewards will be abundant.

BERRIES. Set 3 to 4 ft. apart. Blackberries and Dewberries should be pruned. Pinch off tips when about 3 feet tall to develop low branches. After fruiting, cut out old stems as they are through bearing and will die anyway. Pull up between-row suckers to prevent spreading out of control. If underside of leaves develop a bright orange rust, pull up plants and burn them. Burn any canes infested with borers. Spray with DuPont Fruit Tree Spray in summer and with Bordeaux Mixture in winter as rust preventative.

Raspberries are pruned as for Blackberries. In early spring remove dead and weak canes and shorten long new canes, leaving 3 to 5 strong canes per plant to fruit each year. Main diseases, as with Blackberries, are yellows, anthracnose, orange-rust and cane-blight. Remove and burn diseased plants, as also for cane and root borers. Spray as above.

STRAWBERRIES. Planting. Space plants 12 inches apart on raised, heavily manured beds. Set with crown just above soil level, packing roots firmly. Soak thoroughly at planting. Pine straw is excellent mulch, protecting from cold and drought. Prune back runners to encourage best crops. Spray with Bordeaux Mixture for leaf spot and Malathion for insects.

GRAPES. (Vine and Bunch types.) Set Bunch grapes 8 ft. apart and Vine or Muscadine type 15 ft. apart. Cover muscadine-scuppernon roots 3 inches in shallow trench with unrooted portion only above soil. Fencing is recommended. Never cut in summer. Only prune while dormant, preferably in December. Very long, overgrown canes are usually sterile so cut them off at their bases. Reduce length and number of normal shoots, thickness of a pencil which will bear the next summer. Start training after second year, selecting 2, 4 or 6 canes from main stem in pairs to train horizontally, each cane restricted to bear 6 to 10

buds, according to its strength. Each bud should average 2 grape clusters.

Spraying. Black-rot is the worst disease and spraying for that usually controls most other diseases and insects. Plow under rotted fruit in early spring. Spray 4 or 5 times with Bordeaux Mixture—first when new growth is starting, second when new growth is about 10 inches long, third after blossoms drop, fourth 10 days later, and fifth 15 days later. Second and third sprayings should have added Malathion to control insects.

GARDENIAS-CAMELIAS and other broadleaf evergreens. Pruning may be done generally after blooming or as needed to keep desired size and shape. **Spraying.** Florida Volck sprayed as needed for white fly and scale using care never to apply in very hot or very cold weather.

FLOWERING SHRUBS, FLOWERS. Pruning. After blooming is proper time to prune spring bloomers except disbudbing when desired for improved flowering habits. Summer bloomers are pruned either severely in late winter to force new growth, the source of the new flowers. **Spraying.** Spray or dust with DuPont Floral Dust to control pests when necessary.

BOXWOOD. Prune as necessary to retain correct size and shape.

Spraying. Use Malathion in spring to control box leaf miner. Dust with sulphur in cool weather in summer or spray with MALATHION to control red spider (mites).

ROSES. Planting and Pruning. Set bush roses 24 to 30 inches apart, climbers 6 to 10 feet as desired. Dig beds 30 inches deep, mixing abundance of rotted manure or rotted humus to hold moisture. Plant when weather is still cold. When buds swell noticeably in spring, bush roses are cut back 1/2 to 2/3 normal growth and all dead and diseased canes entirely. Later pruning is for training to desired size. Spring flowering climbers (H.W.) are pruned only after blooming is over, cutting back 1/2-1/3 normal growth or train to desired area and remove all dead and diseased canes. Cl H.T. roses are pruned less severely than bush roses.

Spraying. Weekly spraying or dusting with DuPont Rose Dust gives ample protection against black spot, mildew anthracnose, etc.

HOW TO GROW YOUR ROSES

Plant only heavily rooted, field grown, adapted varieties as compared to small "culls" or large "forced" plants discarded from greenhouses. Choose your varieties as to color and type desired (each fully described on these pages). Place order to be shipped as quickly as it is safe to send well hardened plants to easily withstand transplanting—usually from about November 30 until late March. This is the practice of expert rosarians! Their secret is to prepare the rose beds in early fall by digging 30 inches deep and mixing lower 18 inches with 1/3 peat moss, rotted compost or similar organic matter, and 2/3 soil. The upper foot must be mixed 1/2 and 1/2 with same. This will make an ideal bed to settle down with fall rains and to be ready to receive your roses when they arrive, and regardless of the weather.

Plant with graft just above soil level.

Spread and firm the roots in the large opening made immediately prior to planting and soak promptly even if soil is wet. This settles soil around all roots, making direct contact ready to grow when spring comes. Mulch heavily with compost, pine straw, etc.

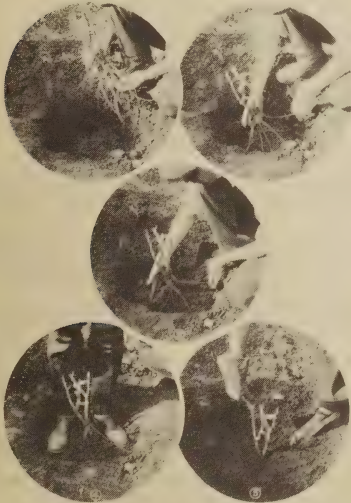
Set bush roses 24 to 30 inches apart and climbing roses 6 to 10 ft. apart as desired.

Prune away any broken or dead branches and normal canes to about 8 inches when buds swell in spring. Use special rose fertilizer when buds begin to grow noticeably in late spring very lightly scratching a half cup, circling each rose.
