GREEN BUG OUTBREAK IN KANSAS (Toxoptera graminum Rond.)

Professor Geo. A. Dean reports that there is a common infestation of green bug over central and south-central Kansas. In Kiowa County green bugs are seriously injuring 500 acres of barley and oats. Similar serious infestations have been reported from Sedgwick County and there is an infestation near Manhattan.
