To the Seed Trade:

In presenting our Wholesale Price List for 1897 we would emphasize the fact that we continue selling only **the best Seeds** that it is possible to produce,—such as are sure to give satisfaction.

Dealers who desire to build up a permanent trade should pay no attention to the “**cut prices,**” which would seem to indicate (to the inexperienced) that seeds have no intrinsic value whatever. Because of several bankrupt stocks thrown on the market, together with the fact that many crops grown without proper selection (largely for firms that have failed disastrously the past season) are offered at any price, the seed trade this season seems to have become largely demoralized. A reaction is sure to follow.

Good seeds cannot be handled at a living profit for less than the prices quoted herein. While we do not seek large profits, yet we are not in the business solely for pleasure.

BURPEE'S SEEDS are the most widely advertised and among the most popular with American planters. By comparison of the prices quoted in our MARKET GARDENERS' LIST, sent herewith, intelligent dealers will readily see that they can make a good margin of profit by handling **BURPEE'S SEEDS**, and at the same time build up a paying business.

Shall we have your order this season, or, throwing aside all consideration of quality, will you buy wherever you can get the “**cheapest seeds**”? If YOU are in the second class of dealers, just referred to, let us tell you that you should not pay more than fifteen cents per pound for Onion, with other seeds in proportion!

TERMS OF SALE.

Terms of Credit.—To regular customers and well-known houses of established credit, all bills bought from this Catalogue are due June 1st, without regard to date of purchase. *All accounts are subject to sight draft on June 10th if payment is not received previously by mail.* Goods purchased after June 1st are payable on October 1st and subject to sight draft.

 Bills purchased on *special quotations*, made by letter, are due three months from date, or subject to a discount of one and a half per cent. for cash within ten days of date of invoice.

 **Grass and Clover Seeds, Onion Sets, and Seed Potatoes** in quantity are invariably **net Cash**.

 Unknown correspondents desiring credit are requested to give satisfactory reference in Philadelphia or New York.

Terms for Cash.—We will allow a discount of **Five per Cent.** on orders accompanied by a cash remittance, and also on all bills (at Catalogue prices) paid within ten days from date of invoice.


Shipping Instructions should be sent with each order, and will be followed carefully. Otherwise we will use our best judgment as to route.

The Prices Quoted are those ruling at this date. We expect to adhere to them through the spring, except in cases where important changes in the market compel us to advance or reduce our prices, when we will be governed by the market. **10 lbs. and over will be supplied at the rates per 100 lbs.;** $\frac{1}{2}$ lb and $\frac{1}{4}$ bush. at the pound and bushel rates; but *smaller quantities will be subject to a higher charge.*

Seeds by Mail.—When desired, small packages will be forwarded by mail at 8 cts. per pound, 15 cts. per quart, extra.

NO CHARGE for Boxes, Barrels, Packing, or Cartage. Bags are *Charged at Cost.* After delivering to forwarders in **good order** (as shown by Bill of Lading) our responsibility ceases. **Insurance** effected only when so directed.


WE DO NOT COMMISSION SEEDS.—In response to hundreds of inquiries each year, we would state that we **positively decline to send out any Seeds on Commission.** Dealers handling seeds in packets will be supplied on liberal terms, and by ordering judiciously, those left over can be destroyed, and the business yet be more profitable and satisfactory than the handling of commission seeds.

ELECTROTYPES.—Many of our customers purchase, for use in their catalogues, **Electrotypes** of the illustrations in our retail catalogue. While we do not make a business of selling electrotypes, yet the expense of engraving our original illustrations is so heavy that we must charge for the blocks at the rate of **30 cts. per square inch.** All orders for electrotypes are subject to our approval, and **in no case can we allow the use of our copyrighted engravings of varieties introduced by us to illustrate other varieties or to sell seed of doubtful purity.**  We purpose to protect from pirates both our copyrighted illustrations and the matter in our **Retail Catalogues**, which is *copyrighted* both for the current year and for years past. We regret that this notice is necessary, but it will not affect any honorable, self-respecting house, and all who purchase seed of our novelties and specialties are entitled, of course, to copy our descriptions.

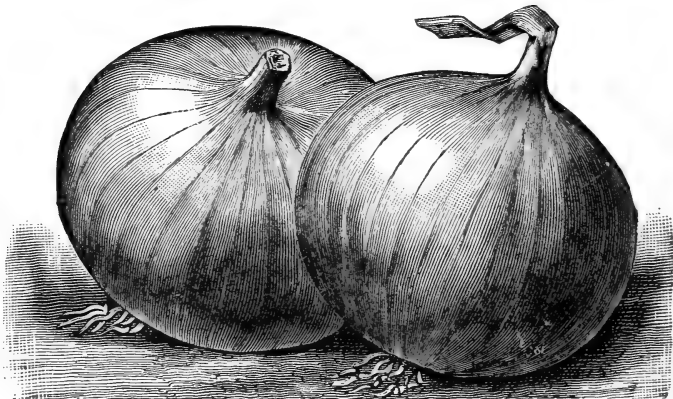

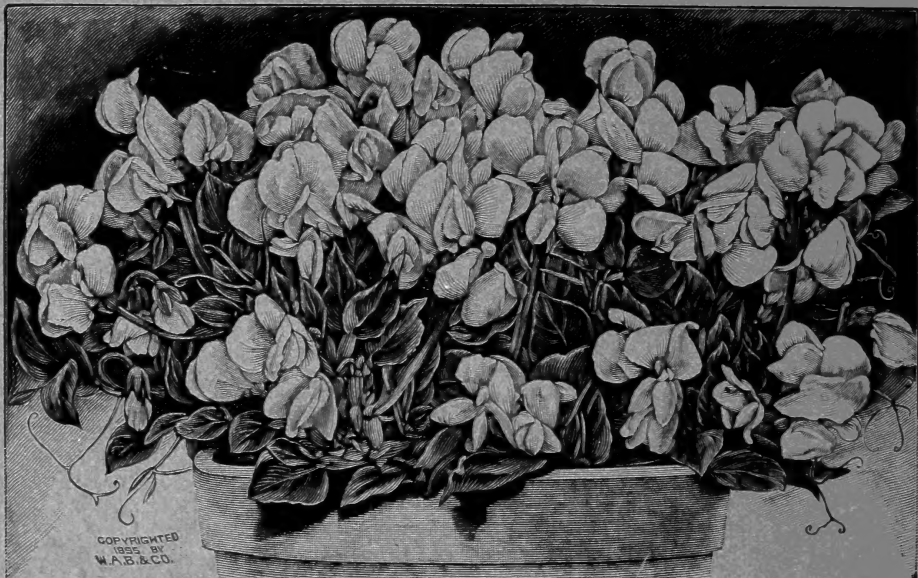
