

# The What-Not Corner

This year of the Oregon Centennial is a special one for us as well, being the twentieth anniversary of Irisnoll catalog. We prefer to remember the ups rather than the downs of this period and so it has been a rewarding twenty years.

Although I have been interested in breeding Iris since the 1920's, I am ever nonplussed by requests for the answers to Iris problems, or how to become a plant wizard overnight. Truthfully, not too much is known concerning Iris possibilities and only a little more is learned each year. And if you do not agree you have not been working for reds! Luckily, we get a break now and then, or someone produces a real advance.

Do you recall when first you heard of a tangerine bearded pink? I remember well, years ago, a hush-hush letter (read in whispers! almost) telling of a seashell-like pink having a red beard. It wasn't possible, the writer reported, to give details or even the name of the originator, but only to say that the Iris was creating a sensation. As indeed it did!

Yet, decades later, we are still searching for the combination that will produce the "ideal" pink,—having out-of-this-world color, size, ruffling, and perhaps a self rather than a tangerine beard!

Among the latest additions to the file of Iris pedigrees are those of Allegiance, Whole Cloth, and Tollgate. It is notable that Black Forest appears in Allegiance, through Dark Boatman. In Tollgate, through seedling 4651. And in leafing through the file, Black Forest is found in Black Satin (Nesmith); Total Eclipse, through Black Hills (Fay); Black Taffeta (Songer); Royal Violet (Riddle); and of course, in Violet Hills.

There is so much to be done during the Iris season that we have put off from year to year any plan for trying our luck at photography. But color slides are becoming almost a necessity, and so we hope to have, (after this season) at least the beginnings of a good collection.

Everything has its "angle," and much depends upon individual view-point. Not the extreme, perhaps, of the Texan's on Paul Revere—the guy who had to run for help! But we do know that, as well as being variable in different regions, Iris varieties appear as diversely to individuals.

It is, of course, rather late in the day for me to be attending charm class! Although I realize all too well what it can do for one! When suggesting to "the Mrs." that I try some hi-flying persuasion the idea was promptly doused by a reminder that the earliest "charmer" was a snake! That did it! And so I am, still, just plain prosaic
